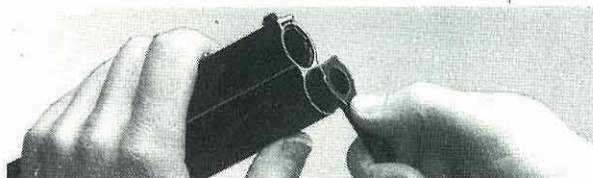

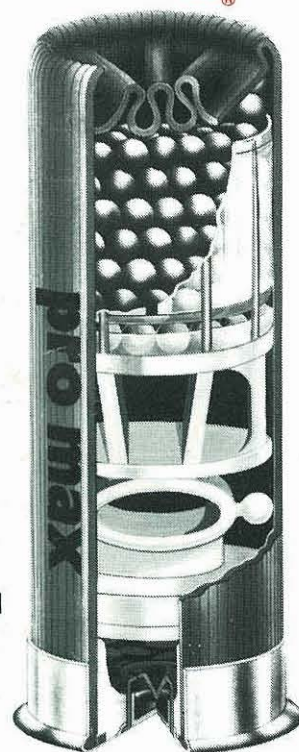

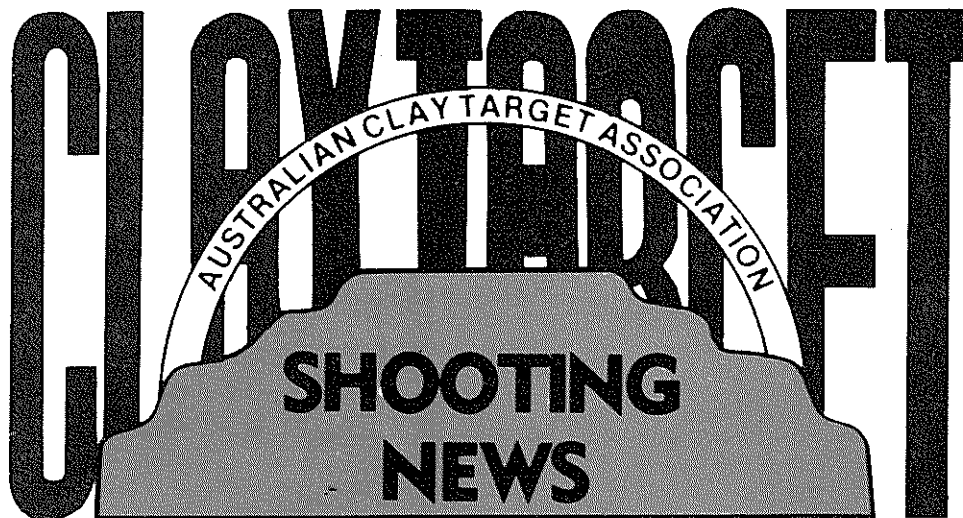

AUSTRALIA DAY OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

A.C.T. INTERNATIONAL GUN CLUB 25 & 26 JANUARY, 1986

The weather smiled kindly on the would-be Australia Day Olympic Trap champions during two days of first class competition, which saw Jimmy Ellis come from behind to tie with his many-times rival, John Maxwell, but fail to win the shoot-off by the narrowest of margins.

Up and coming shooters Fillipo Petriella and Robert Thompson again did well to win the junior class & A class respectively. The ever reliable Kevin Perkins again shot well and together with Thompson and Petriella won The Australia Day "Special Achievement in Sport" medallions.

DAY ONE

Perfect conditions for perfect scores; and Fillipo Petriella, John Fryer and John Maxwell obliged, to card perfect scores in round one; Robert Thompson, Kevin Perkins and Norm Simms in round two; and Jim Ellis, "Pud" Burgess & John Maxwell in round four. Quite amazingly there were no perfect scores in round three!

At the end of competition on day one, Maxwell 98 and Petriella and Perkins both on 97 led the field of thirty nine.

The immaculate Clifford Bailey led AA on 96, Burgess and Simms A, on 95 and Gary Webster B, on 88.

The small field of C graders was making hard work of the targets but Andy Woodman showed the way on 69. Junior A Vella, was well placed in his class on 88.

DAY TWO

The highlights of the day were the 99s by Ellis and Thompson. In fact the 24 in the last round cost Ellis the championship, though 100 straight is an excellent performance by any standard.

Such was the calibre of the competitors, that the pressure of day two produced seventeen 25s, eight more than the previous day.

At the halfway mark on day two, the accomplished Kevin Perkins was out in front on 146, Ellis 145, Bailey 144, Maxwell 144 and Petriella also on 144. It was neck-and-neck until the final round but it was the competition hardened campaigners Ellis and Maxwell who inched to the lead in a nail-biting finish.

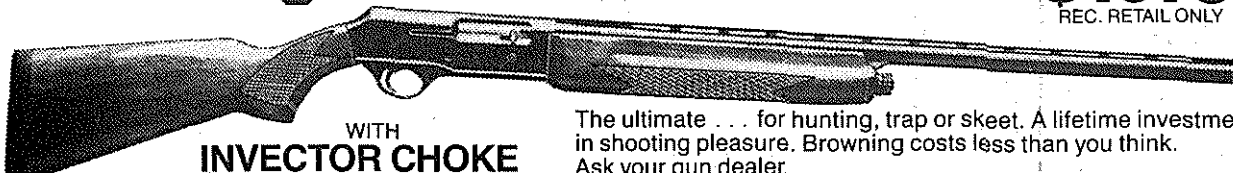

THE CASE FOR REFEREES

John Doyle — Darwin Gun Club

I have watched the decline in refereeing standards in recent years with dismay. In 1978, at the Adelaide Nationals, referees were selected by the Association, and paid for their duties. I believe that this Nationals was the last time that a reasonable refereeing standard was maintained. That this was so, was due in no small part to the organizing abilities of the A.C.T.A. and the South Australian body, and also to the capability of the Shoot Marshal, the late George Bremen.

In Perth, in 1980, referees were also selected and paid, but real difficulty was experienced in getting volunteers, selecting experienced and capable referees, and organizing them.

I may be open to correction, but I believe that the 1980 Perth Nationals was the last time paid referees were used.

At present, at National level, we have a selection system where official referees in a squad are used to referee the following squad, whether the referee is efficient or useless, fresh or tired, good or indifferent on the button, etcetera. Equality of competition is a joke at National levels, regardless of the efforts of officials to preserve it.

The stock answer to the criticism above is that, if a referee does not come up to the expectations, he will be replaced. And he usually is, too, if the squad complains. . . . AFTER the damage is done.

Also, at National, and State levels, many experienced and capable shooters will not referee, having either deliberately neglected to obtain a badge, or letting it lapse. Who can blame them? They state openly that they are there to perform not adjudicate. Refereeing AND shooting takes off their competitive edge, and too much time and effort has been put into their shooting performances leading up to the 'big one' for them to destroy themselves when it really counts.

I am not saying that all top shooters refuse to referee — many accept refereeing as part and parcel of a major shoot.

But many do not.

