





PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR 1986

The year under review has seen another slight increase in our total membership from 8929 in 1985 to 9238 in 1986, an increase of 309. This is most gratifying to your executive, particularly the increase in junior members, who are also prominent at all our National Titles. I am sure however that a lot more could be done to encourage an increase in our membership but this is entirely up to the individual and his club.

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

These were conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club in February and we were privileged to see shooters from the United States, Canada, Malaysia, Papua New Guinea, Hong Kong and New Zealand among our visitors. It was pleasing to see our shooters right up with them and the complimentary remarks from the manager of the U.S. shooting team regarding the standard of shooting in this country and the stiff competition afforded his shooters was appreciated. Our thanks to the President of the Brisbane Gun Club, Mr Tom Meadows, and his members for a well-presented venue, and all officials who combined to make these events so enjoyable.

DTL NATIONALS

These were conducted on the enlarged grounds at Echuca under the auspices of the Victorian Clay Target Association. This proved a winner as the venue chosen was in a well-known shooting area and the club, under the stewardship of President Ray McKenzie with the help of other well-known members, got well and truly behind the project, which was to stage an enjoyable and profitable Nationals. A total of 872 shooters attended, consisting of 179 AA, 236 A, 280 B and 177 C Grade. The 756 competitors in the double barrel event is testimony to the acceptance of the venue chosen, while 612 in the handicap was an all-time record. I would once again compliment Robbie McDonald and the members of the V.C.T.A., who put so much time and effort into these events, for a job well done.

SKEET NATIONALS

Wagga Wagga in N.S.W. was the scene for our 1986 Skeet Nationals and again the N.S.W.C.T.A. accepted the challenge and staged a very successful carnival. A large contingent of shooters from overseas were present, particularly from New Zealand, and the appreciation of this Association is extended to all our visitors. Those dedicated people who did all the ground work and eventually ran the tournament are assured that all competitors appreciated their efforts.

ACHIEVEMENTS

I would like to commend Terry Rumbel for his new Australian record of 199/200 in the trench at Brisbane, Craig Meuleman for his record 198/200 in I.S.U. Skeet at Illawarra and while still of junior status, Ian Hale for his equal third in I.S.U. Skeet at the World Championships in Suhl, East Germany, and Adrian Cousens for his second place in the 12 gge Skeet at the World Championships in San Antonio, Texas, with an initial score of 250/250.

SPONSORS

All the aforementioned national events and Commonwealth, State and Club events would be very low-key and difficult to stage in the extreme if it was not for our sponsors, large and small, that assist with trophies, cash or personnel, towards our tournaments Australia-wide. On behalf of all shooters, clubs and associations connected with this sport I extend our heartfelt thanks for their support.

COACHING

Our Coaching Director Peter Quire has been very involved this year in assisting with the development of coaches at clubs but has also had to contend with management of teams as mentioned elsewhere. We now have ?? Level 1 coaches, ?? Level 2, with ?? Level 3 almost ready to be implemented, and many others well into their courses. I congratulate each one of them for their commitment to our sport.

I was very disappointed at the treatment our Association received from Phil Murray, a recognised expert skeet coach in the U.S.A., who cancelled out on his obligation to us a week before he was due to arrive. This not only let you as shooters down, but allowed this Association no time to find a substitute. Consequently the seminars had to be cancelled, at some cost no doubt to each State Association. This was to be part funded by the Rothmans Foundation and if we can come up with another overseas coach who will positively respond, hopefully these funds will still be available.

Peter was also asked by the New Zealand Association to coach in that country during November and, assisted by several of our shooters and coaches, a very successful clinic was staged. This was funded by the Olympic Federation's Solidarity Fund and we are at present looking at this source for a similar course for our shooters.

FINANCIAL

As can be seen by the financial statements we have run at a nett loss for the year although less than budgeted for, mainly because of the Trap Nationals coming in \$6000 over budget. Less funding by virtue of Government grants of approximately \$5000 also contributed to our shortfall of \$14,524 for the year.

Your executive is aware of the problem and several moves have been made and are contemplated to redress this matter. However, continually escalating prices in the marketplace particularly in regard to the production costs of C.T.S.N. were beyond our control. On a brighter note I am pleased to advise that a recent valuation of our headquarters property has shown that we would make a substantial gain if we decided to capitalise.

