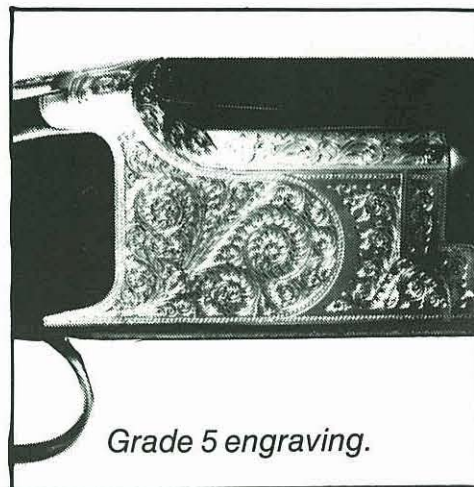

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Here we are again, the last month of the year is with us and thankfully we can confidently look forward to some improvement on the weather scene. It has been a busy year with International Teams to the World Shotgun Championships in Italy where the team recorded some outstanding performances. In addition the Commonwealth Games Team participates in the New Zealand I.S.U. Nationals as part of their training for the 1990 Commonwealth Games where we wish them well for personal success which will in turn reflect well on the sport here in Australia.

We are as would be expected well settled in the recently purchased National Office and in order to establish the background behind this decision the following information may be of interest:

Going back a couple of years, the A.C.T.A. were occupying a house at Blackburn for the purpose of administering the Association. An approach was made by a development firm to purchase the site as part of a planned development plan for the area. As the approach was of interest to the Executive of the day, a sworn valuation was obtained which supported the view that a sale would be a commercially sound proposition. As the offer was based upon a planned development for the area which as yet has not eventuated, the Executive decision to sell has proved to be a sound one.

Following the sale circumstances forced the Association to enter into a short term (6-month) lease at Nunawading while alternative premises were sought, that would be suitable for purchase — this was not an easy exercise as property such as the Association was looking for was not readily available. At the expiration of the Nunawading lease a move was made to Mount Waverley where once again a lease arrangement was entered into. As these premises proved to be most satisfactory to the Association's requirements the property owners were approached with a view to the property being made available for purchase.

Again not as easy as one may think for the property was not for sale. Despite the negative response received a further approach was made at a later date which indicated the possibility of the property becoming available at a future date. Owing to this independent valuations were obtained by the A.C.T.A. which arrived at a figure of \$300,000 as a market valuation. A further approach was then made and after negotiations had taken place an offer to purchase at \$315,000 was accepted. The property was inspected by the Premises Committee prior to purchase and should suit the needs of the Association for years to come. Financing of the property was possible through the use of existing A.C.T.A. funds which do not include the funds contained in the legislation reserve. Financing was also aided by the funds made available to the Association through members and state associations via the property debenture program which raised an amount of \$29,000 towards the purchase of the cost. On behalf of all members the Executive would like to thank those who showed their support in a most practical way.

During October I had the opportunity to visit Adelaide for the Australian Master's Games where shooting of all disciplines was one of the larger sports competing. The shotgun events were held at S.A.G.C. and ran very smoothly, many comments were expressed over the friendliness of the games and this was one of the pleasing features. Many familiar faces attended including Past Presidents, Tup Pedersen, Roy Holtfreter and Laurie Connors with an apology received from Present President Jim Scott who was unable to attend owing to his annual commitment to the ram sales at Dubbo. Congratulations to all participants as well to those behind the scenes who staged a very successful competition.

In closing and on behalf of Leanne, Sandra and Tina from the National Office I would like to extend to you and your families the compliments of the season and trust that 1990 will bring with it health and happiness to you and your family as well as your share of broken targets.

Also included in the grants is the continuance of funding by the Commission for a National Coaching Director and in this regard we are appreciative of the recognition received from the Commission.

The grants received from the Commission will assist in many areas and enable this sport to continue its involvement at International level as well as providing coaching assistance to our many members, upon whose behalf we have expressed our appreciation to the Commission for their continued support of shotgun shooting.

OUTSTANDING EVENTS OF OUR FIRST 50 YEARS

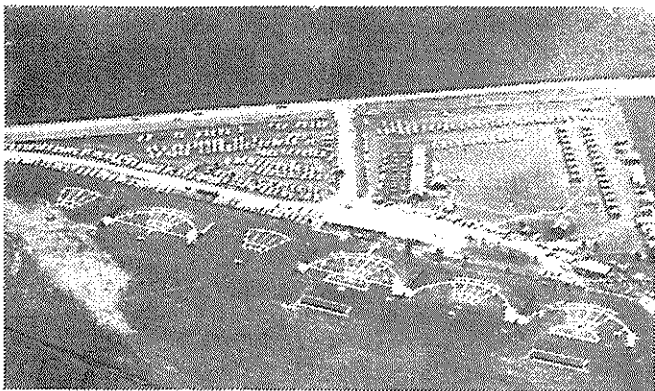

Of the three most outstanding highlights of Australia's Clay Target Shooting History ie; the 1956 Olympic Games, 1973 World Moving Target Championships and the Commonwealth Games of 1982 staged at Brisbane Gun Club, the World Championships of 1973 would have to be the most exciting and interesting event staged in Australia so far.

Unlike the 1956 Games where only Olympic Trap was contested — Skeet was at that time not included as an Olympic Competition, the Melbourne World Championships were shot at both Trap and Skeet, and so a larger group of shooters both men and women from 27 countries for individual and teams competition took part.

Australia can look forward to a wonderful experience when the Perth Gun Club host the 1991 World Championships on their new world class shooting complex. It is hoped we can field a team of trap and skeet shooters Australia will be proud of.