And their attitudes create resentment in one section, and admiration in another section of the shooting fraternity. A great number reckon, 'If they won't referee, why should I?' And why should they, if they do not wish to referee. All that will be gained by forcing a reluctant shooter to adjudicate will be a squad seriously disadvantaged by his reluctance.

It is far better, in any level of competition, to obtain referees who WANT to referee.

'Very easy to say', the answer is, 'but try and get referees. We've tried at the Nationals, and have failed'.

Why has recruiting referees failed? I believe that is insufficient inducement to encourage referees to want to adjudicate.

At Club level, the budding shooter is told NOT to get a referee's badge by many shooters, as there's only trouble if you've got one, and you don't really need one if you're asked to push a button at the Club, and there's nothing in it for you at District, Zone, State or National levels. They're right too!

At National level, I believe that ALL referees must be selected BEFORE the competition starts; Referees should be paid WELL, as the shooters pay to shoot at the Nationals; that preferably they should shoot in their own competition before Nationals, or at least, shoot together in squads at the beginning or end of each event; that trophies be allocated for referees for refereeing skills by shooters and officials; that distinctive badges be awarded for refereeing at a National event; the list is as long as you would wish to make it, to encourage referees.

Why can this not be done? The answer will probably be along the lines of 'Too much trouble to organize'.

But until we take the trouble to organize our refereeing structure, we will continue to suffer a decline in refereeing, and consequently, in shooting.

In other sports, when a player's career is over, or if a player is not good enough to be 'First's' material, he can go onto the administrative side of the sport, or he can become an official. I can cite VFL umpires, runners, etcetera as examples of this.

In shooting there is no incentive to remain in the sport if one cannot become a top shooter. By providing incentives, we will retain more shooters in the sport. We will give Club referees a goal to aim for. And we will entice more shooters to become proficient referees.

Even at Club, District, Zone and State level, these principles can be applied. For example, have you ever been to a Club that gave a trophy to, say, the best referee on the day, awarded by the shooters? I haven't, but I reckon it would be one step in the right direction.

And we must start somewhere.
Very soon.

These are examples of forward thinking, and worthy of emulation by other organising bodies.

The Association welcomed back its 'wandering sons', the N.T. I.S.U. team, who returned recently, trophyless, but with a wealth of anecdotes and experience to share. Well done Dexter, Greg and Phil.

As mentioned before in these columns, it's a shame that no elimination matches were held for I.S.U. Skeet, as some dedicated Skeeties would have welcomed the competition and experience available in Brisbane in February. Next time please, N.T.C.T.A.!

AROUND AND ABOUT

This section is devoted to rumours. The biggest one floating around at present is the one about Jabiru striking trouble in completion of another layout in preparation for its turn at the N.T. Trap titles in June. Some dedicated members are thinking of leaving the area perhaps, but I feel sure that the 'permanents' will rally and all will be well. It would be a shame to deprive the non-travellers at Jabiru of the excitement of the titles. Some of the younger shooters in this area are 'hell on wheels'.

HERE AND THERE

Top End are getting their three squads of shooters to the Field and Game layout, and this number will undoubtedly double as the year goes on. The layout is reasonably easy, with the only 'impossible' shot a long distance ¼ choke right-quartering tree-seeking target. As most shooters opt for open chokes around the layout, there are many 'breeders' left at this station.

Eric Rhinelander, one of the Club's long-time shooters, doesn't often shoot a possible, but has more fun than most of us pursuing the elusive birds with a Teutonic drilling of pedigree.

On a low note, the Club has sited one trap to throw a high right hand, close range target, which, though not unsafe in itself locally, causes visitors and vehicles at the starting point to be showered by shot on a reasonably regular basis. Eyes are important, so a small target flight change should avoid any possibility of accident or incident. How about it, fellows?

Another recent Field and Game shooter, ex S.A., is Bob Cadd, who has recently given Darwin shooters a tussle on the trap and skeet layouts. From his old 20 metre mark, Bob shot the lot in a handicap event recently, and looked set for major honours. Dark horse Daryl Read pipped Cadd on the 35th target, from his 19 metre mark. Bob was also beaten in the continental event when he dropped his final target to let John Francis in unopposed, but won the 'A' grade section after a four-way shoot-off. Good on yer, Bob! It must be all that practice with the new .450/500 toy.

Darwin Gun Club got an unpleasant letter through the mail from the local Council recently, demanding \$3300 in

arrears in rates for the complex. The Club was 'promised' by the N.T. Government on removal to its new location that rates were almost non-existent, being a token payment. Not so, apparently. All clubs in the area were 'crucified', and appeals to the N.T. Government are proceeding.

Alice Springs is reported to be in a slump at present, with falling membership. It's a hard trend to reverse in the present climate but, hopefully, things are on the improve.

Mark Grosvenor, reported previously as an improver, took the honours in Katherine in a double rise event recently, scoring 37-40. His recent efforts have not been as spectacular, but perhaps a number of safety catch parts in the internals of the gun contributed towards the temporary downfall. It was a sight to behold on the walks; the gun which would not cock; would not fire when triggered, on first one barrel, then on second barrel; would not open, then would not stay open; etcetera, etcetera. Good fun, eh, Mark?

SAFETY

At a recent shoot, an 'unknown to the office' shooter was squadded in the competition. You guessed it, a brand-new competitor. Even with a safety man behind him, he managed to blast the walks a metre in front of him. Result, a very hasty exit after the round by a red-faced would-be competitor. Unfortunately for the Club and the shooter, it may have been his first and last shoot. It is completely unfair to both beginner and other squad shooters to squad a tyro in a competitive squad. Perhaps it's a comment on Club practice, where, in small clubs, where everyone knows everyone, no one thought to introduce himself at the office or outside; no one inspected his card, or lack thereof; the referee and scorer proceeded without enquiry, and so on. It's easy to blame, everyone could cop a serve, but I think we should learn from our mistakes, and this particular mistake is perpetrated throughout Australia.

On a lighter note to conclude, a shooter was heard to remark, after missing a target in the event, 'He really put me off my shooting, and I wasn't even in the same squad. Good one, Bob! A new excuse!

N.T.C.T.A. NEWS

Jabiru Gun Club reports that, contrary to rumours circulating, it is 'all systems GO' for the State Trap Championship to be held there over the Queen's Birthday Weekend. Minor problems were experienced with the second layout, but that's been sorted out. The last rumour is that the Club's thinking of putting in a skeet layout also. Great idea, Jabiruvians!

Bob Dalgliesh, from Gove, visited the Darwin Gun Club's Championship weekend recently and reported that the Arnhem Gun Club, while presently non-competitive, is alive and well, with fortnightly shoots averaging three squads. Here's hoping that the Club returns to its former proud place in the Territory calendar very soon.

HERE AND THERE

Speaking of Gove reminds me to advise all interested gun buyers that Graham 'Scrubby' Joiner has returned to the Clay-busting fold again, but does not anticipate a return to wheeling-dealing in weaponry. Really, Scrubby?

win Motor firm with a Gove branch. This trophy was for the overall high gun for the weekend, and guess who won? So back it came with Graham to occupy pride of place in the lounge for many a season. The sooner we return to shoots like that one, the better it will be for Territory shooting, as the shoot was a model of hospitality, courtesy and excellent shooting.

