EXECUTIVE MEETING 10/4/87 — Summary

The meeting held in Brisbane over a total of 10% hours. was dedicated to the ongoing well being of the Association. A number of decisions are to be implemented as a result of the deliberations of the Executive, other matters although discussed at great length have not as yet been finalised and therefore are still the subject of further consideration.

Decisions made that can be announced are

- (a) National Trap Championships 1992 N.S.W.C.T.A.
- (b) Club advertising via the C.T.S.N. to be increased by 15% effective as from the July issue
- (c) Olympic Discipline Nationals 1988 Canberra March 13-19
- (d) I.S.U. Referees system to be implemented as soon as practicable
- (e) National office to be relocated full report in July C.T.S.N.
- Permission granted to Singleton/Upper Hunter Gun Clubs to conduct what is broadly known as a car shoot (g) Registration fees for 1988

Full membership \$30.00 to \$35.00 Second family \$15.00 to \$20.00 Junior \$1.00 to \$10.00

In keeping with the Notice of Motion proposed by the National Executive Committee registration fees are to be increased by \$5.00 as from January 1, 1988. Registration fees for Juniors have been increased from \$1.00 to \$10.00 owing to the existing high cost of processing plus insurance which amounts to approximately \$7.50 per junior shooter.

Matters under discussion include

- (A) A proposal from W.A. to combine Trap and Skeet National Championships — decision September 1987
- (B) National Referees Association recommendations to the Executive - Referred back to State Association for comment by way of a written report - decision September 1987.

As well as the items listed, many other matters were discussed and once finalised will be advised to all members via the C.T.S.N.

One important point to remember is that in relation to the recommendation on rule changes, no decisions have been made and none will be made prior to the Executive meeting to be held in Melbourne in late September.


1987 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS









After the official presentation Maree said winning the award was more than just a personal victory.


"It's an achievement for the sport and for female sportspeople.

THE WILDFOWL CONTROVERSY

A steadily increasing surge of publicity stemming from a collection of people purporting to be LOVERS OF ANIMALS whose behaviour and graphic displays, without exception, illustrate not merely a remarkable dearth of knowledge of the subject, but a total absence of elementary common sense; broadcasts unqualified nonsense graphically displayed by their poster Ban Duck Season showing a snipers-rifle telescope reticle — only seen on rifles which firearms are never used in connection with birdlife, and being expressly forbidden for use in such hunting — and large bullet holes profusely weeping blood, is in every detail so pathetically false as to be inconceivable.

It is contemptible when groups of uninformed exhibitionists solicit and waste substantial sums of money on such irresponsible nonsense, when so many worthy causes are crying out for help and financial assistance.

Corrections in this context are urgently paramount, and thence I would advise the clowns in question to secure a copy of the National Geographic Magazine of November 1984, and read any part of the thirtyeight (38) page article covering the problems created by mismanaged wildfowl programs, noting what happened in three States of USA when in two short years, decreasing wetlands areas and the suspension of culling season saw millions of waterfowl ridden with disease, being bulldozed into heaps for burial and burning to offset the spread of pollution and ravages of Botulism and Avian Cholera; the overcrowded feeding grounds caused millions to die with deformed beaks, truncated feet, bulging skulls and no eyes. These conditions bred the Duck Virus Enteritis which spreads in streams and lakes infecting both bird life and animals. Why is culling and control vitally essential? Here in Victoria, from each nest at least eight ducklings will survive, with a minimum of five reaching adulthood. Most healthy wild duck breed for five years so the minimum possible increase each season is three hundred percent, so one million ducks would be at least fifteen million in any given five years. In the past twenty five years, Victoria's breeding and feeding grounds have been reduced to one quarter the space, and without control the combined extremes of starvation in some species and in other glutton feeding on the rice and millet fields, would kill many thousands fouling and polluting farms, streams, lakes and reservoirs and spreading disease, in addition to depleting the yield of cereal crops essential to human food requirements; so, will our irresponsible ANIMAL LIBERATIONISTS foot the bill for correction, cleanup, loss, destruction and health risks they are planning to create? I think not since such uninformed exhibitionists have no conception of the gross stupidity they are peddling!

This year the eleven dominant species of Duck, must be reduced in numbers to not only protect the more passive and timid species whose habits govern their limited numbers, but to prevent their own species over populating in decreasing feeding grounds, and developing epidemics of disease.

The 'Animal Lovers' should further make note that a 'Shooter' is a registered member of any one of the eight official shooting codes, Victoria claiming in grand total less than 15,000 members; but a 'Hunter' is literally anyone from a child stalking a beetle, to any untrained gun-owner behaving with total disregard for animal, wildlife or human. THERE IS IN EXCESS OF FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND Firearm owners in Victoria.

Let the ANIMAL LIBERATIONISTS educate themselves, be less hypocritical, a little more responsible by looking to their claimed objectives, and lend a helping hand to the SHOOTERS (with the odds 28 to 1 against them) who have fought for years to protect and preserve wildlife, manage all species in health and survival, and rid the countryside of the inexperienced, dangerous guntoting HUNTERS who give SHOOTERS a bad name.

