#### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

A very busy March month coming up as we complete arrangements for the 1986 Trap Championships and the 50th Annual General Meeting of the Association both of which will be held in early April.

The Trap Carnival is something that we are really looking forward to. Reports from the various clubs and shooters alike show an unprecedented interest in the competition, this feeling is further strengthened from within the trade as comments have been received that there appears to be a renewed interest in the sport as a whole.

All of this means that you are giving support to Clay Target Shooting and this support will be shown by the numbers attending at Echuca, where records are likely to be established.

The Annual General Meeting on Friday, April 4, will also be of interest and trustfully, well attended as it provides an ideal opportunity to have ideas presented and discussed.

Good ideas should always be worthy of discussion and serious consideration, not all will be acceptable however, this does not mean they are not worthwhile, maybe they have not been prepared with sufficient care or maybe they will need some refinement before considered for adoption, above all else if you have something to offer by way of a suggestion then prepare accordingly and make certain your thoughts and views are made known — an exchange of ideas and views will ultimately benefit all.

Elsewhere in the C.T.S.N. you will find early advice of Notices of Motion that will be presented to the Annual Meeting. In an attempt to clarify the thinking behind these proposed amendments I offer the following points which are to be read in conjunction with the Notice of Motion.

1. The Bluewaters Gun Club have put forward a notice to ensure that clubs must become and remain a member of their respective State Associations to remain affiliated with the A.C.T.A.

The reason quite simply is that State Bodies who control and stage State Championships etc., as well as working on behalf of their State shooters must be authorised by state members to represent the State at National Level.

Unless the State Body is speaking on behalf of all members in its respective State there could and has been in the past areas of difficulty in standardisation of the Association from all levels.

The lines are already established, they now need to be documented.

2. A motion submitted by Cowra Gun Club, quite clearly, wishes new adult shooters to receive an A.C.T.A lapel badge with their record of registration.

This in fact is already happening, however it is the wish of the Cowra Gun Club to formalise the procedure.

3. Submitted on behalf of the Melbourne Gun Club upon advice from the Association's Legal advisers.

The reasons put forward by the Association's Solicitors quite clearly indicate that this Notice of Motion should be approved by members, as the Act is specifically designed for Associations such as ours.

4. An alteration is proposed to ensure that sufficient time is available to allow for discussion on amendments to the Articles or Notices for special meetings.

It is felt that a twelve (12) week period would be sufficient — only a minor amendment put forward by the Townsville Gun Club however, it would be in the best interests of all concerned should this Notice of Motion be approved.

5. A motion is to be submitted under General Business for an increase in the Club affilitation fee as from January 1 1986

The proposed increase from \$10 to \$30 per year is to allow for an increase in the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance policy from \$1m to \$2m. As the increase in cost is substantial it is considered that the proposal to increase

club fees by \$20 would be acting in the most responsible manner.

This would then allow for all clubs to discontinue their own Insurance for registered shooters which will guarantee all persons are protected for a cover of \$2m and clubs would be benefiting by the savings of a minimum of at least \$180 per club.

6. For the purpose of allowing the Executive Committee to propose notices of Motion, the Constitution shall regard the Executive Committee as a member. This will enable the Executive to have matters raised at Committee level placed before the Annual Meeting as a recommendation.

Personally, I believe that all the proposals should be accepted by the meeting as they are in accordance with the best interest of shooters and clubs as well as in the last proposal being economically viable.

In other words — they all make sense to me and I trust that member clubs for the good of the Association will see fit to agree.

#### NOTICE OF MOTION — AN EXPLANATION

- 1. In theory, club delegates at our Annual General Meeting represent the opinion of their club committee and membership, and items listed on the agenda as notice of motion will have been discussed by the club committee and their delegate instructed of their opinion and how to vote.
- 2. Our official organ of communication is Clay Target Shooting News, mailed to each fully registered shooter, and an item listed as notice of motion on the AGM agenda should have an explanation of the proposal in CTSN and an opportunity for opinion opposed to the motion, prior to the AGM, so that everybody down to the grassroots member knows what is proposed and can think over the argument for and against.
- 3. At present only two weeks notice of motion is required prior to the Annual General Meeting, and in the past when only this minimum has been given, the result has been:
- (i) few club delegates have known of the motion prior to the meeting and so can only vote by their personal and hasty opinion on the matter.
- (ii) few club committees will have had opportunity to meet and discuss the proposal and instruct their delegate.
- (iii) No mention of the notice of motion will have been in CTSN nor a detailed explanation supporting the motion nor a chance for an opinion against the motion to be printed.
- (iv) If such a motion is passed then those opposed have a right to complain that it was "railroaded through" and they were denied the democratic right to have an argument opposing the motion fully considered. This failure of the democratic process leads to breakaway groups.
- 4. Why twelve weeks notice of motion? The 1986 Annual General Meeting is held on the 4th April and to allow a club committee a chance to meet and discuss the motion, articles must be printed in the March edition of CTSN. Articles for the March edition of CTSN must be on the editor's desk on 1st February and to allow time for preparation of items supporting and opposing the motion early January is the latest that notice of motion for the AGM should be received . . . twelve weeks prior to the AGM.
- 5. If this proposal is accepted, the result should be an improvement of standard of the Annual General Meeting and avoidance of last minute motions which can upset the harmony of ACTA.





