





EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Proposal to combine Trap & Skeet Nationals

Further to our argument on this subject which appeared in the April issue of C.T.S.N., we would like the following follow-up article to be printed in the C.T.S.N.:

Since the last W.A.C.T.A. argument for combining the Trap & Skeet Nationals which appeared in the April C.T.S.N., we have had many opinions put to us and this leads us to comment further.

The main comment is that all our National Championships are of equal importance and should be available to the greatest number of shooters possible. Fragmentation of our sport is not the best way to develop it, because the real danger is that two associations could develop and with our small numbers that would be to the detriment of us all. Many shooters have said they would like to shoot in both the Skeet & Trap Nationals, but cannot afford the expense of attending two National series. If the idea that each group pursuing a particular discipline of our sport are entitled to a Nationals of their own, then perhaps the keen Double Rise shooter should have a Nationals for D/Rise padded out with District Championships as the Skeet Nationals already is.

We believe that the best way to develop Clay Target shooting is to expose as many shooters as possible to all types of shooting. Many shooters that had a try at Skeet because it was part of the old Nationals, now do not shoot skeet and the same applies to Skeet shooters that now do not shoot trap. The argument that shooters cannot adapt from one to the other really does not come into it, as the keen devotee will concentrate on his or her particular event as they do now, and so many just want to participate, and we are at present preventing them from doing so. What is needed is a Nationals series of only our National Titles, so let us put them back together and then the sport will all have a win.

Another very good reason for the combination is the sponsors. Surely it would be more attractive for any sponsor to have all disciplines shot at one venue around the same time, rather than having to send their representatives at great cost somewhere else at another time of the year. It is time we thought of the sponsors, as we do not need much imagination to see what sort of a National Championship it would be without sponsorship. Think about it.

Another aspect is the financial burden on A.C.T.A. We all know our sport is not on the increase but is struggling to maintain our present numbers, and this is reflected in the A.C.T.A. finances. What better way of conserving our finances by saving the cost to A.C.T.A. of travel and accommodation for National President, Executive Director and others by having one Nationals instead of three.

These decisions have to be made on realistic and business values, and not to cater for the selfish wants of a few, but for the survival of our sport.

HISTORY OF OUR SPORT

By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian

LOOKING BACK 50 YEARS

Nearly 50 years ago in March 1939 the veteran champion trapshot, Donald Mackintosh, officially presented the now famous International trophy valued at 100 guineas, to the A.C.P.T.S.A. for perpetual competition between teams representative of England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland and Australia. England won the trophy on the first two occasions prior to the outbreak of war. The cup was next competed for at the Australian Gun Club grounds East Burwood on March 14th, 1948. This would be our third International Match.

June 1939 was a month of big events. Australia took part for the first time in the International competition. Fred Burns won the Champion of Champions cup for the second successive year (at this time the champion of champions cup and the International match was a one-day tournament), Ted Holmes won the N.S.W. Single Barrel Championship at Moree. In the International Teams Match Australia registered 1748 aggregate. Athol Love 118/125 was High Gun from Vic Fakhauser 117/125 and Jack Bryant 112/120 — these three all registered 93/100 over the original course.

In the Champion of Champions events Fred Burns won with 49/50 from George Purcell of Launceston 49/50 and Jack Bryant came in with a 49/50.

Looking Back to 1949: At this stage we were just recovering from the effects of the war years. Australia wins their first International Teams Match on the third attempt.

REPORT FROM THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

Australia's success in winning the Macintosh International Trophy for 1949 and with it premier empire honors in the International Clay Target Shooting field is the paramount interest of the moment. The news of our Australian Team's success has been warmly received throughout the Commonwealth, and from all accounts equally well received in Great Britain.

The score of the substitute shooter J. Bryant, who was included in the team after the first round of 25 targets in "Bendigo" H. Ceresa, is disallowed, and therefore is not included in the scores to count.

Since 1948 the International Teams Match has been contested annually by England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, Canada, New Zealand and Australia; at one brief stage both South Africa and Rhodesia did take part without any success.

The International Teams Match has been a popular part of our National Annual Championship tournament since 1948.

Over the years 1948 to 1974 Australia has won 13 times, England four times, New Zealand six times and Canada four times.

The Training Squad will during September attend a livein training camp at the National Institute of Sport in Canberra. Once again, Clay Target Shooting has been recognised by the Institute.





MOSCOW WORLD CUP REPORT John Maxwell

The following is a brief report on my recent trip to the World Cup conducted in Moscow from May 10-17, 1987.

This was my first opportunity to compete in one of the World Cup events. I had purposely selected Moscow so as to coincide training with the 2nd and 3rd eliminations for our World Championship team. This approach proved successful and I believe my performance at both competitions benefited.

Travelling to one of these shoots as an individual puts added pressures on that person as they must perform all the administrative functions as well as keep their concentration on the shooting competition. On the other hand one of the advantages of travelling alone is that you can organise events to suit exactly your own requirements, e.g. flights, training, entertainment, meals, etc.

I went to Moscow with several aims as a competitor, and in general I was satisfied with my performance although I would have liked to win a quota spot for Australia. In general the range and facilities were excellent with the only problem being poor target colour and slow targets both during practice and the competition. I seemed to get more than my share of slow targets and needed to shoot 5-10 repeats per round. Target colour was a very pale red and they were impossible to see as they left the trap and for the first few metres.

The shooting conditions were almost perfect with the exception of some windy periods and scattered clouds.

Accommodation was at the Hotel Sport where all official sport teams stay. The Hotel was basic by Western standards but there was no problem with meals or security. Transport was well organised between the hotel and the shooting range and the trip took about one hour with a police escort.

The trip was made at his own expense with some assistance from the Australian Olympic Committee whose support is very much appreciated.


WAGGA GUN CLUB SCOUT SHOOTING

The 2nd Wagga Scout Troop were instructed in 'Firearm Safety & Useage' on Sunday 7th June.

The 12 Scouts and their Troop Leaders attended a twohour lecture on Firearms and Safety Procedures. The lecture was conducted by Barney Rooke, Bruce Tingle and myself.

It covered such things as: safety, different calibres, gauges, firearms, licensing laws, correct mounting procedures, clay target shooting, and juniors in the sport.

The Scouts then tried elay target shooting. Most were under the age of 12. As usual, the first reaction when given a gun to mount was to lean back. It was quite difficult to get some of the kids to lean forward, but eventually they all got it right. They then were allowed to start shooting (only one shell). Each fired at 20 targets — most had a reasonable success rate.

Maybe in future years, a couple may join a Gun Club, but even if they don't at least firearm SAFETY has been enforced in their minds and won't be forgotten.

Troop Leaders also tried shooting and were able to get about a 50-60% hit rate.

The Scouts have to sit a test and pass it on Firearm Safety. If they pass they will gain another "badge to the collection".

Local TV, the Prime Network and newspaper The Daily Advertiser covered the scouts learning to shoot, with about three minutes of "air time" on TV and a picture of a young scout holding a gun.

The long weekend was a good weekend for media coverage; after the Prime Network filmed the Scouts they went out to Downside to film the Trench and ISU Skeet Team Eliminations. Clay Target shooting was covered on Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights — a great boost for the sport.

Other Scout groups are interested in participating in a similar exercise. A worthwhile exercise though!

In the afternoon there were six NOVICE shooters (one female). These novices had about 50-70% success rate. All were very keen to come back to the club. The novice shooters are put on a separate layout to the competition. The trap is in hole no.3, so the targets are easier for them to hit. (If you give them harder targets they don't hit as many and get discouraged and don't return.) They all get individual attention and coaching; after only 10 targets they stop, then talk about it, watch the experienced shooters shooting, then they shoot another 10 targets and so on. It is worthwhile doing this for the novices as it has paid off with new memberships; not only that but they feel welcomed if they are "looked after".

All clubs should also try to organise special 'Novice Days'. Advertise and pass the word around — a few experienced members or accredited coaches and a few spare guns and time is all that is needed. Maybe they won't all join, but they do have friends they will tell. Just keep on trying — it pays off.


STATE SPORTSPERSON





The N.T. Mixed Target Championship was won from the




Event 3 — N.T. Mixed Target Championship: Overall K. Selwood. Darwin.

Major highlight of the weekend must surely be the magnificent exhibition of I.S.U. Skeet shooting displayed by Victorian John Summers. John completely blitzed the field over the entire weekend, shooting 100/100 on Saturday, the first day; 99/100 to take the honours on the second (and in doing so create a new Australian I.S.U. Skeet record); and finally shot yet another 100/100 on the third day to take the overall high gun honors 299/300.

Congratulations John, a magnificent effort.

Although outclassed over the weekend, the entire field of I.S.U. Skeeties shot well. Ian Hale, Craig Meuleman, Brian Thompson, Ben Dudenas and Michael Inguanti, as well as locals Jerry Cole, Col Burt, Brian Prosser, Jim Wilberforce and Bob Kennett all put in some good scores.

The standard was high, and there were certainly no oddson favourites at any time over the weekend; perhaps with the exception of Summers. That also went for the 'long barrel' events.

In both disciplines, the National Training Squads were squadded together, many of the elite starting very shakily in the first round or so. In fact, the only clean score during the entire first round was recorded by Victorian junior Peter Schwarz of Geelong. Geoff Mark started with a 24 but, apart from that, 20s, 21s and 22s were the order of the first round.

After a round or so, the scores started to improve, Maxwell posted a clean 25 in his third round while Ellis, Russel Mark and Michael Diamond settled for 24s. Ellis in fact shot six 24s for his next six rounds.

At the conclusion of the first day, Maxwell was overall winner of the Pacific Coast Olympic Trap Championship on 94/100. Geoff Mark took AA Grade with 93, while A Grade went to Victor Kalms from West Wyalong, with Gary Grant from Point Cook taking B Grade and the junior trophy going to Michael Diamond.

John Summers had cleaned up the first 100 straight to take day one honors on the Skeet Field, Meuleman carding 96/100 to take AA Grade. The A Grade section saw an extremely good performance from Jerry Cole of Sydney, who started with a 22 but then ran 75 straight to record 97/100 for the day. B Grade went to Bob Kennett, while Michael Inguanti took the junior trophy and Judy Prosser the ladies.

Day two also saw Maxwell take overall honors in the Olympic Trap with a good 98/100. Ellis had a day full of 24s to total 96 and take AA Grade, A Grade went to Pud Burgess, B Grade to Narrandera shooter John Blain, with

Michael Diamond recording 94/100 to once again take the junior trophy.

The second I.S.U. Skeet event saw little change from the previous day's results, except John Summers missed his target for the weekend recording 99/100. Ian Hale notched up 95 to take AA Grade, while Jerry Cole, Bob Kennett, Michael Inguanti and Judy Prosser took their grades and sections for the second day in a row.

At this point, the final 200 targets for the National Team selection was completed, and the teams for the World Championships in Venezuela, and the Oceania Games in New Zealand, were decided.

The Olympic Trap Team — Jim Ellis 763/800, John Maxwell 761/800 and Russell Mark 757/800.

The I.S.U. Skeet Team — John Summers 774/800, Ian Hale 771/800 and Craig Meuleman 761/800.

The final events of the weekend were the Eastern States Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet Championships.

In the Skeet, John Summers continued where he had left off the previous day to record yet another 100/100 for the day. Ian Hale again took AA Grade with 95, Jerry Cole shot 92/100 to take A Grade, while Bob Kennett again won B Grade and Judy Prosser the ladies section.

The Eastern States Olympic Trap Championship saw a three-way tie after the completion of 100 targets, with Michael Diamond, Russell Mark and Pud Burgess all recording 97s. During the shoot-off round, Pud dropped a couple to be out of contention, and it appeared that the other two would need to go 'miss and out' until Russell missed his last to give Michael the overall. 





At this stage the clubhouse is 65% complete. The clubhouse will be operational for the Trap Nationals next April. It will certainly be an improvement on the old clubhouse. During periods where State and National events are being conducted the old clubhouse is used for the office and there is nowhere for the shooters and their families to sit, now both is available.

was elected President of the N.T.C.T.A.

Bob Fox, Darwin's President, becomes Vice-President. and Paul Weis, after a one-year absence, has taken over his old Secretary/Treasurer portfolio.

The numbers were down considerably for shooters 'shooting the programme', only 27 full noms being received from the 53 shooters present. I won't say anything about the programme, other than that it was hastily compiled and poorly executed.

With such numbers, returns to shooters and to the Association were the worst yet. It is to be hoped that the present Committee can arrange a greatly improved and better publicised shoot in 10 months' time. A lot of work needs to be done in the ensuing months on sponsorship for what should be our major shoot. We have sat back with minds in neutral for too long.

Enough said on the above; but we have a Skeet Carnival in September; much organisation again is needed for a reasonably successful shoot.

The N.T. team caused headaches for at least one member of the retiring executive when a Queensland resident, N.T.-registered, made the five-man Shoulder to Shoulder team for the '88 Nationals. Well done J.A.

The first day was 'more than somewhat' hectic, with traps, leads and motors breaking down almost on the half hour. It seems that a spike in the power supply caused most of the trap problems. With the delays, most shooters were not impressed by the decision to postpone the final squads in the single barrel event until the next morning. It was argued, and correctly so, that, as previous squads were also hampered by the position of the sun, so should subsequent squads. The Shoot Marshal decided 'off his own bat' that conditions were adverse and, with the departure of most shooters, the jury and club representatives were powerless to reverse what should have been their decision. Not good enough, Shoot Marshal!

HERE AND THERE: Darwin shooters turned up in droves for the 'Bring a Friend' day recently. It's an idea which has been tried successfully previously, on an annual basis. It might be a better idea tried quarterly, and with the emphasis on short events and many of them. As the Skeeties were heard to say as they took the field at 3.30 for their midday shoot, 'It's been a long day'.

With such shooting, it has always been a mystery that presentations over a long program are left until last; in racing circles, when the race is run, and you're on a 'high', you're presented with the Cup, the Cheque, and the Chit Chat. A shooter shouldn't have to wait around like a stale 'bottler' for every other thing to be shot; you've had your hour of glory, and I think it should be rewarded then and there. There is nothing as boring as sitting down to presentations over a full weekend's programme, and hearing the same old speeches hashed up ad infinitum. Done every couple of hours, it's bearable.

Organisation shouldn't be a problem to any Committee with a collective brain in its head; the only drawback is that the trophies keep reducing as the days go by and the display is not as impressive. However, it's less of a problem to put them in and out daily for whoever's got the job; the

'fair dinkum' top drawer trophies should be the only ones done at the conclusion of the shoot; the High Guns awards.






