A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT



In my last message which appeared in the August C.T.S.N. I spoke about the subject of rumours. As this will be my last word on the matter, I would like to give you a few examples which have come to my ears over the last few weeks:

- (A) The ACTA Executive have bought our present premises at Essex Road, Mt Waverley for \$400,000.
- (B) This was increased to \$450,000 according to the next rumour.
- (C) The Executive is going to levy all shooters \$5 to help pay off the bank loan.
- (D) Only one valuation of Essex Road was obtained and that was for \$250,000.

All the above are completely incorrect and, as with most unfounded rumours, the people who start them finish up with egg on their face.

The facts are: The ACTA Executive have for some months been trying to obtain the offer of our present premises. The owners finally, on the 26th June, put a price of \$327,000 on the building. Two independent valuations were obtained, one a sworn valuation of \$300,000 and the other a confirming valuation also of \$300,000. Negotiations followed and the price of the building now offered to us is \$315,000. The Management Committee, in their wisdom, decided to accept the offer and a deposit of 10% was paid during the last week of August. In my opinion it is a good buy, suitable for our needs and within our financial limit.

No, we are not calling for a \$5 levy to offset our bank loan. We can finance the building ourselves without going to the bank. The debentures some people sent in were a great help. To all those people who saw fit to invest in our future, I say a big thank you. To the other people who were waiting until a decision had been made to buy, this is your last chance to help your association. A few dollars more would be appreciated. As you can see all this took two months so a hasty decision was not made. Some members of the Management/Premises Committee did a lot of work investigating alternative premises; I thank them for their efforts, however, Essex Road was finally decided upon as the best site for our headquarters.

It is good to have our funds invested back into bricks and mortar and we can stop paying rent which was a drain on our funds each month.

I look forward to seeing you all at the Skeet Nationals next month.

were well down on previous years with 7239 being our lowest score ever, or at least since scores have been recorded from 7500. Nevertheless, as they say, winning isn't everything so long as the best efforts are involved and this was certainly the case at Echuca.

Having said that, it is interesting to see that we still managed to take second place being behind the winners, Canada, by a total of 177 points, with England a further 84 points behind in third position. A totally different story in the ladies and juniors, however, with both teams victorious; the ladies by 44 points from Scotland and the juniors by 56 points from Canada. Congratulations to the ladies and juniors and commiserations to our open team, who will, no doubt, be anxious to put the scores back on the board at Launceston in 1990.

We extended our congratulations to our New Zealand friends who declared their scores null and void owing to not having the event in accordance with the new rules of competition. Well done New Zealand, for your sporting declaration which proves afar that winning against sportsmanship isn't everything as some people want to believe.

A note attached to the results was that in these days of easier travel, it would be nice if one day all teams could shoot at the same venue all on the same day. We certainly agree and issue an open invitation to all countries to join us in Tasmania in 1990.

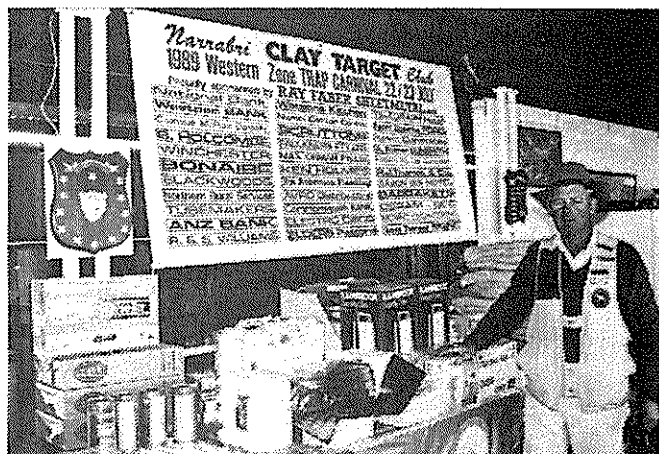

The most consistent shooters for Narrabri Club were M. McInnes, R. McPherson and F. Atkinson.

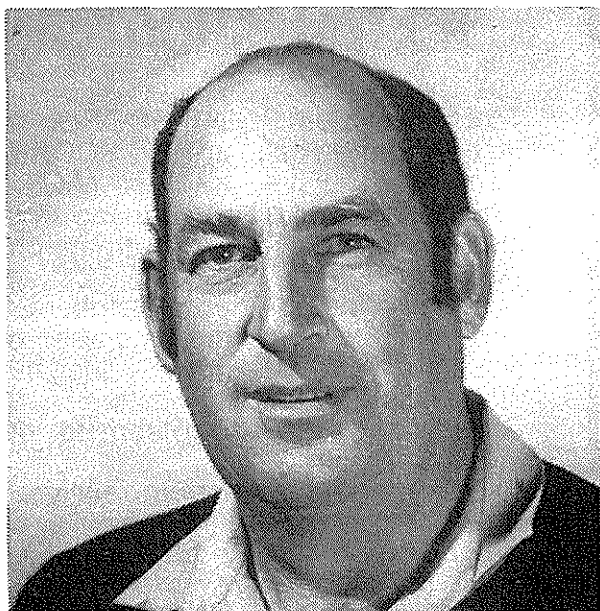

WARATAH STATE NOTES

Recently, a rather unsavoury incident was brought to the notice of the N.S.W.C.T.A. Executive, and required long investigation before the matter was handled — therefore, I will use this medium to once again highlight safety and etiquette rules associated with our sport.