The following story is a copy of the original report on the 1973 World Shooting Championships, together with some interesting photos.

1973 WORLD MOVING TARGET CHAMPIONSHIPS

(Shotgun shooting sections of Trench and Skeet shooting)

The International Shooting Union allocated these 1973 World Championships to Australia, through its affiliate the Australian Shooting Association.

The Australian Shooting Association through its member body, the Australian Clay Target Association arranged the shooting dates to be November 12 to 22 inclusive with the venue to be the A.C.T.A.'s member club the Melbourne Gun Club.

The first contestants to arrive were the Italians, followed by the Australians, for practice shooting both trench and skeet.

It was obvious that the Italians were highly skilled in this type of competition and this gave us an opportunity to see world-class performances.

During the next few days, all competing teams, from the member nations nominated, arrived, and a true sporting atmosphere had them intermingling immediately.

Sometimes language problems occurred but shooters the world over have a common means of communication.

In the early days of practice the Russians made it known "we are here to win medals," whilst from Ireland came two shooters — a medical practitioner and a lawyer — who

between them epitomised "the leprechauns" and captured us with their humor and outlook.

At no stage was any impression gained from any team that they were regimented — far from it — the teams and their managers entered the practice and the events in a most fascinatingly light-hearted and friendly manner. Their co-operation and help to those of us running the shoot, and relatively new to conducting fully international shooting for the first time, the spirit exceeded all expectations.

This attitude enabled the management to proceed with the refereeing and allied duties with the utmost confidence. It is in fact, to our proud satisfaction, that the shotgun series was completed with the minimum of fuss and it was the first time in the history of the world shooting championships that no formal protest was lodged during the entire programme of trench and skeet. This was expressed with strong emphasis by the International Jury Panel of the International Shooting Union and was quite a "feather for Australia's cap."

The management was congratulated for the condition and suitability of the grounds and layout, the operation of the traps and ancillary equipment, and throughout the shooting days there were no breakdowns or halts of equipment.

Special targets were prepared and supplied by IMI Australia Ltd. These targets performed beautifully and broken targets out of the trap were very rare.

Clay targets used in the trench event were full orange (i.e., spray painted over the whole of the domed exterior) whilst those used in the skeet event were conventional black targets.

Most teams brought their own ammunition — the Russians used the old style paper cases which undoubtedly performed well. The South Koreans used Australian-made ammunition, likewise did the New Zealand and the British teams. The European teams relied on their own brands which they had brought with them. There was an array of various colors and types of shotshells at the end of each round.

Shotguns used in almost every instance were the under-and-over type and mostly of single trigger actions. Skeet shooting shotguns were similar to those in standard usage with Australian skeet shooters.

It is quite factual in international competition that if a shooter calls for a target, and shoots at it, he accepts and abides by the result, UNLESS the referee deems that it is an illegal target, in which case the referee signals a no target decision and a same angle replacement target is given immediately.

At the grounds, each team was provided with an individual rest tent. Meals were served by a caterer in a huge steel-framed marquee. These structures and tents were kindly supplied and erected by the army. One of the tents housed Red Cross personnel. Several people made use of this first aid tent for minor abrasions, etc., however, doctors were available at all times.

Shooters and visitors had the use of five especially installed telephones for outward calls. We had had installed a "Telex" teleprinter for the transmission of results as world news.

Shooting scores were recorded for both trench and skeet at three points — the official scorer with his scoresheet was adjacent to the scrambler box; to the rear was a visual miniature scoreboard, operated on a 25 metal disc system, showing white for "Dead" or red for "Lost". Total scores were then marked on the scoreboard. All international shooters gave an understandable call of "Pull" to activate the "phono-pull". There were no verbal exclamations or words on the grounds by the referees as they signalled a "Lost" target by a bleep from a car-type horn, held in the hand.

We were extremely gratified with the performance of our Australian teams, coupled with the fact that the Australian Trench Shooting Team gained third place and

so won bronze medallions. These results fully justified Australia's entry into international shotgun shooting competition and the efforts of all involved in ground preparation, fund raising, management and work load generally. These last were borne, in the main, by a small nucleus of Melbourne Gun Club committeemen.

Canada fielded one lady shooter in their trench team. Mexico fielded one lady in their skeet team. Both ladies were of world class shooting ability.

The visiting teams and their managers were invited to a special evening buffet on the night previous to the free day. This is international procedure. The cost of this was met jointly by the Melbourne Gun Club and the A.C.T.A.

At 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 12, 1973, the national flags of some 22 nations, together with a bearer, carrying the name of each country, preceded the respective teams and entrants who marched in national alphabetical order into prepared places on the grounds between the clubhouse and the official dais. All were clad in the recognised and distinctive clothing applicable to their respective countries. The army provided a full band for the occasion.

Mr Gary Armstrong, as President of the Australian Shooting Association, the host body, gave the initial opening address.

The Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Councillor A. Whalley and the President of the Shire of Lillydale, Councillor M. Seymour, welcomed all present.

Doctor Kurt Hasler, President of the International Shooting Union in speaking to those present said, "This is the first time in the history of shooting sports that the World Championships are held in Australia and, on behalf of all visitors, I offer all the appreciation and friendship on which all sport is based".

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, Major General Sir Rohan Delacombe spoke most feelingly as the Queen's Representative — "this is the first time that a world shooting contest is in Australia and it gives us great encouragement that you (Doctor Hasler and the International Shooting Union) have selected Australia as the host venue of some 20 or so national entries. We now have with us the world's best shooters and we will learn a lot from them and we are appreciative of them having travelled so far to be here. The standards of mental and physical discipline will be a mark for us all and will bring together, feelings over international boundaries which will be with us for many years to come.