INCORPORATION

This Association is now incorporated under the appropriate Victorian Act according to the notice of motion passed at the last A.G.M. effective as from January, 1987. Further to my entreaty in my last report I am pleased to say that many clubs have also moved in this direction. I once again point out to those who have not that it is in the best interests of their individual members to attend to this matter immediately.

In conclusion I congratulate my executive for the way in which they addressed their responsibilities during the year in the representation of their respective bodies and this Association in particular. My thanks also to our executive director and his office staff for their wholehearted support and dedication to their duties. I regret that time did not permit me during the past year to see more of the shooters and the clubs associated with this great sport.

ANNUAL REPORT 1986

It is my pleasure to be able to present the 1986 Annual Report and balance sheet of the Australian Clay Target Association.

In presenting the Annual Report, I have followed the traditional format of reporting to members.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Elected for a third successive term as National President, Mr Roy Holtfreter from Northam, W.A., was untiring in his efforts to ensure the success of the Association.

As well as running a large business operation, Roy at all times made certain that the A.C.T.A. and its member clubs and registered shooters were never disadvantaged.

The results of the many meetings which he chaired are testimony that the President's position was well entrusted for the year.

There was a change in the Vice President position at the Executive Meeting in Echuca following the Trap Nationals. Mr Jim Scott from Dubbo, N.S.W. was elected to the position for 1986 and was also untiring in his efforts on behalf of the Association. We must always bear in mind that the National Executive Committee is not the only area that these dedicated people are involved in on behalf of shooting and the time that they give is always without complaint and ever increasing.

The Executive did meet formally on two occasions through 1986, once at Echuca and once at Geelong in Victoria, when they were hosted by the Winchester division of Olin Australia.

Both meetings were long and demanding and it is to be hoped that the decisions made are accepted in the manner in which they are arrived at, that being for the good of Clay Target Shooting in Australia.

Changes to the Executive during 1986 saw three new members. From Northern Territory we welcomed Mr Dexter Barnes replacing Mr Ian Butcher, Victoria Mr Jack Matthey replacing Mr Bob Buchan and from W.A. Mr Murray Alexander replacing Mr Daryl Wiese.

Changes are always to be expected and on behalf of all shooters we welcome these three new members to the Executive and sincerely thank those who have departed, for their services to the A.C.T.A.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

This four member Committee is responsible to the National Executive Committee for the running of the Association between meetings.

Meetings were held throughout the year as were deemed necessary and decisions made in accordance with the authority vested in the Committee.

A new member for 1986 is Mrs Kaye Woods from Tasmania, who accepted the confidence of her fellow Executive members and has contributed to the Committee with her many years of experience in administration in Tasmania.

This Committee is a most vital one for the Association and continued to operate in a manner befitting its importance.

INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING COMMITTEE

Owing to the new rules governing Olympic competition, the I.S.C. is preparing for a very busy couple of years.

With the games now only open to those countries who have won a coveted quota position, it is going to be very difficult to attract shooters from overseas, as for Olympic Games quotas, Australia has nothing to offer.

Similarly, we must address ourselves to overseas competition for other than the Oceania Games. Quotas must be chased and won outside our "local area".

Chairman Mr L. Connors was ably supported by members of his committee throughout 1986 and has seen recommendations made in committee supported by the National Executive Committee.

The new member to this committee is Mr David Menck from Tamworth N.S.W. David is currently being upgraded from B to an A grade judge and his experience at this level will be passed on to our own shooters as David is a most involved person in the Olympic Disciplines.

In relation to International Teams, more stringent qualifying conditions are being placed on the members of the National Training Squad who come under the jurisdiction of this Committee and these conditions will assist in producing the right team balance at the time of selections.

Australian teams in all shooting disciplines competed at both the Commonwealth Games and the World Championships during 1986. Not all of the results were to our liking, however there were some outstanding results that are worthy of mention. Ian Hale's equal third in the World I.S.U. Skeet Championship being one and all members passing the qualifying standards for the 1988 Olympic Games another.

PROMOTIONS COMMITTEE

The renamed Publicity Committee also has an important function to fulfil, however the results of its labors will not be readily seen. There are a number of existing proposals in the air and the Committee is very confident that it will be able to see and have some of its ideas accepted by the Executive in the very near future. Chairman Laurie Connors and members of the Committee have been active throughout 1986 and the results of their work will be published to all members via the C.T.S.N. at the appropriate time.

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

While the A.S.A. may not be as active as perhaps we would wish, it nevertheless fulfils a vital function of our sport. Government and Olympic and Commonwealth Games Associations will only deal with shooting as a sport through the A.S.A. and therefore without the A.S.A. we would be hard pressed to justify our existence for international competition.

With regards to the importance of the A.S.A. all shooting disciplines are proving to be very supportive and the future of the A.S.A. as a negotiating body for the sports seems to be well assured.

The A.C.T.A. is represented at the A.S.A. by the Executive Director who was elected to the position of Vice President at the Annual Meeting in November 1986 and the National Coaching Director who was appointed to the International Competitions Committee.

NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

With visits to various State Associations to conduct coaching clinics as well as his duties to the National Teams and Training Squad, 1986 did see a very busy year for Peter Quire.

Peter's involvement with the sport over the year as National Coaching Director is now really starting to show results. Our standard of shooters generally speaking has never been higher and our international teams are considered to be worthy opponents wherever in the world they may be competing.

State Associations are urged to ensure that they make use of Peter's experience and ability for their shooters. If this continues to happen then the final result will be proof of the value of having a National Coaching Director for our sport.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Another twelve months has gone by and a number of changes have taken place. We have produced an extensive manual for all national championships which as time goes by will, hopefully, assist in the smooth running of our national events.

A large problem that confronts us is the lack of control over income. A number of ideas have been discussed by the Executive and notices of motion will be presented to the members at the annual general meeting.

Consider them carefully and when exercising your vote please do so with the needs of the sport in mind. There is a difference in what we want to happen as against what we need to happen and the Association does need to be able to have some degree of influence over its income.

The Association does provide a lot of enjoyment for its many members and I take this opportunity to extend my appreciation to all who have assisted me throughout 1986 to allow for this to be so.

I look forward confidently to a successful 1987 and the continued support of members throughout the year.

GOVERNMENT GRANTS

During the year the Australian Sports Commission did allocate grants to the Australian Clay Target Association which greatly assisted in the sending of the team to the U.S. Skeet Championships as well as providing general administrative assistance and the funding of the National Coaching Director.

Additional grants were received from the Commission via the Australian Shooting Association for the World Shooting Championships as well as from the Australian Olympic Federation.

The support of the Australian Sports Commission and Olympic and Commonwealth Games Associations is vital to the future of our sport at International level and we are pleased to be able to record our appreciation of the assistance that is provided.

The Australian Sports Commission does have in its employ some dedicated sports people and it has been a pleasure to have been able to work with them throughout the year.

The Institute of Sport did also provide a training camp for the members of the National Training Squad during the year and we were fortunate to be able to partake of their excellent facilities during 1986.

STATE ASSOCIATIONS

A per capita amount of \$14,062 was returned to State Associations during the year. This figure does reflect the number of shooters registered as full adult shooters for 1986.

State Associations also have been able to obtain State Government funding and the total support given by State Governments is a contributing factor to the ever increasing efficiency of our administration and overall development of the sport at State levels which reflects nationally for the betterment of all shooters.

MEMBERSHIP

A small reduction in the numbers of registered clubs, however, was to be expected owing to the very small number of shooters that some clubs had as members.

New clubs are on the horizon for 1987 and now that clubs have to obtain State Associations' approval to become a member of the A.C.T.A. some of the very, very small clubs that have joined in the past will now have to do more than just pay an affiliation fee to join the A.C.T.A.

Registered shooters were up in numbers and it is pleasing to see a small but gradual increase in this area.

Clubs have continuously been made aware of the need to ensure that only registered shooters compete in A.C.T.A. events and fortunately this appears to be happening. Insurance protection is only for A.C.T.A. members in accordance with the guidelines previously published in the C.T.S.N., and clubs are requested to make certain that they comply with the conditions of cover.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Olympic Disciplines: Conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club and held in conjunction with the 1986 South Pacific Games which have been renamed for 1986 as the Oceania Games. The National events were an outstanding success.

