



# FIREARMS EXEMPTION — N.S.W.

Following approaches made by the A.C.T.A., the following exemption has been approved and is applicable for the year of 1988.

## PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

## REGULATION 1C — Firearms and Dangerous Weapons Regulations

(Extract) New South Wales Government Gazette No. 33

(1C) Any person, not being a resident of New South Wales, who is a member of a firearm or pistol club situated outside New South Wales and approved by the Commissioner is exempt from the requirement of section 25 or 40 of the Act to hold a pistol licence or a shooter's licence —

- (a) While the person is carrying or possessing a firearm in the course of travelling to or from, or carrying, possessing or using a firearm in the course of participating in, a target shooting event conducted during 1988 at an approved pistol range or approved firearms range in New South Wales.
- (b) While the person is carrying or possessing a firearm in the course of travelling to or from a target shooting event approved by the Commissioner and conducted during 1988 at a pistol range or firearms range outside New South Wales.

and, while exempt from that requirement, is also exempt from the requirement of section 40a of the Act that the firearm be registered.

Effectively, this exemption applies to all Interstate (other than NSW) and Overseas shooters for the year of 1988, and will allow for freedom of movement both within and through N.S.W. for the remainder of 1988.

Shooters who must be able to produce evidence of their being a bona fide member of the Australian Clay Target Association (1988 Handicap Card) must also carry with them and be able to produce on demand, documentation issued in their home state (not applicable Qld., Tas., Overseas visitors) that allows them to possess and use a firearm.



## AROUND THE TRAPS

With LAURIE CONNORS

One of the most talked about subjects for some time amongst shooters, around the traps, is the changes being made by the Cain Government to the existing Victorian Firearms Legislation. One of the questions being asked is who is doing what for me? The Victorian Clay Target Association is well aware of the problems the legislation may create for its members, and is doing all within its power to try and keep sanity in any likely changes by the present Government, particularly those changes that threaten law abiding shooters and not the "crim" in our society who uses firearms to commit a felony.

In Victoria there is an umbrella organisation called the Shooting Sports Council of Victoria. Currently the Shooting Sports Council represents ten affiliated organisations. They are Victorian Field and Game Association, Sporting Shooters Association of Victoria, Antique and Historical Arms Collectors Guild, Victorian Rifle Association, Victorian Small Bore and Air Rifle Association, Victorian Amateur Pistol Association, Australian Deer Association, North Eastern Deerstalkers Association, Australian Bowhunters Association and Victorian Clay Target Association.

It is this group, known as the Shooting Sports Council, the Cain Government has accepted spokesperson and representative of the shooter. The V.C.T.A. has only just re-joined this organisation after a lapse of membership since 1983. The V.C.T.A. Council delegate at that time, was not invested with the power to commit the V.C.T.A. to any levies or costs, that may be arrived at by the S.S.C. in meeting, to combat any Government Gun Legislation being introduced during the 1982 elections. It appears other bodies did not have the same restraint. This created concern and problems to the V.C.T.A. at that time. There were also other areas of S.S.C. administration, the V.C.T.A. Council were not fully supportive of, and therefore did not continue with membership. However, it has been necessary for the V.C.T.A. to re-think its position with this body.

The present Cain Government has elected to discuss the contemplated firearms legislation with the S.S.C. only. As well, the Government under its new draught legislation, will only recognise shooting organisations that are affiliated with the S.S.C.

Under the present constitution and guidelines as laid down by the S.S.C., each affiliate can have one delegate per 1,000 members of its organisation on the S.S.C., hence Victoria has three delegates. They are Glen Woodhatch, who is also the V.C.T.A. Legislation Officer, Robert Schwarz and Laurie Connors. This is the first time, since being involved with the S.S.C., the V.C.T.A. has actually fulfilled its responsibility in this area with three elected delegates. Another query I have had from our members is what the "Policy" of the V.C.T.A. is in regards to Firearms Legislation. Our Policy is that as adopted by the Shooting Council and fully supported by the V.C.T.A. Space does not allow for publishing in the C.T.S.N., however, the policy is available to all members upon request.

