





EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Last month's CTSN advised of the composition of the team to compete at the World Shooting Championships in Moscow, this month's unfortunately advises of some changes that come about as a result of the lack of funds from the Australian Olympic Commission so far as all members of the initial team is concerned.

In the skeet team, all three members have advised of their unavailability to take their place on the team. Places were then offered to those next in line who were fully qualified. Two shooters, Brian Thomson (Vic.) and Alex Crikis (Vic.) have joined the team and will be participating at Moscow during August, we wish them well. A similar situation did arise in the trap team where owing to the unavailability of Bill Iles, 1990 Commonwealth Games Team member Russell Mark (Vic.) has been added to the team, being the next qualified person. Approaches to the Australian Olympic Commission has enabled the grant which was not taken up owing to the outcome of the elimination event to be re-directed to Craig Tilley.

The end result however for those who are not competing in Moscow was softened to some degree by the receipt of an invitation from Prince Haji Bolkia of Brunei for a trap and skeet team plus two officials to participate in the MSB Shooting Championships in late July on an all expenses paid basis to help him celebrate his birthday. MEMBERS' ACCIDENT INSURANCE 1-7-90

The following summary has been presented to the underwriters of the A.C.T.A. Members' Accident Insurance Policy and approved as being an accurate summary of the policy's benefits and conditions.

Any queries that may arise as a result of reading this summary will be placed before the insurers for their determination and added to the master summary which will be published from time to time in the C.T.S.N.

INSURED PERSONS:

Registered shooters with the Australian Clay Target Association, Voluntary Workers and Honorary Club Members of the Association.

AGE LIMIT:

10-85 years.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

Death - \$40,000

Permanent Total Disablement - \$40,000

Permanent and Incurable paralysis of all limbs — \$40,000

Permanent and Incurable insanity - \$40,000

Permanent total loss of sight in both eyes — \$40,000

Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of both hands — \$40,000

Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of both feet — \$40,000 Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of one hand or one foot — \$40,000

Other benefits of a similar nature attract benefits on a reducing scale.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

Weekly Accident Benefit — \$400 p/wk for temporary total disablement payable from the eighth day of medical attention for an aggregate of 104 weeks — limited to income earners only.

Temporary partial disablement — \$100 p/wk payable from the eighth day of medical attention for an aggregate of 104 weeks — limited to income earners only.

NON-INCOME EARNERS: (within the policy conditions)

The compensation for temporary total disablement and temporary partial disablement shall be payable only in reimbursement of the cost of hiring domestic help by the insured person who suffers total disablement — limited to the actual expenditure incurred to a maximum of \$150 per week for a maximum of 52 weeks.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

The compensation for temporary total disablement and temporary partial disablement shall be payable only in reimbursement of the cost of hiring domestic help by the insured person who suffers total disablement — limited to the actual expenditure incurred to a maximum of \$150 per week for a maximum of 52 weeks.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

- (a) Shooters whilst involved in club/zone/state and Association functions and/or activities.
- (b) Voluntary workers for the club/zone/state/Association whilst actually engaged in activities officially organised or under the control of the Association through the Rules of Shooting and Articles of Association.
- (c) A/B include necessary travel to and from such activities.

CLAIMS PROCEDURE: (within the policy conditions)

In the event of the need to lodge a claim against the policy, immediate written advice must be given to the insurer, Australian American Assurance Company Ltd., through the A.C.T.A. National Office on the prescribed form which is available upon request.

It is not possible to provide other than a brief summary of the policy owing to the many circumstances that could arise from time to time. Any queries, however, that may arise are to be addressed to the A.C.T.A. who will endeavour to obtain confirmation clarification to the written request.

BENEFITS:

Benefits are additional to any existing policy that may be in force other than for workers compensation entitlement.

DUBBO GUN CLUB Annual "Golden Fox" Shoot



Interpretation of the program will be made by the attending members of the ACTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

GUIDELINES FOR REFEREES TRAP & SKEET

- Read shooters' names from squad sheets and ensure competitors are on correct tracks and marks. For safely reasons ask all shooters to check for obstructions in barrels.
- 2. The Referee must stand where he has a clear view of targets and competitors, preferably between lanes 2 and 3, approximately 2 metres behind the competitor's shooting mark. If there is excessive background noise, the Referee may move between lanes 2 and 4 in order to hear the competitors call so as to give all competitors equity of competition.
- Describe the event and procedure for conduct of the event, e.g. "25 Target Single Barrel Championship, shot from 15 metres, 13 targets from trap 1 and 12 targets from trap 2".
- 4. The Referee should ask his scorer to stand close enough to him, so that the Referee can see the score sheet, and the scorer can observe the target as a check Referee.
- 5. Target to be shown by Referees:
 - (a) when the competitors are all in position, the Referee must release a target for number 1 shooter to look at on his call:
 - (i) at the beginning of all events;
 - (ii) after any breakdown or delay:
 - (iii) at the commencement of all shoot-offs;
 - (iv) on each trap used for a shoot-off;
 - (v) after any break for shells etc. during a shoot-off;
 - (vi) if a competitor received two broken targets in a row, the Referee should ask the competitor, "Would you like to see a target."
 - (b) If it is a six-man squad and there is to be 1 target per shooter eye-opener, number 6 shooter must move up to take the first target, but he must still be shown a target, on his call, before he shoots at his eye-opener target.
- The Referee must at all times release the target immediately on the competitor's call.
- The Referee must clearly call the result thus: one, lost, three, two, no target, as appropriate.
- Lost targets must be called immediately, and the Referee can change his decision if the target breaks before it hits the ground.