The quality of the Internationals attending by invitation brought out the very best in our Australian shooters and magnificent scores were recorded in both I.S.U. Skeet and Olympic Trap, including a near perfect Trench score from Terry Rumbel of 199/200.

The Queensland State Association who conducted the competition on behalf of the Association are to be commended for their efforts as are the voluntary workers behind the scenes. Our appreciation is extended to the Brisbane Gun Club for the assistance and support they gave to ensuring a successful O.D. National Championship.

National Title Holders: J. Waldron U.S.A. Olympic Trap, A. Mullins U.S.A. I.S.U. Skeet.

D.T.L. With the Victorian Association allocating the Trap National to Echuca, the indications were that they would be well attended and this was the case. A total of 872 shooters competed at Echuca and the decision made to shift the Nationals to a country centre was vindicated. An excellent spread of grade shooters made the competition one of the best yet. Grades were represented by AA 179, A 236, B 280 and C 177 with shooters from all states in attendance.

Again the preparation and hard work of the State Association and the members of the Echuca Gun Club contributed in no small manner to the outstanding success of the Trap Nationals.

Australian Skeet. Country N.S.W. was the setting for the Skeet titles and Wagga Wagga the host city. Wagga Gun Club, being a relatively small club by most standards, really showed what can be done, and they, through their President Barney Rooke, made certain that the City of Wagga Wagga would be remembered for an outstanding Skeet National Championship, which attracted entries totalling 173 shooters over all events.

The thought that Melbourne is the home of Skeet in Australia was put to the test as skeet shooters have now shown their liking for both areas which can only augur well for the future of skeet in Australia.

Most disappointing feature of the skeet year was the failure of American Coach, Phil Murray, to honor his obligations after accepting an invitation to Australia that he had requested.

We are now working towards restoring the faith of Australian Skeet shooters in overseas visitors. Hopefully 1987 will bring news of a kind that will see skeeties journey to the West to compete against what we anticipate being a strong field of All-American Skeet shooters at our National Titles.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

MACKINTOSH INTERNATIONAL TEAMS MATCH

OPEN: A magnificent team effort at Echuca which produced a score of 7382/7500 resulted in a win for Australia in this most prestigious event. Second on 7363/6500 was New Zealand, with Canada in third place with their score of 7350.

LADIES: After being the title holders for the last three years, and despite a better score recorded than in 1985, our ladies team had to settle for second place with a score of 1429/1500 behind Canada on 1440/1500. The scores being recorded are evidence to the fact that the event itself is bringing out the best in all shooters.

JUNIOR: Four successive victories to our Junior team with their score of 1472/1500. It would have been a surprise to see them beaten, however while they have been the leaders in this competition over the past four years, other countries are also showing their improvement.

The Mackintosh Cup Trophy has been returned from New Zealand and will now go on display at the National Office as by agreement it is now to remain in the care and custody of the Australian Clay Target Association.

GLENN CUP: Australia vs. New Zealand — Skeet.

The team match at the Wagga National Skeet Championships failed to separate the two countries who each recorded a team score of 123/125. Australia: A. Cousens, B. Dudenas, L. Chelepy, C. Meuleman, H. Theunissen.

SOUTH PACIFIC GAMES: Conducted by the Australian Shooting Association at the Brisbane Gun Club, the competition attracted many overseas competitors of world standing who certainly added weight to the competition.

The Australian team of T. Rumbel, J. Ellis and W. Iles recorded a win in the Olympic Trap Teams Championship with a score of 439/450 from New Zealand on 418/450.

New Zealand reversed the decision in the I.S.U. Skeet match with a winning score of 426/450 from the Australian team of I. Hale, B. Thomson and A. Crikis who shot a score of 425/450 to narrowly miss first place.

The South Pacific Champion in the 200T Olympic Trap Competition was Terry Rumbel from N.S.W. who, for those who were fortunate enough to witness, shot a magnificent 199/200.

Ian Hale from Victoria took out the gold medal in the I.S.U. skeet with another consistent effort scoring 194/200 to make it a double for Australia.

WORLD SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS — EAST GERMANY: The teams under the guidance of National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, competed at the World Championships in Suhl, East Germany. Although not being able on the day to win their events, all members performed admirably and were a credit to their country as ambassadors.

