EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The A.C.T.A. Historian, Mr George Biggs, is appealing to members for information regarding outstanding performances recorded by our past and present champions.

If you are able to assist, then please refer to his notice in this issue of the C.T.S.N.

While George is after information, so are we. For too long we have failed to record our Australian and National record holders and through the C.T.S.N., we are endeavouring to rectify this situation.

A records register is being established at the National Office which will eventually enable us to give true recognition when records are established and broken.

To enable the register to be as up-to-date as possible, we are calling for details of record holders at Australian and National level in all present areas of competition.

The National Office will close the register at December 31st, 1987 and the details that are in hand at that time will be accepted as the record for that particular event.

We will endeavour to publish as many records as possible so that if you are aware of a better performance, you can, if you wish to do so, and we trust that this will be the case, provide details that supercede the published information.

Please do not send in any information which cannot be substantiated in some way as we wish to ensure the accuracy of our records register at all times.

Once the records register is established, that being from January 1st, 1988, the only alterations will be those that are made in accordance with documented evidence supplied to the A.C.T.A. on the prescribed form, which will be made available to affiliated State Associations and Clubs.

Information received by June 30th will be included in the August issue of the C.T.S.N. and hopefully, you will be one to send in some information that will enable our records register to become an important part of our history.

Yes, you are quite correct, we should not be asking for this information, we should already have it. The simple fact is that we do not have the information and because of this there is no better time to correct the situation than now. I hope that you agree.

Another case worthy of your attention is the appeal being conducted through the Australian Sports Aid Foundation which is to assist with funds to have a junior team attend the 1987 World Shotgun Championships in Venezuela as well as to continue the development of our junior shooters at international level.

Donations to the junior appeal are 100% tax deductible and all funds raised are for the exclusive use of juniors.

Three very important items have been mentioned so far in my notes to members, (1) Details of past and present champions' outstanding performances. (2) Information to establish an Australian and National records register. (3) Junior World Championship Fund. All are significant and each one is as important as the other. Please help if you can.

A fourth and just as important matter, is the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy.

Answering questions on the A.C.T.A. policy does certainly occupy a great deal of my time, for as soon as one Club Secretary becomes familiar with the cover provided, another new Club Secretary seems to be appointed.

I do not at all mind the questions, for while they are being asked, shooters are having their interests protected.

One thing I would ask, however, is that before ringing the A.C.T.A. office you do refer to the summary of the A.C.T.A. policy which is printed in this issue.

Should you still be uncertain, or prefer after reading the summary to speak with me about any specific area, then please feel free to do so.

Don't forget to make your bookings for the 1987 Na-

tional Skeet Championship in late October. Perth at that time of the year is a most pleasant place to be, the facilities at the W.A.G.C. complex are excellent. The rest, of course, is up to you.

COMMENTS FROM NATIONAL PRESIDENT — RE NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

For those who have not seen the A.C.T.A. office, the premises that we occupy are in fact a small, three-bedroom, brick veneer house. Owing to the design and the lack of space in which to function efficiently, there have been numerous discussions on how to improve our premises and the decision has been confirmed many times that spending funds on structural alterations could well be an error of judgement.

While this was so, the need for larger premises, more suited to the needs of the Association, remained and a sub-committee was formed to consider the best usage of the office and its available space.

While this was taking place, an approach was made by a firm of property developers to purchase the premises at Blackburn. The site, upon investigation, was decidedly underdeveloped and with the building having no commercial value whatsoever, it became obvious that an opportunity had presented itself, which was eventually negotiated satisfactorily.

With the funds obtained from a sale, the A.C.T.A. should be able to purchase or build an office property more suited to its needs and one that will provide a sound financial base from which the A.C.T.A. could develop in the years to come.

Naturally at this time no actual decisions have been made on relocating as discussions on the question of buying or building and where are still taking place.

The purchase of an office in the first instance was met with objections from some quarters, but after the fiasco in which our building fund instituted in the early 1970s was absorbed into general revenue, and finally disappeared, it was decided that some 'concrete' proposition was needed. Consequently the premises just sold were rented and then were purchased, and a considerable amount of money was borrowed in relation to our then current financial situation, but we moved from a prestigious position to one where the interest was eventually less than the rent we were paying at the time.

A proposition to build a National Ground somewhere in Australia was mooted and actually accepted by means of a referendum conducted by A.C.T.A., subject to a suitable venue being obtained which would contain at least 15 D.T.L. and superimposed skeet layouts, and had provision for our headquarters.

Despite a search by the then executive and submissions from them to and from various clubs, nothing eventuated. The matter was subsequently shelved and is not likely to be revived, unless you wish it so, and now would be the time. The capital gain we have achieved since then has fully justified the move to purchase premises, but it was a unanimous decision of the present executive that all of the proceeds must be returned to a "brick and mortar" situation as soon as possible, and any further borrowings to procure a suitable venue must be self-funding.

Having been involved in this matter from the time I have been on the executive and witnessed the first attempt founder, I can only say that I applaud the present executive in their intention to uphold and extend the foresight of their immediate predecessors. As they make a decision that will take the A.C.T.A. into the 21st century with an office design to fulfil the needs of this Association and its members, I trust that you will agree with this.

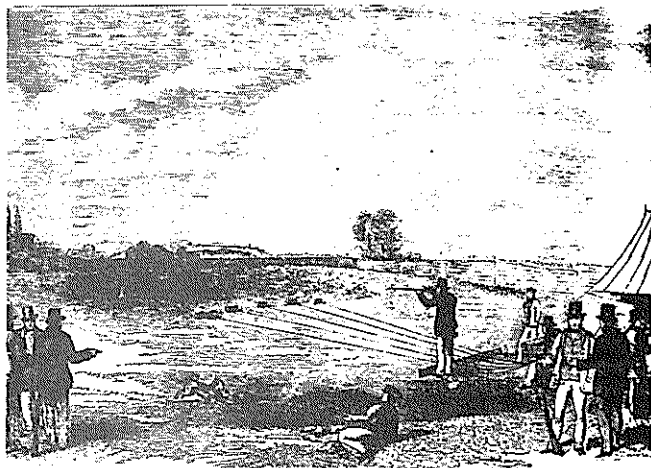
STORIES OUT OF THE PAST

Around 1880, some 20 years before the introduction of clay targets, glass balls were being developed as a target for trap shooting in England and Europe. History tells us about the lengthy challenge matches at glass ball shooting during the 1880s.

In earlier times, prior to glass balls, live pigeon trap shooting was the popular form of shooting throughout Europe and England.

W.W. Greener in his book "The Gun and Its Development" relates how in July 1880 Captain A.H. Bogardus succeeded in scoring 99 birds out of 100, the 47th falling dead out of bounds. This extraordinary score was made in a match with a Mr Rimmell, an Englishman, for \$250 a side.

Bogardus on 30 yards, Rimmell on 28 yards, 100 birds, straps, weather fair, and birds in good condition.

Both shooters used English double barrel guns and cartridges loaded with ditmar powder and 1 1/4 ounces of number six shot.

Glass ball target shooting, a pastime that became popular, firstly in England and later became fashionable and developed by Captain Bogardus in America.

Glass balls when first introduced were merely coloured glass. Further improvements were to chequer them to prevent the shot from glancing off and they were also filled with smoke or feathers. The quickest time recorded for breaking 100 glass balls with a shot gun was just under five minutes.

Captain Bogardus, the great American wing shot, made a match against time in December 1879 and succeeded in breaking 5500 balls in a few seconds under seven hours and 20 minutes. Of the 5500 shot at, he missed 356. He used an English gun with two sets of barrels and changed the barrels no less than 55 times.

Dr W.F. Carver, an American who spent 16 years of his life among the American Indian tribes, attained great skill with his rifle, and made his debut in San Francisco as a professional marksman. He also visited Europe, and astonished all with his remarkable performances: coins, glass balls, oranges, etc. thrown into the air were hit with the greatest ease — in fact, his aim with the rifle was apparently unerring. His greatest feat was before the Prince of Wales when he broke 100 glass balls consecutively with his rifle.

On February 7th 1881, a match was shot off at the Welsh Harp, Hendon between Dr Carver, the champion American and Mr W. Scott, a celebrated English shot. The final score was Dr Carver 60 birds, Mr Scott 62 birds. The stakes amounted to £500. The birds were the quickest seen during the whole winter months and the weather was vile; the greater part of the match was shot in a blinding snow storm.

I'm indebted to Greg Kean for the following story.

Greg was an executive member of the original Melbourne Gun Club which was situated at Tottenham on the west side of the city. The club ceased operations in the late 1950s when live bird shooting was banned in Victoria. Dear George,

This yarn came to me from C.B. (Barney) Medway — now departed.

Barney came from the Benalla district. He was a smallish fellow with a handy way with words.

His shooting days were tapering off when I knew him, but he was always one for a yarn.

Anyhow, as Barney told it, the great Dr Carver from the U.S. of A., with his reputation as the greatest wing shot in history, arrived at the New South Wales Gun Club (I think it would have been at Sans Souci, which is now part of the Mascot Airport. The clubhouse, the dog kennels and bird cages were still there a few years ago). He challenged any person in the world to shoot him a match from 30 yards, 100 birds up, and £100 a side.

He was challenged five times and he won each time, although Jack Neeld ran him close when he shot 93 to the Doctor's 94.

I knew Jack Neeld's son: another Jack, and I had discussions with him about it, but he lacked a sense of history and was only mildly interested, although Errol Bullen, another member of N.S.W. Gun Club of my days there, confirmed Barney's story.

Carver then came to the Melbourne Gun Club (at Brighton, I think) and challenged anybody in the land to shoot against him on the same conditions as in Sydney.

There were several takers and once again Carver won each match. In one of these matches, after he had shot about 20 birds straight, the Doctor walked off the mark and called for a strip of lead; he said he felt he was over-swinging and wanted to wrap the lead around his barrels to slow himself down a little.

After pocketing the loot and running out of challengers, Carver issued an open challenge for £500 a side, 100 birds up.

This offer went untaken for a few weeks while Carver won about every event he wanted to win in the daily competitions of those days.

Then one Friday, the Grant brothers from Skipton walked in to the Club on one of their occasional visits. They worked as rabbiters on very ordinary wages and their ability to shoot at the Club was limited.

According to Barney, they were "pretty fair shots".

They had never heard of Carver; but when told of the challenge they had a little discussion, pooled their money and drew straws to see who would do the shooting.

Bobby drew the long straw and, after checking that the Carver money was up, they paid their five hundred and the match was set for the Saturday a week away.

A great crowd came along for the event and over 50 book-makers stood up to do battle with the punters (these were the days before sprung traps, and the odds would have been five to two on, or worse).

Anyhow, with much excitement, huge betting, and a break for lunch, the big day saw the great Carver shoot 99 out of the hundred, and in Barney's words, "It wasn't bloody well good enough; Bobby shot the hundred."

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

STEEL SHOT

I have just received a copy of the N.Z. equivalent to our Shooters News. They published an article from a U.S. magazine and I think it is of interest. In the U.S. there is a move to replace lead shot with steel shot for all hunting purposes by 1991, as in most things I expect we will follow. In South Australia this has already happened in the South East of the State.

Points from the article worth noting are:

1. Firstly the shooter must decide if their shotgun is suitable to handle steel shot. Many of the older double barrel guns just can't take steel shot. They suggest guns with interchangeable chokes, such as the Browning BPS with Invector tubes. For those who use automatic guns Brownings A5 can be made better able to take the steel shot with the addition of one of the Japanese barrels fitted with Browning Invector tubes. Beretta's 302 automatics come with chrome bores and are stated to be steel shot proof.

2. If using steel shot it is suggested that shot at least two sizes larger than normal be used.

3. No more chokes than modified should be used, improved cylinder is preferred for the steel shot.

None of the above will apply to target shooting of course.

NUTRITION

Most shooters these days are aware of the importance of a well balanced diet, low in fat and with plenty of vegetables and fruit and whole grains in the form of bread and cereal. However, for shooters who are to compete over two, three or more days, it could improve their performances to increase their intake of carbohydrates for the three days prior to the start of the competition. This raises the level of stored fuels in the muscles. Increasing carbohydrate intake is simple, just eat more of the bread, fruit, pasta, starchy vegetables i.e. corn, beans or potatoes. Rice is also a good source of carbohydrate.

Don't eat a heavy meal just prior to competition, a light meal should be eaten at least two hours prior to shooting. Avoid eggs, cheese, meat, butter, oils or margarine if possible. Proteins and fat are digested very slowly. The light meal should ideally consist of low fat foods such as cereal, fruit, bread, pancakes, waffles or pasta. If a heavy meal is eaten it increases the amount of insulin in the blood and this inhibits the fatty acid cells from circulating in the blood. The fatty acid cells are used as fuel by the muscles.

Clay target shooting uses a great deal of energy, so it is important to have stored energy available for the muscles. The capacity of the muscles used in clay shooting to store these fatty acid cells is greatly increased by using the muscles in practice, at least for the same time that the competition will cover. If the competition is to be over three days it is important to practice over three days. Our body adapts to provide the energy needed for the physical activities of shooting a clay target competition over whatever period practised for.

WARM UP

It is important in this very cold weather to get the blood supply moving to the brain and extremities before shooting. Cold muscles are often stiff muscles, so get out of the car or the warm club house and move about, gently twisting and stretching. Perform all of the movements that you normally use when you are shooting. Busy club coaches and officials are moving about but they are not preparing the muscles that will be used in competition. Just five to 10 minutes will do.

PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

IN THE INTERESTS OF ALL REGISTERED SHOOTERS

The Public Liability Policy that has been arranged for the A.C.T.A. by Carlingford Australia is designed to provide specific protection for the Association and its registered members.

The A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy protects the Association and its members from being sued for alleged negligence/blame attaching to an incident causing property damage or bodily injury.

If a shooter is injured in any way during the course of a sanctioned event where no blame can be attached to the A.C.T.A. and its members any claim that may have been made would not be recognised under the policy conditions as it would then be classified as a personal claim covered by an insurance that the shooter may have in force on a personal basis.

Protection is afforded to the following who, subject to certain conditions, are considered to be members of the A.C.T.A.

1. A.C.T.A.
2. State Associations
3. Registered Clubs
4. Registered Shooters
5. Voluntary Workers
6. Club Visitors (participants)
7. Club Visitors (observers)

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

1. A.C.T.A. — Payment of the prescribed premium to the Insurer by the due date, January 1, annually.
2. STATE ASSOCIATIONS — Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
3. REGISTERED CLUBS — (A) Subject to payment of the prescribed affiliation fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
(B) Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Association (respective) who are operating under the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
4. REGISTERED SHOOTERS — (A) Subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
(B) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and A.C.T.A.
5. VOLUNTARY WORKERS — (A) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.
(B) Provided always that such voluntary workers are registered as members of the Australian Clay Target Association on the master register maintained by the Australian Clay Target Associations with a description of their duties.
Additions to or deletion from this master list are to be notified to the A.C.T.A. office as they are known.
NOTE: Voluntary workers to be registered with the A.C.T.A. are to be restricted to those persons likely to assist on a voluntary basis only.
Paid personnel such as trappers, trap mechanics or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the workers compensation act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority.
- 6/7. CLUB VISITORS — (Participants or Observers)
(A) Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.

(B) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered A.C.T.A. shooters.

(C) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulations of the respective club, State Association and A.C.T.A.

NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc. who are not registered shooters with the A.C.T.A. must first of all have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly. Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possibly arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.

8. Clubs who have life members or similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to either the Club or the A.C.T.A. by reason of their inactivity in the sport at Club and/or A.C.T.A. level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered Shooters".
9. Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shooters.
10. Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to safety etc. have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines such as a combination of Clay Target and field and game.

Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master A.C.T.A. Policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation, therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the A.C.T.A. master policy unless cover in excess of \$2,000,000 is required.

Paid employees must at all times be protected under the workers' compensation act.

Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Club or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is eliminated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$2,000,000.

Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person, must at all times sign the visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.

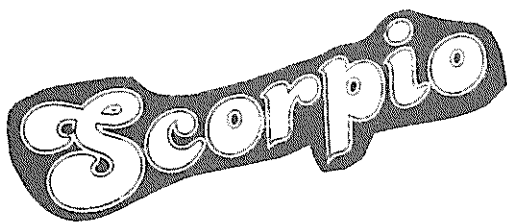
All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body.

NOTE: Club shooters, not registered with the A.C.T.A., are not covered under any circumstances other than operating as a voluntary worker at an organised event. This category of shooter-member is solely a club responsibility and insurance cover should be considered at all times as a club expense.

FOR INFORMATION: Further extensions included within the policy are: Member to member; Food and Drink; Care, custody and control; Medical and welfare facilities; Tenants' liability; Hoists, cranes and unregistered vehicles; Car parking; Cross liabilities.

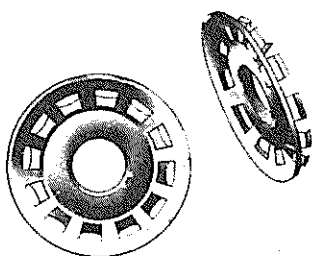

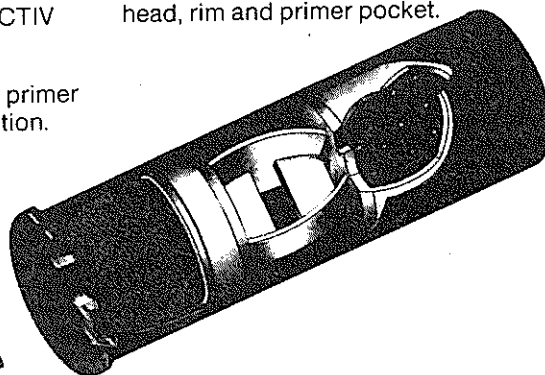

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

The Amalgamation of Members of the A.C.T. International and the Queanbeyan-Canberra Gun Clubs

For some years the Queanbeyan-Canberra Gun Club suffered from the encroachment of the Queanbeyan race-course on its grounds which reduced its Down-The-Line layouts from four to one. Skeet fared little better having to be completely eliminated.

As a result, monthly skeet shoots and open DTL shoots had to be held at the ACT International facilities. In addition, noise pollution regulations, which were strictly enforced, curtailed shooting times on Wednesday evenings.

The A.C.T. International Gun Club was in a similar, if less critical, situation in that it was unable to expand beyond two DTL traps, one Olympic trap and one ISU/Australian Skeet layout because of the limited size of its grounds. This situation was aggravated because all facilities were superimposed which restricted the club to conducting one shooting discipline at a time.

With a large block of land suitable for clay target shooting being offered by the Department of Territories (which is responsible for the management of the ACT, including land use) it was decided that, in the general interests of clay target shooting, the two clubs should consider amalgamating as a possible solution to the problems of shooting restrictions and sharing arrangements.

The main benefits of such amalgamation was seen as the elimination of duplicate facilities and the administration of ground utilisation by one club rather than two.

The combining of funds and equipment with the larger pool of members was also going to strengthen the new club, and therefore the sport.

At separate General Meetings each club agreed to amalgamation and the wheels were set in motion to this end. On 2 September a Special General Meeting of both clubs was held at the Queanbeyan-Canberra Gun Club when it was decided that the new club be named the 'Canberra International Clay Target Club Inc.'

It was also decided that a Steering Committee comprising Steve Teitzel (chair), Norman Simms, Bill Beavan, Peter Simon and Steve Kessell be given the task of determining the requirements of the new club and bringing forward their recommendations to both clubs.

To facilitate amalgamation it was also agreed that the constitution of the ACT International Gun Club would be used for the new club and the change of name was duly registered with the A.C.T. Corporate Affairs Commission leaving the way open to transfer club membership from the Canberra-Queanbeyan Gun Club to the Canberra International.

At the inaugural Annual General Meeting the following were elected to office: Norman Simms (President), Steve Teitzel (First Vice President), Gary Betar (Second Vice President), Jacqui Koselski (Secretary), Judy Prosser (Treasurer), Doreen Newcombe (Public Officer. Committee Members were Mark Barlin, Filippo Petriella, Fred Rees and John Taylor.

The Club currently shoots on the old ACT International grounds at the junction of Majura Road and the Federal Highway on the northern outskirts of Canberra where it conducts the following competitions which, unless advertised otherwise, commence at 12 noon:

Second Saturday:	International Skeet
Second Sunday:	Australian Skeet
Third Sunday:	Olympic Trap
Fourth Sunday:	Down-The-Line
Fifth Sunday:	International Skeet

At 7.30pm every Tuesday DTL is shot under lights.

The Club will continue to shoot on the old grounds until the new grounds are developed sufficiently to enable an orderly transfer of equipment and facilities.

The new grounds, which are located on a block near the

Kowen Forest some five minutes drive from Queanbeyan along the Kings Highway, have sufficient space for 13 DTL trap layouts with Skeet, Olympic Trap, etc to be superimposed. The first stage is due to be completed by the end of September 1987 and further progress reports will appear in this journal.

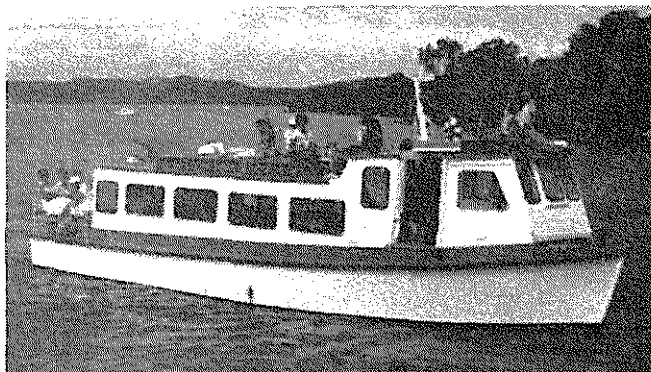

John Maxwell is leading qualifier so far on a very good 96.3%, but only 0.4% ahead of young Michael Diamond from Sydney on 95.9%. Also performing well are Cliff Bailey, Vince Gatt and Robert Thompson, with Victor Burgess and Peter Sbrinovski also doing well.

With scores like these constantly being recorded, it is no wonder the New South Wales team was successful at the Olympic Discipline Nationals in Perth earlier in the year. It is also not surprising that only Victorian Russel Mark stood in the way of our state's total domination of the Olympic Trap Training Squad. Six out of seven in the squad (including the junior spot to Michael Diamond) is a good indication of the success our training squad elimination series and the increased number of facilities in the state has had on our competitor's performances.

Still, things on the I.S.U. scene within the state are not now at a stand still. The complex planned for Canberra is now well under way and will no doubt be as good as anything anywhere else in Australia, including Perth. The recent final National Training Squad elimination held in conjunction with our sub-committee's Annual Fund Raising shoot at Downside, was also a good indication of the following the disciplines are receiving.

The 1988 state carnival has recently been allocated, and will be held on the third weekend of the year, January 16th and 17th at West Wyalong. Perhaps that carnival will really produce some tough competition. During the past few years, scores of 198/200 and 198/200 have been needed to win on that ground. Jim Ellis shot a 198 to win the last state title held at West Wyalong in 1985, and John Maxwell shot 99/100 and 99/100 to win there in April.

It is with alarm that I hear of proposals by the N.S.W. Clay Target Association to impose a levy of 50 cents per shooter per registered shoot. Do members realise how much this could amount to? Most members would be paying far more in the levy than in their affiliation fees.

At present I believe that the State is financed by affiliation fees and the profits from the State Shoots. If it needs more money, surely a small increase in the affiliation fees is all that is required?

Readers will recall that the request from The Clay Target for \$1.00 to publish shoot results was rejected by the members. Now they are being asked to pay far more than this to cover needs that as yet have not been formulated.

That this levy could even be suggested indicates that clubs have lost contact with the State Body. I urge you to give direction to your delegate to Zone, which will in turn give direction to the State Body.

If this is done, decisions made by Association will represent the majority of shooters.

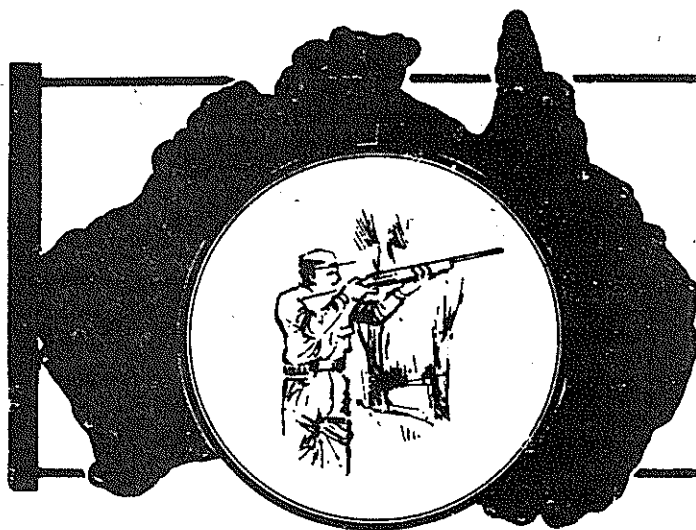

N.T.C.T.A. NEWS

Once again, the State Trap Carnival has been run and won. Congratulations to the new titleholders! Full results will be in next month's 'News'.

The 'Blob' has again heard rumours that pressure is being brought to bear to have the State Skeet titles scrapped in the present format and tacked, once more, into a 50 or 100 target event, as the perennial poor relation, onto a minor day's shooting at the Darwin Annual Shoot.

Why is it that so many officials, at all levels, are parochial in the extreme seeing not what benefit the sport as a whole can derive from sound, far-seeing administration, but only what short-term benefit a club or association can gain, usually at others' expense?

The Skeet Carnival, through astute administration, will do more to promote the cause of N.T. skeet shooters than one event at a Club Carnival. It is true that only 30 shooters participated in '86, but then only 45 fully-paid shooters participated in the Trap Carnival. 1986 was a slow year for all disciplines.

As for the Skeet Carnival running at a loss, the blame can be laid at the feet of disinterested N.T.C.T.A. officials. The collection of a few trophies from a quick canvass of business houses, and the running of a couple of small raffles, is the difference between a healthy bank balance and a loss. If skeet shooters are going to be treated continually as second-class shooters, at any level, it is high time that an Association is formed to cater solely for the semi-circular sport. Ostrich and tunnel-minded administrators, beware! You have been warned!

HERE AND THERE

Following on from the above, how can we, as an Australia-wide Association, prosper when every State body seems to be advancing its cause at the expense of the sport? Western Australia's proposal to combine the Trap and Skeet Nationals was a good idea only for W.A., and that must have been obvious to anyone with a minimum of grey matter between the ears.

It is time that we started working towards the National Shooting Grounds again, and become an Association with roots and traditions. The grounds obviously should be in

The 2nd event on Saturday was the Winchester 3 man

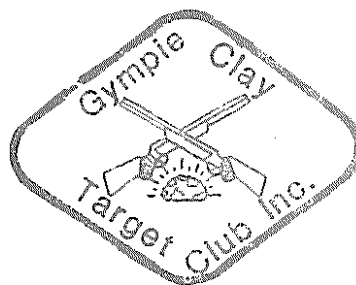