As I travel around various shoots, I see certain things that make one's blood run cold — things that too many shooters have become too blasé about.

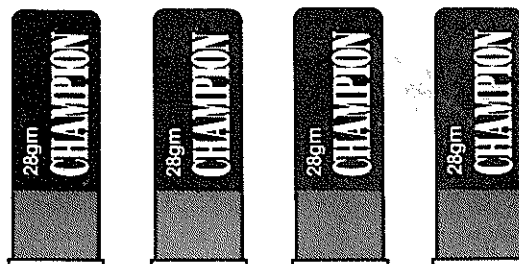
We must improve our image and we must never allow any incident that will attract adverse publicity from the sensation happy media.

Please remember the following points and enforce them at your club:

- 1: NO gun shall be put to the shoulder or aimed in any way except when the shooter is located as follows:
 - a) on the tracks
 - b) at the pattern plate; and
 - c) under the direction of a qualified coach.
 So you don't put your gun together at the boot of your car and then put it up and swing around!!
 You don't put your gun up and swing around while you are waiting for your turn to shoot in a round of skeet!!
- 2: In D.T.L., NEVER walk from lane 5 to lane 1 with a shell or shells in your gun — you MUST unload and do

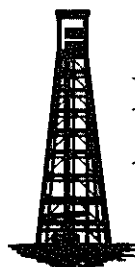

not drop the shells into your gun until you are positioned on lane 1.

- 3: Any shooter deliberately firing at any fauna on any shooting ground shall be immediately suspended by the Club Management and shall remain suspended until the matter is dealt with by his State Association. Think about it!
- 4: Shooting, holding the gun in any position other than orthodox (i.e. other than to the shoulder) is prohibited. Any shooters acting in this way will be immediately suspended by Referee or management and reported to the Executive Committee in writing. Minimum penalty three (3) months suspension.

For a reminder in some "shooters etiquette" —

- 1: Do not move from your shooting track until the next shooter has fired. Do not leave the shooting ground until the last shooter has fired his last shot;
- 2: Do not walk, talk, fidget or otherwise behave objectionably when it is the next shooter's turn to shoot;
- 3: Dress in a neat and tidy manner.

FROM THE CENTRAL ZONE:

Noel Rogers from the Kenworth Club reports that their planned Charity shoot for July had to be cancelled due to the weather — so SUNDAY 29th OCTOBER is the new date. The shoot will be in aid of the Royal Flying Doctor Service and will be sponsored by the Westpac Bank — a barbecue will be operating and arvo tea will be available. Further information from Noel.

Also the State Coaches program for the more experienced shooters.

As members of this great sport we must all do our best to keep it growing so if we all attempt to introduce a new

member or encourage one of those who haven't been seen for a while to come back, we will all benefit now and in the future.

