



THE UNTOLD STORY OF AUSSIE GOLD

THE MEDAL WINNER WHO WASN'T

A piece of our sports history has been discovered and recognised after 87 years. Most Australians will know of Betty Cuthbert, Murray Rose, Marjorie Jackson, Dawn Fraser, Herb Elliot and other Olympic winners of past years. But what about Donald Mackintosh?

In the year 1900 Australia sent three male competitors to the Paris Games. One of them was Donald Mackintosh, at that time classed as one of the best shots in the world. In Paris he won gold medals for game and live bird shooting but, because he was not recognised by the Australian Olympic Federation, Australia did not officially credit him with the honor.

Mackintosh's achievement, in fact, went unrecognised for 87 years, then Brisbane couple Professor Max and Dr Reet Howell, researching a book on Australian gold medal winners, came across his case.

They found an official 1936 A.O.F. history of Australia's participation in the Olympics did not include Mackintosh as a competitor in the 1900 Olympic Games. But other sources including Alexander Weyand's The Olympic Pageant and John Grombach's Olympic Cavalcade of Sport did include the shooter as a gold medal winner.

The Howells decided to clear up the matter and set about obtaining Mackintosh's recognition by the International Olympic Committee.

Their efforts were rewarded when, on September 14, 1987, I.O.C. Secretary-General Francoise Zweifel sent a letter to the authors confirming Mackintosh's medals.

The mystery of Donald Mackintosh's medals is one of the highlights of the Howells' new book — Aussie Gold: The Story of Australia at the Olympics.



- First in Melbourne Gun Club £2000 Handicap shooting 33 birds straight from 33 yards handicap.
- Melbourne Gun Club £100 Challenge Cup, won three times.
- London Gun Club £200 Challenge Cup, three times in succession.
- Paris Gun Club £200 Challenge Cup, three times in succession.
- Grand Prize of Italy, Florence, £1600.
- Grand Prize Aix Les Bains, £1600.
- Championship of Belgium Ostende, £400.
- Grand Prize Monte Carlo, £2000.
- Championship of London Gun Club, £300.
- Grand Prize Milan, Italy, £1600.
- Grand Prize Madrid, Spain, £1600.
- Grand Prize Monte Carlo, £2000.

Donald Mackintosh first visited England in 1896 where he spent a year, returning again in 1900 to spend the next nine years. Donald worthily represented Australia in European and British shooting circles, gaining much prominence as a successful competitor in the most important shooting events in the old world.

DARWIN GUN CLUB ANNUAL SHOOT

The Darwin Gun Club 1988 annual shoot was held over the weekend of 30 July to 1 August. As usual the preliminary events on the previous Thursday night and Friday morning (27-28 July) made the weekend into a fiveday event.

Numbers were a little disappointing, particularly in view of the standard of advertised trophies, but this did not dampen the enthusiasm in what turned out to be a b thoroughly enjoyable shoot.

Thursday night featured the 50 target points Winchester State Night Championship sponsored, of course, by Winchester. Winchester representative and veteran of many Darwin shoots, Dick Ayres, did the honours and presented the trophies. That quiet chap from Melbourne, Tony Bradshaw, took home the Winchester Ranger pump gun and overall sash. Ron Wimshurst was right behind Tony to win A Grade and a fine Winchester hand crafted knife. B Grade was won by Darwin President Bob Fox and C Grade by Brian Aldrick.




Tony Bradshaw receiving his Winchester pump gun from Dick Ayres after the 50 PS Winchester State Night Championship,

Friday morning showed Darwin weather at its best for the 50 target City of Darwin Trench Championship. A generous sponsorship by Telecom enabled us to have antique telephones for trophies. Overall and first in B Grade was Bill Eagle with 48/50. Brett Dunstan won A Grade and veteran Clarrie Copping won C Grade. Only 7 squads shot the Trench leaving plenty of time for DTL practice.

The main shoot was officially opened by the Territory Minister for Tourism and Racing and Gaming, the Hon. Mr Eric Poole on Saturday morning. Eric welcomed all visitors

including ACTA Vice President Leighton Martin and then spoke about the Territory Government's support which enabled the club to shift to its present location and to establish what must be one of the best equipped clubs for its size in the country. (There would be few with a membership of around 60 that can boast a trench, a tower, four DTL and three skeet layouts.) After declaring the shoot open Eric went out on the walks to break the first official clay of the shoot. Many thanks Eric for your time and sportsmanship!

The 10 target single barrel eye opener started in perfect weather but a savage south-easterly wind blew up during the 30 points and persisted on and off all day. The wind gusts caused left swingers to suddenly climb erratically and right swingers to take unpredictable nose dives. Yours truly lost a target which disappeared just as I shot because of a willy-willy. Apparently I was the only mug who did not see it coming! The wind had an obvious effect on scores leaving many shooters shaking their heads in disbelief as targets sailed erratically away unharmed.

Nevertheless Guy Bedington picked up a handy \$400 in the eye opener. Bill Eagle won the 30 points score overall and A Grade and a Winchester rifle. Alan Pobjoy also picked up a rifle in B Grade as did Bob Cook in C Grade. The microwave ovens in the 50 double barrel were taken away by Greg Hipwell (OA & 1st A), local Peter Hoare (1st B) and Russell Evans (1st C). That was Russell's last event as a C Grader as it resulted in his being promoted to B Grade.

The dreaded south-easterly was again prevalent on the following day but perhaps not quite as bad. Nevertheless scores took a hammering and of course that had nothing whatsoever to do with carousing at certain discos and casino the night (sorry morning) before!

