

1989 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

All roads in 1989 led to Echuca so far as trap shooters were concerned and an air of expectation filled the skies as competitors prepared for the first day's shooting. The Echuca Gun Club were prepared for most eventualities, however, the rain was not one of those eventualities as the heavy downpour turned the car parks and the club grounds into a quagmire. Nevertheless, the Nationals, after a delayed start, were under way with the tradional state teams Shoulder to Shoulder Match the first event on the program.



Prior to the state teams match, visitors to Echuca were made most welcome by the State Member for Rodney, Mr Noel Maughan, who, after declaring the Championship, open fired the traditional first shot of the Championships.

STATE TEAMS — SHOULDER TO SHOULDER

Teams from all states were introduced and following their participation in the opening ceremonies were anxious to post a winning score for their state and the A.C.T.A. Cup being the traditional trophy for the State Teams event. Defending champion in the event, Western Australia, despite their combined efforts, were not able to successfully defend their title, with South Australia 122-125 taking the event by one target from Victoria, with W.A. a further target away on 120/125 for third place. A very popular win overall and certainly enjoyed by the



South Australians who participated in the event and the presentations in a most creditable manner as South Australian representatives. All teams shot the event in a sportsman-like manner and extended their congratulations to the winners: Champion State — 1989 — South Australia, 122/125.

40th GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

Despite the conditions, 520 shooters nominated for the event with the largest contingent, as would be expected, coming from Victoria, with 249 shooters. A delighted Eliot Reid from Victoria Gun Club found the Handicap event to his liking, and from the 17 metre mark with a 59/59 took the title in a shoot off from Sebastopol's Scott Cook 17m. Overall third, Glen Kable, also shooting from 17m, shot a very creditable 99/101. With 14 ladies in the field, Suzanne Balogh from Canberra, shooting a possible 50/50, took the Ladies Section and appears to have an excellent future in the sport. Marconi's Chris Alvaro from the 16m mark outshot the other 19 juniors in the event, with a well known and very capable shooter from Echuca, David Penn, taking the veterans title with a score of 54/57 from the 18m mark. National Champion 1989 — Eliot Reid, Victoria Gun Club 59/59, 17m — 520 competitors.



37th NATIONAL DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP

Event Sponsor — Olin Australia, Winchester Division. The traditional blue ribbon event for trap shooters, the Double Barrel, was again well supported with 603 shooters nominating for the event and magnificent trophies provided by Winchester who, as always, showed their support for our National Trap Championships.

Many good and not-so-good performances in the event with none better, however, than overall winner, Ian Holschier from Deniliquin who was unbeaten on 351/351,

Event Sponsor, Olin Australia, Winchester Division. Conditions had not improved with the mud proving to be a nuisance to all and making it difficult to freely move


around the grounds of the Echuca Gun Club.

Wayne Parkes from Wonthaggi, after missing only one target in the event, had to be content after a shoot off, with his first placing in AA Grade.

The Junior Section was well won by Michael Diamond whose overall consistency again proved to be too much for the other juniors to overcome. Bill Mackay from Bega was a very pleased veteran with his 49/50 winning the Veteran's Section defeating 19 other veteran shooters whose shooting skills do not appear to have really diminished despite veterans status.

We would like to record our appreciation to Winchester for again making available to all competitors the Winchester cartridges which by now form a traditional part of this event.






49th CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS


GLENN CUP -- AUSTRALIA vs NEW ZEALAND



HISTORY OF OUR SPORT SILENT ACHIEVERS OF OUR GAME



LEN BIRD

By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian

Every once in a while we meet up with people in our sport who are actually pillars of our game of clay target shooting. People who, over the years, have quietly but thoroughly contributed to the development of our sport with dedication and a minimum of fuss. Len Bird is one such person.

It was the National Championships at Griffith in 1979 where I really got the opportunity to know Len better. On this occasion he was doing a very efficient job as shoot marshal.

I've always considered Len a man of action. He is never at a loss to give good advice and constructive criticism when needed. Len, no doubt, has been a tower of strength to the New South Wales Clay Target Association over the years especially in earlier days when the State Associations were being formed. His contribution to our sport began back in 1954, not only on the sporting side, but in all facets of administration from club level to national level.

Len was the instigator of the formation of the Cowra Gun Club in 1954. He served as club secretary for six years, and then as club president for the next twenty one years. During his term as president, the Cowra Gun Club grew from nothing to becoming a major gun club in New South Wales. Many shooters claim it is one of the best run clubs in the state.

On many occasions, Len would leave his gun at home so that he could put his full time and energy to running a good shoot for the enjoyment of other shooters. He was always on hand to help shooters down on their luck or in need of help. Very few people ever knew the amount of work he did behind the scenes, not only for people, but for our sport generally. Len is not one to boast about his deeds. His vast

experience in the shooting world helped him to fulfil his aims, not without sometimes difficulty and frustration, but also an enormous amount of satisfaction when he won through. Our sport of clay target shooting is very fortunate in that we have men like Len Bird who are willing and capable of giving so much of their time to our sport so that we may benefit and enjoy the game we love. The new South Wales Clay Target Association is ineeded fortunate to have such a leader.

Listed below are a few of his achievements over the years:

Len served on the National Executive for a period of three years, 1979-81. He helped form the N.S.W.C.T.A. in 1973 and did a lot of work in the eary days, serving on the committee for over seven years, as Vice President and State President. Along with this he has been a zone delegate for a good many years, first as vice president of the western zone, and as vice president of the northern zone. Len was also the driving force behind the formation of the new Central zone in N.S.W. He was the instigator of forming the then Central and Southern Gun Club Council in 1965, and served as President of that council. Len was involved in forming the Grenfell, Young and Boorowa clubs in N.S.W. He has been a referee for 23 years, and a referee examiner for 20 years. He has mastered the art of Shoot Marshal at many major shoots including National and State Carnivals.

Len was instrumental for the introduction of Sunday shooting in N.S.W., was also responsible for a number of major trophies donated by sporting companies in his state, as well as donating many himself.

Len helped organize, and ran, the first big coaching weekend held in N.S.W. when National, State and Zone coaches attended, held at Cowra during 1980. I had the pleasure of being present on this occasion.

In 1984 Len was awarded the A.C.T.A. Presidential Medal for his contribution to clay target shooting.

The Club will be hosting both the State and the National Skeet Championships. To hold these events the club has extended their layouts by building a further two permanent layouts, a total of seven.


There have also been smaller improvements such as the spreading of loam to build up the low areas.



TOP HANDGUNNER ELGIN GATES DIES

Accomplished shooter and cartridge developer Elgin Gates of Idaho Falls, Idaho, died Nov. 16 of a heart attack. He was 66 years old.

Mr Gates' list of accomplishments is a long one. He served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, and at war's end he took up boat racing. In a 10-year period, Mr Gates won several national championships and set 26 national racing records.

As a shotgun shooter, Mr Gates captured back-to-back championships in the international trapshooting event at the 1975 and '76 Grand American. He also won 17 national and international titles in six different countries during the mid 1970s.

Mr Gates was president of the International Handgun Metallic Silhouette Ass'n until the time of his death. During his leadership of IHMSA, the association saw its membership increase to more than 40,000 shooters, and in 1987 the group sponsored about 3,500 silhouette competitions. For his work and dedication to the sport, Mr Gates was awarded the Outstanding American Handgunner Award.

A renowned big game hunter, Mr Gates was the winner of the 1960 Weatherby Big Game Trophy and he was inducted into the Big Game Hall of Fame in 1978. Through his hunting career, Mr Gates put more than 200 trophy animals on the record books.






