International Teams to compete at the World Moving Target Championship shall be selected from members of the 1987 National Training Squad who do complete the prescribed additional two 200 targets qualifying events during 1987.

The International/Olympic Final System shall be used for both Championship Events.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

As I mentioned last month, there have been two meetings recently conducted, the International Shooting Committee and the National Executive Committee.

Both of these meetings had very long agendas and as a result were very time consuming. Many varied items were discussed and as a result decisions taken.

In an attempt to keep you well informed on the everyday workings of the Association, a summary of the meetings held are published for your notice.

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING COMMITTEE — December 4, 1986

- The Olympic Discipline Championships from 1987 will be competed for using the new International format for finals. This format which may not appeal to many, has been introduced at our Championships to ensure that when competing Internationally, be it at the Olympic, Commonwealth Games or World Championships, that our shooters are not disadvantaged.
 - The format will allow for 75 targets to be shot on each of the first two days (Trench and Skeet), at the completion of the 150T a cut off point will be established for all other than the top 24 competitors, who will be resquadded to shoot the final 50T.
 - At the completion of 200T the top six from the 24 will contest the final which will be shot over an additional 25 targets. In the event of a tie for any positions a count back shall take place, first in rounds and then if necessary in targets to determine positions.
 - Should this not then separate any shooters, a shoot off will be conducted with the shooter missing first eliminated, providing each shooter has shot at an equal number of targets.
 - All entrants will shoot the full 200 targets on this system with the top six at the completion shooting an additional 25 targets.
- 2. The State Associations will be requested to frame their 1988 I.S.U. program in a manner that will enable continuity of competition. This is considered to be a most important area and the co-operation of all State Associations will be sought at the appropriate time.
- 3. Masters badges for proficiency levels will be introduced as from the 1988 O.D. National Championships, levels to be Gold 192/200, Silver 190/200, Bronze 188/200.
- Olympic Games. Provided that quotas have been secured, eliminations for positions in the Australian team will take place between those shooters who have fully qualified.
 - No person shall be able to obtain a qualifying standard or compete for an Olympic quota for Australia unless he has first received the sanction of the A.C.T.A.
- Members of the National Training Squad must shoot the designated program of 400T to be eligible for selection for the teams to compete in the World Moving Target Championships.

A number of additional items were discussed and recommendations made to the Executive Committee.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING — December 6, 1986

This meeting took place at Geelong where the Executive were hosted by Winchester who arranged meals and accommodation, as well as providing the meeting venue, an excellent gesture and we must thank Winchester through John Canning and Bruce Burns for the opportunity of meeting in Geelong and touring the Winchester plant, a most interesting day for all concerned.

- The A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance cover has been hit severely with an increase in the annual premium of 32%. While this is in keeping with the industry trend on Public Liability, it nevertheless is another example of rising costs.
- 2. The Nationals Sub-Committee has been reformed to

- investigate all aspects in relation to National Championships. Appointed to the Sub-Committee are Mrs Kaye Woods (Chairman), Jim Scott and Brian Growden
- The recommendation to discontinue the practice of awarding grade high gun medals and trophies has been approved.
- 4. A review on the awarding of the A.C.T.A. pewter medal has taken place, this medal will now be awarded only to the overall winner with an additional medal to be struck for Ladies/Juniors/Veterans Grades. This decision has been taken owing to the High Cost
 - This decision has been taken owing to the High Cost of the medal which has almost priced itself out of existence.
- Reduced nominations are to be introduced for all future Nationals and will benefit Ladies, Junior and Veteran Shooters.
 - Nominations will be at 60% of the open nomination amount. The payment of a full nomination however, is still required to win recognition and trophies in the open section.
 - Selection in open teams is also conditional upon the shooter having paid the full open nomination amount.
- Trap National sequence of events as from Brisbane will be:
 - Day 1 Handicap
 Day 3 Single Barrel
 Day 4 Points Championship
 Day 5 Champion of Champions
 Day 6 Double Rise
- 7. Queensland Shooters under the age of 14 years are not and will not be allowed under any circumstances to compete in the State of Queensland until such time as the current legislation may be amended to so allow.
- The recommendation from the International Shooting Committee that members of International Teams who do not comply with the conditions of selection be no longer considered for selection in future overseas teams was approved.
- 9. The National Referees Association will meet formally in Melbourne on Saturday, February 14.
- Penalty conditions have been introduced for late starters and for failing to Referee and score when allotted to do so.
 - These conditions will be printed on the Nationals nomination forms.
- 11. A notice of motion together with an Executive recommendation will be placed before the Annual General Meeting, these have been publicised separately.
- 12. In accordance with a decision taken at the 1986 Annual Meeting the Association has applied to migrate from a Company Limited by Guarantee to an Association under the Associations Incorporation Act (Vic.).
 - This application has been made using the existing Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association to which there has been no alteration other than the introduction of terminology in certain instances to comply with the Associations Incorporation Act.
- 13. In accordance with rule 3(17) the Executive Committee have set the nominations and trophy values for the year of 1987. The full details are published separately.
- 14. Nomination procedures will allow for shooters to request they be squadded in the same wave as other identified shooters.
- 15. 1988 National Trap Championship have been approved for April 16-21 with the Wagga Gun Club being the likely venue.
- A new National title will be added to the Skeet program as from 1987.
 - This will be a 50T National Skeet Doubles Championship which will replace the National Carnival Championship.
 - The winner of the National Doubles Title will be awarded the Silver Australia Badge.

- 17. The results obtained in the National Doubles Title will have bearing on any long run break, any miss in doubles will be a miss in the long run break.
- 18. A seven member team will be sent to the 1988 New Zealand Trap Championships. Comprising one member from each State including the Northern Territory, the team will be self selecting with the best performance from each State at the A.C.T.A. 1987 Trap Nationals in Brisbane forming the seven member team.

Full nominations must be paid in the qualifying event to be eligible, Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points Championship.

19. The Practice of Card playing at all National Championships is to be prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar and dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

As can be seen, the meeting was long and exhaustive and the combined efforts and attention of the Executive to the matters at hand assisted the chairman in the running of an efficient and worthwhile meeting of the National Executive Committee.

On behalf of the Executive and all members of the Association, we extend our deepest sympathy to National Vice President Jim Scott and his wife Joan, for the loss of their daughter Susan, who passed away on Friday, January 2, after a long illness.

Jim and Joan, the thoughts of your many friends are with you in your time of sadness.

REFEREES & REFEREE **EXAMINERS**

The following formats have been approved by the National Executive Committee and will be implemented effective January 1, 1987.

REFEREE EXAMINER

MEMBERS:

As appointed by a Rule Supervisor in accordance with rule 4.23(a).

APPOINTMENT:

To retain appointment until such time as he may elect to resign or alternatively his appointment is terminated by the respective State Association in relation to rule 4.20(c). DUTIES: In Accordance with Rule 4.22(a-d)

- 1. To examine applicants for referee status for A.C.T.A. trap and or skeet.
- 2. To submit to the A.C.T.A. Executive Director a recommendation on forms, Trap — Blue 26A, Skeet — Pink 26B for the confirmation of appointment as a qualified referee for the respective candidates.
- To re-examine every referee within six months of the expiration of his five year appointment and advise the A.C.T.A. Executive Director of either the:
 - A. Continuance of Referee status if re-examined satisfactorily, for an additional five year period.
 - B. Cancellation of referee status if unsatisfactory.
 - C. Continuance of referee status without reexamination for an additional five year period.
- D. Cancellation of referee status without reexamination, together with cancellation reasons.

IDENTIFICATION:

Each referees examiner will be issued with a "Referees Examiner" badge by the A.C.T.A. Office.

The A.C.T.A. will provide details annually on each State

Secretary of those referees who are eligible for reappointment. State Secretary will advise referee examiners accordingly.

ADVICE:

Each referee will be advised by the A.C.T.A. office of the decision of the referee examiner at the expiration of his five year referee appointment.

REFEREES

1. Following upon an approach by a registered shooter to his Club President or Secretary

OR

2. an approach by a Club President or Secretary to a registered shooter.

providing the shooter has achieved a satisfactory standard a recommendation will be made in writing to the nearest registered Referee Examiner that the candidate be given a practical and oral examination.

APPOINTMENT:

- 1. For a period of five years from the date of examination.
- 2. To be re-examined at the expiration of each five year
- Failure to be re-examined following this period will result in the withdrawal of referee status.
- A six month extension will be granted to allow for reexamination.

DUTES: In accordance with rule 4.20

AUTHORITY:

To give final determination in all cases coming under his jurisdiction as set forth in the rules.

IDENTIFICATION:

Each referee will be issued with a referees badge which must be worn at all shoots.

Would all referees and referee examiners please familiarise themselves with the guidelines that have now been established on an ongoing basis.

NOTICE OF MOTION — ANNUAL MEETING

(In accordance with rule 36D) Submitted by National Executive Committee

The Articles of Association be amended to read, under Rule 13, Subscriptions, "The Annual Subscriptions payable by members shall be such as the Executive Committee shall from time to time prescribe.

"All Annual Subscriptions shall become due and payable in advance of the 1st day of January each year. Any Incorporated club or delegate admitted to membership during a year shall pay the full subscription for the year in which it or he is so admitted."

The notice of motion proposed by the National Executive is that the constitution be amended to enable the National Executive to set the annual registration fee. This would provide a lot more flexibility for the Executive in managing the finances of the Association. The present situation means that the Executive, becoming aware of a necessity for an increase of registration fees in mid 1986, has to propose the increase at the 1987 AGM and the increase will be effective January 1988. All business matters agree that to predict so many months in advance is almost impossible and this change will now help to alleviate this. I assure shooters that the Executive will use this authority responsibly, and remind you that most club committees set annual fees. The Executive is made up of two representatives for each State Association, whom they may replace if unhappy with their delegates performance, so I see no problem in according the Executive the right to set the registration fee. An example is the proposal to increase it by 16% after five years, which clearly indicates a responsible attitude.

RECOMMENDATION TO ANNUAL MEETING Submitted by National Executive Committee

"The registration fee be increased by an amount of \$5.00 effective as from January 1, 1988, for both first and second family members.

The National Executive of the A.C.T.A. wish to increase the annual registration fee by \$5.00 to \$35 and the second family member to \$20. If the Annual General Meeting endorses this request, the rise will be effective January 1988, some five years since the last increase. In a way this rise is overdue, as the Executive have delayed this request until absolutely necessary, for as a committee, it is well aware of the economic climate. This five dollars is necessary to fund a 32% increase in our premium for public liability insurance, together with production costs for Clay Target Shooting News which rose 14% last year and 8% this year, as well as all those small regular increases we are all aware of. I believe this is a most reasonable request and look forward to your support of this important recommendation in April at the AGM.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

SKEET NATIONALS WAGGA.

The Skeet Nationals saw some good shooting and prove again that skeet shooters are dedicated and love their sport. It was rewarding for me to meet so many shooters and discuss their shooting with them.

Being at the Nationals brought home to me how important it is for shooters to find a style of shooting that suits their particular body, eye sight and reflexes. There cannot be any one ideal style. I see no reason why any shooter cannot become a good competitor and gain satisfaction from their sport, but some of us are a little stiffer, our reflexes a little slower and our hand eye co-ordination not as fast, this being so even if our body shapes are similar. It is important to analyse not only our bodies but our ability to pivot, point and swing and adjust these to suit ourselves.