WORLD SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS — USA: Under the management of National President, Roy Holtfreter, our skeet team shot the 1986 World Skeet Championships at San Antonio, Texas, and again proved that we are not far from the best that the U.S. have to offer.

Adrian Cousens, 2nd in the 12 ga Championship, is the best ever recorded by an Australian in this event and his efforts, along with the rest of the team, left no doubt in the minds of the other competitors, that Australia is fast becoming a skeet shooting nation to be reckoned with.

COMMONWEALTH GAMES: Although the withdrawal of many countries affected the games overall, shooting was possibly one of the least affected, and Australia was among the favorites for medals.

Not to be, however, as some outstanding performances from other countries proved to be too much, and despite all efforts and the support given by each member, we were unable to produce results up to our best standards.

Each team member, however, did give their all to the competition and are to be commended for their efforts at the Commonwealth Games and involvement with training at all times.

The Western Australian Clay Target Association would like to put to the shooters of Australia, through their representatives, the Executive of A.C.T.A. a proposal to rationalise the National Championships conducted annually.

At present we believe that the duplication of expenses to the Shooters, State Associations and hence the National body in conducting three separate Nationals is proving to be to the disadvantage of our sport.

The most important ingredient in the whole business is the individual shooter. At present the two main Nationals, namely the Standard Trap and Skeet are separated, which is, we believe, proving too costly for the average shooter to attend. It is only catering for the minority of shooters who are so geographically placed that they can attend seven Nationals per year without too heavy a burden upon them.

However, if the Nationals are planned well ahead and the right venue developed in the host state, then it is not inconceivable that both Trap and Skeet Nationals could be run over a period of two weeks at the one place.

The Standard Trap and Skeet should be combined as the benefits are enormous as listed below:

1. Shooters need only incur the cost of travel once per year.
2. Team members for our shoulder to shoulder matches, many of whom are in both Trap and Skeet teams in the one year, could more easily represent their States.
3. Remember the bulk of shooters that we can expect to attract to these events are not always top shots, but the rank and file members who are the mainstay of our sport.
4. One organizing committee to do all the groundwork, instead of several and as you all know the difficult part is putting together a committee in the first place.
5. Sponsorship would, we believe, be easier to come by for a bigger event.
6. All National Championships could, in the main, be streamlined to a set number of targets (namely 50).
7. A suggested programme could look like this:

The programme as you can see has the major events on the weekends to attract the numbers. Also if a shooter attended the whole carnival then two weeks or half the annual holidays of the individual would be needed.

8. The extra burden of management could be covered by the Skeet being run by a separate set of staff to the Trap, with perhaps one Tournament Director for the whole series.
9. The present perpetual Trophies need not be affected. However an Overall High Gun for all events could be provided.

We in Western Australia truly believe that sooner or later something has to be done to streamline the shooting of Nationals as the present split has not worked except for the Trap Nationals where numbers have been maintained. We say this because the joint Trap and Skeet Carnival run

in Western Australia has as many Skeet Shooters as the Skeet Nationals at present.

Finally, we are presenting this submission to the National governing body of our sport to combine the Trap and Skeet Nationals for the benefit of all Australian shooters.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

This month I would like to discuss matters that are relevant to producing high standards of shooting performance.

TRAINING

More and more sports medicine writers are emphasising the need for not only general fitness but for sports specific fitness. This means that for the shooter to perform well in major shoots he/she must have trained their body and mind to perform for the length of time required to win a specific competition, and to perform at the standard of shooting required. In a shooter's build-up to an important shoot, they should try to train in the same manner that they will have to perform in, in the competition. In other words, they must extend themselves in training for that training to be meaningful. The shooter should build up to shooting more in training than will be expected in competition.

So many clay shooters will only have shot once a fortnight or once a week in the lead up to a 2, 3 or 4 day shoot. They are not really fit in a sports specific sense to compete at a high level of sustained performance. If several club members are intending to go to a State, Zone or National competition, it should not be too difficult to get together and organise, with the club coach or administrators, after work or before work training, over a short period.

High standard performance requires skill, toughness, physical and mental fitness and enthusiasm, all of which are developed by meaningful, planned training which builds up to peak prior to competition, approximately a fortnight in our sport, before the competition. In clay shooting the taper period is required to allow the muscles to regain their strength and nerves to rest. The taper period is used to shoot a few targets instead of the heavy training load that has gone before. It is a tapering off period culminating with two days rest from shooting altogether before the competition. This rest period is especially important to older shooters. The young recuperate much quicker from heavy training. They can train closer to an event and need less rest period before competition.

There is no fear that the performances of an experienced shooter who had trained and shot over a long period will drop in taper period, in fact performance is enhanced by the build up of energy in that time.

The above must be adapted to suit the individual shooter. As in all aspects of sport, individual differences must be taken into account.

Scientific research has found there is a need to train to build the specific muscle fitness and a need to taper training prior to the event.

ATTITUDE

Our attitude to anything we do is important, but if we want to perform at a high standard, our attitude to what we are doing becomes vital. Positive thought about ourselves, our training and competition is of prime importance. Negative thoughts create tension and waste energy. Negative thought can be changed, for instance:

1. "I know I am not going to win, Ted always defeats me", or
2. "The conditions don't suit me so I won't shoot my best today", or
3. "It's just luck if I win, I wonder if I'll be lucky today."

Such thoughts must consciously be changed to positive thoughts, i.e.:

1. "Ted has beaten me in the past, but I have been practising well and feel confident I can shoot each target, and if I do that I will win anyway."

2. "The conditions are the same for everyone, I have prepared myself well for this competition, so will have an advantage over those who have not."
3. "Luck or even natural ability are no match for dedicated preparation and hard work. Of course both help, but people who rely on either are not the long term winners in anything."

Past failures are viewed by the positive thinker as valuable learning experiences. Our attitudes are just habits of mind and can be changed by hard work at training to build confidence in performance, ability and by positive thinking.

Competition is a challenge where the shooter is required to use all available physical and mental ability, so don't handicap yourself by depleting your energy with self degradation and doubts.

Good thinking, good training and good shooting to you all.







1987 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads.
All squads will be determined by the Nationals office, whose decision shall be final.
2. Squads of six to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the trap for all titles.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** shall be incurred.
4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be re-squadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET**.
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score.
Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so.
Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT**.
Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
8. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
9. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
10. Shooters who are eligible for and elect to pay a reduced nomination, (60% of the open nomination) for their respective divisions, Ladies — Junior — Veteran, **shall only be eligible for medals/trophies for the division entered.**
11. Shooters who are eligible for a reduced nomination and elect to pay the full nomination, shall be eligible to win recognition for sashes — medals — trophies for all levels of the open competition as well as sashes — medals — trophies for the division of the competition for which they were eligible to pay a reduced nomination amount.
12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations.
Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day.
All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
15. Practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms — bar — dining areas, or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
16. Practice tickets are available for purchase only at the area controlling the optional sweep/purse entries.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of the Management Committee whose decisions shall be final.

Recognition for the open section and or open teams, is dependent on a full nomination having been paid at the time of entry for the event(s) concerned.

GUN LICENSING: Under 14 years residing outside the State of Queensland — **MUST** obtain State Law Exemption. Under 14 years — being a Queensland resident, ineligible to compete.

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

1. Please present your current 1987 Handicap Card for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1986 card.
2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1987 Handicap Card, must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
5. Rule 2.1 (m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter be suspended for a period of three months.
6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7.
8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board, please report to handicapper's office.
9. If you do not wish to be down graded, please advise handicapper's office.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION — ENTRY

Entry in the 1987 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1987 with the Australian Clay Target Association.

Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1986 and 1987 registration cards before nominating, to the 1987 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1986 he must produce his 1987 registration card.

DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the thirty-fifth Australian Double Barrel Championships, where there is a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship.

Shooters who are eligible for and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of the open nomination) for their respective divisions, Ladies, Junior, Veteran, shall only be eligible for medals/trophies for the division entered.

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that his or her entry is correctly classified — an indication can be readily found on the daily scoreboard or the progressive scoreboard.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

VETERANS — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 4, 1987.

JUNIORS — are those competitors who, on April 4, 1987 will be under the age of 17 years.

TIME STARTING

Each day's event shall commence at 9.00 a.m.