The Referee is to see that the next shooter does not close his gun until the result of the previous shot has been called, and should not release the next target if the competitor calls before the result has been called. Refer Rule 1.1E.

- At all times ensure that no competitor leaves a cartridge(s) in his gun, after a red signal from the traphouse (breakdown etc) and when moving from lane 5 to lane 1.
- 10. The Referee must speak to a shooter immediately on any breach of the safety rules. If the rules of etiquette are broken, the Referee should speak to the shooter concerned after the squad has finished, depending on circumstances.
- Providing a shooter does not obstruct the Referee in the execution of his duties, the shooter may walk in front of the Referee when changing from lanes 1 to 5.
- In Single Barrel competition the Referee must ensure that the second barrel in Double Barrel guns remains clear.
- The Referee must not restore a target if the competitor opens his gun after a malfunction.
- 14. In the case of a malfunction the Referee shall firstly check the safety catch is not in the on position, he shall then check that the action is closed, enquire of the competitor how the action operates, i.e. whether mechanical, or inertia triggers, and then test fire the gun once only.

If the shooter is using a release trigger gun, the Referee will ask the shooter to test fire the gun once only. Under no circumstances will the Referee attempt to test fire it in this case.

- 15. The Referee should be mindful of the rule regarding squad members disturbing the competitor shooting.
- 16. A Referee will not call no target to deny a shooter the opportunity to shoot at a whole target, unless a safety hazard exists.

17. Interpretation of refusal rule:

A shooter may refuse to shoot at any target which he considers to be too high, too low, too wide, too quickly released, too slowly released, at any target he considers to be illegal. There is no limit to the number of targets the shooter may refuse as long as the Referee agrees with the reasons. Obviously, if too many targets are refused for illegality, the Referee must inspect the trap, find the cause, and correct it. If the Referee does not consider that the target refused is illegal, he will ask the shooter why he refused the target. If the Referee is not satisfied with the reason, he will tell the shooter. He will also state that any further targets which are refused, and are considered by the Referee to be legal, will be scored "lost target". If the above situation seems likely to arise, it is preferable that a third party, qualified if possible, adjudicates subsequent refusals. The foregoing procedure in no way discrimintes against Referees using their judgement, it is meant to assist in equity of competition. A major point missed by older style Referees is that although a shooter may refuse to shoot at an illegal target, he is equally entitled to accept an illegal target, and shoot at it. However, if he shoots at, and misses an illegal target, the only decision open to the Referee is "lost target". Similarly, if he hits it, "three", "two", or "one" as the case may be is the only decision to be given.


A Referee should not call "No Target" for a fast or slow released target nor if the target seems to him to be too high, too low, or too wide. "No Target" should only be called in the case of a broken target, a pair of targets emerging instead of a single (or vice versa), or where a safety hazard exists if a shooter elects to shoot at the target.

The Shooter must be the only person to decide if the target is acceptable to him.

Many older style Referees consider that this rule takes away too many of their decision-making powers. The fact is that the rule puts the decision whether to shoot or not with the sole person who should have to decide—the shooter concerned. The Referee must leave the "No Target" decision where it belongs—with the shooter. If the shooter breaks the target, illegal or not, he is credited with it, if he misses an illegal target, he must equally accept the "lost target" decision.

Referees are to ensure that "R" for refusal is entered on scorecards. Every refusal must be called either "No Target" or "lost target" by the Referee.

- The Referee is to see that all competitors remain as a squad until the last shooter has finished.
- At the completion of each visit to a trap, the Referee must say, "unload your guns and check your scores".
- 20. In Skeet, the Referee is to ensure that the competitor's feet are within the 1 metre square at each station.
- The Referee should take up a position as recommended for each station.



COACHING CORNER



COACHING DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Australian Coaching Council (ACC) has recently issued a four-year development plan for the guidance of all National Sporting Organisations (ACTA is one) and all those who are accredited coaches or who are contemplating becoming sports coaches. Since the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme was established 10 years ago, over 68,000 coaches have completed some form of training and have been registered with ACC as accredited coaches.

The Coaching Development Plan is complex and comprehensive, so to summarise it briefly is difficult. The most obvious conclusions from the document include the following:

- with effect from July 1990, all accredited coaches will be required to update their qualifications; if not, they will lose their status after 4 years;
- standards for coaches are to become 'performanceorientated';
- at the State and National level, coaching directors will become training administrators rather than direct coaches of participants;
- the acquisition and retention of level 3 and higher coaching qualifications will be conditional upon the candidates working with "athletes of specified standard", i.e. elite shooters;
- the process of training a coach candidate will become both more flexible and more formal.