"I declare the meeting open and may the competition be keen."

During this period, four flags had been flying from separate mastheads adjacent to the dais. From left to right, facing, these were the Australian National Flag, the Governor's personal standard, the flag of the Union Internationale de Tir (the International Shooting Union) and the Italian National Flag.

Shortly after the opening addresses the Governor left the shooting grounds to attend other functions and at the moment of his leaving, his personal standard was lowered

and removed.

For the period of the World Shooting Championships the other three flags were flown from three adjacent mastheads. The Italian National Flag was flown symbolising the venue of the 1972 World Shooting Championships.

The Australian Team Manager Mr Robert Buchan representing the host nation, Australia, moved to a position before the dais to read, and declare, the oath of amateurism on behalf of all competitors and in the name of all judges and officials, in the true spirit of sportsmanship. This declaration was made under a special Australian National Flag which was carried by Australia's youngest shooting team member within this series, skeet shooter Mark Little.

Mr Lee Meerman, President of the Sporting Shooters' Association also gave the oath on behalf of the Running Boar shooters.

The final awards were presented at the victory ceremony and this was most symbolical and colorful in that the teams mounted or stood next to their places, on the presentation dais whilst their national flags were hoisted to the masthead and also whilst their respective national anthems were played. The flags were on separate flagpoles facing the gathering in the same order of 2, 1, 3 as those on the dais.

The closing ceremony was conducted at the grounds and clubhouse of the Sporting Shooters' Association, some 15 miles (24 kilometres) south-east of Melbourne.

Doctor Hasler spoke to all assembled of "the excellent grounds and (gave) credit to the organising committee and the referees in that the jury had no protests to consider. You have two excellent ranges for running boar and clay target shooting and International Shooting Union arrangements are now in five continents and international competitions can now be held more frequently".

A period was then taken up by special mementos and awards — from the Tunku Abdul Rahmin of Malaysia to Mr Robert Buchan; from Russia to the Australian Shooting Association, to the Sporting Shooters' Association and to Mr Buchan; from Doctor Haltsrom and the Swedish Shooting Association on behalf of the King of Sweden — medallions to Mr Peter Garrett of the A.S.A., to Mr Lee Maugher of the Sporting Shooters' Association and to Mr Gary Armstrong. President of the A.S.A.: from Doctor Rieckmann of Hamburg on behalf of the German Shooting Association to Mr G. Armstrong of the A.S.A., and to Messrs R. Fox and R. Buchan of the Melbourne Gun Club; from the Italians, a banner to Mr G. Armstrong and a framed metal plaque to Mr R. Buchan; from the British Shooting Association, a pennant to Mr Buchan and to A.C.T.A. President, Mr G. Hall an engraved silver salver.

The International Shooting Union then gave a parchment award of merit to Melbourne Gun Club personnel — Messrs Rupert Henwood, Russell Fox, William Henwood, William Loney, Geoff Clarke, and to Mrs Betty Biggs. Mrs Biggs is the first lady in any world series to receive such an I.S.U. award.

194. From a shoot off of three further rounds Tsuranov secured second placing and the silver medal with a further 74/75 score.

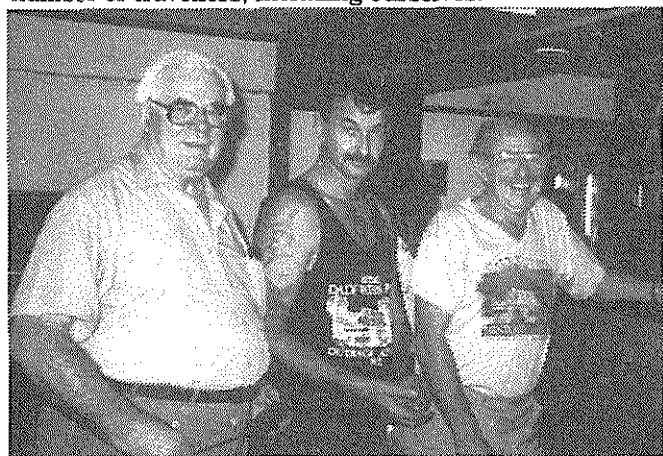


AROUND THE TRAPS

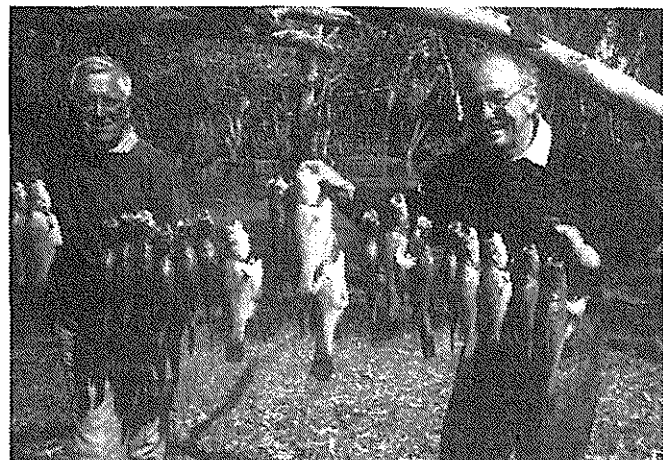
It is some time since "Around the Traps" has appeared in C.T.S.N. One reason for this is that I have been attending to and doing the things that I had found difficult to find the time for, when I was heavily involved with clay target administration. My interest in the sport over the past months, at club level only, has allowed me the time to be more involved in fishing, another one of my favourite past times. I can commend this trip to anyone, who, like myself

enjoys the bush land and outback territory this great country of ours has to offer.