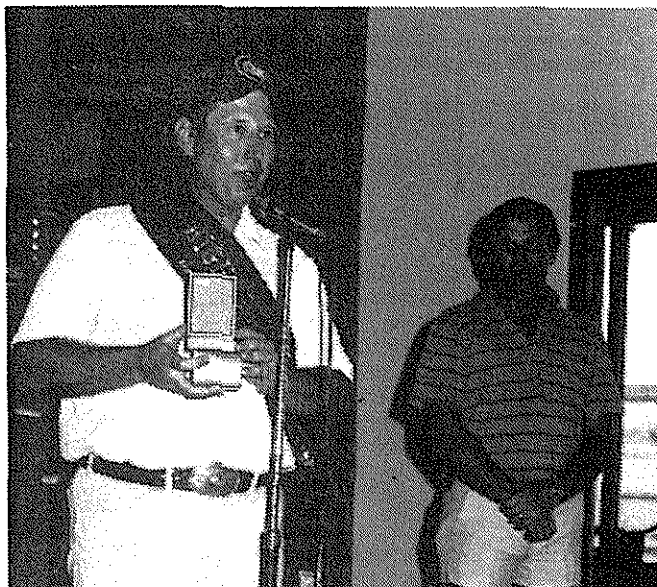

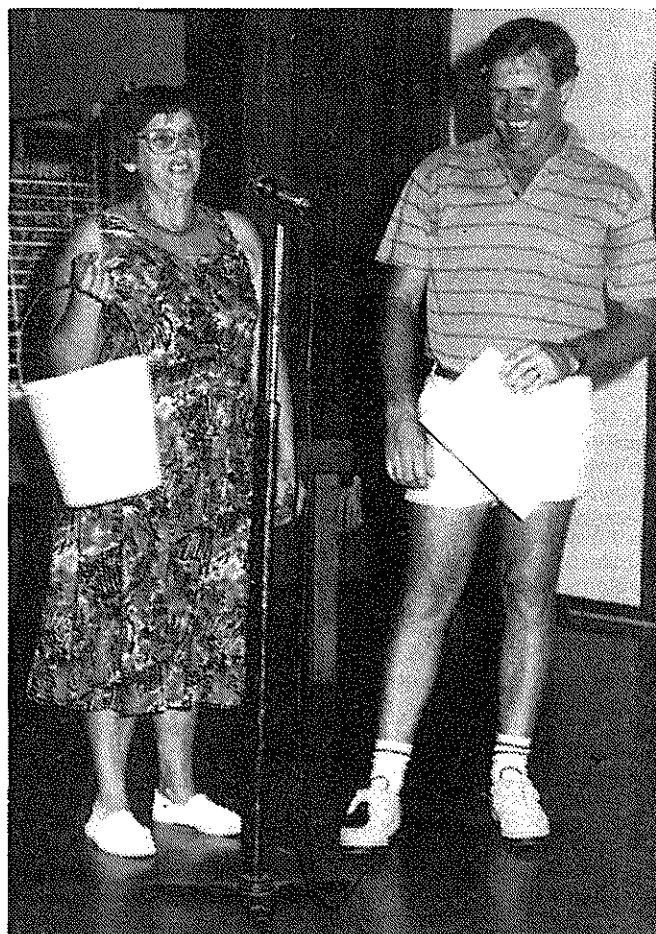
Bill Charlton picked up the \$400 cash on the 10 D/B eye opener after a short shoot-off Darwin style i.e. Indian file starting on lane 3.

SHOOTERS CORNER

Q: We at our club are at the moment putting together a 2-day shoot and have come across a problem determining where to gauge front and back markers. My question is "Where are the front and back markers normally assessed from?" Please settle this question in the "Shooters Corner" of the C.T.S.N.

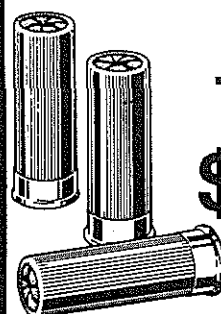
A: There is no specific ruling on the meterage section of front and back markers, the club have the option of deciding the grouping. It is generally accepted that the front markers fall into the 11-15m mark, while the backmarkers fall into the 22-25m mark.

Q: Can you explain why there is a difference relating to the mark from which Deauville Doubles are shot at National Championships? Commonwealth C'ships shot from 24m, State C'ships from 22m, Zone C'ships 22m, District C'ships from 20m yet at the Nationals the Deauville Doubles is shot from 20m. Shouldn't the mark be at least the same as for State or even Commonwealth titles?

A: The Deauville Doubles event at the National Championships is not classified as either a National Title, nor a Championship as such. It is considered as a family event. A decision made by the Executive Committee some years back was to shoot this event from the 20 metre mark to encourage family participation, as opposed to the stringent marks of 24/22 metres for Championships.

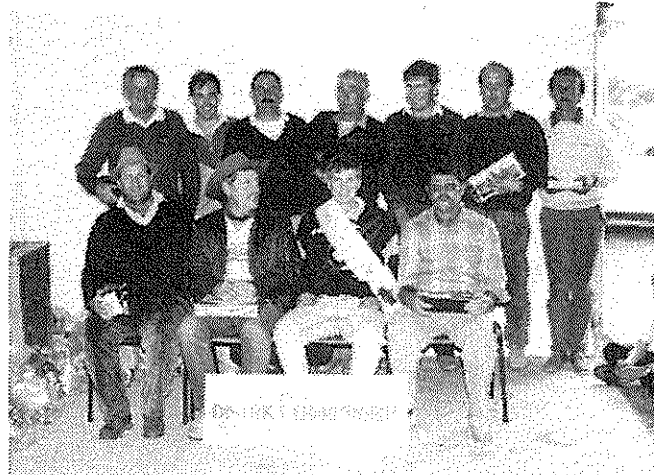

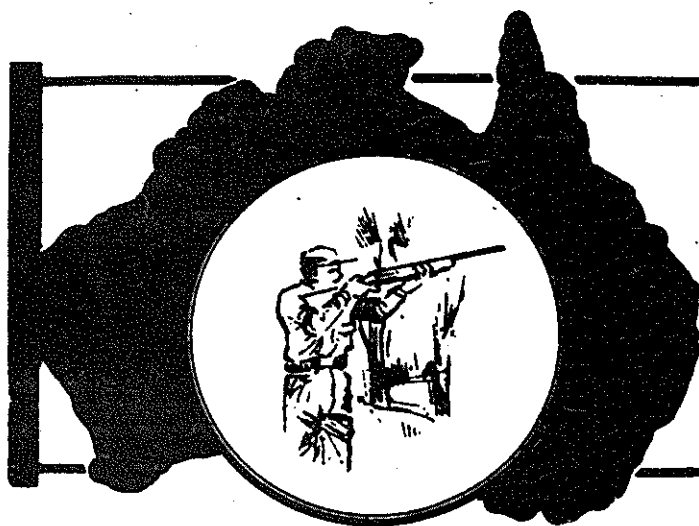
ANTONIO, Jack:
