

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Following the series of meetings held by the Executive from May 17 to 21, 49 of the 52 recommendations put to the full executive by the sub-committees were adopted. It is a pleasure to see the executive all pulling together for the improvement of clay target shooting. I am confident this harmony will continue. I would like to thank them all for their effort during these meetings.

We had a break from meetings on Friday when we were invited by Winchester to inspect their plant at Geelong. What an enjoyable day it was. Thank you John Canning and all the people at Winchester for their efforts to make us feel so welcome. It was appreciated by us all.

I have just seen the May membership figures. It shows that 2,616 shooters have not re-registered for this year. To put it another way the A.C.T.A. is down well over \$90,000. I ask all to contact their people and urge them to re-join the A.C.T.A. Take it from me, the gun laws issue has not gone away, it will reappear at any time and we must be ready. One way to do this is to build up our membership. Why don't clubs have a little competition to see which member can introduce the biggest number of new or old shooters to the A.C.T.A.?

The next item I would like to bring to your attention is PROMOTION. This should start at grass roots level, that is you, the shooter, and your Club. We must do much, much more to promote ourselves as shooters and show that we are members of a responsible sporting club, as part of our community.

For example:

(a) Advertise in your local paper, or on your local television station that your club will be holding instruction days on gun safety and gun handling on the first three Saturdays or Sundays of the month, between 2.00pm and 5.00pm. I am sure your Zone Coach would help your Club Coach if asked.

(b) Hold a film night and barbecue at your club. I know there are a number of good, interesting tapes which clubs can borrow through the coaching system. This is an easy way to show people the enjoyment of clay target shooting. (c) Ask your club to conduct a charity shoot. Pick a worthwhile charity in your area. Ask them for their support in organising the shoot with all proceeds going to the nominated charity. Have a two man team over the program, one member of the team to be a member of the club, the other to be a member of the charity. This type of competition creates a lot of interest.

These are just a few ideas I believe you can use to promote our sport. I would welcome it if people would write to the C.T.S.N. letting other clubs know what they are doing to promote their club and our sport. This is a self help experience.

The I.S.U. team eliminations have been and were conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club for the 1989 World Championships and the 1990 Commonwealth Games. To the successful team members congratulations and on behalf of all shooters I wish them every success in the forthcoming championships. To the other members of the National Training Squad, commiserations.

By the time you read these notes the A.C.t.A. will have most likely purchased our present office at 3 Essex Road, Mount Waverley. To me this is a great step forward, not only are we not paying rent each month but we have invested our money back into bricks and mortar. Whilst we have most of thefunds required to pay for our very own building, some money will have to be borrowed from the bank. Final figures have been worked out by our financial adviser. With this in mind I appeal to you all, shooters, clubs, zones and State Associations to give serious consideration to lending the A.C.T.A., your Association, money to help offset the high interest rates the banks are charging at present. If anyone is interested, the A.C.T.A. is offering debentures of \$1000 minimum, interest rate of 71/2% payable 1st December each year. We already have \$25,000 in our Debenture Program, but a few more holders would be appreciated. The more you take up the more it will help the A.C.T.A., and as I said before, it is your Association. So if you have a spare \$1000 to invest, invest it in the future of Clay Target Shooting. Application forms are in this month's C.T.S.N.

I understand there is some resentment in some quarters with the rise in club advertising rates. The Executive have given this matter a lot of thought over a long period of time. One reason behind this decision was to try to offset some of the losses incurred with the printing of the C.T.S.N. Other suggestions were put forward but it was thought this one was the fairest to all. If anyone has any ideas how we can reduce the cost of the C.T.S.N. please let your Executive know.

It is a big problem, a problem the Executive is mindful of, and is watching closely at all times. I would like to point out, last year the cost for the C.T.S.N. was well over \$50,000. I do not know any small business that can stand a cost of that size in one section of its operation without taking positive steps to reduce it.

