

1989 WORLD SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS — ITALY

The Sporting Club at Montecatini was the venue for what was to be the biggest field of shooters at a World Championship ever. Forty-five nations took part with 143 skeet shooters, 82 seniors, 38 juniors and 23 ladies, the trap shooters totalled 163, 96 seniors, 38 juniors, 29 ladies; 306 shooters in total.

After our arrival and having a much needed couple of days rest we left for Brescia where we visited both the Beretta and Perazzi factories, these have to be seen to be appreciated and our thanks must go to Winchester's Mr Bruce Burns and Austral Gun Co's Mr John Fuller, for arranging these tours for us.

On our return to Montecatini it was time for some unofficial practice at both the Pisa and Montecatini Ranges. Everybody was training well and looking forward to the competition. Monday saw the start of official practice and with such a big field everybody was limited to only two rounds of practice per day. Most were finding the ground a little hard but were all shooting very well.

Thursday was the start of the business end of the trip with most of our shooters getting off to a very good start. The skeet scores overall were high with our boys, Ian and Michael 73/75 and Craig 72/75 holding their own. The trap scores, however, were not so high and with John and Russell 70/75 and Terry 68/75 not far off the pace, our juniors were also holding their own with Michael 71/75, Filippo 70/75 and Brett 68/75.

Day two saw the skeet scores maintaining their high standard and with Ian shooting another 73/75 for a total 146/150 putting him into sixth position. Craig and Michael both on 141/150 shot on for a qualifying score. In the trap John 140/150 and Russell 139/150 both made the cut and were not far off the lead which was 144/150. Terry on 136/150 also shot on for a qualifying score.

Our juniors were still holding their own with Michael on 141/150 just two off the pace and Filippo 138/150, not far behind. Brett on 132/150 made the cut also.

At the end of the 150 targets the team scores were calculated. Our juniors finished second just two targets behind the Italians. The senior trap team finished sixth and the skeet team tenth.

Day three, Saturday, Ian was still shooting very well and with a 49/50 he finished on 195/200. In seventh place, a world class performance, Michael and Craig both finished on 189/200. John 186/200 and Russell 184/200 in the trap placed them both in the top twenty in the world. John 15th and Russell 18th.

The pressure and excitement was mounting around the juniors and at the end of the 200 targets Michael was on 187/200 in fourth position. Filippo 185/200 in sixth spot and Brett finished on 179/200 in ninth position.

For the first time they shot finals in all disciplines at the World Championships with the Junior Trap first up, the scores in the final were:

Backto-back Junior World Championships. Congratulations Michael from us all and to the rest of the junior team con-

\mathbf{WORLD} CHAMPIONSHIPS

As part of the commitment by the Australian Sports Commission to the 1991 World Championships, a study was undertaken of the proceedings that took place at Monte Catini for the 1989 Championships. I am pleased to be able to say that while the championships in Italy were well conducted and by all appearances ran very smoothly, there did not appear to be any areas that would cause problems to the 1991 Organising Committee. A video was used throughout the championships to record the various facilities as well as the ceremonies that took place and a copy of the video has been made available to the W.A. Organising Committee as well as I.S.U. Shooter's Representative David Menck to enable them to see what actually took place as well as view the facilities made available by the Monte Catini Club.

If anything, the visit to Monte Catini emphasised the excellent facilities that are available in Western Australia and there should be no doubt in any person's mind that the W.A. Shooting Complex is of the highest standard. A very surprising happening was that of shot falling on the spectators back from the skeet ground (6) when viewing the trap competition on ground (5). The location of the two grounds did allow this to occur and did not appear to be a cause for concern from those at the championships. The safety standards in Australia are excellent when compared to this one particular instance and also our insistence on shooters not closing or sighting their guns at other times than when competing. This is an area that will need to be closely looked at for 1991 as we have a safety record that can and must be maintained in the best interests of all.

A full and detailed report will be presented to the W.A. Organising Committee and having been able to view the happenings that took place to some degree will be in a better position to plan for 1991. As has been stated many

times, "An eyeful is much better than an earful," and in this regard a very accurate statement.



I would on behalf of the sport like to publicly express our appreciation to the Australian Sports Commission whose assistance as part of their involvement for 1991 made the study possible.

KNOW YOUR EXECUTIVE

A.M. Burgess.

Pud Burgess has been a member of the Cobar Gun Club and the Australian Clay Target Association since March of 1950. Since this time he has been an on and off member of the Cobar Club Committee whilst currently holding the position of President.