Jenny Fabian cursed the Darwin Traps during the Championship weekend as she had a 'horror squad' to compete in, which averaged six targets per breakdown over the 50 targets. However, after 'chucking a wobbly' on conclusion of that event, she went out in the double barrel and blew away 49, to win her grade, and shoot off for overall honours. That's showing how it's done, Jenny.

To carry the story on to its conclusion, Jenny dropped out after another dozen, leaving 'C' grader Nick Magriplis to go to the bitter end with 'A' grader Phil Grove. Phil courteously let his 24th slip away, leaving Nick the 1986 Champion, and also a 'B' grader.

Back to cursing traps, John Doyle did a bit of that after he was bitten while demonstrating to a trapper that 'you can't get hurt if you use your left hand'. The trapper also found out, courtesy of J.D. that it pays to watch what you're doing also. The incident didn't seem to affect J.D.'s shooting in the Double Rise event, when he took Overall with 47/50.

The Godfather, Greg Chan, shot the possible 150/150 in the Points Score event, taking Overall in this event uncontested, on the way to winning Overall High Gun honours for the shoot.

Darwin seems to attract many social shooters to its practice sessions on Wednesdays and Fridays, but finds the conversion rate of social to competitive shooter minimal. With the savagely competitive 'C' and 'B' grades at present shooting, perhaps it's time to programme some 'Novice' or 'D' grade shoots to retain the newer shooters? Also, perhaps a few more 10 target events would not go astray for the same members, who may 'strike it lucky' over a small event, but don't have a hope in a 30 bird contest. It's worth a try!

1986 NORFOLK ISLAND INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING ROUSING SUCCESS

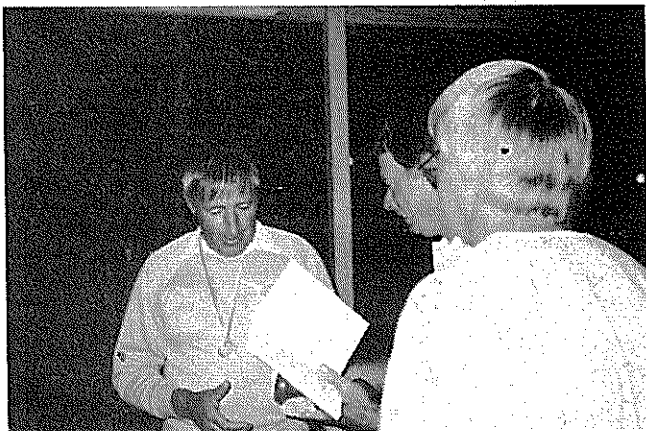

As usual the Norfolk Island members excelled themselves on the fish fry and presentation dinner nights. These social events were enjoyed by all who attended.

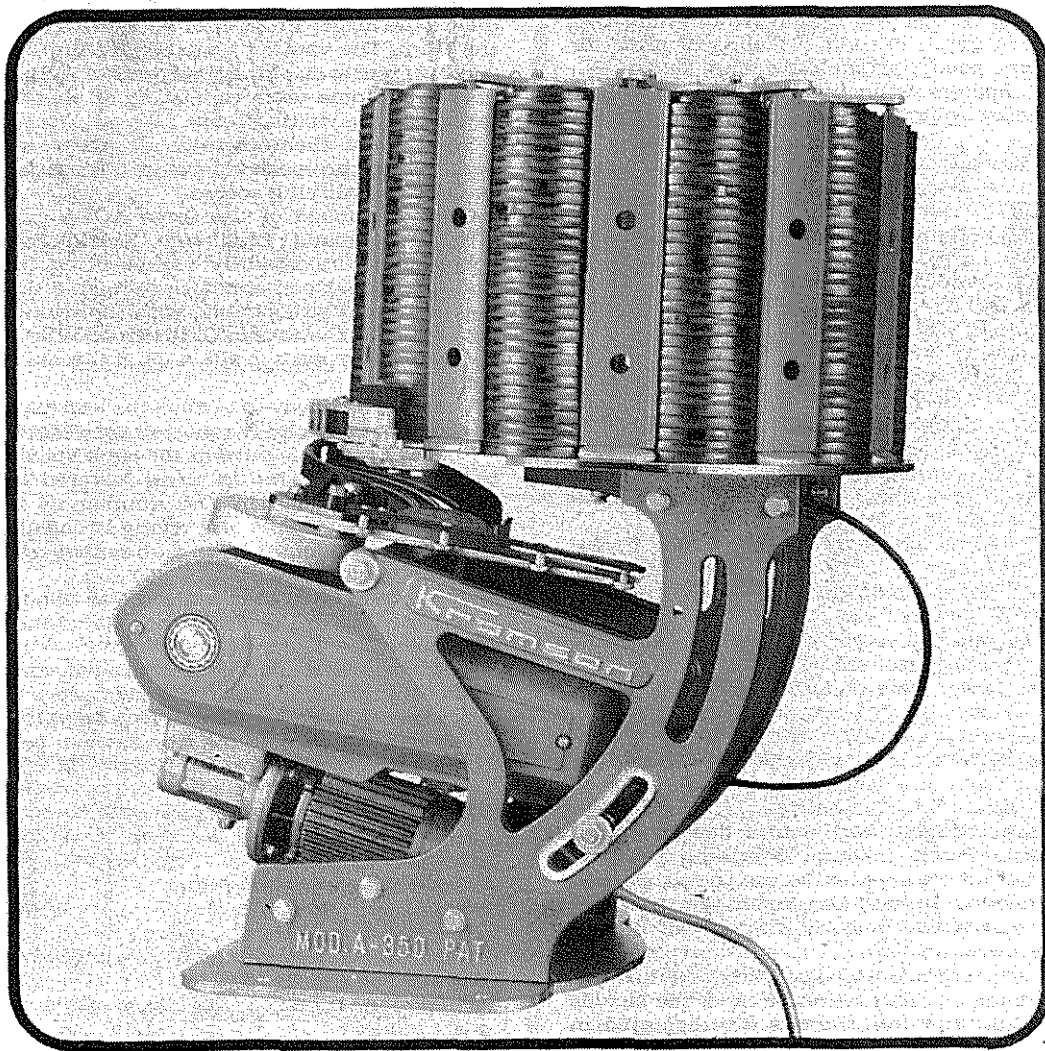

TEAM SHOOTING. THE WAY TO BETTER SPORTSMANSHIP?

Clay Target shooters are generally a fairly strong minded and independent type of person, and without doubt, some of the strongest personalities in sport are in the non-team sports such as ours. The need for great concentration over long periods of time, and nobody else to blame when it all goes wrong, must surely attract or produce (I'm not sure which) people having a strong inner determination and sometimes selfishness and short temperedness as well.

When people of such types meet and disagree, as we have all seen from time to time at our own clubs, fireworks usually follow, and little rational thinking usually takes place before words, usually regretted later, are spoken.

For this reason a greater affinity amongst shooters should be nurtured. One of the best ways of doing this would have to be to instill in them a feeling of pride for their club, and some good, old fashioned team spirit.

