

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Olympic Discipline Nationals commence on 7th February and a reminder that 1 oz or 28 gr loads are mandatory at these Championships. While factory loads are manufactured to exact specifications, this is not necessarily the case for reloads, so please ensure if you intend shooting the Olympic Discipline of Trap and Skeet that you do not reload (if that is your preference), other than to the prescribed 1 oz load.

A telephone call recently received advised of an accident at one of the regular club shoots and the importance of the recently introduced Members Accident Insurance Policy became very apparent. While the by far greater majority of clubs have paid their accident premiums, a relatively small number have not as yet fulfilled their obligation. If you, as a registered shooter, are in any doubt as to whether or not your club has ensured your protection, then ask the Club Secretary. If any doubt remains then contact the national office.

Registrations are due and payable as at 1st January and new cards are being processed to ensure they will reach you without delay. Persons who have not renewed their membership as at 10.3.89 will cease to receive the C.T.S.N. as from the April issue.

The front cover of this issue features New South Wales junior, Michael Diamond, who has been honored by the Confederation of Australian Sport, being named Australia's Junior Male Athlete of the Year at the recent Sport Australia Awards in Melbourne. Michael's performance over the twelve months of the award was truly outstanding and included his win at Venezuela in the World Shotgun Championships at which he became the World Junior Champion. Well done Michael!

The April issue of the C.T.S.N. will carry the full program for the National Trap Championships commencing on 1st April at Echuca. Every effort is being made to ensure that the magazine is posted to reach its destination as early as possible before the end of March. If you are planning to attend the Trap Nationals, and we certainly hope that you are, there will be some copies available there should you not have received yours prior to your departure for Echuca.

By now you may have already heard of the resignation of our National Coaching Director, Peter Quire. Peter has decided after his many years in the position to return to the workforce in his own business in Adelaide. We wish Peter well in the years ahead, and thank him for the role that he has played over the years in establishing our Australian shooters as world class competitors. The matter of a replacement for Peter is being discussed by the Management and Executive Committees and details will be announced as they come to hand.

Peter will continue with the Association as a member of the World Championships Organizing Committee, and as well as attending the Olympic Discipline Nationals in February, will be available to offer any assistance that he can to whoever may be appointed to fill his role. With leave, etc. and a desire to complete unfinished projects, Peter will officially depart from the Association on 31st May and resume his position in the workforce as a self-employed person. We wish him well and thank him for the efforts given over the years.

Team Selection Procedure

In order to comply with the conditions of grants received from the Australian Sports Commission and the Australian Commonwealth Games Association, the Australian Clay Target Association has had to review the selection procedure for both the World Championship Teams and the 1990 Commonwealth Games.

The selection procedure following careful consideration has now been amended and will commence in the following manner with the naming of the 1989 National Training Squad at the Olympic Discipline National Championships being held in Melbourne from February 7-12.

National Training Squad. To be determined on scores recorded at the Olympic Discipline National Championships.

Elimination. Over three days, 300 targets in early July 1989 with Brisbane Gun Club being the venue subject to availability.

World Championship Teams. 3 Olympic Trap, 3 I.S.U. Skeet, being the three shooters for each discipline recording the best scores over the 300t elimination. Final teams subject to sanction from the Justification Committee.

Commonwealth Games Teams. 2 Olympic Trap, 2 I.S.U. Skeet, being the two shooters from each discipline recording the best scores over the 300t elimination. Final teams subject to sanction from the Justification Committee.

New Zealand I.S.U. Nationals. 2 Olympic Trap, 2 I.S.U. Skeet, being the members of the official Commonwealth Games Team.

Funding will be made available for members of the National Training Squad to travel from their home state to compete in the 300t Elimination Program.

Shooting Committee comprising of: Chairman: Mr R. Smith (NSW) Executive Committee: Mr T. Catling (WA) Executive Committee; Mr P. Quire (ACTA) National Coaching Director. I.S.U.: Mr D. Menck (NSW) Shooters Representative. Trap: Mr P. Hayman (NSW) Shooters Representative. Skeet: Mr D. Deventor (SA) Shooters Representative. R. Dower (SA) Shooters Representative.

