CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT

PAST AND PRESENT

DONALD MACKINTOSH



World Champion Australian shooter and founder of our sport. Well before those of us who are shooting today were born, Donald Mackintosh was making a name for Australia on European shooting grounds and at the leading gun clubs of England in the 1890s.

The following story is a personal sketch of Donald Mackintosh by an un-named Australian journalist of that time and was published in a leading Melbourne daily newspaper and magazines.

No branch of trade is more interesting than that of the manufacture and sale of guns for use in sport, personal amusement, and the encouragement of shooting skill. In the world of sport many individual marksmen have gained worthy distinction, but I venture the opinion that amongst them all there has been no more picturesque or noteworthy personality than that of Donald Mackintosh, the Australian native, who, for a quarter of a century, held front rank in shooting circles, and for over 10 years shot with marked distinction at Monte Carlo, Paris, London, Rome, Madrid and other European centres. By dint of natural aptitude, keen study, and persistent effort, he lifted himself up from small beginnings into the very foremost grade of the world's marksmen, and eventually gained a name equal to the best of the world's best in the use of the shot gun, both in the field and in International competitions.

In shooting, as in other things, there is nothing like an early start, and "Donald", as he was for many years known in the Australian shooting world, learned to handle the gun when very young — not more than six years of age at the most. Although not an exceptionally strong lad, he took to the gun "like a duck to water". His earliest efforts were devoted to getting the best results he could from a flask of black powder, a few pounds of lead, and an old-time muzzle-loader, which could be adapted either to bullets of the old spherical kind or shot. With this outfit he set out, a not ambitious boy, with his gun under his arm, and the world before him. His "first shot" was at a flock of crows, at the other end of a plough furrow, the alignment of which, at that time, rather assisted his "sporting aim". He took careful sight at long range, and sure enough there was a "dead bird" accounted for, and gathered in as a result of a well-directed effort. After that he had plenty of practice on parrots, snipe, wild duck and other feathered species, as well as rabbits and hares. "Donald" did not make the acquaintance of a gun club until about 16 years of age. The first he joined was a Bacchus Marsh club, and his first success was taking second prize in a shoot for a trophy presented by Mr J. O. Inglis, who was at that time one of four foremost amateur riders, and later the owner of the Melbourne Cup winner, Malua.

At 23 years of age he was a member of the Melbourne Gun Club, which has, for many years, been the leading Gun Club in Victoria, if not Australia. Entering the club, virtually as a "Novice", he was, at the end of the first six months, back to what was then the handicap limit, 30 yds, at pigeons. Once on that mark he has never stood nearer up to the present day.

Amongst Mr Mackintosh's first notable successes was winning the Melbourne Gun Club £50 Challenge Cup three times and taking final possession. In doing this he had shooters of the first order of skill to defeat.

Later on he had much success in open pigeon matches, for valuable stakes, at the Melbourne Gun Club, the Sydney Gun Club and various country meetings. With the true love of an Australian native for game shooting, he spent much time in the leafy forests, and soon gained a widespread reputation as a crack shot on quail, snipe, wild duck etc.

One episode remains fresh in Mac's memory of an outing he had with the renowned American wing shot, Dr Carver, in the Yarrawonga District, when the two cracks were out after snipe and any other attractive "live target" offering. Mac winged a galah, and Carver chased down a beautiful young swan. As the Doctor was anxious to take away to his American home something purely Australian, they exchanged birds, and the great record-holder ever afterwards cherished that galah as a domestic pet. He told "Mac", when the two sports met at Monte Carlo many years afterwards, that it was still living and flourishing in its Kentucky home — and "talking like a bullock driver". As for the swan, that also still survives.

It is not so much on his Australian doings as on those at Monte Carlo and the other great European shooting grounds and at the leading gun clubs of England that "Donald's" reputation has been built up. As a single man he first visited England and the classic rendezvous on the shores of the Mediterranean, ruled over by the Prince of Monaco, in 1896. After a two years' tour, he came back to Australia, having made good impressions in Europe and England. He returned to the shooting world's great centres in the year 1900 a married man, taking his Australian wife with him. For nine years thereafter "Donald" worthily represented the Australian democracy in European and British shooting circles, gaining much prominence as a successful competitor in the most important shooting events in the old world.

Some of "Donald's" more conspicuous wins in Australia, the continent and in England and their value are as follows:

1. First in Melbourne Gun Club £1000 Cup Handicap, 1890, killing 33 birds straight 30 yds.
2. Melbourne Gun Club £50 Challenge Cup, won three times in succession. Won Cup and £150.
3. London Gun Club £100 Challenge Cup, won three times in succession. Cup and £250.
4. Paris Gun Club £100 Challenge Cup, won three times in succession. Cup and £150.
5. Grand Prize of Italy, Florence, £800.
6. Grand Prize Aix les Bains, £800.
7. Championship Belgium Ostenden, £200.
8. Grand Prize Monte Carlo, divided first £1000.
9. Championship London Gun Club, £130.
10. Grand Prize Milan, divided first £800.
11. Grand Prize Madrid, divided first £600.
12. Grand Prize Monte Carlo, divided first £1000.

On his return to Australia, a few years ago, Mr Mackintosh, yielding to a natural inclination to assist others to gain successes in a sphere which had proved so fascinating to himself, decided to go into the business of the importation and sale of shot guns, rifles, revolvers and all sporting requisites. He started at 400 Bourke Street West, close to that historic sporting rendezvous, Kirk's Bazaar, where he quickly secured a following, and rapidly "caught the eye" of the local shooting world.

When in England, Mr Mackintosh took special steps to acquaint himself with all the details and processes of the manufacture of shot guns and other sporting weapons, and by personal inspection and interview, acquired a knowledge of all particulars and peculiarities in the London, Birmingham and Continental gun trade, both as regards original manufacture and the conditions of the export of guns, etc. to Australia. The knowledge thus gained he concentrates upon his business, which he is thus enabled to conduct so as to bring all costs and charges to his customers to the desirable minimum, consistent with quality and efficiency. By a careful system of selection and adaptation of the latest methods, he is able to stock guns, ammunition and all sportsmen's requisites suited to the requirements of all classes of purchasers.

SOME FOREIGN PRESS NOTICES

These cuttings may interest Australian shots as showing how one of their countrymen was received, and what was thought of him in Europe.

SHOOTERS AND SHOOTING

The "Daily Mail" Special, London, concludes an article on Australian English, Russian and Italian shots by saying:

"Monte Carlo claims attention in winter. Perhaps the finest shot that has ever competed there is the Italian shot, Guidicinni, but at the present time the best shot in the world is probably Mr Mackintosh, the Australian."

"The Jockey", Paris, in a long and interesting discourse on shooting, winds up by contrasting the performances of the world's famous shots who have contested at Monte Carlo as follows:

"Mr Mackintosh's performances at Monte Carlo, together with his records made in England and Australia, are such that, in a word, we declare him the Champion of the World".

From "Diana", Florence: "On the 23rd September, 1908, Mr Donald Mackintosh, the famous shot, left for Australia, after an absence from that country of many years. He, who had so many victories, and who made so many friends, being as he was, the prototype of the correct sportsman, has left everybody regretting his departure, and with a sincere desire to see him again. We voice the sentiments of every Italian shooter in wishing him a pleasant voyage and great future happiness."

The "Grand World of Sport", Madrid, in an article, discusses the most extraordinary shots of the world, and sums up as follows:

"The grand programme of events, shot at Monte Carlo in fees for the various items total about an equal £10,000.

TRAP SHOOTING BY DONALD MACKINTOSH (approx. 1956)

"The competitors at the series of events are of all nationalities. But those who stand out most prominently are Guidicinni and Grasselli, representing Italy; Count O'Brien, Spain; Mackintosh, Australia; Roberts, England. These gentlemen are considered by those best qualified to judge to be the leading shots of the world.

"Among all the shooters who demand public notice by their extraordinary performance, the one who stands out most conspicuously from the rest is D. Mackintosh, whom we have no hesitation in proclaiming the best shot in the world at the present time."