In competition, shooters rarely compete in teams events and little if any team spirit is evident in too many of our clubs.

My home club, Roma currently contests five team shield events. Three of these are with other clubs, one is with the general public, and the last is between members of local oil companies at our oil-patch sponsored shoot. All five shields create great interest, and encourage better attendances at both our Annual Shoot and our public Charity and oil patch shoots. We see the same teams of members of the general public, turning up each year and it is from this main source that we try to snare a new member or two.

At our Annual ACTA shoot the team shoots are run in conjunction with events on the program, and do not interfere with the running of the shoot in any way. By holding teams shoots at our annual shoot in conjunction with three other nearby clubs, we encourage a team of five of their shooters to attend. This has lifted our attendances by fifteen shooters almost overnight.

This particular teams shoot is run between Roma, Tambo, Charleville, and Cunnamulla clubs at their respective annual shoots. Small memento-type trophies are presented to the winning team at each venue. At the last annual in each year the year's total scores are tallied and the winning team presented with the Wattle Glen Shield, which was generously donated in early 1984 by Wattle Glen Tanneries.

It is held by the winning club for the next year. Roma Gun Club has constructed a trophy display cabinet for exhibiting these shields and other trophies and items of interest.

It is an engaging display with cards describing all trophies and exhibits, and is quite a talking point at Charity Shoots where there are members of the public who have never seen a trap gun, let alone an old Sniper which exploded and removed its owner's fingers at a well remembered local duck shoot.

Shields are often lost or misplaced and this was the main reason for the cabinet's construction, none of the shields now leaves the club, and the winners are displayed in appropriate surroundings.

Groups of shooters travelling together to distant shoots are also a way of promoting good fellowship and to this end we have in the past hired a bus to take club members to shoots. It works out cheaper than small groups in cars and allows a few ales to be drunk, without any worries about making it home in one piece. The Western Zone QCTA has recently introduced team jackets as an incentive to shooters to attend their zone shoot and qualify for the team.

They are tailored to size, personalised, and presented to team members at the following years Zone Carnival.

Roma club members coats have Roma Gun Club on the back of them, and this helps promote both team spirit and our club when we travel to other shoots.

Some people believe that team shoots are only catering for the better shots, but this can be avoided by a simple method suggested to us by some Gold Coast shooters when arranging the competition rules for our newest shield, the Kilima Motel Shield.

At team shoot venues there is always a home team and a visiting team. The home team is always at an advantage due to the larger number of shooters from which to select the team. The visiting team could be made up of shooters coming from each of the three grades A, B, & C. All we do is propose a home team consisting of shooters in the same grades as the visiting team.

This allows shooters from all grades a chance to take part. Teams are selected using the scores from previous events as qualifying scores.

Only one shield of the three ACTA orientated shields (The Queensland Challenge Shield) is contested by shooters not necessarily representing particular clubs, and this allows odd shooters to form a team also. Teams pay in a small sweepstake, with the winning team taking all. Sunshine Coast Gun Club has another variation where a shooter from each grade A, B, & C make up a three man team.

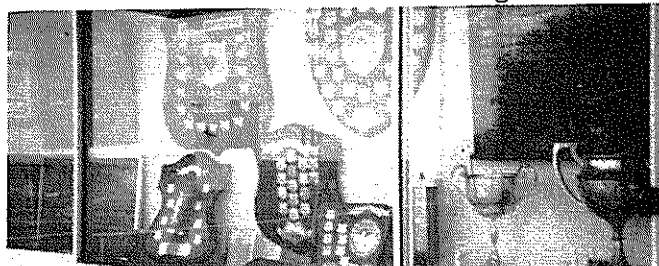
This is a good way to involve the less experienced or less proficient shooter in the pursuit for team spirit.

I believe that this pursuit for team spirit, club pride and better sportsmanship is being fostered by team shoots, and it can be seen by the number of shooters keenly examining the scoreboard, trying to calculate the winners of team events long before club management has time to post the team totals.

How often is it that a group of shooters facing the scoreboard all are backing the one winner, and not just themselves?


Team shoots should be encouraged, and clubs holding them congratulated for trying to improve the sport. Clubs not presently holding team events should give it a try.

The cost is little and the rewards can be great.

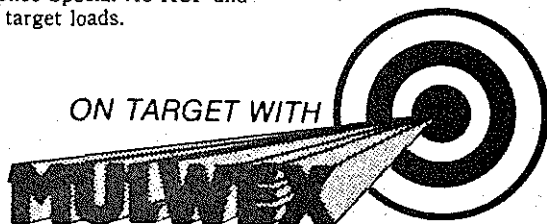

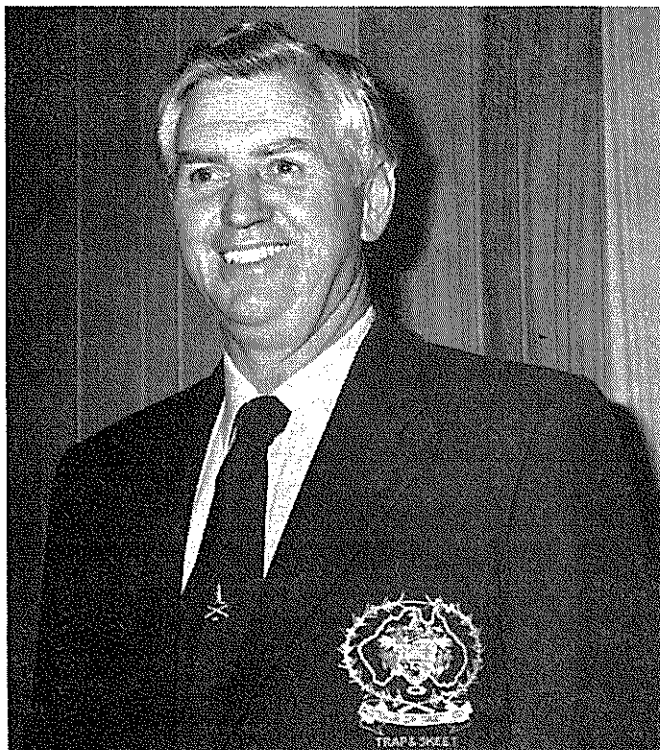

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR



I'M BUYING A NEW GUN, WHAT SHOULD I BUY?

This is the question that I am asked repeatedly on my travels. I firstly ask why the new gun is needed, often I find that the shooter feels his gun does not fit, perhaps it never did, sometimes shooters have altered their guns to such an extent, with bits off here and bits off there, that the gun no longer fits as it once did, so a new gun is needed.

When we start shooting poorly, we look for causes other than ourselves, and the poor old gun is blamed. Sometimes the fact of doing an alteration will make a shooter concentrate harder, and so their scores will improve temporarily, but so often it is a basic error in technique that is at fault, not the gun.

I do believe that it is possible to shoot with a gun that does not fit. We have all known game shooters who have been successful with guns that should have been discarded, but that is not the point. A gun that fits and feels good, has good balance and a pattern suited to clay shooting, with little recoil, is a wonderful thing to own.

