The new rules appear to have been well-received and we will shortly be producing a pocket-size rule book. Once this has taken place, advice on availability will be provided.

FIREARMS LAWS AND THE A.C.T.A.

With the problems that are being encountered particularly in N.S.W. and Victoria, our registered shooters would no doubt be expressing concern over the stand taken by the Association.

The Association does and must at all times consider the best interests of its members, however, it must be remembered, and recognised by all, that the laws governing firearms are administered at State level and consequently there is no uniformity in the existing laws that apply nationally.

As our members are over the seven States/Territories, all of which view the firearms situation in varying degrees, a National solution to the difficulties we have been confronted with is not practical.

Members have contributed over the years to a Legislation Fund to be used to combat threats to our sport, such as the threat we are now facing. With the need for such a fund being recognised many years ago, calls are now being made for the use of these funds and in this regard, the National Association through Member State Associations is working on your behalf.

We are confident of achieving some success, however the degree of success is relative to the time that you as members expect us to achieve it in. Patience is a virtue and in this instance we must show our patience and allow for success to be achieved.

Patience will not be easy for many, particularly those persons and clubs who are affected now. We must not lose sight of the fact that we are endeavouring to correct the situation in the long term and not just be concerned with short term compromise.

For the good of our sport and shooters in general, please allow us the opportunity to produce everlasting results. If this opportunity is not given to those working on your behalf at all levels, the end result will not be overly difficult to forecast.

We are as concerned as you are and we are working towards obtaining a solution that is equitable to all concerned. Your support of our combined efforts will assist us to achieve our goals which will then in turn reflect on you and the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

While we are doing our best for you, our members, you in turn must also play your part. Let your feelings be known to your local politician, write a personal letter and also be ready to throw your support behind those working on your behalf if called upon to do so.

We have a fight on our hands and together we must win the battle.

FIREARMS EXEMPTION - N.S.W.

Following approaches made by the A.C.T.A., the following exemption has been approved and is applicable for the year of 1988.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

REGULATION 1C — Firearms and Dangerous Weapons Regulations

(Extract) New South Wales Government Gazette No. 33

- (1C) Any person, not being a resident of New South Wales, who is a member of a firearm or pistol club situated outside New South Wales and approved by the Commissioner is exempt from the requirement of section 25 or 40 of the Act to hold a pistol licence or a shooter's licence —
- (a) While the person is carrying or possessing a firearm in the course of travelling to or from, or carrying, possessing or using a firearm in the course of participating in, a target shooting event conducted during 1988 at an approved pistol range or approved firearms range in New South Wales.
- (b) While the person is carrying or possessing a firearm in the course of travelling to or from a target shooting event approved by the Commissioner and conducted during 1988 at a pistol range or firearms range outside New South Wales.

and, while exempt from that requirement, is also exempt from the requirement of section 40a of the Act that the firearm be registered.

Effectively, this exemption applies to all Interstate (other than NSW) and Overseas shooters for the year of 1988, and will allow for freedom of movement both within and through N.S.W. for the remainder of 1988.

Shooters who must be able to produce evidence of their being a bona fide member of the Australian Clay Target Association (1988 Handicap Card) must also carry with them and be able to produce on demand, documentation issued in their home state (not applicable Qld., Tas., Overseas visitors) that allows them to possess and use a firearm.

SHOOTING TRAP

WITH GEORGE BIGGS

THE TECHNIQUES OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING



It is easier and more enjoyable if everything is done right. The recipe for good shooting is simply a good knowledge of the basic fundamentals involved in shooting moving targets and a complete application of them at all

Gun fit, gun handling, gun mounting to shoulder, are vital statistics that should concern the shooter.

Trap shooting calls for a complete application of the basic principles. Swing with the target, lead and follow through is exactly what we should do.

Ground layout sketch number one shows the shooter facing the trap house from lane one. In preparing for this shot, it becomes very important to have our stance and gun point correct.

Proper stance is one of the most important basics. We should remember to avoid an unnatural stance such as feet too far apart or too close together which will result in being out of balance. Try to adopt an unstrained and not tensed up position. In other words, stand easy but alert and ready to swing after the target right or left or anywhere in between with ease.

Let's assume we are having problems with our left angle target from number one lane at sixteen metres and keeping in mind what we've been discussing. Our diagrams will serve to illustrate the trap field lay out. Here we show maximums left and right as well as a straight away target angle.

Let's look at the left angle target from lane one: The trap house shown in the sketch is marked with five black dots which indicate a suggested approximate gun holding point on the front top of the house. By holding our gun at this point we are able to focus our gaze over the known area of target release. In other words we will quickly catch on to target/angle of flight.

Stance and feet position is most important on this station. Remember not to expect only a left angle target because we stand on number one lane. We could, in fact, receive a maximum right which would appear to us as a straight away from number one lane; hence the need to adopt an easy tension-free stance, ready to swing through 90° of target travel if necessary. Further study of our sketch and photos will highlight the pointing positions for the other lanes. The dotted line is line of gun travel through to trigger let off ahead of target.

Finally, when the target appears, latch on to it and never lose sight until your gun has caught up to and broken it.

The successful and most difficult shooter to beat in competition is the one who does his own thing. Target after target, he refuses to be hurried or pushed into shooting faster than he normally shoots. He does in fact, continue on with his own deliberate style. This style of competition shooting is one I have personally used over the years. It's a good way to keep concentration working - so don't allow other shooters in your squad upset your style!

Gun pointing positions on the trap house is another important detail. This is where we look for and pick up the target for correct sight alignment. The proper gun holding position on the trap house will enable us to sight the target leaving the trap house at the earliest possible moment. If we can see our target within the first eight to ten feet of flight, we have a much better chance of catching and breaking it. If we don't catch up to it until it is half way out, our chances of swinging through and breaking it are very much less indeed.

Position of feet will need to vary from lane to lane. Body weight should be shifted to your left foot and lean your shoulders and upper body slightly forward from the waist. The left knee can be bent just a bit. In this position we are leaning just slightly forward into the recoil of the gun. We are also better positioned to follow through with gun swing and target lead.

If you watch a squad of shooters firing in their order on the trap field, you will quickly become aware of the fact that the targets are leaving the trap house at many different angles over an area of approximately 90°. For this reason we cannot have our gun swing direction cut and dried. However, we can be prepared for any angle, by our mental approach to each shot, simply by positioning our gun and stance so that we move smoothly and quickly after the target as it leaves the trap house.

Station five is really the opposite to station one. The left





angle target becomes a straight away target and the straight away from number one is now a right swinger.


Proper feet position is very important. Gun handling, cheeking and shouldering of the gun is also vital. Stock position on the shoulder must be right. If the butt is allowed to rest on one's upper arm it will be too far from the shooter's face. This position causes the shooter to stretch his cheek across to rest on the comb behind the barrel rib. The tendency is then for your face to leave the comb as the gun swings to the right after the target.



• Lane One: Note how feet are placed to swing left or right using the left leg as a pivot point depending on angle of target travel either right or left or in between. The shooter may prefer either of the two outside left gun holding points according to his preference.




. Lane Two: Position feet in a similar position to Lane 1. Again using the left leg as a pivot, feel perfectly free to swing with the target whatever the angle. Gun point on the trap house for this shot should be the third position on the trap from your left.



● Lane 3 is accepted by most shooters as being the easiest to shoot from but unfortunately a lot of targets are also missed from this position. You simply cannot afford to ride this target out in order to make sure of it — if you do you will shoot high because it has levelled out and is no longer a rising target. Likewise if you snap at the straight away chances are you'll shoot under.


• Proper gun fitting and gun mounting will bring your gun and eye into alignment. You will then be pointing where you are looking. And, if you keep your eye on the target, you should then have no problem — hitting the target!!




Lane 4 becomes a similar shot to Lane 2. However your feet position will need to vary a little in order to keep in balance. Gun point should be the third position inside the right hand trap corner.



• Lane 5 can be a problem for the right-hand shooter if he does not position himself properly — An extreme right-angle from Lane 5 can frighten hell out of the new shooter and a lot of not so new shooters if they are not prepared for it — So make sure your stance is right and that the gun and cheek position is right. Be carreful not to let the stock get away from its position under your cheek as is often the case. Keep cheek and gun stock together always. You will then be pointing the gun where the eye is looking.




- The next time you miss a target think for a second and ask yourself: "Did I really see the target leaving the trap?" The answer will be for sure: "Well no not really. I only saw it after it got out a bit further causing me to make a hurried shot. That resulted in a miss."
- The remedy for this problem is, after mounting the gun and establishing a gun point on the trap house, pause for a second to properly focus your eyes over the area in which you know the target will appear. Now, completely disregard everything else while you form a quick mental picture of correct procedure for shooting the target. When this mental picture is complete, call for the target. You will find that the whole action of tracking the target, lead, fire and follow through, becomes easier and more of an automatic action provided you keep your eye on the target all the way out until it is broken. This technique is one of the basic fundamentals of shooting clay targets either trap, trench or skeet.



- A lot of trap shooters will prefer the front top edge of the trap house as a gun point position prior to calling for the target — however, we have an increasing number of shooters showing preference to hold higher over the house and watch for the target leaving the trap under the barrels.
- This style does not have a lot going for it in that it cuts down on gun movement and tends to make the shooter watch more intensely for the target leaving the trap and this is what we want. Unfortunately, it is only the shooter who shoots two eyes who can adopt this style. Because when the left eye is closed the view of target leaving the trap is lost. To overcome this problem the one eyed shooter would have to wait for the target to rise above his gun. In so doing, he cancels out the advantage he would otherwise have.

On the reverse side of your entry form will be the terms and conditions of entry to these Nationals . . . PLEASE READ THEM.



AROUND THE TRAPS

Firearms legislation has been a major topic amongst clubs and shooters over the past few months. The changes being implemented by both the N.S.W. and Victorian Governments has done very little to complement our sport of clay shooting.

The Victorian Clay Target Association has been active and is continuing to organize meetings around Victoria to inform shooters and to discuss the proposed legislation that the Cain Government is endeavouring to bring into operation. The first of these meetings was held at Bendigo Gun Club on the 10th January. It was very successful with some 300 shooters turning up to air their views on the legislation. Other meetings took place at Frankston Australia Gun Club on Friday 12th February, and at Lismore Public Hall on Friday 19th February. Shooters should make every effort to attend these meetings, as it is in their interest to know exactly how the changes will affect them and their sport. Should information be required on the proposed legislation I would suggest you contact our Firearms Legislation Officer, Glen Woodhatch at Bendigo, or Bob Schwarz, Geelong. Along with myself, these gentlemen are our representatives on the Victorian Shooting Sports Council. This body has direct liaison with the consultative committee set up by the Government to advise on the proposed gun legislation. Robert Buchan, President of Melbourne Gun Club, and a member of the Victorian Clay Target Association is a Government appointee to this committee who can also be contacted for any information required re the gun legislation. The Firearms Consultative Committee is also setting up a Firearms Safety Education and Training Scheme for future gun licence applicants. Gun Clubs will be expected to play a major roll in this program. After our next State Council meeting to be held at Ballarat on Sunday February 21st, 1988, more information regarding this will be made available to clubs.

A record entry for the Kerang Clay Target Club's Presidential Silver Anniversary Championship was a magnificent testimony to Frank James for the tremendous contribution he has made to the sport.

Twenty-five years of leadership of the club led to the inauguration of the event on New Year's Day and there were 148 entries from throughout Victoria and interstate, including Darwin.

The modern clubhouse near Quambatook Road was crammed with well-wishers when the president of the Victorian Clay Target Association made surprise presentations of a commemorative plaque and a gold watch to Frank James.

He also read a letter of congratulations from the executive director of the Australian Clay Target Association, Alan Maher.

Mr Connors said Frank's quarter century of service as president of Kerang club and his additional role as zone coach for eight years made up a fantastic contribution to

The entry of 148 shooters was itself an indication of the esteem in which Frank was held among fellow shooters, he

Responding, Frank James thanked the club and visiting friends for their congratulations and support, and the anniversary gifts.

He said Kerang was a wonderful club and it was the great people on the committee over the years who had advanced the club. He had been fortunate to have been leader during the 25 years and he had enjoyed the friendships made through the sport.

More than \$2000 worth of trophies were presented to the winners of the Presidential event in the various grades.

With the huge entry it was a marathon with a thrilling elimination shoot-off.

118 STRAIGHT

Eventually the calm nerves and unerring aim of Shepparton champion, Neil Barry triumphed as he finished with 118/118 to win from Richard Allen of Kyabram with 117.

Fittingly Frank James also had a silver sash to take home as he won the veteran's grade.

Frank, 61, has been a member of the Kerang Clay Target Club for 33 years.

His father, Harry, "a good bush shooter" introduced him to shooting at the age of 10 years.

As a young man, Frank joined in live bird shooting at the showgrounds, but when he married Audrey and was earning only seven pounds 10 shillings a week, he could not afford the sport.

He recalled when the club had only an open shed and no SEC power in marked contrast to the modern building of

In a long competitive career he has won several State championships and a host of lesser events. He was the 16th shooter in Australia to be handicapped to the 27-yard mark.

In 1962 Frank tied with five other shooters in a shoot-off for a car. "We decided to sell it and share the proceeds," he

"My biggest thrill was when I was appointed zone coach covering some 24 clubs and more than 600 shooters in the region," he added.

'I have made fantastic friends in shooting all over Australia.

"I am proud of the achievements of the Kerang club which are due to the work of the committee and members in constantly improving facilities and attaining a high standard of competition.

"Naturally I believe it is the best club in Australia."

There was also praise for the support Audrey James has given to the club and Frank and she was presented with a sheaf of flowers by club official and top lady shooter, Faye

FROM THE DESK OF THE COACHING DIRECTOR

PETER QUIRE 1988

This year could prove to be a decisive one for the sport of Clay Target Shooting. The move to restrict gun ownership will more and more put the obligation on to the gun club members to act responsibly, and for the sport as a whole to see that its members do act responsibly. Safety has always been a vital part of our sport and I believe that we must show society that we are good and stable members of society with a lot to contribute. We should all try to invite friends or acquaintances to our clubs, we must, I believe, advertise the good social nature of our sport and we must try to show that the guns we own are not used to kill or maim people, they are not a threat to anyone. Our guns are a vital part of the performance of our sport.

It will be a great pity if the State Associations do not make their various State Governments aware of the excellent coaching scheme that we have. They should notify their Police Ministers and Sports Ministers of the role that our accredited coaches play in the teaching of gun safety. Association members where possible, should put forward the names of our accredited coaches as people who are competent and recognised teachers of gun safety. If Association members do not support their own coaches as being people eminently suitable to teach gun safety, the ability of clubs to attract new members will be up to those outside our sport. Our Coaches are excellent people who have, as part of their coaching courses, had to prove their ability as teachers of Gun Safety.

THE FLIGHT OF THE FROZEN PEECANS

I have received a very funny letter from Yves Tetreault, President of the Shooting Federation of Canada, on the World Championships just held in Venezuela. I would like to quote some of his letter for you:

"The skeet fields were tricky. Each field had a different background, and individual weather conditions, in fact lead was raining on field 3, not from God, but from the Trap field, sometimes birds would land on the skeet field, not birds with wings but birds of clay, unbroken from the trap field.

"The trap competition was even more tricky. Susan Natrass had to shoot her last round at 1730 hours, but the sun went down at 1700 hours. The start was so late that only two rounds instead of three were fired on the first day, so the next day some shooters had to shoot four rounds to catch up.

"Peter did you notice the line judges? They were either smoking a cigar or by their decisions, allowing the spectators to believe that they were either blind or drunk.

A joke went around that this time it would be the Judges that would be tested for drugs. So you ask, where are the Peecans? Venezuela did not have a competent and UIT approved lab to conduct the urinalisis required after the drug test. The lab is in Montreal, so I got the privilege and opportunity to leave Venezuela with 54 cans of urine, frozen in a camping cooler. You have had experience with Customs, but imagine the questions, 'What is the nationality of this urine? Is it masculine or feminine?' I ask you Peter, who knows about the sex life of frozen peecans?? I nearly lost it though, as one zealous official thought it should be confiscated under the agricultural restrictions for PEECANS."

Yves was one of the officials who pleaded with me to try to have the World Championships here, you can see why.

The I.S.U. and Down the Line Championships will be held in March and April, so for those of you who will be attending this year, I hope that you have started to get yourself prepared for the events. Physical fitness is a great benefit to performance, and mental preparation is just as important. Remember to break up the competition into one target events. If you keep hitting that one target you will win. It is not the other fellow that you have to worry about it's the next target.