The A.C.T.A. does not have a National Policy, other than to give support to all States where the use of firearms by its members is being threatened. Other similar organisations to ours are likewise, such as the Victorian Field and Game Association, they do not have a National Policy. This would not be necessary unless a National principal was at stake.

The Firearms Legislation Fund, as set up by the A.C.T.A., and to which every A.C.T.A. registered shooter has been a contributor, is there to be used for the protection of us as legitimate gun owners. This money is held in trust by the A.C.T.A. and is made available to, and

at the request of, a State Association. The V.C.T.A. has already, in the past, been granted money from this fund, and no doubt will make further claims, should the necessity arise. The N.S.W. State Association has recently applied for and been granted \$10,000 from the fund to combat changes that are being contemplated with their firearms legislation.

Another Committee, set up by the Government, is the Consultative Committee. It has delegates from the S.S.C., as well as personnel elected by the Government. Robert Buchan is a Government appointee on this committee. It works in an advisory capacity to the Government, as well as hearing appeals from those refused shooting licences.

Another Sub-Committee is the Firearms Training Sub-Committee. This Committee has the responsibility of setting up the format that will be used for the training of persons in firearms safety, prior to them being issued with a shooter's licence. It will be the responsibility of approved accredited firearms instructors to educate all future shooter licence applicants, prior to them being issued with a shooter's licence. No new shooter licence will be issued until this is in operation. Juniors whose shooter's permit expires at the present time are affected by this part of the legislation. They are unable to obtain a licence on the expiry of their permit until they have attained the necessary training now being set up by the Firearms Training Committee.

The V.C.T.A. has organised several public meetings around Victoria, with the sole purpose of informing shooters of the proposed legislation changes. The first of these was run at Bendigo Gun Club, followed by one at Frankston Australia Gun Club and the last taking place in Lismore, Victoria, at the Lismore Public Hall.

## PRESIDENTIAL REPORT TO A.G.M. 1987

Your Association has just completed a year of utmost difficulty brought about by pressures directed at the shooting sports, mainly concerning the use of our sporting equipment by persons not trained in their use, probably never alerted to the dangers of firearms as children by their parents because they were never associated with these in their youth as we more than likely have been, and mentally disturbed in some way when these necessities to our sport were to hand at the wrong moment.

However, we have generally endeavoured at executive level to answer the questions levelled at us all in this regard, with the positive response that we believe that all A.C.T.A. members are responsible firearms users. To my knowledge, no member of our Association has been guilty of any criminal misdemeanor involving this equipment in 1987 and our rules both actual and moral are positive in respect to such if they occur, against our fellows, fauna or flora, and should be actively prosecuted by club officials if they are infringed. Only in this way can we justify the privilege of owning and using our firearms.

The increasing pressures on shooters generally in respect to restrictive gun laws in the states of N.S.W. and Victoria have, I believe, brought a potential problem to clubs there, which will escalate to other parts of the country, and that is the wish, or prospective requirement, of gun owners to join a club to legitimise their ownership of the weapon, rather than be an active and useful member of that club. I would suggest that while an increase in our membership is desirable, it is welcome only for the right reasons, and I would warn clubs against allowing new shooters to enjoy the facilities provided over the years, for more than a couple of practice shoots, and then only subject to signing your visitors book. If they are not prepared then to join your club and pay the necessary fees, they would more than likely become a liability rather than an asset, if allowed to continue.

As you are aware, we disposed of our premises at 8 Main Street at a considerable profit on our purchase price. We were prepared to repurchase part of this property when redeveloped to suit our purposes but this did not eventuate, through circumstances beyond our control. We were forced to move in a hurry to protect our interests, at considerable expense, but have since moved to cheaper premises in Mt Waverley which can be financed from the interest generated by our building fund, which now stands at \$200,000. We intend to purchase as soon as a suitable property is located, hopefully in an area which will allow another capital gain, and we welcome any propositions from our members.

