1988 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS


With the Trap Nationals returning to New South Wales in a year of unsettlement so far as gun licensing laws were concerned it was anticipated that there could well be a drop in attendance.

This, in fact, was the case with shooters being down in numbers from what was expected. With the uncertainty that did exist, particularly in New South Wales, the attendances we achieved were more than satisfactory.

The host club Wagga had prepared the shooting grounds in fine style and the new club house which was officially opened on Friday, 15th April, by Mr Joe Schipp, the state member for Wagga, was ready and waiting.

The weather was perfect, grounds in excellent condition and in this regard we must thank the Wagga Gun Club and the very willing club members for the work that had obviously taken place in the months preceding the National Championships.

In opening the '88 Championships Mr Schipp also added his tribute to the work undertaken by the Wagga Gun Club as did the Mayor of Wagga Wagga, Mr Ron Harris, and then passed on the honor of firing the opening shot to John Harding, Regional Director of Sport and Recreation, who despite his enthusiasm found the target difficult to break.

Resplendent in their State Team jackets, teams from all states competed in the opening event.



39TH GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

Major Sponsor — Wagga Boat and Sports Centre With only the one possible being achieved, Victorian

shooter Len Cook (18m) from Sebastopol outshot the field of 447 to become the first National titleholder for 1988. In second place was another Victorian in Robert Chris-

topher from Point Cook who recorded his 58/59. Also from the 18m mark with 13m shooter Scott Monahan from Hermidale delighted with his third placing.

Competition from metreage positions was very keen as was the competition to decide the section winners. New Zealand's evergreen 'Ted McRae showed his shooting prowess and discipline versatility to take the veterans section from 17m with a 49/51. A popular winner in the ladies section was Pt Cook's Carmel Carlon also from 17m with an excellent 49/50, with New South Wales junior Mark Piotrowski from the 12m mark putting his name into the record book with a score of 54/56.

36TH NATIONAL DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

Event Sponsor — Winchester Division, Olin Australia In keeping with tradition, this event attracted the

highest number of entrants over the championships. Receiving total sponsorship from Winchester the Double Barrel produced no less than 66 possibles from a field of 528 which included 13 visitors from New Zealand who as always were most welcome.

After many targets had been thrown the shoot-off was reduced to a field of three in Arthur Turner (Dubbo), John Murphy (Tas) and Doug Smith (Qld). All eyes were on Doug Smith who was determined to go one better than '87 and take out the D/B title.

First of the trio to depart the scene was Arthur Turner who dropped his 401st. Tasmanian Executive Member John Murphy who by now had well and truly surpassed his best ever break kept up the pressure and it was not until the 443rd target that the winner was decided. Doug Smith had done it again and with his 443/443 was the 1988 National Champion.

A great effort by all and a well-deserved victory to Doug who provided a lesson for all with his concentration and consistency.

Junior Champion 1988 — Michael Diamond, Illawarra, New South Wales, 52/52, 26 competitors.


34TH SINGLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP



With qualifying points scores recorded from 243/250 to a high 249/250, all was set for a good score to be achieved in the teams match.




28TH DOUBLE RISE CHAMPIONSHIP

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HIGH GUNS


With Michael Diamond and Adrian Cousens of Victoria tying for the Overall High Gun the final result was decided in a shoot-off.

National High Gun Champ Michael Diamond.





STATE COACHING DIRECTORS

Tasmania and South Australia have changed their State Coaching Directors, Robby Elmer of Tasmania and Hillary Baynes of South Australia have resigned. The shooters from both those states will thank Hillary and Robby for their efforts. I certainly thank them for their support.

Stuart Browning is the new State Coaching Director for Tasmania and Don Stevens for South Australia. Both Stuart and Don have been involved with the National Coaching Scheme for several years. Stewart is well known and respected in Tasmania and those South Australians who have not yet met Don Stevens will soon find that Don is an excellent coach and coach administrator. Shooters in the Northern Territory will remember Don from the period that he was Zone Coach in the Territory.

I welcome both Don and Stuart to the National Coaching Council. The shooters from both Tasmania and South Australia will benefit greatly from their experience and talents. Congratulations to you both.

1988 OLYMPIC GAMES

The Olympic Federation cut the Australian Shooting Team for the 1988 Olympics from 17 shooters to 12. This is even though the four shooting disciplines had won 17 quota spots in regional and international competition. Pistol was reduced from six shooters to three, Small Bore from five shooters to four. Running Bore maintained its one position, and sadly the I.O.F. reduced our team to four shooters from the initial five. The Olympic shooting team is:

Clay Target: John Maxwell, Russell Mark and Domingo Diaz, Olympic Trap; and Ian Hale, Skeet.

Small Bore: Don Brooks, Alan Smith, Wolfgang Jobst and Alison Feast.

Running Game: Bryan Wilson.

Pistol: Philip Adams, Ben Sandstrom and Val Winter.

I am honored that I have been appointed overall coach for the Olympic team, and will do my very best to assist the shooters to bring home the medals. Ian Bridge, a pistol shooter, has been appointed manager of the shooting team.

I firmly believe that had the I.O.F. permitted us to take the extra shooter, Michael Inguanti, he would have been a great competitor and made the team much stronger by his presence. Michael will be there next time, and show how good he is. It is a great disappointment to us all that the I.O.F. changed its policy, because of financial restrictions, so late in the day.

While on the topic of the Olympics, I have been reading a very interesting article written by the Russian coach which coincides with my own thinking. He says that the Russian team, like so many of the other world teams, had been through a period of relying heavily on psychological methods and had cut back on their training time. They have found that it does not pay off. Practice, regular training and competition develop their own psychological benefits and the shooter goes into competition with confidence based on the knowledge that the competitor can perform to the required standard.

DOUBLE TRAP

Double Trap is a new Olympic discipline. It is designed as a spectator sport, and is easily televised. The Olympic team and myself are going to Europe in May for the championships in Suhl, East Germany, Yugoslavia and Italy. The A.O.F. will be funding the trip; besides being great training for the team it will give the shooters an opportunity to shoot Double Trap. I think it is important that all of our shooters have the opportunity to start shooting this new discipline.

DOWN THE LINE NATIONALS

The D.T.L. Nationals must be one of the major sporting events in Australia each year. Few sports attract the numbers that our sport does to its national championships, not as spectators but as competitors. They were a great success again this year and all involved must be congratulated. The standard of shooting was high and the conditions excellent. The nationals give me a chance to meet and talk to shooters from all over Australia. Those two stars Michael Diamond and Doug Smith were shining again, and there were many great individual performances.

LEVEL THREE ACCREDITATION

Several of the State Coaching Directors have successfully completed their Level 3 accreditation. Congratulations to Bill Stevens, Col Burt, Hillary Baynes and Murray Alexander. Greg Chan will complete his Level 3 this year. These coaches now have experience at both national and international level, in administration and practical coaching. Our sport is extremely fortunate to have such highly qualified and dedicated coaches. Well done.



DOUBLE TRAP

The new shotgun shooting event David Menck National Rules Supervisor Olympic Disciplines

During the past few years, brief mention has been made in numerous articles from the U.I.T. (the world shooting body), that shotgunners throughout the world were not satisfied with only having two events, trap and skeet, and when compared with the other shooting disciplines of rifle and pistol, which each have more events at such major competitions as World Championship and Olympic Games, the olay target shooting events were becoming less important.

As a result of this, the section committee for shotgun shooting, were given the opportunity to create a new Olympic Discipline shotgun shooting event, and this has now happened.

The new event is DOUBLE TRAP.

Double Trap has been developed by Mr Conny Wirnhier of West Germany, who was the Gold Medal winner in ISU Skeet at the 1972 Munich Olympic Games, in conjunction with Mr Andriano Laciolo, a member of the UIT Technical Committee, and in developing this event, they have considered many matters including the cost of setting up a facility; the amount of time it takes to conduct a competition; television, spectator and media appeal; environmental and competitor safety, etc.

Double Trap is exactly what it indicates, Double Rise shooting, but with a difference.

The event is conducted either over an existing Olympic Trap (Trench) facility, or over a new traphouse about 12 metres long, located at ground level the same as Olympic Trap or Ball Trap. Two clay target throwing machines are set in the traphouse to throw simultaneous doubles.

Trap number one, which would be situated where number seven trap would be in an Olympic Trap layout, is set to throw a single target between 70 and 72 metres at a height of 3.5 metres measured 10 metres from the trap.

The second trap, an oscillating type 'continental or ball trap', is situated a maximum of 1.2 metres to the right of the first trap, and throws a 'continental' type target between 65 and 67 metres with a minimum height of 3.0 metres and a maximum height of 4.0 metres.

The effect of this combination of traps is that unlike Double Rise shooting as we know it, the targets are travelling much faster and further, and are higher. Double Trap angles are also considerably less than our standard double rise targets, with the oscillating trap only throwing 15 degrees either side of centre.

The event is shot squad fashion across the tracks from 15 metres (straight tracks as for Olympic Trap, not curved as for DTL), and shooters shot at 25 pairs at each visit. A normal day's event is 150 targets (75 pairs) with a final being conducted for the top six shooters of a further 25 pairs.

An international event over two days would consist of 250 targets (125 pairs) with a further 25 pairs being thrown for the top six 'finalists'.

Team events are conducted over 150 pairs per shooter, three shooters per team. A total of 450 pairs per team.

Scoring for the event is the same as it is in standard Double Rise shooting, with a broken pair being scored as one-and-one, one target being broken as 'one' only and lostand-lost if neither of the pair are broken.


As an aid to pollution and environmental control, and for comfort and safety of the competitors, the maximum load allowable for this event has been set at 28.0 grams of lead shot, with maximum shot size not to exceed 2.5mm. In layman's terms, this is 10z of Number 7 shot. This has been stipulated in order to reduce the amount of lead used (and the cost), and also to reduce recoil and noise.

As yet, an International Championship has not been

conducted in Double Trap — the first will be held at Bologna, Italy on 13th June, the same day as the N.S.W. I.S.U. Sub-Committee will be holding the Eastern States Double Trap Championship at Canberra International Gun Club. The Eastern States Championship will be held in conjunction with the N.S.W. I.S.U. Fund Raising Carnival, and will be 75 pairs (150 targets).

Double Trap will not be an event for the 'faint hearted', but will certainly be an event for those of us who relish a challenge. A minimum of 75 pairs of Double Trap using loz of shot will certainly prove a challenge to those of us who are 'fair dinkum'.


Nineteen shooters from Port August, Minlaton, Mallala and Adelaide as well as locals turned out to christen the new layout without a possible being shot.


It is hoped that the new trap will encourage greater shooter attendance as it now brings the club into line with all other clubs.

RIFLE SHOOT AT VICTORIAN GUN CLUB

After the introduction of recent legislation concerning the use of firearms in Victoria, there was some talk at committee level at the Victorian Gun Club of cancelling the pre-arranged shoot involving firearms as prizes in each grade. After much discussion, the committee finally agreed to attempt to run the shoot within the new guidelines of the Victorian Legislation.

The Central Firearms Registry at Flinders Lane, Melbourne, was contacted and the question put to them as to how we could legally run the proposed shoot. A Mr Hay from the Firearms Registry pondered the problem and finally returned with the following instructions:

- 1. A Permit to Purchase each firearm must be obtained from the local Police Station, and the firearm is purchased in the Club's name. The firearm must be registered in the Club's name
- 2. before the shoot.
- 3. After the shoot, another Permit to Purchase must be obtained for the winner of the firearm. The usual Police clearances apply.
- The firearm can then be registered in the name of the 4. winner.

So, with the list of instructions and an ambition to make the shoot succeed, the committee set about planning the shoot. The Event where the rifles were to be the prizes turned out to be one of our most pleasing and simple that




At the Nationals our team did us proud and came in second to W.A. on a countback being two points down, 360/375.


SOUTH-EAST ZONE PREMIER TEAMS EVENT — ROUND ONE


WAGGA GUN CLUB OVER \$3.2 MILLION SPENT AT WAGGA NATIONALS

GUN SAFETY

Recently my attention has been drawn to the number of new shooters joining gun clubs who lack an adequate understanding of safety regulations and on-range etiquette. The following list is intended to help new members participate safely and perhaps refresh some older members' memories.

SAFETY RULES

- 1. Guns must be carried unloaded, with breach open, at all times.
- 2. No gun shall be put to the shoulder, or aimed in any way, except when the shooter is located as follows: a) on the tracks
 - b) on the pattern plate
 - c) under direction of a qualified coach.
- 3. The gun will only be pointed towards the trap area or towards the pattern plate or at the instruction of a qualified coach.
- 4. The gun will only be loaded and the breach closed when the shooter is positioned facing the trap, or pattern plate, and standing on their correct mark, and
 - a) There are NO shooters or other people or animals in front of the shooter's mark. (This must be strictly

adhered to in handicap shooting).