Getting back to clay target shooting, one must report of the recent Second Master's Games, I attended, hosted by the South Australian Clay Target Association at the S.A. Gun Club. Around 157 shooters entered and competed in skeet and trap events, with overall and grade medals being presented to winners in all events. The tournament was like a mini Nationals. Well known competitors Roy Holtfreter, Dick Burton, Merv Neve from W.A. were in attendance, in fact all States were represented at these Games. Ted McCrae from New Zealand, a regular visitor to our National Tournaments was also competing, and amongst the medal winners. Ted told me he has not been enjoying the best of health lately, but is still enjoying his shooting, and it was great to meet up with him and his wife Von once again. Anyone who thought they were in for easy pickings at the medals table were badly mistaken. Some of Australia's top shots in Dennis Lymn, George Steele, Tony Bradshaw, Bob Christopher, Robert Dower and Graham Appelby, just to mention a few were there to make winning a well earned honour.

Also great to see Bill Abbott, Tup Pedersen, Bob Mules

and Brian Growden, past members of the National Executive in attendance.

An analysis of the 157 shooters in attendance showed the State representation was: S.A. 76, Victoria 56, N.S.W. 6, Queensland 1, N.T. 1, Tasmania 5, W.A. 10, and New Zealand 2.

One thing these games proved to me, is the fact that there are shooters around, who are prepared to compete for small rewards, and I am sure a number of those competing at this tournament were there to win a medal if they could, but mainly there to enjoy the sport of shooting and the camaraderie that goes with it. There is no doubt both of these were achieved at the Games. A number of competitors who admitted they enjoyed these games immensely, asked me if I knew where the next games would be held. For those interested the 1990 Master's Games will be held in the Mornington Peninsula area in Victoria, with the shotgun section, I believe being hosted at the Frankston Australia Gun Club. They will be conducted from November 17th to 25th, 1990. Our sport, in fact all sports, needs and will benefit from this type of venue and competition. This was proven by the numbers competing. Some 5,000 in Tasmania, with approximately 9,000 competing in South Australia. There is no doubt there could be an increase in these numbers for 1990 in Victoria. I have heard it on the grapevine, there is thinking along the lines of conducting the Australian Master's Games bi-annually, with each State running their own State Master's Games in the off year. Great idea and I believe it would be tremendous for our sport, should it come to fruition. Another area of our shooting that needs our attention is the duck identification test that must be passed to allow the issuing of 1990 duck hunting licences. Mildura Gun Club has been running on a regular weekly basis for some months, an education program for shooters wishing to attain a classification. So far, the response to this program has been excellent and beneficial to those

that have attended. However some Victorian shooters have taken the attitude they only shoot ducks in N.S.W., so it is not necessary to comply. This attitude could be doing an injustice to our own cause for two reasons. Firstly, you may have difficulty if confronted in Victoria proving you shot the game in your possession in N.S.W., and secondly and probably most importantly, if not enough licensed shooters who regularly hunt wild ducks, do not bother to attain this classification, it could be used as evidence to eliminate our hunting season altogether. Think about it shooters.

See you where there is shooting and fishing.

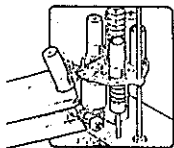

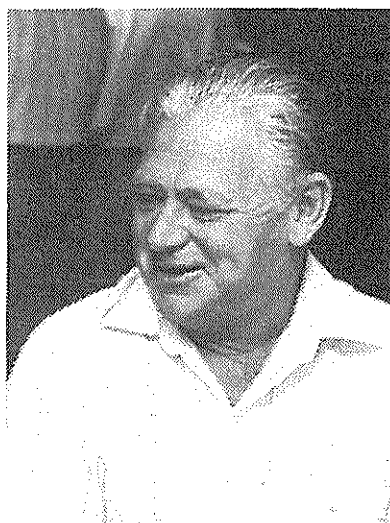
SHOOTER'S CORNER

Q. I have noticed that the program for the Trap Nationals make reference to two high gun trophies — could you please explain the reasons for the two trophies being presented.

A. The National Trap Championships were up until 1982 held in conjunction with the National Skeet Championship and the overall high gun trap and skeet was awarded the J. Newton Thomas Trophy. In memory of Past President Ron Porter, a separate trophy was presented for the Overall Trap High Gun with the trophy donated by Mrs Muriel Porter and family.

When the Nationals were separated it was decided that the two trophies would remain for competition between trap shooters with the Overall High Gun receiving the J. Newton Thomas Trophy to recognise and record High Gun Winners under the previous system as well as retaining continuity for the future. In addition the overall high gun then receives the Ron Porter Remembrance Trophy competed for by Trap

Shooter only. This trophy is presented annually by Mrs Muriel Porter and is very much valued by the Association as it gives the opportunity to perpetuate the memory of a Past President.

Q. Why do the A.C.T.A. and many other clubs refer to the runner-up in the Overall winners grade as first in that grade?

A. Rule 21. (f) of the A.C.T.A. rule book gives club management the best options to fit their club needs. If a C grade shooter shoots well enough to take out the overall then he is the overall winner not the grade, with the next best performer in C grade taking out the grade.

Q. If the program contains a points event the rules say the High Gun shall be decided on points. Shouldn't targets be counted?

A. If a points event is programmed then the points event must count as points to determine the high gun. If targets only are to be counted, why would points be shot? Source: E. Ransom Rules Supervisor Qld.

Q. Could the Association take a good long look at the AA shooter sitting on 18 metres with the view to having any shooter capable of 98% where he belongs, on the 23 m mark where he could even try for the honour of being a 25 m shooter?

A. This has been looked at in recent times and will be taken into consideration by the rules committee when undertaking their review of the total handicap system.

Q. Why does a person have to join the A.C.T.A. before he can shoot at a registered club?

A. The greater majority of clubs will allow a shooter or interested person to shoot as a visitor on two or three occasions before asking them to make a decision on joining. The registered A.C.T.A. shooter supports the sport as a whole and received many benefits such as rule control, insurance protection, coaching, opportunity to gain selection in National Teams representing Australia at the highest level, as well as the clay target shooting news and the comradeship that comes with being a member of an association against being able to use the facilities at little to no cost that have been made available at over 300 clubs throughout Australia, all of whom make the registered shooter welcome on their grounds.



NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT



As the State Coaching Director for N.S.W. over the last three years, and now as National Coaching Director — the one real problem has been and continues to be the reluctance of club coaches to provide "coaching reports" on their activities.

As I compile annual statistics — it appears that the majority of States are having the same problem. Coaching reports to hand are mainly from the state coach himself or zone coaches — with very few actually coming in from the individual club coaches.

These reports are of great assistance by way of the comments contained — and once annual figures have been tallied — to towards gaining Government assistance for a wide and varied number of needs in coaching throughout the country.

The forms themselves are available from your Zone Coach or from the A.C.T.A. Office and really are very easy to complete. The forms come in pad form — and are similar to the sample below. The top two copies are sent to your zone coach who will in turn forward them to the state coach and the bottom copy is retained for your own records.

Each form can be used on more than one occasion — and it would possibly be reasonable to suggest that you could leave the pad in the club office and fill it on each occasion that you provide your service as a coach.

I think it is fair to say that the majority of club coaches feel that they only need fill in a report when there has been

a "coaching" day — but what happens if you don't have an organised coaching day at your club this year?

How many times at your club do you spend talking to a shooter — experienced or novice — about say, gun fit or stance or why he or she is having difficulty in hitting low 6 in skeet and so on? All these are considered to be "coaching", so out comes the report pad and you fill it in:

(1) Venue — the club name. (2) Date. (3) Hours taken — you're at the shoot for 4 hours, so you enter 4 hours. (4) Cost — it is 15kms from your home to the club — therefore 30kms x 20c = \$6 and then you total the targets used and again at 20c per target. (5) Nature of project — This can be a club shoot, a coaching morning, a gun handling and safety talk to boy scouts and so on. (6) Experienced shooters in attendance at that venue on that day. (7) Novice shooters in attendance at that venue on that day.

Then once the page is full send it in to your zone coach, that way he is able to see which clubs are actively involved in coaching and which are not. The zone coach then forwards the reports onto the state coach — allowing him to keep his records up to date and see which club or clubs are attending to the requirements. Finally at the end of each quarter, each state coach sends the top copy of the reports to the National Coaching Director. If the reports are completed at each instance that the coach is involved in coaching activities it really is a very small task to perform.

You may be interested to know that there are 334 accredited coaches in the clay target shooting ranks in Australia, but we are not getting anywhere near the expected number of reports from those 334 coaches.

By devoting my report for this month just to the topic of coaching reports, I hope many more of you will take that little extra time at the end of your shooting day to put pen to report pad.

A very enjoyable day was had by all at Wonthaggi Gun Club on Saturday October 7. All of the events were keenly contested and competition was fierce.

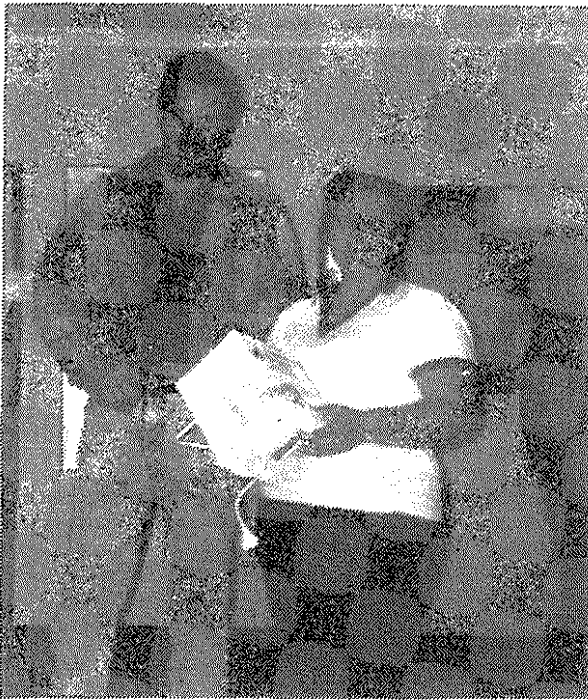

NEW WINCHESTER 28-GRAM LOADS



The International and The Universal

Recently, the news broke regarding the adoption of twenty-eight gram shot weights for UIT clay target disciplines. Shooters by now have begun to adjust to the idea of using lighter loads.

We in Australia have had a longstanding tradition of using 32 grams for our clay targets, and some adjustment is required for shooters to learn the capabilities of what to many has seemed to be a beginner's load. The new rule is with us to stay, regardless, though I think that seeing it is such a break from our tradition. Trench shooters who believe that it constitutes a handicap could be excused for it. However, I think time will show that it makes very little difference at all, ballistically.

It is the second barrel that poses problems in the Trench layout. Dropping suddenly to a 28 gram load could bring in a bit of culture shock. If shooters are in the habit of believing they need real teeth rattlers to get this job done, then they may feel that with the new load limitations they'll be heavily set back.