One last point that has come to my notice is the rumours that seem to abound. We cannot stop them, but we can try to correct them. By this I mean if people who start them were to make sure of all the facts and that the facts are correct. To do this ask one of your National Executive Members or give me a ring. We on the Executive do not run a secret society, ask and you shall be told. The rumours going around at present are quite untrue and completely unfounded, nevertheless some people believe them, and this in itself is undermining your Association. How can clay target shooting grow and prosper if people, and it is only a few, continually spread untrue rumours and knock the A.C.T.A.? Let's get on with the business and enjoy the sport and the pleasure that comes with breaking targets.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The various committees of the Association have been very active in recent times with no less than eight meetings taking place during the latter part of May. Owing to the printing deadlines for the CTSN this is the first available opportunity of being able to report back to members on the outcome of the meetings by way of a summary of the discussions that took place together with advice on decisions made.

National Shooting Committee: A total of 14 recommendations were placed before the members of the National Executive Committee for decision with only the one recommendation not being adopted, that being the decision taken by the Executive not to approve the recommendation to shoot the State teams Matches Olympic Discipline over the first 150 targets of the Nationals in favor of retaining the existing system which was implemented for 1989 at the request of State Association whereby the State Teams Matches are shot over 50T on the afternoon of the third day. The decision to retain this system will undoubtedly displease some, however, in the best interests of all competitors, the State Teams Matches will continue to be shot as an event giving recognition to those whose shooting prowess has gained for them an opportunity to actually shoot for their state as against merely having their scores over the first two days

We are awaiting early advice from the U.I.T. on the result of our applications for David Menck and Jim Kelly to gain A Grade judges status. Both David and Jim have been nominated for official positions at the 1990 Commonwealth Games at which time we trust that they will be officiating in some capacity with their status being that of A Grade judge.

With the 1991 Oceanic Games scheduled to be held in Adelaide in February of that year, the decision has been taken to allocate the 1991 Olympic Discipline Championships to SACTA with the Commonwealth Titles offered to WACTA as a forerunner to the 1991 World Shotgun Championships. Double Trap as from 1990 is to be included on the Olympic Discipline Program being shot on day seven over three rounds of 25 pair plus a 25 pair final with the winner being declared National Champion and receiving National Title Awards. In addition double trap has been given Commonwealth Title status with the first title shot for during the latter part of this year under the control of the NSWCTA.

Robert Smith, Committee Chairman, reported on the successful Junior Development Camp at the Australian Institute of Sport which was attended by juniors representing shotgun disciplines. An application has been made to continue this program through into 1990 and we are confident of being able to have our juniors visit the Institute again in 1990. The continuous support and recognition of this Association by the A.I.S. is very much appreciated by those who are fortunate to be able to participate and we look forward to the continuation of this support in the years ahead.

Peter Hayman (N.S.W.) was re-elected to the National Shooting Committee as DTL Shooters Representative for a further term and is anxious to do well for those shooters that he represents. He will do this, however, it would greatly assist not only Peter but the two other Shooters Representatives, David Menck (I.S.U.), Robert Dower (Skeet), if you, the shooter, let them have your thoughts on matters you believe require addressing. All can be contacted direct or by writing c/o the A.C.T.A.

Correspondence received from Adrian Cousens, President of the Skeet Shooters Association, was discussed at length. However, the matters raised by Adrian did not in the main gain the support of the Committee. Other matters raised were addressed at a meeting of the National Championships Committee at which Adrian attended and over a two hour period

discussed and presented the views of the Skeet Shooters Association.

The appointment was made following a recommendation to the Executive of Robert Smith, Committee Chairman and Level 3 Coach as Team Manager for the 1989 World Shotgun Championships, as well as for the Commonwealth Games team participating in the New Zealand ISU Nationals as a lead up to the 1990 Games. Robert is very well credentialled for the position and well respected by those who he will have in his charge.

The Association has also endorsed the A.O.F. and A.C.G.A. Policy on Doping and Drug Testing, something which we trust is only a formality and an area of which the Association never has to face in relation to our shotgun athletes — we believe this will continue to be the case.

In keeping with the Mackintosh Event for trap shooters, we as an Association, are corresponding with other countries in an effort to establish a similar teams event for standard skeet. The ACTA has in its possession a trophy which is to be offered for competition (being retained in Australia owing to its monetary value) and while this will take some time to establish, we are hoping that the inaugural year of competition will be 1991. More about this as times goes by.

