OUR HISTORY IN WORDS & PICTURES

Many of our present day shooters would not know the struggles and frustrations our administrators went through in the 1950s and 1960s when the Australian Clay Target Association was attempting to affiliate with the International Shooting Union, in order for us to compete in World Championships at Olympic Trench and Olympic Skeet. The struggle goes back to the Melbourne Olympic Games of 1956.

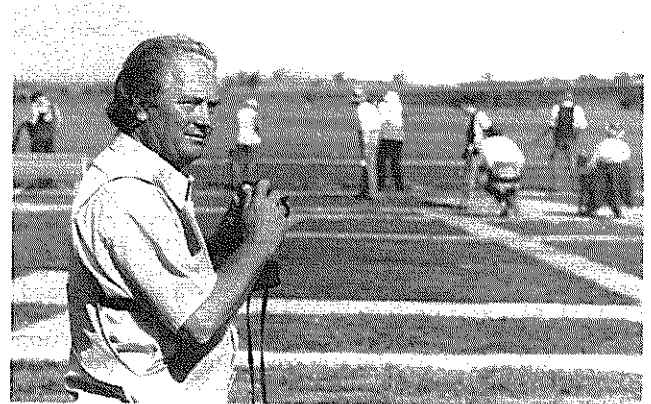
The games in Australia were seen by the Executive Committee as a great opportunity for Australian Shooters to join the ranks of international competitors.

So we applied to have Olympic Trap shooting included in the shooting sports program. The request was granted, but then the real problems began to show. Apart from the enormous amount of ground work and planning that went into preparing for an event that had never been attempted before in our Country, we had to cope with the Australian Olympic Federation's conditions of amateur status for our shooters. Copious amounts of correspondence went back and forth to the International Shooting Union, who finally agreed to accept Australia's affiliation with the World International Shooting Union. At this stage everything looked plain sailing, but unfortunately it was not to be. The Australian Olympic Federation's Chairman, Mr. E. Tanner, ruled that in his opinion, all Australian Shooters were professional because we shot for big money trophies, such as motor cars etc.. it mattered not that overseas countries also shot for big money prizes and were still within the amateur status. It was obvious to us that Mr. Tanner was not going to budge, so in order that some of our shooters could shoot, the Executive Committee had to alter our constitution concerning rules of competition, it meant that big money trophies were out.

We did eventually field a two man team in the 1956 Olympic Games, the two shooters were John Bryant and Clem Mudford, both of Melbourne.

One of the most ridiculous conditions of competition was that if a person was employed in the firearms and ammunition industry, they were ineligible for Olympic

Competition. This meant that several of our top shooters were not able to compete. When the games finished the A.C.T.A. had to come to a decision on whether to remain so called "amateur" or revert back to our former conditions of shooting. A referendum conducted showed a 50% club response and a 3-1 against becoming an amateur body. This was not really unexpected as clubs throughout Australia could not see our shooters being able to conform to the Australian Olympic Federation's rules of eligibility.