There are only two hundred Accredited Firearm Safety Instructors in Victoria, selected from the fifteen thousand shooters, and before the commencement of the 1987 Duck Season, every man and woman in that group urge everyone in Victoria to rise early on Tuesday March 10, and watch from 6am to 7am on Channel Two the program "Ducks in Sight", and learn that we the registered shooters are doing (and for two decades have done), something useful and positive towards preserving wildlife, and unlike the rowdy prattling of the uninformed, we just quietly, get on with the job.

So for a great weekend of skeet shooting — remember the 3rd weekend in February and head for Tamworth.


ROMA GUN CLUB ANNUAL TWO DAY SHOOT. 1987.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Re: Proposal by W.A.C.T.A. to combine Skeet & Trap Nationals.

I've read with interest the proposal and it seems to me that the recommendation must be viewed as a combination of the two separate features namely:

The poposed program for both Skeet & Trap and secondly the combination of both Skeet & Trap Nationals.

To me the paramount item is that the quality of the Skeet & Trap Nationals should not be sacrificed for what may be short term expediency.

REGARDING THE PROGRAM

TRAP... It has been traditional that the Trap Nationals be conducted over six days and while I have not competed during the last few years at these events there was, and I understand still is, a pre-nationals usually of some two days.

It seems to me that the pre-nationals is an important event for two reasons. First it allows the Club whose facilities are being used to get a return on the significant cost incurred in preparing the grounds (all clubs must be profitable or they cease to exist).

Second it allows shooters whether they be AA or C Grade to tune their performance for what is to every shooter the peak of his/her years shooting. This then suggests that a suitable program, and I'm sure that shooters would not welcome downgrading such an important carnival, would have to be conducted over some eight days! Incidentally I never cease to be surprised that trap shooters continue to attend major events where only 50 targets are shot/day/shooter (not including shoot-offs). An experienced six man squad shooter 25 targets comfortably in 13 minutes — this means some half hours shooting play (?).

SKEET... A meeting of skeet shooters some years ago at Mildura recommended to the Executive a program which was adopted. This program provided 100 targets/day/shooter and was to be conducted over four days. This was introduced and in my view has been successful (some modification has been made to the program by including a doubles event for 1987 — a good move). The 1986 Skeet Nationals at Wagga included a two day prenationals. That this was successful is beyond doubt. Wagga Gun Club was able to repay shooters who assisted in financing additions to the clubs facilities from this extended program.

I consider that the appropriate program for Skeet Nationals is a two day pre-national plus four days at 100 targets/day Nationals — a total of six days. I've experienced the old system of 50 targets for Skeet Nationals in conjunction with the Trap Nationals and while I appreciate that the intention was to give skeet

exposure to shooters, I must emphasise that skeet in the eyes of a skeet shooter is the Trap in the eyes of a trap shooter — the real clay target shooting. If a combined carnival is adopted each of the disciplines must be programmed to suit the requirements of that particular discipline — no bastardised programs simply to suit somebody's perception of what is required.

COMBINATION OF THE TWO NATIONALS... For a suitable program then it appears that eight days would be required for trap and six days for skeet giving a total of fourteen days shooting. From an organisational point of view this is a major project and would place a major load on both the facilities and the ACTA. From a shooter's point of view there is both the financial load (which is very significant) and the taxing of a shooter's physical resources. How many shooters could stand the pace for such a long period and still perform satisfactorily?

Switching from one discipline to another over a short period will almost certainly result in sub-standard performance — I suggest that there are very few shooters capable of such an interchange.

It seems to me that the attractions of combining both Nationals is rather superficial — it sounds good if you say it quietly.

All state directors are level 2 standard at present and now that the directors are level 3 course accepted by the Coaching Council of Australia our state directors can work their way towards that accreditation.

MASTERS GAMES

Clay target shooting has been included in the masters games to be held in Tasmania in November of this year. This is a good opportunity for our sport to be part of a multi sporting event and it could not have been held in a better place. The philosophy of the masters games is an excellent one, just because dates roll by on a calendar it does not

mean that people who enjoy their sport cannot compete at an international level. Many of our best shooters are over 40 years old, so let's help make it the success it deserves to be.

THE OPENING

Easter and Anzac have passed, the duck season has opened and the first time since I was 11 years old, I have not been part of that event, here or interstate. With a changing society, that prefers its poultry to be force fed in confined cages, shooting ducks and quail for the table seems to be more and more a thing of the past. I have often wondered why it seems to many people immoral, to be able to identify, accurately shoot and kill, carefully clean and finally cook a wild bird, but they do not seem to give a second thought to the thousands of ducks, quail pheasants, chickens and turkeys that have known nothing but confinement. When is a duck not a duck? To many when it is presented in a plastic bag in the freezer of the supermarket. I just hope for the wild ducks' sake that as much attention is put on the draining of wet lands and the development in breeding areas as is put on the more visible duck hunter.