National Rules Committee:

A number of rule changes were discussed and presented to the Executive. These have been published as a separate notice in this issue. Please note your rule book with the amendments which should not cause any real concern as they are all seen to be straight forward.

The one matter that will call for greater discussion is the decision to review the section of the rules that relate to handicap shooting with a view to implementing a revised set of rules based upon a previous system which is generally considered to have been more workable and acceptable which will, it is hoped, see a return to handicap shooting in most programs.

The presentation of handicap cards at National Championships was discussed and it was noted that no less than 38 competitors failed to produce their card at Echuca for the Trap Nationals. As this is in conflict with the rules the penalty on future occasions as well as what is contained in the rules, will be a monetary penalty of \$20.00 which would need to be paid prior to the acceptance of a shooter's nomination. A little harsh some may say, but not those who comply with the rules; and aren't these the shooters we should be seen to be supporting?

National Computer Committee instigated to develop the use of computer facilities for all National championships has produced a finished program with the expertise of N.S.W. shooter Michael Fisher. Under the direction of Pud Burgess the decision has been taken that the Trap Nationals in Tasmania, apart from the squadding of competitors, will be controlled by computer. It will take some a while to get used to and accept the decision, however, all would surely agree that computers, being here to stay, must come into account at the Nationals either sooner or later. The decision has been taken to make it sooner and we look forward to 1990 and the years ahead as the program gains the support that is necessary if it is to succeed — which it will.

Following the Tasmanian Nationals the program will be made available to all states at no cost to encourage the implementation of standard programming at all State as well as National Championships.

Promotions Committee. Our sponsorship agreement with Winchester was discussed and having had previous discussions with the company the option contained in the contract was expected to be taken up by Winchester. The Management Committee met with Winchester personnel John Canning, General Manager, Bruce Burns, Marketing Manager, and Gary Matchan, Sales Manager at the

Winchester plant and following this meeting it is expected that the re-signing of the contract for the 1989/90 year leading up to the Tasmanian Nationals will shortly be finalised.

Additional sponsorship has been made available by the Beretta Company through Winchester of an S05 Shotgun for the ISU Nationals. The decision on where to place the trophy has not as yet been finalised although it appears that it will be for presentation to the Olympic Trap High Gun over the 400T of the Championship. We are indebted to Winchester for this totally unexpected trophy which greatly enhances the support that we as as Association, receive through the Winchester Company.

Executive Committee: Commencing at 8.30am the Executive met throughout the day with less than 60 minutes taken for morning tea and luncheon break before the meeting concluded at 6.50pm — a total of 10½ hours of continued discussions on behalf of all aspects of the sport. National Championship allocations were made, Olympic Discipline, S.A. 1991, Qld. 1992, with the request made to Victoria to relinquish the 1990 Skeet titles in favor of Queensland who would, in turn, pass their 1991 allocated year to Victoria. This has subsequently been agreed to with the Skeet Nationals 1990 to be shot most likely during September at the approved ground, Townsville.

The continuing problem of locating a suitable National office was discussed with a visit by the Executive Committee to both Hoppers Crossing where a property had been offered and the proposed International Shooting Complex at Werribee. As a result of the Hoppers Crossing inspection and inquiries made at the site, it was the decision of the Executive that the Management Committee by their rejection of the Hoppers Crossing property for the reasons given, had acted in a manner in accordance with the responsibility of their office. It was also the opinion of the Executive that the proposed shooting complex at Werribee was not of any significance to the Association so far as the siting of a National Office was concerned owing to its remoteness. Elections for 1989 resulted in the following positions being filled:

President — Mr Jim Scott, NSW; Vice President — Mr Ross Silvester, W.A.; Management — Mr Neil Hardy, Qld, Mr Pud Burgess NSW; Rules Committee — Mr John McVitty, Vic. 3 year appointment; National Shooting Committee — Mr John Fissioli, WA, 2 year appointment; Mr Peter Hayman, NSW, 2 year appointment, DTL representative; Promotions — Mr Leighton Martin, SA; Mr Ross Silvester, WA; Mr Robert Smith, NSW; National Championship — Mr Richard Brook, Qld; 2 year appointment; Mr Jack Matthey, Vic, 2 year appointment; Mr Robert Smith, NSW, 1 year appointment; Mr John Murphy, Tas, 1 year appointment; Nationals Computer — Mr Pud Burgess, NSW; Mr Bob Fox, NT; Mr Ross Silvester, WA; Mr N. Hardy, Qld; Premises Committee — Mr Jim Scott, NSW; Mr Ross Silvester, WA; Mr Neil Hardy, Qld; Mr Pud Burgess, NSW; Mr Jack Matthey, Vic.