In the case of skeet shooters, life is somewhat different. The tendency here has been for many competitors to realize the value of reduced wear and tear on the nervous system, and as a result to use moderate loads.

There has been less resistance to this because of the comparatively low ranges over which skeet is shot, whether American or UIT. The further skeet target would be taken at perhaps half the distance at which the first barrel is fired at the Trench target.

However, regardless of this, those folk who have grown up with 32 gram loads as the standard for skeet may well end up asking themselves whether they're being robbed of one ninth of their chances of hitting their targets when they reduce from 32 grams to 28.

Winchester has come out with two offerings, each in three shot sizes, these being aimed at the Trench and UIT skeet markets respectively in 7, 7½, and 9 shot.

The International has been released for the best part of a year and is set up to give 1280 fps to the 28 gram shot load. The case length is the standard 70 mm, and the red AA case will be recognizable to everybody.

The Universal is loaded to give 1230 fps to the same shot weight. Instead of being in the red case, it is in the gold one which is used in the popular AA325.

The wad is the AA one ounce. I have been hopeful for years that this very desirable piece of gear would find its way into the hands of reloaders. Up until this international ruling forcing the issue of lighter loads, I think Winchester was on pretty safe ground by assuming that buyer resistance would relegate the one ounce load to the realms of quail shooters only.

Now, the picture may well change — a significant number of shooters will have to become familiar with the lighter load, and once they do I'll be surprised if they don't recognize some of its advantages and use it in other aspects of their shooting.

The powder charges in the two cartridges show them to be completely different loads. The International samples contained 22.3 grains of ball powder. The Universal contained 18.6 grains of another blend, also ball powder, which always monitors well, and both it and the shot weights were consistent.

It is important to understand the shot size naming that has gone on here. Up until recently there has never been any true 7½ shot sold in Australia, but the number has appeared from time to time on imported ammunition. In this case, the shot that is offered is indeed both Australian sizes seven and a half. There is no reason why half sizes of shot cannot be made and loaded if there is sufficient market demand. In this case, number eight has been dispensed with in favour of the slightly larger seven and a half.

Number eight has never been popular in Australia for trap shooting. However, number seven and a half, which comes in at a nominal 400 pellets to the ounce (as opposed to seven at 340 and eight at 450) is the equivalent of American size eight, which has been used in one ounce loads very extensively for trap over about a decade. It seems to me to be a good move to load both the seven which we are used to, and, additionally, the most popular size for first barrel trap in the U.S., which has already well and truly proved itself. These two sizes give the shooter room to select, and I believe there is a discernible difference between them.

When patterning the trap loads I started with sevens and I used two of my standard test barrels, a nominal quarter choke (at .014") and a nominal three quarter (with .025" constriction).

My reason for this selection was that I believe that shooters other than Trench aficionados will find a use for the loads; there aren't a lot of Trench guns choked quarter in the first barrel, but there are plenty of simulated field pieces that are, and there are plenty of enlightened trap shooters who have less choke than the full and full combination of the old days.

Whatever the odds, both cartridges in number seven as well as 7½ shot came up patterning well within normal tolerances. I got quarter choke patterns in the first barrel, and three quarter choke in the second, across all combinations — that is, both shot sizes and both cartridges through the quarter and the three quarter choke.

Pattern distribution followed the Winchester tendency, and through both barrels it came in at above average quality. The five point scale I use is poor, fair, normal, good, and excellent. The International through both barrels gave results on the high side of normal. The Universal gave practically identical figures. It is a job well done by the manufacturer to make up two loads of quite different velocities and keep them so close together in patterning performance. This is a pleasing result.

There is a very specific problem confronting the manufacturer of loads for this newly created market, and it is this. The average shooter may well be convinced that 28 grams of shot is a significant handicap, and this leaves the following problem: should the cartridge be designed to

open patterns — such a step will usually make them automatically better in quality — or to hold them together, and so minimize the effect of the slight shot weight reduction by keeping more pellets in the pattern?

The first course of action means there will be a small drop in effectiveness at longer ranges, because there won't be so many pellets working in the pattern, though it will be just as easy to hit with at normal ranges. The second means the opposite — extra tightness of pattern means pretty much the same ranging power, but makes it harder to connect with the smaller diameter killing circle at closer ranges.

It's not an easy decision to make. The step in either direction will be achieved by manipulation of the propellant, the velocity, and the pressure combination. I was pleased to see that the cartridges do not show the excessive signs of pattern tightening which could so easily have come about if Winchester had felt obliged to make it so the pattern would hold together heavily for longer range Trench work, particularly the second barrel.

The one ounce shot weight is an excellent proposition in the 12 gauge. Australian shooters in general have never favoured it, probably because they believe that if some shot is good, more is better. What people fail to see is that the efficiency of this weight may in fact be proportionally greater than that of larger quantities of shot. In other words, it does not follow automatically that a shot charge one ninth greater in pellet numbers will place one ninth more pellets in the killing circle at the target.

It may be that the same number of pellets is to be found in the pattern downrange because the shorter shot column is actually more able to be carried in a regular mass to the target. In other words, a greater percentage of the pellets sent in the lighter loads may actually reach the target.

This depends very heavily on the suitability of the particular load for the individual barrel it is to be fired through. There is no way ever to guess how effective a combination is going to be — it has to be tested before any definite statement can be made. Let it be understood, though, that pressure, velocity, and wadding being equal, the lighter weight will often tend to pattern a little more tightly than an equivalent 32 gram load.