He has spent a great deal of time on the coaching scene; State Coaching Director for three years, also at the same time serving on the National Coaching Committee. Pud is the current club coach at Cobar.

Pud is currently zone delegate to the New South Wales Clay Target Association, and has been such since its inception. He served on the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A. from 1972 to 1976 and has now returned to such.

WANGARATTA GUN CLUB — 70th ANNIVERSARY

On 9th May 1919 a group of 10 shooters met at the Bulls Head Hotel, Wangaratta (apologies were received from 15 others).

This body of men formed the Wangaratta Gun Club, with Mr J.J. Teague elected as the first President. Membership was set at five shillings per annum. The first shoot was set to be conducted on the date proclaimed as a Public Holiday for the King's Birthday. The principle event being a major club handicap open to club members only and with a prize of Ten Pounds, but this was later rescheduled to 11th June 1919 because it clashed with the Chiltern Races. Five hundred live birds were required for the shoot at a cost of three pence each. Nominations were ten shillings double, seven shillings and six pence single, and five shillings star. 10% of sweeps were kept for the benefit of the club.

Club records from 1920 to 1962 were unfortunately destroyed years ago, therefore I have had to rely heavily on the memories of families who had descendants shooting in the Wangaratta area during these times, but more especially on George Walker who celebrated his 80th birthday last December. George, in his younger days lived at Euroa and shot only occasionally at Wangaratta until 1934 when he moved there to live.

In 1929 the club shot live birds in the area that is now known as the HP Barr reserve and the Wangaratta Rovers City Oval.

During the early 1930s the club relocated to its present site behind the Vine Hotel, with a membership of approximately 30-40. Attendances varied from 20 to 30 per shoot with some shooters travelling from other districts by train to compete. The wit and comradeship of the hard case shooters together with the betting (bookmakers attended the shoots) were some of the activities fondly remembered by our most senior club members. Les Goodwin, who was a top shot at the time and used to work the live bird traps then (72 years ago) can remember a bet being placed for 1600 pounds on the pull of a trigger.

The club shot intermittently throughout the war, depending on availability of powder which was required for the purpose of fighting the war, therefore permission had to be gained from the "authorities" to put it to other uses like splitting posts. It is believed that on many occasions it ended up in shells used at the gun club.

After the war attendances increased to the 80s. Some of the top shooters competing at Wangaratta during the late 40s and early 50s were Gordon Twamley, Paddy Holmes, Ed Tippet, Claude Fell, Les Goodwin, Roy Grossman, Barnie Nedway, Charlie Priesley and notable George Walker who won the Commonwealth mixed bird championships -8 sparrows, 8 starlings and 9 pigeons at Tottenham in 1949, then in 1950 he won the Victorian Galah Competition at Bendigo and two weeks later won the Loddon Valley mixed big bird championship at Myer Flat without using a second barrel. Other shooters attending this shoot could not recall a championship being won using only the first barrel, it is reputed that he also broke the "bookies" that day. George Walker had the first under and over gun in the area. It was a Marlin bought in 1939 for twenty-two pounds, his first Browning Automatic was purchased in 1926 for ten pounds (which was a lot of money in those

In 1949 Ian Reith first registered with the ACTA, although he had been a club member and served on the committee the previous year. Ian has been a Club and ACTA registered member ever since then (a total of 40 years). During this time he has dedicated an enormous amount of time working to improve and establish the club, particularly in the 50s and 60s.

During the 50s the club was honoured to have some of the country's top shooters competing at their shoots:

— The late Claude Dean who won Australian National Clay Target Single Barrel Championship in 1958 with a score of ninety-seven. This was an Australian record which stood for a number of years.

— Alex Jamieson from Corowa was a regular visitor from the early 1930s but during mid 50 he shot off the twentysix yard mark. At this stage there were only ten shooters in the Commonwealth shooting off this yardage.

In 1953 the lights for night shooting were declared connected by the late Honourable Keith Bradbury and were switched on by Mrs J.E. Walker, wife of George Walker who was Club President.

During the sixties and early seventies many improvements were made when a group of very enthusiastic and dedicated club members donated materials required for a large number of these improvements, spent countless hours erecting fences, concreting tracks, installing lights to the trap houses, planting trees and building the road, plus many more. It would have been very satisfying for the workers (Messrs Bussel, Dent, English, Law, Penney, Reid, Reith, Stamp, Suter, Walker and Williams) who organised these regular working bees to see the club gain the reputation of being one of the best country clubs particularly when the shoot attendances increased to an all time high, with over 100 at some shoots.