Shooting at an international level had a lift in 1987, particularly at junior level. We now have five quotas for the Olympics due to the efforts of our shooters. Our training squad is now in the process of elimination to fill these spots. At home we ran three very successful nations series and our thanks must go to the various organising committees and their helpers, mostly shooters, who staged these events for us. I am particularly proud of my home state W.A. in the way they ran the Skeet Nationals, and the local shooters' support to produce a near record field of 187. The Masters Games held in Launceston proved to be very popular and many of our older shooters were elated once more to be among the medals.

I would like to again, on behalf of your Association, thank all sponsors, large and small, for their contribution to our sport, at National, State and Club level. We are indeed fortunate that this is available and given so freely. Your own support of our Junior Travel Fund is commended, and has produced results. This is an on-going project and we look forward to further donations.

The recently adopted revamp of the rules which should be effective for the next five years, unless some unexpected anomalies arise, were the result of much discussion between the Referees Association, State Associations and your Executive. We are now turning our attention to the Olympic Discipline and following the oppointment of David Menck as National Rules Supervisor (I.S.U.), States are now in the process of setting up their own organisation and training referees.

Our National Coaching Director has maintained his high standard and can be proud of the achievements shooters led by him have attained in 1987. The coaching seminar held in Adelaide and attended by all State Directors, was a resounding success and will benefit our coaching scheme no end. The support we receive from the Australian Sports Commission is really appreciated by your Executive and ensures our coaching scheme does not founder.

The finances of your Association are basically sound, but unfortunately operating expenses have escalated without a corresponding increase in revenue from operations and a static subscription, which has been the same for the last five years. As an instance of this, we incurred an increase of 32% on our insurance last year despite a change of insurer for a lower rate. Consequently our trading figures show a deficit of \$38,877 which is more than budgeted for. I would direct your attention to the notes attended to the financial statements for an explanation of some of the reasons for the shortfall. Your Executive decided to increase the subscription by \$5.00 for this year as intimated at the last A.G.M. When this power was vested then, however, this figure is not anywhere near inflation or C.P.I. increases over the period and I suggest that your incoming committee must keep this in mind. Expenditure has been pruned wherever possible without reducing the services asked for. Your Executive have decided to hold one meeting a year instead of two, as has been done in the past, to reduce expenditure, but in my opinion this is a retrograde step and should only be a temporary measure. This will throw an extra load on the management committee which could very well make the job untenable.

The notice of motion to be put at this meeting regarding the issue of a replacement delegate for the State from which the President is elected, if accepted, will save on expenditure, but I can assure you that this person has his work cut out to represent you properly having to attend three Nationals, Executive, Management and all subcommittee meetings, generally at the expense of his contribution to state and club. I appreciate the latitude shown to me by W.A. in this regard.

In closing this report, I would congratulate my executive on their input for the year in representing the various states. The staff at the office for their willingness to cooperate and still produce the goods under the trying circumstances of moving, and the State Associations and Clubs I was able to visit, for their hospitality.

This will be my last opportunity to address you in this position as I intend to resign all executive positions, both National and State, at the end of my term. I can only say that I am extremely proud to have been allowed the privilege to represent you for the past four years.

## **ANNUAL REPORT 1987**

It is my pleasure to be able to present to members the 1987 Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Association. In presenting this report the traditional format of reporting to members has been adhered to.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

For a fourth successive year the members of the Executive Committee elected Mr Roy Holtfreter from Northam, Western Australia to the presidency of the association. As always Mr Holtfreter was a busy president and, as well as chairing meetings of both the executive and management committees, also attended all meetings of the various sub-committees of the association.

Mr Holtfreter has indicated his intention to relinquish all official positions at the expiration of his elected term and his experience which has been gained over the many years of his involvement with the association will be missed. We wish him well in his retirement to the Northam Club and look forward to seeing him at our National Championships for many years to come.