When buying a new gun the brand is not, I believe, of great importance. But like most things in a commercial world, the more expensive guns are usually patterned and tested individually and are more finely tuned and balanced than the production line models and brands. This is not to say that it is not possible to get a production line gun that patterns well and suits the shooter.

In the shooting world the popularity of different makes of guns seem to follow fashion. When the world champion uses a certain brand it seems to set a trend that the other International shooters follow.

For your interest I will list just a few of the good shooters and the brand of gun that they use.

OLYMPIC TRAP

You will see from the above that the shooters listed use a variety of brands. The important thing is that the gun must fit, and have a good pattern. The fit is all important, so if you win the lottery, go overseas to one of the manufacturers and have a gun tailor made for you, or be measured here by an expert and send the measurements to the manufacturer and have one made especially for you.

I always think the ultimate would be to be A.F. Burns, a great shooter who had a presentation gun made for him and he described the gun when it arrived nine months later by sea. "It is of a single-trigger design, it is perfectly balanced.

"The stock is fiddleback cut from the oldest section of a walnut butt. The hand engraving rivals fine oriental inlay work and includes the owner's name in gold and the word "special" in copperplate gold along the top barrel rib. A pigeon is engraved in gold on the top lever.

"Hand-beaten gold rosettes adorn the sides of the barrels. A jacksnipe in full flight is in handbeaten gold and inlaid on the trigger guard. With a magnifying glass, it is possible to detect the detail in the bird's breast feathers. The trigger itself is gold-plated and knurled."

So much for dreaming, but for the majority of we shooters there are many reputable gun shops with trained staff who will welcome considered and careful selection by any shotgunner. Here are a few general hints for selecting a gun.

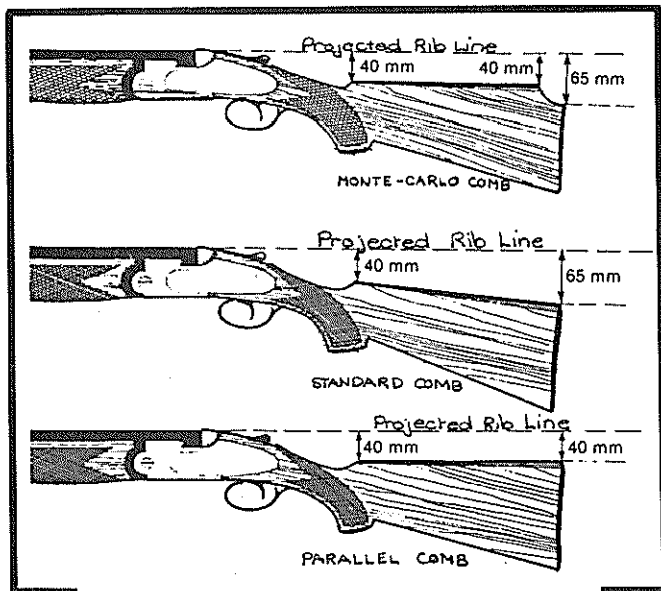
1. Under and over shot guns are better suited to clay shooting. It has the simplicity of the side by side, without the recoil behaviour, and is more reliable than the automatics. There have been some great shooters who have succeeded with side by sides and automatics but it is my view that all round, the under and over is best for trap shooting.
2. Take a friend to the shop with you, and when you position yourself comfortably in a shooting position, get the friend to check the fit of the gun. Ask him or her to look at you from the muzzle end to see that your eye is perfectly in line with the centre of the rib. This is to be done only when the gun is mounted in the natural shooting position, you must not strain to align the eye.
3. Check the height of the comb so that when you look down the centre of the rib you can place two 20 cent pieces on the rear of the rib by the breach. It should still be possible for you to see the front site. In other words the shooter should be looking down on to the rib, not along it.
4. The top of the comb should be parallel with the projected rib line for trap shooting. Also for American Skeet shooting with the gun up, I personally believe a parallel stock is also suitable, for Olympic Skeet a slight drop at the heel can be used.

5. Because everybody is built differently, the cast of the stock is something the shooter should consider. It is better to get a gun with the appropriate cast to fit your body than to have the stock altered later. The length of the stock and the pitch angle of the butt might have to be adjusted to body size and shape.
6. Some guns have an oil finished stock which is too high, too long, and too full. This is to allow a stock maker to make the finished gun fit, so in this case it is necessary to have a gunsmith or a stockmaker adjust the stock, as the manufacturer intended.
7. Most good guns are accompanied by pattern sheets. If not, ask if you can pattern the gun, ideally for trap shooting first barrel at approximately 30 metres should give a pattern of $\frac{1}{4}$ to two thirds of the shot pattern above the point aimed at on the sheet, 2nd barrel approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ pattern above the point aimed at. This is because the first shot in clay shooting is usually rising much more than the second shot. For Skeet shooting, for both first and second barrel, half the pattern should be above.

If you have any questions on the above, discuss the purchase with your club or zone coach, as I have said, a good gun that fits well and patterns well, is a great asset to any shooter. I believe that clay shooters, to be consistently successful need to be at one with the gun as the eye is used as a rear sight and the height of the eye determines how high the gun shoots.

A shotgun is an expensive and important purchase so good shopping and good shooting to you.

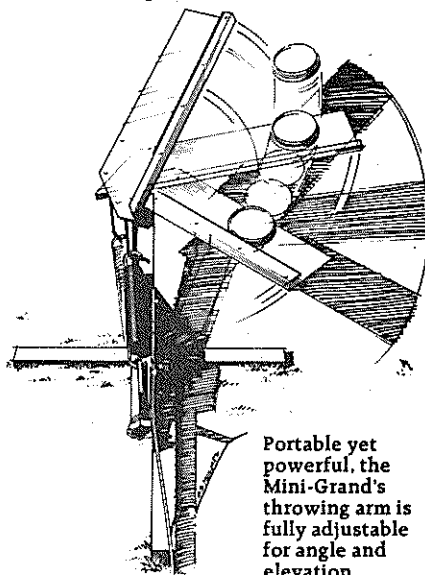

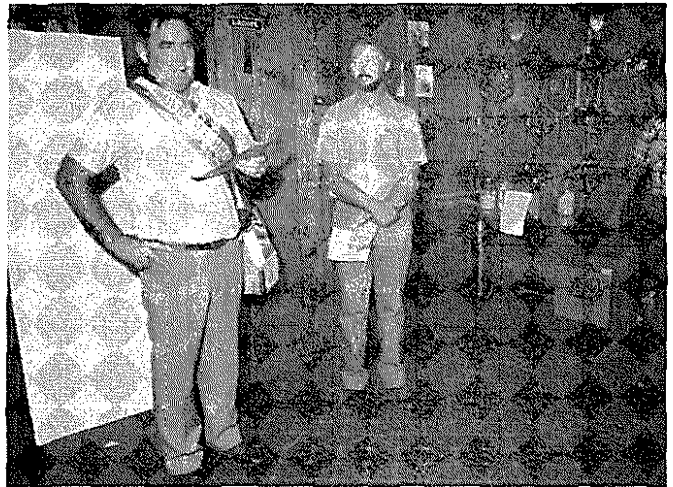

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

I have been reading with interest the nostalgic articles appearing in the News.

