

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Planning is well under way for the 1988 National Skeet Championships which will be held at Melbourne Gun Club from November 17-November 20.

This time of the year generally produces fine weather. This, when coupled with the often heard comment that "Melbourne is the home of skeet shooting in Australia" augurs well for a successful and enjoyable competition for those who decide to shoot the Four Day Nationals Program.

One of the National titles, the Skeet Doubles Championship, will have a new trophy for perpetual competition. The actual trophy which was won in competition by the Inaugural Doubles Champion, Paul Johnson of Victoria, is very complementary to the trophies to be shot for and is a very welcome addition to the A.C.T.A. trophy cabinet. Paul is to be commended for his thoughtful gesture and will no doubt be endeavouring to have his name inscribed as the 1988 winner — thanks Paul for your contribution to this National Title Event.

Other happenings of recent times include the meeting of the various Committees of the Association and the all important election of office bearers to see us through another year.

With retiring President, Roy Holtfreter, having previously announced his intention not to seek reappointment, Jim Scott from the Orana Gun Club in Dubbo, New South Wales, was unanimously elected to the position of National President of the Association.

Jim has been an active shooter and worker for the sport at both State and National level for many years and his commitment to the Presidency will quickly be noticed.

Following a ballot for the Vice Presidency, Leighton Martin from International Gun Club in South Australia was elected as Jim's Vice President and we wish them both well in the demanding positions they have been elected to.

Again a ballot took place for the two remaining positions on the Management Committee and elected to Management were Tim Catling from Katanning in Western Australia and Townsville Gun Club member, Neil Hardy.

Both Neil and Tim have a wealth of experience in the sport and will serve the Association well during their term of office.

With no less than five members attending their first committee meeting, one could have expected that the input to the meeting would not have been as great as on previous occasions. It is pleasing, therefore, to report that all new members settled in very quickly and without exception played a contributing role to the success of the meeting.

Those welcomed for their first meeting were John McVitty (Vic), Richard Brook (Qld), Jim Bitossi and Bob Fox (N.T.) and Ross Silvester (W.A.). Rejoining the Executive following the resignation of Victoria's two members L. Connors and R. McDonald was Jack Matthey from Beaufort.

All of these new members will be introduced to members in forthcoming issues of the C.T.S.N. and we wish them all well as they contribute to the development of the sport.

On a sadder note was the news that long serving Executive Member and Past President, Laurie Connors, was resigning from all positions at State and National level. Those who have come to know Laurie over the years will realise that his departure along with that of Roy Holtfreter leaves a gap in experience that will be difficult to fill.

For my part, Laurie was very supportive at my introduction to the sport as Executive Director. I shudder to think what those early months would have been like without his support and guidance and I thank him for the

part that he played in enabling me to come to grips with a sport that I was totally unfamiliar with.

Thanks Laurie, we all hope that you will still be seen "around the traps" to use your own words and look forward to receiving news from you for the C.T.S.N. if you are able to find the time.

Nationals dates for the next few years were decided upon and they are:

TRAP: 1989: Victoria, at Echuca; 1990: Tasmania, at Evandale via Launceston; 1991: South Australia at the Virginia Park Complex; 1992: New South Wales; 1993: Western Australia at the Whitman Park Complex.

SKEET: 1989: New South Wales — Wagga Wagga (to be confirmed); 1990: Victoria — Melbourne (to be confirmed); 1991: Queensland — Townsville.

I.S.U.: 1989: Victoria; 1990: Western Australia.

The A.C.T.A. Presidential Medal was the subject of review and the decision was taken to increase the number of medals which may be presented in any one year from one to three.

A recommendation to form a National Rules Committee was discussed at great length and subsequently approved. This Committee which is comprised of three members from the National Executive Committee, namely John Murphy (Tas), Robert Smith (NSW) and Tim Catling (WA) will assume the responsibility on recommendations that may be made to introduce or make alterations to the Shooting Rules.

This responsibility was previously in the hands of the Referees Association who were mainly responsible for the recent revamping of the Rules, a long and tedious exercise for which they have been congratulated.

The procedure that will now apply is that the Referees Association will operate as a consultative body to the Rules Committee and will advise of their thoughts on all matters pertaining to the Rules prior to recommendations being presented to the Executive — we believe the new system will work well for the sport.

