

It is possible however to report that the T.C.T.A. conducted the Nationals at the Tasmanian Gun Club at Evandale under shooting conditions which did not disadvantage any competitor and on behalf of all those who competed in Tasmania we extend our appreciation for the efforts of the host State Association who certainly enjoyed the opportunity to have the National Trap Championships return to their state after an absence of some fifteen years as did the shooters of Tasmania who supported the state with their attendance.

The Mackintosh team events were shot using 1oz loads and it will be interesting to see final results from other countries when they come to hand.

A report on the Tasmanian Nationals will be published in the June C.T.S.N. which will contain all details including the very well received win by Kevin Perkins of Illawarra Gun Club as the Overall High Gun which won for him a Beretta S05 Shotgun made available to the Association by the Winchester Division of Olin Australia.

An elimination for the 1990 World Championships Team will take place at the Melbourne Gun Club over three days, May 25, 26 and 27 and all I.S.U. shooters are invited to compete in the event being shot in conjunction with the

The Executive Committee will be meeting in Melbourne during May and this will be a busy time for those who have been elected to the National body. A full report on the outcome of the meetings will be provided via the earliest possi-

The organisation of the 1991 World Shotgun Championships is well underway with a report from the Chairman of the organising committee published in this month's C.T.S.N. While problems will no doubt be encountered, every effort is being made to ensure the success of the Championships when they are held at Whiteman Park in Western Australia.

The matter of Ladies and Junior teams will be discussed at the May meeting of the National Shotgun Committee who will be placing a recommendation before the Executive to ensure that every opportunity is afforded the Ladies and Juniors to participate and be competitive. Details will be published once the matter has been determined.



PUBLIC LIABILITY POLICY

The Public Liability Policy that has been arranged for the A.C.T.A. by C.E. Health Casualty & General Insurance Limited is designed to provide specific protection for the Association and its registered members.

The A.C.T.A. Public Liability Insurance Policy protects the Association and its members from being sued for alleged negligence/blame attaching to an incident causing

property damage or bodily injury.

If any person is injured in any way where no blame can be attached to the A.C.T.A. and its members, any claims that may be made would not be recognized under the policy conditions as it would be classified as a claim against a policy that the person may have in force on a personal basis or in the case of a registered shooter, a policy arranged for them by the A.C.T.A.

Protection is afforded to the following who, subject to certain conditions, are considered to be members of the A.C.T.A.

- 1. State Associations
- 2. Registered Clubs
- 3. Registered Shooters
- 4. Voluntary Workers
- 5. Club Visitors participants and observers
- 6. Life Members/sponsors
- 1. STATE ASSOCIATIONS Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
- 2. REGISTERED CLUBS (A) Subject to payment of the prescribed affiliation fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
- (B) Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Association (respective) who are operating under the rules and regulations of the A.C.T.A.
- 3. REGISTERED SHOOTERS (A) Subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the A.C.T.A. from time to time.
- (B) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and A.C.T.A.
- 4. VOLUNTARY WORKERS (A) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.
- (B) Provided always that such voluntary workers are registered as members of the Australian Clay Target Association on the master register maintained by the Australian Clay Target Associations with a description of their duties.

Additions to or deletions from this master list are to be notified to the A.C.T.A. office as they are known.

NOTE: Voluntary workers to be registered with the A.C.T.A. are to be restricted to those persons likely to assist on a voluntary basis only.

Paid personnel such as trappers, trap mechanics or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the workers compensation act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority.

5. CLUB VISITORS — (Participants and Observers)

- (A) Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.
- (B) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered A.C.T.A. shooters.
- (C) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulations of the respective club, State Association and A.C.T.A.
- (D) Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person, must at all times sign the

visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.

(E) In the event of a visitor or visitors to the club negligently causing injury or damage to any person or property, any actions that may be taken would need to be directed towards the person or persons concerned.

NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc, who are not registered shooters with the A.C.T.A. must first of all have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly.

Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possibly arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.

- **6.** (A) Clubs who have life members or similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to either the Club or the A.C.T.A. by reason of their inactivity in the sport at Club and/or A.C.T.A. level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered shooters".
- (B) Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shooters.
- 7. Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the A.C.T.A. Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to the safety etc. have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines such as a combination of

Clay Target and field game.

8. Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master A.C.T.A. Policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation, therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the A.C.T.A. master policy unless cover in excess of \$2,000,000 is required.

Paid employees must at all times be protected under the workers' compensation act.

9. Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Club or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is eliminated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$2,000,000.

- 10. Cover is extended to include (A) Visitors attending National State Zone, International Championships are exempt from the requirement to sign a visitors register.
- (B) Member to member whilst participating in any event.
 (C) Erection, demolition, alterations, additions to buildings including club house and trap houses for the portion of the work undertaken by voluntary workers does not extend to any works carried out or undertaken by contractors or sub-contractors.
- (D) Registered shooters involved in coaching or instruction are indemnified.
- 11. All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body.
- 12. NOTE: Club shooters, not registered with the A.C.T.Aare not covered under any circumstances other than operating as a voluntary worker at an organised event. This category of shooter-member is solely a club responsibility and insurance cover should be considered at all times as a club expense.
- 13. FOR INFORMATION. Further extensions included within the policy are Member to member, Food and Drink Care, custody and control, Medical and welfare facilities, Tenants' liability, Hoists, cranes and unregistered vehicles, Car Parking, Cross liabilities.

VICTORIAN DOUBLE RISE MARATHON

When a New South Wales team issued a challenge in January to try to beat a score they posted over 5000 double rise targets the Victorians were quick to respond.

Steve Haberman soon organised Steve Atkins, Graham Boyd, Bill Iles and Russell Mark to join him in the challenge match to be conducted at the Geelong Clay Target Club on March 10.

Word spread throughout the State about the likely outcome, who should be in the team and who shouldn't and who would shoot the most and who would break the least. In fact well-known local identity Tony Bradshaw made the very big statement that one particular shooter in the squad would finish so low down that they would have to hire a "Kato" to dig him out!

The match got underway at 10 a.m. in absolute perfect conditions. The Geelong club had made every possible precaution to throw ideal double rise targets by offering two trap boys, their best of the five traps available and a new trap-arm rubber and plate.

Scores were high from the outset. No wind and a perfect background contributed highly. The event was conducted in 20 rounds of 25 pair with Russell Mark getting off to a good start with a 49 followed by Steve Atkins with the same in the second. Graham Boyd was the first to post a magical 50 in his third round. This was to be one of 19 perfect rounds shot for the day.

By 1 p.m. a large crowd had gathered on the hill behind trap 2 and on the public road behind the club. Shooters had travelled from all parts of Victoria to watch the record attempt and none were to be disappointed. When the squad stopped for lunch after the twelfth round Russell Mark and Graham Boyd had both posted amazing long run breaks of 144 pair and 131 pair respectively. Double Rise shooting of this calibre had certainly never been seen before in Australia and possibly never will be again.

The squad shot the last pair at ten minutes past three with the final round producing the near perfect score of 249-250.

A final total showed a team score of 4821-5000 (96.42%), 790 targets clear of the New South Wales team.

1000 targets per shooter in five hours and ten minutes was not a bad effort, but fatigue surprisingly never entered into the event. All of the shooters with the exception of Bill

Iles opted for either 3 dram 1% ounce shells or less with Steve Haberman and Russell Mark using a combination of 1 ounce loads.

The event certainly created much interest and even the local media were keen to cover the event. Thanks must go to Steve Haberman for organising the squad and other associated duties, but more importantly the Victorian team would like to thank Mike Fisher and the other N.S.W. shooters who had a go from the outset and issued the challenge. It's now up to other States to see what sort of score they can post.

Finally thanks must be given to the Geelong Gun Club for providing the grounds for the day, Bay City Clay Targets for the donation of the targets and our referee Carol Zagor and scorer Roslyn Viney who worked the entire marathon and did an absolute fantastic job. Thanks Girls! A special thank you to Jamie Cleary for installing the traps, and thanks to Winchester for their support.

KNOW YOUR STATE COACHING DIRECTOR



Don Stevens, South Australia

Don commenced clay target shooting in 1975 at the Arnhem Gun Club in the Northern Territory. He was Gun Captain from 1976 to 1985 and during that time doubled up 2 years as President and 2 years as Treasurer. Don was a delegate to the N.T.C.T.A. for six years. He has been coaching since 1980 and has 43 years of experienced shooting behind him competing in largebore, smallbore, pistol and archery along with clay target shooting.