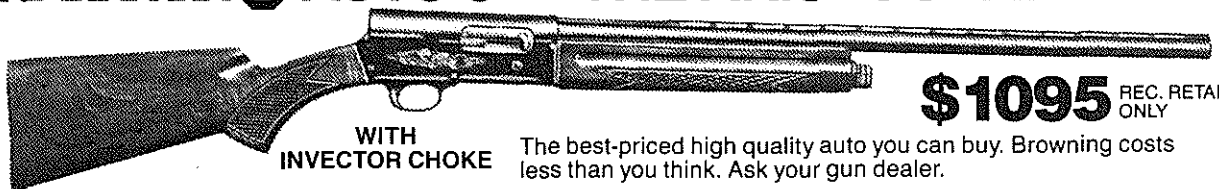

A BRIEF HISTORY OF INTERNATIONAL CLAY TARGET SHOOTING IN AUSTRALIA

In the world of International Shotgunning, Australian Shooters were held in high esteem as Live Bird Shooters, winning many of the major tournaments in Europe. Now in 1956 the opportunity for the Australian Clay Target Shooter was presented through the holding of the Olympic Games in Melbourne. By arrangements between the A.O.F. and the A.C.P.T.S.A. Australia was made acceptable to the U.I.T. and competed in the Olympic Trap Events of these Olympics. The way was then opened for Australian Shooters to compete throughout the world in International Trap and Skeet Tournaments, World Championships, Olympics etc. However through incredible arrogance and maladministration by the Australian Executive Body of the A.C.P.T.S.A. the support of the A.O.F. was lost and the Association was discredited as professional in the eyes of the U.I.T. The golden opportunities presented through the Olympic Games of 1956 were wantonly wasted, the International Trap & Field with the equipment it provided was abandoned and subsequently lost to the scrap metal trade.

As a direct result of this disaster the opportunities of Australian Clay Target Shooters were to lie in limbo for nearly 14 years until Bob Morgan, who had been officially involved in Australian Shooting Teams overseas since 1956, decided that he could get enough interest in

Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia and the A.C.T. to have them form State Associations, independent of the discredited A.C.P.T.S.A., to conduct International Trap and Skeet Shoots. Encouraged by the subsequent developments made by these State Associations, he proposed the inauguration of a National Body called the "Australian Amateur Shot Gun Association". Delegates representing each State Association gathered at the Inaugural Meeting held on November 7th 1969 at 125 Davey Street, in Hobart, Tasmania where, upon the motion of Mr. Papps and seconded by Mr. McRae the proposal to form the A.A.S.A. was adopted (Minutes: see Appendix No. 1.)

Australian Amateur Shooters now had a National Body to represent them. This body swiftly contacted the Australian Shooting Association for full Affiliation.

On the 16th November Bob Morgan, Delegate for the A.A.S.A. and Messrs. C. Barry & G. Hall, representing the A.C.T.A. were invited to attend the Annual General Meeting of the A.S.A. held at the Southern Command Army Club, to discuss the affiliation of the A.A.S.A. with the A.S.A. and to clarify the attitude of the A.C.T.A. in regard to Amateur competition.

Mr. Berry & Mr. Hall attended, submitting correspondence which indicated (see Report A.G.M. of A.S.A. 16/11/69 Appendix No. II) that the A.C.T.A. was not interested in Olympic participation and that a referendum conducted by the A.C.T.A. showed only a 50% club interest and a 3 to 1 vote against becoming an Amateur Body. That no change would be made in the A.C.T.A. Constitution towards amateur status.

Mr. Hall concluded his remarks by saying it was impossible for the A.C.T.A. to accept the A.S.A. Constitution, that he wished the proposal "well" in their endeavours on behalf of the Australian shooter, but could not see them getting the "cream" of the Clay Pigeon Shooters as amateur representatives.

After these remarks and the A.C.T.A. letter of "clarification" it was clear to the delegates assembled that A.C.T.A. had no interest in International Competition or of being involved in its control.

The affiliation of the A.A.S.A. with A.S.A. was unanimously resolved and A.A.S.A. became the National Body in control of International Trap and Skeet.

The way was now clear for the A.A.S.A. to organise national shoots in the International Discipline, the first of these being held in Tasmania on the 18th, 19th and 20th of April 1970. (see Report Appendix III).

1st National Skeet Championship.
1st National Trap Championship.
1st South Pacific Regional Skeet Championship.
Elimination Matches — Australian Team — 40th
Worlds Shooting Championships
Phoenix — Arizona — October 1970.

It will be noted above that only the 1st South Pacific Skeet Championship — (no Trap Championship) — could be held as the trap matches were over "ball traps". It is required that a 15 Trap set up be used for "Regional Championships".

A complete 15 Trap Stand was established in Hobart during the following year using "Kromson" equipment and has continued to function without fault ever since.

The Shotgun Team for the 40th Worlds Championship was selected by the elimination matches and were:—

He has been involved in Australian Shooting Teams overseas since 1956 he is in fact greatly responsible for the A.C.T.A.'s acceptance as an affiliated body of the International Shooting Union. Which cleared the way for Australia to stage the 1973 World Clay Pigeon Shooting Championships at the Melbourne Gun Club, Australian shooters could then compete internationally in the future — Australia has sent Trench and Skeet teams overseas annually since 1974, to Olympic Games and World Championships.