Discussion also took place on the Association's Articles of Association and the Management Committee were entrusted with the responsibility to review the constitution in keeping with advice received and the structuring of a National Sporting body.

We have been fortunate to obtain the services of NSW State Coaching Director/Level 3 Coach Colin Burt from Tamworth as National Coaching Director and Colin will commence his duties as from 1st July. Colin, as part of his duties, is also National Coach for all disciplines and Chairman of the National Coaching Council. Taking over from Peter Quire, who was very experienced in the position, Colin will be looking for all the support and assistance that can be provided and in this regard he will appreciate your assistance and co-operation. It must be pointed out that the National Coaching Director's duties do not entail coaching at any level other than as National Coach and to assist the State Coaching Directors who have the Coaching responsibility in their respective states. National Coaching Director's principal role is to continue the successful coaching accreditation scheme operating in all states as well as to provide back-up service to State Coaching Directors. While this may not appear to be a time consuming role, he also is a member of the National Shooting Committee, National Coach, as well as having the responsibility to successfully steer our athletes through the Australian Institute of Sport. This is not taking into account the many activities which, through the National Office, also involve the National Coaching Director — Colin needs the support of all involved and as he has the respect of our members, this support will be forthcoming. I would like to take this opportunity to also thank all applicants for the position who, while not being successful, showed their continued interest in the sport of clay target shooting.

A number of projects are on the drawing board, many of which are dependent on the outcome of our application for funding to the Institute of Sport. They include the development of a women's squad for the 1991 Championships, something which the Association is keen to see in operation. While on international competition, all shooters wishing to compete in overseas competition that does not include an official ACTA team, will only be able to do so once they have recorded the minimum scores of Olympic Trap 182/200 and ISU Skeet 184/200.

National Championships Committee:

This Committee chaired by Robert Smith is one that takes into account all matters relating to National Championships. It is not a decision making committee in its own right, instead changes are brought about as the result of recommendations emanating from the matters presented for discussion and those raised by Committee members. Matters of general interest that came from the meeting included a lengthy discussion with Adrian Cousens on behalf of the Skeet Shooters Association which, while not producing the end result that may have been required, nevertheless enabled the views of the Skeet Association to be both heard and discussed. Three offers of trophies for National Championships were recommended for acceptance subject to the acceptance by the donor of the conditions imposed by the Association. Trophies were for one of each of the Nationals, a perpetual trophy donated by Art Goodman USA, for the Olympic Trap High Gun Best International, Mixed Pairs Trophy for the Skeet Nationals and a trophy to recognise the performance of any shooter who qualifies for the Mackintosh Team with a possible 250/250. Once donors have confirmed their acceptance of the conditions of the trophies further details will be published.

Following receipt of correspondence from an interested shooter, a recommendation was approved to eliminate the loss of one target for any person being late for their squad at National Championships Trap and Skeet replacing the penalty with one of the forfeiture of the nomination paid and the requirement to renominate in order to compete in the event for which the penalty was incurred. An interesting discussion took place relating to the Deauville Doubles at National Championships and the eligibility of competitors. It was agreed that the traditional guidelines be adhered to with all who wished to compete being made aware that the event has a family tradition within accepted boundaries and those who wished to discount the family conditions governing the event could well be by their actions jeopardising the continuance of the Deauville Doubles if they persisted with their approach to disregard the intentions behind the introduction of this increasingly popular event.

Another matter of great interest was the decision to promote the possibility of increasing the Trap Nationals from six to seven days and shoot the Double Barrel championships over 100 Targets. If you have any specific views on this, then please let us have your thoughts preferably through the avenues of zone and state associations.

