

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Trap Nationals at Echuca have now been completed with all results published in this issue of the CTSN. Next month a full summary of the Championships will be published which should be of interest to DTL shooters in particular.

As is well known by now, National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, has resigned his position effective end of May and a search is under way for a successor to be appointed. Peter has held the position for many years and has made a great contribution to the coaching scheme throughout Australia. His knowledge, however, should not be lost as he has agreed to remain as a member of the 1991 World Shotgun Championships Organizing Committee and his experience at these and similar international events will be of great assistance as we plan for 1991.

Advertisements for the position of National Coaching Director were placed in the Melbourne Age and Sydney Morning Herald on Saturday 15th April with a further notice being contained in this issue of the CTSN. If you are interested in the position then please read the notice carefully and should you then decide that the position is one that would suit you and benefit the Association's registered shooters then please let us have your application by the due date.



Australian Institute of Sport

During this month the facilities of the Australian Institute of Sport have been made available to the A.C.T.A. to conduct a Junior Development Training Camp which will be a live in camp at Canberra from 1st May-5th May. Invitations to attend have been forwarded to the following juniors who, by their scores at the various National Championships, have selected themselves.

Olympic Trap: Michael Diamond, NSW; Filipo Petriella, NSW; Brett Dunstan, Vic; Craig Tilley, NSW.

I.S.U. Skeet: Paul Rylands, Vic; Jason Smithwick, Qld. Skeet: Katle Light, Vic; Daniel DiPietro, Vic.

DTL: Tom Turner, NSW; Glen Hayden, Vic.

There is no doubt as to the benefits that will be achieved by attending the camp and it is trusted that all invitations are able to be accepted — Level 3 Coaches from the ACTA will also be in attendance to offer their assistance and expertise to the week-long program. On behalf of our juniors we express our appreciation to the Australian Institute of Sport whose financial assistance supported by ACTA financial assistance has made this Junior Camp possible.

Meetings of the National Executive Committee and various Sub Committees have been scheduled to take place in Melbourne over the period Wednesday 17th May to Sunday 21st May, a total of eight long and demanding meetings from which many important matters will be both discussed and implemented for the overall benefit of our registered shooters. Repeating a previous comment "some of the decisions will be popular, some will not, however, all are made in the best intentions of shooters throughout Australia".

Once the meetings have been held, details of decisions made etc. will be made available to all state associations and also to all shooters via the CTSN. If you feel that you have comment to make on the decisions reached through the various committees then please let us hear your voice and direct your comments to your State Executive Members whose names and telephone numbers are on the inside cover of every issue of the Clay Target Shooting News.

The May meetings will bring three members to their first Executive Meeting, Paul Weis from N.T. and new

members from South Australia and Western Australia. From S.A. the new Executive Member is George Steele from Mt Gambier who is replacing Brian Growden after six years as a member of the National Executive. From W.A. State President John Fissioli has been appointed to replace Tim Catling, another long serving member of the Executive who is retiring after five years of service at National level. Both George and John have been welcomed on your behalf and Brian and Tim thanked for their contribution to the sport as members of the National Executive Committee.

Planning is under way for the 1991 World Shotgut Championships and more will be heard of this as time goes by. While 1991 may seem a long way off, as to international competition, it is fast approaching and all efforts are being taken to ensure the success of the World Championships in Perth. We are firm in our belief that once Australia has been able to host a successful international shotgun event, the opportunity will present itself for other events such as World Cups to come to Australia. This is what we are aiming for as a long term goal.

During July the members of the National Training Squad will be shooting a 300T elimination program at the Brisbane Gun Club. The eliminations will produce the six shooters to travel to Italy for the 1989 World Shotgun Championships as well as the Commonwelath Games team who will compete in New Zealand in 1990. As part of the preparations for the 1991 World Championships the Australian Sports Commission has made funding available to conduct a detailed study of the 1989 Championships in Italy and because of this decision I will be accompanying the team to Italy at, I am pleased to say, no expense to the Association. The support we receive from the Australian Sports Commission is very much appreciated and as can be seen by this month's notes, we have been favorably considered in two areas, Junior Development Camp at Canberra to which ten juniors have been invited and the opportunity to prepare thoroughly for 1991 by taking into account the happenings in Italy in 1989.

The eliminations in Brisbane will be open to all registered shooters, however, the members of the National Training Squad will, as would be expected, be shooting as a squad throughout the 300T of the eliminations. We wish every member of the squad the best of luck as they strive to gain selection to represent their country at the 1989 World Shotgun Championships and the 1990 Commonwealth Games.

