



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Another year has come and gone, and as we look back we find that it has been a mixed one. On the one hand we find that our membership is well up on past years, and on the other we have not yet seen the last of the attempts to impose severe restrictions on the ownership of guns. We believe that shooters on the whole are a responsible part of the community and that rather than continue the efforts to thwart on the shooting population, we should be seeing a more concerted effort to encourage responsible use. We are all aware of the problems and must not, under any circumstances, give up when the need is there to continue our stand against repressive gun legislation.

The influx of new members has certainly assisted our finances, however, one year of surplus is really only replenishing the larder which, over the last three years, was becoming a little bare. The Annual Report to members will be more than healthy when compared to previous years, and if we are able to maintain the level of membership that we have enjoyed in 1988, your Aesociation will reap the benefits in the years ahead. The old saying that there is safety in numbers may well be put to the test at a future date and for this reason alone all categories of our membership are reminded of the role that they must play if they wish to continue their involvement in the sport of shooting, particularly clay targets.

There has been a restructuring of the National Shooting Committee and for those who shoot the ISU Discipline of Trap and Skeet, the recommendations approved by the Executive Committee are most important. A total of four recommendations have been approved for introduction in 1989. They are:

NATIONAL SHOOTING RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Olympic Discipline National Championships will be conducted over seven days of competition with each of the State Teams matches being held on the afternoon of the third day. Day seven will provide for a 100T Olympic Double Trap Championship (non title) over 100T plus a semi final and final, each of 50 targets.
- 2. The Overall High Gun in Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet over the 400T Program will each receive a Gold Australia Badge.
- 3. The composition of and arrangements for all official teams to be restricted to team members plus appointed officials.
- 4. (a) A Justification Committee has been approved to review the composition of all overseas teams (all disciplines)

(b) The National Shooting Committee of the day to be the appointed Justification Committee

(c) All teams to be selected by a "first past the post" procedure subject to final acceptance from the official Justification Committee.

The restructuring of the National Shooting Committee will enable shooters to have their views taken into consideration and the Committee will reflect the views of the various disciplines if you support your elected representatives who, working on your behalf, are: I.S.U. David Menck, Skeet Bob Dower, Trap Peter Hayman, all of whom can be written to c/o the A.C.T.A. office.

In closing and on behalf of Leanne, Tina and Sandra, I would like to wish all members and their families a healthy and happy Christmas and extend best wishes for the continuation of health and happiness into the 1989 year. Alan J. Maher


As well as the individual names it is pleasing to see that clubs have shown their support as well as two State Associations.

MEMBERS' ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The following summary has been presented to the underwriters of the A.C.T.A. Members' Accident Insurance Policy and approved as being an accurate summary of the policy's benefits and conditions.

Any queries that may arise as a result of reading this summary will be placed before the insurers for their determination and added to the master summary which will be published from time to time in the C.T.S.N.

INSURED PERSONS:

Registered shooters with the Australian Clay Target Association, Voluntary Workers and Honorary Club Members of the Association.

AGE LIMIT:

10-85 years.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

Death - \$40,000

Permanent Total Disablement - \$40,000

Permanent and Incurable paralysis of all limbs -\$40,000

Permanent and Incurable insanity - \$40,000

Permanent total loss of sight in both eyes - \$40,000 Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of both hands — \$40.000

Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of both feet - \$40,000

Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of one hand or one foot - \$40,000

Other benefits of a similar nature attract benefits on a reducing scale.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

Weekly Accident Benefit - \$400 p/wk for temporary total disablement payable from the eighth day of medical attention for an aggregate of 104 weeks - limited to income earners only.

Temporary partial disablement - \$100 p/wk payable from the eighth day of medical attention for an aggregate of 104 weeks — limited to income earners only.

NON-INCOME EARNERS: (within the policy conditions) The compensation for temporary total disablement and temporary partial disablement shall be payable only in reimbursement of the cost of hiring domestic help by the insured person who suffers total disablement - limited to the actual expenditure incurred to a maximum of \$150 per week for a maximum of 52 weeks.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

- (a) Shooters whilst involved in club/zone/state and Association functions and/or activities.
- (b) Voluntary workers for the club/zone/state/Association whilst actually engaged in activities officially organised or under the control of the Association through the Rules of Shooting and Articles of Association.
- (c) A/B include necessary travel to and from such activities.

CLAIMS PROCEDURE: (within the policy conditions)

In the event of the need to lodge a claim against the policy, immediate written advice must be given to the insurer, Australian American Assurance Company Ltd., through the A.C.T.A. National Office on the prescribed form which is available upon request.

It is not possible to provide other than a brief summary of the policy owing to the many circumstances that could arise from time to time. Any queries, however, that may arise are to be addressed to the A.C.T.A. who will endeavour to obtain confirmation/clarification to the written request. Alan J. Maher

A LETTER TO THE EXECUTIVE

Dear Sir.

After much thought and consideration regarding the current debenture scheme as proposed, we have come to the conclusion that rather than ask people or clubs to contribute in \$1000 debenture units that this issue should be abandoned and a levy of a minimum of fifteen dollars per member be imposed as a one off charge.

This would consolidate our finances and enable us to purchase our headquarters and place our administration into a fully paid up situation. The executive should give their consideration to the following. At current interest rates, 13½ per cent can be obtained on invested capital.

Under the current debenture proposal, persons or clubs are virtually donating 6% of their profits to the ACTA. This is \$60 per debenture or \$600 per 10 debentures per year. The current debentures scheme will be borne by too few clubs and loyal members, as is usually the case with this type of arrangement.

The executive should stop pussy-footing around and confront the problems head on. Every shooter should be levied on a once only basis to raise these finances. In the following year the association should then have surplus funds which could be invested in interest bearing deposits. This way we have a financially healthier association not burdened with a debt over our heads. This will eventually have to be repaid plus interest which will indirectly cost all members more.

Members who object to this scheme should open their narrow minds and consider that \$15 represents only about five packets of cigarettes, two jugs of beer, or 100 reloaded shells. This levy would be just a small sacrifice that everyone should contribute to so this association can be on a sound footing in the future.

In conclusion any member who refuses to pay the extra levy and resigns their membership were quite obviously only half hearted. Those members who object should really give some serious thought in that they are contributing to the future of their association and sport.

Let's get down to business and get on a sound footing. Every member should contribute and bear the burden instead of the usual minority. This way we will all be better off in the future.



INTER CELEBRATES ITS NEW RANGE


International Gun Club held its 1988 Birthday Shoot at its new range at the International Shooting Park Virginia, on October 15th and 16th.



FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

The Olympic Games are over and the teams back home again. The Australian Shooting Team certainly tried hard, and in some cases, shot their personal best scores. It was an unusual competition in that many of the best shooters in the world in Clay Target shooting found the Olympic competition tough going. The Italian shooters who had performed so well in the World Cups, Matt Dryke the World Champion and many others, just did not make the finals. Our own trap shooters, Russell Mark and John Maxwell both made the semi finals, with Russell coming 15th and John equal 22nd.

Ian Hale and Domingo Diaz failed to make the cut off for the semi finals. In the other shooting sports, Alan Smith came 11th in his event, prone, in small bore rifle and Phillip Adams in air pistol came 15th. It became obvious to me that our shooters, while being just as talented as those of the Eastern Bloc, do not have the major competition experience that the shooters from Russia or East Germany etc have, nor the opportunity to engage in long term intensive practice. Any sportsperson, whether their sport is golf, cycling, tennis, hockey or shooting, in this day and age of professionalism, to be amongst the top ten in the world, must compete at that level. There is the occasional unexpected win by an unknown, but for the level of performance required at Olympic competition, the competitors must have the confidence and toughness that comes from having to perform under pressure.

Because of lack of money, our competitors are truly amateurs. They must earn a living, and a good one to compete at all, let alone afford the continued absences from their work that competition and training require. The swimming coach bemoans the fact that the young swimmers must start making a career when they finish their swimming career, as they have no hope of starting one while they are training. How much harder it is for older people who have commitments, family and work, and who do not just jump into a pool to train, but must pay for the targets and the ammunition that they train with. That is if they can find a club open during the week, with automatic traps and someone to push the button. The fact that our shooters, when they do compete on the international scene, regularly manage to come in the top 20 in the world shows what commitment they have.

It will be essential for the next Olympics that our shooters have the opportunity to compete in the World Cups in Europe in the years prior to the Olympics in Spain. Firstly, they must do so to achieve their minimum qualifying scores, and secondly, they must perform credibly in those events to justify selection. Big fish in little pools are often little fish in big pools and whether we like it or not, little value is put on Australian performances by the Olympic Federation.

The organization and facilities in Seoul were first class, equal to anything I have seen in the world. The accommodation in the village was excellent also. The range was approximately three quarters of an hour from the village and the traffic had to be seen to be believed. A horn is essential and the drivers use them continually. It just seemed chaos to me even with half the cars off the road.

Since coming home I have had letters from England and Europe from shooters who regularly correspond with me, and they all have the same complaint that I have heard since coming home — no coverage of the shooting events on television, and only minimal coverage on the radio. There certainly wasn't any lack of television crews and reporters at the grounds, so I don't know what happened to the footage they took. The morning after John Maxwell shot 75/75 he was followed by the media, not

understanding the nature of the event, many thought he had won. Russell Mark shot very consistently, 23 being his lowest score, Russell shot 191 and John 189. The experience gained by John, Russell and Domingo will stand them in good stead for future international competition. It was an extremely high standard of shooting at Seoul. The winner of the Trap shot 197, as compared to L.A. Olympics where the winner shot 192. Jim Ellis shot a 190 and Terry Rumbel a 189 in L.A. in 1984. The presence of the East Europeans certainly made a difference. Wergner of the G.D.R. told me that he would not have qualified to go to the Olympics unless he shot 196 at the World Cup. He went on to win the Skeet with 198. Unlike the Americans he does not crouch. Monakov of Russia who won the Trap is a shooter of impeccable technique, the result of hours of practice.

The Russians tell me they are looking forward to the Australian team coming to Russia for the World Championships in 1990.

1 OZ. LOAD

From January 1989, loz loads only are to be used under the new U.I.T. rules. This will be the same for both Olympic skeet and trap. Shooters at the 1989 Olympic Nationals in Melbourne must be using loz (28 grams) loads.

Some of the top European shooters have been using this load and tell me that it has made only a slight difference to their scores. They believe that with future practice with the new loads they will reach their previous standards.

The theory behind the move is to decrease lead and noise pollution, and to lessen the recoil.

New records will be made with the new loads. State, National and World records will start anew from the 1st January. I am quite sure that many of the D.T.L. shooters will go to 1oz load when they see that the International discipline shooters break targets with them.

VICTORIAN STATE COACHING DIRECTOR

I am very pleased to welcome Len Cook as the new State Coaching Director in Victoria. Len, as Director of Coaching, is enthusiastic and knowledgeable, and with the support of the many excellent coaches in Victoria, will join his organizational abilities with their coaching abilities and Victorian Coaching will go from strength to strength.





1988 - N.S.W. STATE TRAP CARNIVAL





I.S.U. RULES UPDATE

Courtesy of D. Menck, National I.S.U. Rules Supervisor, Editor "Shotstring"

The latest copy of the I.U.T. Journal from Germany confirms the recent rumours regarding one-ounce loads. "From January 1, 1989, the maximum cartridge load for Olympic Discipline Trap & Skeet events will be 28 grams of lead shot."

The General Assembly of the U.I.T. have also decided to reduce the Minimum Qualifying Score in both trap and skeet for the 1992 Olympic Games. The new M.Q.S. are: Olympic Trap 182-200, I.S.U. Skeet 184-200. The same meeting again voted not to allow compensators or similar devices on guns used in Olympic Trap competitions.

* * *

On the subject of cartridges . . .

When the new limitations regarding shot weight come into force next year, the other restrictions as to shot size etc will not change. Maximum shot size for Olympic Trap 2.5mm (+0.1 tolerance) — in Australia this means No.7 shot is O.K., No.6 shot is NOT.

For I.S.U. Skeet, lead must not be larger than 2.0mm (+0.1 tol.) i.e. No.9 shot. Larger shot such as No.8 or No.7 is not allowed. Dispersant wads or similar are also not permitted, and only one type of cartridge may be used in a round, that being the type used at the commencement of the round.



RENEW YOUR MEMBERSHIP

For the first time since the A.C.T.A. started, we have over 10,500 registered shooters, including 2,746 new members.

It is imperative for us all to re-register for 1989. We must all do our bit for our Association, not only to make sure shooters re-register, but to encourage more people to join our Association.

I look forward to a minimum target of 12,000 by the end of 1989. Not only would this help the A.C.T.A. financially, but would give us more strength when talking to Government. The gun laws have not gone away, they are still in the melting pot. The N.S.W. Government have said, only this week, they are looking into the whole matter of guns and gun laws. It does not matter in which State you live, or what Government is in power, the fact remains, Governments do not like guns, and the law will change. The more members we have, the better chance we have of Governments listening to what we have to say.

I believe the \$37 we have to pay in affiliation fees, plus \$5 for new members each year, is a small price to pay to have the use of our guns when we want, and to have a say in gun legislation.

In Government it is the numbers game, the more numbers the more they listen. So do yourself and your Association a favour, bring in more members. It is not that hard. If each club introduced say five new members, per year, plus what you introduce, just think what a wonderful Association we would have.

The future of guns and gun control is in your hands. It is a self help situation.

HISTORY OF OUR SPORT CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT

By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian

BARNEY ROOKE OF WAGGA

Barney Rooke first came into our sport of clay target shooting in 1968 and within 18 months of taking up the sport he had won no less than 24 overall championships. Prior to taking up clay target shooting, Barney shot big bore rifle shooting where he enjoyed a very successful record. I've persuaded Barney to give me a list of his achievements over the years since 1968.

His first State Title was the N.S.W. Walkup Championship in 1969. Then in 1970 he took out the National Grand Australian Handicap at Perth. He has since 1970 added to the list 19 State Titles, both trap and skeet, and was three times State Team High Gun. His bag of Commonwealth titles includes Commonwealth Double Barrel Mini Championship 1971 and also winning this title again in 1973. Barney's total number of championships won would be around 200 including all types.

He has been a member of the Macintosh Team in 1970, 1972 and 1974, a member of the Australian Team competing in N.Z. 1971, 1972 and 1973, N.S.W. State Trap Team three times, N.S.W. State Skeet Team six times, N.S.W. State I.S.U. Skeet Team seven times and N.S.W. State I.S.U. Training Squad twice.

- In 1971 Barney shot a match with local trap shooter scoring a total of 699/700 at Wagga Gun Club.
- In 1973 a challenge from local shooter Eric Vincent with a side-wager of \$1000 with the winner collecting \$2000.
- In 1974 he was team captain of a group of 31 Australian trap shooters who competed in the USA.
- In 1976 he also captained a group of 65 shooters to New Zealand.
- In 1978 he captained a group of 106 shooters to New Zealand. (He has since taken many smaller groups to

the USA and New Zealand.)


- In 1980 he held the N.S.W. State Skeet break record of 213. This was shot at Mildura and was broken less than 24 hours later by Ian Hale. The record was broken three times in seven days. Prior to this, the record of 216 was held by George Biggs for just on five years.
- During his shooting career he has had over 25 trips to N.Z. and five to U.S.A.
- In 1978-1982 he was the Riverina Zone Coach and from 1982-1986 N.S.W. State Coaching Director. (He resigned due to other work commitments.)
- He is an Accredited Level 2 Coach and over the years has conducted more than 160 coaching seminars and schools.
- 1985-1987: State Executive (N.S.W.).
- He has been an A.C.T.A. Referee Examiner since 1974.
- Has been on various sub-committees.
- Won his first National Title in less than 18 months of shooting.
- 1978 A.C.T.A. Trap/Skeet Referee Nationals.
- 1979 A.C.T.A. Asst. Shoot Marshal Nationals.
- 1979 N.S.W.C.T.A. Asst Shoot Marshal State Championships.
- 1982[^]A.C.T.A. Asst Shoot Marshal/Referee Nationals.

I also found out that another shooter, Charles Lyne, originally from Tasmania, has moved to Bundy, so we wish you all the same Charles.