Another Committee to be restructured was the National Shooting Committee which previously comprised two Executive members, National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, and three shooters representatives drawn from the total membership.

This Committee will now comprise two members from the National Executive, National Coaching Director, and three shooters representatives, each representing a distinct discipline and not elected from members of the National Executive.

Elected to the National Shooting Committee were Robert Smith (NSW Executive) Chairman, Tim Catling (W.A. Executive), David Menck (N.S.W. I.S.U.), Bob Dower (S.A. Skeet) and Peter Hayman (N.S.W. Trap), plus the appointment of Peter Quire in his capacity as National Coaching Director.

Should you, as a shooter, wish to have any matter raised at meetings of this Committee then these are the men to speak with. Please bear in mind that while as shooters representatives they will be acting on behalf of all members, David, Bob and Peter have been elected to represent a particular discipline which is in their field of expertise.

Correspondence that may be forthcoming will be forwarded to the members of this Committee through the National Office.

Another decision of great importance was the establishment of a property debenture program.

This program has been set in operation to ensure the long term stability of the Association with the eventual purchase of a property suitable to the needs of the sport.

Details of the debenture program are published separately in the C.T.S.N. and the early support that has been advised is more than just encouraging, it is an indication that the decision is a correct one and one that will serve members well for many years to come.

Please give it your fullest consideration and for those

who wish to become a part of the program, advice of your intentions will be welcomed.

Registration fees for 1989 were discussed at great length with the decision taken to accept the recommendation from the Management Committee to restrict any rise to a figure in keeping with the National C.P.I.

As from 1st December when registrations will be accepted for 1989, registrations will be Full Member \$37.00, a rise of \$2.00 or 5.7%, Second Family Members and Veterans over the age of 65, or 60 with 30 years of continuous service, \$21.00 which is an increase of \$1.00 or 5%, with no increase in Junior Registrations, remaining at \$10.00.

One of the major decisions taken was the one to introduce an Accident Insurance Policy covering all members. This insurance is in addition to our obligatory Public Liability Insurance and should be welcomed by all shooters.

Obviously there is a cost involved and in this case the cost is \$3.50 per member which will be met by debiting each and every club on a per member basis.

The policy is planned for introduction as from 1st August and will provide benefits within the policy conditions of \$40,000 in the event of a death occurring and \$400 per week whilst injured and not receiving weekly income.

Full details by way of a summary of the policy conditions will be published in the C.T.S.N. as soon as the policy has been finalised.

The decision to introduce this form of member protection was not one lightly made, clubs had been advised of the investigation that was taking place and requested to voice their opinions at the last Annual General Meeting.

With an almost 100% acceptance by member clubs at that time to introduce this form of insurance the matter of payment was the only contentious issue.

The per capita club membership was most favoured by the Annual Meeting and this is the method that has been adopted following the recommendation made at the Annual Meeting by member clubs to the National Executive Committee.

Club membership at 30th June will be the basis of club payment, this will be reconciled annually at 31st December with any new members registered after 30th June being debited to the club account.

The Executive believe that the introduction of an Accident Insurance Policy is in the best interest of all members. This view is shared by the fact that clubs have given an almost unanimous acceptance to the proposal since the idea was first promoted.

We certainly do not wish for a claim on the policy to be the contributing factor in receiving total unanimous acceptance—the lack of claims against the policy is what we are aiming for as this will ensure an accident free period for all clubs and leave shooters free and able to enjoy their chosen sport.

Another new innovation is the introduction of a facsimile machine, again a recommendation to the Executive from member clubs at the Annual Meeting.

The Fax Number is (03) 807 2716 and for those with access to a personal fax, the opportunity to use a commercial fax or even the Australia Fost Public Fax facility, the ease of ensuring that your information is received at the National Office without undue delay will be a decided asset.

As far as the receipt of notices and the like for the CTSN is concerned, the fax will now allow a little more time for clubs to prepare their notices and still guarantee they have been despatched for delivery by the copy deadlines.

Please make use of this fax facility which has been installed at your request for your convenience.

