





Three meetings of the A.S.A. took place in Sydney on the weekend of July 22/23. The A.C.T.A. was represented by Peter Quire and Alan Maher at the A.S.A. Council and International Competitions Committee, with Alan Maher also attending the Management Committee Meeting in his capacity as Vice President of the Association.

Being a half yearly meeting many matters were raised for discussion, none more important to the future of shooting as an Olympic sport than the one which determines the justification system that will be presented to the Australian Olympic Federation by A.S.A. President, Dick Willis and A.O.F. Delegate, Alan Maher.

The system which is acceptable to all members of the A.S.A. Council remains to be ratified by each discipline and it is expected that this will be obtained at an early date, the justification system will be published in the C.T.S.N. following its presentation and trustfully its acceptance by the O.A.F. at a meeting tentatively scheduled for late September.

Two very important positions were finalised at the meeting with Peter Quire being appointed overall shooting Team Manager for the 1990 World Shooting Championships in Moscow during August of that year. The other important appointment was that of David MacFarlane Australian Small Bore & Air Rifle Association as Shooting Team Manager for the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona. Both Peter and David were appointed following ballots to decide the positions. We wish them well in the successful completion of the duties they have been elected to perform.

The importance of the Australian Shooting Association to the sport as a whole is not to be underestimated for as a National Federation it is the only body recognised by the Australian Olympic Federation, Australian Commonwealth Games Association, and the International Shooting Union being the governing world body for the shooting sports.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 1991

A full scale meeting of the Organizing Committee for the 1991 Championships was conducted at the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex on Monday, 17th July.

Under the direction of Committee Chairman, Roy Holtfreter, the meeting discussed at length the matters that need to be attended to and it is pleasing to report that at this comparatively early stage of planning preparations are well in hand.

Attending the meeting to offer their support and guidance were three members from the Western Australian Ministry of Sport, headed by the Executive Director to the Ministry, Mr Jack Busch. In addition, Mr Bill Eastman the W.A. Events Corporation Manager addressed the meeting as did Mr Alan Brien, the Manager State Planning for the Whiteman Park Complex.

As a memento of their visit, all were presented with a World Championship Badge by Roy Holtfreter and thanked the Organizing Committee for their kind thought.

INTERNATIONAL JUDGES



With elevation to A Grade, both Jim and David are eligible to officiate at all major events, including World Championships and Olympic Games.


The appointments are the result of many years of association with the sport as well as the time spent officiating over the last four years as B Grade judges.

No correspondence will be entered into regarding any nomination received.





THE FOURTH AUSTRALIAN GUN EXPO

In July 1978 at a basketball stadium in the suburb of Coburg THE FIRST MELBOURNE GUN SHOW was staged by Maurie Albert and Jeff Overington.

THE SECOND MELBOURNE GUN SHOW was held at the Coburg Town Hall and within a very short period became a twice yearly event outgrowing the Town Hall and moving to a much larger venue being the Camberwell Civic Centre, 340 Camberwell Road, Camberwell — THE EIGHTEENTH BEING HELD THERE ON JULY 22nd AND 23rd THIS YEAR.

The shows originally catered almost exclusively to the antique and collectable gun and related items fraternity with a small percentage of modern guns for sale. Due to various factors this concept has changed and a large percentage of the shows cater to modern hunting, target, and the like guns and allied fields such as cartridge reloading, custom knife making, etc. etc.

Over the years Maurie and Jeff were approached by various modern gun dealers, manufacturers and distributors with regards to their participating in their shows but were told that they could not be accommodated for two main reasons, being — That these events were basically staged for antique and collectable type guns and allied items collectors; and that selling and display space was usually (and still is) BOOKED OUT weeks before each event thereby leaving no room for the substantial number of modern gun and allied fields people who wished to participate in the twice yearly shows.

Maurie and Jeff endeavoured to stage an all type gun show but found it impossible due to not being able to find a suitable venue to stage the same. In 1986 after years of waiting, they gained the use of the Centennial Hall at the Royal Exhibition buildings and on the dates November 1st and 2nd staged THE FIRST AUSTRALIAN GUN EXPO. It was a huge success and it followed that it became an annual event. Unfortunately the dates it has been held (including this year) is on the Melbourne Cup weekend on which various other gun related activities are also staged but it has been the ONLY weekend that this venue has been available for the Expos — BUT from next year future Expos will be held the weekend BEFORE or AFTER the Melbourne Cup weekend.

The Centennial Hall is a huge area but not large enough to accommodate the number of participants that take part in each Expo so it has been extended to an adjoining building.

At the last THIRD AUSTRALIAN GUN EXPO approximately two hundred and fifty people occupied forty booths which varied in size from eight by eight feet to eight feet by thirty two feet — PLUS two hundred and four six feet by two and a half feet tables. Over six thousand people visited the Expo on the Saturday and Sunday.

Every conceivable area of the gun and allied field was represented such as ... custom-made guns, military medals and badges, engravers, outdoor cooking equipment, bows, arrows and allied equipment, new and used books on hunting, collecting, target shooting etc, survival equipment, security equipment, safari outfitters (one outfitter travelled from New Zealand and had great results), cartridges, new and used target pistols, new and used target rifles, new and used shotguns, new and used sporting rifles, new and used handguns, scopes and binoculars, antique and collectable type guns — related items such as swords, uniforms, obsolete cartridges, etc. etc. ex-military rifles and handguns, taxidermists, custom knife makers, gunsmiths, clay bird, pistol, target, big game, deer etc, shooting and hunting clubs and associations, manufacturers, distributors, retailers and a great deal more.

A great "let's get together" atmosphere is certainly evident at the Expos. As Maurie and Jeff state, what other event relating to such fields can bring together thousands of people from every part of Australia (and overseas) under one roof as it were?

It is a great opportunity for clubs and associations to gain new members for it gives them the chance to show people who have (consciously or sub-consciously) thought of becoming involved in such an activity but have never had the opportunity to come in contact with people involved in the same.

For example, at the last Expo the archery fraternity were represented for the very first time — and those that participated were MORE THAN PLEASED WITH THE RESULTS THEY OBTAINED FROM THEIR ATTENDANCE AT THE EXPO. Needless to say these same people will be participating (in a bigger way) at the Fourth Expo.

An area of the next Expo which is expected to be on a much larger scale than on previous occasions is the sale of guns owned by private individuals. As the law stands in Victoria at the present time, private gun owners CANNOT ADVERTISE WHAT THEY HAVE FOR SALE other than via a club's newsletter, magazine or the like, and all transactions MUST GO THROUGH A LICENSED GUN DEALER.

Due to the legal situation at a MELBOURNE GUN SHOW or EXPO, private individuals CAN OBTAIN SELLING SPACE AND DEAL DIRECTLY WITH THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

On a similar subject, if you ARE INTENDING TO PURCHASE A LONGARM(S) at a show or Expo, OBTAIN YOUR PERMIT(S) TO PURCHASE at your local Police Station BEFORE ATTENDING THE EVENT.

NEWS FROM W.A.

Clay Target Shooting is about to become a "big noise" in W.A. sport.

During the next two years the sport will be introduced to the majority of the State's uninitiated with TV coverage of the World Championships.

The shooting facilities already established in W.A. at Whiteman Park have secured the future of the sport, and when completed, will be the equal of the best in the world.

The cost of stage one of the shooting complex was \$2.25m, shared by the Federal and State Governments and the sports enthusiasts. The ongoing costs are paid by the 'residents'.

To complete the facilities, which would eventually support all shooting disciplines, a further \$2.7m is needed.

Shooting events already staged at Whiteman Park have been the Australian Trap Championships, the National Olympic Championships and Australian Skeet Championships.

Australian and Asia/Oceania Archery Championships have also been held there.

The Whiteman Park complex now offers top local shooters the same practice facility previously only available in Europe and the U.S.

Two major shooting events are planned for Whiteman Park — the Australian Olympic Discipline Championships in February next year and the World Championships, which attract some 400 competitors from around 50 different countries, in November 1991. And if Perth's bid for the 1998 Commonwealth Games is successful, the Whiteman Park centre will host the shooting events.

As part of the sport's up-tempo promotion, target shooting was also introduced into W.A. High Schools last year, with coaching clinics held for students and the inception of the Winchester interschool championships.

Six teams from four metropolitan schools and six teams from three country schools took part.

To introduce their sport to the public, the W.A. Gun Club held a hands on open day last month and has planned another one for Sunday, August 27 where all members of the family are invited to try the sport.

Some eighteen years ago, I introduced myself to the sport of Clay Target Shooting at the Inverell Gun Club in Northern N.S.W. I was very fortunate on that day to be given some valued assistance by a gentleman by the name of Ernie Redman. He was one of the exceptions in that he was not only a very good shot, but also a capable coach.

Since then I have enjoyed the sport immensely, taken my fair share of rewards and most of all, made a mountain of life-time friends.

The first coaching clinic I attended was held in Coffs Harbour many years ago, and was conducted by "Pud" Burgess and the late Newton Thomas. This for me was the most incredible experience having such a wealth of knowledge and sharing it, something that in the past was considered only for the elite in the sport.

Now, of course, with every State, Zone and most Clubs having qualified accredited coaches available, it is no wonder the standard of shooting in this country is so high.

This squad of shooters gained selection after competing at the Olympic Discipline Nationals held in Melbourne in February of this year.

Competition was intense and as the smoke cleared, John Maxwell and Russell Mark had won selection in the Olympic Trap section to attend the Commonwealth Games in February next year. The third place was filled by Terry Rumbel, who will join with John and Russell to represent Australia at the World Championships in Italy.

On the I.S.U. Skeet side, Ian Hale and Craig Meuleman will be off to the Commonwealth Games, with Michael Inguanti joining in to make up the Squad for the World Championships.

On the Junior front, Michael Diamond — the defending World Junior Champion — will join Brett Dunstan and Filippo Petriella to defend the Junior Team Gold they won in '87.

Our team will be under the watchful eye of Team Manager and Level III Coach, Robby Smith and should perform well.

As you read this, our team will be on their way to Italy, having left on August 26. I am sure we will all eagerly await the results of their performance and welcome them home as champions no matter what the result.

Finally, I would just say that I have enjoyed my past three years as State Coaching Director, the Zone Coaches have been of such a high standard, it has been a pleasure to work with them.


To the new State Coach in N.S.W., I wish you well and look forward to working with you, as with all the other State Coaches.



OUR FIRST 50 YEARS

Continuing the Story . . . from last month's magazine

By George Biggs, A.C.T.A. Historian

Over the past couple of years I have been endeavouring to collect and put together the missing links in the history of our sport. In this regard I am very grateful for the help I have received from many clubs about their history and the people involved in the early days of their development.

As a result of this research, I have so far been able to establish that several of our clubs could lay claim to the title of Australia's oldest (still operating) Gun Club.

High on the list from the information I have gathered are the following:

NEW SOUTH WALES GUN CLUB have evidence of being in operation at Sydney in 1866.

WAGGA GUN CLUB, N.S.W. reported in the City's first newspaper that they were shooting live pigeons in 1868. The club was originally situated at the Wagga racecourse in the early 1900s. During the 1900s-1940s only the 'elite gentlemen' of Wagga shot, these were the doctors, solicitors and lawyers. Mr Baylis was shooting then and he was a Mayor of Wagga. About 20-30 shooters turned up for the shoots. The birds were kept overnight in an aviary and they were watered and fed. They were released from the traps by a trapper.

Shooting stopped during both World War 1 and 2. The club shifted from the racecourse for reasons I am unsure of, to the old Agriculture College, then to the Uranquinty Aerodrome until the owners decided to sell the property and the club had to relocate. Finally a place was found, the licenced Wagga Airport in 1970. The club moved there with a mere \$12.00 in the bank. The original office was an old wooden caravan, come playhouse. Two trap layouts were put in and it would have cost at that stage \$1500 to put electricity on, so for two years they used an ex-army generator. In 1971 the first skeet layout was built. Over the years the club has added to the clubhouse which was an old RAAF hut (the caravan was unsuitable) and have just received a grant from the NSW State Government for an \$80,000 clubhouse. The first grant is \$31,000 and the clubhouse is to be built in three stages completed by the 1988 Trap Nationals.

COLAC GUN CLUB — Brief Club History.

Our year of establishment was 1896 with President, W.H. Clements and Secretary/Treasurer H.D. Thomas with the initial and present location being Colac recreation and racecourse reserve. Our club had shot live birds as you will read in our minutes a little further on. Many top line shots have risen from the ranks of Colac men. Prominent among these were Eric (Pop) Ball, George Crosse, Ray Parker, Harvey Eldrige, Ian Holt, Don Corstorphon, Ernie Osborne, to name a few. Don joined up in 1946, Ray and Harvey as mere lads, soon after. Then along with Eric Ball and Ian Holt, all gained International status with the A.C.T.A. formerly the A.C.P.T.S.A.

In the early 1950s before we had our own accredited referees, Hartleys would kindly release George Biggs on a Saturday morning, so that he, accompanied by his wife and two charming daughters, would travel to Colac to referee our Open Championship days.

The conversion to clay shooting commenced in 1939 with a plus trap and a single lane one target at a time. In 1946 we bought an auto angling trap from Les Black (which is still in its box — unused).

A new club house was erected some years ago but the old shed still stands as a storeroom and it will be remembered as the scene of good times in the past.

Thirty eight years ago Harry Mills, our local Policy Inspector, offered the club crockery if Mrs Corstorphon would prepare teas and suppers. She carried on this for 15 years then Mary Osborne took over for a like period. Mary Dignan now resides in the kitchen. We now have crockery!

Notes taken from Old Minute Book of the Colac Racecourse Reserve:

- 18/11/1865 Public meeting held with the intention of forming a Board of Management. 5 Trustees were appointed. Dr Thomas Rae, John McLaughlin, Robert Robertson, Humphrey M. Hearn, William Bradley. The Secretary, who wrote the minutes in beautiful copperplate and impeccable grammar was P. Wilson. Regular periodical meetings were held at Colac Hotel until 25/11/1868, then a break occurred until 30/11/1872. Captain John Haines was then Chairman.
- 8/12/1877 Trustees increased to 7 by appointment of John Calvert and Easton Johnstone.
- 1/9/1883 Management of Course passed to Colac Turf Club, who retained control till 4/2/1918, a period of 35 years.
- 12/12/1918 First mention of Colac Gun Club, when Dept of Lands and Survey wrote to say that Golf and Gun Clubs had applied for 75 acres of the Racecourse Reserve.
- 9/4/1923 Gun Club asked Trustees to be relieved of its indebtedness owing to its inability to arrange shoots, and offered payment of one pound per year. Agreed and future rental set at two pounds per acre per annum.
- May 1928 Golf Club was professionally extended to 18 holes, which was to include the present practice area and where the gun club then operated. Also, as shooting (live birds) was considered distasteful to ladies the Gun Club was asked to move across the drive and exchange clubhouses. This was agreed subject to payment to Gun Club of one hundred pounds and full shooting and clubhouse facilities. W.H. Clements and H.D. Thomas represented Colac Gun Club.

Note: Gun Club must have been formed while reserve was in the hands of the Turf Club, i.e. between 1883 and 1918. The late Charlie Romeo had a club membership card for 1908 and his recollection was that the club began operations in 1896.

COSGROVE GUN CLUB, Vic.

First established in 1898 on the Cosgrove Recreation Reserve. The club commenced shooting clay targets 1960. Office bearers at this time were Lance Sim, President, and G. Ballintine Secretary.

The club was first started as a hare shooting club but unfortunately the original books have been ousted. The club have minute books and other records, scores etc. back to 1914. A banquet was held in 1949 to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Club. Unfortunately the club has nothing further to really confirm the exact date.

MILLICENT GUN CLUB, S.A.

Year established: around 1900.

Location of Club: Saleyards Rd, Millicent.

Commenced shooting clay targets 1928.