Vice-president Mr Jim Scott from Dubbo, New South Wales, was also an untiring member of the executive, and his knowledge of the sport was of great assistance throughout the year. As well as occupying the position of national vice-president, Jim was appointed by his state association as the N.S.W. representative to the National Referees Association and with those responsibilities added to his responsibilities from the N.S.W.C.T.A., 1987 was a busy year for him.

Two meetings of the Executive were conducted in 1987, one at Brisbane following the National Trap Championships with a subsequent meeting in Melbourne during September.

As has become the standard, meetings of the Executive were very demanding and to extract a passage from the 1986 report which is still the case today, "It is hoped that the decisions made are accepted in the manner in which they are arrived at, that being for the good of clay target shooting in Australia."

Changes to the Executive were made during the year with Mr J. Murphy replacing Mrs K. Woods from Tasmania, Mr J. Bitossi replacing Mr D. Barnes from Northern Territory and Mr R. Brook replacing Mr E. Ransom from Queensland.

On behalf of all members we record our appreciation for the involvement of the retiring members of the Executive and welcome those who have been elected as their state's representative to the National Executive Committee.

## MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Being the Committee responsible for the conduct of the Association between meetings of the Executive Committee, the executive members after due and careful deliberation entrusted management positions to Mr L. Connors from Mildura, Victoria, and Mr T. Catling from Katanning, Western Australia, who with both Mr Holtfreter and Mr Scott, by virtue of their elected positions of



president and vice-president, comprised the four-member committee.

Meetings of management are held as deemed necessary and the Executive at their meeting in April showed confidence in this committee with their encouragement for management to fulfil their elected role by assuming more responsibility than had previously been the case. The management committee have shown by their handling of the many matters that came their way, that the confidence in them was not misplaced.

This is a most important committee and it will be of benefit to the association if they are able to continue to operate in the same manner in ensuing years.

## INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING COMMITTEE

Preparations for the Olympic year of 1988, as well as our involvement in the World Shotgun Championships in Venezuela, made for a busy year. The committee which includes three members elected from general membership as shooters' representatives was chaired by Mr L. Connors and is to be congratulated on their contribution to the Association during 1987.

With two meetings throughout the year, the committee attended to many matters relating to shooting in general as well as shooting on the international scene.

1988 may well see some variation to the composition of this committee as well as its possible renaming to reflect to members that it is in fact a National Shooting Committee representing our three disciplines, trap, skeet and I.S.U., and not, as many feel is the case, international shooting alone

#### PROMOTIONS COMMITTEE

An exciting achievement in 1987 with the Winchester Olin Australia company and the A.C.T.A. entering into a two-year sponsorship of the Trap Nationals which totals in excess of \$50,000. In addition to this sponsorship Olimpyc Targets have also agreed to provide sponsorship in excess of \$8000 for the same period.

We appreciate the support shown by both companies and trust that their support to the Association is returned by members.

## AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

This Association which represents all disciplines on the international scene is not, as was reported last year, as active as we would wish; however, it is the body which is recognised internationally and for this reason we must be supportive.

Difficulties late in the year with the resignation of the General Secretary have resulted in the A.S.A. not being able to operate efficiently. We are confident that this problem will be overcome in the near future.

## NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

With the benefits that are achieved by having a full-time coaching director, we are commencing to see the results that we have been looking for.

We are one of the few sports to have introduced a Level 3 coaching scheme and because of this Bill Stevens, Queensland, and Hilary Baynes, South Australia, attended at

their own expense the World Shooters' Championship in Venezuela as a requirement of their Level 3 coaches' accreditation.

Additional coaches will be attending the Oceania Championship in New Zealand also as part of the Level 3 coaches' scheme and the benefit to shooters at all levels will be readily seen as the coaching scheme develops.

All state coaching directors attended a very successful weekend seminar in Adelaide during the year which was financially assisted by the Australian Sports Commission and Rothmans Sporting Foundation.

National coaching director Peter Quire has had a busy 1987 with visits to various states as well as his duties with the national training squad. 1988 being an Olympic year will offer no respite.