In offering two different velocities in two different shot sizes both suitable for trap, Winchester is producing a variety of options which should serve to make the best use of this lighter shot weight. If the gun does in fact give slightly tighter patterns with one of the four combinations, then the room is there for the shooter to move, say to the half size smaller shot, to open them up again.

I would like to think that there will be wider use for this range than just the discipline it's been made for. It ought to find its way into the guns of the DTL shooters as a first barrel load, and similarly in the case of simulated field shooters. A lot of range variation occurs in the FITASC style shooting that goes on these days, and I have always found use for an ounce of nine shot on the closer birds to be found somewhere on most simulated field courses.

The average pellet count of the well known 325 number seven is 390 per cartridge, and the 28 gram loads of seven in the Universal and the International carry a nominal 340 pellets. When I first reviewed the 28 gram offering, I put the argument for Winchester's thinking carefully about this load and perhaps offering it in a genuine English (Australian) 7½. This means 390 pellets to the ounce — in other words, to reduce the shot pellet diameter by half a size would mean the same pellet count that Australian shooters are used to in the 325.

True 7½ shot would mean a nominal diameter of .091" instead of .095" with lower recoil and a higher muzzle velocity in the case of the International, and almost the same velocity but greatly reduced recoil in the case of the Universal.

Evidently the Winchester technicians have reached

similar conclusions, because the cartridges have been released in just that form.

The same cartridges in number nine are also designed as specialist loads, being for UIT skeet.

Made with the same componentry, their shot and powder weights turned averages identical to the sevens, as did their velocity and pressure figures. The shot was the standard Winchester nine, the sample cartridges running at 596 to the ounce load, as compared to the nominal 580. This is well within normal tolerances.

The skeet shooter's lot is different from the Trench shooter's in that his pattern quality is very heavily determined for him by the modern skeet choke. Those barrels which are true cylinders or retros are not so easy to influence by cartridge selection as are the barrels used for trap. In other words, skeet shooters are less able to regulate their patterns by carefully choosing velocities and pressures for their ammunition. Their barrels, unlike the heavily choked barrels of the trap shooter, don't care quite so much about the diet they're fed.

A velocity of 1280fps is fairly sharp for a skeet load, and it gives very positive breaks over the usual skeet range of about twenty metres. The 1230 of the Universal will almost certainly be favoured more for this work, being milder in recoil.

My experience testing the loads in both sizes indicates once again the usual Winchester reliability, which is a matter of the utmost importance in competition of any kind, and particularly in the types under consideration where the emphasis is on very long breaks of a hundred birds or more. The concentration factor is paramount, and no competitor can afford to have a good run broken by an ignition failure. Winchester's quality control is excellent, and the test ammunition was well up to standard in this regard.

Machine tested for its crush value, the shot proved to be in the good target quality hardness range, and appropriate for the pressure levels generated by the ammunition. Higher pressures require harder shot to avoid excessive deformation, and the Winchester policy is to operate in the higher pressure bracket in order to keep ignition reliable in varying weather conditions. The shot is well matched to this policy. The correct marrying of shot hardness to the usual operating pressures is one of the chief reasons that Winchester cartridges do tend to give above average patterns in most guns.

I thought it interesting that the nines as well as the trap loads use the standard one ounce wad, and not the wide pattern wad, a device which I feel does not confer a lot of advantage to the user. The serious skeet shooter who has his gun appropriately bored will gain all the pattern opening that can reasonably be expected with the standard wad.

Patterning the nines, purely for skeet, I fired them through the cylinder tube of a Beretta under and over. This is in fact an improved cylinder, having in it rather more choke than in a genuine cylinder. There being little point in giving forty yard figures for loads that are going to be used at half that distance, I did my usual comparison work at twenty-one yards, which is about as far as skeet targets regularly get shot at.

There is no question of a pattern of nine not giving sufficient density for clays at this distance, out of any barrel you could name. The test is whether the charge is opening out quickly enough for the job, and it ought to give a thirty to thirty-two inch circle if it is to qualify as a true cylinder pattern.

The fact is that a lot of skeet guns are not quite as open in the boring as their owners think. To qualify as genuine cylinders, the gun and cartridge combination should be turning in patterns of thirty to thirty-two inches diameter at 21 yards.

As it happened, the spread in the case of both cartridges was near enough to exactly 76 cm, or thirty inches. There was some small central thickening of the patterns, the

result of shooting what is really quite hard shot at mid-range pressure through a skeet choke that is really an improved cylinder. This is a fairly tough test, which the loads passed well. I suggest that there could be room for further gain by putting either of these loads through genuine — true — cylinders, rather than improved ones, as many choke tubes today seem to offer in their skeet borings.

If I were to use these on a continuing basis I wouldn't hesitate to get my skeet gun (other than a retro) reamed out to cylinder. This is a particularly easy operation in the case of choke tubes. It is at this boring they will give their best results with both of these new cartridges. I think also that the Universal will prove to be the one that is the more suitable for skeet, on account of its lower recoil.

I am certain that quail shooters will not overlook the arrival of the loads on the market. Both have the potential to perform well against the little birds, with minimal meat damage, light recoil, and the capacity to turn in a good pattern.

With regard to the Trench (and DTL) possibilities, the shooter is in effect faced with four different cartridges. My patterning experiments indicated that through the nominal three quarter choke, which is just what's likely to turn up on a Trench gun's first barrel, there's a lot of value in manipulating patterns by changing the load.