This Shotgun Team together with the Rifle and Pistol Teams proceeded to Phoenix to contest the Worlds Championships. It was the 1st Australian Shotgun Team ever to so compete internationally. Bronze Merit Medals were won by D. Byrne and Bob Morgan in Trap and Don Jones in Skeet.

The opportunity to train at the T.S.A.M.T.U. at Fort Benning with the American Team, before proceeding to Phoenix was initiated by Bob Morgan through contacts made with Lt. Col. Keifer at the 1968 Olympic Games held in Mexico. Valuable experience was gained here by Eric McRae, Bob Morgan and Don Jones together with Tibor

Gonzol of the Pistol Team.

In Australia the "ball" was now rolling merrily along with each of the affiliated States conducting regular International Matches. Late in 1971 Canberra organised and effectively, under the direction of Peter Papps ran the elimination for Olympic Trap Team for Munich 1972.

These shooters together with Don Jones and Don Taylor were submitted to the A.S.A. for consideration. Sperry Marshall was selected to join the 1972 Australian Olympic Team.

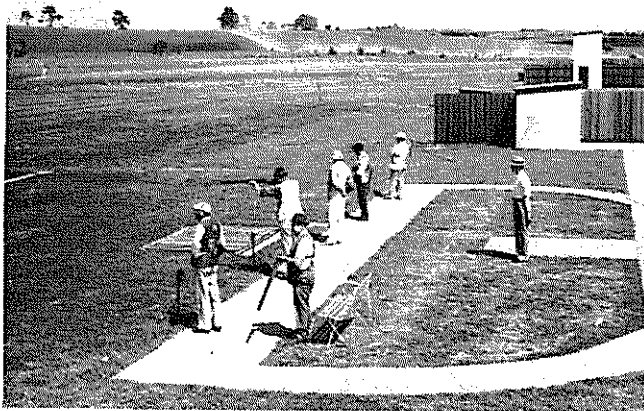
Also during 1971 the A.A.S.A. decided to apply for the 1973 Worlds Moving Target Championship. The International Union de Tir was advised of our intention and an extensive proposal was produced. (see Appendix IX).

Bob Morgan together with Peter Garrett, Sec of the A.S.A. and a member of the U.I.T. Executive, proceeded to Munich and presented Australia's proposal to the Meeting of the U.I.T. — Administrative Council on July 16th, 17th & 18th 1971. The application was successful and withstood a strong challenge by South Africa the voting being 17 to 4 in Australia's favour.

Bob Morgan had already, in anticipation of a successful appeal, secured the enthusiastic support of Mr. Jules Steiner of Western Australia. A letter dated 22nd June 1971 was received from the Perth Gun Club in which they agreed to make their shooting grounds available. (see Appendix V).

A great deal of our application was prepared on the basis of a W.A. Venue for several reasons, one being the fact that W.A. is closer to Europe than any other suitable capital city in Australia, this was considered to be a possible important advantage in discussing the application in Munich and secondly, the fervent enthusiasm of Jules Steiner for the project.

Both I.C.I. and Winchester had proffered support in the event of a successful application, the whole matter to be



