

Barry was a very well known shooter in the early 1970s to the early 1980s, in South East Queensland and Darby


He was given a life membership for the many hours of work, often until after midnight, he put into making the steel trap and skeet houses.

THE TECHNIQUES OF SKEET SHOOTING — PART 2

Continued from July News

HOW TO SHOOT STATION ONE

In this article and in future articles we'll do a station by station tour of the skeet field and explain what I consider is a good sound procedure to adopt in order to shoot better scores at skeet.

Station one, like all other stations requires the shooter to learn and practice the basic fundamentals and put them to work every time he fires at a moving target, be it for feathers or clay targets.


In previous articles I've strongly emphasised how important it is to have selected the correct type of gun and have it correctly fitted to yourself. Having done this, it is then necessary that you learn how it should be properly handled. Always keep in mind the fact that if your gun does not fit you right, then you will never be able to handle it properly and if you don't handle your gun right then it's impossible for you to become a good shot regardless of how much practice you get and how much other instruction and coaching you have. It's as simple as that!

Proper gun handling will lead to better gun mounting. The position of your right and left hand on grip section and fore-end is very important. An incorrect right hand grip will lock up wrist movement and prevent free and easy movement of proper gun mounting to the correct position on one's shoulder. Incorrect fore-end hold will also cause problems. Be sure that you are not over reaching with the left hand which will cause restricted gun swing, especially on targets travelling from left to right. If we use too short grip on the fore-end, gun swing will become jerky and inaccurate. The ideal position is a little way either side of fore-end centre — depending on length of shooter's arm. Providing all other measurements of stock are correct.

BODY BALANCE AND FOOT POSITION

Naturally body position and stance will vary from one student to another. We will see this every time a skeet squad goes onto the skeet field simply because we are all built differently, however, it is very important to remember that our stance and body control must be basically correct. Any stance that we adopt that creates unnecessary muscular strain is not good because it will cause erratic and restricted movement and it is also very fatiguing.

Let's view the skeet field station by station taking in turn the high target and the low target as we go around.



STATION ONE HIGH CORRECT PROCEDURE

Check foot position for correct stance by facing the point where targets will cross at centre of field. Position gun on shoulder in right position, high up so that it comes up nicely to your cheek, remember not to push your face down to meet the stock. Low gun mounting on one's shoulder is often the cause of a missed target due to the head being taken off the comb causing misalignment of gun and eye. The message is, bring the gun up to your face and NOT YOUR FACE DOWN TO THE GUN — keep your face snug on the comb all the way through the act of firing. This is a situation where proper gun fit is vital.

The next detail is gun hold position prior to calling for the target. At this station I prefer to face down the line of target travel with feet correctly placed so that the left foot is pointing along the line of target travel with the right foot just round 15 inches to the rear and right, to give support and balance.

GUN HOLD

On station one has to be a position that is right for the individual. The gun point will depend, to some extent, just how quickly the target is picked up. The hold I personally use is shown in the photo, also take a look at the line drawings.

At this point, and before I shoulder the gun, I do a quick mental exercise of the procedure I will follow when I call for the target.

There is a basic procedure that I've always used when shooting both trap and skeet targets.

It is something we should do when preparing to shoot each target. This procedure goes like this. It applies to both trap and skeet. As you step onto the firing line, make sure that your feet are correctly placed so that you have complete freedom of movement as you swing the gun out and on to the target.

Load the gun and place the butt correctly on your shoulder so that your face can easily rest snugly on the comb in such a position that your shooting eye can see right down the rib for a perfect gun and eye alignment.

Your next step is to point the gun muzzle at a point out from the trap house where your eyes will be focused to see the target leave then smoothly and accurately decide target direction and swing out to it from behind, form the right sight picture of gun and target relationship as the muzzle brushes the bottom of the target quickly establish correct lead, pull the trigger and follow through and watch the break.

By firstly shooting each target mentally you are building up a technique that will help you build greater powers of concentration and much better scores — it's positive thinking.


SHOOTING DOUBLES FROM ONE HIGH

Contrary to what some new shooters think, shooting skeet doubles is no more difficult than shooting singles, provided we know what we have to do and how we should go about doing it.

In shooting doubles we simply use the same style as we

use to shoot singles.

However, remember to swing with the targets in the normal way and do not make the mistake of jumping at the first target. You have enough time to comfortably shoot both targets if everything is done right. Feet position is similar to singles.



Drawings show gun hold point and target flight path. Note gun hold point just out from trap house and slightly below line of flight. At this point your eyes should focus back to the trap opening to pick up the target as it leaves the shute your gun should swing with the target pass it shown in the sketch, open up a lead, pull the trigger and follow through. When shooting the double, your gun will need to swing smoothly and accurately back to the second target, pass it and pull the trigger allowing 2 feet of lead.

When swinging with the target don't make the mistake of watching the gun muzzle — look only at the target and the gun will come to where your eye is focused.

OPENTRAP— TAMWORTH


The program read 215 targets — \$7,000 in trophies and sashes — the weather was fine and warm — and 58 shooters paid their nomination for the big event on the 3rd and 4th September. The sheer hard work and determination of Club Secretary, Rod Prior, saw a fantastic display of trophies. Rod worked in conjunction with the program committee, who managed to secure sponsorship from the Tamworth Combined Agents, Versatile Windows, Hiscocks Sports Store, Independent Communications, Fosters Firearms and C.L.A.S.S. Ammunition.

Competition got under way with the 30 target Country Capital Double Barrel Championship. The overall winner is no stranger to the Open Trap Shooter at Tamworth, having attended almost every year — Kevin Thompson, from Central Coast, returned 40/40 for his first of many wins for the weekend. Guyra shooter, Mick Blenman was 1st in "AA" with 56/57 from Narrabri's Mark McInnes on 55/57. Western Australia regular, Chas Riegert won 1st in "A" with 33/34 from Andrew Futter on 36/38. The Versatile Windows Double Barrel Trophy Handicap was the next event and Tamworth member, Michael Carey showed the way on 14 metres to win with 78/78, from Tom Scanlon on 77/78, 3rd was Kevin Ellis with 50/51, Rod Taylor of Tamworth was 4th with 28/29, from Jim Hodges on 25/26 and Club President, Geoff Walters filled 6th place.



WORLD WINNERS

Who did have the first World Championship medal and the Australian flag raised in their honour? I submit the following order account of photos and score sheets in my keeping.

This series of events started in the 1978 CTSN December when on the front cover it showed Jim Ellis coming third and gaining the bronze medal, beating Carrega the Italian champion/ex-world champion. Valduvi of Spain was 1st, also mentioned was that this was the first time the Australian flag was raised at a World Championship for an Australian shooter in an individual

In the CTSN January 1979, it was found that Mr Don Brook had other information to 130 against the above for Jim as follows below:

1979 World Championship Phoenix Arizona, USA. Miss Judy Trim and Mrs Gloria Vause from South Australia finished Gold and Silver in Ladies Match Pistol Championships. This also was the first time ever that the Australian flag had flown above our marksmen/women. So Don Brook thought until Ray Parker of Colac Gun Club came along and told us that Don Mayfield of Cavendish Vic. won the World Live Bird Championship in 1963 of which the Australian flag was raised. Ray went on to say that regarding the point that live bird shooting is now legal in Australia, it does, however, make up a large portion of competition shooting in the world today. Legal or not, here it takes none of the credit from Mr Mayfield nor alters the fact that he was the first Australian to win a World Championship and as such his name has gone down in the World Shooting Record as a World Champion, and that the flag was flown for the first time.

The previous information would have gone unchallenged except there are two more shooters oil world shooting fame one has to mention, and that is Mr H'. Frazer who in 1907 won £720 and a gold medal in England, and Mr W.G. (Bill) Downie of Victoria (but evidence shows Tasmania). Mr Downie won the World Championship at Monte Carlo on June 27 and 28, 1928 with 40,000 frames for 1st place, this event being the 14th Triennial Championships where he shot 25 pigeons to win from the mark of 27 metres. Also at this meeting was the great J.W.G. Sutherland who won the Prix De La Cote D'Azur. And of course you have read in the latest CTSN the story on famous Donald Mackintosh. It is worth noting that Ray Parker's mention of W.G. Downie having one eye and one arm cannot be supported by photos I have of him standing next to Jack Slutherland and the Count Granedo, President of the Monte Carlo G.C. taken in 1928.

It appears that J.W.G. Downie was the first World Championship winner known to date and Donald Sutherland the first and only Gold Medal Clympic winner and Don Mayfield the first one to have the flag raised.

I wonder where or who has got those medials and if there is any addition to my winners list?

HISTORY OF OUR SPORT

LOOKING BACK TO THE 1960s LAST NATIONALS AT "FROG HOLLOW" By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian

The year 1965 saw the last National Championships to be conducted on the Australian Gun Club grounds where they had been staged annually since 1948, when they were then rotated round the states as the sport developed on a wider national scale.

Shortly after the 1965 nationals the Australian Gun Club went into recess merging later with Frankston Gun Club to become the Frankston Australian Gun Club.

Proceedings for the 1965 Nationals got under way on the morning of March 4 with the National Double Barrel Championship, at 50 targets from 16 yards. The number of entries received was in keeping with the numbers in recent years. Actually 226 complete nominations were received for the National Double Title and 32 entries were received for the Intermediate Championship only, which was shot in conjunction.

The record entry for this event was received in 1952 when 253 nominated.

Probably the best shooting of the whole series took place in the tie shoot off of this event. Twenty shooters shot the possible. Although, under the usual missout conditions, the field dwindled fairly quickly, there were still six left when shooting was called off for the day owing to failing light.

When the tie resumed next morning Don Anderson (Hay


N.S.W.), John Doyle (Mildura), F.R. Hudson (Sydney), A. Hamilton (Vic), K.R. Heywood (N.S.W.) and Brian Mark (Vic) faced the traps. Anderson missed his first bird out and retired. Hudson followed twelve birds later, and Heywood four rounds later. Brian Mark went on to drop out at his 233rd round. Doyle and Hamilton then settled in to battle it out. Hamilton ultimately gaining the title with a score of 270-270. Doyle was runner up 269-270 and Mark in third place with 233-234.

The second day, when the single barrel title was conducted, saw the start of a remarkable run of success by N.S.W. shooter Warren Charlton. John Raleigh, Qld, and Charlton tied for top placing, each with 49-50. Charlton won the shoot off, 57-58 from Raleigh and Jack Blake (Tas) each 56-58.

Shooting on the third day commenced with the Australia-New Zealand Trophy Event points scoring 3 and 2 over 50 targets. Six shooters returned a possible 150-150 points, and in the shoot Warren Charlton showed his true

Warren's brilliant performance through the 1965 Nationals was surely something of a record when he won no less than four National Titles at the one National Series. To the above two titles he went on to win the 1965 Champion of Champions Cup Score 60-60 and rounded off the series by taking out the 1965 Double Rise Title with a score of 56-58.




VALE