DON'S SUGGESTIONS ON PREPARING TO COMPETE AND COMPETING

The following are 10 points on how one could be preparing with bigger competitions in mind:—

- PRACTICE: Always practise at full pressure. Better 25 targets with maximum concentration, than 50 or 75 anyhow.
- 2. DRY PRACTICE: Practise your muzzle control. Five minutes per day will do wonders. Learn to control the muzzle of your gun by following along house guttering, power lines, tree branches, corners of rooms, picture rails etc. Practise in front of a mirror also. Dry practice is great and "cheap".
- 3. MENTAL PRACTICE: Mental simulation of the task at hand. You should have done it so many times PERFECTLY in your mind that the event will be just like practice and a formality.
- 4. The minutes prior to any event should not be of great pressure if you have followed faithfully and practised 1, 2 and 3 above. A few slow deep breaths will disperse tension
- 5. At the start of any event "Make a Bird" of the first 2 or 3 Targets. By that I mean do not rush or try too hard, just shoot within yourself, making sure you see the target CLEARLY
- 6. Build up a little saying, that you can repeat each time you load your gun to take a target Such as "See it, then shoot it" or "See it, then shoot it smoothly". This will stop the tendency of jumping the target.
- 7. Make sure you call clearly, so as to receive even and good releases from the referee. Many referees are unfairly blamed for poor relases when in fact it is the shooter's poor call that is at fault.
- 8. Make sure you have enough shells for the round and of the shot size you prefer to use. Often the fact of running low on shells or shot size gets the mind off the job at hand, which is, — SHOOTING EACH TARGET AS AN INDIVIDUAL EVENT. Remember from 15 metres shot size has very little, if any, bearing on your score.
- Build up a good steady rhythm in your shooting that will fit in with most squads, as it will help you shoot better without developing extra pressures.
- 10. Remember to shoot your own targets and let everything else take its course. You cannot be running the squad in your mind and shoot well. Concentrate on your own shooting of the targets — "ONE AT A TIME". Relax after each shot you have and then build up concentration again just before your next turn.

Remember, if you have practised the above 10 points then you can expect to perform well and you should think positively in that vein.

WARATAH STATE NOTES

PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL

Firstly this month, on behalf of shooters Australia-wide and his fellow N.S.W. shooters, may I offer sincere congratulations to Guyra Club Secretary. Rex Varley, on having been awarded the Presidential Medal during the recent Tasmanian Trap Nationals. Truly a fitting reward for one of the gentlemen of our sport. For a person to serve as Club Secretary for over 23 years in itself is a remarkable achievement, let alone all the time and effort that Rex puts into the sport as a whole. Congratulations Rex.

SCHOLARSHIP/GRANT APPLICATIONS:

I would like to make mention of two (2) available grant allocations that can be applied for by an individual sport-sperson and secondly Clubs can apply under the Capital Assistance program.

For individual shooters a scheme providing sportspersons with outstanding potential from N.S.W., the opportunity to fully develop their talents. The appropriate application forms are available from myself or from your local office of the Department of Sport, Recreation and Racing.

It should be noted that the N.S.W.C.T.A. in consultation with the Department have set a closing date for these applications as 31st May each year — meaning your applications will have to be in my hands by that date. This will allow the Executive to address each one received at their June meeting, and then forward to the Department for their July assessment.

Should you require further information about this assistance, please feel free to contact myself or your local Department of Sport and Recreation.

The second available grant is under the Capital Assistance Program and the closing date for it will be October. The application forms are available from your local Council Chambers and the applications have to be returned to your local Council.

Two clubs in N.S.W., that I know of, have been successful with the applications that they put in last year — so why not obtain a form and see what is involved — you may also be in the running for some Government assistance to improve your facilties.

FROM THE COACHING DESK:

The Western Zone will be holding a 2 day coaching session at the Dubbo Gun Club on 5th/6th May. Both Trap and Skeet instruction will be given and the weekend is open to any interested shooters from any zone.

A further reminder of the Central Zone weekend — 30th June and 1st July. The program is for Trap at Cowra on the Saturday and then over to Bathurst for Skeet on the Sunday. Again, anyone may attend — it is not just for Central Zone shooters.