#### AUSTRALIAN SPORTS COMMISSION

The assistance received from the Australian Sports Commission is very much appreciated as it provides the Association with the services of a full-time national coaching director, administration assistance and financial support for the coaching scheme and international teams.

During 1987 our international shooters attended World Cups in Korea, Mexico, Moscow and Venezuela and they were assisted financially with funds received from the A.S.C.

The Australian Sports Commission through its Sports Talent Encouragement Grant, provided financial assistance to a number of our elite athletes.

The Institute of Sport provided a training camp in Canberra for the national coaching squad which was also attended by state coaching directors and appreciated by all

The Australian Sports Commission does have in its employ some extremely dedicated sports people and it has been a pleasure to have been able to work with them throughout 1987.

## AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC FEDERATION

As part of our Olympic preparation, financial assistance was received from the A.O.F. and allocated towards costs incurred by members of the National Training Squad as they sought to obtain Olympic Games quotas for Australia. Jim Ellis from Canberra did successfully obtain an Olympic quota for his country at the World Cup in Korea. We extend our appreciation to the Olympic Federation for their assistance with our Olympic preparations and congratulate Jim on his achievement.

#### MEMBERSHIP

Club membership remained reasonably stable throughout the year; however, the number of registered shooters was slightly down on 1986. With the firearms problems that have been encountered in New South Wales and Victoria we would reasonably expect registrations to increase in 1988 with many being anxious to obtain legal status through club membership.

Clubs are cautioned against accepting new membership applications for the short-term benefit that may be obtained. What is required is active participating members as against increased numbers on membership rolls.

Throughout the year a summary is published in the C.T.S.N. that in 90% of cases contains the answer to the query that is received. If you do have a query in this regard please ring or write to the National Office; however, it will save time and money in most instances if the summary provided is first referred to.

## NATIONAL OFFICE

Changes have taken place at the office both in personnel and office location.

As is known we have moved from our Blackburn location to temporary premises in Nunawading and shortly in the New Year will be on the move again.

Our accounting is now attended to by Miss Tina Costello who joined us early in the year following the resignation of Peter O'Donnell who did elect to pursue other fields of interest

Staff numbers were cut back by a decision of the Executive from five to four. However, it has now been found the cutback which reduced costs has increased the workload to such a degree that the decision has been reversed and a junior will be appointed to the staff at the appropriate time.

As the issues at hand are controlled by state authorities, we as a national body must support the wishes of the respective State Associations which in turn are reflecting the wishes of the shooters in that state.

We are working behind the scenes with some success. For those who have said that the A.C.T.A. is not doing anything, I can only say that they have obviously not taken the time to investigate the matter for we are, as would be expected, working on behalf of our members — allow us the time to achieve our objectives.

The shooting rules review has been completed effective 1.1.88. It is not anticipated that there will be another review for approximately five years. This does not mean that there will not be any alterations or amendments during the five-year period for we are prepared to correct anomalies that are brought to our attention. Hopefully these will be few and far between.

In closing, 1987 has not been all that we would have wished; we have problems with gun licensing that must be overcome. We do have other areas that need improving upon and we will continue with your support to work for the betterment of the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

I look forward confidently to a successful 1988 and thank the members of the Executive Committee and all members for their support throughout 1987.

Press Statement

24th August, 1965

## Target Shooting to be permitted on Sundays in New South Wales

The N.S.W. Premier, Mr Askin, said today that Cabinet had approved a recommendation made by the Chief Secretary (Mr Willis) that legislation be drafted to amend the Police Offences Act to permit organised target shooting on Sundays.

"At the present time Section 19 of the Act provides a penalty for shooting or carrying firearms on Sundays and it is proposed to amend the Act to enable exemptions to be made from the provisions of the Section, subject to such conditions as may be prescribed."

Mr Askin said that the Minister had made the recommendation following his consideration of representations by a number of Clubs which participate in clay target shooting. The proposed amendment will, however, enable exemption to be granted in respect of other forms of organised target shooting.

"It is also intended," Mr Askin added, "to increase the penalty for illegal Sunday shooting from £5 to £50, which is more in keeping with present-day values and will provide a deterrent against indiscriminate shooting which may cause damage to property or endanger the lives of human beings, livestock and wildlife."

## TWENTY FIVE YEARS AGO

A report of the day announced that "the Nobel Clay Pigeon Shooting Club — the pioneer club of inanimate target shooting in Australia - will write 'Finis' to its spacious shooting grounds at West Footscray (V.) next weekend at a special farewell gala meeting. The area will soon be taken over for factory buildings. The gathering is certain to draw many of the originals. The report goes on to say, "The ground at West Footscray is fronted by a deep quarry. In the volatile depths of this excavation in 1927 a band of enthusiasts brought about the birth of organised clay pigeon shooting. From this humble beginning the sport has gradually spread to every State in Australia and the number of clubs shooting clays exclusively has grown to 65. Only 11 took part in the first Footscray shoot. The continual building of factory works has necessitated shifting the club to other headquarters — yet to be decided".

It is worthy of comment that the self same shooting ground of the Nobel Club, which, it was stated, was required for factory buildings, is today as bare of buildings as it was when the Nobel Club moved out in 1939. It is also of interest to note that the Nobel Club's first President was the great shooting sportsman, J.W. Sutherland (better known as "Calrossie"), Vice Presidents were the late E.B. Turner and Fred Clift. Joint Hon. Secretaries were Geoff Rutledge, now of Brisbane and the late Mac Evans (founder of the present day firm of Evans & Balfour). "Duxbac" (H.G. James) was the original Treasurer.

It was fitting that a veteran of over 50 years' trapshooting, in the late Charles Corbett, and a pioneer member of the Nobel Club, gained main honours of the club's final day at West Footscray. Of the field who took part that day, only Des O'Callaghan is still numbered among the active shooters of today.

AUGUST, 1964

INTERNATIONAL MATCH. AUSTRALIA AGAIN WINS IN 1964. Australia repeated its victories of 1962 and 1963 when the 1964 Australian International Team successfully defended the title it had won in the two previous years. Cabled advice was at A.C.T.A. headquarters from London on July 1, which read: "MACKINTOSH TROPHY WON BY AUSTRALIA HEARTIEST CONGRATULATIONS STOP NEW ZEALAND 8636, SOUTH AFRICA 8479, ENGLAND 8427, WALES 8256, SCOTLAND 8084, IRELAND 8083, CENTRAL AFRICA 7643 REGARDS PAGE."


Australia's winning score as revealed in June issue, when the full team scores were published, was 8763/9000 points, this giving Australia a winning margin of 127 points or only 16 points less than the Australian record winning margin established in 1962, when the Australian team aggregated 8764 points, one more than that registered this year.

The Australian winning score of 1964 was a model of consistent shooting. As an example, it will be noted that although several shooters were capable of breaking 100 straight, none was equal to a full score in points. Further, the top score was 298/300 points and the lowest was only 22 points below that high standard. On the form shown by the Australian shooters over the past three years it will indeed be something of a surprise if Australia cannot continue to be the premier shooting country of the British Commonwelath of Nations.


He goeth to shoots full of enthusiasm and hope, spends more than he can afford, and brings home either nothing, or at least a trophy that this wife and family have no use for.

Jim Ellis had previously won a quota spot in Korea, so we now have five country quota places in the Olympics, which will have to be competed for at the Nationals in Brisbane by the shooters with a qualifying score. They are — Skeet: I. Hale, C. Meuleman, A. Crikis, gained in East Germany; J. Summers, B. Thomson, gained in Korea; D. Cunningham, M. Inguanti, M. Agar, gained in New Zealand. Trap: T. Rumbel, R. Mark, D. Diaz, gained in East Germany; J. Maxwell, gained in USSR; J. Ellis, gained in Korea; M. Diamond, F. Petriella, B. Dunstan, gained in New Zealand.

Incidentally there are only three other countries in the world that have more country quotas, that is USSR, USA and Italy.

The highlights were the 198+24 shot by Craig Meuleman, the highest score shot in international competition, out of Australia by any Australian shooter, and the performance of the Junior Team.

Michael shot a 190 to win the Junior Gold, Fillipo 189 and Brett Dunsten 188. Mark Agar shot 100 straight, and all of the juniors now have a qualifying score. New member to the team was David Cunningham from Victoria, a most promising shooter who has represented Australia at Field and Game as well as Clay Target. He shot 190 and in doing so shot a qualifying score.

The shooters who win the right to represent Australia at the Seoul Olympics will have to be ratified by the Australian Olympic Committee. It is my opinion that all 16 of the qualified shooters deserve to win the spots, they have trained, travelled, sacrificed income and are in their separate ways great Australians, their energy and dedication deserve the greatest praise. Well done.

State Coaching Directors, Col Burt, Greg Chan and Murray Alexander accompanied the team, their assistance was invaluable, without their talents I am sure the team would not have performed as they did. Thank you all for your support.

## OLYMPIC QUOTAS FOR AUSTRALIA

Oceanic Games — Christchurch

The World Championships held late last year in Venezuela were hailed as probably the most successful venture ever by an Australian Shotgun Shooting Team, however, this claim must now surely be contested following the Australian Shotgunners success at the Oceania Games held last week in New Zealand.

The Clay Target Shooters of Australia have now reached a point where they can claim to be as good as any shotgun shooting nation of the world, and far better than most, following the magnificent performances by our representatives, to win all four Olympic Games Quota spots up for grabs in New Zealand.

Only two other nations, Italy and Russia, have bettered our efforts of a total of five shotgun quota spots for the Seoul Olympic Games. Both of those countries have each won the maximum of six spots, three in Olympic Trap and three in I.S.U. Skeet.

Not only did our Oceania Games representatives win all the quota spots, but they also completely blitzed the opposition right from the start.

Rivalling the winning of the quota spots for highlights of the trip was the individual effort of each of the juniors.

Each of our four juniors, Mark Agar, Michael Diamond, Filippo Petriella and Brett Dunstan shot an Olympic Games minimum qualifying score of 188/200 or better.

On the first day of competition, Monday's Badge Match, Sydney junior Mark Agar shot a magnificent 100/100 ISU Skeet, to head the open section winner, New Zealand's John Woolley, by two targets. Victorians John Summers and Alex Crikis finished one target behind Woolley on 97/100, with Michael Inguanti and Ian Hale both on 95 taking the next two spots.

The Olympic Trap saw Russell Mark complete a very good 74/75 for the day to take the lead on 144/150, three targets ahead of Filippo Petriella on 141, with Robert Thompson, John Maxwell, Michael Diamond and Sydney based Kiwi, Brent Woodward all on 140.

The completion of the second day's shooting saw the finalising of the team events, with Australia taking all the honours.

Although medals were only awarded to the winning teams in both disciplines, the above is in fact how each team finished.

Special mention must be made of the excellent score shot by the Australian 'A' I.S.U. Skeet team of 437/450. THE HIGHEST SCORE EVER RECORDED BY AN AUSTRALIAN ISU SKEET TEAM.

While on the subject of teams, the Australian Junior Olympic Trap Team, which won the World Championship only a few months ago, again demonstrated their ability being only two targets behind the winning Australian 'A' team. WELL DONE BOYS.

The third day, with only 50 targets plus the 'final' round to be completed, saw Brett Dunstan, who was in the first squad, shoot a perfect 50/50, to add to his overnight 138 to record an Olympic Games Minimum Qualifying Score. Also in the first squad, Ellis finished on 186, Geoff Mark and Domingo Diaz on 183s, and the Kiwis were out of it.

Squad two saw Russell Mark finish in first place on 191/200, with Michael Diamond also shooting the 50/50 to finish one target back with a good qualifying score of 190. Filippo Petriella shot very well for the day to add 48 to his overnight score and qualify on 189, along with John Maxwell. Woodward finished on 188/200 and Robert Thompson on 187.

By the time you read this we will no doubt know if we are affected by the Unsworth's Government Firearms Legislation Act or shooting along with the Coalition's Proposed Act.

A lot of shooters within N.S.W. are not aware of the part that your State Association took in the proposed changes to the Firearms and Dangerous Weapons Act.

Your State Association along with all the Affiliates of the N.S.W. Shooting Association is financially supporting a Press Release Kit, that is being formulated by the N.S.W.S.A. — the parent body within N.S.W. We also applied for and were granted a substantial grant from the A.C.T.A. Legislation Fighting Fund by the National Executive.

These funds were placed with the Joint Task Force, namely The Firearms Advisory Council and the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia. Once again all affiliates of the N.S.W. Shooting Association are supporting this body as it was felt that we would achieve much more by being seen as one large body of shooters with a common goal and very few spokesmen, not all going out where we would become very fragmented and no doubt being pulled apart by the media. If you saw the newspaper and television adverts or happened to attend any of the many local public meetings you would agree win or lose this Task Force did a magnificent job.

Hope this can help clear the air for those of you who thought that we were doing nothing about your interests. I can tell you that I personally kept in contact with the Task Force either in their office or by phone throughout each week of the campaign.

Good shooting to you all and best of luck to those of you attending the National Championships at Wagga — hope to see you all there.

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY —** NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 Targets/75 Targets in brackets of 25 one visit only to the traps for all
- 3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets/75 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.

4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be re-squadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE

5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible

for any refund of nominations paid.

6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

- 7. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 9. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 10. Shooters may only nominate in any one section of an event, Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran. Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section shall only be eligible for the section entered. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before Sashes/Medals/ Trophies are awarded.
- 11. When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the open team irrespective of the section nominated for. In addition to open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.

- 15. Practice tickets are available for purchase only at the area controlling the optional sweep/purse entries.
- 16. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$5 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

Note: In the event of any omissions to the conditions of entry, nomination form to determine final conditions.

## **HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1988**

To make it easier for all concerned - office staff, handicapper and shooters -- we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

- 1. Please present your current 1988 Handicap Card for stamping before nominating. Also your up-to-date 1987 card.
- 2. Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by Handicapper.
- 3. Any shooter unable to produce a 1988 Handicap Card. must produce a Club Receipt as proof of A.C.T.A. registration.
- 4. Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the A.C.T.A. until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
- 5. Rule 2.1 (m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter will be suspended for a period of three months.
- 6. If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error. rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
- 7. Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be downgraded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7.
- 8. Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board, please report to handicapper's office.
- If you do not wish to be downgraded, please advise handicapper's office.

#### CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION - ENTRY

Entry in the 1988 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1988 with the Australian Clay Target Association.

Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1987 and 1988 registration cards before nominating, to the 1988 Nationals Official Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1987 he must produce his 1988 registration card.

#### DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the 36th Australian Double Barrel Championship, where there is a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship.

Shooters may only nominate in any one section of an event, Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall only be eligible for the section entered.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the open team irrespective of the section nominated for.

In addition to open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

#### AGE QUALIFICATIONS

VETERANS — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 16, 1988.

JUNIORS -- are those competitors who, on April 16, 1988, will be under the age of 17 years.

#### TIME STARTING

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30 a.m.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be re-squadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the loss of one target.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

#### CARTRIDGES

Cartridges of the competitor's choice may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the carnival at competitive prices.

## TARGETS AND TRAPS

Targets throughout the program are to be black and will be supplied by Olimpyc Targets. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electrically operated. The traps used will be Winchester White Flyers.

#### CLASSIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard.

This applies to trap grades, open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that regrading and rehandicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Ladies, Junior and Veterans who have elected to enter the open section will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as OL, OJ, OV.

#### PRACTICE

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

#### CASH PRIZES