While no changes are contemplated to this amended format, the Association does retain the right to make alterations at any time that they may be considered necessary in the best interest of the sport.

CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT — THE GOLDEN OLDIES OF OUR GAME

Tup Pedersen of Drouin: As a youngster in the early part of this century, Allan (Tup) Pedersen was destined to become a farm hand. He was born in Drouin, Victoria just 80 years ago. His father was a farmer and his grandfather was a market gardener. The land was in his blood and nobody, not even Tup, could see any other future for him. Few people could envisage that he would enter the motor industry, let alone spend more than 63 years in the industry.

At the age of 14 Tup took a job with one of Drouin's car dealers (Drouin Motors). The only qualification Tup needed was a driver's licence that cost him 2/6 (25 cents). After about 12 years behind the scenes Tup and his partner bought the place for the sum of £1500 (\$3000), including the buildings. Despite a very good start, Drouin Motors faced tough times during World War 2 when car sales plummeted and petrol rationing was introduced. However, the end of the war signalled a period of high turnover for Drouin Motors and Tup and his partner George Clark found it a good time to consolidate the business.

It was in 1948 that Tup decided it was time he enjoyed some recreation and being a country boy his thoughts turned to shooting. Clay target shooting was just beginning to reorganise after the war and so Tup took a liking to what he saw.

The early days of Gippsland in Eastern Victoria saw several gun clubs that were formed around the beginning of the century. They were of course live bird clubs. Around 1925 clay targets were replacing live birds, resulting in most of the live bird clubs changing over to clays.


It was 1948 when Tup Pedersen decided he would take up clay target shooting. I remember him coming into Hartleys Sports Store one afternoon. He told me he was going to shoot clay targets more seriously and wanted to know what kind of gun he should buy. He had joined the Moe Gun Club and used an old Hollis double barrel hammer gun for a few years but had switched to a Browning auto.

About this time (early 1950s) the under and over gun by Browning was beginning to reach Australian clay target shooters. Tup purchased a mod "C" grade. He still has this gun today and has used it very successfully for over 35 years. Of course I had to make an alteration to the stock which was originally a so-called field stock with a lower comb measurement. If my memory serves me correctly the going price was around \$200.

Over the 40 years that Tup has been competing at clay target shooting he has taken out over 200 championships at both trap and skeet.

The Drouin Gun Club was formed in 1950 and officially opened by the then A.C.T.A. President Jock Wilson. The club had a membership of 65, with Joe Oliver as president. Later, Tup Pedersen was elected president with Stan Turner secretary. The club carried on until 1982 when they disbanded to join up with Morwell club. Tup served on the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee from 1956 to 1977. He was appointed vice-president in 1974 and national president 1975, serving for 2½ years. Tup is still attending shoots and enjoying the friendship of old and new shooters at the good age of 80 years.

One of the highlights of Tup's shooting career was a trip to the U.S.A. where he shot in the "Grand American", an event that is billed as the biggest shooting tournament in the world. He brought back trophies from several shoots that he attended whilst there.

In December of 1987 Tup and his wife Enid visited the Australian Masters Games held at Launceston where he shot in all the shotgun events. He remarked to me that he and Enid enjoyed themselves so much they had decided to travel to Alice Springs for the Northern Territory Masters Games in October the following year (1988). Sure enough he and Enid did visit Alice Springs. They actually did drive up.

It was at the Melbourne Gun Club a couple of weeks after their return from Alice that I had the opportunity to talk with them over their trip. It was obvious that he and his wife Enid had really enjoyed the shoot. Tup described the welcome they received from club president and members and said it was out of this world. People just couldn't do enough for them. The president Mick Marella and the secretary Sue O'Grady were fabulous. The catering was really something to talk about.