- b) There is NO red flag showing from the trap house, c) And it is the shooter's turn to shoot.
- 5. Immediately on shooting from any station the gun will be opened, and unloaded while still pointed in the direction of the target area.
- 6. In the event of an apparent misfire or gun malfunction, the shooter will keep the gun pointed in the direction of the target area, and call the referee's attention.
- 7. No more than two cartridges shall be loaded at any time in automatic or magazine guns.
- 8. When shooting D.T.L. or Olympic Trap and moving from No. 5 track to No. 1 track, and in skeet when moving from lane to lane guns shall be unloaded, with breach open. Shooters will pass behind the other shooters and the referee.
- 9. On the appearance of a red flag at the trap house, or any unexplained movement in front of the shooters, all shooters will immediately unload.
- 10. All cartridges shall contain shot size No. 6 or smaller (skeet No. 9 or smaller).
- 11. The wearing of thongs while shooting is not permitted.
- 12. Persons under the influence of alcohol will not be permitted to shoot.
- 13. In handicap events shooters must wait until shooters in front of them have shot and retired before loading.
- 14. Shooters are expected to be in control of and responsible for both their guns and cartridges at all times.

EVERY GUN SHOULD BE TREATED AS A LOADED GUN


Every shooter should also be aware of the "etiquette" of club shooting. The following points are important as they promote a friendly and organised club atmosphere.

ETIQUETTE OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

- 1. Your President and Committee are HONORARY. They respect your constructive criticism and expect your assistance and co-operation.
- It is your duty to ascertain your squad and shooting layout, and to be on time.
- 3. Do not walk, talk, fidget, or otherwise behave objectionably when it is the next shooter's turn to shoot. Do not stand behind the referee and behave in any way that may distract the shooters. This is common courtesy.
- 4. Do not move from your track until the next shooter has fired. Do not leave the shooting ground until the last shooter has fired his last shot.
- 5. Do not obstruct the referee's view. Always walk behind him, if possible.
- Do not engage in horseplay whilst in possession of a firearm.
- 7. This is your club; do not damage or pollute it in any way.
- 8. Dress in a neat and tidy manner.
- Remember, it is a sport and you are expected to 9. conduct yourself in a sportsman/sportswoman-like fashion.
- 10. Referees are honorary and human, and you are expected to abide by their decisions.
- 11. Limit your vehicle speed to 8 k.p.h. within club grounds. 3

Clay target shooting as a sport has maintained an excellent safety record over its long history. It is the responsibility of each and every club member to know and obey the safety regulations. The officials, coaches and referees also have a responsibility to enforce the safety regulations at all times. Our excellent safety record maintained in this potentially dangerous sport is testimony to the vigilance of our shooters in the past. Clay Target Shooting is a safe sport - let's all work together to keep it - Peter Quire that way.

LOOKING BACK **1982 OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Fine double to Ellis . . . Hale makes amends in Commonwealth Skeet Title.

The 1982 National and Commonwealth Olympic Discipline Championships were conducted at Brisbane Gun Club over the Easter period.

The National Championships were used by the Commonwealth Games Foundation as a "dress rehearsal" to test officials and equipment.

Sixty-six shooters were squadded on Easter Saturday to commence battle for the 1982 National Olympic Trap Championships. First round possibles came from Connolly, Rumbel, Budd and Flower. At the end of 75 targets, World silver medallist Jim Ellis had hit the front on 73/75, Seymour and B. Lowry were one target behind, with Long, G. Stevens and Flower on 71.

A second 73 on day two put Jim Ellis two in front of Greg Long, with Rumbel and Collinson three targets further back on 141. Porter, Lowry and Collins were tied together on 140.

The final 50 targets saw Jim Ellis drop two to win the gold medal with 194/200. Greg Long took the silver two targets behind Ellis on 192, and John Porter shot 49/50 on the last day to win the bronze medal with a final tally of 189. These were good scores as intermittent showers throughout the three days made conditions difficult.

The equipment worked well in both trenches, after slight modification by Public Works Department officers.

A field of 23 faced the starter in the National I.S.U. Skeet Championship.

John Woolley of New Zealand ran the first day clean to lead by one target from Alex Crikis, with Ian Hale one further back on 73. Cameron was on 72, Summers 71 and Boyd, the 1981 holder, on 70.

Ian Hale shot them all in the second 75 to lead Woolley by one with Crikis in third place on 146. Boyd improved his position with a brilliant 75 to add to his first day's 70, while Summers had trouble again carding 71.

Day three, the final 50 targets, Woolley again shot brilliantly breaking them all to card 197/200. Hale dropped two and had to settle for the silver medal, one target behind on 196, with Alex Crikis taking the bronze medal with a score of 194.