We are unsure of quite a bit of our early history. I am enclosing some photo copies from our oldest surviving minute books, with some information which may be of interest. The first sheet shows that at the 1902 meeting the minutes of the last meeting were read, which indicates a previous minute book. Many enquiries and a plea in the local paper have not been able to find the book. Therefore we do not know our founding members' names or ground location. Several ground locations are mentioned in the minutes, the earliest being the showgrounds. Talking to older people in the town confirms that the grounds were always close to the railway station, for transport.

There were at least five clubs within 50 mile radius and there were regular shoots held against each other.

The minutes mention meetings held to pick teams to shoot against. Mt Gambier, Robe, Hatherleigh, Tantanoola and Beachport, so the club was very active up to the forties. The minutes show that the club shot through the first war but there was only one meeting held between 1938 and 1946.

The first mention of clay targets was 1914 but there is no follow up information available. The first clay shoot was held in December 1928 but there is no further mention of clay targets so we can only assume that it was a one-off.

There are several mentions of "Adopting" Victorian Gun Club rules or joining the Adelaide Gun Club for the year.

There is also mention of quite a few matches of up to 50 pound prior to 1910 with a 40 pound match in 1902.

Records show that the club had quite a few recesses 38-46, 50-53, 54-63, or at least there are no meeting minutes available to cover these periods.

In 1963 the club reformed on our present ground and although membership numbers have had their highs and lows the club has shot clay targets monthly since then.

CHARLEVILLE GUN CLUB

Adavale Rd, Charleville, Qld.

Year of establishment: 1935.


Story of the club's beginning from Reg Akens.

The club commenced skeet shooting on the site of the Diggers racecourse, known as McGregor park and was called the Charleville Diggers Gun Club. The club was inactive during World War II.

In 1947 the Charleville Diggers Gun Club got underway again after many difficulties in procuring ammunition and targets. Lal Armstrong was President and Jack Harland was Secretary/Treasurer, both of whom being diggers. As the old grounds where the club had first started shooting had been sold, with the main racecourse on the sandy soil east of Charleville, the Gun Club moved to this new site in the centre of the course, where an Eley Minor Trap was put into operation.

It was not long before there was another shift of the club grounds from out of the racecourse area to an area on the southern side of the showgrounds which adjoin the

racecourse and under the leadership of Ossie Smith as President and Reg Akens as Secretary/Treasurer two auto traps were installed and then the club really got under way. The club had a membership of around 100 local shooters and in the early fifties was rated as the best club in Queensland, and as Jock Wilson, a Past President of the Australian Association said, when he attended one of the open three day shoots, the club was capable of holding the National Championships.

The down the line layouts was increased to three auto traps to be able to handle the large number of shooters. The late fifties saw a decline in the shooting due mainly to the economy and drought in the area, and as the club was becoming more hemmed in at its site on the showgrounds, there was another move to its present site just off the Adavale Rd, about two miles from Charleville.

The club's name was changed to the Charleville Gun Club as most of the old diggers had passed on. In this period the club lost all previous records when the then Secretary, Brian Allen had the misfortune to have the homestead on "Allendale" Station destroyed by fire. There followed a slow build-up of the grounds until the reins were taken up by President, Jim Maloney, Noel Gadsby as Vice President, and Don Turnbull as Captain-Secretary. The club now has lovely grounds. There are two down the line and one skeet layouts, with beautiful trees, lawns, a very good clubhouse, the grounds are fully lit and has modern shower and septic toilet facilities.

In the past such greats as Newton Thomas, Clive Evans and Joe Raleigh were members of the Charleville Diggers Gun Club and attended shoots regularly, and also Doug Smith began his shooting with Charleville Gun Club and any shooter in Australia knows his class.

NOORAT GUN CLUB, Vic.

First established prior to 1892, live bird shooting at that time. Commenced clay target shooting 1936. A minute book prior to 1936 cannot be located. A hand written letter dated 1892 has been sighted, some articles relating to the club history are in the district but not held by the club.

The Noorat Gun Club which was once a small tin shed situated about one kilometre from the local hotel, has since progressed to be an organisation which meets every Thursday night and shoots monthly every third Saturday.

