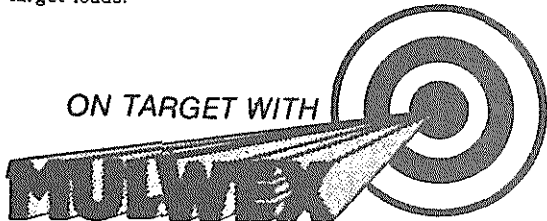

As has been mentioned previously, the number of calls and letters received at the A.C.T.A. office points to the fact that the majority of shooters are unaware of the depth of cover provided by the Associations Public Liability Policy, which is not, as many believe, an accident policy.

To help each member to be fully conversant with the information that has been provided to each club Secretary I am enclosing in the C.T.S.N. a reasonably detailed summary of the protection that the cover affords.

This summary has been presented to the insurers who have confirmed its accuracy in writing to the A.C.T.A.

Please read it thoroughly and should you have any queries then all that I ask is that you direct them to me via your club Secretary and not direct to the office, I am sure that you will understand the reason for my request.

JUNIOR SHOOTERS & QUEENSLAND FIREARMS ACT

The following advice has been received from the Secretary of the Q.C.T.A. to legally allow junior shooters to compete, **CLUBS MUST APPLY IN WRITING** to: Inspector Cain, Police Headquarters, 30 Makerston Street, Brisbane Qld. 4000 and seek his permission for juniors between the ages of 14 and 17 to be allowed to become members, be instructed in the safe handling of firearms and compete in events under the supervision of club captains, range officers and club coaches.

Inspector Cain is the sole authorised Officer to grant this permission.

A draft application letter is available by contacting the State Secretary, Mrs Bev Grice.

NOTE: The permission required relates only to juniors over the age of 14 years and below 17 years and must be obtained by the respective clubs.

Failure to obtain this permission would immediately place the club in a disadvantageous position should a claim arise under the Public Liability Insurance Policy as the club would be contravening the State Laws.

WAKEHURST GUN CLUB, SYDNEY, COMPETES FOR SINGAPORE AIRLINES TROPHY

Perfect weather and conditions were experienced at the Wakehurst Gun Club, Sydney, on 1 June, 1986, for the 4th year of the Singapore Airlines "Champion of Champions" Shooting Competition.

Some 35 professional Clay and Skeet target shooters from the New South Wales area battled hard to win this magnificent trophy. Over 55 mixed targets i.e. 10 targets single barrel, 10 targets double barrel, 10 targets point score and 25 targets skeet.

"C" Grade shooter, 18 year old Mark Agar, who was the "C" Grade winner of this trophy in 1985, had a magnificent score and stole the limelight with an overall win of 71 out of 75 from "A" Grade shooter, Chris Naudin with a score of 68 out of 75 and "B" Grade shooter Eric Stano with a score of 67 out of 75, who were also winners in last years competition.

The "C" Grade winner for this year is a new member to Wakehurst Gun Club, Mr Ray Lainey, with a score of 66 out of 75. Miss Carol Mann was the Most Improved Ladies Shooter of the day with a score of 59 out of 75.

Mr Jon Howse, Sales Manager NSW, for Singapore Airlines, and also Mr Charles Abela, District Sales Manager Sydney, also from Singapore Airlines and a Committee member of the Wakehurst Gun Club, Sydney, were in attendance to present the trophies to the lucky winners.

PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

IN THE INTERESTS OF ALL REGISTERED SHOOTERS.

The Public Liability Policy that has been arranged for the A.C.T.A. by Carlingford Australia is designed to provide specific protection for the Association and its registered members.

The A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy protects the Association and its members from being sued for alleged negligence/blame attaching to an incident causing property damage or bodily injury.

If a shooter is injured in any way during the cause of a sanctioned event where no blame can be attached to the A.C.T.A. and its members any claim that may have been made would not be recognised under the policy conditions as it would then be classified as a personal claim covered by an insurance that the shooter may have in force on a personal basis.

Protection is afforded to the following, who subject to certain conditions, are considered to be members of the A.C.T.A.

1. A.C.T.A.
2. State Associations
3. Registered Clubs
4. Registered Shooters
5. Voluntary Workers
6. Club Visitors (participants)
7. Club Visitors (observers)

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

1. A.C.T.A. — Payment of the prescribed premium to the Insurer by the due date, January 1, annually.
2. STATE ASSOCIATIONS — Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
3. REGISTERED CLUBS: (A) Subject to payment of the prescribed affiliation fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
(B) Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulation of the State Association (respective) who are operating under the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
4. REGISTERED SHOOTERS — (A) subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
(B) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and A.C.T.A.
5. VOLUNTARY WORKERS — (A) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.
(B) Provided always that such voluntary workers are registered as members of the Australian Clay Target Association on the master register maintained by the Australian Clay Target Associations with a description of their duties.
Additions to or deletion from this master list are to be notified to the A.C.T.A. office as they are known.
NOTE: Voluntary workers to be registered with the A.C.T.A. are to be restricted to those persons likely to assist on a voluntary basis only.
Paid personnel such as, trappers, trap mechanics or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the workers compensation act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority.
- 6/7. CLUB VISITORS — (Participants or Observers)
(A) Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.
(B) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered A.C.T.A. shooters.

(C) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulation of the respective club, State Association and A.C.T.A.

NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc who are not registered shooters with the A.C.T.A. must first of all have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly. Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possibly arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.

8. Clubs who have life members of similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to either the Club or the A.C.T.A. by reason of there inactivity in the sport at Club and or A.C.T.A. level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered Shooters".
9. Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shooters.
10. Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to safety etc have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines such as a combination of Clay Target and field and game.

Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master A.C.T.A. Policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation. Therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the A.C.T.A. master policy unless cover in excess of \$2,000,000 is required.

Paid employees must at all times be protected under the workers compensation act.

Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Club or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is eliminated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$2,000,000.

Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person must at all times sign the visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.

All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body.

NOTE: Club shooters, not registered with the A.C.T.A. are not covered under any circumstances other than operating as a voluntary worker at an organised event. This category of shooter-member is solely a club responsibility and insurance cover should be considered at all times as a club expense.

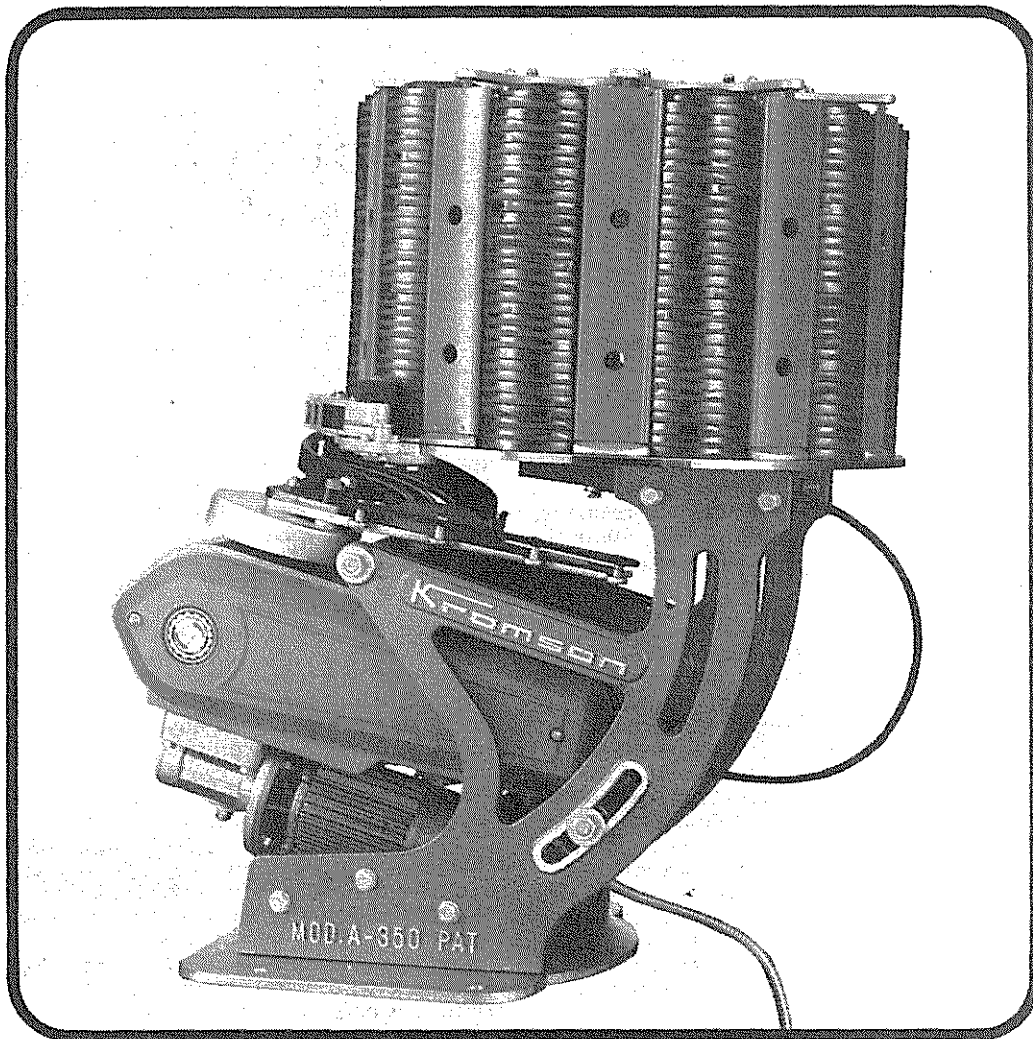
FOR INFORMATION: Further extensions included within the policy are: Member to member, Food and Drink, Care, custody and control, Medical and welfare facilities, Tenants Liability, Hoists, cranes and unregistered vehicles, Car Parking, Cross Liabilities.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

PETER QUIRE

I have recently returned from Canberra where the programme for the national squad's stay at the Institute of Sport was finalized, at the same time the executive director, Alan Maher and myself had meetings with those at the sports commission in regard to the grants from the Federal Government, as it is form filling time once again.

Last month I mentioned in my article the intention of the government to improve sport through the National Coaching Scheme, but did not mention that the government has funded the position of National Coaching Director, and some of the activities of the National Coaching Scheme since its inception.

Sometimes due to the complexities of balance sheets and financial statements it is difficult for we non economic people to see that this is so.

I think we must give credit where credit is due. The Clay Target Association is of course expected to contribute to the coaching scheme, not only does the Clay Target Association both federal and state contribute to coaching at all levels, but so do the individuals involved in the scheme, they do it willingly as it is something they believe in.

Last year 6,200 people had some form of coaching from those involved, a grand effort.

The government also contributes to overseas competition as does the Commonwealth Games Association and the Olympic Federation, without all this assistance few sports could mount professional coaching schemes or compete at a world level.

I would like to express my thanks to Alan Maher for his efforts in Canberra on our sports behalf.

The Commonwealth Games will be on by the time you read this, so I would like to fill you in on the details as I know them so far, the Clay Target is to be shot at Kippen about 50 miles north west of Edinburgh. The team is to be bused out to the range each day and will stay at the Edinburgh University.

The competition commences with the badge match, Terry Rumbel and Domingo Diaz trap on July 21, and Ian Hale and Alec Crikis skeet on July 22, the teams matches are, trap July 25 and skeet July 26 with the individual events being held on 28, 29 and 31 July and 1 August.

