FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF SPORT, CANBERRA

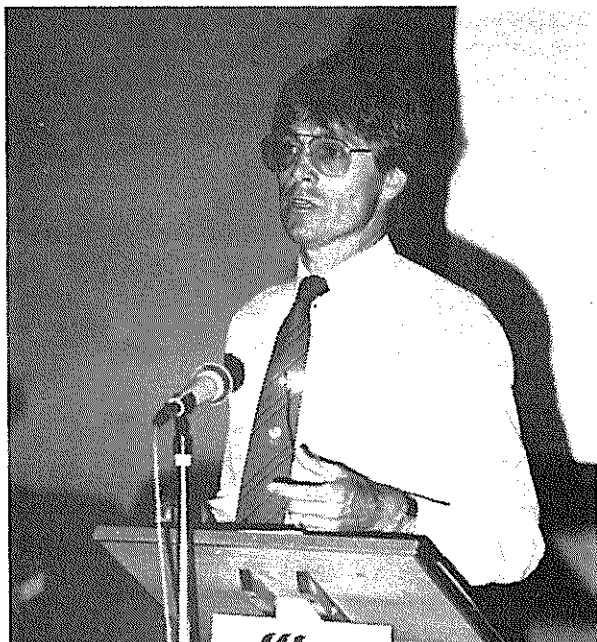
This month I would like to talk about the visit to the Institute of Sport by the National Squad, the State Coaching Directors and myself, and tell you something about the Institute itself.

The training camp at the Institute was held in September this year and the camp provided the opportunity not only for the squad to train, use the facilities of the Institute and utilise the expertise of the Institute experts but also for the State Coaching Directors to complete a further segment of their Level 3 Courses.

For sports such as clay target shooting that do not have the resources and facilities of the high profile sports, the Institute provides an excellent venue to hold training camps. The live-in accommodation and facilities give us a rare chance to be together as a team, and for me to assist, where assistance is needed, in the preparation and training of the shooters.

Don Wright once again organised our visit to the Institute. Don has become an old friend, and everyone appreciates his work and efficient co-ordination. This year Jim Ellis, John Maxwell, Cliff Bailey, Russell Mark, Robby Thompson, John Summers, Craig Meuleman, Michael Inguanti, Ben Dudenas, Michael Diamond, Filippo Petriella, Brett Dunstan, Col Burt, Murray Alexander, Hillary Baynes, Bill Stevens, Robby Smith and myself attended the camp. The Institute funds the camp, the transport and accommodation and meals for the team. The Coaches either paid for themselves or had funds provided by their State Associations or their State Governments.

We were met at the airport by Don Wright and the Institute bus and were transported to the Institute to settle in. The rooms hold four with double bunk beds, and as would be expected the meals are nutritious and the food is varied and plentiful.

Jeff Bond the eminent psychologist gave the opening session. He spoke about competition and the importance of only concentrating on those things that you can control. He touched on relaxation and how to monitor your body for arousal, and told the shooters of a quick relaxation technique. I was most interested in his talk on developing the ability to monitor cues that tell if you are becoming tense or over-aroused. Jeff reinforced our own coaching beliefs that it is most important to break up the competition into separate competitions of one target. If you hit that one target be pleased with yourself and go on to the next; if you miss, note what you did wrong and then go on to the next target, just as if it were a new competition.

Stev Haynes then told us all about drugs and sport, and the different effect that different drugs have on the body. He ran through all of the banned drugs, and spoke of the importance of seeing a medical doctor before you take anything prior to international competition. Even very simple things like cough drops, aspirin and coffee and of course alcohol can have an effect. Some brands of eye-drops will even cause a positive reaction to the very sensitive tests now carried out. At the World Championships for moving targets, and the forthcoming Oceanic Games, when our shooters win, they will be urine-tested for the presence of drugs. We have also agreed to allow the testing of our athletes when next we go to the Institute.

Biomechanical filming was done, at the grounds of the A.C.T. Gun Club. Incidentally, many, many thanks to the Club for the use of their facilities. The filming involved the shooters stripping to the waist and being filmed by two cameras from different angles. The films were sent to be developed and we viewed them on the Friday. This method very clearly shows the muscle groupings used in clay target shooting. In trench mainly the back muscles with just a small amount of leg muscle is used, whereas in skeet the back muscles are used with a lot more leg and arm muscle. It was found that the shoulder and arm muscles were mainly just bunched to absorb the recoil.

This filming is a wonderful coaching aid; it pinpoints each movement with great clarity, much better than video, but also much more expensive. A technology which we can only use at the Institute.

