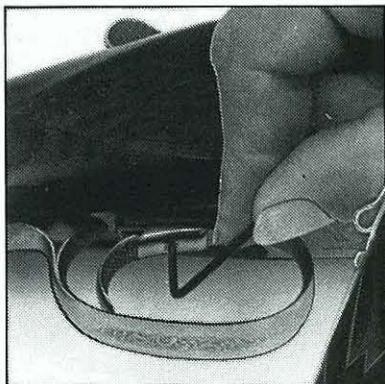

Fortunately we do have some capable people at the office who, in my absence, kept in touch and between us all we managed to overcome the problem that we had encountered.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT THERE ARE NO CHANGES TO EITHER OUR MAILING ADDRESS OR TELEPHONE NUMBER.

We have taken out a six month lease with an option to renew for a further 12 month period. What will now happen is that during the period of our occupancy, we will continue the search for suitable premises to house the Association on a permanent basis.

Amidst all of the drama that took place was the good news that ACT Olympic Trap Shooter, Jim Ellis, had won for Australia our first Olympic quota position. At the time of writing I am not able to advise on any further details nor any news on the I.S.U. Skeet Team, we'll continue to keep our fingers crossed for them.

With regard to the many meetings that have just taken place, once again time does not allow for a report to be made, this will however be attended to in detail for the next issue, which will also contain the details of some rule changes that have been made.

The changes which are probably more cosmetic than anything will come into effect as from January 1, 1988. In the meantime, your State Association, through their National Executive Committee members will be able to advise the changes that have occurred.

One more important thing to note is that once the changes have been published, effective January 1, 1988, there will be no further changes for the next five years.

The Executive meeting just concluded, also farewelled Queensland member Eddie Ransom, whose term of appointment on the National Committee had expired. Ed, on behalf of all shooters, thank you for your contribution to the sport of Clay Target shooting.

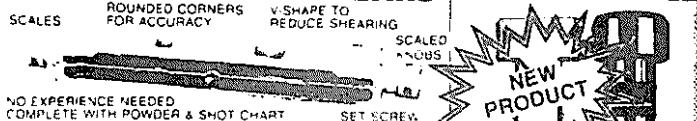
HANDICAP SHOOTING

**FROM THE DESK OF THE
NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR,
PETER QUIRE**

ROTHMANS NATIONAL SPORTS FOUNDATION

The Rothmans Foundation made it possible this year for the Australian Clay Target Association Coaching Scheme to hold a most successful weekend seminar for advanced coaches in Adelaide.

The Seminar made it possible for those present to exchange ideas, and canvass new ones in many topics, some of which have been discussed in this column previously, junior competition, Olympic discipline coaching and competition, and general administration of the National Coaching scheme by the State Directors present. The extent and worth of the new ideas for the health of our sport was outstanding.

The speakers invited to the seminar were interesting and informative, Jane Roberts B.Sc Dip. of Nutrition and Dietetics, and consultant Dietitian, Fitness Centre, Sports Institute and the Institute for Fitness Research and Training, gave an extensive lecture on nutrition for sports-people, nutrition for life, and diet for competition, this was slanted at our sport, with the need for general fitness and the needs of the body during protracted competition. All of those present went away determined to cut back on fat, in all its forms and increase their intake of fruit, vegetables and grains.

Graham Winter, B.A. P.G. Dip. Applied Psych, Dip. Hypnotherapy, and a registered Psychologist. Graham works with the Sports Institute in a wide variety of sports, and accompanied the small bore team to the World Championships in East Germany this year. Graham's topic was mental rehearsal, which is very relevant to our sport. He emphasised the need to practise mental rehearsal, to treat mental rehearsal as an exercise, just as we practise the skill of clay shooting, so we must practise the skill of mental rehearsal. Coaches were encouraged to teach their students to think clearly and specifically about the important aspects of their performance, and make the mental rehearsal as realistic as possible. This increases the effectiveness of the mental rehearsal and enables the shooter to focus all their energy much more specifically on to their performance. Coaches were warned that no two people will experience mental rehearsal in the same way, but the more it is practised the easier it becomes.

This segment of the seminar was followed by participants practising mental rehearsal themselves and discussing problems that they had.

Each State Coaching Director addressed the meeting and told of the progress of coaching in their states and of the performances and training of their respective State Squads. I also spoke on the importance of encouraging new shooters to make use of the coaching facility provided under the accreditation scheme, the importance of a friendly welcoming attitude and of the new shooters feeling satisfaction with their initial efforts.