The history of the club dates back to 1913. According to the original gun club book and information from Mr Kevin Densley of Noorat, the initial shoots involved live bird targets, including sparrows, starlings and pigeons. These shoots continued until 1940 when they were forbidden and considered illegal. During the days of live bird shooting, people from Ballarat brought the birds to the gun club site. The number of birds required, depended on the size of the shoot. An average shoot would require about 600 birds. However for a large competition a variety of about 800 sparrows, 400 starlings and 200 pigeons would be used. The traps would be set up in a slightly curved line formation, a specified distance away from the box where the traps were let off. The birds would be placed in the traps then let off. The shooters had to hit the birds before they passed over a 19 yard boundary line.

SHOOTS: The club shoots were abandoned from 1950 to 1961. Mr Densley said the reason was because there was just no interest in shooting at that time. A re-opening shoot for clay targets was held at the gun club in January 1963. Some of the original members of club listed in the book which takes in the years 1913-37 are Messrs Jim Murnane, Charlie Holmes, Alec Dennis and Tom Densley. In 1937 the President of the Noorat Gun Club was Mr Jim Murnane, Ron Morrison Vice President, Tom Densley Asst Vice President, S. Morey Secretary/Treasurer and Ron Lewis Asst Secretary. The Committee was M. Brennan, H. Smith, C. McArthur, M. Arundell, C. Holmes, L. Carmody and R. Lewis.

The first Noorat Gun Club ground was situated on the Noorat/Keilambete Rd, about one kilometre west of the Noorat Hotel. The club purchased 1 1/2 acres in 1937 from Mr T. Sadler at \$60 per acre. The old clubhouse gradually started to deteriorate and eventually blew over. A new one-room club house was constructed in 1968-69 and extensions were added about ten years ago.



W.E.H. (Bill) Rainbird of Launceston, Tasmania. Bill Rainbird was the instigator in the development of a National Shooting Ground for Tasmania at Launceston where the 1975 National Trap and Skeet Championships were conducted. The first time in Tasmania. Bill served for many years on the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee and also as Vice President to Mr Jock Wilson A.C.T.A. Inaugural President.

This new shotshell is the culmination of many months of exhaustive research and development. Many combinations of powder types and velocity manipulations were tested to determine optimum performance.

The AA UNIVERSAL has a muzzle velocity of 1235 fps

and is loaded in Australian shot sizes 7, 7½ and 9.

The UNIVERSAL is loaded in a gold coloured hull to ensure it is readily distinguishable from the INTERNATIONAL (red) for those shooters using a combination of the two.





WINCHESTER

TRADE PRACTICES ACT

Thank you for providing an opportunity to have our point of view published by way of question and answer. I look forward to reading this section of the magazine in the months ahead.

Q: My question is in relation to the information contained on my handicap card, could you please provide an explanation?

A: C/N 1234 represents the club through which you are affiliated, M/N 12345 would be your number as a registered shooter, C 11 04 determines that you are a 'C' grade trap shooter off 11 metres for handicap shooting with a skeet handicap of 4 which also shows you are a 'C' grade shooter. The reference to ISU Trench shown as C and ISU Skeet also C shows the handicapper that you are a C grade shooter at both of the olympic disciplines. If you are registered as a trap or skeet referee then this would also be noted on the label affixed to your handicap card.

* * *

Q: As a junior shooter can I pay a reduced nomination and be able to win a grade at the nationals?

A: If you pay a reduced nomination you can only shoot for the section of the event that you are eligible for, in your case the junior section. If you choose to pay the full nomination you can win your junior section as any grade awards that your scores entitle you to. If you win the overall trophy then being the event champion you are not eligible for further recognition in either grades or sections of the event.

Q: Has any thought ever been given to reducing the veterans age from 65 to 60? I am interested in this as I am almost 60 years of age.

A: Yes, the matter of veterans being veterans at 60 or 65 has frequently been raised and will no doubt be raised

again. The main reason for retaining the veterans age at 65 is to keep the section for veterans; by that I mean older shooters as against opening it up to you younger, and no doubt experienced good shots, who are more than capable of holding their own in open competition.

Q: How does one go about obtaining a position with the Association at other than club level?