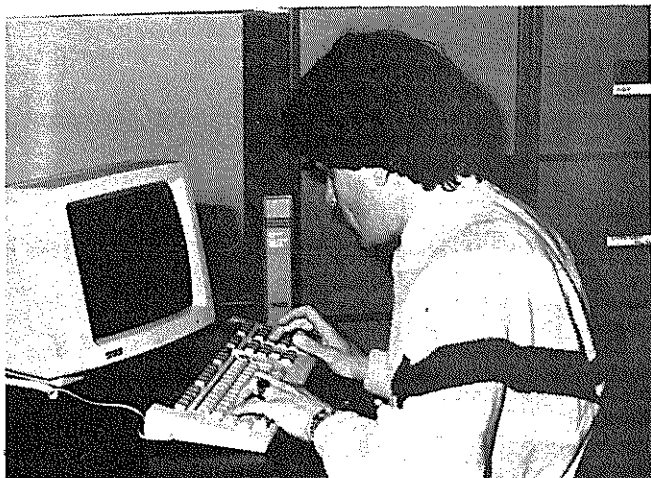
Dick Telford spoke on diet and preparation for competition. He explained in detail how the body reacts to a good diet, and how some foods slow the reactions of the body. Fat is a culprit, but grain foods, vegetables, and a little meat seems to be the best. We should eat little but often during the day of competition, but no food for at least half an hour before competition.

Jeff Bond conducted a profile test of the squad members and the coaches. These tests highlight areas such as emotions, attitudes and personality, so that change can be made to improve competitive performance. A confident, positive attitude is what we should be aiming at.

In between all of these lectures the squad trained at the range, using heart rate monitors. I am pleased to report that the national squad members all have hearts, and that this was an interesting experiment, because it was easy to see by the graphs when a shooter was tense. The shooters soon learned to not only monitor their heart rates, but to bring those rates down when their monitors were high. Physical exercise seemed to improve the shooters' ability to perform. Their scores were slightly better after a short jog. The lesson from this was that it is beneficial to have some form of gentle exercise before shooting.

So many shooters use the excuse "It was because I had to hurry" when they miss a target. It is not the hurrying that does the damage — it's the worrying about the hurrying that does it.

A short lecture was given on injury prevention, mainly in relation to the spine. A series of exercises were done to keep the spine supple, and considering the amount clay shooters use their backs in their sport the spine is of great importance to a shooter.

Mr Leon Evans, an optician, came to the Institute with 10 other opticians to test the team's eyes, and their reflexes, their focus while jumping up and down on a trampoline, eye focus on a ball on a long string, and speed of focus. Mr Evans and his colleagues are to be thanked — they went to Canberra at their own expense to do the testing. It was greatly appreciated by the team.

The last session with Jeff Bond was on goal setting, and being professional in their approach to their sport. Written records should be kept of their performances. These should include practice as well as competition. A little good practice is better than a lot of half-hearted practice. Good practice is practice that is treated in the same way as competition is treated.

The whole team wishes to express its thanks to Mr and Mrs Petriella, who provided the whole team with lunch each day. Mr Petriella also helped to run the trench layout.

I want to thank the other coaches who came. They all assisted and contributed in a positive way, lightening my load and making the camp more successful for all.

Thanks from all who were at the Institute, and from the Australian Clay Target Association go to the Staff of the Institute. They could not have been more helpful or efficient. The camp provides us with sports science and medicine that we could not have access to in any other way. It also provides an opportunity for the national squad to get together and to compete against each other.

Since the camp, some team members have been to Korea, where Jim Ellis obtained a quota place for Australia at the Olympics, and on the 26th of this month the skeet team, the trench team, and our junior team will be going with me to Venezuela, to represent the Clay Target Association and Australia.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GUN FIT AND PROPER KNOW HOW OF GUN HANDLING

My shooting career, covering some 40 years or so of shooting the shotgun and teaching the skills of shooting, I still don't cease to be amazed by the number of new shooters that come into our sport of Clay Target shooting who do not always get a proper instruction of the fundamentals of shooting trap or skeet targets. This is a great pity really because it is at this stage where the beginner should be given special attention before he or she develops bad incorrect habits. These habits become very hard to break at a later date.

The lady shooter also requires special help as does the junior shooter with selection and proper handling of the gun. One of the biggest problems we have when instructing the junior shooter is finding a suitable gun with the correct stock specifications. This also applies to most lady shooters due to their physical characteristics. They, like the junior shooter, mostly have a lighter frame and cannot handle the larger stocked and heavier gun that is made for Mr Average man and so modifications must be made to suit the person concerned, otherwise poor shooting and a lot of bruising and discomfort will result. This can frighten the new shooter off the sport. I frequently see Dad teaching the boy to shoot using Dad's gun. Not only is the boy unable to control the gun, but he is being punished by the recoil to a point where he says — I've had enough Dad.

