AUSTRALIAN GUN CLUBS OF EARLIER DAYS

One of the most difficult tasks I have in putting together the history of our sport, is the absence of information material that goes back to our very beginning. Unfortunately it seems that no records have been made or kept of our sport in that period of time prior to 1930. In fact, almost no records have at any time been made of the history of our game.

Perhaps the nearest approach to keeping records was the decision by the Executive Committee to publish a monthly magazine called "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News". The publication was the Association's initial essay at providing a regular monthly news bulletin covering Clay Pigeon Shooting happenings in all States of the country. The "news" was certainly a great step forward. Its contents included Association open handicaps, personal paragraphs and information, Association directions, instructions and recommendations, letters of interest, suggestions, shoot reports and overseas items as they come to hand. The news was issued to every affiliated club and registered shooter.

Today, 40 years later, the news is still being produced and distributed in much the same way. Of course it is updated and presented in modern form.

I am indebted to the following clubs for their help and support in supplying the stories and pictures of the early days of their club and the people who were involved in helping to establish and build our sport during difficult times. Most of the pioneers of the real early days have now passed on, however, they should not be forgotten.

All the evidence available points to a period of time around the early 1850s when gun clubs became active in Australia. Firstly in Sydney and Melbourne, and later spreading to Tasmania. Then country areas throughout Victoria — N.S.W. and S.A. became popular venues for live bird clubs around the 1890s and more or less flourished up to pre World War 1, 1914-1918.

With the war behind and reports of Clay Pigeon Shooting in America replacing live birds, very few of the original pre war clubs bothered to reform.

As far as I am aware, there is no evidence of live bird shooting in West Australia or Queensland, before the introduction of Clay Targets. However, I am sure there would have been some form of activity in this regard.

Has your club ever shot live birds? NO.

When did you club commence shooting clay targets? 1935 (this is to the best of our knowledge).

The Club commenced skeet shooting on the site of the Diggers racecourse, known as McGregor Park and was called the Charleville Diggers Gun Club. The Club was inactive during World War 2.

In 1947 the Charleville Diggers Gun Club got underway again after many difficulties in procuring ammunition and targets. Lal Armstrong was President and Jack Harland as Secretary-Treasurer, both of whom were Diggers. As the old grounds where the Club had first started shooting

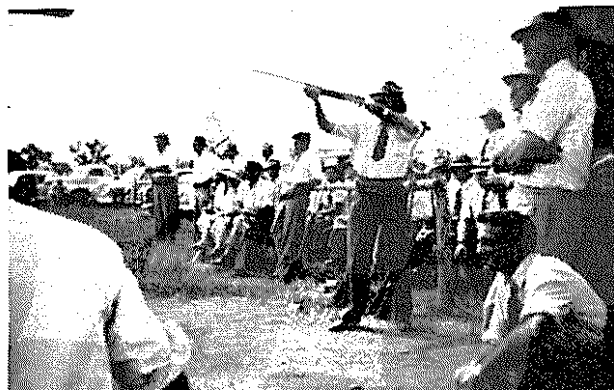
had been sold, the Gun Club moved to this new site in the centre of the course, where an Eley Minor trap was put in operation.

In was not long before there was another shift of the Club grounds from out of the racecourse area to an area on the southern side of the Show Grounds, which adjoin the racecourse and, under the leadership of Ossie Smith as President, and Reg Akers as Secretary-Treasurer, two Auto traps were installed and then the club really got underway. The Club had a membership of around 100 local shooters and in the early fifties was rated as the best club in Queensland, and as Jock Wilson, a Past-President of the Australian Association said when he attended one of the open three day shoots, that the club was capable of holding the National Championships. The down the line layout was increased to three auto traps to be able to handle the large number of shooters. The late fifties saw a decline in the shooting due mainly to the economy and drought in the area, and as the Club was becoming more hemmed in at its site on the Showgrounds, there was another move to its present site just off the Adavale Road, about two miles from Charleville.

The club's name was changed to the Charleville Gun Club as most of the old Diggers had passed on. In this period the club lost all previous records when the then Secretary, Brian Allen had the misfortune to have the homestead of "Allendale" Station destroyed by fire.

There followed a slow buildup of the new grounds until the reins were taken up by President, Jim Mahoney, Noel Gadsby as Vice President, and Don Turnbull as Captain-Secretary. The club now has lovely grounds. There are two down the line and one skeet layout, with beautiful trees, lawns, a very good clubhouse, the grounds are fully lit and has modern shower and septic toilet facilities.