Preservation for future generations is a must, and I believe most shooters like myself have cared about, and where possible nurtured nature, be it ducks, kangaroos, or our fast disappearing scrub and forest, but the hypocrisy of many meat eating humans I believe deserves note.

2nd ELIMINATION FOR THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The national training squad will be shooting 200 targets at Frankston on May 2nd and 3rd, to add to their scores shot in Perth, as part of the 800 target qualifying competition for the world championship team. The final 200 targets will be held at Downside in the long week-end in June.



RULES CLARIFICATION

Rules Supervisor, Noel Dwight has submitted the following — and hopefully this matter will be clarified once and for all. "All clubs wishing to shoot Point Score handicap events MUST count BROKEN TARGETS and not points when determining whether a possible has been shot. Then normal handicapping procedure (Rule 2.3 (e) must apply"

If any person wishes to have clarification on any rule they can contact Noel at 49 Victor Street, Cowra 2794.

While on Rules matters — after a recent meeting of the Referees Association quite a number of rules changes have been proposed. THEY ARE NOT IN FORCE AS YET - but. have been referred back to each State Association for discussion and thoughts — it would be totally impossible to list all proposed changes in this section however, 3 that will affect everyone are:

* to be included as part of Rule 2.1

ADD A shooter will not become eligible for downgrading in the year in which he attains a higher grade.

He will become eligible for down-grading only at the commencement of the following year.

He will become eligible for down-grading for the period of the year after he was upgraded if his last 2 x 200 targets indicate that of a lower grade.

Following re-registration he will become eligible for down-grading only at his own request.

He will not be down-graded more than one grade.

Rule 2.3(e) Delete

ADD any competitor winning first place in a handicap event will be handicapped 1 metre.

Second place getters and group winners to be handicapped 1 metre providing they have shot the possible.

All handicap events must be shot to finality, broken targets to count and not points to determine the possible.

* Rule 4.13 Delete

ADD 4.13 for all events, load is restricted to 32 grams (1-1/8th oz) shot size no larger than number 6.

I MUST STRESS AGAIN — THESE RULES ARE NOT AS YET IN FORCE — PLEASE FEEL FREE TO COMMENT ON THE 3 THAT ARE LISTED.

A complete copy of all the proposed rule changes has been sent to each Zone Secretary, and the State Association will have further discussion at their next meeting to be on the 20th June.







N.T.C.T.A. positions are on the line again at the Carnival, so it's up to all members, and Club Committees to define their, and the Association's needs, and speak up at the Annual Meeting. It's no use complaining afterwards. As an old saw says, 'You get the Committee you deserve'. Too true!

HERE AND THERE

The N.T., although with only seven reps. at the Nationals, was far from disgraced. We came third in the team shoot, with only one member missing targets. (So upset was HE that, after a prawn and plonk evening hosted by Manager Bitossi, he went on strike and didn't surface for two days. I won't tell 'em it was you, JD.)

On a more successful note, Phil Grove got the 50 in the single barrel, and went on to become fourth in Oz. Good shooting indeed.

Ken Selwood appeared to be cruising towards at least a place in AA grade in the double rise, having shot 40 on the trot, but wind and weather contributed to a final score of 45/50, 46's shooting off for third. Next time, Ken.

Back to the Territory, and old timer Steve (the Silver Fox) Lorman scored a magnificent 98/100 to take out the district skeet title. Second home was 91/100. Steve's feet weren't touching the ground, what with the win and the fact that he'd just shot his first 25 in competition. Sour note, if anything could upset the occasion, was the target he missed twice - low six. Perhaps excusable for a mollyduker, but a bit annoying for an orthodox gunner, eh, Steve. What's that about Skeet being the game you take up when trap starts to bore you?

Down at Top End, Secretary Bob Hooper says that they're finally getting the layout laid out. Let's hope that the unsafe layouts have been altered, because it was only a matter of time before someone got a barrelfull.

Darwin President, Bob Fox advises that the Committee is deep in preparation for this August's Four Day Shoot, and asks that intending shooters start organizing accommodation as soon as possible. COMMENT

According to the father, the Q.C.T.A. referred it back to the Club. The N.T. shooter guizzed both National and State Executive members about action on the issue. Guess what? The A.C.T.A. washed its hands of the affair, saying it was Queensiand's problem, and the Q.C.T.A. official dropped it into the Club's lap.

This writer's opinion is that such insanely restrictive laws should be opposed with the full force that our Association can bring to bear on the Queensland Government, at National, State, Zone, Club and shooter level. Let us ALL stand up and be counted for the betterment of our sport. Let us start the petitions NOW, One to the local Member (for Queenslanders only), and another one for ALL directly to Sir Joh Bjelke-Petersen, who, after all, is the patron of our Sport in Queensland.

Firearm safety should start as soon as a shooter is physically capable of holding a gun, and the mid-teens would probaly be the most difficult period to inculcate safe practices in a beginner: and if we want our sport to continue, and to expand, we must actively encourage our most junior shooters.