I am pleased to be able to advise that Queensland

Executive Member, Neil Hardy, has been granted an Honorary Life Registration for his service to the sport and his service over the last 10 years as a member of the National Executive Committee.

Neil, a dentist by profession, has given freely of his time over his years at National Level and continues to do so. This is seen in 1988 by his election to the four member Management Committee where his judgement and experience will hold him in good stead as he continues his involvement on behalf of all shooters.

Congratulations Neil for the honour you have had bestowed on you and we trust that your Honorary Life Registration is enjoyed for many years.

Membership has continued to increase, due no doubt to the situation that existed in N.S.W. and to a continuing degree in Victoria and other states.

At the time of writing membership has passed the 10,000 mark and we certainly hope that the new members that we have received participate in the sport at all levels and remain with the Association for as long as they continue to be known as shooters.

If you see new faces around your club or wherever you may be, please make them welcome and share with them one of your greatest treasures, friendship.

A new member can be lost quite easily by not being made welcome and while we all believe that we make new shooters welcome at all times, experience tells us that this isn't always the case.

By helping a new shooter to enjoy his or her sport you will also reap the pleasure of their success, why not try it at your next opportunity?

Your attention is also drawn to one of the conditions of entry for all State and National title competitions. This condition has been the subject of review and change many times. At last it is felt that the correct mix has been achieved. Please be aware of the decision that has been made which in effect is:

The overall trophy can only be won by the payment of a full nomination. By winning the overall, a shooter shall then be declared ineligible for grade and or section trophies (Lady, Junior, Veteran).

For other than overall, shooters shall be eligible for grade and section trophies for all events providing a full nomination has been paid.

Shooters electing to pay a reduced nomination shall only be eligible for the section of the event entered.

In closing I must make mention of the recently formed Australian Skeet Shooters Association. The A.C.T.A. did receive a request from the solicitors representing the Skeet Shooters Association for permission to register the name "Australian Skeet Shooters Association".

This request was made following receipt of correspondence from the Corporate Affairs Department which pointed out the similarity in the name and objects of the Skeet Association to the Australian Clay Target Association.

As the matter had been formally brought to the attention of the A.C.T.A. it was the decision of the Executive that permission for use of the name requested could not be agreed to. This decision was made in the best interest of all members owing to the correspondence received from the Corporate Affairs Department in Victoria and for no other reason.

This information has been advised to the parties concerned who will now need to become incorporated under a different title than was contemplated.

A lengthy report of the involvement of members elected to represent you at National Level — their attention to the matter at hand is a reminder to all of their commitment to the sport.

Good shooting in the months ahead.

RULE BOOK CHANGES

Please note the following amendments to the Rules as published in the Official Rule Book, printed effective April 1st, 1988

Guidelines for Referees: Page 4 Number 9

(1) Delete the wording "or any time competitors or other personnel are in front of him".

Trap Shooting Rules: Page 28, 2.3(f)

(2) The first sentence has been amended to read: "In a group handicap event shot from handicap marks, the winner of each group will be handicapped one metre providing they have shot the possible".

DEBENTURE **PROGRAM**

AN INVITATION TO MEMBERS ONLY

A legal document is being prepared to allow for the implementation of a Property Debenture Program to allow the Association to purchase a building to establish a permanent home for the administration of the sport and to cater for the needs of its members.

The following clauses along with any other legal requirements will be included in the Debenture Document:

- A. Debentures to be of a minimum of \$1,000 or multiples thereof.
- B. In the event of a debenture holder's death occurring, the debenture to be immediately available to the deceased estate-
- C. In the event of a syndicated debenture holder's death occurring, the payment of any syndicated share will be the responsibility of the remaining syndicate members.
- D. Debentures to be for a maximum period of ten (10) years.
- Debentures to be repaid within a ten (10) year period (maximum) in accordance with annual results achieved by the Association.
 F. A maximum of 150 debentures be available at \$1,000 each or alternatively a total debenture issue of \$150,000.
- G. Interest to be paid annually at a fixed interest rate of 7.5% with 1st December being the effective date.
- H. Secured by floating charge.
- Assets constituting security, A.C.T.A. Building Fund Investments.
 Floating security to become a fixed security on the purchase of property for the purposes specified in the debenture invitation to members.