In the past such greats as Newton Thomas, Clive Evans and Joe Raleigh were members of the Charleville Diggers Gun Club and attended shoots regularly, and also Doug Smith began his shooting with the Charleville Club and any shooter in Australia knows his class.

ESPERANCE BAY GUN CLUB INC.

In 1960 the Gun Club began with a few members shooting in a small clearing in the sandhills on what is now the site of the Esperance Squash Club. This was a clay target setup using something like a Plus trap. Two years later in '62, several members travelled to Kalgoorlie to contest their Championships.

In 1962 the first Easter Shoot was held on the beach in front of the Pier Hotel. This was a picturesque setting with Norfolk Island pines along the Esplanade.

The traphouse was a steel box which must have made the trappies' ears ring if someone shot the traphouse. The

Easter Shoot continued on the beach until 1964.

While shooting carried on at the original site with the Easter Shoot at the beach site, attempts to come up with a permanent site continued and eventually a Nature Reserve about three miles east of town on the Fisheries Road was gazetted for recreation and the present complex has grown from there. The then President, Ivan Donohue, Secretary Brian Barrett and a membership of about twelve began with a single layout on what is now the No 4 layout. The original traphouse had double timber walls sand filled. A small tin shed served as a club room.

The last beachfront Easter shoot, 1967, was moved about a mile north in front of the Travellers Inn due to Police pressure. It was about the beginning of the Esperance boom years when better roads to the Goldfields brought visitors in droves for holidays.

1967 saw the development of a permanent clubroom. The first Easter shoot on the present site was held in 1968 over two layouts. In August of that year very heavy rainfall caused Bandy Creek to burst its flood path and the grounds were flooded. Members had to wade out to the traphouse and retrieve the pride and joy of the club, a Damo automatic trap.

During 1978 two more layouts were added. Not quite at right angles to the original pair it has provided a challenging shooting site. As these two layouts were built, extensive earthwork was done to improve the background and a skeet layout was incorporated into No 2 D.T.L.

Over the years, the Easter Carnival has developed into a two and a half day event with trophies up to the \$6000 value and attendances of up to 108 shooters.

WAGGA GUN CLUB

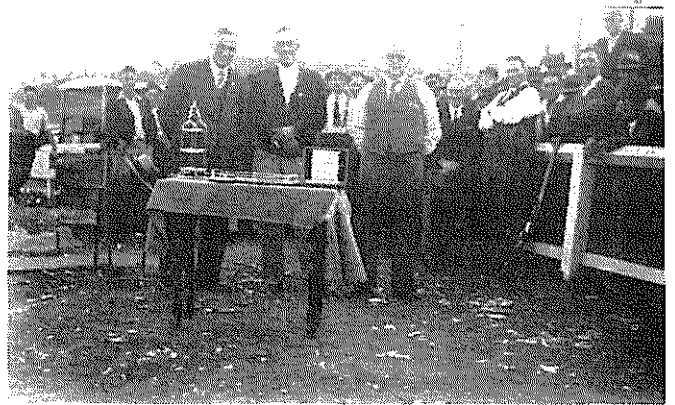
The club was originally situated at the Wagga Race Course, in the year 1868 (approximately) as this is the year in which a newspaper had recorded the results. As this was the newspaper's first edition, the club may well have been established years prior to this date.

During the 1900-1940s only the elite gentlemen of Wagga shot; these were the doctors, solicitors and lawyers. Mr Baylis was shooting then and he was the Mayor of Wagga. An average of 20-30 shooters attended the shoots. The live birds were kept overnight in an aviary and they were watered and fed, then released from traps by trappers at the shoots.

Shooting stopped during both World Wars I and II. The club shifted from the Race Course to the Old Agriculture College, then to the Uranquinty Aerodrome until the owners decided to sell the property and the club had to be relocated. Finally a place was found, the de-licensed Wagga Airport, in 1970. The club moved there with a mere \$12.00 in the bank. The original office was an old wooden caravan-cum-playhouse. Two trap layouts were put in and it would have cost at that stage \$1500 to put electricity on,

so for two years they used an ex-army generator. In 1971 the first skeet layout was built. Over the years the club has added to the club house which was an old R.A.A.F. hut and have just received a grant from the N.S.W. State Government for a new club house.

ST. GEORGE GUN CLUB

The above club formed in 1936 with Dr S.M. McDonnell as President and for one month only E.H. Corbould acted as Secretary/Treasurer. After this period C. Neilson took over as Secretary and Dr McDonnell took over as Treasurer. The location of St. George Gun Club is Marie Street, St George and has been at this address since inception.

