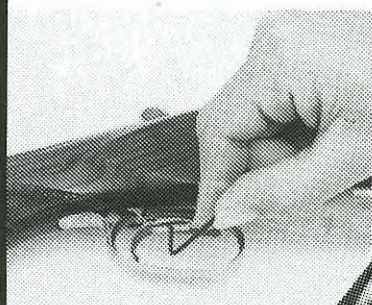

HISTORY OF OUR SPORT

VERY EARLY DAYS — 1928

It would seem that back in the early days of clay target shooting, the newspaper cover of our sport was a great deal more than we get today.

The following story by way of cuttings is from the "Age" newspaper dated 1929 and courtesy of Malcolm Green of Korumburra, Victoria. At this time most trap shooting was at live birds although clay birds were beginning to show at the odd club that could manage to scrounge a few clays from someone who had them shipped out from England or U.S.A. The Nobel Club at Footscray had become established and were holding regular weekly shoots from 1929 with material obtained from I.C.I. ex England. Some of Victoria's oldest clubs were operating in Gippsland in the early 1900s with live birds, of course, and some of these clubs are now shooting clays.

The usual fortnightly shoot took place at West Footscray on Saturday afternoon. There was no outstanding large break, C.B. Hislop leading the list with a break of 14. About 1000 birds were put through the trap. The first event was a five-bird special handicap, B class, 18 yards, and A class, 23 yards. R. Dennis, 18 yards, and C.E. Hall and G.O. Richards, 23 yards, tied with 5-5. After the eighth, C. Hall dropped out, and at the twelfth bird Dennis and Richards were ordered back three yards. Dennis lost his fourteenth bird and Richards won.

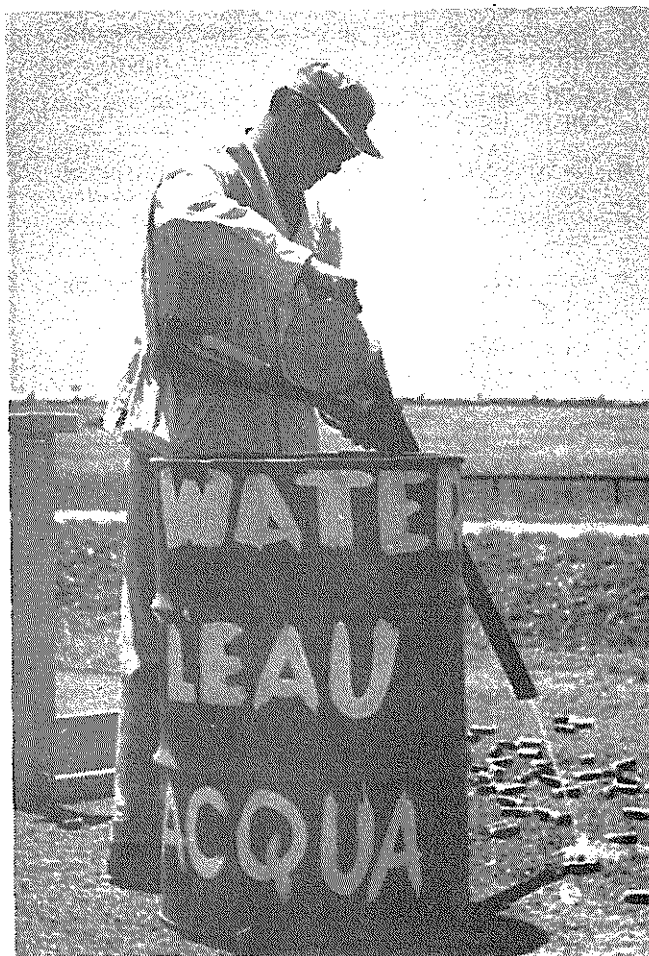
The second was the main attraction for the day, being a ten-bird handicap for the W. and A. Gilbey silver cup, to be won three times. Three shooters tied with the possible (10-10) — C.B. Hislop, O.D. Evans and B. Anquetil. In the shoot-off, Evans and Hislop failed to retain their previous good form, and Anquetil won with 14-15, and also secured a Nobel spoon for the highest score in the event.

The third was also a ten-bird handicap, with trophies, for A and B classes. In the B class, L. Sutherland (son of Calrossie, champion live-bird shoot) was the winner, with 8-10. The A class was won by J.C. Sharp with 10-10 and he also won a Nobel spoon for the highest score in the event.

Results of other shoots were also reported from Ballarat, Traralgon and Wonthaggi. The competition at these clubs was at starlings.

A 44 gallon drum of water was provided at each end of the trench layout. G. Rossini, Italy, was the winner with a score of:

First Day 24.25.25; Second Day 24.24.23; Third Day 25.25; = 195 — Total = 200.

Skeet shooting was not a part of Olympic shooting Discipline at that time.

Sale Gun Club's original ground was located on the bank of a creek behind the hotel on the main road to Melbourne out of town.

The club was most progressive in having a two trap layout as can be seen in the picture. Also to be seen are reminders of the fact that the ground was a cow paddock when the shooters were not there. One had to be careful where you walked! Nevertheless, the hospitality was something to be remembered.

REPORT FROM THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR, PETER QUIRE

1988 has been an eventful and productive year with World Cups in Europe and the Olympic Games, six Coaches receiving their Level 3 accreditation, and four new State Coaching Directors being appointed.