In 1967 one of the club's top shots, Vic Bussel competed in a club shoot at Euroa which turned out to be one of his most memorable shoots when he shot 349 in a Double Barrel Championship to run second to Alf James who shot 350. The shoot-off took three and a half hours. Special medallions were struck for both these great shooters in honour of their effort and to this day these take a very special pride of place among their shooting trophies.

Following the introduction in 1963 of lectures to local secondary school students in gun handling and safety by the late Chas Whitla, then the commencement of regular junior competition in 1966, the club successfully hosted a number of Winchester and IMI School Boy Carnivals during the seventies.

In '74 and '75 the club committee investigated the possibility of buying their own land and building a new club house, but it wasn't until 1977 that a proposed plan was put forward to build a club house on the present site.

The Club has been a strong supporter of skeet shooting and hosted the first Victorian State Carnival in 1977.

The generous donation in 1978 of a very impressive silver cup with the aim of promoting skeet shooting at Wangaratta by well known shooter Bill Attwood and Kevin Law, who was one of the club's hard working committee men and Club Secretary for many years, saw the fruition of the Attwood-Law Skeet cup. To this day the Attwood-Law cup is regarded as one of the most prestigious skeet trophies being offered in Victoria and New South Wales.

Members' dreams came true in June 1980 when they moved from the "old tin shed" to the new Club House, with a fully equipped kitchen, much to the Ladies' Auxiliary's delight, Mesdames Law, Maurey, Stamp, Suter and Williams had put up with appalling conditions for many years while serving afternoon teas and suppers.

Following years of speculation regarding if the land which the club had rented for over fifty years was for sale, in 1986 the Wangaratta Shire Council was granted funds to secure the land as a sporting complex, thus ensuing a future for clay target shooting at North Wangaratta for some time to come.

Over the past thirty years the club has had some great ambassadors, some like Ken Maurey have won many local district club championships, while many others winning places in State Teams, MacIntosh Teams and also winning the Allan Brown Team match at the last Trap Nationals conducted in Melbourne. One of the most worthy of mention is Graeme Boyd, who joined Wangaratta club as a junior in 1970. Graeme has certainly achieved much since

by winning many Club, District and State Championships, being named in the Australian Team on twelve occasions, numerous Commonwealth Titles, the National Trench and National Skeet High Gun Trophies plus many more too numerous to list.

While researching for the club history I sincerely appreciate the tireless efforts of Dick Love, Les Goodwin, the family of the late Roy Grossman and my very special thanks for the lasting memories of George Walker.

It's unfortunate that Club records from 1920 to 1962 were destroyed, otherwise so many more details of Club's activities would be known.

Club members are deeply indebted to many past and present members who have dedicated years of work to establish, develop and maintain the club at a level of the highest degree.

Presently the Wangaratta Club has a number of very enthusiastic junior members who are great shots. I hope that they and maybe their own lads will be associated with the club to celebrate the centennial anniversary of the Wangaratta Club in 2019, remembering that today's achievements are tomorrow's history.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 Targets/100 Targets in brackets of 25, 50 Target events, one visit to the trap. 100 Target events, two visits to the trap.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads.
 All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets.
 - A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets.
 - Should the two minute time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score.
 - Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so.
 - Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- Any unauthorized shooter who interferes with or attempts to interfere with the trap will be penalized FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep-purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for.
 - To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events, excluding doubles events.
- Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s) and Overall.
 - Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.

- 16. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID OPEN OR SECTION.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
- 19. Nominations will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director.
- 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- NOTE: FOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS REQUIRE-MENTS OF CONDITION 2 MAY BE VARIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE WISHES OF THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE/TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR.

NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

TWO EYES! The benefits are enormous for those of us who use them correctly.

At all the coaching days that I have attended there are always a few who insist on shutting one eye - the reasons are usually one of the following:

- 1: I see two barrels or I see two targets;
- 2: My left eye takes over;
- 3: I don't want to upset my rifle shooting; and the list

Usually if you can get a one eyed shooter to try two eyes, and use them as they should be used they have instant success. However, even though they prove to themselves that it works, usually the next time you run into them at a shoot, they are back to using one eye shut.

Therefore to successfully use both eyes there are a few simple things we must do.

Firstly we must establish which eye is our master eye. Your master eye is the strongest eye - most people will have this and there are a few ways to establish which one it

- a) with both eyes open, focus on an object in the distance and point your trigger finger at that object - then close your left eye - if your finger didn't appear "to move" then you have a Master Right Eye.
- b) stand in front of a mirror and focus both eyes on the centre of your nose then point your trigger finger on that spot - you can see that your finger is in line with one of your eyes - that one is your Master Eye.