The Gun Club was formed on the 5th September, 1936, with approximately 23 members with shooting marks from six to 18 yards. On March 10, 1937 it was decided to affiliate with the A.C.P.T.S.A. The last general meeting held before the war was 28/8/39 and then re-established on November 24, 1945. The Club still holds a memorial trophy shoot in memory of John F. Jackson who was one of the original founders of our club who died in the war.

DEVONPORT CLAY TARGET CLUB — TAS.

Originally called the Latrobe Gun Club, goes back to the 1930s when shoots were held at the old Latrobe Showground where the Latrobe High School is now situated.

The club got underway at Benney's Flat, behind Lucas Motel around 1946. Mae Johnstone was president, Ernie Sharman, Bob Mikenell, Don Brett, Jack Marse, M. Brett, Doris Gatho, Sid Meagher and Romney Rockcliffe were some of the earlier members. Of these only Sid Meagher and Jack Morse are still alive.

About 1950 the club moved to Laurie Johnson's property at Sherwood, two or three miles out of town, and remained there until the early 1960s.

In 1963 we moved to Coles Beach, Devonport, our present site, and renamed our club the Mersey Gun Club, the late Bert Watson being elected President in 1964.

In 1973/74 under the guidance of President Ray Mason great improvements were made. With the aid of the R.E.D. scheme the club house was extended and a skeet range installed.

Members decided in 1980 that the word "Gun" did not help our image in the eyes of the public and the club name was again changed and is now the Devonport Clay Target Club.

Our current President is Steve Munday and acting secretary/treasurer is Mrs Molly Bryan.

COSGROVE GUN CLUB — VIC.

The above club was formed pre-1900. No official date can be confirmed, only in 1949 a banquet was held to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the club. The club was started as a hare shooting club. The president in 1961 was L. Sim and Secretary was G. Ballintine and the original club location is the present location, Cosgrove Recreation Reserve, and on July 4, 1961 the first clays were recorded to have been shot from this club.

COLAC GUN CLUB — VIC.

Our year of establishment was 1896 with President W.H. Clements and Secretary/Treasurer H.D. Thomas with the initial and present location being Colac Recreation and Racecourse Reserve. Our club had shot live birds as you will read in our minutes a little further on. Many top-line shots have risen from the ranks of Colac men. Prominent among these were Eric (Pop) Ball, George Crosse, Ray Parker, Harvey Eldridge, Ian Holt, Don Corstriphan, Ernie Osborne, to name a few. Don joined up in 1946, Ray and Harvey as mere lads, soon after. They along with Eric Ball and Ian Holt all gained International status with

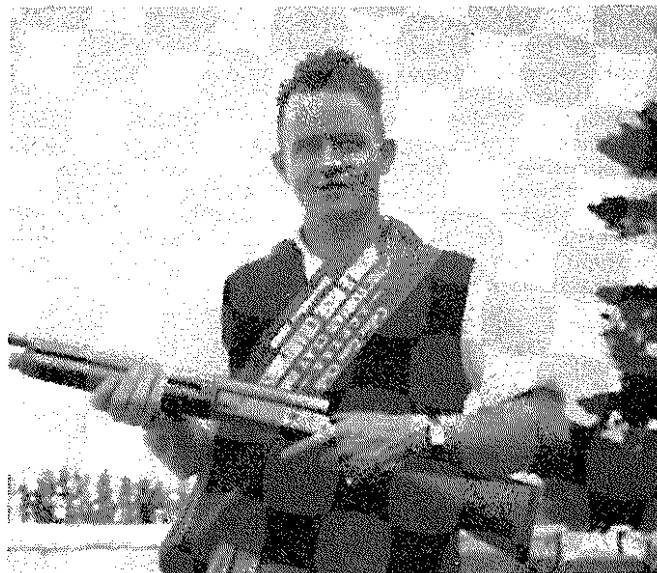
the A.C.T.A., formerly the A.C.P.T.S.A.

In the early 1950s before we had our own accredited referees, Hartleys would kindly release George Biggs on a Saturday morning, so that he, accompanied by his wife and two charming daughters, would travel to Colac to referee our Open Championship days.

The conversion to clay shooting commenced in 1939 with a plus trap and a single-lane one target at a time. In 1946 we bought an auto angling trap from Les Black (which is still in its box — unused).

A new club house was erected some years ago but the old shed still stands as a storeroom and it will be remembered as the scene of good times in the past.

Thirty-eight years ago Harry Mills, our local Policy Inspector, offered the club crockery if Mrs Corstriphan would prepare teas and suppers. She carried on this for 15 years then Mary Osborne took over for a like period. Mary Dignan now resides in the kitchen. We now have crockery!

Notes taken from Old Minute Book of the Colac Racecourse Reserve

- 18.11.1865 Public meeting held with the intention of forming a Board of Management. Five trustees were appointed — Dr Thomas Rae, John McLaughlin, Robert Robertson, Humphrey M. Hearn and William Bradley. The Secretary, who wrote the minutes in beautiful copperplate and impeccable grammar, was P. Wilson. Regular periodical meetings were held at Colac Hotel until 25/11/1868, then a break occurred until 30/11/1872. Captain John Haines was then Chairman.
- 8/12/1877 Trustees increased to seven by appointment of John Calvert and Easton Johnstone.
- 1/ 9/1883 Management of Course passed to Colac Turf Club, who retained control to 4/2/1918, a period of 35 years.
- 12/12/1918 First mention of Colac Gun Club, when Dept. of Lands & Survey wrote to say that Golf and Gun Clubs had applied for 75 acres of the Racecourse Reserve.
- 9/ 4/1923 Gun Club asked Trustees to be relieved of its indebtedness owing to its inability to arrange shoots, and offered payment of £1 per year. Agreed and future rental set at £2 per acre per annum.

May, 1928 Golf Club was professionally extended to 18 holes, which was to include the present practice area and where the Gun Club then operated. Also, as shooting (live birds) was considered distasteful to ladies the Gun Club was asked to move across the drive and exchange clubhouses. This was agreed subject to payment to Gun Club of £100 and full shooting and clubhouse facilities. W.H. Clements & H.D. Thomas represented Colac Gun Club.

Note: Gun Club must have been formed while reserve was in the hands of the Turf Club, i.e. between 1883 and 1918. The late Charlie Romeo had a club membership card for 1908 and his recollection was that the Club began operations in 1896.

NARRABRI GUN CLUB — N.S.W.

The club formed in 1905/6 by J.M. McDonald assisted by an enthusiastic committee comprising Messrs Jim McCutcheon, Horrie Lillyman, Harry Foster, Dugie Frater, Billy Smith and many others.

The first shoot was held at Dugie Frater's property immediately opposite Merihula Wine Shop. Birds were live pigeons, betting was allowed and even in those days betting on the first barrel was prolific. The club housed a number of birds at Frater's house (now demolished) where they were regularly housed and fed. When there was missed bird, he could not get back to the loft quickly enough.

In live bird shoots there were five traps in a fan shape each equi-distant from and connected to a central control where the umpire sat. Marks (shooters' positions) ranged from 32 yards to 20 yards. The boundary was roped off a distance of 35 yards from the trap and the bird had to be killed within that boundary. In later times gun dogs were introduced for retrieving the birds and they were remarkably well trained. These dogs would follow the shooter to his mark, stand quietly behind the shooter and when he fired they were off to retrieve the birds. Bets were made on the first barrel only, although a kill on the second barrel allowed the shooter to remain in the sweep.

The first shoot at Merihula was won by a local Bob Dempsey, off 20 yards.

After a while birds became scarce and costly and about a couple of years before the 1914 War clays came on the market. Casual shoots were held in the centre of the racecourse but the ground was unsatisfactory because of shooting into the sun.

Every shooter had his own gun, including some very good makes such as Purdys, Boswell, Cashmore, Holloway-Norton, Greener and Hollis. There were a few Browning Automatic 6 shot. There were not any under and over Japanese guns. The cartridges used were mostly Balastite, Mullerite and Diamond Smokeless. One hundred cartridges cost ten bob.

Live bird shooting was again resurrected and a very enthusiastic team formed a new club at Tom Barrett's Hotel including Tom Barrett, the two Dempseys (Cyril and Fred), Bill Galloway, Jack Hougnet, Wal Martin, Dave Thomas, Pat Casey and many others. The club staged a shoot (live birds at the old Plumpton, Egan's paddock) and Sid Delander won the big shoot from George Gilbey. The Plumpton layout was not a success and the Club next had a shoot at the back part of the racecourse opposite Moyland's paddock. At the first shoot a young lad in his first suit of long trousers stole the show and outshot all the big gun shooters. It was only Vic Eather, so well known by shooters all over Australia.

At one shoot on this new ground we had the pleasure of entertaining Luke Hughes who had just come back from winning the Melbourne centenary shoot. Luke was the

possessor of one of the most beautiful Purdy Double Barrel (two sets of barrels) guns.

After a lapse of 25 years yet another bank of enthusiasts got together and formed another gun club and decided on Perfume (Newton) Park for the shooting. The new President was Bruce Mill, Vice-President Bruce Solling and joint honorary secretaries Dave Thomas and Pat Casey. In the early stages the committee were greatly assisted by Vic Eather of Boggabri Club. The Perfume Park site had a very short life due to a wet season and the impossibility of access to the ground.

In 1963 the same club had two shoots at Narrabri West on the property of Peter McColl. More wet weather put a stop to shooting at Mr McColl's property and a new site was sought.

The committee were successful in obtaining the present site of 13 acres. The first president on the new site was Athol Palmer with the new secretary Eric Saunders.

Today the club boasts three Damo automatic traps with cement walks to shoot from, as well as skeet, tower shooting and provision for night shooting. It also was a clubhouse containing the usual necessary amenities.

MOUNT GAMBIER GUN CLUB

The club was formed on August 8, 1872, President Mr R.J. Turner and Mr W.R. Burton, Secretary. The first program organised by the newly-formed Mount Gambier Gun Club was a pigeon match held on Mr Umpherson's paddock, two miles east of the town on October 2, 1872.

I would like to acknowledge a special thanks to Fred Hudson whose contributions have been most welcome. Unfortunately some of his historical pictures have been too frail to be reproduced.

However, we will present further oldies in later editions. I was delighted to hear from two old timers, to share their history and their future with us.

A.J. (Alex) Baker commenced competition shooting in 1922 and continued regularly through until December 1984, at which time he had attained the age of 84 years.

He was a foundation member of Ganmain Gun Club, which was formed in 1925, and which still conducts shoots on a regular monthly basis.

In 1946 he instigated the first Gun Club to be formed at Tumut, and since that time has done much towards keeping the Club operational. His efforts in this resulted in him being given Life Membership in about 1970.

During his 62 years of competition Alex has shot at many Clubs in Australia, and in 1974 he competed at the National titles conducted at Vandelia, U.S.A.

His favourite gun, and one with which he was noted for his marksmanship, is a side-by-side Purdey.

Alex, though not now competing, still retains a very keen interest in the sport.

The Tumut Gun Club since its formation in 1946, has been located at various ranges until 1975, at which time it moved to its present site on the Kurrajong Reserve.

It has a current membership of 30, and facilities consist of two Winchester traps, one of which is set up for night shooting, a comfortable clubhouse, set in the picturesque Bombowlee Creek valley, and children's playground area.

Shoots are conducted on a regular monthly basis (second Sunday of each month), and during 1985 average attendance was 28 shooters per month.

As a matter of interest, Alex Baker's son, Robert, has almost completed his seventeenth consecutive year as Secretary/Treasurer of the Club.

I first stated this sport of shotgunning way back in the early 1920s; it may have been going long before then, that I don't know.

My brother and I seemed to have had a liking for shooting as far back as I can remember. We must have been only school kids when our mother used to ask us to take the gun (it was an early model Winchester 22 Rifle) and try and shoot something for the weekend. In those days meat from the butcher was out of the question for us, as we were a large family living on the banks of the Goulburn River. So out we would go and return with only a rabbit or hare or if we were lucky a black duck or any other bird which we thought was edible.

About this time we heard of a shooting club starting, which it did in the Alexandra Show Grounds, so one way or another we pooled our finances and had two pounds and ten shillings, which was enough to buy a H & R single barrel shotgun, and had our first attempt at hitting these fast-flying objects, in those days clay birds, and I am still trying to catch up with them after 60 years of trying but expect to give it away when I turn 81 in March.

I have shot at most clubs in Queensland, Norfolk Island, Terranora Lakes. There is always a day in a shooter's life that we always have great pleasure to look back on. For me it was the day I shot alongside of Newton Thomas. He came to Townsville with the well-known sportsman and champion shot Jim Smith.

Many times I have told my mates that I intend to give shooting away but I just can't as I like the sport so much.

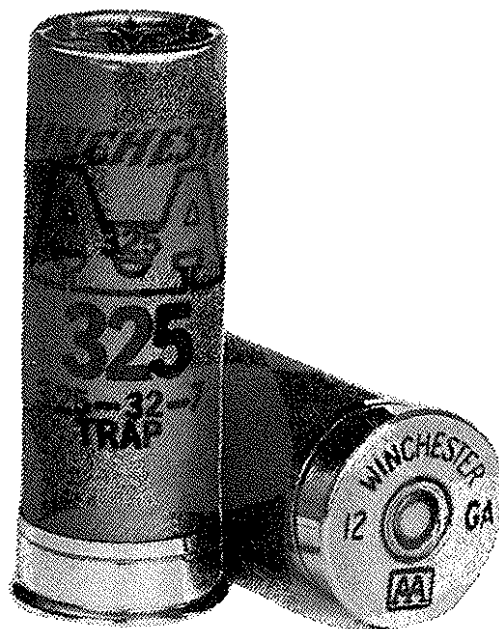

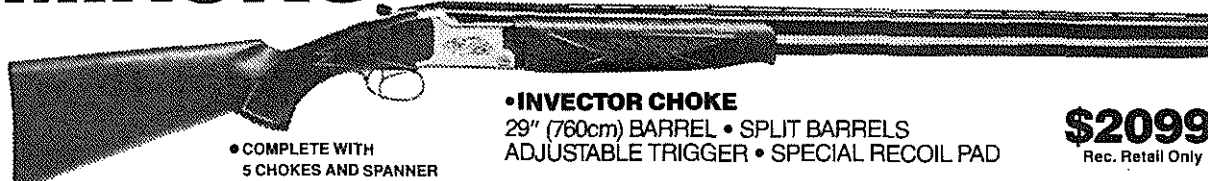

PANIC STATION

Breaches of Firearm Safety are all around us every day, and with less than one shooters licence in every 28 claiming membership in any of the shooting codes, the battle for awareness and responsibility is likely to rage for many years to come.

We have all heard of irresponsible and dangerous behaviour in this bane to shooting sportsmanship. Recently at a registered gun club, with events in progress during mid-afternoon, a Toyota Landcruiser arrived on the scene bearing three adult males and an eight-year-old boy. The driver, as spokesman, commenced to bounce our very busy Club Secretary demanding approval to test a new gun. The Secretary naturally refused but relayed the problem to the Club Coach, who in turn secured permission from the Club President to handle the matter.

It transpired that all three visitors wanted to test the new gun, and when first asked all claimed to hold shooters licences; however, when requested to present them, all three "had left their licences at home". The forgetful visitors were informed that in the absence of licences they would not be permitted to shoot, for reason of both Insurance restrictions and routine safety procedures practised by the club.

The spokesman, in manner akin to a kid with a new toy, took an eighteen inch barrelled 12g long-magazine self-loader from the floor behind the front seat where the young boy was sitting. I requested him to open the action: he pulled back the bolt lug and as I reached to take the gun I noticed a cartridge in the magazine, and immediately commented, "You have a problem, there is a round in the magazine with the action open and empty." He quickly replied, "No problem, there is a special button inside to allow loading. This is a new safety system to allow loaded guns to be safe." He proceeded to extract six cartridges from the magazine...

During the course of my tirade, for having the gun loaded, being carried in a vehicle, etc. I was informed that this gun (which resembled one of the 1970 Rossi specimens with all metal sandblasted) will be carried wherever its owner (legal or otherwise) wishes, as the gun "IS COMPLETELY SAFE when loaded". I confess to being devoid of the ability to appreciate the actual intelligence of such practised stupidity.

The questionable character, being somewhat offended by my apparent lack of co-operation in his intentions, decided he was without a name and neither he nor his two adult companions were inclined to sign the visitors' book, or be educated or advised, and thenceforth proceeded to depart the venue.

I ask every person claiming basic intelligence to assess the undeniable potential of this "Accident Going Somewhere to Happen" (when will they visit your club?) with currently very little that any sane person can legally do to prevent, in this and similar circumstances, the inevitable.

I would alert all shooters and clubs to such as this example of gross stupidity and irresponsibility, and as a veteran Safety Officer recommend that in any assembly every new face should be checked.

Be sure to:

1. Ascertain identity and physically inspect shooters licence;
2. Record name and address or shooters licence in visitors' book;
3. Ensure that a qualified Safety Officer or Instructor checks each person and educates, if necessary, before allowing that person to run loose among the educated and trained.

FIREARM SAFETY IS A PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY AND MUST BE RECOGNIZED AND PRACTISED BY EVERYONE.



WORLD SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS 1986, SUHL, EAST GERMANY

The World Shooting Championships are held every four years and include all types of shooting. It is the Olympics of the shooting world. This year sixty Nations competed in some form of shooting competition.

The Championships were held in Suhl, a town in the south west corner of East Germany, surrounded by forest. Small fire-arms have been made in Suhl since the 16th century and the sporting and hunting weapons made there are excellent. The whole town is involved in the industry, so interest in shooting sports has a long history, with attendances at the various shooting grounds of up to 20,000 spectators. The competitors and officials were treated like heroes, with queues of people waiting for autographs. The facilities were excellent as was the organization.

Our team flew to West Germany and stayed at the Police Academy in Wiesbaden in West Germany to train. Winchester had organized some ammunition for us and this was appreciated as it is almost impossible to purchase ammunition in West Germany. A licence is required for any purchase. It is necessary to be a Gun Club Member and apply to the appropriate government department to obtain one.

The skeet team of Craig Meuleman, Alex Crikis, and Ian Hale, competed in a competition at the Wiesbaden Gun Club and all won German sausages and bottles of wine, very temporary trophies, as they were shared with all other competitors.

For those of you who may not know, all international competition i.e. World Championships and Olympics is I.S.U. or Olympic discipline, the majority of nations competing have never shot D.T.L.

The skeet team and myself went into East Germany on the 1st of September for the skeet competition, leaving the trap team and Robby Smith, an invaluable member of the Australian team, in Wiesbaden.

The World Championships this year were run according to the new championship rules, to make the trap and skeet finals suitable for television. Even the clay targets used in the final had red powder in the centre, so that when hit, a puff of red dust was visible.

From the shooters point of view, the new rules are not altogether satisfactory. There is a cut off at 150 with 24 shooters continuing to shoot the next 50, and the top six shooters are taken into the final. The top six shooters are decided on count-back system. The final six shoot a further 25 targets, if scores are equal after this, a count-back

is used to decide those left. If there is more than one after this, a shoot-off, miss and out, is used.

This year the shooter who initially finished in 2nd place with 198 missed out altogether on count-back. Ian Hale of Australia shot a magnificent 197/200 to finish equal third, but was eliminated on count-back. Matt Dryke of America won. He shot 199/200 to go into the final and shot 25 clear, Benelli of Italy second with 197/200 and 25 clear, and Toman of Rumania third with 197/200 and 25 clear. The count-back system to decide the top six shooters seemed unfair, as did the count-back in the final. Those of equal score would have previously shot off, miss and out. I believe this could still be used to decide the final six and the place getters after the final 25 targets. In miss and out it is the first to miss that is out, not the last.

As I have said, Ian Hale shot 197/200, Alex Crikis 190/200 and Craig Meuleman 190/200, but lost three targets on a penalty. The women's skeet was won by Demina of the U.S.S.R. with a 196.

The trench team of Terry Rumbel, Domingo Diaz and Russell Mark worked extremely hard and all went on to the last 50 after the cut off. That is they were in the top 24 shooters. The team shot 436 to come 4th in the team event. Terry shot 193/200, Domingo Diaz 192/200 and Russell Mark 190/200. Bednarik of Czechoslovakia won the trap with 199/200.

All of the six Australian shooters shot 190 or better, it was a great effort, our shooters are very highly regarded by other competing nations. We have every right to be proud of their efforts, as I know just how proud they were to represent their sport and country. Ian Hale's 197/200 was some of the best shooting that I have seen, and to shoot a

personal best in a world championship is no mean feat. The three newcomers to team, Domingo, Russell and Craig, performed like veterans.

Our trap shooters in Australia when competing, start their preparations to shoot before the previous shooter has finished shooting, in Europe the shooters do not prepare to shoot until it is their turn. This means they are cutting down the period of intense concentration and extending the rest period. This has the effect of slowing down the competition and of course takes more time.

The next World Shooting Championships will be in the U.S.S.R. in 1990.

WARATAH STATE NOTES

Firstly this month, President Len Bird's Annual Report which was presented at the A.G.M. held at Griffith on the 3rd October. Len was unable to attend the State Carnival due to not being in the best of health. Everyone's thoughts are with you Len — hope to see your happy face back around the traps very soon.

PRESIDENTIAL REPORT — 5.10.85-3.10.86

Once again, I submit my report, knowing that a great deal has been achieved in a depressed atmosphere, and feeling that more could have been achieved with a little more effort and support.

I said in my previous report that "it is easy to look over one's shoulder and reflect on the past — somewhat more difficult to look into and read the future". This has proven very true during the term of this report.

The most important factor facing your Committee and every club in the Association is the continuous "drop off" in attendance — I know that we have constantly discussed this aspect of the sport and, frankly, I cannot see any possibility of a change in the foreseeable future. My personal feeling is that the predominance of 15m shooting is a deterrent to new shooters entering the sport and will continue until we can obtain the co-operation of the clubs to program shoots that will encourage new shooters.

FIREARMS ACT

The State Government have commenced to invoke the new Firearms Act, although the full effect will not be felt for some time. From information received it appears that it will be gradually invoked over a period of time for political reasons. I would strongly suggest that every registered shooter continue to contact their local Member of Parliament and press for the repeal of portion or all of the Act.

STATE CARNIVALS

Once again — the State Carnivals have proven to be a financial success and are our main source of income. Each club that is fortunate enough to be allocated a carnival know that they will have a great deal of work to do to bring the amenities to the standard required by the Association. It is an honour to hold a State Carnival and show the shooters of NSW just what your club can achieve.

CLUB CO-OPERATION

My State Secretary, Jenny Burt, is continually seeking your assistance and co-operation. Jenny can only work to her capacity if you, the club secretary or president, send her the information before or when it is due. Please assist by sending all information in early and assist your Association to function satisfactorily and competently.

WARATAH STATE NEWS

We have continued to give you particulars of any happening as soon as possible through "The News", monthly bulletin or the Waratah State News. The presentation of news by the above media gives us the opportunity to keep in close contact with you and assist you to know what your State Executive are doing. In our sport, we are scattered right throughout the State and this is the only satisfactory means of communication that we have available.

Armand Chateneuf, French, 50, has smashed the previous world record of Olympic Trap clayshooting over 24 hours at Nancy range: 8091 clays hit over 9012 shot at — an enormous 2044 hits over the previous record (Michel Pujolle).

Percentage of hits was 89.78%; total cartridges fired 10,842.

The French shooter had four Beretta S04's available for this event, but has practically utilized one only, without encountering the slightest malfunction — no servicing to the gun was required!

The previous 12-hour record fell after 7 hours 26 mins., the previous 24 hour record (6074 clays) fell after just 15 hours 10 mins.

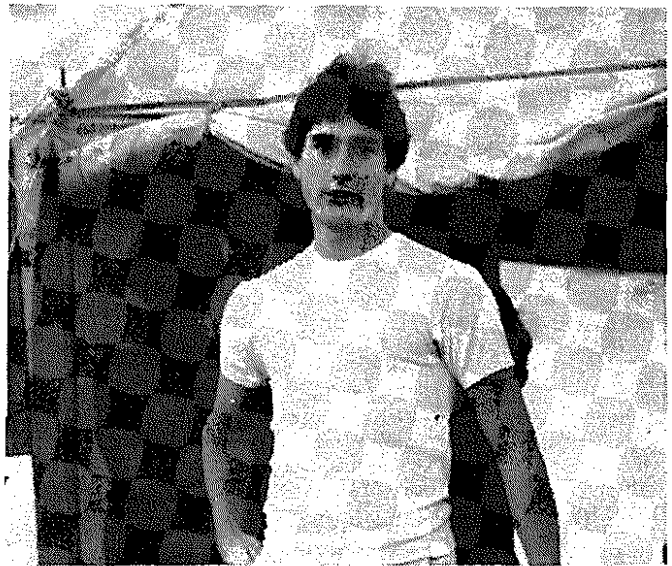
To the press witnessing his exploit, Armand is reported to have said, "... my new 8091 clays record over 24 hours won't be easy to break ... for anybody else!"

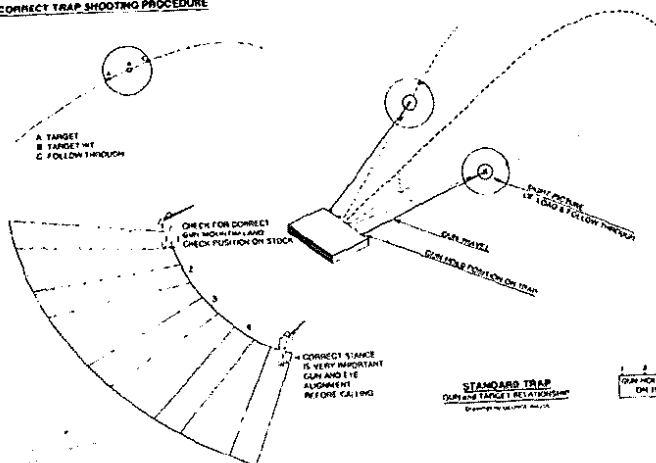