Many shooters have never learned the correct way of placing the gun to shoulder and the face on the stock. Not only will this poor gun handling result in poor shooting, but it will also cause a bruised cheek and a sore shoulder, plus many lost targets simply because eye and gun are not accurately aligned. This is a problem I frequently encounter during instruction classes with beginners. Most new shooters, and quite often older shooters, in their keenness to see the target more clearly, will subconsciously lift their face off the comb. This action takes the shooting eye completely away from alignment of gun barrel to target. Accurate pointing is then impossible. Mostly this problem is caused when the gun stock has too much prop at the comb. In this case the shooter's eye is more or less floating above the gun rib preventing him from keeping his cheek firmly down on the comb where it should be during the process of tracking the target.

Briefly summing up, it can be seen that unless your gun fits you properly and you learn to handle it correctly, the chances of you becoming a good shot are not at all good. So never listen to anyone who tells you that gun fitting is unimportant — nothing is further from the truth.

The simple facts are that no matter how much other technical and psychological knowledge you may acquire, you will never become a first class shooter unless you learn the basics and apply them every time you fire a shot. The most important basic is the gun and how to handle it.

Five main points of correct stock fit:

- A. Drop at comb;
- B. Drop at heel;
- C. Length of pull;
- D. Angle of pitch;
- E. Shape of comb.

Problems connected with poorly fitting stock:

- A. Loose cheek position on comb;
- B. Loss of gun control;
- C. Greater recoil effect;
- D. Low shooting;

- E. Loss of accurate pointing;
- F. Bruised cheek and shoulder;
- G. Shooting behind target.

If you are one of those shooters who frequently misses the straight away target, check your gun stock for drop at comb measurement. Chances are it's too low.

If you have a problem with your gun bumping and bruising your cheek, chances are you are not mounting and cheeking it correctly. Actually, no gun should cause discomfort to the shooter, provided the stock fits the person and is correctly mounted to shoulder and face.

Incorrect pitch setting can cause great discomfort and bruising to the shooter's shoulder — especially lady shooters. Pitch is the angle of butt or recoil pad to the barrel rib. If the toe of the butt is digging into your shoulder excessively, then the pitch down angle should be increased.

The shot pattern is controlled by the degree of choke built into the gun barrel — it is a construction of the tube at a point approximately 2in back from the muzzle and is built in by the barrel maker. Density of the shot pattern will naturally vary depending on shot size. However, contrary to what a lot of shooters imagine, the area of pattern does not increase or decrease by varying the shot size — it is the choke that controls pattern area. As an example, a cartridge of no. 9 shot will have an average of 650 pellets as against 385 of no. 7 but the pattern area will be roughly the same if fired from the same gun.

It's a good idea to fit a recoil pad to any shotgun, be it used for trap shooting or field shooting, or any other type of shooting. I've heard shooters say they cannot mount their gun properly when a pad is fitted. If this is the case, the gun they are using does not fit, it is most likely the stock is too long.

Don't worry about the possible effects of wind on your shot pellets. That is, would wind blow my load of 9s about more than 8s or my 8s more than 7s? Tests have proved that wind has no practical effect on shot pattern regardless of size, over the range we use a shotgun.

Be sure to get your footwork correct before calling for the target. Be relaxed, but alert and ready to move with a smooth co-ordinated gun and body movement after the target.

Just before you call for your target, pause for a second to focus your gaze in the area where the target will appear. This practice will enable you to see the target more clearly. You are then more aware of target behaviour. It's a good way to develop concentration.

It's certainly not the end of the world if you discover you cannot shoot with both eyes open due to the fact that you are a right hand shot and have a left master eye. When this is the case you must obviously do one of two things — either change over to the left shoulder, or stay with it on the right shoulder and close the left eye. Actually, some of our prominent shooters do just this, and shoot very well. So don't worry too much about this problem.

The next time you miss a target think for a second and ask yourself, "Did I really see the target leaving the trap?" The answer will be for sure: "Well no — not really. I only saw it after it got out a bit further causing me to make a hurried shot. That resulted in a miss."

The remedy for this problem is, after mounting the gun and establishing a gun point on the trap house, pause for a second to properly focus your eyes over the area in which you know the target will appear. Now, completely disregard everything else while you form a quick mental picture of correct procedure for shooting the target. When this mental picture is complete, call for the target. You will find that the whole action of tracking the target, lead, fire and follow through, becomes easier and more of automatic action — provided you keep your eye on the target all the way out until it is broken. This technique is one of the basic fundamentals of shooting clay targets either trap, trench or skeet.

Most trap shooters will prefer the front top edge of the trap house as a gun point position prior to calling for the target — however, we have an increasing number of shooters showing preference to hold higher over the house and watch for the target leaving the trap under the barrels.

This style does have a lot going for it in that it cuts down on gun movement and tends to make the shooter watch more intensely for the target leaving the trap and this is what we want. Unfortunately it is only the shooter who shoots two eyes who can adopt this style. Because when the left eye is closed the view of target leaving the trap is lost. To overcome this problem, the one eyed shooter would have to wait for the target to rise above his gun. In so doing, he cancels out the advantage he would otherwise have.

Proper gun fitting and gun mounting will bring your gun and eye into alignment. You will then be pointing where you are looking. And, if you keep your eye on the target, you should then have no problem — hitting the target!

The successful and most difficult shooter to beat in competition is the one who does his own thing. Target after target he refuses to be hurried or pushed into shooting faster than he normally shoots. He does, in fact, continue on with his own deliberate style. This style of competition shooting is one I have personally used over the years. It's a good way to keep concentration working — so don't allow other shooters in your squad upset your style!

Contrary to what some shooters may think, the safety catch on your gun is completely divorced from the gun's cocking and uncocking of the hammers. The safety catch is actually a mechanism that prevents the trigger or triggers from being pulled when on safety. Fact is, the hammers are still cocked so that if the gun is dropped or jarred by a fall, the hammers can operate and fire the shell — even though the safety catch was on "safe".

Many skeet guns come from the manufacturer with a stock that has too much bend down — or in other words, too much drop at the comb. This problem will result in poor scoring due to your shooting eye being below the rib level when your cheek is resting on the comb. If you suspect that you have this problem, have your gun stock checked out by a competent person.

As the shot pattern leaves the muzzle it begins to lengthen. This is called stringing. Tests have shown that at 40 yards it has strung out to around 8-12 feet and is cone shaped.

Regardless of whether you shoot trap or skeet, the basic technique remains the same:

- Learn the fundamentals involved;
 - Learn how to apply them;
 - Learn how to practice them always, at all times.
1. Proper gun fit;
 2. Correct gun mounting;
 3. Body and gun control;
 4. Good stance position;
 5. Gun and target relationship;
 6. Watch for the target leaving the trap. See it bright and clear;
 7. Lead the target, fire and follow through;
 8. Select a good gun hold position relative to the trap house;
 9. Learn to concentrate;
 10. Shoot one target at a time and NEVER EVER think about the one you just missed, or how many more you have to shoot.

Proper gun holding will lead to better gun mounting. The position of your right and left hand on grip section and forend is very important. An incorrect right hand grip will lock up wrist movement and prevent free and easy movement of proper gun mounting to the correct position on one's shoulder. Incorrect forend hold will also cause problems. Be sure that you are not over reaching with the left hand which will cause restricted gun swing, especially on targets travelling from left to right. If we use too short a

grip on the forend, gun swing will become jerky and inaccurate. The ideal position is a little way either side of forend centre — depending on length of shooter's arm. Providing all other measurements of stock are correct.

For the trap or skeet shooter who takes his shooting seriously and shoots regularly throughout the year, I'd suggest he have his trigger pulls checked every 9 to 12 months. At the same time, have the action and locks cleaned. Any good gunsmith would be able to do this work for you.

Always incline the body slightly forward from the waist and don't bend the front knee too much. This action of leaning into the shot will help maintain body balance during the act of firing.

I'd recommend fitting a recoil reducer. A good make of recoil reducer does work and will reduce recoil and barrel flip. It will also provide better gun control for the clay target shooter.



Photo shows the shooter using a gun where the stock is not suited to his particular build. In this case, the stock measures 14 1/4" and because the shooter is of stocky build with short thick neck, he requires a stock of around 13 1/4" length in order to have complete control of gun pointing during the process of swinging after the target.

If a stock is too long it will cause the shooter's cheek to be too far back along the comb. This in turn will make it more difficult to maintain accurate eye and gun alignment.



Photo illustrates a good stock length position. Notice how the shooter's nose is up close to the point of comb, and not further back as shown in the other photo.

Note also the good firm hand grip with thumb around the grip section, not along it as we sometimes see. Note how the trigger finger is contacting the trigger at first joint

where the feel is positive with less tendency to flinch. Shoulders are level and head is upright allowing the eyes to look comfortably without strain, down the rib and out to the target.

DRAWING NO. 1

This drawing shows correct eye position above the rib. YOU CAN CHECK this position by looking in a mirror.