Champions are champions because they have adapted their stance, gun hold, swing etc., to suit their bodies. The whole process of shooting the clay is natural and comfortable and with practice the gun becomes an extension of the body. But what suits any one particular champion may

not necessarily suit everyone.

With the assistance of a coach initially, find the correct stance and hold for you, and then learn to monitor yourself, and ask yourself what it is that you do when you break the clays and feel comfortable about it. Take note of your feet position in relationship to the pad, and in skeet the gun start position, and then practise. Practice is the key once the shooter has the correct stance to suit his body, and understands the importance of waiting to see the target, before moving. Practice will ingrain the correct movements in your muscle memory. Practice your gun hold, stance and swing in the laundry, in the kitchen, anywhere, as long as you take heed of gun safety, of course.

Too often I see shooters mimic some movement that a champion makes that is suited to that champion, but not to the mimicker. If God had made us all the same shape and size and with reflexes of the same speed, we could learn the skills of shooting by numbers, but of course this is not the case. It is possible to learn many things by watching others, but to be successful, we as shooters must develop our own individual style. Champions become champions because they practise, are dedicated to personal improvement, have a style that suits them, and a desire to win, and the confidence in their own ability to do so.

I.S.U. NATIONALS PERTH 1987

The Olympic Trap and Skeet Nationals are to be held in Perth in February 1987. This will be the first I.S.U. Nationals at W.A.'s magnificent new grounds. There are three Olympic Trap layouts and three Olympic Skeet grounds. The shooting complex in Perth is really something to see now. Any shooter who can be in Perth in late February early March can be assured of enjoying a great facility and W.A. hospitality as well as enjoying competing for the 1987 National Squad, and possibly representing Australia in the 1987 moving target Championships in Montecatini in Italy, and also have a chance to represent Australia in the Oceanic regional championships to be held in late January or early February, giving the opportunity to gain a qualifying score to make them elegible for selection for the 1988 Olympics. Don't forget you have to be in it to win it.

CLAY SHOOTING 1986

1986 has seen Domingo Diaz win the World Championship in 5 trap in Spain, Ian Hale shot equal third score at the World Championships, Adrian Cousens came 2nd in America at their World Skeet Championships, Terry Rumbel and Domingo Diaz won bronze at the Commonwealth Games, Terry won the silver medal at the badge match of the Commonwealth Games and Domingo and

Terry came fourth at the World Championships in Germany. Terry Rumbel broke the Australian record in Olympic Trench and won the South Pacific Games, Craig Meuleman broke the record in Olympic Skeet, Adrian Cousens has shot over 501 straight in American Skeet. Add to all that, outstanding performances in D.T.L., and all I can say is, what a year!

CLAY SHOOTING 1987

We have a great sport, we can break clays from an early age to as old as we get, and compete at any level we choose to, and add to that, I believe without doubt, clay shooters are the friendliest sports people there are. So in 1987, with enthusiasm and commitment, clay target shooting will go from strength to strength. We must adapt and be forward looking. Looking back fills a need, but must be used to build upon, to create a brighter future. May 1987 be full of broken clays for all of you.


1986 VICTORIAN STATE I.S.U. CARNIVAL

NOVEMBER 22 AND 23, 1986

The final 200 targets to select the Victorian State Training squads in I.S.U. Skeet and Olympic Trap was hosted by Frankston Australian Gun Club. Both the State, I.S.U. Skeet and Olympic Trench titles made the final 200. They were shot under ideal weather conditions compared to the first 200 at Melbourne Gun Club. Thirty-four shooters entered the Olympic Trench event and eleven the I.S.U. Skeet. The competition was tough for outright winners with the juniors showing their ability to match it with the top shots in all eliminations. Top scorer to make it in the Olympic Trench State Training Squad was Steve Haberman with 377/400. Domingo Diaz 376, Russell Mark 370, Geoff Mark 364. Two juniors filled the other two placings, Wayne Vella on 357 and Mark Crevatin 353. Not far behind Mark and taking the two junior spots in the squad were Mark Rogers and Brett Dunstan, both on 352.

The I.S.U. Skeet Training Squad consists of Craig Meuleman 378/400, Ben Dudenas 369, Alex Crikis 366, Glen Clarke 363 and Graham Guy 358. Disappointing to note, no juniors competed for positions in the I.S.U. Skeet Training Squad, especially when so much is being done to encourage and assist the juniors to participate. Something for the Trench juniors to watch for is a 100 target Championship event to be conducted at Frankston Australian Gun Club in February 1987. The event carries as first prize to the top junior an air fare to Perth W.A. to compete in the I.S.U. Discipline Nationals. It is being

Congratulations all!

RULES RORTS

We can come forward ONE Metre each year, if we haven't won anything during the year, provided we shoot at 200 or more handicap targets, but we can go backwards and forwards between grades at the drop of the proverbial hat. It is not inconceivable that a shooter who 'plays a tune' on his grades can cheat his fellow shooters at least a dozen times a year by shooting in a lower grade, winning at a major shoot and going up a grade, then shooting 'off' for a couple of events in his next 400 targets and being downgraded again. The only fair way to sort out grading rorts is not to reward a shooter for shooting poorly, but to handicap him for shooting superior scores. THE ONLY MOVEMENT IN A CALENDAR YEAR IN GRADING SHOULD BE UPWARDS. If a shooter over the calendar year shoots lower then the grade he has attained, he is entitled then to drop one grade, just as in handicap shooting, he is entitled to move forward one metre. This system will stop grade cheats, eliminate much of the handicapper's work at all levels, with grade movement occurring, generally, only once a year. It will also make a shooter shoot to his capabilities, knowing that he is only going to be downgraded at the end of each year. It also stops poor weather, bad lighting, strange layouts from incorrectly influencing gradings of a shooter. If the shooter shoots well during the year he is graded upwards and can only be regraded further upwards, regardless of poor scores shot during bad weather, bad temper, or bad targets. What about it, Rules Association? Any comments for and against, from anyone, would be welcome at the 'News'.

WAIKERIE "LEGACY" SHOOT FATHER v. SON FOR TRIP IN GREAT SHOOT-OFF





Sponsorship of all the events by local businesses was the main factor in the success of the Pre-Nationals. These sponsors provided excellent trophies at high values. These sponsors must be thanked because without them we would not have had a successful National:

Weather and shooting conditions were near perfect for most of the week.

All the Pre-National Championships were won with perfect scores and always having to be decided by shoot-offs with some going for a considerable time. This gave an indication of the standard of shooting that would be at the Nationals, which was extremely high with the possibility of the skeet break record being broken again. Adrian once again came very close but not quite close enough, he made another break of 501 straight.

Also thanks to the very small hard working committee and workers who helped with the construction of the new layouts and other jobs to help bring the standard of the club up to national level in the short period of time. (Incidentally, the committee and workers consisted of four men and three women.) These people have been thanked, but need thanking again. Some alone spent over 800 hours in the construction of just the skeet layouts.

Many of the shooters do not realise the amount of 'behind the scenes' work involved in making the Championships run smoothly; replenishing the trap houses and cleaning the rubbish up each day. Our committee at the club have been branded the 'quiet achievers'.

Those who attended the Nationals were surprised by the amount of media coverage we received for the Nationals. Local television station RVN2 — The Prime Network (which covers a huge area) spent many hours and much work in preparing lead-up stories and footage for the Nationals, this started in November 1985. During the Nationals they spent a few hours EACH day at the Club taking footage and interviews with shooters, this was then covered on the news each night with a considerable amount of time being given. Under the guidance of Sports Editor, Doug Hogan, publicity of Clay Target Shooting and the Nationals started well in advance of the championships here in Wagga with many of the general public commenting on this. We are very lucky to have such a good association with someone like Doug and The Prime Network team, who are ready, willing and interested in the shooting and give us many hours in total of positive publicity.

Local paper, the Daily Advertiser which has an average circulation of over 17,000 a day (which more than likely increased while the Nationals were on!), also gave us good publicity. During the Nationals, Sports Writer, Ian Smith, did an excellent job with his coverage. Ian spent a lot of time at the Club before and during the Championships with stories in every day with results as well as photos. We are also very lucky to have a good association with the Daily Advertiser and Ian Smith.

Riverina Leader, which is a free paper once a week, were also very good with leadup stories and pictures leading up to and during the Nationals.

Our Riverina Radio Broadcasters **2WG** with Sports Editor, Allan Hull, gave us plenty of 'air' time. Friday and Saturday Sports Talk programs as well as in general sports and news items. Interviews were conducted from the studio as well as via the phone. Most of the interviews went for five or more minutes.

I would like to thank all those involved with the media coverage of the skeet shooter's 'prestigious' event of the year and their time involved in coming out to the club and learning a little more about shooting and skeet in general and for making my job much easier.

We have had very favourable comments by the general public about shooting. At least they now know we are not a bunch of idiots with guns. The club has also had about 2-3 phone calls a week about people interested in coming to have a look/try at clay target shooting.

We had quite a few spectators during the week which is encouraging. The Nationals were a big plus for the City of Wagga Wagga and also for our sport.

The club would also like to thank Mr Sergio Zuffo for the kind loan of his automatic Kromson skeet traps and the portable skeet layout. Also thanks to Melbourne and Queanbeyan Gun Clubs for the loan of their traps.

I'm sure that those who attended the Skeet Nationals had a wonderful stay in Wagga and at the Nationals. It was also good to see the Ladies taking grade trophies in with the men.

The Sapphire necklet and earrings which were kindly donated by Ken Cross (Qld) for the raffle was won by Kevin Weatherall's wife, Shirley, of Tamworth. Congratulations.

Construction of the new club house has started and will be finished by the Trap Nationals in 1988.

Good shooting and all the best for '87.

REMOVABLE CHOKES — THEIR EVOLUTION

CHOKE has been defined as "a constriction, usually at the muzzle end/s of the barrel/s, intended to improve the density of the pellet pattern/s". One way of achieving this is through the use of removable chokes. The idea is not new. In this country an early and successful attempt was made by Thomas Turner who produced an attachable short pair of choke tubes (see illustration). These were fixed on the ends of a double-barrelled gun's muzzles. The illustration is taken from "Practical Hints on Shooting", 1887. The author claimed he had fired some 1,000 shots through a gun so fitted without the attachment working loose. Even in those days these muzzle devices were separately proofed and stamped. The weight of this gadget was given as 20z.

For those who wish to use one gun for all their shooting, which I favour, the add-on screw-in, drop-in, screw-on choke tubes do have a great attraction.

Between the wars we had the Cutts Compensator. Produced in the States and derived from military-type weaponry, eventually someone fitted a modified version of it to semi-automatic and pump guns. Such guns were often barrel-heavy and this was overcome by rebalancing. The greater diameter of the Compensator made the gun so fitted shoot low. This caused no problem for the Americans; they simply bent the barrel slightly upwards to raise the pattern placement.

Most well-dressed skeet shooters of those days used pumps or semi-autos so fitted — and to good effect. A full selection of screw-on choke tubes, from skeet to full, were supplied. Those which I shot and tested threw good patterns equating to the chokings indicated.


I also did some experiments with the Cutts spreader chokes. With the help of an engineering friend we redesigned one of these, eventually producing one to throw an oval pattern, the idea being that for crossers one would turn the choke to throw the oval pattern horizontally whilst for Station 8 and the Springing Teal type of target one set it to throw the oval pattern vertically. The trouble was that to produce an oval pattern one also flattened it. Regretfully I came to the obvious conclusion that what I and many others really required was simply a much much greater all-round pattern.

My friend Gough Thomas took out his slide rule and designed a screw-on rifled choke. Fitted to a semi-auto it really did what it had been designed to do — throw 50-in diameter patterns at about 20 yards. This was much wider than the usual pattern produced by a normal skeet gun of around a 30in diameter at the same distance.


All of which was encouraging. But most clay shooters always watch how they break their targets. If they begin to "tail" their targets and are chipping the back edge, they take note and either increase their speed of swing or open up their sight picture. The extra wide patterns of the rifled choke made this accurate reading of pattern placement more difficult. This in turn resulted — at least in my own case, of even more confusion — not conducive of improved scores! The police ruled that a gun fitted with a rifled choke required a firearms certificate with all the extra expense and hassle and so the idea was dropped. I am still convinced that the Gough Thomas rifled choke had much to commend it for, say, ferreting rabbits or close-range woodland shooting.

Greener's also supplied a fine set of screw-in choke tubes for their GP Multichoke gun. A compensator was first fitted to the barrel, into which the tubes were screwed. I owned one some 25 years ago. It handled well and the patterns were excellent. I only once tried the experiment of sharing a pigeon hide with a friend who also owned a Multichoke—but not for very long. To my mind compensators at such times are anti-social.

Also available was, and indeed still is, the collet-type of choke. With or without a compensator, these were fitted to

single-barrelled guns. One model claimed a range of eight degrees of choke available "at a twist of the wrist". Another was designed to automatically tighten up one degree of choke each time the gun was fired, the idea being if one missed with the first shot one immediately was provided with the required tighter choke for the next shot at the going-away target. Whether the thing worked in reverse on incomers I know not.

Since then there has been much development work and many single-barrel guns and O/Us are designed from scratch to be fitted with choke tubes as standard. Some of these tubes are even designed to throw off-centre patterns. For myself, I regrettably am all too capable of eccentric pattern placement without the help of so much sophistication. I believe that within the next few years there will be available new guns, O/U and single-barrel in a wide range of qualities, all with choke tubes supplied as required.

As for side-by-side guns, as far as I know there is only one side-by-side which will be sold new with choke tubes. The above illustration shows two sets of barrels, both of the same make, one without chokes and one with. There is very little extra width at the muzzles; actually it is only 5mm. This gun will be available later this year.

As to converting existing guns with conventional barrel's, there has been extensive work done in the States. Briley of Houston, with the aid of a computer, fine machine-tools and high quality steel has been converting guns to screw-in chokes whether single barrel, side-by-side or O/U. I patterned some guns when I was over there and the results were excellent. Mr Briley told me that the

barrels needed a minimum of about 35 thou thickness barrel wall from the muzzles extending back for 3in. It was also vital for the barrel/s to be bored concentrically.

Work on similar lines has been done in this country. Although the choke tubes are shorter, have a different shaped thread and fixing key, the patterns which I have so far seen are fine. Both gun and tubes so fitted in this country must be submitted for proof and be passed before being sold to the public. This has to be done under the rules of our Proof Houses, and rightly so.

Held at Frankston/Australian Clay Target Club.


On a cool and overcast Sunday late in October, with a fine attendance of 167 shooters the carnival ran smoothly all day

The Carnival is the final round of the South East Zone Premier Teams Event which was shot in conjunction with the first two events, being the Double Barrel and Handicap.


The winning team on the day was Bairnsdale with 235/250, represented by: D. Luelf, G. Hine, M. Huggins, G. Petruska and P. Curtis.

We are pleased to be able to congratulate them both and also set the records straight.


COWRA GUN CLUB LIFE MEMBERS





The Forest Gun Club's first 2-day shoot proved to be very successful due in no small measure to the hard working committee who put in a third trap layout at the last minute.


In spite of the new layout, giving one the feeling of perching on mountain peaks, the greatest number of possibles were broken on said layout.