#### NOTICES OF MOTION TO AMEND THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

1. Notice of Motion: Submitted by Bluewaters Gun Club Article 5 to be amended to include, following the words "admit to membership of the Association."

(A) "Providing however that the Executive Committee shall have the power to refuse membership to such clubs as are not or do not remain affiliated members of their respective State Associations."

(B) "Any member not becoming or remaining an affiliated member of its State Association shall cease ipso facto to be a member of the Association.'

2. Notice of Motion: Submitted by Cowra Gun Club

Article 40 to be amended to include:-

(A) 40 (d) Adult Shooters registering for the first time with the Association shall be forwarded the A.C.T.A. Lapel badge with their record of registration.

3. Notice of Motion: Submitted by Melbourne Gun Club acting of the advice of the Association's Legal Advisors.

(A) The Association migrate from being a Company, Limited by Guarantee under section 66 of the Companies code, to a body Incorporated under the Associations Incorporation (VI) Act 1981, which is an Act especially designed to regulate Associations such as the Australian Clay Target Association.

4. Notice of Motion: Submitted by Townsville Article 36 to be amend to include:-

(A) 36 (c) Notices of Motion that propose alterations to the Articles of Association must be received by the Association at least twelve (12 weeks) prior to any General Meeting at which they are to be presented.

5. Notice of Motion: Submitted by the Melbourne Gun

Article 36 to be amended to include:—

(A) 36(d) For the purpose of submitting Notices of Motion to Annual or special General Meetings. The Executive Committee to be considered to be a member.

attempted by others.



 Victorious in the International Invitation Trap Team 100, Bill Iles (93), Terry Rumbel (99) and Jim Ellis (98).



The last 25 saw Rick Smith drop another and, at the completion of the shoot off, John Wooley emerged as the clear winner on 174-175 from Rick Smith U.S.A. 173-175. Next on 99-100 was Vincent Teo of Malaysia with Glen Clarke our Australian Junior producing the best Australian score with 97-100.

The 200T South Pacific Championships, A.C.T.A. Open, was next and with 100T behind them the score was set for what should be a great shooting match. After two days of shooting some fine scores had been recorded.

The trap field was led by Terry Rumbel and Domingo Diaz both on 149-150 from Hobbs of the U.S.A. 148-150, closely followed by Australia's Jim Ellis and Russell Mark on 147-150 and the last 50T was obviously going to be very interesting.

At the same mark, the skeet field was being led by Ian Hale and Al Mullins of the U.S.A. both scoring 147-150, a point ahead of Rick Smith U.S.A.

At the completion of the 200T event, a new Australian and South Pacific Shooting Federation Olympic Trap record score had been set by Terry Rumbel with what all agreed had been an outstanding shoot with a final score of 199-200. Terry naturally also took out the title of the South Pacific Shooting Federation Championship.

Domingo Diaz recorded an excellent 198-200, good

The S.P.S.F. Championships were won by Ian Hale of Australia with a score of 194-200. The competition from overseas was excellent and Ian Hale with his 194 was only one target behind the open winner at the completion of the 200T. Our visitors were clearly surprised by the standard of our Australians and really had to work harder than they may have thought they would to record their scores.

With the South Pacific Championships completed, all were anxiously awaiting the first shot of the Australian National Championships. An influx of new competitors increased the squads and in the hot and humid conditions that were prevailing the shoot was on.



At conclusion of the 200T we had two new National Champions.





I cannot give specific advice about problems with technique unless I know what that problem is, but there is generalized advice about preparation for a major shoot that might assist shooters.

The nationals are a grand event by any standards, the numbers of competitors makes it special and different to any other event, as does the fact that they are to decide Australia's best D.T.L. shooters. I think it is the goal of most serious clay shooters to not only participate in the nationals but to win a national championship.

Many good club shooters have told me that they are disappointed with their performances at the nationals, I would put this down in most cases to pressure and the lack of big match experience. The advice that I give then is to help shooters cope with that tension and pressure.

1. Mistakes are made because the gun is held too tightly when the shooter is nervous, that all important follow through is affected.

To combat this the gun must become a part of the shooter's body, the shooter must feel that the gun is just an extension of their arms.

This feeling is achieved by the constant handling of the gun, put it in a convenient place at home, being aware of gun safety of-course, pick the gun up every day, practice holding it, practice shooting an imaginary target, watch yourself in the mirror, and be pleased with the way you feel when shooting that imaginary clay.

The American Army Team shooters both male and female use their guns to exercise with, lifting, twisting and bending exercises gets the body used to the weight of the gun.

2. Tiredness affects many shooters, they are not used to competition each day for a week, and often do not have the stamina required, they shoot well in the pre-nationals and then peter out when the nationals are on.

It is important then to build up your stamina and fitness in the weeks leading up to the nationals.

Try to practise at least once during the week and use the local shoots as build up practice. You will then find it much easier to get into the rhythm of shooting each day, when you get there.

• 1. STARTING POSITION. Side straddle, regular stance, weapon forward. 2. CADENCE. Moderate. 3. MOVEMENT. A 4-count exercise. At the count of: (a) ONE. Send the trunk to the left. Keep the knees straight. (b) TWO. Recover to the starting position. (c) THREE. Bend the trunk to the right. Keep the knees straight. (d) FOUR. Recover to the starting position.

3. Train yourself to think of your shooting as a series of one target competitions. If you keep shooting that one target you will win the shoot, but if you are pre-occupied with winning the shoot you will miss that one target.

4. Consciously wait to see the target before you shoot, you must see it clearly, and focus on it, you can't shoot something you can't see. Practise this until it is a natural process. The first thing that happens to many shooters is that nervousness makes them jump the target, they don't wait to see it.

When you do see it shoot it, you will find that you will smash it to smithereens. You can practise this process in your mind's eye when at home or anywhere you have a quiet minute. Imagination is a wonderful thing, imagine the whole process, see yourself waiting to shoot, putting the gun up and shooting it. Our top shooters all mentally rehearse to some degree.

5. Develop your mental toughness, this can be done in conjunction with developing your fitness. Prove to yourself that you can mentally make yourself do things you would not normally want to do. To give you an example, make yourself get up at say 6 a.m. and go for a

When jogging go that extra 100 yards when you think your too tired, and then congratulate yourself when you do. Win battles with yourself, you will find that when it comes to making yourself concentrate on the next target in a pressure situation, it will be so much easier to do.

6. Organise your stay at the nationals so that you can, as much as possible continue your normal living patterns. If you are used to going to bed at 11 p.m. don't suddenly start trying to go to bed at 8 p.m.


7. Get to know the lay-out of the gun club when you get there and feel comfortable and at home.

8. Believe in yourself, believe that you can shoot whatever that trap can throw out.

Finally, I will be looking forward to meeting as many of you as possible at the nationals. It is a great opportunity to meet old friends and to make new ones. On a different note to end with I would like to congratulate John Maxwell on winning the New Zealand I.S.U. Nationals with a score of 192/200 John has been N.Z. champion twice now, congratulations John.

Vice President Robbie Smith attended a meeting in early December of the above body and reports the following:

#### **BUFFER ZONES**

This matter was discussed at length and, as everybody agreed, that the cost to Clubs — to buy or lease this land would be too great. It was thought that we should get Town Planners, Local Government and Councils to realize our situation when giving consideration to future development of their areas.

To help in this regard, we, the NSWCTA have been asked to supply the State Pollution Control Commission (at their next meeting on March 19, 1986) with the following:

We require information on the 20 most likely affected Clubs in this State.

#### Information Required is:

- 1. Distance from town;
- 2. Distance from nearest (a) Residence (b) Factory (c) Farm;
- 3. Size of Club Grounds;
- 4. Size of Clubhouse traps etc.;
- 5. Number of Members;
- 6. Any other relevant information.

This request will be in February "News" so I am asking ALL CLUBS to write to us a letter URGENT giving us the above details. We can then send a report to their next meeting on the situation as it affects our members.

#### INCORPORATION OF CLUBS AND ASSOCIATIONS

The Law Society has a video tape and information package available on incorporation of Clubs and Associations. Cost is: \$85 the lot to keep; or \$55 the lot with video tape only hired.

Clubs — don't forget to keep your list of voluntary workers advised to the ACTA. If you do not supply their names they are not covered under our insurance policy — in the event of an injury each member of your Club could be held liable. Advise the ACTA on a regular basis and protect yourself.


Michael's pictures during the competition won him two of the monthly prizes for accuracy when he shot at the Colac V.S.B.R.A. Club under lights.

There was one nasty incident reported for the day with someone having dismantled two guns, mixing barrels, stocks and fore ends and putting them back together one bit from here one bit from there.



Trophy donors were Attalla's Gift Shop, Kerang; Alister





The blue ribbon event of the day was the Commonwealth night double barrel championship.


Until now, you could be excused for not realising some of the big guns like Berry, Hipwell, Whittacker, Glenn, Spence and Bouchier were in attendance.

veterans, ladies and juniors respectively.


By now, patience was being stretched as the last event was started. A sting in the tail of the program a points-score championship, hopefully to help give clear winners in all sections of the high gun.

they wanted another event and they could have been in it for overall!


A. Sheard took out C grade again and D. Fenn, D. Burton and Liza Williams veteran, juniors and ladies.

the Commonwealth Continental Double Barrel Championship, which saw Greg Hipwell emerge as the winner.






#### HAPPY 75TH ANNIVERSARY CRESSY