Your State Coach has a copy of this Development Plan and he or I would be happy to provide enquirers with more details.

KNOW YOUR STATE COACHING DIRECTOR

COL BURT - NSW

Col commenced shooting at the Inverell Gun Club in 1970 and on moving to Tamworth in 1973 became involved with that Club and has held various positions including President and Secretary.

Col was a Delegate for the NSWCTA for 13 years and has served as State Coaching Director from 1985 until 1989 and was reappointed in 1990.

He has been an accredited coach since 1982, completing Level II in 1984 and Level III in 1988.

Col partakes in all disciplines of Clay Target Shooting on a regular basis.

VISUAL CONSIDERATIONS IN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

Shooting a moving target is predominantly a eye-hand co-ordination task. The eyes visually direct the hand to position the gun, allowing for the target trajectory, so that when the gun is fired, the shot and clay target will meet at a pre-calculated point in space. The visual demands for such a task are complex and significantly different to those required to shoot a stationary target which only requires good central fixation and eyesight. In a moving target situation the shooter has to first detect the target's position, speed and direction, visually centre and track it while maintaining focus and gun alignment and then co-ordinate the signal to the hand to pull the trigger with the gun aligned with the visually projected position of the target. All this in a time frame of less than 3 seconds.

Main visual components are:

1. Detection of the Target:

The detection of a moving target is initially a peripheral retinae function. Retinal cells are organised into receptive fields which respond to a stimulus moving across it. In the peripheral retinae these fields are large and information from these fields helps direct the cortex to align the eyeball onto the target (central fixation). Peripheral field size is reduced under conditions of stress (fear, flight or fight responses). Hence the more relaxed or less excited/nervous the shooter, the better the peripheral awareness, the larger the peripheral field, the better the visual judgement of the target position and control of visual tracking skills.

2. Tracking the Target:

Tracking the target is a function of reflexes. The following reflex and the fixation reflex maintain the target position on the central part of the eye (fovea). This part of the eye is extremely sensitive and relays information back to the cortex about size, direction and speed of the target.

This tracking mechanism can fatigue as it requires the use of the extra-ocular muscles. However this is only under extreme conditions and it is unlikely to occur with target shooting.

The extra-ocular muscles are basically skeletal muscles (voluntary) but are unique from other skeletal muscles in the body in that they have a very high nerve to muscle fibre ratio (1:20). For every one nerve fibre there is only 15 to 20 muscle fibres. This gives the extra-ocular muscle one of the finest and most sensitive motor control of any muscle in the body.

Information from the neck, vestibular and extra-ocular muscle fibres is relayed along with fovea information to maintain fixation. Excessive head or body movement will interfere with good eye tracking. The skill of eye movement control will vary with individuals as does most fine motor skills, Jerky or slow tracking skills can be remedied by therapy.

3. Maintaining Focus and Depth Perception:

A clay target at 100ft would require eyesight abilities of about 6/12 vision. It is important in any target shooting that the refractive status of the eye be corrected to provide at least this visual acuity if the eye cannot do this by itself. Both eyes open (binocular vision) are required to give us the fine sense of depth (stereopsis). A shooter who closes one eye will not have a accurate perception

of depth or judge distance and speed clues as well as with both eyes.

Eyesight abilities can be fatigued, but again it is unlikely in the clay target shooting situation for this to ever occur as prolonged viewing (greater than 15 minutes) is not being maintained.

To improve tracking and eyesight abilities during clay target shooting, tinted lenses may be helpful to improve contrast of the target against a blue sky. Depending on the colour of the target, the tint to give best contrast is a haze muster yellow or green tint.

Tips and Tails from the Editors Page Clay Pigeon Shooting News

Vol 1, No. 1. 1947. Secretary-Editor Mr Bill McCullough "Bill" goes on to report:

The Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association is pleased to introduce to shooting sportsmen this, the first issue of "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News".

The publication is the Association's initial essay at providing a regular monthly news bulletin covering clay pigeon shooting happenings throughout all states of the country.

The management of the Association gave careful consideration to the idea before agreeing to launch out in an enterprise which will require the fullest support of all to ensure its unqualified success. From soundings in all eastern states of the Commonwealth among representative shooting men the result was instantaneous approval.

Famous Clubs Amalgamate C.P.S.N. Vol 2, No. 1, 1948.

The Blackburn club held its eighth annual meeting on Tuesday August 24. The meeting was well attended and several important matters were finalised. Chief among these was the approval of amalgamation with the Nobel Clay Target Club. The latter club—the mother of all clay pigeon shooting clubs in Australia—has been in recess since the early months of the recent war period. The committees of the two clubs through appointed delegates, then entered into negotiations with a view to joining forces. Both Blackburn and Nobel members unanimously agreed to the amalgamation and also to a new name—"Australian Clay Target Club", incorporating Blackburn and Nobel Clay Target Clubs.

The new club held its first meeting on August 28 at East Burwood. The Australian Gun Club's grounds from 1948 on to 1956 became the venue for the A.C.T.A. National Championships with a three automatic trap layout.