In giving these cuttings from many Press notices Donald Mackintosh received while abroad, the object is to show that the hand of good fellowship is extended to visiting shooters most freely and cordially in Europe.

The Victorian Clay Target Club fired its first shot last week at Bentleigh in a five acre field, near Bentleigh railway station, the property of Mr T. Cormick, who generously placed it at the club's disposal, and the club fittingly made him a life member. This site, facing west with a perfect background of landscape for miles, is ideal for a gun club.

Here in the very shadow of the Old Melbourne Gun Club's grounds, this new club has started just about a half century since the old club fired its first shot. The Melbourne Gun Club sent marksmen abroad and upheld the prestige of the shotgun against the finest shots, until Australia's name is a household word on any shooting ground the world over. My earliest recollections were in the early nineties when many wealthy city men, young squatters, eminent city business men and men of letters met to try conclusions here with the gun. J.L. Purves, the leading of the Bar, the president, made the club one of the most genial for real sport and humour the world over, while the late Sir Rupert Clarke, their patron endowed it with many fine prizes. On two occasions a £1,000 handicap event was held with success, and a massive silver challenge cup stood for years, the envy of all crack shots to have their names inscribed on it.

As I have visited many gun clubs in Europe, it is very natural that I should draw comparisons, and when I see 50 shooters for this inaugural meeting I consider it the finest I have ever seen. Besides the competitors, their families

came along to see them take part, and made the day, what all sport should be, a happy social gathering.

The club is equipped with the very latest automatic trap, which automatically selects the angle flight of every target thrown. The target is similar to an ordinary saucer in shape, being 4 inches in diameter, and being made from a composition of clay and pitch, which breaks readily when stuck with a few pellets.

Most brilliant shooting was shown by the ex-president of Nobel's Clay Target Club, Mr B. Anquetil, Mr H.G. James, president of Nobels and also Donald Corbett, winner of the handsome foundation cup, E. Tricks, G. Vypond, J. White, C. Corbett, Calrossie, and D. Mackintosh.

Councillor C.T. Butters, president of Moorabbin Shire, declared the ground open and D. Mackintosh fired the first shot.

The president (Mr Lew Bertram) presented the prizes, and he and the honorary secretary (Mr G. Townsend) made everybody welcome.

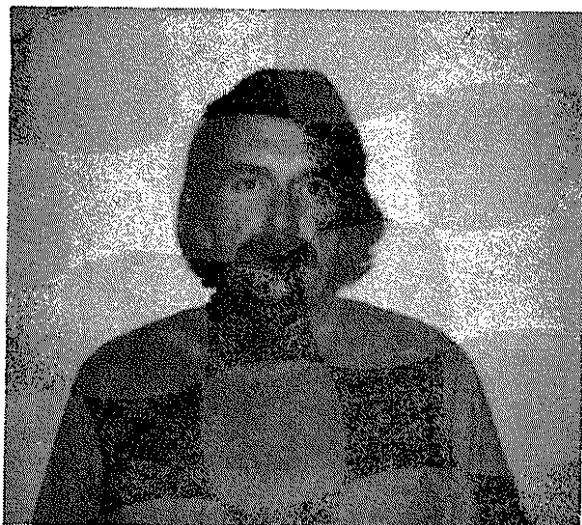
KNOW YOUR EXECUTIVE

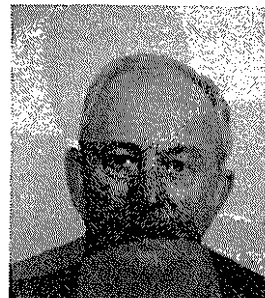

Stuart obviously has a lot to offer and is prepared to be involved. His contribution has been outstanding in his few years in the sport and will be further appreciated in the years ahead.

From Victoria we have Jack Matthey who commenced shooting in 1978 at the Sebastopol Gun Club. Like Stuart, Jack also was quickly into the administration side of our sport having served as committee man at Sebastopol for two years, Noorat for five years, club delegate to the South West Zone and South West Zone delegate to the V.C.T.A.