Another highlight of the weekend was Roydon Swan from the Cressy Gun Club receiving the Newton Thomas Award from National Executive member John Murphy.





I am sure that at this time all is on schedule, but rest assured any suggestions that could be implemented to make this event more enjoyable to our visitors and competitors, if within my jurisdiction, will be considered.



LET'S TALK ABOUT SHOOTING DOUBLE RISE TRAP TARGETS



By GEORGE BIGGS, former Victorian State Coaching Director

Shooting doubles is perhaps the most challenging and enjoyable of our clay target shooting games. Doubles is now being introduced into skeet competition and is creating fresh interest in this discipline. The doubles shooter will soon learn that greater concentration and discipline are needed, this in turn will make him a better all-round shot. He will become more aware of the fundamentals that are involved in shotgun shooting.

There is no doubt that shooting double rise targets and scoring well is not the easiest form of clay target shooting.

To become good double rise shooters we must first learn how it should be done and then practice and more practice until our timing is perfect because timing is of the utmost importance.

It's a great pity that the average Australian shooter doesn't get a greater opportunity to shoot more often at double rise. How many times have we heard shooters say after having shot the National Double Rise Championships at the Nationals each year, "I don't know why I bother to shoot this event, it's only the second time this year I've shot doubles." No wonder we don't shoot well, we simply don't get the practice.

Lack of practice and experience is certainly the reason that we rarely see a possible doubles at our National Championships. The remedy of course, is for clubs to promote double rise events.

I well remember my earlier days of shooting when almost every week we were able to shoot a doubles event at one club or another. Not only did it give us a different challenge, which added more interest to the day's shooting, it also contributes to making us a better all-round shot because we just simply have to learn to concentrate more on doing what is necessary in order to hit more targets.

The doubles shooter must keep perfect control of his body movements with each shot. His gun must be well-fitted and his gun mounting and handling must also be spot on. If this detail is correct, he will then have no problem keeping his cheek snug on the comb throughout the process of shooting both targets. Lifting one's cheek off the comb in order to look more for the second target will result in a complete miss due to overshooting.

All kinds of funny things happen when the inexperienced shooter first takes up double rise. The most common practice is to snap shoot the first target and then swing across to the second, and follow it while he decides where and how he will break it.

Unfortunately it's not possible to connect with a moving

target in this way. It is usually the second shot that wrecks our score at doubles and it all comes back to timing. We really don't have time to be precise and careful. Shooting moving targets is a case for instinctive action and pointing the gun muzzle at the correct spot where the shot pattern will intercept the target.

Successful doubles shooting calls for a complete understanding of what action is necessary or in other words one should form a mental picture of correct procedure routine for shooting each double. From the five different firing points, this routine should apply every time he prepares to shoot at the target. Our mental picture should go something like this:

Firstly the shooter must have complete confidence in himself. He must believe that if he does the things he knows he should do in the correct way, he will be well on the way to turning in winning scores. This positive thinking must always be present in competition.

The first detail of our correct procedure routine when on the firing line is:

Correct stance, and body balance;

Gun mounting and gun control;

Gun and eye alignment.

These fundamentals will contribute greatly to the successful shooting of doubles.

Next procedure is correct gun point on the trap house. Eyes should focus in readiness to see the target, the eyes move out with the target, establish lead, fire and follow through. This procedure routine should occupy your thinking completely, during your time at the firing line.

Keep constantly in mind that correct stance and body position will be one of your greatest assets. Seeing the targets leaving the trap after you call is without doubt the most essential basic detail to remember. I am convinced that if we can see the target bright and clear leaving the trap at six to eight feet out we are more than halfway to breaking it. When targets are not seen clearly as they leave the trap house, our gun pointing will be slow, uncertain and inaccurate.

Proper Gun Fit and Gun Handling

Make sure that your gun fits you and you have learnt to handle it correctly! Always keep your cheek nice and firm on the comb throughout the process of firing at the target.

Experience has taught me that before we can expect to shoot good scores at not only double rise but any other moving target — we must have the right gun and we must have this gun properly fitted to our own physical characteristics. This is necessary because the factory built gun is designed to fit Mr Average, but unfortunately Mr Average is few and far between, so personal modifications are often necessary.

If these alterations are not done the shooter will try to adapt himself to fit the gun—this practice is not successful—the result is bruised shoulder, cheek etc., it is in fact impossible to control the gun correctly in order to shoot good scores. The facts are that if your gun does not fit you correctly you cannot control it correctly and therefore you cannot point the muzzle accurately which means you will never become the good shot you would like to be!

I never cease to be amazed at the number of shooters struggling with a gun that does not fit them. Usually the stock is too long or the comb is too low, both these problems will cause inaccurate gun pointing as well as cheek and shoulder discomfort. The score they put on the score card is usually 47 or 48 out of 50 and often worse.

Drawing 1.

Accurate gun pointing is the key to successful shot gun shooting — and this can only be achieved when we have a

well fitted gun and we learn to handle it correctly. This drawing shows correct eye level position above the rib. You can check this position yourself by looking into a mirror. Note how the gun, arms and face are tied into the shoulder for perfect alignment of gun and eye.


Shows incorrect eye level which is positioned below the barrel rib. I can say without hesitation that of all the measurements of stock fit, drop at the comb would be the most critical and possibly the least understood. It is in fact the most common problem with most shooters.

A good rough method of determining the comb measurement of your stock if you think you have a problem, is to place the gun to your shoulder in the correct way and position your face hard down on the comb. You should still be able to see all the frontsight. If you find you are looking into the breech of the gun and cannot see the rib, then the stock is too low and you will shoot low and behind the target. When you are faced with this problem you will need to have the stock bent up at the heel whatever amount is necessary in order to give the required height on the comb where your cheek will rest during the process of shooting.

TRAP DOUBLES FIELD SHOOTING LANES 1-5.

This drawing shows the shooter positioned to shoot a double from lane one shooting the straightaway target first, in other words from right to left. His first consideration should be position of his feet so that after firing at his first target he will then swing smoothly and quickly across to break the second target. The method I recommend for shooting this double and for all five lanes is as follows.


Firstly, we already know where each double target is

coming from and where it is going so all we have to do is see it leaving the trap bright and clear and believe me this is most important. Failure to see any target quickly and clearly quite frequently becomes a lost target.

From this point on the process of shooting the double should go something like this — as you step on to the mark you quickly form a mental picture of what you are about to do. Firstly you must know that concentration and timing are vital. Placement of your feet comes next, followed by correct gun position on the shoulder and your cheek snug down on the comb of the stock to give a perfect eye and gun alignment of eye and rib. This position must remain until after you have broken the second target. Failure to do this will result in a lost target so keep your face down firm on the comb right through the act of firing. Be careful not to lift your face off the comb in order to see the second target.


Body position and stance for No. 2 lane will be similar to No. 1, the right target will be almost, but not quite, a straight away and so your gun swing will need to be just a touch on the right of the target to establish correct lead—and to form correct sight picture for trigger let off. Do not blot the target out—always see the target on the end of the gun as you pull the trigger; failure to do this will cause a missed target.

Gun hold on the trap house should be as shown in the

sketch roughly 3ft up on line of target travel. Watch for the target leaving the trap by focusing on the area under the gun—do not look at the gun muzzle, look only at the target and the gun will follow out to form a sight picture and trigger let off.

Do not momentarily stop your gun swing as you break the first target — it is best to keep the gun moving smoothly and quickly across the second target. You should in the process be forming a mental sight picture of how you will break the target when your gun muzzle gets there.

I prefer to shoot this second shot on all stations as follows—as the gun closes in on the target from the side—simply pass the muzzle under it by about 2 feet and lead it by another 20-25 inches. Pull the trigger and follow through, do not stop the gun as you pull the trigger, and as I keep saying keep your head down on the stock!!!

This station presents us with a doubles pair where we have right and left angles to cope with. In my view lane 3 is the most difficult to shoot because of these two angle targets, where as with the other lanes we get at least one almost straight away target. I have heard shooters say that lane 5 is the most difficult for them, however I beg to differ. If we were to shoot all doubles from right to left, then possibly it would be the case — coping with 2 angle targets from lane 3 calls for the utmost concentration and timing.

Feet position should be positioned in such a way that will allow the body to move freely through an arc of 90° from right to left without restriction. It will be a similar position as if you were shooting single rise targets from this lane.


Some of our best doubles shooters adopt a stance position on all stations that favour the second target. This style means winding back the body somewhat to shoot the first target then unwinding as you come across for the second shot. It is somewhat like skeet where the body is used to help swing and follow through.