Local sports store proprietor and club stalwart, Greg Chan, won the 10 points eye opener and \$400. In the 30 single barrel portable stereos were won by Greg Hipwell (OA & 1st A), Clarrie Copping (1st B), and local Bob Dalgleish (1st C). Steve Atkins won the overall in the 50

double barrel from Greg Hipwell in one of the few good shoot offs in the weekend. Steve, John Blechynden (1st B) and Peter Brammer (1st C) carried off the colour TV sets.

The traditional Calcutta dinner was held on Sunday night. Despite only 59 shooters having nominated for the Calcutta, Darwin auctioneer and former Darwin President Ted Easton and his intrepid team sold over \$3000 worth. Ted's chief spotter, John Franklin, quickly woke up the visitors who had not seen the show before. Ted and his team of three "cockatoos" did a terrific job and made it into a most enjoyable Darwin style night.

The wind was not so bad on the last day, Monday 1 August. Greg Chan made it a profitable weekend by winning the \$400 for the eye opener, 10 single barrel handicap (that sorts them out!).

The 30 target Computer Sales and Leasing Handicap featured truly unusual trophies of gold nuggets for 1st, 2nd and 3rd. These were won by Steve Atkins, David Blechynden and Dick Ahmling respectively. The nuggets were from Territory gold and were presented by Ken Selwood, former Darwin President and now partner in sponsor company Computer Sales and Leasing. Thanks Ken!

The final and major event of the weekend, the 50 double barrel Australian Äirlines Calcutta, was shot as a graded handicap with AA on 18 metres, A on 17, B on 16 and C on 14. Steve Atkins won overall and first in AA Grade after a short shootoff from Larry Dimasi. Ron Smith won A Grade, Graham Carbury B Grade and David Blechynden C Grade. All grade winners picked up return airfares from our major sponsor Australian Airlines.

Local Laney Grove won the ladies high gun and Clarrie Copping won the veterans high gun. Steve Atkins was a clear winner for the overall high gun, the trophy being a handsome engraved watch donated by Fishing and Outdoor World and presented by Greg Chan. Thanks Greg!

The advertised duck and goose hunting for Tuesday 2nd did not eventuate because of the late (again!) start to the season (27 August). However the fishing trip to Corroboree Billabong went off well. Tony Bradshaw was the champion angler having caught two very nice barra and one just over the legal limit. Unfortunately there were no worries about exceeding bag limits but it was a glorious day with or without fish!

Despite the relatively low numbers the weekend was a resounding success thanks to our sponsors and to all the club members who worked so hard to make the weekend a success. A special thanks is called for to all the ladies who worked so hard and so cheerfully to feed and water us extraordinarily well throughout the weekend.


Examinations series at all clubs with ISU facilities.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY —

NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: a \$5 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 Targets/100 Targets in brackets of 25, 50 Target events, one visit to the trap. 100 Target events, two visits to the trap.
- 3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads.
- All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets/75 Targets.
- A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 Targets.
- Should the two minutes time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be resquadded towards the end of the event and incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 Targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter who interferes with or attempts to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13.. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for.
- To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events, excluding doubles events.
- 15. High Gun awards are determined for each section irrespective of the nomination paid.

To be eligible for High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.

16. Any shooter winning the overall trophy (having paid a full nomination) shall not be eligible for any additional recognition in grades and/or sections.

Shooters who are eligible for a reduced nomination and elect to pay a full nomination shall be eligible for recognition in all grades and sections for which they are entitled to compete. Shooters who are eligible for and elect to pay a reduced nomination shall only be eligible for the section entered.

- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including High Gun before sashes, medals or trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
- 19. Practice tickets are available for purchase only at the area controlling the optional sweep/purse entries.
- 20. Nominations will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director.
- 21. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- 22. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS HANDICAP CARDS Conditions of Entry

Nominations will not be accepted from any shooter. who cannot produce a stamped handicap card or have the handicapper approve the reason for not being able to do so.

All shooters from AA to C Grades must present their card to the handicapper for stamping prior to nominating.







Also a fine effort was that of Maree Rooke to finish well ahead of many well known skeet shooters.



SNIPPETS FROM OUR HISTORY – THE WAY IT WAS

Items of interest taken from Clay Target News 1968 The Editor's Report goes on to describe interesting highlights of around that time. The highlight of all being Australia's dominance of the Mackintosh International Team Match. Over the first 22 years of the competition Australia won nine times, England six times, New Zealand five times and Canada on two occasions.


22nd INTERNATIONAL TEAMS' MATCH

Australia has again won this prized International event with the score of 7355/7500. This score is 104 points more than that of the next competing country and Australia has now won this event eight times during the last 11 years.

Scores were: Australia 7355, Canada 7251, England 7247, New Zealand 7241, South Africa 7138, Ireland 6983, Wales 6940, Scotland 6935, Rhodesia 6394.

The Australian section of this 1968 International Event was shot under calm and clear conditions in a temperature of 80°F at the Bolivar grounds of the South Australian Gun Club on March 13. The final section was shot near Cardiff, Wales on July 5.

Although varying methods of scoring have been used over the year, the 7355/7500 recorded by Australia in 1966 and again in 1968 appear to have established the highest total to date. All contestants can be justly proud of their contributions.

The program was set as: 1. 50 Target D/B 15m Modern Shotgun. 2. 50 Target D/B Side by Side (Mixed Targets).



Harry died suddenly on August 8, 1988 at home.


