





PIONEERS OF OUR SPORT OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

CHAMPIONS OF THE PAST



By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian DONALD MACKINTOSH — World Champion Australian Shooter.

Well before those of us who are shooting today were born, Donald Mackintosh was making a name for Australia on European Shooting Grounds and at the leading Gun Clubs of England in the 1890's.

The following story is a personal sketch of Donald Mackintosh by an un-named Australian Journalist of that time and was published in a leading Melbourne daily newspaper and magazines.

No branch of trade is more interesting than that of the manufacture and sale of guns for use in sport, personal amusement, and the encouragement of shooting skill. In the world of sport many individual marksmen have gained worthy distinction, but I venture the opinion that amongst them all there has been no more picturesque or noteworthy personality than that of Donald Mackintosh, the Australian native, who, for a quarter of a century, held front rank in shooting circles, and for over 10 years shot with marked distinction at Monte Carlo, Paris, London, Rome, Madrid and other European centres. By dint of natural aptitude, keen study, and persistent effort, he lifted himself up from small beginnings into the very foremost grade of the world's marksmen, and eventually gained a name equal to the best of the world's best in the use of the shot gun, both in the field and in International competitions.

In shooting, as in other things, there is nothing like an early start, and "Donald", as he was for many years known in the Australian shooting world, learned to handle the gun when very young - not more than 6 years of age at the most. Although not an exceptionally strong lad, he took to the gun "like a duck to water". His earliest effort were devoted to getting the best results he could from a flask of black powder, a few pounds of lead, and an old-time muzzle-loader, which could be adapted either to bullets of the old spherical kind or shot. With this outfit he set out, a not ambitious boy, with his gun under his arm, and the world before him. His "first shot" was at a flock of crows, at the other end of a plough furrow, the alignment of which, at that time, rather assisted his "sporting aim". He took careful sight at long range, and sure enough there was a "dead bird" accounted for, and gathered in as a result of a well-directed effort. After that he had plenty of practice on parrots, snipe, wild duck and other feathered species, as well as rabbits and hares. "Donald" did not make the acquaintance of a gun club until about 16 years of age. The first he joined was the Bacchus Marsh Club, and his first success was taking second prize in a shoot for a trophy presented by Mr J. O. Inglis, who was at that time one of our foremost amateur riders, and later the owner of the Melbourne Cup winner, Malua.

At 23 years of age he was a member of the Melbourne Gun Club, which has, for many years, been the leading Gun Club in Victoria, if not Australia. Entering the club, virtually as a "Novice", he was, at the end of the first six months, back to what was then the handicap limit, 30 yds, at pigeons. Once on that mark he has never stood nearer up to the present day.

Amongst Mr Mackintosh's first notable successes was winning the Melbourne Gun Club £50 Challenge Cup three times and taking final possession. In doing this he had shooters of the first order of skill to defeat.

Later on he had much success in open pigeon matches, for valuable stakes, at the Melbourne Gun Club, the Sydney Gun Club and various country meetings. With the true love of an Australian native for game shooting, he spent much time in the leafy forests, and soon gained a widespread reputation as a crack shot on quail, snipe, wild duck, etc.

One episode remains fresh in Mac's memory of an outing he had with the renowned American wing shot, Dr Carver, in the Yarrawonga District, when the two cracks were out after snipe and any other attractive "live target" offering. Mac winged a galah, and Carver chased down a beautiful young swan. As the doctor was anxious to take away to his American home something purely Australian, they exchanged birds, and the great record-holder ever afterwards cherished that galah as a domestic pet. He told "Mac", when the two sports met at Monte Carlo many years afterwards, that it was still living and flourishing in its Kentucky home — and "talking like a bullock driver". As for the swan; that also still survives.

It is not so much on his Australian doings as on those at Monte Carlo and the other great European shooting grounds and at the leading gun clubs of England that "Donald's" reputation has been built up. As a single man he first visited England and the classic rendezvous on the shores of the Mediterranean, ruled over by the Prince of Monaco, in 1896. After a two years' tour, he came back to Australia, having made good impressions in Europe and England. He returned to the shooting world's great centres in the year 1900 a married man, taking his Australian wife with him. For nine years thereafter "Donald" worthily represented the Australian democracy in European and British shooting circles, gaining much prominence as a successful competitor in the most important shooting events in the old world.

A reference to the splendid array of gold medals, illustrated on page 31 of this catalogue, will give an idea of the success which attended "Donald's" gun whilst abroad. Words cannot speak more eloquently than that collection

and the photos of valuable Challenge Cups, won at London, Paris, and Melbourne, as shown on page 32.

Some of "Donald's" more conspicuous wins in Australia, the continent and in England and their value are as follows:—

- 1. First in Melbourne Gun Club £1000 Cup Handicap, 1890, killing 33 birds straight 30 yds.
- 2. Melbourne Gun Club £50 Challenge Cup, won three times in succession. Won Cup and £150.
- London Gun Club £100 Challenge Cup, won three times in succession. Cup and £250.
- Paris Gun Club £100 Challenge Cup, won three times in succession. Cup and £150.
- 5. Grand Prize of Italy, Florence £800.
- 6. Grand Prize Aix les Bains, £800.
- 7. Championship Belgium Ostende, £200.
- 8. Grand Prize Monte Carlo, divided first £1000.
- 9. Championship London Gun Club, £130.
- 10. Grand Prize Milan, divided first £800.
- 11. Grand Prize Madrid, divided first £600.
- 12. Grand Prize Monte Carlo, divided first £1000.

On his return to Australia, a few years ago, Mr Mackintosh, yielding to a natural inclination to assist others to gain successes in a sphere which had proved so fascinating to himself, decided to go into the business of the importation and sale of shot guns, rifles, revolvers and all sporting requisities. He started at 400 Bourke-street West, close to that historic sporting rendezvous, Kirk's Bazaar, where he quickly secured a following, and rapidly "caught the eye" of the local shooting world.

When in England, Mr Mackintosh took special steps to acquaint himself with all the details and processes of the manufacture of shot guns and other sporting weapons, and by personal inspection and interview, acquired a knowledge of all particulars and peculiarities in the London, Birmingham and Continental gun trade, both as regards original manufacture and the conditions of the export of guns, etc. to Australia. The knowledge thus gained he concentrates upon his business, which he is thus enabled to conduct so as to bring all costs and charges to his customers to the desirable minimum, consistent with quality and efficiency. By a careful system of selection and adaptation of the latest methods, he is able to stock guns, ammunition and all sportsmen's requisites suited to the requirements of all classes of purchasers.

SOME FOREIGN PRESS NOTICES

These cuttings may interest Australian shots as showing how one of their countrymen was received, and what was thought of him in Europe.

SHOOTERS AND SHOOTING

The "Daily Mail" Special, London, concludes an article on Australian, English, Russian and Italian shots by saying:

"Monte Carlo claims attention in winter. Perhaps the finest shot that has ever competed there is the Italian shot, Guidicinni, but at the present time the best shot in the world is probably Mr Mackintosh, the Australian."

"The Jockey", Paris, in a long and interesting discourse on shooting, winds up by contrasting the performances of the world's famous shots who have contested at Monte Carlo as follows: "Mr Mackintosh's performances at Monte Carlo, together with his records made in England and Australia, are such that, in a word, we declare him the Champion of the World."

From "Diana", Florence: "On the 23rd September, 1908, Mr Donald Mackintosh, the famous shot, left for Australia, after an absence from that country of many years. He, who had so many victories, and who made so many friends, being as he was, the prototype of the correct sportsman, has left everybody regretting his departure, and with a sincere desire to see him again. We voice the sentiments of every Italian shooter in wishing him a pleasant voyage and great future happiness."

The "Grand World of Sport", Madrid, in an article, discusses the most extraordinary shots of the world, and sums up as follows:

"The grand programme of events, shot at Monte Carlo in fees for the various items total about an equal £10,000.

"The competitors at the series of events are of all nationalities. But those who stand out most prominently are Guidicinni and Grasselli, representing Italy; Count O'Brien, Spain; Mackintosh, Australia; Robinson, the United States; and Roberts, England. These gentlemen are considered by those best qualified to judge to be the leading shots of the world.

"Among all the shooters who demand public notice by their extraordinary performance, the one who stands out most conspicuously from the rest is D. Mackintosh, whom we have no hesitation in proclaiming the best shot in the world at the present time."

In giving these cuttings from many Press notices Donald Mackintosh received while abroad, the object is to show that the hand of good-fellowship is extended to visiting shooters most freely and cordially in Europe.

HINTS ON TRAP AND GAME SHOOTING


By Donald Mackintosh.

In giving the following "Hints" to shooters, I do so at the request of a number of sportsmen throughout Australia, who have been good enough to state that my many years' experience in shooting undoubtedly enables me to speak as an expert, remembering that, coupled with my personal experience, I have come in contact in my travels with all the world's champion shots, and have had the benefit of their experience as well.

As a native Australian, I feel that my fellow-countrymen are as pleased at my successes abroad as I was to secure them. The present and rising generation of shooters have an equal chance, by patience and perseverance, to secure all that and more than I attained in my shooting career. I have come back amongst you more an Australian than when I left for distant lands. I come back fonder of this dear old land of gum leaves than ever, and with the fervent wish — "Advance Australia".

Always treat firearms as loaded. Disregard of that rule is dangerous. More people have been killed by the gun thought to be unloaded than by any other weapon. A careful regard for this will always ensure you welcome among your companions in the field.

Kipling says in one of his ballads about the soldier's rifle - "You treat her as human; she'll treat you as such".

A.C.T.A. Jumper — \$40.00 (made upon receiving order). N.S.W.C.T.A. Pockets for blazers can also be ordered.

REGISTERED REFERESS:

Does your club have any registered referees? I'm aware that there are some clubs who do not have any referees. How about obtaining a rule book and becoming a referee.

FROM THE NORTHERN ZONE:

The Annual Guyra "COOL 100" was conducted the last weekend in July, and the winner with a perfect 100/100 was Guyra shooter, "Bud" Sweeney. Congratulations. From all accounts the weather was certainly appropriate for the "COOL 100"!!

INSURANCE:

One phase of our sport which is probably more confusing than the rules is the old phobia of "Insurance".

To assist to clarify the position:

WORKERS COMPENSATION INSURANCE

This is a policy which is compulsory at law and is effected by the club to **cover any person who is employed by the club** — simply, it covers all employees who are injured on the way to work, at work, or on the way home from work. This cover is compulsory and any employer who does not insure faces a fine of \$400 for every day that his employees are not covered.

PUBLIC RISK or PERSONAL LIABILITY

This is the policy effected by the ACTA to cover its members — it is a liability policy and not, I repeat NOT a personal accident policy.

The cover offered by this policy is one whereby some person or the club has been **negligent** and, as a result of this negligence, another person is injured or killed. Before a claim can be paid, full particulars must be lodged with the Insurance Company and usually will not be settled until a judgement is awarded by a court. In 99% of cases the injured party (or his or her next of kin) must sue a person or a club and, after the due process of law is finalised, an award will be granted.

This cover is automatic for all registered persons and visitors under certain circumstances. Each club must have a visitors book and obtain the signature of any visitor — then, and only then, are the visitors covered. Further to this — certain persons, such as ladies working at the club etc, are covered if the club registers their names at the ACTA office. This is most important and is quite simple for the club secretary to enclose a note to the ACTA with each monthly shoot return.

DON'T FORGET — this is a LIABILITY POLICY and NOT AN ACCIDENT POLICY.

ACCIDENT POLICY — CASUAL WORKERS

This policy is really important but very few clubs do anything about it. The names tells the story — it is a policy to cover any casual worker (such as working bees etc) who is not an employee and is working for nothing. If they are being paid they would be covered under the Workers Compensation policy.

I'm not sure of the current premium cost as it varies with the numbers of club members — recently, a club with 25 members took out a policy covering anyone injured for an amount of \$300 per week (up to a total of 10,000 for any one accident) and the total premium was \$121.40.

I personally feel that this is a most important policy and should be effected by every club — it would be a great relief to any president to know that, if any person is injured whilst working for the club — then that person would receive \$300 or any other amount that the club insures for.

If the club cannot afford the cost, ask your members and I'll guarantee they would pay \$5 or so for the cover. In conclusion you have —

- 1. Workers Compensation Insurance to cover all employees.
- 2. Public Risk or Personal Liability to cover you or your family for any acts of negligence.
- 3. Casual Worker Accident Insurance to cover you against injury if you are working for the club and are not a paid employee.

I feel that this may clarify the situation, if not, contact your nearest reputable insurance company and they will clarify the matter for you.

A THOUGHT

"Never miss an opportunity to make others happy, Even if you have to leave them alone to do it".

CLUB FACILITIES

Once again, I stress the importance to club executives — presidents, secretaries and committee etc, to do everything in your power to entice visitors to attend and return to your club.

Some clubs put on afternoon tea, consisting of dry biscuits and a cup of tea and charge 50 cents or \$1, whilst other clubs put on a beautiful afternoon tea and also charge 50 cents or, in some cases, no charge at all. I have heard many shooters talking and saying "you should go to X club — they put on a terrific meal and make you feel welcome". I have also heard shooters say "Don't go to X club — they charge \$1 for a cup of tea and a couple of dry biscuits".

Another avenue that doesn't cost one cent — walk up to a visitor with your right hand out, a smile on your face, and say "Welcome, thanks for visiting our club, I hope you enjoy your visit". This will make you feel good and I'll guarantee the visitor will tell others how friendly you were — try it and see.

STATE CARNIVAL

Only one month to the Trap Carnival at Griffith and what a carnival it promises to be — all events have been sponsored and, with this guarantee, the carnival will be a carnival to remember. Griffith has ample accommodation (the Citrus Motel is one of our sponsors) and a visit to a winery is an excellent way to spend a "blotto" few hours. Most of us have shot at Griffith Gun Club and we all know the hospitality that "Simbo" and his boys can turn on — See you at GRIFFITH.

LET'S IMPROVE THE STATUS OF OUR CHAMPIONSHIPS

At a recent Coaching Seminar, I was asked by a well known Victorian Shooter, what could we do to improve the standard of our shooting. The shooter was not referring to the practical, physical and psychological side or our sport, but was indicating that we should be shooting against tougher competition.

I could not agree more, and for this to occur, we must all try to compete with others whose standard is equal to or much better than ourselves.

Over the past few years, Clubs in our state appear to hold too many Championships with the nett results, the shooter is only a champion for one day. This lowers the value of the term CHAMPION.

A few years ago, I remember attending a Club in Victoria which was given a Commonwealth Championship. Fifteen shooters attended, so the winner (good luck to him), was crowned Commonwealth Champion in that discipline for one year.

Knowing the winner of the event personally, he did not feel he had really earnt the title, because of the conditions under which the title had been won.

To improve the image of Clay Target Shooting, we could take a leaf out of the book of other sports disciplines, where it is necessary to determine the best Competitor for the year. The car racing fraternity set out certain races that each driver must compete in to qualify for points to see who is the best and most consistent driver for the year. Our sport determines the top shooter for the year in a particular discipline on one performance in one location on one day. A true indication? I believe not.

The question now arises, why can't Clay Target Shooting use a similar system to determine its State Champion?

Let's say we want to find out who is the best Double Barrel DTL Shooter in our State for 1986. This in my opinion should not be determined by one performance in one location on one day.

If each Zone still conducts its Zone Double Barrel Championships at different periods throughout the year, and points are allocated as to where the shooter finished in the event, by the end of the year, we would have determined the most consistent and best shooter. This person is certainly worthy of laying claim to the State Title.

Example:

If the N.W. Zone hold the Zone Double Barrel Championship as a qualifying shoot for the State Championship and the shooter finishes third, he or she Page 10 receives 8 points. The same shooter then attends the S.W. Zone and finishes first, then he or she now receives 10 points; a total of 18 points. All eligible shoots are aggregated towards the Championship.

To be eligible for the Title, the shooter must compete in 3 out of the 4 Zone Shoots. The highest points achiever for the year is then the State Champion. By using this system, Clay Target Shooting can only benefit.

Benefits of this System are:

- (i) The true State Champion is determined.
- (ii) Better competition between shooters.
- (iii) A willingness by competitors to extend goals beyond one event will be fostered.
- (iv) A better standard of shooting between individuals will occur.
- (v) A greater awareness of our sport in the public sector will be fostered.
- (vi) Better interaction between Zones will occur.
- (vii) Participating Clubs will benefit from experience and support from other Clubs.
- Some possible arguments against this System are:
- (i) More work involved in co-ordinating the scores.
- (ii) Why should we visit other Zones, they don't come to us?
- (iii) Fuel is far too dear etc, plus a host of other excuses. We can all generate if we want to.

But if we want the standard of shooting to improve as well as individual performances to be upgraded, we must take some sacrifices.

Let us all work together to give our top Titles the prestige, credibility and honor they rightly deserve.

49 YEARS A TRAP SHOOTER

The Gippslander with the longest association with the Australian Clay Target Association has died.

He was Les Mitchell, 73, a retired farmer of Trafalgar. Started in '37

ACTA historian George Biggs of Knoxfield recalls Les's shooting trap at Blackburn in 1937.

Friend, Tup Pedersen, of Drouin, a former ACTA president, said Les laid off shooting during the war, and soon after he left Melbourne for an orchard at Trafalgar.

The pair met at the since defunct Moe gun club in the 50s.

(Clubs at Sale, Yarram and Leongatha have also disappeared).

Les was a good single barrel shot.

But a Les Mitchell Second was a term for a frightfully late shot.

As Les entered his 70s, and successes grew fewer, he took up skeet.

His age and years of tracking a down-the-line shooting made it difficult for him to achieve the zip that is required to skeet.

Nevertheless he went to the National skeet carnival in Melbourne last spring, and on one of the several days of shooting won an over-65 veterans' section with 47/50.

He was a most agreeable competitor, he never complained or made excuses.

He was one of the few who closed a gun correctly . . . by raising the stock rather than the barrel.

He is survived by his wife, two sons who live at Trafalgar and Traralgon and six grandchildren. He is also survived by three brothers and a sister.



N.T.C.T.A. NEWS

COURTESY CORNER

The writer was involved in the following incident. A new shooter at the club, on hearing his name called for a squad, picked up his gun, closed it, with cartidges in the barrels, and proceeded to walk across the grounds to the second layout in use. He reached the walks before being accosted. Luckily, the rounds were empties. The writer arrived at the club, and was asked to take the shooter 'under his wing' post haste. Understandably, the 'newchum' was a bit tense (to say the least), and after a low-key, but concentrated lecture on safety, unwound and started breaking a few clays. He finished the round reasonably confident and composed. As we walked back to the clubhouse, we were accosted, first of all, by the gentleman who was going to 'see him right' at the shoot, and then by another shooter who was all set to tear strips off the returning novice for his earlier unsafe efforts.

This type of incident reflects no credit on the club, its officials (who should have spotted the novice and allocated a 'buddy' to look after him), the person responsible for inviting the shooter (who should have advised squadding officials if he was unable to look after the novice), or the shooter who saw the safety breach, and did not immediately attempt to correct it. Fair is fair, we must encourage new shooters, and it is for the benefit of everyone if we smother these shooters with attention from the time they get to the club until the time that they become safe and proficient. Let's get it right next time, fellows!

DUCKS AND DRAKES DEPARTMENT

August the first was the beginning of the duck season, the announcement coming a bare three weeks before the opening, from the N.T.'s Conservation Commission. New regulations have been promulgated (again!) regarding shot size and gauge of guns (10 gauge being allowed for geese).

If you're not sure of the regulations for this session, it would be advisable to contact the nearest C.C. outlet for details.

"THERE'S NO RULE LIKE AN OLD RULE" CORNER

Top End shooter, Phil Crute has had in his possession for many years, a copy of an 1860 British book on shotgun shooting called 'The Dead Shot', writted by a shooter with the pseudonym of 'Marksman'.

It covers the many facets of the gunning arts, giving a wealth of detail on all topics. The style of writing, although obviously of another age, is still engrossingly readable. Chapters include those of selection of a gun (explaining why a muzzleloader is a much harder hitting gun than a breechloader — 'those new fangled ideas will never take on'); duck, quail, snipe, grouse and partridge shooting ('the French partridge is a much inferior bird to the native British bird'); selecting a gundog; courtesy and etiquette; etcetera.

The chapters that particularly took my attention were those on safety and rules for live pigeon shooting. Their wisdom has been untarnished by time. In recent months, we have debated the 'Refusal Rule', sometimes




Illustration and Title Page of "The Dead Shot", an 1860 Shooting Manual.

ferociously, and it was most refreshing to read what rules our counterparts of a century ago shot under. Clay targets were not mentioned, whether from not being in widespread use, or from being beneath the author's dignity to comment on. With live birds, a field stance was required. On his mark, the shooter was not allowed to either sight the gun, or to have the butt above his elbow. On refusal, "miss-fires", etcetera, consider the following rules —

- 11. If the trap be pulled, not at the time of the signal, the shooter shall have the option of calling "No Bird" and refusing to shoot, but if he shoots, the bird will be deemed a fair one, and scored for or against him as the result may be.
- 12. If the bird does not rise immediately, after the trap is pulled, the shooter is to have the option of calling "No Bird", but if he shoots on its afterward rising, it will be considered a fair bird. If he advances beyond the footmark, shoots at the bird on the trap or on the ground before it rises, it will be scored against him as a "Lost Bird" and this is whether he kills it or not.
- 14. If after giving the signal "Pull", the gun should be found uncapped, without a tube, or improperly loaded; or if the shooter, through negligence, is unable to fire, and the bird flies away, it will be scored against him as a lost bird.
- 15. But in the case of a miss-fire, through the cap or tube not exploding, or failing to ignite the charge or other accidental circumstances not attributable to the shooter's negligence, he may call "No Bird" and claim another.
- 16. In single bird matches, if two or more birds be liberated at the same time (whether accidently or otherwise), the shooter shall have the option of calling "No Bird" and refusing to shoot at either; but if he shoots, the birds will be scored for or against him, as the result may be.

There are many more rules, and I was struck by these century-and-a-quarter-ago-compiled laws, and the commonsense approach. The shooter was the person who decided whether he would shoot at any particular target or targets. Officials were present at the shoots to determine sportsmanship, observance of rules, legality of shot and charges (which section was also reasonably detailed), but the shooter was master of his destiny when it came to choosing his targets. We seem to have forgotton quite a lot over the last 126 years.

DARWIN DIARY

After a working bee to finalise preparations for the Annual Shoot, workers were treated to a couple of hundred free targets. The catch was, that they were a mixture of colors collected over a three month period on the grounds. Fluorescents, magpies, yellows and whites intermingled with the old standby, blacks. Also, to make things more difficult, many had been warmed by "the hot tropic sun" into shapes their maker had not intended. Strange to remark, few targets found their way unbroken to the ground, and no shooter was unduly surprised by the color (or lack thereof) of the target. Point of the story is, that if you're aware that any color will emerge from the trap, it's no big deal. And, if you get the wrong colored target in competition, it shouldn't be a problem, either to break the target, or to refuse to shoot at it. It's your choice.

The ladies are showing good form on practice days, with Laney Grove and Vlasta Weis excelling.

Geraldton visitors Jack and Laurel Hartley are also practising for the Annual Shoot. Many locals remember their epic Double Rise shoot off three years ago, when Laurel took the grade trophy away from Jack.

Phil Baldock is still scratching his head over the wiring system used in a skeet layout at the club. After re-siting a set of traps, test-firing gave shooters the choice of; singles only, doubles only, or one trap firing regularly with the other one firing continuously. Anything for a chance, I guess. After all, it's only skeet!

After a trip to Adelaide with wife Vera, long-time club member Steve Lorman became ill, and is now convalescing at his Stuart Park home. Here's for a speedy recovery, Steve. We hope it's not too long before you're out on the walks again.

Resident "Trenchologist" Dexter Barnes took another trophy recently after a shoot off with Ken Selwood, both scoring 48/50 in the event. The usually fiercely competitive 'B' graders took fright at the 'A' graders' scores, and left Joe Bell top of the pile with 35/50. Bob Fox, shooting in 'C' grade (how did you manage that, Foxy?) slaughtered both his grade and the 'B' graders with a fine 42/50, which Bob reckons should have been 45/50 at least. Well done all!