Drawings 4 & 5...Stations 4 & 5.


Lanes 4 and 5 are actually the reverse to lanes 1 & 2. We continue to take the straight away target first and in the case of these two lanes it is the left angle target.

Most of the top line doubles shooters go for the straight away target first claiming that it is more natural for the right hand shot to swing from right to left in order to shoot the second target, however if you shoot the straight away first from lanes 4 & 5 you would then have to swing from left to right, which is the opposite to lanes 1 & 2.

It sometimes happens that wind conditions are such that the second target that you would normally shoot last, is being driven by rough winds causing it to dive into the ground, in this case it would be advisable to take this shot first.

So it becomes obvious that shooting double rise targets is far from easy. It is indeed a very challenging game that requires a lot of practice and a lot of cartridges plus a good coach.

Points to Remember

- 1. Most shooters miss the second target because their lead is wrong and their elevation is wrong, in other words they do not allow for the target flight outwards and they do not allow enough for the target commencing to descend at the time the shot pattern is reaching the spot where it will break the target. For this reason it becomes necessary to allow around two feet of daylight under the second target and roughly twenty inches of lead.
- 2. Try and get as much practice as you can and develop a smooth fast timing style of shooting. Learn good body control and easy stance, learn to concentrate, relax but be alert. Remember not to be over careful as you simply do not have time to be too precise and deliberate. When you fire at the first target don't stop to see if it is broken, simply swing smoothly and quickly over to hit the second target, lead, fire and follow through.

My Personal Opinion

I am of the opinion that if double rise target events were made easier the event would become more popular with the

average shooter, thus adding more interest in doubles. I would suggest that we adopt the American rules of Double Rise.

Their rules state that the targets be thrown a distance of $48\,to\,50\,yards$ with smaller angles of say 30° and push them up a little higher -- certainly the good shots will still win but a lot of not so good shots will enjoy themselves a lot more. What do you think?

DELVING INTO THE PAST

The following tit bits take us back to the days when the then Management of the Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting Association decided to introduce to affiliated clubs and registered members a publication to provide a regular monthly news bulletin covering clay pigeon shooting happenings throughout all States of the Commonwealth.

September 1947. Volume 1, Number 1. Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News.

Overseas Items . . . Following a suggestion made to the Association some months ago by Mr Colin M. Barr of Mount Gambier, S.A. regarding the supplying of food parcels to our kindred shooting sportsmen in Great Britain, the matter was discussed at the last meeting of the Executive Committee. A letter forwarded to Mr H. Rogers, secretary of the English C.P.S. Association, brought forth an immediate air mail reply. Portions of this interesting letter are quoted, "I want to acknowledge your letter just to hand and to express our happiness at the very kindly feeling you have given us by the offer therein of sending food parcels. It is just a naturally expressed wish of the people far away to see that the 'Old Folk' do not lack food. The letter will go before our committee and we will write to you again. I have made one suggestion: Our championship meeting takes place at the end of this month and the lowest scorers should have food parcels to build up their stamina! We have not seen a steak for years and our meat supplies are very poor."

Bertram carried on in a miss and out event and broke another 17 before missing his actual competition break being 77 straight. (Yes, you might ask, where did he get hold of so many crackers! — Ed.)

Editor's Notebook . . . With information to hand of entries from as far north as Central Northern Queensland, and as far south as Hobart, the A.C.P.T.S.A. Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) and International meeting, fixed for March 12 and 14 at East Burwood (Vic) appears likely to exceed previous records. Shooters whether they secure a place in Australia's International Team or otherwise, will shoot at 160 clay pigeons each at least, during the competitions. This total per man will easily be a record number of birds for Australia. An important variation decided upon since the first publication of the International Teams Match conditions is that the members of the 1949 Australian team will not be required to pay for entrance to the event, birds and cartridges will also be supplied free. This departure from the previous conditions has been brought about through the generous interest and support of Messrs Imperial Chemical Industries A. & N.Z. Ltd.

Looking around for a suitable name change, the officals happened on the idea of "Wongabri" after the estate on which the club's grounds were situated. At the club's annual general meeting at this time a very healthy balance sheet was presented, showing assets at 120 pounds and a club increase in membership from 18 to 47.