Once involved at State level, Jack became State Treasurer, a position that he has occupied for three years, appointed to the National Executive Committee in 1986, Jack's home club is Beaufort where he contributes further to sport in his capacity as club secretary.

New South Wales is well served at National level by State President Rob Smith. Rob commenced his shooting in 1968 and in 1969 joined the Committee at Illawarra before moving to Goulburn where he served on the Committee for the years 1974/76 and was elected Vice President 1976/78.

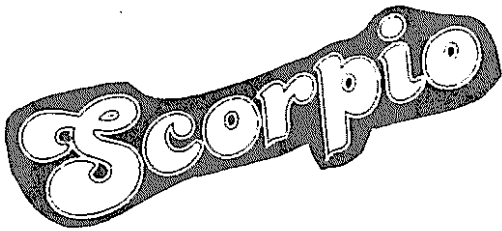
During this time Rob became the inaugural Secretary of the N.S.W.C.T.A. Southern Zone, a position he held until 1978. Returning to the Southern Zone in 1983 as Zone President a position which he still holds. Rob then joined the N.S.W.C.T.A. Executive and in 1984 became Vice President, a position which he held until 1986 when he was elected President to replace the retiring President Len Bird.

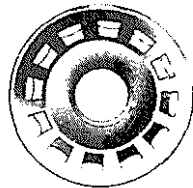

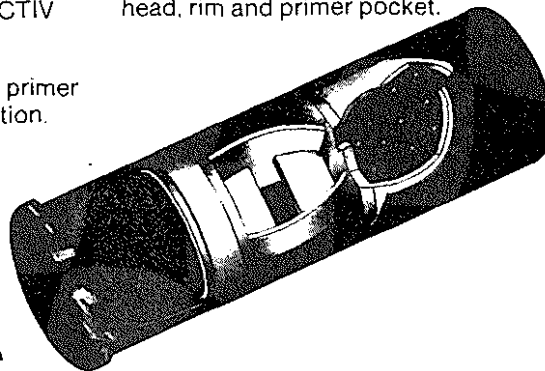

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

THE NATIONAL COACHING COUNCIL

The National Coaching Council of the Clay Target Association met in June. Bill Stevens from Queensland, Col Burt, N.S.W., Robby Elmer, Tasmania, Hillary Baynes, South Australia, Murray Alexander, W.A. and Greg Chan of the Northern Territory are all Coaching Council members, being the State Directors of Coaching in their own States. Sadly, Harry Brooksby of Victoria has resigned due to work pressure. Harry was missed from the meeting and as yet Victoria has not appointed another State Director.

The Council meeting permits an exchange of ideas between its members and that exchange gives motivation and direction. I would publicly like to thank Council members for their support, for the intelligent informed debate, but mostly for the work they put in in their States on behalf of the clay shooters.

One particular problem was voiced at the meeting, and I would like readers to consider the matter and voice their opinions. The problem is the large number of novice shooters who pass through our sport, but do not go on to become A.C.T.A. members, or if they do, only stay for a short period. Juniors and novices are coached, but there seems to be a break down when the new shooter goes back to the Clubs for the first few times.

We at the meeting felt this was a problem that the sport will have to face as a whole. A first step would be for clubs to get behind their Club Coach and make provision on shoot days for the Coach to assist beginners. It would be ideal if all Coaches held at least ex-officio places on the Executives of their Clubs, then they could help plan on shoot days when easy targets can be thrown for the novices and back up coaching can occur. So often novices are expected to compete on the same basis with the experienced shooter, with the result that the beginner is made to feel foolish and inadequate.

Novices must be made to feel welcome and be helped to break targets. It was suggested at the meeting that an assistant Coach be appointed to spread the load and to be present if the Coach is not available on shoot days. Hospitality and real pleasure at the presence of a newcomer is something that all club members can offer and feel, a warm friendly atmosphere is created by the members not only the Executive and Coach.

Greg Chan of Darwin told the meeting of the success of bringing a friend days in Darwin. Each member asks a friend to partner them on these bring a friend days, the scores of the friend and the member are combined and a trophy given to both. The friends are often brought out a few weeks prior to the shoot and the Coach helps them to learn how to break targets. The Club members look after their friends and a great time is had by all, the new shooters are introduced to our sport in such a way that it is a good experience, enjoyable and rewarding.