A: A welcome question. Firstly, you should seek your club's support to represent it at zone level. Once you have obtained this, your performance at zone meetings will indicate to those around you as to your ability to represent the zone at state council level. Similarly your performance at State level will lead the way to representing your state as a member of the National Executive Committee. All of this involvement is time consuming, however, it is also very rewarding and I would encourage you to pursue those paths if you believe that you have something to offer.

Q: I have noticed a number of changes to the rules in the C.T.S.N., the question is, when will the next review of the rules be taken?

A: The last review of the rules effectively was April 1, 1986. It is not intended to conduct any further review until the existing rules have been operative for a full five year period. Should, however, there be any valid reason to change a rule or introduce a new rule during the five year period, then in the best interest of all, this action would be taken.

CAIRNS & DISTRICT CLAY TARGET GUN CLUB

Good weather, good shooters and good trophies combined to ensure success for Cairns Clay Target Gun Club's Annual Shoot on July 1st and 2nd.



D.J. FLEETWOOD



One of South Australia's best known Clay Target Shooters passed away suddenly in the R.A.H. on Sunday, 16th July, 1989.

He was Donald Jack Fleetwood, known to his family and friends as "D.J." His firearms business was conducted for 36 years at 136 Pirie St, Adelaide before recently moving to 24 Gilbert St.

Don served overseas in W.W. II as a Mid Upper Gunner in Lancaster bombers with 460 SQDN.

On his return, he married a Henley Beach girl, Florice Olson. They moved into a small house in Henley and it was in the kitchen of this house where Don's firearms business began. Rebarrelling of ex-Army rifles, designing scope mounts, holsters and the assembly of the infamous .22 silencer. Reblueing was carried out in the kitchen stove. (Can you imagine the smell!) It was during the treatment of some silencers that one of them exhibited a gold coloured spot. "D.J." being a man of a very positive attitude, decided thereafter to call his products "Gold Spot Accessories" so he designed the G.S.A. logo and registered it as his trademark.

Living conditions at the Sea Ave house became quite difficult by the time the third son, Gary, was born and it was decided to find proper premises. The business was moved to 136 Pirie Street. The rest is history!

Back in the early 50s when the SACPTSA was in its infancy, Don was a big supporter; donating Snipe traps to the Alexander Gun Club, was only one of his gestures.

He was State Secretary and State Handicapper.

For those of us fortunate enough to see him shoot, will still talk about it for years to come — with his Breda Auto, 2 shells in one hand and calling pull, then hitting the target was a great treat to watch. Real showmanship and the crowds who watched loved it.

Don is survived by his wife Jacqueline, sons Roger, John, Gary and daughter Sylviane.

RULES AND REGULATIONS DOUBLE TRAP

DOUBLE TRAP

DOUBLE TRAP is a new UIT event in shotgun shooting for the exclusive use of doubles.

The General Technical Rules of UIT for all Shooting Disciplines and the Special Rules for Clay Target Shooting — Trap — apply to this new event unless otherwise specified in the following special regulations.

Standards for Double Trap Ranges:

Double Trap Pit:

Two day target throwing machines, automatic type, with self-loading equipment may be installed in the existing trap pits, where machine no. 2 replaces machine no. 8, and machine no. 7 can be used as machine no. 1.

New double trap pits can be economically constructed in such a way that the two machines meet the following measurements:

The two machines must be installed in the pit at a maximum distance of 1.20m, when measured from the pivot points of the throwing arms and when the machines are fixed at a 0 (zero degrees) side angle (Fig. A). The target plates on the throwing arm of both machines have to be exactly in balance, when both machines are fixed in identical positions. Their distance from the surface of the ground level, measured at the pivot point, is a minimum of 50 cm and a maximum of 80 cm (Fig. B).

Trap no. 1 (fixed day target throwing machine, left) has to be installed to the left, exactly parallel and at a right angle to the trap machine no. 2.

Trap no. 2 (moving day target throwing machine, right) has to be installed exactly in the middle of the front of station no. 3.

The traps must only be released by an electric-microphone system in UIT championships and UIT supervised competitions. In regional competitions, the release of both machines may be executed by only ONE release button.