Applications from registered shooters, clubs, Zone and State Associations are now being received and will continue to be received up to and including 30th November.

OBITUARY MR JOHN HOUSTON

FROM GEORGE BIGGS

One of the best known personalities of the Hay district, Mr John Houston, of "Budgewah" and "Tongul" passed away on Wednesday, June 1 at the age of 87 years.

John Houston will be remembered by the many hundreds of clay target shooters that visited the Hay Gun Club over the years especially the very popular Annual Easter Shoot.

Shooters came from all over to shoot in the Easter Carnival, the grand prize for the main event being a motor car. The social event of the program was the dance on Saturday night and a wonderful barbecue on Sunday at "Tongul" on the banks of the Murrumbidgee River. John was the most gracious host.

One occasion I will never forget was shooting in the Car Shoot one easter. The conditions were 30 birds double barrel from handicap marks. My handicap was 27 yards and I missed my 30th target. Was my face red! I couldn't find a hole big enough to fall into. Over the years my family and I spend many enjoyable hours with John and his family.

John Houston was President of the Australian Clay Target Association from 1957-1961. His interest in clay target was keenly Australia wide. He was a much respected and popular person. He was a member of the Mackintosh International Team on several occasions and a honorary life registration member.

John Houston was a foundation member of the Hay Historical Society and a long time President.

Many members of the A.C.T.A. will recall that he collected antique pistols and firearms for many years. It was his intention, since realised, for the collection to be housed and displayed in the Hay Museum, established in the old Hay Gaol.

Mr Houston was a member of the Committee of Management and an Elder of the Hay Presbyterian Church for many years, and also on the Council of the Hay Students Hostel, Claughton House. He was a long serving President of the Hay Branch of the Far West.

His great love in sport was hunting, shooting and fishing in the bush. He re-established the old clay target shooting, Hay Gun Club, and presided for many years as it became one of the leading clubs in Australia. For three years he was the Australian President of the Australian Clay Target Shooting Association.

Mr Houston's civic activities earned him the distinction of being awarded the first citizen of the year award by the Hay Apex Club.

In a personal tribute, during the service at St Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Brough Gibson recalled some of the happy memories of picnics in the hopbush near "Kangaroo", a tune on the mouth organ, a sing-song around the piano, his cooking breakfast for visitors and barbecues on the river, of finding a duck, quail, pig, yabby or kangaroo tail in the coolroom on Tongul.

He mentioned local graziers' interest in his legends about "grey birds" as a sign of rain, and "green pick on the sandhills at Lamorna by Queen Victoria's birthday, 24th May, as an omen for a good or bad winter".


Mr Gibson concluded by saying that "Jack" was one of the most unforgettable characters he had ever met, an opinion shared by many.

Mr Houston is survived by his wife, Dorothy, son David and grandchildren Lani and Rowan and sisters Miss Marjorie and Noreen (Mrs N.R. Smith) all of Hay.

Brothers, Hillis and James (Max) predeceased him.

The service at the church and graveside was conducted by Rev Jonathon Boyall.

Children of Claughton House and Hay Gun Club members formed a guard of honor.





HANDICAP CARDS AND SCORE RECORDING

Rule 2.1(J) "No shooter, other than those awaiting the issue of a card after registering for the first time, shall be allowed to enter in any competition unless he submits his card to the designated club official on each shooting day. However, if a shooter has lost his card he shall be allowed to compete providing he is registered with the A.C.T.A."

This rule on producing a handicap card when competing is self-explanatory and further explained in 2.1(K)(L)(M).

Rule 2.1(H) "It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results and after each 200 targets, regrade the shooter if necessary."

Complaints are being received that in many instances these rules are not being complied with.

In the best interests of the sport, please ensure that you continue to comply with the shooting rules and if you happen to be an offender, please remember the rules are made for one and all and not all and one.

UNREGISTERED SHOOTERS — RULE 4.16D

Club administrators and all registered shooters are requested to ensure that they comply with Rule 4.16D of the current rule book which reads:

"All competitors must be registered by the A.C.T.A. before taking part in competition. Unregistered shooters are not permitted to compete at any time."

Should this rule not be complied with any matter that may arise concerning insurance would be jeopardized owing to the non-compliance with the rules.

While this is one factor that must be addressed, the other important one is that registered shooters provide the backbone of the sport and unregistered shooters should not be able to take advantage of facilities etc. that they have not and are not contributing to.

If you know that you are shooting in a squad with an unregistered shooter who does not fit the categories covered by insurance, then he/she is placing you at considerable risk despite the fact that you are complying with the rules — it's worth thinking about isn't it?

WAGGA GUN CLUB — NATIONAL TRAPPERS HAVE A SHOT!

The Wagga Gun Club extended an invitation to all the trappers who trapped at the Nationals in April for an afternoon of shooting.

The hard working trappers quite often go without a mention or thanks, so the Wagga Club provided the clays and Winchester the shells all free of charge.

The trapping was done by the Kooringal Rotary with assistance from the Wagga Army and RAAF Bases. It was a superb job done, with many working very long hours.

Most of us prefer to shoot at the targets rather than put them on the traps!


The afternoon was enjoyed by all the Army and RAAF boys. They may not have shot the top scores but they sure knew how to put the afternoon tea away!

THE WINCHESTER 275

Ron Forsyth

I was pleasantly surprised to be advised by Winchester, recently that the well known 275 has been resurrected in its familiar gold AA case, and is now back on the market.

The numerical designation of the 275, in case newer shooters are not up with it, indicates its power rating, and the cartridge has a 2% drams equivalent velocity. Most regular shooters will be aware of the rest of the graduated Winchester factory line up for target shooting — the 300, the 325, 350.

The 275 is by definition a load that gives a nominal 1145 fps to 1½ ounces of shot, just as the 3 DE gives 1200 and the 3½ gives 1255. The rating is based purely on speed.

The load is designated as a target proposition, and the samples I received from the factory spoke of the usual Winchester quality control in manufacture. For instance, the shot count in the number seven load averaged out at 384 per load, which is exactly the required nominal figure. In other words, it is accurately loaded, a good start.

The value of the low velocity cartridge for target shooting cannot be overestimated in the hands of average and highly competitive shooters alike. All around the world, trap has been shot successfull by cartridges producing velocities well under 1200 fps.

In looking at the 275, we are in fact now seeing two cartridges. There is little point in speculating on the actual powder used to load them, because Winchester has the facility to use blends that are unavailable to reloaders.

However, it doesn't matter in the least whether it's 452, or faster or slower in burning rate. What matters is that the factory can manipulate its blends for the consistency necessary for regular users to learn its performance in their own guns.

Testing indicated that the cartridge was loaded to 1150 fps, and a mean pressure of 9100 fps. This is moderate by SAAMI standards (of which I will write in detail in a future article). It is these, the American standards, to which Winchester adheres as a means of gaining worldwide quality control.

Why is it two cartridges?

As it comes in shot sizes seven and nine only, the two targeted buyer groups are obviously Down the Line and skeet shooters.

Consequently, it comes as no great surprise to find that the sevens come with the white AA wad and the nine use the AA wide pattern.

This becomes a complication, but not a bad one.

Modern skeet guns, anything other than those with a fairly positive degree of choke which they used to have many years ago, in my experience tend to pattern very similarly from one cartridge to another. Put another way, it's practically impossible to get a skeet gun with a retro choke, or a true cylinder bore, to tighten its patterns. It will resist efforts to tighten up because there is no constriction there for the shot to catch onto at all.

I have to add here that the skeet and cylinder are the only chokings that in my experience are so incapable of changing their patterns with a different diet of components. Now, if you shoot skeet with an improved cylinder, a gun with some small quantity of choke, however negligible it may be, then you do stand to benefit from the wide pattern wad, which will help to override it and give the rapid spread needed for the close ranging skeet targets.

In this way it is easy to understand Winchester's thinking in using the wide pattern wad in the skeet cartridge. There is nothing to lose, and there may well be something to gain, depending on the particular gun in use.

The advantage that this cartridge offers for skeet is that it is offering the lowest recoiling performance on the factory loaded market. In any competition this aspect is just too often overlooked, but a lot less often by the winners than the losers.

Compare it with a faster cartridge. At the twenty metres' breakage of most skeet targets, the slightly reduced velocity of the 275 has no harmful effect whatever on the ability of the load to break the targets; at the same time it recoils less, and is probably going to pattern the same as a harder kicking cartridge. No contest. Among the current range of factory loads I'd use it for preference without hesitation.