As mentioned before, if you have any good ideas on attracting and keeping new and novice members, or your club already does have good ideas please write to us, my address is in the front of the book, and I will pass them on. It is, after all, to the benefit of all clubs to attract and keep members, it must be remembered that when a person is taking up a new sport they feel inferior and nervous but are looking for the pleasure of performing a skill successfully and a friendly, sportsman like atmosphere.

LEVEL 3

The State Directors are all part way through their Level

3 Courses. Each Director will, as part of their course, attend the Institute of Sport in Canberra for a camp as well as attend an International Competition. All the new skills and knowledge that our State Directors gain will be passed on to the other Coaches in their States. Much of what the State Directors do is at their own financial cost, but they believe that it is so important that our sport have a high Coaching Scheme that they are prepared to make such sacrifices. During the period that the scheme has been operating all Directors report a rise in the standards of shooting at all levels.

WORLD CUP KOREA

Several of our I.S.U. shooters are going to Korea to shoot in the World Cup. They have a dual purpose.

- 1) to gain a quota place for Australia in the Olympic Games by winning the World Cup; and
- 2) for some of them to attain a qualifying score so they can be eligible to shoot for a place in the Olympic Team, when we gain quota places.

Russell Mark, John Maxwell, Jim Ellis, Ian Hale, John Summers, Craig Meuleman, Brian Thomson, Alex Crikis and juniors Michael Diamond and Brett Dunstan are all, with the exception of a small grant to some of the shooters from the Australian Olympic Federation, are going at their own expense. As most of the shooters have and do shoot world ranking scores, their talent and courage, I believe, will see them do well. As usual at these events they will be proud representatives of their sport and Australia.

HOLIDAYS

I have had two weeks holiday since writing the last article. I spent it with long time clay shooter from the Yorke Peninsula Bob Edwards, by the Coopers Creek and the Coongee Lakes in the far north east of S.A. It is a wonderful place to camp. The fishing is good, callop that tasted like barramundi and rabbits for rabbit stew. A four wheel drive is necessary, but the bird life, the beauty of the place and the isolation are worth the trip to get there.

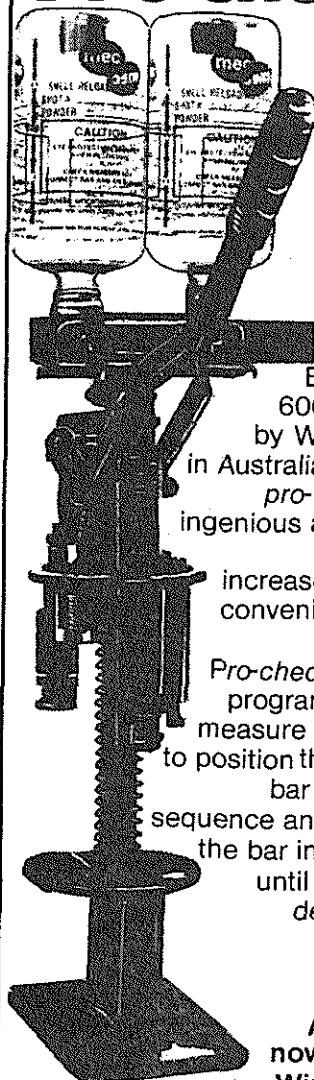

PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

IN THE INTERESTS OF ALL REGISTERED SHOOTERS

The Public Liability Policy that has been arranged for the A.C.T.A. by Carlingford Australia is designed to provide specific protection for the Association and its registered members.

The A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy protects the Association and its members from being sued for alleged negligence/blame attaching to an incident causing property damage or bodily injury.

If a shooter is injured in any way during the course of a sanctioned event where no blame can be attached to the A.C.T.A. and its members any claim that may have been made would not be recognised under the policy conditions as it would then be classified as a personal claim covered by an insurance that the shooter may have in force on a personal basis.