Shooters registrations for 1989 are down in number, no doubt due to the belief that gun licensing problems have gone away. This is, I believe, for those who have not reregistered for 1989, an error of judgement and as a sport, we urge all shotgun shooters to renew their registration with the A.C.T.A. If you know of any shooters who have not as yet renewed for 1989 perhaps you could give a word of encouragement for them to do so.

In closing it was very interesting to see at first hand, the progress made by the Nationals Computer Sub committee at Echuca where a program to computerize all championships was put through its paces. We owe a great deal of thanks to Mike and Merril Fisher from N.S.W. who have, between them, put in untold hours to produce the program that, with very minor tuning, appeared to me to pass all tests with flying colours. In addition to his effort with the computer, Mike found time to shoot the nationals program, finishing one target down in the Overall High Gun. Thank you, Mike and Merril, as well as your capable co-worker Johanna whose contribution along with that of N.S.W. State Secretary, Jenny Burt, must not go unmentioned — thank you all. The driving force at National level was Pud Burgess who, if not previously converted to the need to computerize, is a strong advocate of the need to computerize at an early date. Thank you Pud for your contribution which was instrumental in reaching the stage which we are now at.

Good luck with your shooting.

AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC FEDERATION

DOPING POLICY

Advice has been received by the A.O.F. Doping Policy which came into effect on February 3, 1989.

In order to give support to the A.O.F. stand against drugs in sport, the policy is being published in its entirety to ensure that there is no doubt as to the consequences of a positive test at A.O.F. level. Tests previously were only carried out in the year of the Olympics whereas now they may be carried out at any time.

REVISED DOPING POLICY OF THE AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC FEDERATION ("A.O.F.")

(Adopted 3rd February, 1989)

In this policy, the following words shall have the meanings set forth below:

"athlete" shall mean a member or potential member of an Australian Olympic Team and/or members of a member body or persons competing in a competition under the control or auspices of a member body;

"doping" shall have the same meaning as determined from time to time by the International Olympic Committee;

"member body" shall mean a member body of the A.O.F. pursuant to its Constitution;

"official" shall mean an official of a responsible authority, coach, medical practitioner, sports scientist or psychologist or other person associated with sport other than as an athlete;

"responsible authority" shall mean the Australian Olympic Federation, the International Olympic Committee, the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Institute of Sports, International Federations, National Federations, Australian Governments (both Commonwealth and State), State Institutes of Sport and/or State Sporting Associations;

and such words when used in the plural shall have a corresponding meaning.

- 1. Doping is forbidden.
- This policy applies to all member bodies, athletes and officials.
- All athletes are liable to doping controls which shall be conducted by the A.O.F. Medical Commission in conformity with the rules from time to time of the I.O.C. Medical Commission ("a doping control examination").
- All member bodies shall cause all athletes to be liable to a doping control examination to be conducted in conformity with the rules of the I.O.C. Medical Commission.
 - All member bodies shall permit the A.O.F. Medical Commission:
 - (i) to attend competitions conducted by them or under their auspices and conduct doping control examinations on athletes, and
 - (ii) conduct doping control examinations on their members out of competition,
 - which examinations shall be in addition to those conducted by the responsible authority or authorities concerned.
 - All member bodies shall require their members to consent to the conduct of such doping control examinations as a condition of their membership of the A.O.F.
- Samples taken by the A.O.F. Medical Commission or by a member body shall be analysed by a laboratory accredited by the I.O.C. (provided however that the

first sample may be analysed at the Australian Government Analytical Laboratory at Pymble, New South Wales, notwithstanding that it is not accredited by the I.O.C.). Two samples shall be taken and upon being informed by the laboratory that the analysis of the first sample reveals a breach of the doping provisions, the Chairman of the A.O.F. Medical Commission or a duly authorised officer of the member body will authorise the analysis of the second sample. Upon being informed that the analysis of the second sample confirms the breach of the doping provisions, the Chairman or such duly authorised officer shall notify the Secretary-General of the A.O.F. of such result.