NATIONAL COACHING SCHEME

Arthur Kenna from Queensland, Stewart Browning from Tasmania, Len Cook from Victoria and Don Stevens from South Australia were all appointed as their States' Coaching Directors. Arthur, Stewart, Don and Len have all been accepted within their own States and are doing a great job, as are Murray Alexander, Greg Chan and Col Burt. Don Stevens, since his appointment, has done all that has been asked of him, and has accredited six coaches in the short time he has been in the job. Previously there had not been an accreditation in S.A. since 1984. It is very pleasing to me that Victoria has such a competent person in Len Cook as State Coaching Director. With support from his state, and co-operation from the clubs, Len can work towards making Victoria strong in the coaching side of the sport.

LEVEL 3 ACCREDITATION

As previously stated, six senior coaches have attained their Level 3 status, with Robby Smith just completing his Level 3 course. Len Cook, Arthur Kenna, Stewart Browning and Don Stevens have all started their Level 3. They all attended the Coaching Seminar in Adelaide in November, Len attended the Elite Coaching Seminar in Canberra with myself and Col Burt, Don attended a camp at the Institute of Sport with the National Training Squad, and Stewart and Len will both be at the Olympic Nationals in Melbourne in February. There will be opportunities for them to complete their Level 3 Course in the next 12 months with the juniors camp at the Institute in May, the World Championships in Italy and the N.Z. Nationals in November. It is important that the State Coaching Directors attain the Level 3 accreditation, so that they can begin bringing up senior coaches in their own states to Level 3 standard. New South Wales is to be congratulated on having two Level 3 standard coaches, the first state to reach this position.

LEVEL 2

All states are in the process of bringing through coaches of Level 1 standard to Level 2. There are 55 Level 2 coaches now. Some states are using the correspondence course, some seminars, and some a combination of both. The fact that so many coaches have advanced to Level 2 denotes a growing professionalism in our sport.

LEVEL 1

There are 308 Level 1 accredited coaches. Coach accreditation is not just the receipt of a badge and a card. Accreditation should carry with it respect; respect from fellow shooters for someone who has taken the time and effort to attain a standard of knowledge and skill, and the ability to pass on that knowledge and skill; respect for someone who often does not shoot, even when they would like to, so that they can make someone else shoot better and enjoy it more. Level 1 coaches, club coaches, are extremely important in the whole coaching scheme.

INSTITUTE OF SPORT

The Institute of Sport has been of great assistance to me.

Over the years that it has been established, the experts there have always been willing and able to help where they can. The Institute has been a great boon for sport in general and our sport in particular. Up-to-date information, scientific knowledge, and general knowledge have all been passed on from the Institute. Our camps for the National Training Squad at the Institute have been a wonderful opportunity for our athletes to benefit from the up-to-date equipment and knowledge. Our coaching scheme and coaches have also benefited from seminars and camps at the Institute. I do hope our sports association with the Institute can continue for many years to come.

AUSTRALIAN COACHING COUNCIL

Lawrie Woodman of the Coaching Council has been a great help to me personally and to our sport. In the rewriting of the Level 1, and writing of the Level 2 and 3 courses, Lawrie was helpful and supportive. He understands that our sport is one that requires skill and dedication. Many other people in top sports positions, as well as many media people, do not understand or recognize the use of a firearm in a competitive sport. It seems to be a widespread idea that the blame for the current state of society, and many of the tragedies that occur, should be sheeted home to the use of firearms, to an implement, which has for centuries been a part of the way we humans gathered food. Our sport grew from the great skill required in that activity. Much of my time has been spent in promoting our sport, and in television and media interviews it seems that I must always first explain and defend our sport. Hopefully, with better public awareness, this detrimental aspect will disappear for all time.

CONFEDERATION OF SPORT

The junior team that won the world championships in 1987 did extremely well in the Confederation of Sports Awards — Michael Diamond winning the Junior Male Athlete of the Year Award, and the team consisting of Michael Diamond, Filippo Petriella and Brett Dunstan coming second in the junior team award. I was proud to have been acknowledged by the Confederation for team coaching, for the fourth time.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

This being the year leading up to the Commonwealth Games in New Zealand, the Commonwealth Games Association, together with the Australian Institute of Sport will be funding the World Championships in Italy, the New Zealand Nationals as well as our participation in the 1990 Commonwealth Games. I am confident that our teams will do extremely well in all of these events. As I have always said, our shooters are world class, they just need the experience of international competition and the finances to train in a professional manner.

IN CONCLUSION

As you will already know, after many years as National Coaching Director, I have tendered my resignation. It is with a great deal of sadness that I have done so. I have always believed in the coach accreditation scheme and in its benefits for our sport. Being a part of the development of the scheme has been very rewarding. However, the best part of my job has been meeting the shooters, making friends, and seeing the improvement in standards. As I still love the sport of clay shooting, I will still be involved and available for consultation as required.

The members of the international teams that I have coached and managed have become friends. I can assure you that both they and I were always proud to represent our sport and country and did our very best. I died a little each time one of the team had a disappointment, and shared the joy when they had success. Champions in our sport give up much for their sport, and get very little

recognition. They are special individuals and deserve the support and encouragement of those who want them to do well.

I must thank past and present Executives and Executive Directors for their support, and the coaches and shooters for their encouragement and friendship, and finish by wishing you all well. I look forward to seeing many of you around the traps where I wish you good shooting.