I have no great claim to fame as an old shooter, having started shooting about 1940 at the age of ten, then graduating to clay targets and live birds about 1948, and have been sniffing large quantities of burnt gunpowder ever since.

The shooter I wish to brag about, and I think could take the record as the oldest shooter, is my Father, Bill Cations. He started shooting in 1911 and still goes out at least once a week and quite often comes home with three or four rabbits without a miss. He turned eighty four last December.

In the early days they quite often used muzzle loaders, and one of the funny incidents he relates of the old days was when he and his brother were heading, in the horse and cart, from Werribee to the (now historic) Point Cook Homestead, which was then the residence of one of the Chirnside families. Game was in abundance those days and at one stage a hare ran across in front of the horse and cart, Dad grabbed the gun and bowled the hare over, but the horse got such a fright, with the shot whistling past his ear, that he fell onto his knees.

Uncle Dick turned to Dad and yelled, you silly bugger, you've shot the bloody horse! He did very little trap shooting in his younger days, but in the field, could hold his own with the best of them.

His first connection with trap shooting was in 1913, when the Werribee Gun Club used to go to the school and get Dad and one of his mates to trap for the afternoon (live birds).

The Werribee Gun Club also has a fair bit of history, although I don't know too much about it before 1953-54. I presume that the 1914-18 war put a stop to the club and from what information I could gather it operated again in the early and mid thirties. It was 1953-54 when it next came into being, to become a permanent fixture in the sport of shotgunning, and it was then that Father became a regular trap shooter.

He was president of the club for many years, and is the only life member.

The club has had three other sites before the one it is presently on. Number one was the Werribee Racecourse, then a site a bit further out of town in an area called the black swamp, then back closer to town on Ballan Road, (residential area now).

The early shoots were held using a "Plus" trap placed behind a couple of sheets of steel, which were taken home after each shoot by the secretary, Tom Powell.

The club gradually improved; built a clubhouse, and installed a traphouse and trap with manual cocking and release from behind the shooter.

Then came Australia's first electric trap (as far as we know). Built by a local engineer, Peter Byer, and consisting completely of generators, switches, and parts etc, taken from ex war-disposal aircraft. It threw a mean target and there was a standing prize for the first one to shoot twenty straight. If I remember rightly it was about six months before the prize was won by Roy Ayre.

I can remember winning a single barrel championship in those days with 12 out of 15. The opening shoot at the Ballan Rd. site in 1955 was advertised — "Ten targets points:— 10 shillings. Fifteen targets handicap £2-10. £260 in twelve prizes. And club S.B. champ, nom. 10 shillings."

Another interesting thing about the Werribee Gun Club is, that after the 1956 Olympic Games held in Melbourne, the shooting layout at Laverton RAAF Base was left unused and the W.G.C. in conjunction with the RAAF people used to run some big shoots there on Sundays, the electronic equipment gradually deteriorated and the shoots were abandoned.

If I had put everything in this article that was talked about while I was compiling these notes, it would have filled the whole magazine.

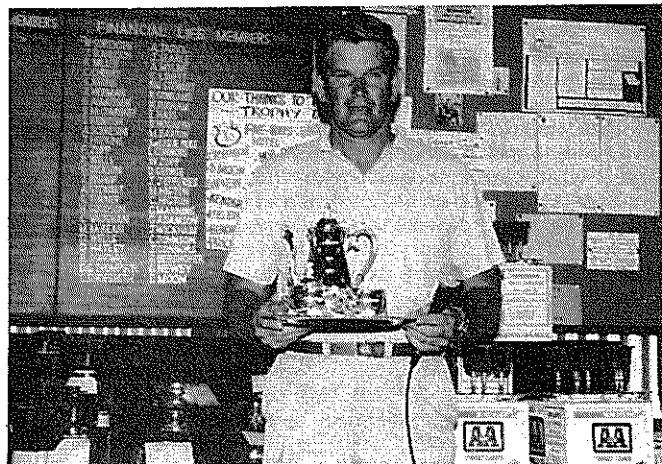
Of special interest this year was the \$10,000 being offered to any shooter who could shoot the whole program without dropping a point as per High Gun conditions.

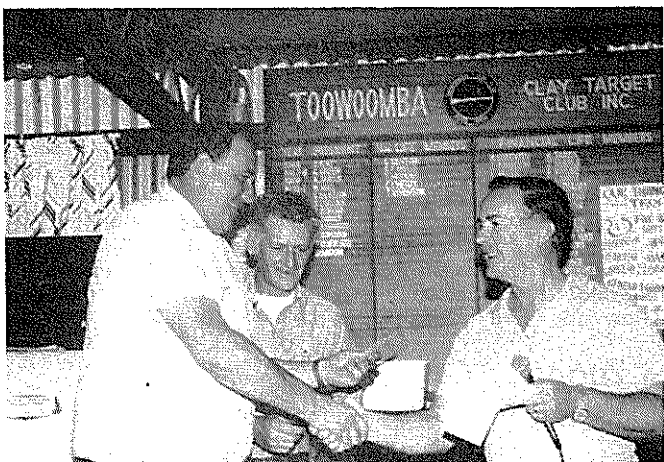
STATE CARNIVAL — REFEREE PANEL

In the past we have followed the National Series by drawing shooters from the previous squads — this has some advantages and some disadvantages so we are going to try another format.

We have decided to allocate one trap to each zone and two adjoining traps to the host zone — each zone will be completely responsible to have a referee and scorer in attendance on their allocated trap at all times.

Saturday night was pleasant and warm and after a most enjoyable meal, the Calcutta auction got under way. After some spirited bidding the books closed on a fine \$2,800 in the pot.

Sunday dawned with a return to more usual Toowoomba weather, i.e. sunny but a strong, gusty and varying wind from the south-west. At the close of shooting on Saturday five men — Greg Newey, John Porter, Doug Smith, Ray Hammond and Russel Hohn were all clean.

The first event Sunday, 25t Points Championship saw four of them drop points, leaving only Doug Smith, who had to work extremely hard, due to trap/trapper problems, to record the only possible and take out Overall and AA Grade. Also, the traps will be allocated at our July meeting and each zone will then know the trap they will be looking after during the complete State Carnival — each zone can then decorate, and do "whatever" to that trap in an effort to win the "Presidential Scroll" — if you wish you can even place some "white ants or gunpowder" under the opposition zones (do a good job as a shot gun and coarse salt can make it awkward to sit down for a few days).

In return for their services the State Association will pay each zone \$200 per trap managed over the carnival.

NOISE POLLUTION:

I know — it has been mentioned before and you may feel that we are being "over anxious" about this — BUT — each day we are receiving information that, if not attended to, could easily result in some clubs being closed down or their hours restricted. Already we have clubs that can only shoot on three (3) Saturday nights per year, etc. etc.