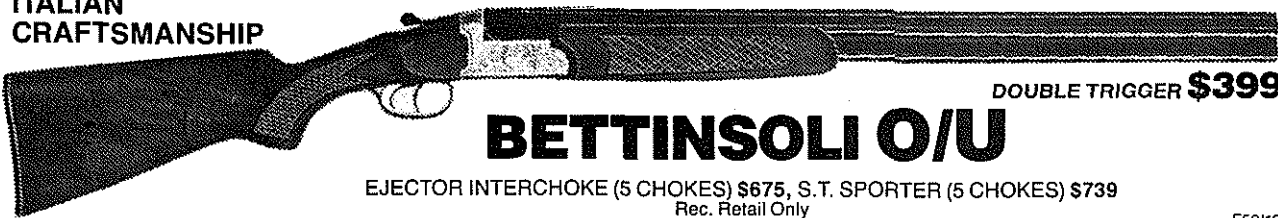

discussed and finalized at the Nationals to be held in Griffith in 1972. However Mr. Steiner arrived at Griffith with the bad news that he had not been able to sustain the support of the Perth Gun Club, not withstanding their letter of 22/6/71 (see Appendix V) and he suggested we advise the U.I.T. that our application had lapsed. Then I.C.I. and Winchester immediately lost interest in the proposal and Bob Morgan was left with the 1973 Worlds Moving Target Championship on his hands and nowhere to go. Realizing that Bill Delaney had shown a genuine interest in International Skeet and had competed in such events in Malaya and other places Bob Morgan discussed the possibility of Melbourne Gun Club accepting the Championships with Bill Delaney and Geo Biggs, both were enthusiastic and were prepared to carry the proposal to Bob Buchan for M.G.C. consideration. The Melbourne Gun Club agreed to accept the challenge of running the Championships. The A.A.S.A. advised the U.I.T. of the change of venue, this was readily accepted by them as it meant that Trap and Skeet would now be conducted in the same area as Running Boar, which is the 2nd part of the 1973 Worlds Moving Target Championship.

The A.A.S.A. had long realised that having two separate bodies running Clay Target Shooting in Australia was a disadvantage both in administration and opportunities for its supporters. At a meeting of A.S.A. the delegates of A.A.S.A. requested permission of the A.S.A. to open up exploratory discussions with A.C.T.A. with the object of a joint partnership.

Meetings were arranged with Mr. Garry Armstrong (President & Chairman A.S.A.) as Chairman, Mr. Peter Garrett, representing A.S.A., Gordon Hall and C.M. Berry, representing A.C.T.A. Bob Morgan and Don Jones, representing A.A.S.A.

These meetings were long and difficult, with the A.C.T.A. representatives finally convincing the A.S.A. of their bonafides as amateurs and that the A.C.T.A. was willing to amalgamate with A.A.S.A. for the benefit of International Clay Target Shooting. An Extra-Ordinary General Meeting of A.A.S.A. in Munich on 28th August was held to amend the A.A.S.A. Constitution to admit the A.C.T.A. as required by the A.S.A. and an official letter of invitation (see Appendix VI.) to amalgamate with A.A.S.A. was sent to the A.C.T.A. President Mr. Gordon Hall.

The A.C.T.A. accepted the conditions and the A.S.A. was duly notified of the successful amalgamation and that the future control of International Trap Shooting would be in the hands of the A.C.T. and A.A.S.A. acting as joint bodies.

The way was now clear for Australia to hold the 1973 World Trap Shooting Championships in Melbourne at the Melbourne Gun Club and for Australian Trapshooters to compete Internationally in the future.

I am indebted to Bob Morgan for his report on the events leading up to our ultimate affiliation.

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING UNION ELIGIBILITY RULES

General

1. For all Championships and Games which are under the direction, control or recognition of the International Shooting Union, its Eligibility Rules will be strictly applied.
2. The International Shooting Union invites its Member Federations to apply these eligibility rules for entry both to their National Competitions and to all international competitions organised with the participation of their shooters.
3. The eligibility rules of the International Olympic Committee must be observed for participation in the Olympic Games.
4. The amateur rules of the appropriate National Olympic Committee must also be observed by the shooters of each country.