DRAWING NO. 2

Shows incorrect eye level which is positioned below the gun rib.

I can say without hesitation that of all the measurements of stock fit, drop at comb would be the most critical and possibly the least understood. It is in fact the most common problem with most shooters. A good rough method of determining the comb measurement of your stock if you think you have this problem, is to place the gun to your shoulder in the correct way and position your face hard down on the comb. You should still be able to see all the front sight. If you find that you are looking into the breech of the gun and cannot see the rib, then the stock is too low and you will shoot low and behind the target.

When you are faced with the problem of a stock being too low, the remedy is to have it bent up at the heel whatever amount is necessary in order to give the required height on the comb where your cheek will rest during the process of shooting. A good qualified gunsmith should be able to do this for you.

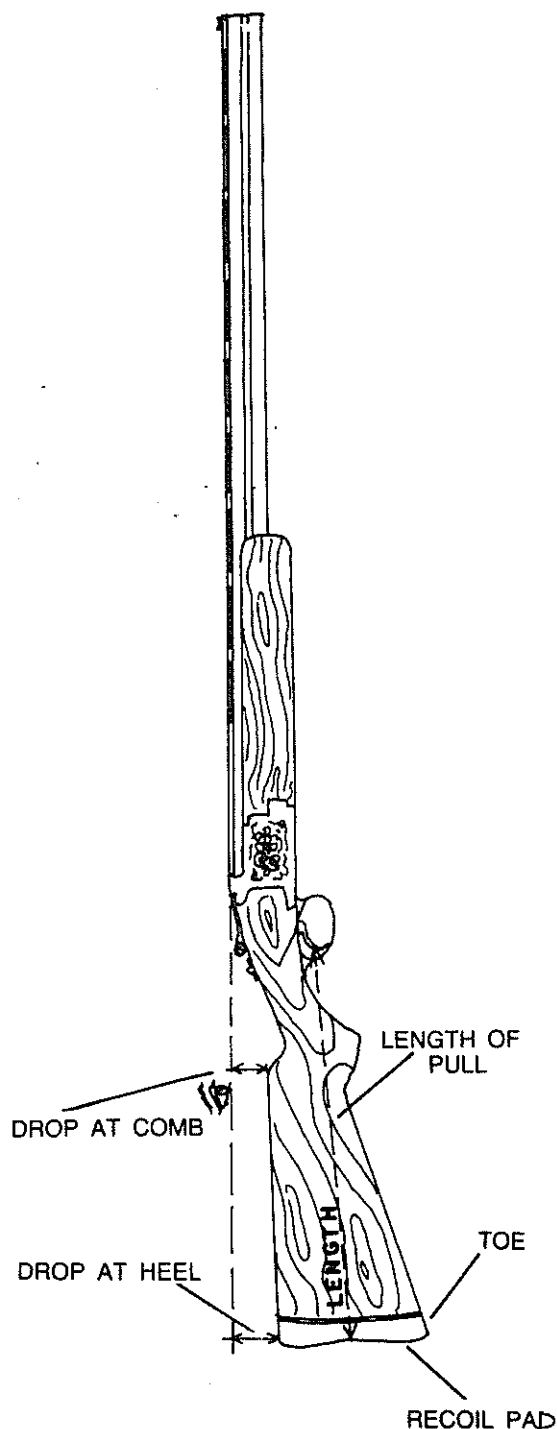


DRAWING NO. 3

THE GUN AND ITS MEASUREMENTS:

Note correct eye level above a line coming through from the rib in this position. You will always see the target

viable on the end of the muzzle as you fire. If your eye is lower than this line, you will shoot low.



DRAWING NO. 4

This is a position I recommend for practical and comfortable gun mounting on your shoulder. It allows the head and face to rest comfortably in a natural position on the comb. There is no tendency to lift your face off the stock and the eyes are looking out to where the target is without strain on the neck and eyes. Shooting becomes much easier and more enjoyable because you have greater gun control.



Shows a badly positioned stock on shoulder. The butt is off the shoulder altogether, it is actually resting on the shooter's upper arm and very much too far down from his face. This position will create numerous problems. For instance, because of the low position of the comb, the shooter must press his face forward and down in order to get his shooting eye on a level with the barrel rib (which he must do to have eye and gun alignment). When this happens, the cheekbone comes in sharp contact with the hard comb's surface. Result — a very nice little bruise which eventually begins to bleed.

Another problem with this low gun mount is a tendency to lift your face off the comb to see the target, resulting in a lost target. Numerous other problems exist when the stock is not correctly positioned on shoulder for every shot.

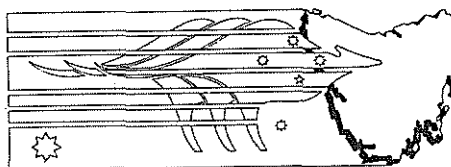
MALLALA GUN CLUB

State Coaching Director's Report October 1986-October 1987

Since being appointed to the position of State Coaching Director in October 1986, I have travelled 11,280km for coaching days, Accreditations and Training Squad activities.

During this time I have travelled into each of the five Zones and worked with all of the Zone Coaches — except one.

The Zone Coaches are all doing an excellent job — with all except one being Accredited Level II — and all of them deserve praise for the unselfish work that they are doing.

Coaching is the best formula for introducing new shooters and retaining those who become disheartened or disgruntled with their performances.

With this in mind, next year's "Blue Book" will contain the name of each Club Coach along with the President and Secretary — also to be included will be the actual dates of coaching days and the venues that they will be conducted in each of the five Zones. These Coaching Days will be organised by the respective Zone Coach and I will be in attendance to give assistance.

N.S.W. now has an additional five Level II coaches, namely Peter Hayman, Peter Holmes, Arthur Turner (Snr), Ted Schneider and John Pethybridge. Congratulations to those coaches. This now brings the total of Level II coaches in N.S.W. to 17.

At the end of June, I attended the first meeting of State Coaches, which was organised by the National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, and was held in Adelaide. It was at this meeting that all the State Coaches agreed that a set of five tapes be produced, one as an introduction to the sport and one each on the four disciplines of shooting.

It is envisaged that we use shooters such as Doug Smith, Adrian Cousens, Terry Rumbel and Ian Hale and use a

format or script designed by the Coaching Council of State Coaches.

All State Coaching Directors now have a set of Coaching Tapes similar to those that the N.S.W. Zone Coaches obtained last year and my thanks must go to David Menck for organising those.

The meeting in Adelaide was the first stage of the A.C.T.A. approved Level III Accreditation. This course has been undertaken by the Western Australian, Queensland, South Australian and New South Wales State Coaches. The course is proposed to take three years and involves international travel with the National Coaching Director, live-in weekends, assignments and reading.

Also part of this course was a recent week-long attendance at the Australian Institute of Sport with the National Coaching Director and the National Training Squad.

Once I have gained the Level III qualifications, I will then be in a position to offer the Level II coaches the opportunity to undertake the course.

One of my priorities for the near future is to organise a Level I Refresher Course. I believe that Level I Coaches need upgrading within their own accreditation to keep the standard as high as possible, as it is these people at Club level who hold the key to the growth of the sport.

Finally, I would like to thank my dear wife, Jenny for her many hours of typing and assistance.

I look forward to giving you continued assistance — all you have to do is ask.

Again, the past twelve months have seen good results and growth in the Olympic Discipline in New South Wales.

Almost without exception, the training squad eliminations held by each of the eight I.S.U. clubs have been successful, and once again positions for the 1988 Training Squads in both Olympic, Trap and I.S.U. Skeet are being fiercely contested. It is quite likely that next year may see a few new faces in the squads for the first time.

During 1987, New South Wales competitors performed well both within Australia and overseas. Although they have not performed as well, the state's I.S.U. Skeet shooters are certainly becoming stronger by the year. The past twelve months have seen a few newcomers to the ranks and some extremely good scores recorded. Hopefully, these new faces, combined with some of the more experienced performers, will see some of the feats of the Olympic Trap shooters repeated by our I.S.U. Skeet shooters in the not too distant future.

In all, the Olympic Disciplines are performing well and the state is still seen by other states as the leaders in this field. Many new and varied ideas are on the drawing board for the future and hopefully these will see New South Wales continue as the leading I.S.U. state in Australia.

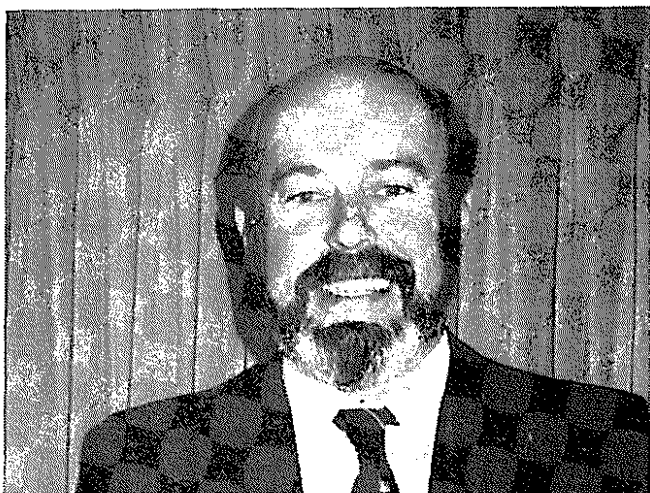

MURRAY ALEXANDER

Murray Alexander from Western Australia, became involved with the sport by starting as a trapper boy at the Clontarf grounds of the Perth Gun Club. He commenced his shooting sport at the age of 12 in 1957, and rejoined

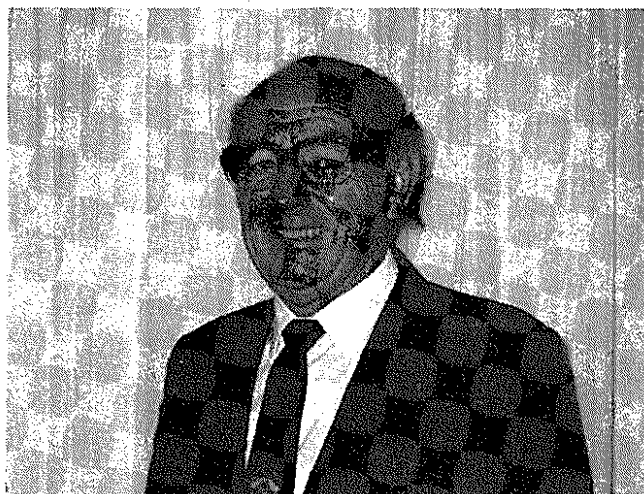
the sport through the Azzurri Gun Club in 1968 after army service.

Whilst with Azzurri Gun Club he held the position of Club Captain 1977/78, Vice President 1979/80 and President of the Club 1981/82. He served the Executive of the Club for eight years and was the Azzurri Gun Club and Zone 1 Coach from 1979/1985.

On a State Level he commenced in 1979 as an Executive Member and is still part of such today. During this time he held the Vice President position in 1980, and President 1981/82/83. Murray was an Assistant State Coach in the years 1984/85 and the State Coach 1986/87.

He was delegate for the W.A.C.T.A. to the W.A. Sports Federation 1983/85, delegate to the Department of Sport & Recreation in the same years and delegate to the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee 1986/87.

As if this is not enough, Murray holds the position as President to the West Australian Shooting Association which he commenced in 1984.



LAURIE CONNORS

A keen bush shooter for many years, Laurie was introduced to the sport of clay target shooting in 1957. He was also elected to Mildura Gun Club committee in December of the same year.

The club, having formed in 1953 was only in its infancy as far as its facilities and development were concerned. The club made steady progress over the years, and in 1964 Laurie was elected as club secretary. As well as being secretary, in 1968 he was also given the added duty of treasurer of the club. Even with a heavy workload in administration, Laurie has been a regular contributor to our magazine "Shooting News" with his photography and "Around The Traps" column.

In his total involvement with clay target shooting administration, spanning a period of some thirty years, his record shows through circumstances beyond his control, he has only missed attending two committee meetings, these were at State level.

Laurie has attained accreditation as Level 2 Coach and is also accredited as a Firearms Safety Instructor Examiner for Victoria, by the Firearms Consultative Committee.

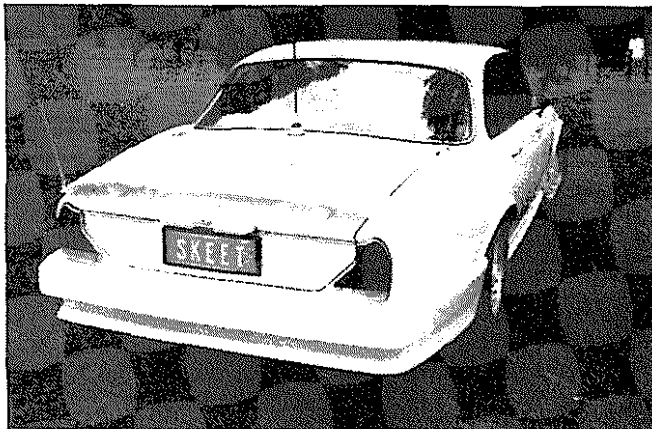

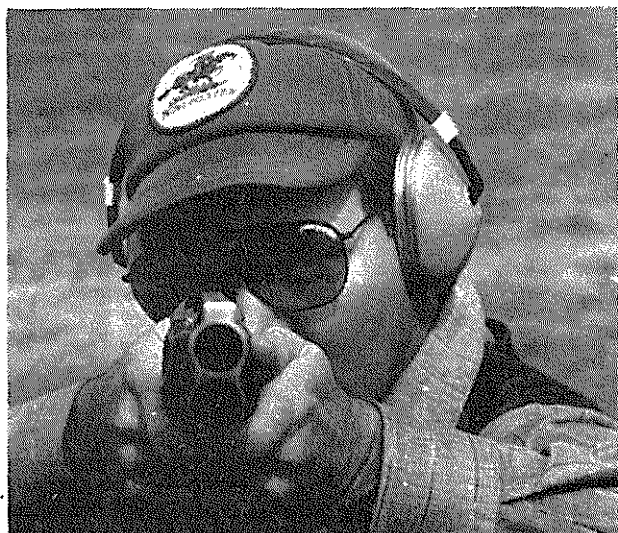
NORTHAM GUN CLUB

Four State Coaches attended the Australian Institute of Sport in conjunction with members of the National Training Squad. The reason for our attendance was to further our studies for Level 3 Accreditation and to observe the training squad go through their paces under the guiding hands of the Institute and our own National Coach.

The members attending were from ISU Skeet: John Summers, Craig Mueleman, Michael Inguant and Ben Dudenas. For Trench: Jim Ellis, John Maxwell, Russel Mark, Robert Thompson and Cliff Bailey. In conjunction with this squad was for the first time members of the Junior Squad: Brett Dunstan, Michael Diamond and Philip Petriella.

For five days this squad plus Bill Stevens (Qld), Hillary Baines (SA), Col Burt (NSW), Murray Alexander (WA) and Rob Smith attended lectures, participated in tests and studies as well as practical training at the International Gun Club.

These lectures ranged from psychology under Dr Jeff Bond (fresh from Wimbledon with Pat Cash) to biomechanics, injury prevention and the start of a study into vision. The vision section was handled by a group of optometrists from Sydney who had devised and put together a series of tests. These tests are at this time being colated and the results we hope will invoke further studies into this vital section of our sport. A new addition to the training was high speed filming and from this exercise it is hoped to gain more insight into muscles that we use and exercises that are able to be used to improve our expertise.

For five days the attending people were kept on the go with only the occasional break to relax. At the end of five days, all the squad members were better off and ready for Korea this month and Venezuela in October. To say the least a good solid team will be representing us at both venues, teams that are solid in performance and backed by solid experience. The State Coaches completed their tasks and gained valuable experience at the hands of our National Coach.

On that point could I say that without the total dedication given by the very down to earth and caring National Coach, Mr Peter Quire, our shooters and coaches would not be where they are today. He ensures that everything runs along the lines of a well cared for and maintained instrument, that we use in our sport. It is up to us, each State, to give him more support and attempt to make him feel our thanks for his dedication to Clay Target Shooting.

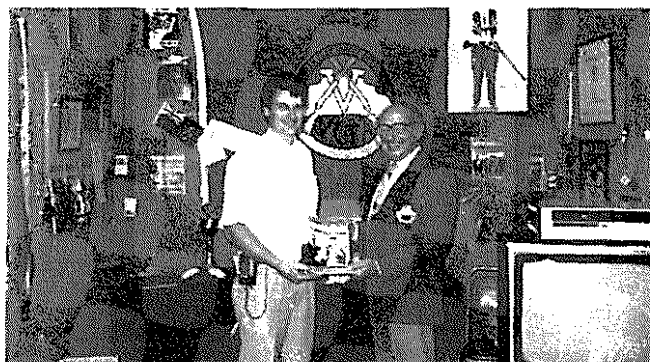

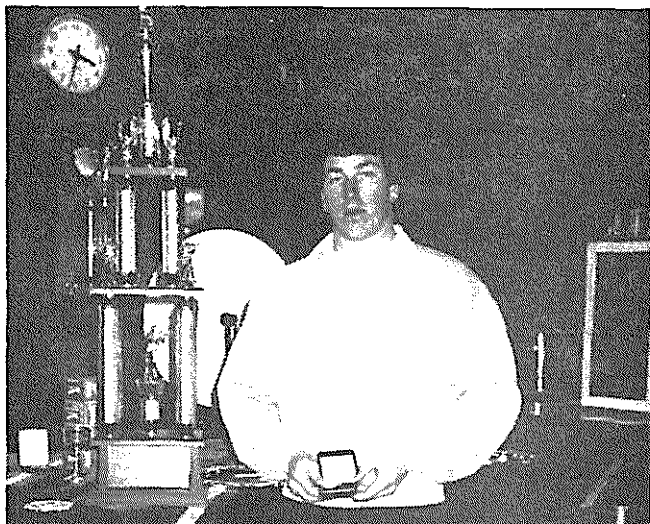