Competitors will be called only once for their squad — any competitor who misses his or her squad without reasonable excuse shall be penalised one target.

All competitors who miss their squads will be resquadded in the last details.

CARTRIDGES

Cartridges of the competitor's choice may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the carnival at competitive prices.



Also, should you see that practice of the losing shooter walk off the layout before the completion of a shoot off — ensure that that shooter is made to wait until the shoot off is finished, i.e. only two shooters left first shooter misses and goes to walk off before the second shooter has fired his shot. This is very poor sportsmanship in the very worst form.

PETER McLACHLAN



STURT PEA FROM S.A.



You cannot have a good shoot without the support of the competitors themselves, so to all shooters who spent the time to referee or score, we would like to say thank you.







himself to Jabiru for an indefinite period. Darwin's loss will be Jabiru's gain. Many visitors to the Annual Shoot will have commented on Dave's catering arrangements at the dinners.

Speaking of Katherine's 50 target handicap, on which a Calcutta will probably be conducted, it seems that the Rules Committee, in its wisdom, has decreed that Handicaps below State level will be conducted only over 25 targets. Furthermore, common mark shooting will be only in eye openers of less than 10 targets, with shoots over 25 targets, or multiples thereof. To my way of thinking, this is a retrograde step, imposing an arbitrary number of targets on Clubs for no good reason whatsoever. These rulings help no one, and promote divisiveness. If a Club or zone wishes to hold 50 or 40 or 30 target handicap events, what's the big deal? If a Club holds eye openers of 15 targets over three layouts, or 20 target events over two or four layouts, what's the matter with that? The 25 target figure, supposedly to make is easier for handicappers, solves nothing, as ALL targets shot at Common mark in double barrel or points score must still be recorded. In skeet, where only full rounds of 25 are recorded, each shooter shoots at the same number, and, more importantly, the same type of targets every round. It is sensible to disregard parts of a round shot in a shoot off. But in D.T.L. each target is unique. Conceivably, in some rounds, as all shooters have experienced, the shooter will get a 'dream round' consisting completely of straightaways, or mildly quartering targets, whether the event be 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 40 or 50 targets. Conversely, in other rounds, most of the targets seem to be right swingers on station five, and left swingers on station one. However, over 200 or 400 targets, the law of averages seems to work out. But, keeping the number of targets restricted to 25, or multiples thereof makes no sense, either in fairness to Clubs or shooters, or to handicappers. In no way will the number of targets shot at exactly equal the 200 required for grading purposes, nor should they be required to equal the figure. As any Han-

dicapper will tell you, with calculators, there is no problem. So why interfere with a Club's decision to run events of any length the Club desires. There are enough constraints on management already. If shooters do not like a program, they will advise this by their absence. All that these most hastily devised 'rules' will do is encourage a plethora of 'novelty' events off, say 14 or 16 metres, which will not be eligible to be recorded, but which do give vital indications of a shooter's performance. Enough said!

Peter Hoare has mixed feelings about shooting at present. He's Range Officer at Darwin, and just bought a Beretta SO4 model, but he has to go into Royal Darwin for a fusion operation on his spine. National plans have been shelved, and he's out on the walks blowing as many clays away as he can with the Beretta. Commiserations Pete!

Judy Retter, of Pungalina Station, in the Borroloola area advises that preparations are under way for the McArthur River Gun Club's Annual Shoot on May 16 and 17. This shoot is always well attended and well run, and is a pleasure to shoot at. If you're in the area, drop in and have a shot. This is friendly country.

Back to the shooting, and Paul Buck who, along with wife Carol, were once mainstays of the old Darwin Club, has returned to the fold with a vengeance. After a few shoots at the Top End Field and Game layout, Paul has started shooting the semi-circular discipline again. A couple of low teen rounds allowed Paul to come into the high teens and low twenties with subsequent 25s. It shouldn't be long before you break through in a handicap event, Paul!

Bob Hooper, also a reborn F&G shooter, has taken on the discipline with a renewed vigour, assuming the Secretarial responsibilities from John Doyle. Good luck, Bob!

The best thing about the sporting shoot is the fraternisation afterwards, around the waterholes with the barbecues ablaze, and the tinnies flowing. Keep it going, folks!