The juniors who would be attending the 1989 World Championships in Italy in defence of their Junior World Team Title are each to be allocated \$1,000 from the Junior Teams Fund to help defray expenses. As from 1990 a junior will be included in the National Training squads irrespective of the composition of the open squads — Juniors, however, will be members at their own expense and not be eligible for open team selection owing to their inclusion in the squad for the opportunity of gaining valuable experience.

A very interesting point is the decision to consider whether or not 1 oz/28 gr loads should be introduced for all disciplines as against the mandatory ISU. This will be discussed over the next twelve months and if you have a view then make certain that it is heard.

Reverting back to the Skeet Shooters Association, the Executive have again had to refuse their consent to the name requested for incorporation "Australian Skeet Shooters Association" owing to its similarity in name and objectives of the ACTA as has been noted in advice received from the Corporate Affairs Office. The Executive reasoning is sound on this issue even though their decision does not rest easily with the skeet shooters. The decision has again been taken in the best interests of all shooters, not just skeet shooters, and one must surely agree that such a decision, while not popular with the Skeet Shooters Association, is difficult to disagree with.

The Skeet Nationals at Wagga will be over the traditional 400 targets with the high gun over 350T excluding the National Skeet Doubles Championship. One of the last decisions taken at the Executive Meeting was the one that determined that the only cartridges that would be made available for purchase on the grounds during the Pre Nationals and National Championships would be those made available through the occupiers of trade sites by the respective manufacturers licensed to the A.C.T.A. — a decision not lightly taken, however, in view of the support given both to Pre Nationals and National Championships

THE SEARCH FOR OUR OLDEST GUN CLUBS CONTINUES

Australia's involvement in trapshooting goes back (as far as I'm able to gather), to the early 1800s and was a carry over from the sport brought here by our early settlers from the old world. Of course the targets were live pigeons in those times and so live bird trap shooting clubs were eventually established throughout Australia. It was not until 1900 that clay targets were developed in America and later in the early 1920s to Australia. As clay targets gained more favour, live pigeon clubs went into recess. However, quite a number converted to clays as equipment became available. A number of these such clubs are operating today. From this small number of clubs I am trying to establish one that is Australia's oldest and longest operating gun club. In the following issues of Clay Target News, I will be telling the story of several clubs that go back to 1886. Can anyone beat this? If so, please let us know. I would certainly appreciate your help!

The following story comes from the Narrabri Gun Club in New South Wales. I am sure your will find it interesting.

Narrabri Gun Club, NSW, 1905

The first "Gun Club" that the writer can remember in Narrabri was about the year 1905-6 period. My father was a very keen enthusiast and a good shot at the "traps". It is rather difficult to try and give a history in that so many gun clubs were formed, died out and were again resurrected by another crowd of enthusiasts on a different ground altogether.

The club formed in 1905-6 by J.M. McDonald assisted by an enthusiastic committee comprising Messrs Jim McCutcheon, Horrie Lillyman, Harry Foster (Squire of Merihula Wine Shop and Grandfather of the Foster boys of Narrabri), Dugie Frater, Billy Smith (Wynella) and many others I cannot remember.

The first shoot was held at Dugie Frater's property immediately opposite Merihula Wine Shop. Birds were live pigeons, betting was allowed and even in those days betting on the first barrel was prolific. The club housed a number of birds at Frater's house (now demolished) where they were regularly housed and fed. When there was a missed bird, he could not get back to the loft quick enough.

In live bird shoots there were five traps in a fan shape each equi-distant from and connected to a central control where the umpire sat. Marks (that is the shooters position) ranged from 32 yards to 20 yards. The boundary was roped off a distance of 35 yards from the trap and the bird had to be killed within that boundary. Lots of people have not seen live bird shoots so this little bit of information will not go astray. Birds were first collected by a "runner" and he would go around the bird and the boundary. Later some very clever gun dogs were introduced for retrieving the birds and they were remarkably well trained. These dogs would follow the shooter to his mark, stand quietly behind the shooter and when he fired they were off to retrieve the bird. Peculiarly enough the good dogs would hardly move and seemed to know when it was a dead bird or not. Bets were on the first barrel only, although a kill on the second barrel allowed the shooter to remain in the sweep.

At the first meeting I was astonished at the colossal bets that were made by some of the shooters. Frank Manchee laid £120 to £80 on and missed and ended up losing over £400. George Gilbey was also a terrific bettor on himself.

Getting back to the first shoot at Merihula, the big shoot was won by a local, "Bob Dempsey", off 20 yards. Bob was a real good bush shot and it seemed to run in the family, for later on the names of brothers will be mentioned. Frank Manchee from Moree shot off 30 yards and Morgan

Crowhust shot off 32. What a lovely shot Mr Crowhurst was, a bird rarely got a few yards from the trap before it was dropped. We kids got five bob each for picking up, and incidentally, we each got five cuts from old Bob Taylor for wagging it from school.

After a while birds became scarce and costly and about a couple of years before the 1914 war, clays came on the market. Casual shoots were held in the centre of the race course but the ground was unsatisfactory because of shooting into the sun.


Every shooter had his own gun, including some very good makes such as Purdys, Boswell, Cashmore, Holloway-Norton, Greener and Hollis. There were a few Browning Automatic 6 shot. There were not any under and over Japanese guns. The cartridges used were mostly Balastite, Mullerite and Diamond Smokeless. One hundred cartridges cost ten bob. Morgan Crowhurst represented "Diamond Smokeless". He picked out for my dad a beautiful Hammerless Boswell Gun. I still have the gun.

Live bird shooting was again resurrected and a very enthusiastic team formed a new club at Tom Barrett's Hotel, including Tom Barrett, the two Dempseys (Cyril and Fred), Bill Galloway, Jack Houguet, Wal Martin, Dave Thomas, Pat Casey and many others. The club staged a shoot (live birds at the old Plumpton, Egans' Paddock) and Sid Delander won the big shoot from George Gilbey. The Plumpton layout was not a success and the club next had a shoot at the back part of the racecourse opposite Moylan's Paddock. At the first shoot a young lad in his first suit of long trousers stole the show and out-shot all the big gun shooters. It was only "Vic Eather", so well known by shooters all over Australia.

At one shoot on this new ground we had the pleasure of entertaining Luke Hughes who had just come back from winning the Melbourne centenary shoot. Luke was the possessor of one of the most beautiful Purdy Double Barrel (2 sets of barrels) guns.

The shoots at the racecourse had a "conscientious objector" to the sport on the grounds that shooting of the pigeons was a form of "cruelty". The same gentleman used to go about half a mile outside the shoot and wait for the missed or wounded birds to squat in a tree and he would have a sitting shot and eventually get his "pigeon pie".

After a lapse of 25 years, yet another band of enthusiasts got together and formed another gun club and decided on Perfume (Newtown) Park for the shooting. The new President was Bruce Mill, Vice President Bruce Solling and joint Honorary Secretaries Dave Thomas and Pat Casey. In the early stages the committee were greatly assisted by Vic Eather of Boggabri club. The Perfume Park site had a very short life due to a wet season and the impossibility of access to the ground.

In 1963 the same club had two shoots at Narrabri West on the property of Peter McColl. The first shoot was attended by members of the Miranda R.S.L. Club. At this shoot a beginner that never shot over the traps in his life was presented with a prize for shooting a possible five straight. The visitor was Ernie Ellis, who admitted that this was the first time he had ever shot out of a 12 gauge

More wet weather put a stop to shooting at Mr McColl's property and a new site was sought. The committee were successful in obtaining the present site of 13 acres. The first president on the new site was Athol Palmer with the new secretary Eric Saunders. By dint of hard work effected by an enthusiastic committee and members, the club continued to expand by leaps and bounds. Particular mention must be made of Arch Rowe for his infectious enthusiasm and untiring effort during this period of expansion. Today the club boasts three damo automatic traps with cement walks to shoot from, as well as skeet, tower shooting and provision for night shooting. It also has a club house containing the usual necessary amenities.

Within the last few weeks a shoot was held for the N.S.W. Division of the "State Teams Shoot". Shooters came from all over New South Wales. After hearing the opinion of visitors, it can be safely said that Narrabri Gun Club is considered the best ground and layout outside the metropolitan area.