Now that you know which is your Master Eye, hopefully it will be on the same side as you mount your gun - so a right handed shooter with a master right eye is very fortunate.

For those of you who happen to be at cross purposes -

say a right handed shooter with a master left eye - you have two options -

- 1) change shoulders the best system for the dedicated; or
- 2) always wear shooting glasses with a spot affixed to the lens of the master eye - covering the view of the foresight -
- 3) No, DON'T shut that eye.

You need both eyes open to shoot moving targets. Shooting clay targets is a pointing game and pointing is three dimensional. Depth perception and judgement of speed can only be done with both eyes.

We must learn to point instinctively – it is a gift we must learn to trust - if the guns fits - it will point where you

The one eyed shooter trying to master the correct way will often find that their scores will go down, but you should persist - eventually you will find it starting to work and your scores will climb along with the enjoyment of breaking more clays.

I will never forget the statement made by young "Pud" Burgess, "If I had a third eye, I'd have it open too"

Basically, if every time you mount your gun it is in the same place, the beads are always in line and the same elevation, you shouldn't need to look at the gun - but that is what people who use one eye do - they are using the gun as a rifle - you aim a rifle - but you point a gun.

The secret of using a shotgun correctly with the eyes is to only look at the target. You will obviously see the gun

but you must focus on the target.

When you did the exercise of finding your master eye, try it again but this time when you focus on the object in the distance - point your trigger finger at it quickly - you will always appear to touch the target.

See the target, focus on it and shoot it - don't hesitate. If you hesitate you are probably shifting your focus from the target to the end of the gun - resulting in stopping the swing of the gun and subsequently missing the target.

If you are dedicated enough to give this a go you will soon master the art of proper gun use with the eyes.

Remember, the eyes have it - so look after them - have your eyes checked by an optometrist to make sure everything is in order and finally – it's a good idea to wear shooting glasses - especially in skeet. A good pair of shooting glasses should be part of your shooting equipment.

Shooting glasses should be selected by the individual fitted so that the eyes look through the centre of the lens in the shooting position and of a light colour. The eyes respond to light and work better when the iris is smallest giving clear sharp vision.

This was done for all the behind the scenes work and many other odd jobs that he has done for the club.







SHOOTER CORNER

- Q. Can you please explain the meaning of what is known as MSQ in Olympic Discipline shooting?
- A. MSQ or Minimum Qualifying Score is a standard to be achieved which allows a shooter to compete at the Olympic Games should country quotas be obtained. To obtain a MSQ you must compete at either UIT World Cups, World Shooting Championships and in the case of Australia the Oceanic Championships.
- Q. Why have the 1990 Trap Nationals at Launceston been scheduled over seven days as against the usual six days of competition?
- A. As there will only be seven competition traps for 1990 it was believed that the numbers competing on Double Barrel Day (Sunday) may have not enabled the event to be completed or possibly near completed. Because of this an additional day (Tuesday) has been included to allow the event to be completed prior to the commencement of the Single Barrel Championship.
- Q. Has any thought ever been given to having a "Spot the Clay" competition that members could enter by paying an entry fee for a monthly prize? I am certain that this would create some interest.
- A. The idea has been prompted in the past however we have been unable to proceed with the competition as it would be contravening the law. According to the licensing and gaming board and the raffles and bingo board the conduct of such a competition would legally be deemed to be a lottery. A good idea certainly which we are investigating further.
- Q. During this year I competed in an event that carried Commonwealth Title status. I have not seen any results in the C.T.S.N. and would like to know if I am likely to do so?
- A. All winners of Commonwealth Titles both Day and Night will be published in the January issue of the C.T.S.N.
- C.I recently purchased a badge for the 1991 World Shotgun Championships and was suitably impressed with the striking design. I would recommend them to all members.
- R. The World Shotgun Championships Badge has been well received and still available through the National Office at \$6.50 including postage.

The Queensland Clay Target Association held its annual State Skeet Carnival at Rockhampton on 22-23-24 September 1989.


The weather was fine but hot — however this did not detract the shooters and the State record was broken and some very high scores were recorded.

• R-L: QCTA President Tom Meadows congratulating OA High Gun winner and Qld Skeet Champion Mick McGill of Mount Isa.


The Interstate Team was then selected and the following shooters made up the teams:


