Many of the performances were achieved at personal cost to those concerned which makes the results more outstanding.

RULE ADDITION

In addition to the rules published January, with amendments published April CTSN, the following rule has now been approved effective April 1, 1988.

RULE 4.20 (k): Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap, will be penalised five (5) targets.

SPORTS TALENT ENCOURAGEMENT PLAN 1988

Athletes from our sport have again been recognised by the Australian Sports Commission with grants of \$8000 being approved for the 1988 year.

Our shooters, all of whom were nominated by the A.C.T.A., together with their Step Award Grants are: Jim Ellis, A.C.T., \$2000, Olympic Trap; Russel Mark, Vic., \$1500, Olympic Trap; John Maxwell, NSW, \$1500, Olympic Trap; Michael Diamond, NSW, \$1500, Olympic Trap; Ian Hale, Vic., \$1500, I.S.U. Skeet.

As a condition of their grant, each recipient will be required to submit two half-yearly reports as well as being prepared to undergo random drug testing during 1988.

A.S.C. Grants under the Step scheme were approved for 94 individual athletes for a total amount of \$230,600 plus 11 teams for an additional \$293,000 were recently announced.

The support of the Australian Sports Commission to our Clay Target Shotgun Discipline is very much appreciated and overall, sport itself is the winner.



THE EVENT

This year the Commonwealth and National Championships were a very special event, not only were they to decide the Commonwealth and National Champions and the Champion of Champions in both Skeet and Trap, they were also to decide:

- the national team champions, both skeet and trench;
- the composition of the National Training Squad;
- the junior champions both skeet and trench;
- the shooters to be put forward to the Olympic Federation.

BRISBANE GUN CLUB

The host club was the Brisbane Club, which has great facilities for I.S.U. shooting, and a club house that provides excellent hospitality. The grounds were in beautiful condition and all those involved must be congratulated on their efforts. The State Secretary and level 2 Coach, Bev Grice, ran the office in her usual efficient and friendly fashion. The tournament ran without a hitch, this was due to the organisation of the director, Jim Kelly and his assistants, who included the members of the Brisbane Gun Club. It was good to have National President, Roy Holtfretter there, he lent a hand where necessary. Well done, Queensland!

OVERSEAS VISITORS

The nationals attracted several overseas visitors, Susan Natrass, the Canadian Champion and friend, a contingent of American shooters, Art Goodman, Quinton and James Bristow and Tom Gloyd. Richard Ferguson and David Williams, N.Z., Alan Maher, New Guinea.

THE COMMONWEALTH TITLE

The numbers were slightly down on last year, but the enthusiasm and skill levels could not have been better.

The Commonwealth Skeet title: These titles are shot over 225 targets now, and Dave Dundon a local Queensland shooter won the Commonwealth Title convincingly. Dave's determination paid off with a great win. Dave shot very consistently, with his worst score being 23/25. He concentrated on the next target, not the other shooters, and this certainly paid off. Ian Hale came second and John Summers third. Mark Agar the leading Junior shot as a senior in this event shooting 209/225.

THE TRENCH TITLE

John Maxwell won the Commonwealth Title with some determined consistent shooting. John must be one of

Australia's all time best I.S.U. shooters, he doesn't give up and deserves the success he has. Domingo Diaz shot 195/200 as did John Maxwell, but John shot 24/25 to Domingo's 23/25 in the final. Robby Thompson came third with brilliant consistent shooting 193 and 24/25.

It was a very exciting match with world class scores, the last Olympics was won with a 193.

The World Champion Junior Team members all shot as Seniors this year to try to secure an Olympic spot. Brett Dunstan and Michael Diamond both shot 189/200, with Brett going into the final six with a 24/25 in the last round. Craig Tilley the Junior from Illawarra, shot extremely well.

It was great to see the State Teams competing in the I.S.U. events.

THE NATIONAL TITLES


By this time in the competition the pressure was really on, not only because of the prestige of the National Title, but because the top shooters over the 400 targets would be our Olympic representatives.

Russell and John once again proved their ability to shoot well in stiff competition and under pressure.

Brett Dunstan and Michael Diamond both entered the National Titles as Seniors, with Brett Dunstan shooting 186 and Michael 185. Craig Tilley won the junior event with Fillipo Petrella second and Mark Grosvenor third.

Michael Inguanti is a new member of the senior skeet team but has been a member of the national training squad as a junior since 1985 and has represented Australia at the World Championships in Italy as a junior. He has improved each year and finished 2nd in Australia this year. Michael is a tenacious competitor and has a tremendous future in the senior ranks.

It was very rewarding to see the high standard of shooting in Brisbane, all of those shooters who have won Masters Medals can be justly proud of them. Stan Collins kindly donated the Masters Medals, many thanks to Stan, a great supporter of I.S.U. over the years.

The donors of all the trophies must be thanked and congratulated. Olympic disciplines are shot by people who, on a whole, do not expect much in the way of rewards, but it was heartening to see the support from many sponsors in Brisbane. Serg Zuffo is a great supporter, and this year the Carindale Hotel/Motel donated most generously.

1988 is a year that we can all look forward to. More and more shooters are coming to realise the challenge of the Olympic Disciplines, and that it is a truly International sport, indeed one of the sports that Australia can boast of having world class athletes competing in. It is going to be great in '88 for our I.S.U. shooters.

SNIPPETS FROM EARLIER DAYS

The accompanying photo has been loaned to me by Bill Atwood and the only information he could give me was that it was taken around 35 years ago at possibly Rainbow or Sealake Gun Club in Western Victoria. Unfortunately, he could not put names to any of the shooters, however, I've been able to recognise a couple of young looking guys in Tom Lucas, with his son Robert on his knee, and Alf Hall, first on left front row kneeling. I think also Kelvin Mark. Can anyone put a few more names to the picture? Note the number of side by side double barrel guns. The over-under trap gun was just commencing to appear on the Australian market around this time.

For quite some time after World War 2 the Australian trap shooter had to make do with the English side by side double barrel game shooting gun. One other choice was the tested and proven F.N. Browning 5 Shot Auto used by a great many shooters who liked its easy pointing qualities and reduced recoil effect, plus its low cost, compared to the double barrel side by side.





She, like so many of us, believes that although the man may have gone, his memory and influence lives on through the many and varied ways in which he helped in the development of clay target shooting in Queensland.