The success of this club is not due to any particular person, but is due to the lead set by an enthusiastic President and Secretary (Messrs Grant McPherson and Peter Noble) ably assisted by a committee of both ladies and gentlemen. Added to these efforts, a great deal of success is due to the fact that shooters only shoot for "Tin Dishes" (Trophies) as betting is prohibited by the Australian Clay Target Association.



As part of what hopefully will be an ongoing section of the C.T.S.N. interested shooters are invited to write in to obtain answers to any questions regarding the Association which they may be unsure of.

- Q: Why does the A.C.T.A. require Public Liability Insurance as well as the Members Accident Insurance Policy which all members pay for?
- A: The Association's Public Liability Policy is a negligence policy and as such negligence must be proven. It is not an accident policy and because of this any accident that may occur would not be recognised as a claim against the Public Liability Policy unless negligence could be proven. Claim could, however, be made against the Members Accident Policy.
- Q: If I ring the A.C.T.A. Office can I obtain information on club shoots?
- A: The A.C.T.A. only publishes shooting programs in the C.T.S.N. from clubs who wish to advertise their programs. All States produce a shoot book which is available for all shooters in the state and lists all approved shooting dates. Your club secretary should be able to obtain copies of these books upon request.
- Q: I recently paid my membership at the club which I have recently become a member and it took some time before my handicap card was received from the A.C.T.A. Is there any reason for this delay?
- A: The reason in most cases where this problem occurs is that the membership was not forwarded to the A.C.T.A. until some time later and because of this your card was not able to be processed. Generally speaking handicap cards leave the A.C.T.A. on or around the day the membership fee is received.
- Q: I haven't received my copy of the Clay Target Shooting News.
- A: The wrappers for posting of the magazine are printed a couple of weeks prior to the posting of the C.T.S.N. This must be done to enable sufficient time for the cutting, sorting etc. If at the time of the wrapper print you are unfinancial, your name would not be on the mailing list. Your registration may arrive a week after the wrapper run, hence you will receive your registration card before the actual magazine is posted, but at the time of the wrapper run you were an "unfinancial" member.



We hope the shooters of S.A. share our committment.


NOARLUNGA CITY GUN CLUB INC — BIRTHDAY SHOOT 4th JUNE, 1989


WESTERN ZONE 100 TARGET BALL TRAP ELIMINATION DAY







RULE AMENDMENTS – CORRECTIONS

Please note the following alterations to the A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules, effective 1.7.89.

Ruel 4.14 To Read:

(c) A competitor may appeal against the decision of a referee in regard to interpretation and application of these rules. The competitor shall advise the referee before he leaves the shooting track that he intends to appeal, and, immediately upon completing his run over the traps the competitor shall lodge a written appeal and \$20 forfeit with the Management.

(d) The Management shall appoint a jury of three chosen initially from members of the Referees Association. In the event of insufficient members being available, the jury shall be appointed from (in order) members of the Executive Committee, Rules Supervisors, Referee Examiners Qualified Referees on the grounds to examine the matter.

(e) Should the competitor's appeal be upheld, this deposit shall be returned and the correct ruling shall be applied to the target appealed against. Should the appeal be disallowed the deposit shall be forfeited and paid to the club concerned. There shall be no appeal against a referee's decision in regard to whether a target is legal or whether it has been missed.

Add:

(f) For major I.S.U. Competitions the jury shall be appointed from (in order) UIT Judges, Referee Examiners, Executive Committee Members, Rules Supervisors, Qualified Referees on the grounds to consider the matter.

Rule 2.9 (a) To be amended by the substitution of \$7.00 for the existing \$5.00.

Rule 2.3 (i) Delete in Entirety. For other than National, Commonwealth or State Titles, handicap events shall consist of a maximum of 25 targets.

Rule 4.23 To be amended to include new paragraphs in A & B, with existing paragraphs to be renumbered from C to K.

New paragraph (a) A maximum of two suitably qualified persons appointed be the relevant State Association until such time as they may elect to resign or alternatively are replaced by their State Association.

New paragraph (b) A maximum of one suitably qualified person appointed by the Executive Committee to act in the capacity of National Rules Supervisor, I.S.U. appointed until such time as he/she may elect to resign or alternatively be replaced by the Executive Committee.

Rule 3.22 (b) (vii) Substitute 200 for existing 100.