John Halbert M.A., B.A., Dip. P.E., Dip. T. Champion Australian Rules footballer and coach, and cricket player, Sports Science Researcher, S.A. College of Advanced Education.

John gave a lively talk on the art of goal setting. Major points made by John were that goals should be:

- 1) Performance not outcome goals;
- 2) Specific and measurable not vague and subjective;
- 3) Short term not long term;
- 4) Realistic and challenging not unrealistic or easy;
- 5) Agreed to by all concerned parties not individualistic;
- 6) Publicly declared not private or secretive;
- 7) Adjustable not fixed.

John Halbert's many years at all levels of sport, participant, coach, administrator, and researcher, came through in his presentation and knowledge. Question time proved just as informative.

The Rothmans seminar closed on Sunday night proving to be both enjoyable and informative to all who participated.

Many thanks must go to the Rothmans Foundation for funding the weekend. Knowledge is like ripples on water it spreads, in this case from those who attended the seminar to all States and all coaches and finally to the most important people of all, the clay target shooters. The Australian Clay Target Association now has 1 Level 3 Coach, with six others nearly through their course, 47 Level 2 Coaches with many part way through Level 2, and 260 Level 1 Coaches. During the year 14,700 people were coached by the accredited coaches.

CLAY TARGET DROP OUTS. Many thanks to all those readers who have written to me on the problems of keeping new shooters within the sport. I am indeed heartened by the concern that is obviously widespread. I would especially like to thank John Farrow of Burleigh Heads for his letter and thought on the subject. John points to an excellent article in the Clay News published in October 1985 which was the result of a good deal of research on the subject. If you have a copy, look it up. If possible I will suggest that it be reprinted.

STOP PRESS: Jim Ellis has secured for Australia a quota place at the Seoul Olympics. Jim shot 189 in the World Cup being shot at Seoul. Well done Jim, we are on our way.

Saturday's weather was ideal for shooting but this did not reflect in the scores — no perfect scores were recorded and the shoot-offs were short.

Saturday's prizes were — 1st in each grade: Side by Side Shotgun, \$500; 2nd in each grade: .22 Repeater Rifle and 1000 rounds of Ammo, \$200; 3rd in each grade: Case of Scorpio Trap Loads, \$110.

The end of the day's competition saw 14-year-old Michael Diamond come from third place in the Grand Slam ratings to first place with a four-point lead. In equal second place were S. Atkins of Echuca, R. Hammond of Guyra and D. Ellis of Guyra, all on 195-200. Equal third place were A. Turner of Dubbo and John Maxwell of Illawarra on 194-200.

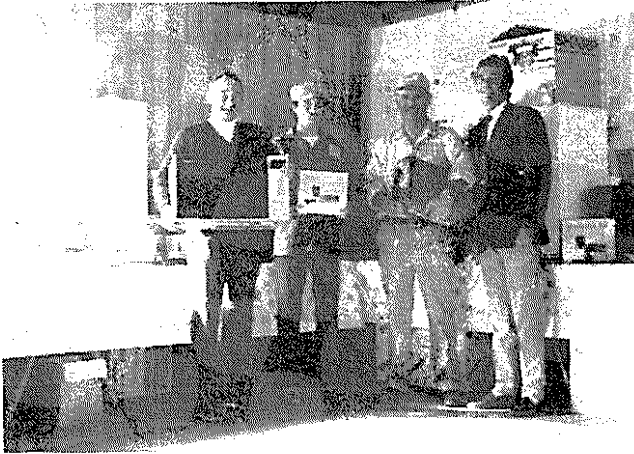

A disastrous last round (1 target & 2 second barrels, including a second barrel on the last target) saw Michael Diamond lose his grip on the car. A true measure of Michael's ability, he settled into the shoot-off and took out second place, a Beretta 682 Trap Gun valued at \$2000. Third place, a Miroku 4800 Grade 2 valued at \$1600, went to Steve Atkins when he pulled a second on the 16th target. This made it three guns in one weekend for Steve. Surely this must be a record.

A three-way shoot-off for fourth place between Ray Hammond, Doug Ellis and John Maxwell saw John shoot 24 first barrels to take home the radar detector valued at \$500.

This brought to a close two great weekends of competition. Those present had nothing but praise for the prizes on offer.