The five shooting stations must be arranged on a straight line so that station no. 3 (middle position) is exactly at a distance of 15 m to the rear of the front edge of the trap pit. The shooters use the same 5 shooting stations as specified in the General and Special Technical Rules for trap ranges. The distance between the centres of the shooting stations must measure a minimum of 3.00 m and a maximum of 3.30 m.

Target Distances, Angles, and Elevations

Trap no. 1 (fixed machine)

The height of the target path above the ground level and at a distance of 10 m in front of the throwing point must be 3.50 m. The length of trajectory of this target is between 70 m and 72 m. The side angle of the target path is fixed at an 0 degree angle.

Trap no. 2 (moving trap)

The height of the target path above the ground level and at a distance of 10 m in front of the throwing point must be 3.00 m and the length of trajectory must reach a distance of 65 m to 67 m. This trap no. 2 has to change the degree of the height and side angles automatically after each throw. The change of the height varies at a distance of 10 m in front of the throwing point between a minimum of 3 m and a maximum of 4 m. The side degree is fixed at a maximum of 30 degrees, which means 15 degrees each to the left and to the right of the path of the target thrown by machine no. 1.

Equipment and Ammunition

Guns:

All types of shotguns, according to the Special Technical Rules for Clay Target Shooting, Art. 4.2 and T 4.4.

Ammunition:

Cartridges of calibre 12 or smaller can be used. Shot load must not exceed 28.0 g. Loading tolerance of + 0.5 g. Pellets must not exceed 2.5 mm diameter (+ 0.1 mm tolerance).

Conduct of Double Trap:

Ready position of the shooter: free

Clay targets:

Clay targets must be in conformity with the UIT Special Technical Rules for Clay Target Shooting. For the semi-final and finals in

championship competitions, clay targets with special color effects, like flash targets, have to be used.

Doubles:

A double can only be considered valid, when the two clay targets appear undamaged simultaneously and fly correctly. The decision on correctness and validity of the doubles is made by the referee.

The result of a double has to be recorded with two points. If only one target is hit, only 1 point is recorded. If both targets are hit and broken with one shot, the double has to be repeated (it is considered as 'no bird').

In the case of an allowable malfunction, a new double has to be thrown.

Competition Procedure:

Individual and Team Event:

Up to six shooters form one squad. Start numbers are drawn at random. After every double, the shooting stations are changed according to the trap rules.

One round has 25 doubles = 50 targets.

International Competition for One Day:

Two rounds per 25 doubles for all shooters = 100 targets (counts also as team events for three shooters with 100 targets each).

One round with 25 doubles for the best 24 shooters (semi-final) = 50 targets.

One round with 25 doubles for the best six shooters after 150 targets (final) = 50 targets.

International Competition for Two Days:

First Day:

For every participant, three rounds per 25 doubles = 150 targets. Team results for three shooters per team with a total of 450 targets.

Second Day:

For the best 24 shooters of the first day, two rounds per 25 doubles (semi-final) = 100 targets.

For the best shooters after 250 targets, one round with 25 doubles (final) = 50 targets.

Tie Breaking:

In general: For all grade placings, and overall places in events without finals.


1. Highest number of doubles.
 2. Last series. Last round, if event is shot in more than one round.
 3. Highest number of hits with the second shot.
- After the Finals: For overall placings only in events with finals.
1. Highest result of final round.
 2. For the first three places, shoot-off with sudden death on doubles.
 3. Each double is considered separately.

The participants at the shoot-off have to shoot at the same number of targets. The shoot-off has to be conducted for all participants on the shooting station no. 3.

MAJOR POINTS TO NOTE:

- 1 oz. cartridges are compulsory;
- Both targets are released simultaneously;
- Two shots may be fired at the one target;
- If both targets are broken with the one shot then a new pair is thrown: No result of first pair;
- Target One: Fixed position; 3.5 metres high at 10 metres in front of trap; Distance = 72m.
- Target Two: Oscillating 15 degrees left and right of centre and 1 metre up and down. Between 3 and 4 metres high at 10 metres in front of trap; Distance = 67m.

*IMPORTANT: Note tie breaking rules for double trap.


A.C.T.A. ORGANISATION