Eligibility

1. An amateur shooter is anyone who devotes and continues to devote himself to the practice of the shooting sport for pleasure and diversion without deriving any material personal profit from competing in his sport; he will strictly observe the agreed rules and procedure in a spirit of fair play and discipline.
2. His income or his living expenses must neither directly or indirectly be linked to his sporting activity nor to his knowledge of the shooting sport and to his relationship to the sport — administrative functions excluded.
3. He must not be or not become signee to a contract of financial interest which directly or indirectly concerns the practice of the sport, the knowledge of the sport or the relationship with the sport — administrative functions excluded.
4. An official declaration of eligibility for each competitor by the National Federation or Association of the country will be required.
5. A shooter does forfeit his eligibility if:
 - a. he accepts payment for participating in a shooting sport event or for training for that event or for the demonstration or exhibition of shooting.
 - b. he derives profit and accepts any payment from press, television or film companies in connection with his shooting sport activities.
 - c. he supports advertising for any manufacturer or dealer of any shooting equipment of any kind; (the long established practice of the make and model being inscribed on firearms or other shooting equipment or at the interior of shooting clothing is not considered as advertising.)
6. A shooter does not forfeit his eligibility if:
 - a. he receives from his National Federation or Shooting Club:
 - i. arms, ammunition and other shooting equipment.
 - ii. travelling expenses for his participation in National and International competitions.
 - iii. costs of meals and lodging for the purpose of such shooting competitions (corresponding to the actual cost to him).
 - b. he receives money prizes not exceeding Sfr. 200. — or the equivalent per day or a total of Sfr. 1000. — or the equivalent for contents fired over several days in the same tournament and within the same calendar week. Such prize money is considered to be compensation for expenses borne by the shooter. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned amounts must be paid to the National Federation or Club of which the competitor is a regular member.
 - c. he receives prizes in kind which do not exceed Sfr. 5000. — in value within one calendar year. An amateur is not permitted to sell such prizes in kind.
 - d. he is serving in the Defence Forces of his country and is required to give instruction in shooting as a part of his regular duties.

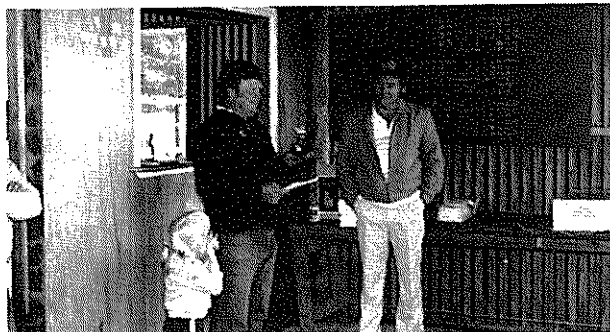
SHOOTING AT THE FOREST

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

The state and national ministers of sport and recreation are currently compiling a set of pointers to help in the identification of junior talent.

Thinking about this problem made me think carefully about what talent is, junior or senior, is it something we are born with or can it be developed?

It is my belief that it is not necessarily the novice who when first embracing our sport is able to master the skills quickly or easily who is going to be the most talented in the long run. I am sure you have all known young and older people who have entered our sport with the ability to shoot well but who have not had the success expected in the long term.

Just the opposite, because of instant success, the shooter does not feel the need of help and consequently does not master the fundamentals of our sport properly, they suffer from the "what can they teach me" syndrome.

My list for the identification of potential talent, for both young and older shooters alike would be,

1. A person with the **desire** to learn and succeed.
2. A person who will really listen to advice given by the coach, and try to do as directed.
3. A person tenacious enough to **persist**, to try, try, and try again.
4. A person who gets **pleasure** from, and has the **drive**, to do well.
5. A person who can **concentrate** on one thing at a time, or who will make the effort to learn to concentrate.
6. A person **determined** enough to practise until their skill is perfected, so developing **confidence** in their own ability.
7. A person **honest** with themselves, who will accept disappointments in an honest way.

You will note that the above points don't have anything to do with shooting Clay Targets, but with having a positive mental attitude. The physical aspects necessary to become a talented shooter come next.

8. A person who is physically able to carry a gun and who is willing to become fit and stay fit and strong enough for our sport. It is not necessary to be big, but to shoot over several days in all conditions it is necessary to be strong.
9. A person with good reflexes, and hand eye coordination, or one who is prepared to develop these.

Talent in the past has often come from field shooting and an inherited interest in shooting as a sport. People with rural backgrounds are often strong people, both mentally and physically because of their continual battle with their environment. We now have many talented shooters from the cities and towns who have learned their skills through the gun clubs and who have developed their toughness through their own endeavours and desire to do well.

If we set too narrow limitations when deciding what constitutes talent we will miss many shooters who would have succeeded because of their own strengths. Our sport has had and does have champions with physical differences from the norm, these very differences have made those shooters into determined, tenacious people who have had to conquer obstacles and win battles continually in every day life.

I would like to conclude with the observation that talent in the young as well as the not so young lies in a person's ability to develop both mentally and physically, with the desire to succeed and the confidence to do so, based on their self realization of their own ability.

"DUXBAC"

By John Monk

Author's Note: I wrote this piece on June 16th, 1963, after spending quite some time with the old gentleman at the shop in Latrobe Street, Melbourne, where it operated under the name of Donald Mackintosh, and Horrie was officially termed Governing Director.

Horace James — for that was his real name — began in the gun business under Donald Mackintosh, and at that time had been in the business over 50 years. Horrie was one of the last of the great gunshots of the Donald Mackintosh days, former world champion gunshot, and a man who even in those days was often remembered as "the greatest wing-shot the world has ever seen!"

Horrie was also one of the last of the great champions to have a shooting name. The Clay Target Association stopped the practice of registering these shooting names.

The site of the old East Oakleigh gunclub was very close to Huntingdale railway station — now all houses. I think it was named the East Oakleigh Settlers Club, or something quite like that. There was, until a few years ago anyway — maybe still — a saleyard for cattle or an abattoir, on the site.

On the subject of shooting targets one-handed with a shotgun, I've also seen Fred Burns do this, releasing his own clay targets from a single trap, and he didn't miss any! These top gunners were wonderful shots. Newton Thomas, in my company on a trip we had through Victoria and N.S.W., once shot four rabbits with an autoloader, with the reports almost blending together.

I had been pushing rabbits through a box-brush swamp toward Newt when it happened. When I approached he said, "John, I've just missed the biggest rabbit in Australia! He was enormous!" This had been on a property owned at that time by a man named Don Anderson, and the rabbits had been very large ones. I asked Newt if he'd fired 5 shots at the rabbit in question. He looked at me in disbelief that I could ask such a question!

"Oh, no!" he replied. "There are four other rabbits lying here, dead!" There were, of course!

"If I had four eyes," he declared, "I'd shoot with 'em ALL open!"

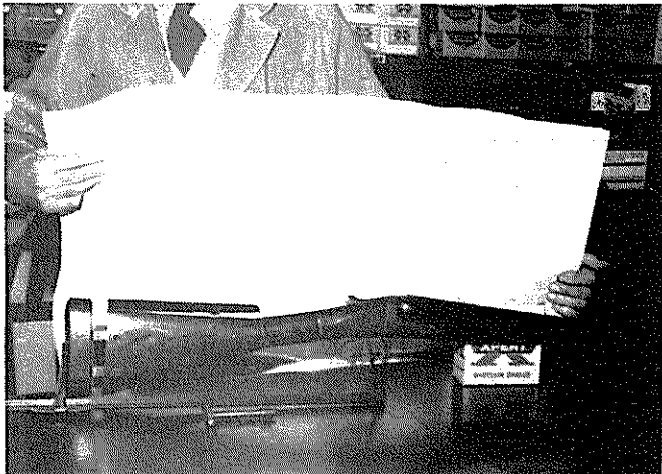
And that advice is surely worth listening to. For Horrie James one day had a wager with a fellow shooter and won it shooting with one hand behind his back, his heavy double in the other. On another occasion he was challenged about the ease of clay target shooting.

His challenger pointed out how much more difficult it was to shoot the live birds — at that time legal. The ensuing match was held at the old East Oakleigh Club — now long gone — and Horrie shot 33 starlings straight. That's great shooting in any language!

Horrie shoots gamebirds too, and his favorite sporting bird is the Jack snipe, and he enjoys the sport given by these very fast and elusive feathered arrows. He has hunted and shot everything in the game line at one time or another, but the snipe remains his firm favorite.

His word of advice for the young shooter is this: Get to know your gun before ever taking it into the field. Get to know all there is to know about it. Handling, loading, unloading, ejection of fired cases, the proper way to close a gun, and the right cartridge and shot-sizes to be used for each type of game. In short, everything one can learn.

This, says Duxbac, one of our greatest gunshots, is what makes a shooter.