Almost every City or Shire Council in the State would have an Officer authorised under the Noise Control Act, who would be able to take noise level readings for each club. Make contact with this person (usually a Health Surveyor) and make sure he and the Council are aware of your Club, its location, the benefits it offers by training people in firearm safety, etc., as well as benefits to the Community. Arrange a time for that person to carry out noise level readings when you have a shoot in progress. (These readings are taken at the NEAREST RESIDENTIAL BOUNDARY), so use your discretion!

Although these readings are usually only taken when a complaint has been received — jump the gun (for the want of a better phrase!!) — so that if or when they do receive a complaint — they already have the reading — however with 90% of the Clubs in N.S.W. well out of the way of residential areas, it is hoped that no complaints related to noise will be received.

ACT NOW — if you value your sport and freedom of choice to continue shooting clay targets.

DID YOU KNOW:

RULE 2.4 (c) Page 13 Rule Booklet — "A competitor may apply through the STATE ASSOCIATION for inward movement due to a proven physical disability".

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NOTES — I.S.U. SUB COMMITTEE

As many within New South Wales, and even interstate, would realise the I.S.U. movement in the 'Waratah State' is an extremely active one, and appears set in 1986 to continue the growth and success demonstrated over the past few years.

At present there are eight (8) clubs in New South Wales offering combined Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet facilities, a good reason the Olympic Discipline events are flourishing within the state. Each of these clubs is represented on the I.S.U. Sub-Committee, a guarantee that

each club has a say in the administration of the disciplines within the state, and during each year a two day training squad elimination is held at each of those clubs.

Delegates to the Sub-Committee are nominated each year by their club and along with three shooter delegates (nominated by other shooters) and the State Coaching Director, make up the Sub-Committee.

In regard to training squads, a squad is selected each year for each discipline, Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet. These squads are made up of eight shooters (including two juniors) in Olympic Trap, and six shooters (including one junior) in I.S.U. Skeet.

The training squads are announced at the final elimination each year for the following year, and are selected on percentage scores over five eliminations, including the state carnival.

Competition for the Training Squad positions is becoming far more fierce over the last few years and the improvement in scores would indicate why. The general standard of Olympic Discipline shooting in New South Wales has improved immensely of late, and it is not surprising that the National Olympic Trap Training Squad of seven has five N.S.W. shooters in its ranks.

N.S.W. I.S.U. TRAINING SQUAD ELIMINATIONS

Three months of the year almost gone and already four Olympic Traps and four I.S.U. Skeet training squad eliminations have been completed.

On the Olympic Trap scene, the discipline that attracts the larger number of competitors, good attendances and equally as good scores have been recorded at Guyra; the State I.S.U. carnival at Downside; the Australia Day competition at Canberra and most recently at the Southern Zone carnival at New South Wales Gun Club.

The most consistent competitor for 1986 so far — John Maxwell. John has performed well most of the year and as well as winning Guyra, Downside and Canberra, also won the New Zealand Olympic Trap title, and finished second in the National Olympic Trap event in Brisbane in early February.

Who else is performing well for next year's training squad?? Terry Rumbel, Jim Ellis, Cliff Bailey, Robert Thompson, John Fryer, Greg Oehm and a host more have all been recording some good scores. Terry Budd shot well with his new gun in Brisbane, and the two outstanding juniors, Fillipo Petriella and Michael Diamond, shouldn't be forgotten.

The scores in Olympic Trap in New South Wales have gone through the roof in recent years but unfortunately there are only places in the training squads for eight. There will certainly be more than eight shooters who deserve to be in the squad this year!

I.S.U. Skeet attendances and performances are also on the improve.

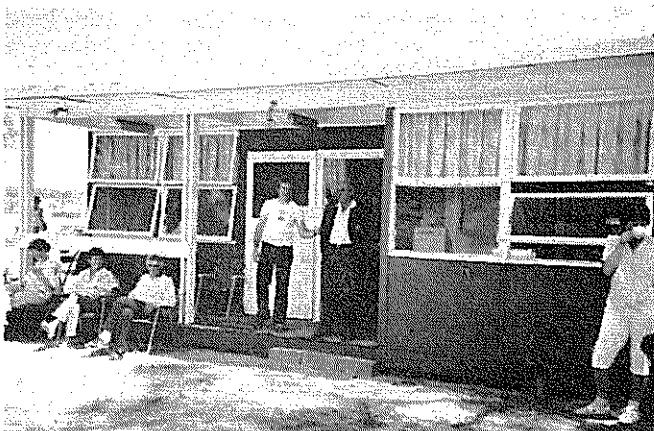

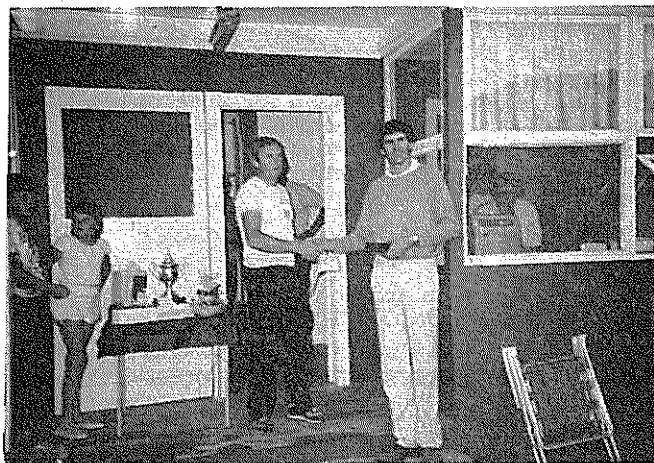
With its relocation, the club hopes to attract new members from the large City of Lithgow and its surrounding areas.

MERV CALLS IT A DAY

Top Kingaroy shooter, Merv Champney, has stepped down from the administration of the club he helped form 32 years ago.

Ever since clay target shooting was established as a sport in Kingaroy, Merv Champney has been involved with its organisation, culminating this month with a 16 year term as club president.

Farmer, Peter McDonald, takes over as president of the Kingaroy gun club.

The origins of clay target shooting go back to 1953. Merv remembers attending the first shoot in that year at the Mount Wooroolin rifle range.

Shooters were under the Kingaroy Gun Club banner, using a trap at Nanango aerodrome. Prior to this the trap was located in Carroll's paddock off Haly Street west.

At the club's first general meeting on February 26, 1954, Merv, then aged 24, became secretary, a position he held until 1960.

During this time, the club established itself at its present site at Taabinga Village, holding its first shoot there in March, 1957.

It reverted to the name Kingaroy Gun Club in 1977, after being known as the South Burnett Gun Club since 1963.

In 1962 and 1963 Merv was gun president, successfully leading it to host the 1963 Queensland teams titles. Merv had to work hard to have Kingaroy accepted as host club, but so successful was the shoot that Kingaroy became recognised as one of the above average clubs.

The first electric traps in Queensland were installed at Kingaroy for the titles.

Merv remembers the 120 competitors made the biggest roll up of shooters ever at the Kingaroy club. Kingaroy has hosted the titles twice since then, and hopes to do so in 1990 again.

Merv was again club president in 1966, and since 1970 he has held the position continuously.

He has seen membership climb from only a handful to

more than 70 in the early 1970s to a static 40 in recent years.

He has been club captain, is a trustee, and in 1984 was granted life membership.