The three organising clubs and especially the major sponsors were bitterly disappointed by the lack of support from shooters. Nevertheless the sponsors have indicated their support again next year. BOYS ARE ON TARGET FOR CLEAN SWEEP OF VENEZUELAN TITLES

There are world class juniors in Australia who could hold their own against world class seniors in open competition, but few people know about them. There is an Olympic sport in which Australia has gained medals, but few people get to hear much about it. Soon, the first junior Olympic Trench Shooting Team — comprising Michael Diamond, 15, from Sydney, Brett Dunstan, 17, from Kerang in Victoria, and Canberra's own champion shooter, Filippo Petriella, 18 — ever to leave these shores, will go to compete in the World Cup in Korea, and later the World Championship in Venezuela.

The fascinating thing about these boys is that they rarely miss what they are shooting at. Most people are familiar with the sport of clay target shooting. There are several variations on the theme. Olympic skeet is the second most difficult, and entails holding the gun with the butt on the hip and shooting one target flying left to right, one flying right to left, and two flying at the same time from each side. One also moves to different positions from left to right, and finally right beneath the path of the targets to shoot. Olympic trench is the fastest, and most difficult, competition. It involves shooting a target which may fly away from the shooter straight ahead, diagonally left, or diagonally right, often at varying height, at random, and at speed.

The team was practising last week at the Majura shotgun range as part of their preparation for the World Cup, and attending courses at the Australian Institute of Sport, where the sport psychology unit was advising them.

"Psychology is the name of the game — the one that can control his head is the one that will win," said the national

coach, Peter Quire. "If you have the skills and you let little things interfere with you, well, your performance drops off."

A measure of the importance the national body places on the psychological aspect is that it has used the same psychologist since 1982. The boys have learnt processes of relaxation, concentration, fitness, to know about their bodies — what stages they are at and how it can affect their performance — diet, and so on. Concentration is the crucial factor, as they may be asked to shoot for six hours a day over three days, a long time in anyone's book.

Quire is enthusiastic about the team's overseas chances, and believes in the value of competition in other countries, against their shooters. "You can't beat it, that's the best thing there is," he said.

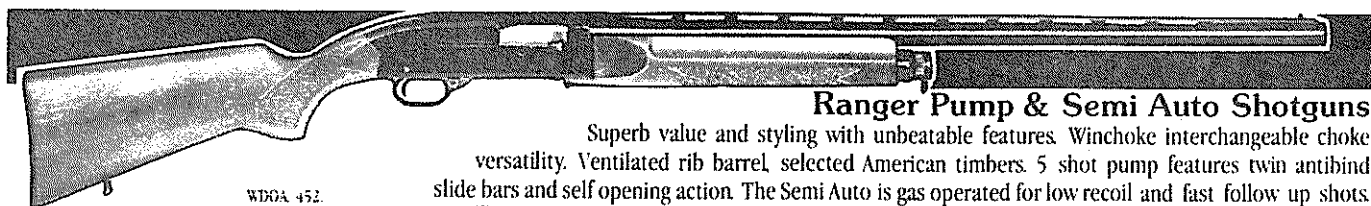
Other countries, in particular the USSR and the USA, train their shooters in the army. In this way they get training all day, five or six days a week. In Italy, a national search was made for the area which most resembled the place where the last Olympic competition in the US was held, and the Italians won what they planned for. With this sort of professionalism to compete against, it is an outstanding accomplishment that Australian shooters do so well.

Petriella has vindicated the confidence placed in him by making the national training squad last year at a time when there was no junior world championships. Now that there is, he has been chosen again, and will compete overseas for the first time. If he has any problems it will not be due to lack of confidence or talent. "We've never competed as a team yet, never shot together," he said. "My main achievements this year — I made the team again, shot way high scores. I've brought my standard up from last year when I shot a 190 (out of 200) . . . and this year I've done a 194, and two 192s. This year I'm shooting heaps better and getting much more consistent."

Petriella had things to say about the value of the AIS. "AIS is really good," he said. "They teach you things that people outside of sporting fields can't teach you. You go to a psychologist who is not in sport, he can tell you some things, but he can't relate them to sport. This morning we had a session with the psychologist with Pat Cash when he was at Wimbledon. He told us exactly what he did there and tried to relate it to what we were going to do. Told us to take it target by target like Pat did ball by ball. They take us up on technical things we can't see with our eyes, show us graphs, things like that which you can't see with the human eye and it helps us heaps."

All the boys find the idea of international competition exciting and are looking forward to mixing it with the world's best as a way of boosting their confidence. Petriella first picked up a gun when he was six. "Dad (was shooting) then my brother started," he said. "He started but gave it up because it got too expensive and then I took it up . . . and got hooked. At the moment we practise two or three times a week. We might increase that just before we go so we don't peak too early, because if you get there on the downward run you shoot some terrible scores."

Diamond and Dunstan started shooting when they were nine and 11. Neither believes there is anything to gain by starting later in life. "The younger you are the better it is

because the more competition you're in, the more practice, the more experience you get," said Diamond.

The team uses Beretta shotguns for a range of reasons, including weight, feel, and balance. This is not cheap. A standard shotgun costs \$2000 to \$3000, and the better ones up to \$40,000. The costs of travel and ammunition also mount up alarmingly. At a time when political and media opinion has come out indiscriminately against firearms, the trap-shooters — many of whom have never shot anything but clay targets, and who not only provide a valuable service in teaching many hundreds of children gun safety, but also have an outstanding safety record with only one accident in the past 64 years — find sponsorship very difficult to gain. It would be a pity if this affects their performance, because our champion junior shooters are among the most dedicated and successful competitors Australia has produced.

FAR WEST GUN CLUB HOLD 2 DAY SHOOT

The Far West Gun Club conducted its two day "Kym Parker Memorial Shoot" during the weekend of September 12 and 13 in conditions which could only be described as perfect for Clay Shooting.

The Committee had hoped that with trophies to the value of \$1445 to be won, plus the excellent local and state-wide publicity given the event, that attendance would be higher than in previous years.

However, competition from clubs nearer the population areas, plus the distance involved in travelling to Ceduna meant only 17 shooters contested the events. Consideration will be given to re-scheduling this fixture next year to avoid inter-club clashes if possible.

The Western Zone had itself represented by shooters from Port Lincoln, Ungarra, Whyalla and Port Augusta and what was lacking in numbers was compensated for in quality.

The first event on Saturday the 12th was a 50 target ball trap contest and where targets flew high, wide and from some shooters' point of view, not so handsome. When the dust and frustrations had settled we had the following results. First in B Grade, Toni Woods, scoring 36/50 with T. Stratford weighing in for second on 33/50. The C Grade section was won by A. Suter who was also top gun in the event with a creditable 42/50 followed by T. Heard who carded 47/60 after a shoot off with K. Firth and B. Silby. There were no A Grade competitors in attendance.

Second event for the day — a 50 Target Double Barrel Handicap event saw the first two places filled by a formidable father and son combination from Whyalla, Bill and Malcolm Fisher, who each returned a perfect 50/50 with handicap.

Local shooter, Alan Suter, who was giving his gun its annual rust removing workout, took third place with 49/50.

Sunday dawned bright and clear (much clearer than the eyes of some who had attended the Social Night at Suters Highway One the night before), and all shooters were on hand to do battle for the 10 Target eye-opener. The prize for this event was a magnificent Webber Kettle.

After a delay of 10 minutes from the schedule starting time, shooting was under way. (The delay was caused when the Club President attempted to cut into the Shoot Marshal's morning teabreak. This nonsense was quickly short circuited by the Marshal and he would like to remind the President that in the Old West, Marshal's have been known to shoot men for less — it could happen in the Far West.) It is hoped that ACTA, in conjunction with ACTU, will shortly draw up a list of conditions, lurks and perks for Shoot Marshals including long service leave after a 2 day shoot.

However, when the shooting was done, the Webber was on its way to Port Lincoln under the ownership of Joy Curtis who scored a perfect 36/36 against a disappointed Malcolm Fisher who could only manage 33/36. The Far West Gun Club regrets the colour of the Webber Joy, but have reason to believe that black is sometimes a more natural colour for outdoor cooks than red.

The 100 Target event was shot in two sections of 50 targets. This saw Malcolm Fisher victorious in A Grade with a perfect 50/50 and as this was the first time he had shot 50 targets without loss, he was awarded his 50 break badge to commemorate the occasion. Port Lincoln shooter G. Docking won the second spot in A Grade with 48/50. The B Grade honours were shared by local shooters T. Heard on 49/50 and J. Innes on 48/51. John had to shoot off with P. Beale to take the money. Likewise the C Grade saw local shooters, J. Heard and B. Silby on the prize list, Janet showing 38/50 and Brad 43/50. Isn't it marvellous what a new bra can do for a girl, Janet?

After a pleasant luncheon adjournment, it was back to the traps for the final 50 targets. The senior grade was once again dominated by Malcolm Fisher and Graham Docking even though Malcolm could only manage 49/50, with Doc also dropping an additional target thereby scoring 47/50. That 100 break was mighty close Malcolm.

It was now K. Firth's turn to follow the Fisher lead in the first 50 targets and score his first 50/50. A good performance Kym, especially with Alan Suter breathing down your neck all the way. Alan had by this time gotten all the rust out of his gun and scored 49/50. A couple of likely candidates for A Grade.

Brad Silby came back for a second cut at C Grade having improved to 44/50 and leaving Barry Pobke runner up on 36/50. Early in the piece Brad and Barry were neck and neck and had the shoot Marshal wondering if they were to tie, would they 'shoot off' or 'weigh off'.

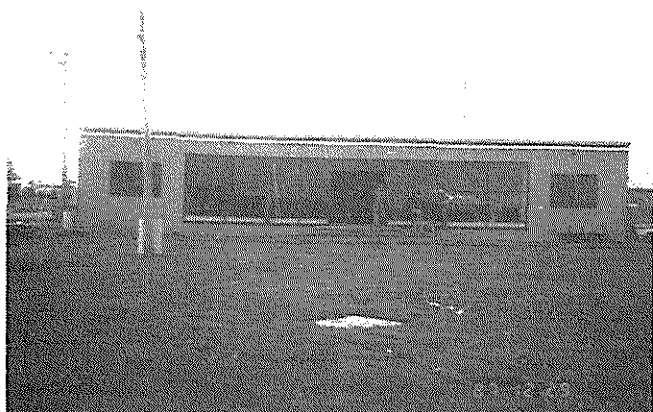

THE PASSING OF AN ERA — BUTE (S.A.) GUN CLUB

To many clay target shooters, the call of PULL!! is the signal for the referee to push a button which releases the target from a trap powered by electricity. Older shooters will remember (some fondly) that prior to such modern innovations, the call of PULL!! was a signal not to the referee but to a strong individual with excellent powers of hearing and/or sight to pull a vertical bar set at the end of the middle lane, thus mechanically releasing the target. The 'puller' then had to push forward on the bar to reload the trap. (Hard work during long shootoffs.)

Such a shoot was held for the last time at the Bute Gun Club on September 12, 1987, the first having been held on July 25, 1954. A secondhand White Flyer has been purchased and will be installed in time to be used for the first 1988 shoot in March. A good turn up of 29 shooters wished the old Snipe trap goodbye and afterwards enjoyed a barbecue tea.

Most of the State's finest shooters have at some time shot at Bute, which is situated approximately 150 kilometres north of Adelaide, and many have come to grief. Some, such as the present long term (21 years) President, Eric Commons (the "Gentleman from Bute" now retired

and living in Kadina) thought they could 'read' the trap as it moved around, but occasionally it would slip a cog and embarrassed shooters would find their gun pointing in one direction while the target went another. There were very few slow pulls given with this machine as shooters (used to the almost instantaneous appearance of the target) found their gun wildly moving around looking for the target. To add to the fun, a few well placed Mallee trees fooled many shooters as the clay disappeared into them. Loud calls were the order of the day, particularly when a strong wind was blowing from the 'puller' to the shooter.

For the record, the shoot commenced with a 5 target eye-opener after which the T.J. Burke Memorial 20 Target Handicap was contested (in memory of the club's founder), with the winner having his name engraved on a large cup. Local shooter, Trevor Bowman, (20/21) was successful after a shootoff with Kevin Hobbs of Noarlunga G.C. (19/21) with P. O'Sullivan (18/20) coming third. The Birthday Double Barrel Championship was eventually won by Peter Marcionni of International G.C. with a fine score of 53/53 defeating Terry Kenyon of SAGC 52/53. Joe Laxton took B Grade with 24/26 from Fred Atkinson 23/26, while R. Fleming was successful in C Grade (23/25) with C. Burnley taking second (21/25). Kevin Hobbs took out the High Gun with 46/50.

Some clubs still have the old 'pull' lever system as a backup, but conversations with many well travelled shooters believe BUTE to be the last club in Australia (or the world) to have operated such a well liked dinosaur as their main means of releasing targets. Any challengers?