Tup won a bronze medal in the 50 target points and a silver in the 30 target double. At the closing ceremony Tup was presented with a gold, silver and bronze for his effort at the age of 80 years. Tup promises to go back again in 1990 and would recommend it to anyone who can make it.

To my good friends Tup Pedersen and his wife Enid I sincerely hope you can make it, but I think you should fly up next time.





KNOW YOUR EXECUTIVE



Richard Brook, Qld.

Richard first started to shoot clay targets in about 1956, and followed it for a couple of years until the Goondiwindi Gun Club folded due to the rural recession owing to the slump in wool prices. Richard did not shoot a clay target until the Goondiwindi club was reformed in 1981, when he was elected club delegate at the first meeting, a position held ever since. He was elected club president for the second year of the club's operation.

Richard was elected to the Council of the Queensland Clay Target Association in 1983, to vice-president in 1985, to president in 1987, a position still held, and on to the Executive of the Australian Clay Target Association in 1987.

He was chairman of the Organising Committee for the National Trap Championships in Brisbane in 1987 and subsequently tournament director for those championships. He was also tournament director for the Olympic Discipline Nationals in 1988, also held in Brisbane.

Positions now held in the shooting world include member of the Executive ACTA, president of the QCTA, a member of the executive of the Queensland Shooting Association, a member of the Qld Government's Firearms Advisory Council, shooting's delegate on the Qld Olympic Council and also the Commonwealth Games Association (Qld Division).



W.A. COACHING SEMINAR

On October 29th and 30th the West Australian Coaching Council, supported by the Department of Sport and Recreation, conducted a Two Day Coaches Seminar. Twenty-five coaches from around W.A. gathered at the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex for what was to become a very indepth seminar. The coaches had gathered for a variety of tasks not the least being seven doing finals for Level 1, and two doing finals for Level 2. Because of the logistics involved all the accreditations and refresher courses had to be programmed on the same weekend but with different components to suit each situation. Our National Coach, Mr Peter Quire, arrived on Friday and after a few last minute preparations, all was ready.

Saturday morning and after registration and course explanation, our first lecturer took the floor. Mr Grant Dorrington from the Football Development Trust, imparted to the assembled coaches that inner knowledge of how coaches could and can coach. But the reactions and questions all now seem to have a better understanding of how to help. A luncheon break was taken followed by a lecturer on nutrition from the Heart Foundation. Mr Glen Cardwell opened our eyes to a variety of foods and blew away everybody's theory on muesli bars and rice bubbles.

The last lecturer of the day came via the Institute of Sport with vision being his task. Like the previous lecturers, had time not run out he would have been kept talking all night.

After the final luncheon break the groups split to carry out various tasks, with Level 1 doing an evaluation on Skeet shooter, Miss Lynda Johnson, and Level 2 handling more administration tasks.

As the two days drew to an end, a round table question period was held under Mr Peter Quire. Again time had to be called so the course could be concluded.

It was by the Coaches' own statements a rewarding weekend with possibly the highest quality of lecturers seen outside the A.I.S.

Wangaratta Club consider this the premier event of country skeet.







I have noted with interest the decision that from 1st January 1989 all I.S.U. shooting will be restricted to 28 gram loads.

I just hope that the A.C.T.A. executive resist this idea for Australian standard trap and skeet. Shooters in Australia have developed their own type of events and any change must be very carefully considered.

Any change in loading would disrupt most club shooters and of course some would not bother and drop out of the sport. The idea of resizing shot bushing for competition loads and field loads after 15 years shooting really "excites" me, and I am sure that the average shooter would have more confidence with the lighter cartridge. That's why we all use the 32 gram load instead of the 28 gram load!

Just remember! Change for change's sake is not worth the trouble. Handicap shooting is nearly a thing of the past due to rule changes and what happened to the great "American Single Barrel" shooting that was mooted a few years ago?

LOOKING BACK SEVEN YEARS

1982 OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Fine double to Ellis . . . Hale makes amends in Common wealth Skeet Title.

The 1982 National and Commonwealth Olympic Dis cipline Championships were conducted at Brisbane Gur Club over the Easter period.

The National Championships were used by the Common wealth Games Foundation as a "dress rehearsal" to test officials and equipment.

Sixty-six shooters were squadded on Easter Saturday tc commence battle for the 1982 National Olympic Trap Championships. First round possibles came from Connolly, Rumbel, Budd and Flower. At the end of 75 targets, World silver medallist Jim Ellis had hit the front on 73/75, Seymour and B. Lowry were one target behind, with Long, G. Stevens and Flower on 71.

A second 73 on day two put Jim Ellis two in front of Greg Long, with Rumbel and Collinson three targets further back on 141. Porter, Lowry and Collins were tied together on 140.

The final 50 targets saw Jim Ellis drop two to win the gold medal with 194/200. Greg Long took the silver two targets behind Ellis on 192, and John Porter shot 49/50 on the last day to win the bronze medal with a final tally of 189. These were good scores as intermittent showers throughout the three days made conditions difficult.

The equipment worked well in both trenches, after slight modification by Public Works Department officers.

A field of 23 faced the starter in the National I.S.U. Skeet Championship.

John Woolley of New Zealand ran the first day clean to lead by one target from Alex Crikis, with Ian Hale one further back on 73. Cameron was on 72, Summers 71 and Boyd, the 1981 holder, on 70.

Ian Hale shot them all in the second 76 to lead Woolley by one with Crikis in third place on 146. Boyd improved his position with a brilliant 75 to add to his first day's 70, while Summers had trouble again carding 71.

Day three, the final 50 targets, Woolley again shot briliantly breaking them all to card 197/200. Hale dropped two and had to settle for the silver medal, one target behind on 196, with Alex Crikis taking the bronze medal with a score of 194.

A four-man State Teams Match was conducted over the first 150 targets of the National Titles, which resulted in a win for Queensland in Olympic Trap and Victoria in I.S.U. Skeet.

The Commonwealth Championships were conducted over the two days April 15 and 16, 100 targets per day. Fields were smaller for these titles as many shooters had returned home to start work after the Easter break.

At the end of day one, the Olympic Trap shooters had performed very well, 10 of the 35 shooters scoring 90 or better.

Jim Ellis led with 97 by one target from John Maxwell with Terry Rumbel in third place on 95. On 93 were Ken Stevens, Garry McDonald, Stan Collins and Dennis Lymn. Evergreen Bill Stevens had shot consistently for 92, one target ahead of John Byrnes of South Australia. John Porter had started quietly with 90 and was tied with Norm Simms of A.C.T.

Day two dawned fine and clear, the improvement in the weather saw scores improve too, with 13 scores of 90 or better.

Jim Ellis was his usual quick and efficient self, shooting an immaculate 98 to take the gold medal on 195. John Maxwell, who was disappointed in the National Championship returned to peak form with an excellent 98 to take the silver medal at 194.

Terry Rumbel was consistent with another 95 to win bronze on 190, after surviving a shoot off with Stan Collins for third place. Stan had shot well throughout this championship to record his 190. John Porter again came home very well to card 98 on the second day. As with the National Championship his second hundred targets was top class.

Jim Ellis again demonstrated his class by winning both titles. His vast experience shows in the cool and efficient way he goes about his shooting.

Fifteen shooters lined up for the Commonwealth I.S.U. Skeet Championship. At the end of the first 100 targets, Ian Hale showed he meant business with a brilliant 99, while Nelis, Madsen and junior Craig Mueleman were tied together on 94. Norman was one further back with Crikis and Gauld on 92.


Day two saw Hale go further ahead to street the field, winning the gold medal by eight targets with a score of 195. Alex Crikis had to shoot off for the silver medal with Craig Meuleman, both carding 187. This was a fine performance from the 16-year-old junior from Melbourne, who obviously has a bright future.