This award would have been deserved for organisational work alone, but this is only half the story.

Merv's achievements in competition have given him great personal satisfaction, and the club great pride in his record.

Merv won his first championship in 1959 at Southport where the State and Australian championships were being held.

He won the prestigious Pacific Coast Double Barrel Championship, with a gold cup donated by Bauman.

The following year he was runner up in the same event, winning it again in 1970.

Merv was the first Kingaroy club member to become a State team member (in 1963) having shot in the Australian team in 1960.

He won the Double Barrel Championship in 1964, and in 1968 won the first Winchester Clay Bird Tournament in Queensland with a score of 99 out of 100.

As Merv looked back, he said the greatest attraction of clay target shooting has been the fellowship and quality of people he had met.

"I have made tremendous friendship through the sport, and if I had my time over again, I would begin shooting at an earlier age," he said.

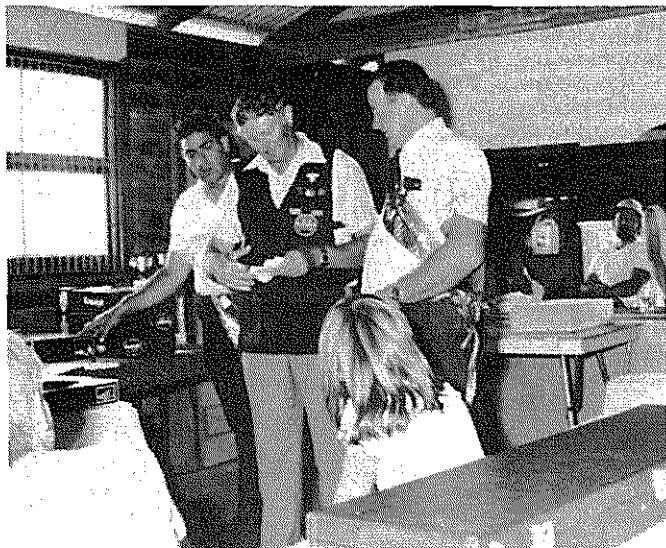
QBN-CANBERRA CLUB AUSTRALIA DAY SHOOT

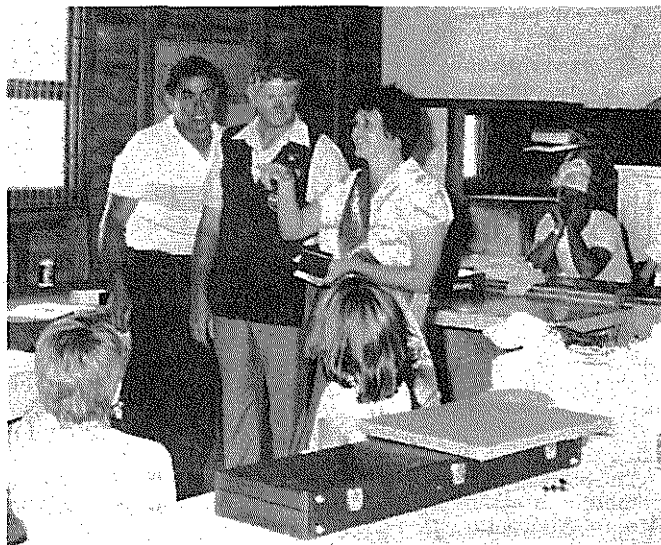

• Ladies' High Gun winner Mrs G. Lawrence.

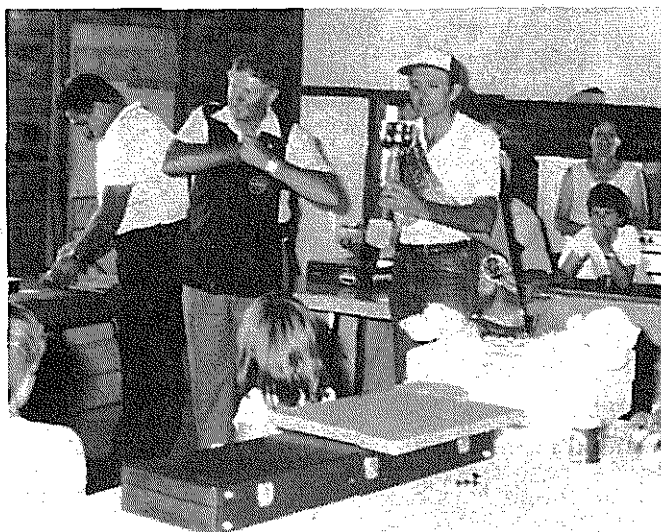
was the end of the first day and many were visiting scoreboards to see who was clean and might have a chance at the High Gun the next day.

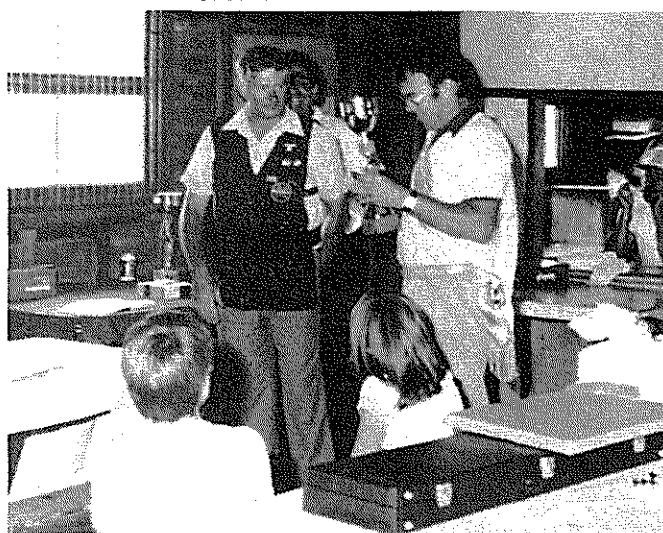

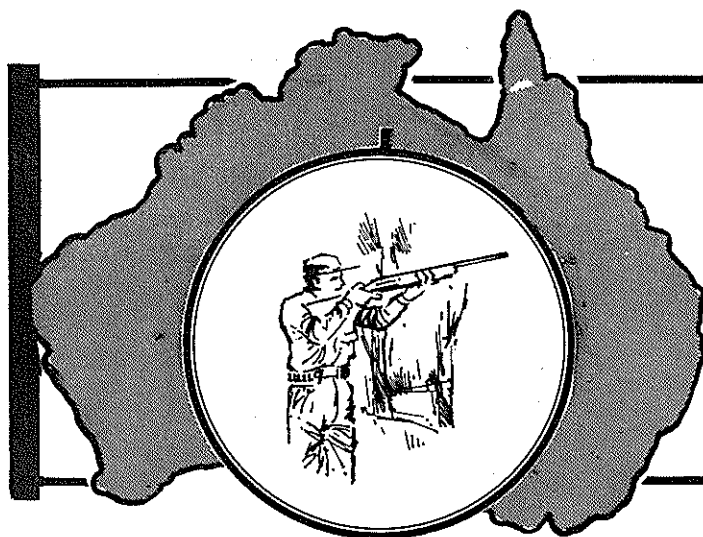
