

The questions posed to the panel which included Mr Laurie Connors, Chairman of the International Shooting Committee and Peter Quire, National Coaching Director, were noted for future reference.

Not a great deal came from the meeting, however, this was not unexpected as generally speaking, Olympic Discipline shooting is well controlled by the International rules under which we compete.

What did occur however, was that the shooters were able to put their views forward publicly for discussion and when this takes place the winner in the overall sense is the sport itself.

OUR HISTORY IN WORDS AND PICTURES

Peter McDonald, Vice President of the Colac Gun Club — one of our oldest Victorian Gun Clubs — sent me a copy of a photo taken at the National Championships held at the Australian Gun Club grounds, Burwood, Vic. The picture shows members of the Australian Mackintosh International Team of 1985.

Peter goes on to advise that he is unable to put names to all faces.

The only ones I recognise are: Jim O'Donnell, Newton Thomas, Andy Tie, Cal Hollow, Don Corstorphan, Sperry Marshall, Bob Jorgenson, Roy Ayres, Peter Wray, Bob Bushby, Bill Finnegan, Luke Doyle, Norm Guy, John Houston (President), Clem Mudford, Fred Burns, Eddie Brenk, Don Glover, Lu Lupp, Clarrie Barns, 3rd from left, front row, official referee Stan Cole.

Peter's letter goes on to further advise:

"that last November Don Corstorphan turned 80 and is still shooting — and winning I might add — and is just as keen as ever.

Don has been a member of Colac Gun Club for 41 years continuously. I do not think there has been a better shot or a finer sportsman ever to walk onto a shooting ground.

On a date to be announced in Shooting News, the Colac Gun Club will be conducting a double barrel championship and a handicap to honor Don Corstorphan's 41 years with

the Colac club. A former member of our club, Noel Flowers, has kindly made a shield from solid walnut, which will go into competition on that date and thereafter annually. No doubt any one who is fortunate enough to have their name inscribed on this shield will feel very proud indeed.

We have a number of Colac business people who are prepared to help with sponsorship in regard to trophies so there will be an excellent array.

We would like to have as many as possible of the older shooters here that day, to spin a few yarns and make this day a really memorable one for a fine gentleman in Don Corstorphan."

COLAC GUN CLUB — BRIEF CLUB HISTORY

Our year of establishment was 1896 with President W.H. Clements and Secretary/Treasurer H.D. Thomas with the initial and present location being Colac recreation and Racecourse Reserve. Our club had shot live birds as you will read in our minutes a little further on. Many top line shots have risen from the ranks of Colac Men. Prominent among these were Eric (Pop) Ball, George Crosse, Ray Parker, Harvey Eldrige, Ian Holt, Don Corstorphan, Ernie Osborne, to name a few. Don joined up in 1946, Ray and Harvey as mere lads, soon after. They

along with Eric Ball and Ian Holt all gained International status with the A.C.T.A. formerly the A.C.P.T.S.A.

In the early 1950s before we had our own accredited referees, Hartleys would kindly release George Biggs on a Saturday morning, so that he, accompanied by his wife and two charming daughters would travel to Colac to referee our Open Championship days.

The conversion to clay shooting commenced in 1939 with a plus trap and a single lane one target at a time. In 1946 we bought an auto angling trap from Les Black (which is still in its box — unused).

A new club house was erected some years ago but the old shed still stands as a storeroom and it will be remembered at the scene of good time in the past.

Thirty eight years ago Harry Mills, our local Policy Inspector, offered the club crockery if Mrs. Corstorphan would prepare teas and suppers. She carried on this for 15 years then Mary Osborne took over for a like period. Mary Dignan now resides in the kitchen. We now have crockery!

NOTES TAKEN FROM OLD MINUTE BOOK OF THE COLAC RACECOURSE RESERVE

18/11/1865 — Public meeting held with the intention of forming a Board of management. 5 trustees were appointed. Dr. Thomas Rae, John McLaughlin, Robert Robertson, Humphrey M. Hearn, William Bradley. The Secretary, who wrote the minutes in beautiful copperplate and impeccable grammar, was P. Wilson. Regular periodical meetings were held at Colac Hotel until 25/11/1868, then a break occurred until 30/11/1872. Captain John Haines was then Chairman.

8/12/1877 — Trustees increased to 7 by appointment of John Calvert and Easton Johnstone.