The change to the half size smaller shot gives a theoretical addition to the pattern of about fifty pellets. This means that in a three quarter choke about 35 extra pellets would arrive at the target at forty yards if a 7½ was selected as a first barrel load instead of a 7. Patterning in the test barrels, however, indicated that the percentages fell a little in the change to the smaller shot. This is normal in a move to a smaller pellet. In effect, it meant that the pellet count remained pretty much the same in the 75 cm killing circle. Question: what became of the extra pellets? Answer: they moved towards the outside of the pattern to thicken up the fringe, and provide a bit of extra margin for aiming error.

In the Universal, particularly, I see the possibility of widespread use for fifteen metre DTL shooting, especially as a first barrel. The lower recoil of the 1230 fps allows a very quick recovery for the second barrel. Using seven and a half shot gives near enough to the same pellet count as the 325, and gives away nothing in pattern quality or density in my test barrels.

The second barrel selection is a curlier question. When shooting Trench, there is a need for a longer range second barrel, and I think the shooter's choice between these two cartridges ought to be made between the size sevens offered in the two different loads. The larger pellet will carry its energy further for second barrel targets. As to which of the two to use, the Universal at 1230 fps or International at 1280, I would not be inclined to reach for the faster one automatically. The speed difference is almost unimportant, even for a second barrel, in its effectiveness against clays. I would suggest that in some guns, the slightly lower speed of the Universal will hold patterns together for greater density at the longer ranges, and this would be an advantage at Trench. It comes down to a matter of testing the barrel in question and finding out which it likes more.

Overall, I think these are both very good loads, and I particularly endorse the available shot sizes. What we really have here is a move to lower recoil ammunition which is eminently suited to clay target work, and which I think will grow very quickly not only in popularity but in application. The change in UIT rules will have done us a favour if it makes us more experimental in the approach to our gear. A lot of folk will soon be comfortable with the idea that 28 grams of shot is a very efficient load in 12 gauge.

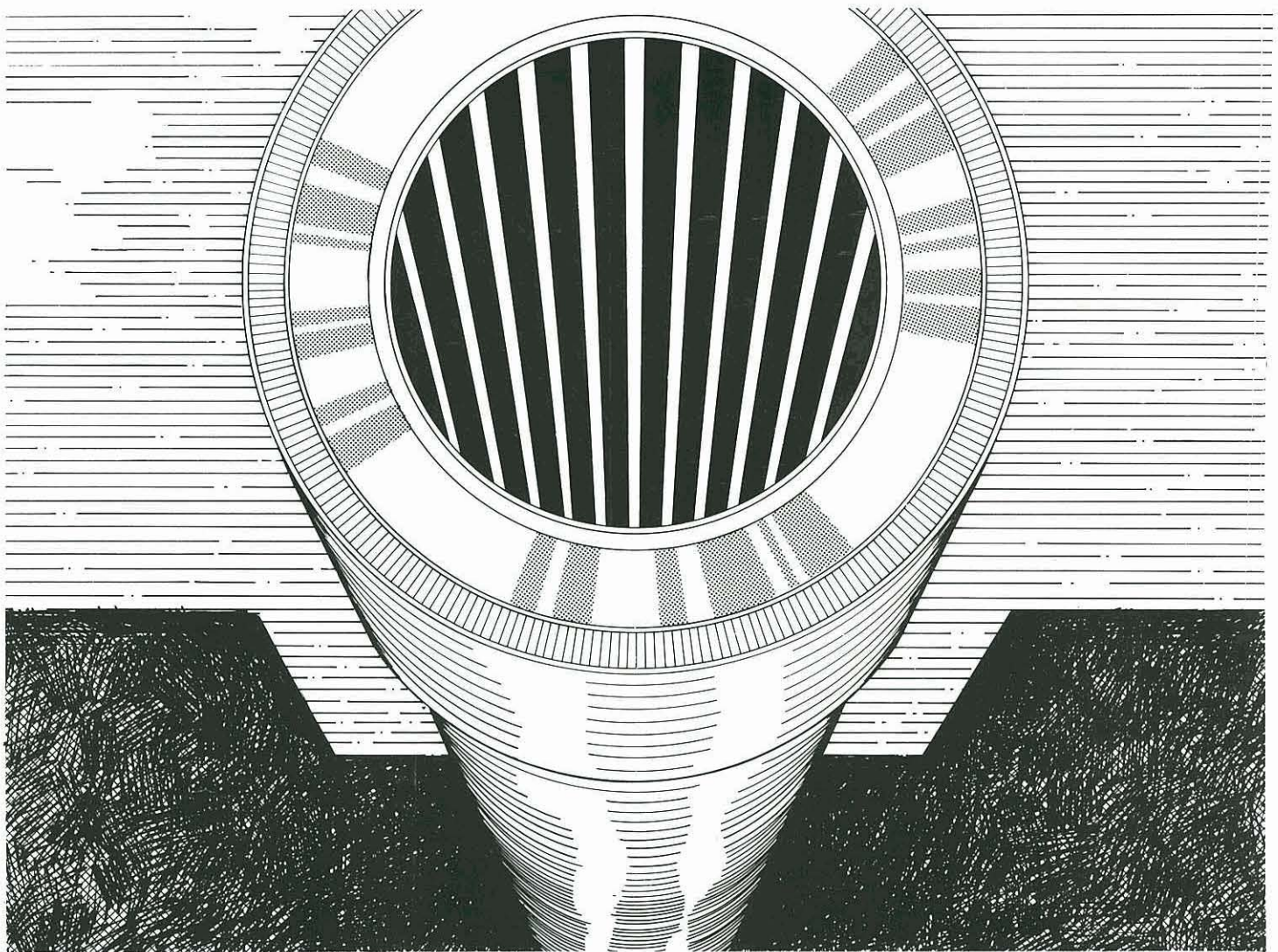