Protection is afforded to the following who, subject to certain conditions, are considered to be members of the A.C.T.A.

1. A.C.T.A.
2. State Associations
3. Registered Clubs
4. Registered Shooters
5. Voluntary Workers
6. Club Visitors (participants)
7. Club Visitors (observers)

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

1. A.C.T.A. — Payment of the prescribed premium to the Insurer by the due date, January 1, annually.
2. STATE ASSOCIATIONS — Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
3. REGISTERED CLUBS — (A) Subject to payment of the prescribed affiliation fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
(B) Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Association (respective) who are operating under the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
4. REGISTERED SHOOTERS — (A) Subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
(B) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and A.C.T.A.
5. VOLUNTARY WORKERS — (A) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.
(B) Provided always that such voluntary workers are registered as members of the Australian Clay Target Association on the master register maintained by the Australian Clay Target Associations with a description of their duties.
Additions to or deletion from this master list are to be notified to the A.C.T.A. office as they are known.
NOTE: Voluntary workers to be registered with the A.C.T.A. are to be restricted to those persons likely to assist on a voluntary basis only.
Paid personnel such as trappers, trap mechanics or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the workers compensation act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority.
- 6/7. CLUB VISITORS — (Participants or Observers)
(A) Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.

(B) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered A.C.T.A. shooters.

(C) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulations of the respective club, State Association and A.C.T.A.

NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc. who are not registered shooters with the A.C.T.A. must first of all have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly.
Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possibly arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.

8. Clubs who have life members or similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to either the Club or the A.C.T.A. by reason of their inactivity in the sport at Club and/or A.C.T.A. level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered Shooters".
9. Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shooters.
10. Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to safety etc. have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines such as a combination of Clay Target and field and game.

Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master A.C.T.A. Policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation, therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the A.C.T.A. master policy unless cover in excess of \$2,000,000 is required.

Paid employees must at all times be protected under the workers' compensation act.

Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Club or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is eliminated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$2,000,000.

Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person, must at all times sign the visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.

All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body.

NOTE: Club shooters, not registered with the A.C.T.A., are not covered under any circumstances other than operating as a voluntary worker at an organised event. This category of shooter-member is solely a club responsibility and insurance cover should be considered at all times as a club expense.

FOR INFORMATION: Further extensions included within the policy are: Member to member; Food and Drink; Care, custody and control; Medical and welfare facilities; Tenants' liability; Hoists, cranes and unregistered vehicles; Car parking; Cross liabilities.

Jan Ovens won herself a trophy in C grade with her 20/20 with Bob Rundell (Myamyn) 19/20 in second place.

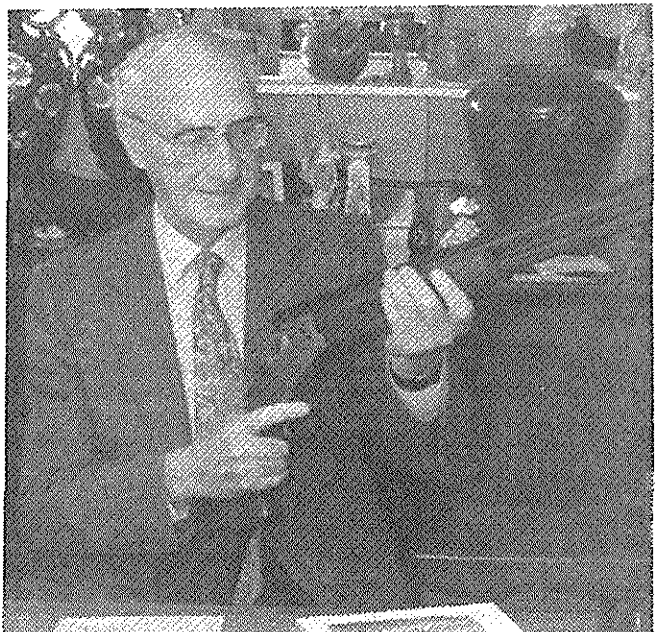
In the group for unregistered shooters Greg Holt shot 18/20 and E. Dell 13/20.