1/9/1883 — Management of Course passed to Colac Turf Club, who retained control to 4/2/1918, a period of 35 years.

12/12/1918 — First mention of Colac Gun Club, when Dept. of Lands & Survey wrote to say that Golf and Gun Clubs had applied for 75 acres of the Racecourse Reserve.

9/4/1923 — Gun Club asked Trustees to be relieved of its indebtedness owing to its inability to arrange shoots, and offered payment of £1 per year. Agreed and future rental set at £2 per acre per annum.

May, 1928 — Golf Club was professionally extended to 18 holes, which was to include the present practice area and where the Gun Club then operated. Also, as shooting (live birds) was considered distasteful to ladies the Gun Club was asked to move across the drive and exchange clubhouses. This was agreed subject to payment to Gun Club of £100 and full shooting and clubhouse facilities. W.H. Clements and H.D. Thomas represented Colac Gun Club.

Note: Gun Club must have been formed while reserve was in the hands of the Turf Club, ie. between 1883 and 1918. The late Charlie Romeo had a club membership card for 1908 and his recollection was that the Club began operations in 1896.

The title that most shooters were after, the State Double Barrel, went to Ramano Bisi. Ramano shot 114/114 to leave Richard Ayres as runner up with 113/114.

Richard Dean put a score of 149/150 together to take the State Points Championship. Barbara Wallace was the top lady performer over the program on 215/250. Bruce Pallant, as well as winning the Winchester Junior title, was also Junior High Gun 228/250. Peter Caddy, from Barmera, who seems to enjoy a clay target shoot no matter where he goes, won the Veterans High Gun 276/325. I have

Phil Scott won the first event on the program by taking top honours in the Continental Single Barrel Championship 28/30. John McVitty won the Double Barrel title 25/25.

Saturday February 28, to Thursday March 5, 1987: The Western Australian Clay Target Association hosted the National I.S.U. Championships at their new complex in Perth. There is no doubt, the complex now completed since the D.T.L. Nationals were held there in 1985, is a credit to clay target shooting in general.

Three trench layouts fitted with the most up to date automatic equipment were used to conduct trench titles. Although shooter attendance was below previous years the tournament was well supported by our top international shooters. Making up the 108 shooters that attended and competed in both disciplines were 45 from W.A. 16 of these entered the I.S.U skeet section, 2 from S.A., 21 from Victoria, 19 from N.S.W., 7 from N.T., 4 from Tasmania, 7 from Queensland, 3 from New Zealand and one from Papua New Guinea.

The performances of our top shots in both disciplines was of world standard. One thing that stood out was the performance and ability of several of our junior trench shooters. Their scores indicated any of them are capable of being future gold medallists for Australia. Let's hope they continue supporting this discipline with the desire and enthusiasm they are presently showing.

The West will again be hosts to the 1987 Skeet Nationals later this year. Now the complex is finished, I can recommend to all "skeeties" it will be well worth the trip just to see for themselves what a complex this State is fortunate to have.



The magnificent Whiteman Park Shooting Complex, which really has to be seen to be believed, was in first class condition for the 1987 National Olympic Discipline Championships and the W.A.C.T.A. are to be congratulated for the part which they have played to make certain that all was in readiness for this important Nationals competition.

Many of the eastern State shooters had arrived a day or so early to allow them time for practice and by the time the first shot was to be fired they, along with the W.A. competitors were raring to go.

The conditions were typically West Australian with the sun shining and wind blowing, the wind seems to have a strange effect on shooters as it causes problems in their approach to matters at hand or is it all in the mind.

Notwithstanding, the wind may have had an effect on some, however Victorian shooter John Summers was not at all disadvantaged and following his first 75 targets in I.S.U. Skeet he was out in front with three clean rounds.

At the trench layouts, Jim Ellis N.S.W. and Russell Mark from Victoria were leading the trench shooters both having shot 74/75. Also from N.S.W. and one shot behind was John Maxwell with a 73/75. Still a long way to go in

I.S.U. SKEET COMMONWEALTH TITLE — 200T

With the field containing 1986 Commonwealth Games and World Championship team members, a good competition was assured. The strong Victorian contingent was dominant at the end of the first 75 targets and John Summers with his excellent 75 held a two target advantage over fellow Victorian Ian Hale with Brian Thomson another two targets away in third place with a score of 71/75. Some disappointing scores were recorded on the first day and general comments were, "I'm glad that the day is over."

Under the new system, these 24 shooters were squadded together to shoot an additional 50 targets, with the top six at the completion of the 200 targets going on to contest a six man final.

The eliminated eighteen shooters were then eligible for grade recognition along with those eliminated at the 150 target mark plus the three shooters who would be eliminated from the first three places in the final.

Being the International method this system did also apply for the trench competition.

DAY THREE: THE FINAL 50 TARGETS

With the top 24 shooters shooting together, the pressure to perform was certainly at its highest. At the 200 target mark it was obvious that experience had played a large part in the composition of the final six shooters. Ben Dudenas a much improved shooter was the only one of the six who had not had International experience. By the way he shot, he will not have too long to wait to gain International recognition where he will eventually make his presence felt.

Skeet Title and the trophy donated by Strat Co. W.A., second was Ian Hale on 196/23, third place following a shoot off went to another Victorian, Ben Dudenas with a 215/226. Victorian Junior Michael Inguanti won the Junior section with a well shot 213/225 from Mark Agar of N.S.W. 212/225. It was apparent that although not all were necessarily in favour of the finals system, it was full of interest and has added a new dimension to the competition.

Into the shoot off to decide first place and at the 5th target Jim Ellis let one get away, Russell Mark with the pressure on him only had to shoot his 5th target in this miss and out competition to become the 1987 Commonwealth Olympic Trap Champion and with all eyes on him the target was shattered and Russell Mark was Commonwealth Trap Champion. Third on a countback from Cliff Bailey was John Maxwell with a final score of 217/225.

Congratulations to the winner and particularly to all competitors for the sportsmanlike approach to the competition which was of an excellent world class standard.

In the Ladies section, the well travelled Doreen Aylett from Devonport, Tasmania won the Ladies title with a score of 152/200. Well done to the ladies who contested this most difficult of shotgun disciplines and well shot Doreen Aylett.

Junior winner with an excellent 188/200 was Michael Diamond from N.S.W. who only failed by 2 targets after a

Rumbel missed again on his ninth after Ellis had missed on eight. Ellis missed again on his tenth target and again on his eighteenth.





(Firearm Safety)

IT IS ON AGAIN!

The 1987 "Duck Season" is with us, and we may expect, before it ends, records which include incidents of injury and tragedy among those who participate. However, victims may not look among the registered shooters to lay any blame for the antics and behaviour of countless thousands of hunters who have little, if any, knowledge of the project in hand, know precious little about the Firearms they often carelessly use, and have never bothered to acquire the skills and training which identify the expertise and self discipline of the registered Shooter.

There are some four hundred thousand licences held by Firearm owners in Victoria; there are less than fifteen thousand registered Shooters in all the shooting codes in the State, of which less than half use shotguns, and of that number a very small percentage indulge the hassles, risks and expense of hunting ducks. The odd thousand or so shooters who risk life and limb among the countless thousands of Duck Hunters witness many who blast off thousands of rounds of ammunition and child-like disport a few pathetic specimens of the game they were hunting, often leaving an appalling cleanup task for the shooters and the Fisheries & Wildlife Officers.

Too many Hunters adopt the practice of emptying a 'tinny' for every shot fired, shooting at everything that moves, and with bleary-eyed vision have no hope of distinguishing between retriever dogs and waterfowl, recognising protected species. Some have seen no difference between a sleeping bird and a rubber boot!

In recent weeks registered shooters will have unearthed all equipment, put every item in perfect working order, attended the nearest Gun Club to perfect marksmanship and refresh application of Firearm Safety and field shooting procedures: they will have contacted the appropriate Fisheries & Wildlife officials to ascertain what areas and what species need culling, and made plans in the areas where culling is prescribed.

Unlike the seasonal Hunters, the responsible Shooter will have visited his own designated areas, organised his 'camp' and set up his 'hides; or 'blinds' so that during his brief stay his shooting will be orderly, positive, successful and completely safe, and with unlimited tolerance he will try to educate those who, with no forward planning, pile loads of beer, guns and ammunition into 'a mate's car' and drive around the countryside being a confounded nuisance and leaving a trail which promotes protest and complaint from many sections of the community.

Duck Season, which is the culling exercise, is vital. It is essential to protect the various species of waterfowl: their feeding and breeding grounds have been reduced more than seventy percent in less than three decades, and with a general average of not less than five ducks from every nest surviving to adulthood, the over-crowding and shortening food supply, promote the more dominant species to intimidate and thus reduce the protected species, and then gorge themselves on the rice and millet crops. The ability of the stronger species to rapidly multiply has to be offset, so that pollution, fouling of lakes, reservoirs and streams — the source of human water supply — and the spread of Botulism, Avian Cholera and Virus Enteritis (a positive threat to animals as well as birdlife), can be kept under control.

Planned culling is often marred by untrained thoughtless clowns who have neither interest nor appreciation of the essential features and purpose of each 'Duck Season', and worst of all are not capable of carrying out humane quick clean kills.

Those people who go duck hunting during the next few weeks are urged to plan ahead, be constantly alert, know and identify the protected species and be constantly aware that for every trained Shooter, there are thousands of hunters who do not know and do not practise the essential

FIRST AUSTRALIAN MASTERS GAMES

Masters or veteran sports is a recent phenomenon and one of the most exciting growth areas in sports participation throughout the world. The concept of the Australian Masters Games has been created to provide long term goals in sports and to promote the ideal of sport for life and healthy life styles.

The inaugural games will be held in Tasmania from 28 November to 12 December 1987, and follows an announcement made in September 1985 that the Tasmanian Government had accepted the Confederation of Australian Sports invitation to host the inaugural Australian Masters Games. The Patron is the Hon Robin Gray, Premier of Tasmania. Tasmania was selected because of the commitment to sports development of its Government, the concept of a statewide network of competition venues and its renowned tourist attractions.

The games are to be a major sport festival for mature age sportsmen and women and held in a number of locations throughout Tasmania. At least 4,000 competitors are expected to participate in the events which will include up to thirty five different sports.

Masters are mature aged athletes competing in age related events, most of which begin at 35 for women and 40 for men. Entries will be accepted from any athlete or team wishing to compete and no qualifying conditions apply. Participants in the First Australian Masters Games may be amateur or professional. Many will have been national or international champions, many are now or will be champions in their respective age divisions.

The overall cost of the Games exceeds \$1M. It is anticipated that money raised by way of corporate sponsorship and registration fees will exceed \$500,000. It is estimated between 7,000 and 9,000 visitors, including competitors and families from overseas and all parts of Australia, will be attracted to Tasmania. An economic impact of up to \$8M could be anticipated.

In recognition of the major benefits to the Tasmanian economy and the opportunity to stage one of the largest sporting events held in Australia, the Tasmanian Government has agreed to support the games through Government Departments, including the Departments of Tourism, Main Roads and Supply and Tender.

The Board of Directors for the Australian Masters Games is chaired by Mr Ken Lowrie. The organising committee is an incorporated body with the Board of Directors responsible for the successful organisation of the Games. Mr Kim Newstead has been appointed General Manager and Mr Chris Guesdon appointed Marketing Executive.

Although the first Australian Masters Games are many months away, GOLD has already been won. In the recent Pica Awards, the Gold Award was given to the Masters Games Logo for their promotional folder.

The logo features three kangaroos in Australia's national sporting colours of green and gold, together with a blue kangaroo, representing the Confederation of Australian Sport. The kangaroos have been combined with a map of Tasmania where the first Australian Masters Games will be held from 28 November to 12 December, 1987.

Venues for all sports have been selected as the organisers are keen to ensure that as many locations as possible throughout the State are involved in what will be one of the largest sporting events ever to be held in Australia.

The General Manager, Mr Kim Newstead, stated that a Triathlon will be held in conjunction with the First Australian Masters Games.

All events will carry Gold, Silver and Bronze medallions for place getters.

Mr Newstead went on to say that a large contingent of New Zealand athletes were expected to participate, following on from the World Veteran's Cup in Melbourne the previous week.

The cricket competition offers the organisers the possibility of attracting UK and Caribbean teams as the teams could travel to Tasmania in their "off" season.

Sponsorship packages of Golden Master, Silver Master and Bronze Master have been developed and will shortly be submitted to National and Tasmanian companies. The games are an attractive proposition for many companies as the number of "Credit Card" athletes in Australia totals 850,000 and embraces all major sports.

Many well-known sporting personalities are expected to visit Tasmania to compete and assist the organisers with the general promotion of the Games throughout Australia.

In 1986 the members once again recognized that Jack Stamp's expertise were required on the managerial side of the Club and elected him as Treasurer. Quote from 1971 "Jack Stamp's a great backstop with his experience in Club management and could always be relied upon to assist in trouble spots". This again proved to be true, even though by this time his health was deteriorating.

Jack had a unique ability to formulate his ideas into plans for the future. The Club benefited tremendously from this over the past 23 years. Jack was one of the main instigators of many of the Club's improvements including that the club build a new Club House.

Jack was a very tireless club worker who did a huge amount of work that, to some went unnoticed, yet to him it was just automatic that the work needed doing. He never expected thanks for his efforts.

Jack was a very keen skeet shooter and believed that more handicap events should be conducted to give the C & B grade shooters a chance to win.

Jack was a terrific competitor who loved to win, but when beaten would be one of the first to congratulate the winner. Jack really enjoyed the friendly competitiveness created when the Melbourne Gun Club members visited Wangaratta for the annual inter-club visits and received a great deal of pleasure when he and his son Ray were in the winning Skeet team in 1985 that "beat those Melbourne chaps". He was extremely popular with his fellow shooters and a great club ambassador who always made visitors most welcome to the Club. No matter how poorly he felt to others he was always "fit". Very few people realized just how ill he was.

Little did we realize that at our Christmas Skeet shoot last year when Jack Stamp won his turkey and ham that it would be the last time we would have the pleasure of enjoying this wonderful Clubman's genuine friendship, knowledge and understanding.

REX WAS A MAN OF MANY TALENTS

One of Kerang's best known sons, Rex Peacock, a man of many talents, passed away on January 13, aged almost 66 years.

During his life Rex Peacock was a sleeper cutter, electricity station engine driver, gun dealer, farm machinery salesman, sporting shooter, apiarist and later in life, an assurance salesman for Colonial Mutual Life.

Rex Peacock was born on a dairy farm near Kerang on March 17, 1921 and worked on a travelling chaff cutter until called up for service in the Second World War. After the war, he cut railway sleepers and drove an engine in the power station at Kerang.

When the State Electricity Commission began supplying power in 1961, out of a job, he bought an interest in a Kerang retail store, and acquired a gun dealer's licence. He also bought a share in a garage and sold farm machinery for about 10 years.

Throughout his life, he was a keen shooter, winning State titles and representing Australia as a clay target shooter.

He remained a keen sportsman throughout his life, hunting deer and fishing for trout in New Zealand.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

Peter Quire

I have just completed the National Coaching figures for 1986-87. The total number of people coached has risen by 1,276 from the previous year. From the figures you will see just how busy some of the accredited coaches have been.

These figures are compiled from coaching reports I received during the year and I know that there are many coaches who put in time and effort coaching but do not send in their reports, so the figures would be better than shown.

There have been a wide range of groups coached during the year, just some are: high schools, scout groups, adventurers, charity groups, service clubs, police associations, national parks and wildlife management students, colleges of advanced education, air force, star force.

Our coaches have taught safety and the skill of clay target shooting and introduced people from all walks of life to our sport.

The Clay Target Association now has 291 Accredited Coaches with 40 coaches also having gained Level 2 accreditation and several others in Queensland and Victoria nearing completion of their Level 2 courses.

This month I would like to address myself to the fact that there has been a recent fall in membership numbers. The rural recession will of course affect our sport in this regard, but I would like to suggest that club, zone and state administrations make full use of their accredited coaches.


Open days or charity shoots where new shooters come to the clubs for the first time are a great opportunity to gain new members. If the coaches at these events can help the novices to succeed in breaking clays the newcomers will enjoy the event and come back. This is where club administration and coach co-operation is essential.

New shooters need easy targets and less targets than are offered at the normal competitions. If the coach could have access to the trap to send straight-aways and give personal attention to the new shooter I am sure this would pay off in membership numbers. Of course it does not stop there. If the club has a few novice shooters, how about putting on ten target events, so that the novice can build up his or her ability and confidence, without feeling foolish, as so often happens, by trying to shoot the normal competition because there is no other. Often there is not even an eye-opener, so the newcomer ends up, for example missing 20 targets out of 25 and feeling that they will never master the skill, so they do not come again. It is better to hit 5 out of 10 than to miss 20 out of 25.

A combined effort of the club, zone or state coach and the administrations is needed to encourage and keep new members.

Few sports that cater for adults as well as young people offer the free coaching scheme that our sport does, so please make the most of it. Next time you go to your local shoot, bring a friend and introduce him or her to your club coach.