- Athletes are liable to any number of doping control examinations in any year, whether in or out of competition.
- 7. Subject to Rule 8 of this policy:
 - (1) Any athlete who is found by a responsible authority to have taken or used drugs or stimulants or participated in other related doping practices prohibited by that responsible authority (all of which are hereinafter called "doping provisions") will be ineligible for life for selection in any Australian Olympic Team or to hold any position on the A.O.F.
 - (2) Any official or other person who aids, abets, counsels or procures or is knowingly involved in an athlete's breach of a responsible authority's doping provisions will be ineligible for life for selection in any Australian Olympic Team or to hold any position on the A.O.F.
 - (3) If already selected in an Australian Olympic Team or holding an A.O.F. position, the athlete and/or official will be immediately removed from that Team or position upon any breach of the doping provisions.
- 8. Upon receipt of notification pursuant to Rule 5, or upon being notified by any responsible authority that there has been a breach of that authority's doping provisions, the Secretary-General shall notify in writing the athlete or official or other person concerned of the finding of the responsible authority and stating that such person shall have the opportunity to be heard by the Executive Board of the A.O.F. at the meeting stated in such notice and present any relevant material as to why he or she should not be subject to the penalties prescribed by Rule 7.

Any decision of the Executive Board of the A.O.F. to impose a lesser penalty than prescribed in Rule 7 shall be in its sole and absolute discretion.

- 9. Any Olympic Team member who refuses to submit to a doping control examination will be immediately removed from that Team and be ineligible for life for selection in any Australian Olympic Team or to hold any position on the A.O.F. Any other athlete who refuses to submit to a doping control examination will be ineligible for life for selection in any Australian Olympic Team or to hold any position on the A.O.F.
- 10. It is the intent of this policy that responsible authorities, other than the I.O.C., A.O.F. and member bodies, shall conduct doping control examinations in conformity with the rules of the I.O.C. Medical Commission, but the failure so to do shall not of itself invalidate the findings of any such doping control examination.
- 11. This policy shall apply to any Director or officer of any corporation and committee member or officer of any association, where such Director, committee member or officer has been knowingly involved in, or acquiesced to, or approved of such corporation or association aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring an athlete's breach of a responsible authority's doping provisions.

Any such director, committee member or officer shall be liable to the same penalty as if he or she were an official. 12. The Australian Olympic Federation Executive Board will be responsible for the administration and implementation of this policy and will continue to monitor developments in this area.

In support of the A.O.F. Policy, the question on the adoption of a policy by the A.C.T.A. will be addressed at an early date.

1989 WORLD SHOTGUN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications are called for the position of Team Manager for the World Shotgun Championships to be held at Montecatini, Italy, from 4th September, to 10th September, 1989.

It is envisaged that the teams will consist of three Open Olympic Trap, three Open I.S.U.

Skeet and three Junior Olympic Trap Members who would be competing at the invitation of the Association.

The successful applicant will be required to attend an elimination at the Brisbane Gun Club which will be held on July 7th-July 9th and be readily available from that time for consultation with the Executive Director on all aspects relating to arrangements to compete in the 1989 Championships.

Applicants would need to be able to demonstrate qualities that would enable them to work in close harmony with members of the team and organizational ability to ensure that all team members are able to compete to the best of their

ability.

Applications will be received in writing addressed to the Executive Director, Australian Clay Target Association, P.O. Box 800, Glen Waverley, Vic., 3150, up to and including 12th May, 1989.






represented, with the shooters vying for four championships including one state title.





A TRIBUTE TO PETER QUIRE

By one who appreciates his talents

At the Adelaide Nationals of 1978, I was sitting behind one of the layouts waiting for my turn to shoot, when I noticed a fellow approaching with a couple of spanners in his hand. We chatted a bit about how the trap was going and as he left I thought to myself, "What a pleasant man."

I never gave any of this a second thought until a few days later when I attended the foundation meeting of the Australian Coaching Council and there sitting across from me was this same fellow and I was introduced to Peter Quire, and so began a very valued friendship.

Peter progressed from being the South Australian Coach to the National Coach on the retirement of Newton Thomas in 1981. The contribution by Peter Quire to Clay Target Shooting has been immense. Each State now has Level 3 Coaches plus Level 2 and dozens of Level 1 Coaches all closely tied together within the system. Our National teams competing away at World. Olympic and Commonwealth Games events have improved steadily under Peter's guidance and Peter is now recognised in many other countries as an astute coach of world class.

Peter has never been a pushy coach, but rather one who sows the seeds of an idea and then lets the shooter work on that. This is coaching at its best, although sometimes it is misunderstood by outsiders who do not understand what is going on.

Peter's greatest trait is his approachability, for he has the wonderful gift of being able to relate to everyone equally.

Shooting will be the poorer for Peter Quire's retirement and the incoming person to this position, will, I am sure, find Peter only too willing to help if asked to do so.

Finally Peter, if I can be so bold as to say, on behalf of your thousands of shooting friends, most of whom owe you much for your help over the years, may good luck and happiness be yours in the years to come and we hope to see you around the traps from time to time.