He was shooting at a time when the clay target game in Australia was in its infancy, and Horrie began shooting them at the old Nobel Club, about 1928. This was situated at the old Nobel works, at Footscray, Melbourne. It was from here that clay-target shooting spread to the nationwide coverage it enjoys today. And it is largely due to such men that it has become the sport it now is.

Horrie James, like all champions, was always easy to identify on the shooting tracks. He would walk out to the track, jerk his right arm upwards in a characteristic motion to free the coat-sleeve and prevent it binding, then would place his hand beneath the toe of his gun-stock — right on the very end, near the butt-plate.

He would then raise the stock smartly from this position, closing the gun with a snap, then put it to his shoulder and call for the release of his target. He always said this is the correct way to close a gun — best for the locks of the gun, easiest for the shooter, and by far the safest.

By closing the gun this way Horrie says the locks of the gun are sure to shut tightly. He says that many young shooters don't do this, but instead close the gun gently and push the top lever over afterwards. This, he feels, could allow the gun to be partly unlocked when it is put to the shoulder.

His guns — which between them have fired many thousands of rounds — are a William Cashmore, and a William Powell. Both are English guns of a quality not now seen very often, and both of them close as tightly as the day they left the factory.

Both are bored full-choke in both barrels, and both are side-by-side guns, long-barrelled and heavy. Horrie James has had a long association with side-by-side guns, and when the over/under became popular for trap-shooting he tried these, but could not get comfortable with them, and returned to his side-by-side doubles.

Horrie stands very square behind the gun, feet firmly placed, both eyes wide open. And, with the young shooter in mind, I asked him the question of whether it is best to shoot with both eyes open.

He is a slim, fairly tall man, shoulders sloping, with the loose-muscled litheness of a champion boxer. His eyes still have the intentness that made of him the magnificent gun-shot who could take a falling target as it tumbled almost to the grass-tops — the only man I've ever seen who could do this consistently.

Horrie James is particularly well-known for the repairs and stock-making departments of his shop. With so many years of gun-handling and shooting to his credit, there is very little that he doesn't know about the fitting of stocks, gun-handling and all the rest of the lore that goes into making an expert and champion gunshot. Certainly the man to pass on knowledge to the rest of us who are willing and anxious to learn.

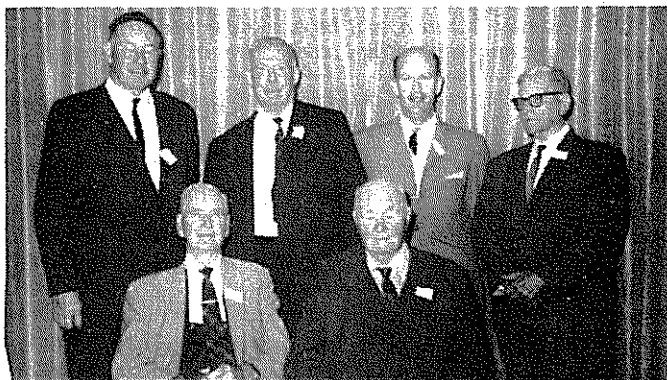
The championship he looks upon with most pride is the Centenary of Shooting, held in 1935, during the celebrations for the Centenary of Melbourne. At this time he was shooting at his top, and performing brilliantly in shooting circles.

At the peak of his shooting form he fired somewhere in the vicinity of 600 to 700 cartridges per week, and it is often said that a man must shoot better than 100 rounds per week to ever expect to gain top-class competition.

This number of cartridges — particularly at today's prices — seems enormous, yet I don't suppose the rules of competition change because of cost. Overseas, where the competition is fierce, many shooters fire this quantity and more each week.

Horrie was born in Coburg, Victoria, and told me he used to shoot rabbits and hares in open country where today large woollen mills stand, and where streets of houses thronged with cars send up their steady roar of sound. And it was not his father who taught him to shoot, but his mother.

His mother had lived in the famed Kelly country, and when young Horrie spent too much time reading by the dim lights of his time, his mother would warn him: "That poor light will ruin your eyes for shooting, son." This always had the desired effect, for fear that such a dreadful thing might indeed come to pass!