It has a place in simulated field as well, just a couple in the loops of your shooting jacket to deal with the close, fast birds, particularly where you need quick recovery for the second barrel.

In looking at the number seven load, we have a different question to confront.

The trap shooter is not blessed with a choke that makes for high quality patterns regardless of what diet he feeds his gun on. If he has, say, an improved modified first barrel, he may have to do a little work in matching cartridge to gun, because such tighter than moderate levels of choking do get patterns to want to head into the area of overtight percentages and inefficient distribution—unless some preventive measures are taken in patterning to find the most suitable combination.

On the other hand, the fifteen metre Down the Line specialist is very much in need of a low recoiling first barrel load, and will benefit from the quicker realignment time if he has to use the second barrel. Just as much as the skeet shooter, he will benefit from the decreased pounding his nervous system has to soak up from recoil.

In the States, the demand for such loads has steadily increased, and extends to 12 gauge one ounce jobs at the same 1145 fps, and the reloading manuals are full of them. They do the work at fifteen metres without any question whatever.

Pattern testing of the 275s in sevens demonstrated that the cartridge when properly used is a delight. Only misuse by the shooter can interfere with their potential. And any cartridge can be misused.

Let me explain. The pattern efficiency scale is able to be broken down into what amounts to five sections — poor, fair, average, good and excellent. Remember, this has nothing to do with pattern percentage, which is a register of how tight the choke is. It is a measure of how well distributed a pattern is, regardless of choke.

Among the test barrels I used for this report, I selected three from different ends of the spectrum — .025", say improved modified, likely to be found in the first barrel of a trap gun; .014", say a light modified; and true cylinder. The last we have already covered. Patterns were just as I would expect from a cylinder — devastating. They always are. The skeet end is well and truly wrapped up.

The .025" improved modified barrel using sevens shot fairly tight (75%) full choke patterns with average to fractionally above average pattern distribution.

The .014" was a different story altogether. It shot to specifications, giving 58%, a light modified, and pattern quality improved noticeably to reach the high average bracket, enough to impart an advantage in the favour of the shooter.

Frankly, this surprised me. The shot used in the 275 is to my knowledge the hardest you can get in Australia, harder in fact than some Italian nickel plated that I compared it with. I rate it as the highest antimony content on our market, and this can mean the shot tends to centrally thicken the patterns.

The factory thinking here is not hard to work out. By reducing velocity to basic target speed they want to keep penetration to a maximum, and so use the hardest shot.

As always with shotgums, there is a trade off, and in this case it goes like this. Harder shot retains energy and patterns tighter down range, but if put through too much choke it will bunch the shot up in the middle. There is a perfectly easy way out of this — use less choke.

As a result of my testing I am very pleased to recommend the 275—I think it is a boon to target shooting. However, if you simply swap over to it from, say 325s, there's a likelihood you may not get the best out of it because your patterns will be prone to tighten up.

In the States, they've recognised this phenomenon for years. It makes me wonder when Australian shooters will wake up to it. The way to go to get the very considerable benefits of this cartridge is to reduce choke to suit it. Any reader with a trap gun too heavily choked to give best results with these low recoiling moderate loads need only have a little choke removed to get the required pattern distribution. About .015" is getting close for good half choke patterns. If you're not confident about a gunsmith who can do a competent job, write to me here at the magazine with a stamped addressed envelope and I'll recommend a couple.

The other group in the shooting community who could readily adopt the 275 with some benefit is the simulated field shooters. Many folk these days have a set of choke tubes at their disposal. The 275 is ideal through an improved cylinder tube, and will give first class results on targets from 25 to 40 yards, which is where most simulated field shooting is done — and, once again, reduce recoil related fatigue, and allow a quick recovery for the second barrel.

At present the 275 has been reinstated in sevens and nines only. I would hope to see it come out in eights, with the standard AA wad, and feel this would increase its usefulness further, both for first barrel trap and particularly for first barrel simulated field.

And what's more, it comes in that tirelessly reloadable gold case. I hope the demand stays high. It's filling an entirely empty gap in the market.