The team members are building up their shooting training, as they have built up their physical fitness, and are all looking forward to the week in the Institute Of Sport with the national squad prior to leaving. The skeet team is to compete in the English Grand Prix prior to the games.

We will be all doing our very best in Edinburgh and are proud to represent our sport and our country.

The World Championships come hard on the heels of the Commonwealth Games and start at the end of August in Suhl in East Germany. The Commonwealth Games team will be joined by Russell Mark trap and Craig Meuleman skeet.

Robby Smith a well respected coach from NSW is coming to Suhl at his own expense in the position of Assistant Manager Coach. In Germany the trap team shoots several days after the skeet team so Robby and the trap team members will stay in West Germany until near competition time.

I would however like to add that it is important to put the glasses on for about 20 minutes before shooting to allow the muscles of the eye to adjust.

I am pushing "this Barrow" very hard at present. Every Club must look very seriously at becoming incorporated. In the last Newsletter to all clubs in NSW I gave details of a publication produced by the Department of Sport and Recreation Office in Tamworth, that is available from your State Secretary, P.O. Box 836, Tamworth.

This publication sets out all particulars and details of just what is required by the Club. Something else in each Club's favour, is that with the new Insurance cover provided by the A.C.T.A. (via the \$30.00 annual affiliation), being for \$2,000,000 (that amount required in NSW when becoming incorporated) this policy is able to be used as the insurance cover — so your Club does not have to go chasing a \$2,000,000 insurance policy of its own.

A SOCIAL DAY

K. Constable

On May 4, 1986, a social day was held between Namoi Aero Club and Narrabri Gun Club with the venue of the aerodrome in the morning, and the gun club in the evening.

The morning activities were for a shooter to be taken up flying, with an experienced pilot at the controls. The shooter was handed a computer and an area map, and had to give the pilot a heading or headings to fly in order to overfly predetermined points and return to starting point in the shortest time. Needless to say, the pilot already knew the headings.

After a barbecue lunch at the Aero Club, we went to Narrabri Gun Club for the evening session, which was a round of skeet. Before shooting got underway, the visitors were instructed as a group on the basics of safety with firearms, namely guns open at all times except when ready to shoot, cartridges in the gun only when on the shooting station and facing forward, and open the gun before turning to leave the shooting station, with emphasis on resisting that panic-stricken urge to turn around with the gun still closed and pointing towards other shooters or spectators.

I then gave a target by target description of a round of skeet and how to shoot each individual target. I should mention that I was using a blackboard as a teaching aid, and we also had a tall wooden peg at the target crossing point to use as a visual reference for position, and a peg out from each house to refer to as the aiming point.

I advised using a foot of lead on low 1 and high 7, 2 feet on station 2, 3 on 3, 4 on 4, 3 on 5, 2 on 6. We had a board 4 feet long lying on its edge at the crossing point, this made it easy to explain to each shooter as we went around, just how far to lead, for example, on station 4 have a look at the board and then keep it in your mind that you have to shoot that distance in front of the target.

Considering that only three of the visitors had ever shot at clay targets before, none of them had ever seen skeet, and some had never even used a gun, the visitors are to be commended on their performance, particularly with regard to their safety standard.

Of the visitors, two of them with 14/25 shot off for the visitors trophy with the junior member winning 16/25, thanks to his calm attitude and attention to instructions. The visitors had to shoot the full round to be eligible for a mystery trophy, the mystery being station 8. One score of 2 got the trophy.

Of the Gun Club members who were dubious about shooting skeet, one of them shot his first straight 25 and another dropped high 1 and smoked the next 24, his highest score so far. Hopefully, I will get the club interested in shooting more skeet.

The day was disappointing in that only five shooters attended. Some were sick with 'flu, others were farming, and no doubt some are afraid of aircraft.

Nevertheless, we had an enjoyable day, and look forward to making it an annual event, next time with the emphasis on "starting on time".
