AUSTRALIAN INSTITUTE OF SPORT

At its last meeting the Australian Sports Commission endorsed a policy which will enable elite athletes from non-AlS scholarship sports to visit the AIS in Canberra to train and receive assistance for a maximum period of one month per calendar year. Initially, this program will be for individual athletes, not whole teams.

To be eligible an athlete must have a current senior world ranking of 8 or higher.

Application forms for these visiting scholarships are available from: Sports Administration, AIS, PO Box 176, Belconnen, ACT 2616.

As well as completing the forms, an applicant must include a letter of endorsement from his or her national sporting organisation, list the proposed training program to be followed while at the AIS and explain how the visit will assist the athlete's preparation. All documents should be sent to the AIS at least one month prior to the start of the anticipated visit.

Successful applicants will receive:

- Full board and accommodation at the AIS.
- Return airfares between home and Canberra for a maximum of two visits.
- Access to Sports Medicine services.
- Sports Science services may be provided to be negotiated for each individual.


TERRITORY TRAP & SKEET CARNIVAL

8-11 JUNE 1990

The Northern Territory Clay Target Association held a combined trap and skeet carnival at Katherine Gun Club over the Queen's Birthday weekend. This was the first time that we have run a combined carnival and it was done as a trial to try and revive interest in both shooting disciplines. The experiment worked and combined carnivals are likely to be a feature of the Territory for at least the next few years.

Over 50 shooters turned up which is a tremendous turn-out considering our numbers and the distances that shooters had to travel. For those not familiar with the Territory, the nearest club to Katherine is Darwin, some 330 km away. Shooters travelled the well over 3000 km round trip from Yulara and Alice Springs to be there and the Gove contingent travelled the arduous 4WD 1200-odd km round journey across Arnhem Land. I think that even the most cynical observer would have to agree that this is indeed dedication to the sport.

Thanks to the terrific effort made by the Katherine Gun Club in preparing the grounds and providing the usual legendary Katherine hospitality. The bar service and food provided by the ladies was superb but particular thanks are due to Jim Bitossi and his firm, Dee Jay Engineering, Ian (Slug) Winstanley and Bronte Evans. Without their efforts there would not have been a carnival. Dee Jay Engineering put so much effort into the preparations for the carnival that it became our major sponsor.




Top End President Barry Munt enjoyed his weekend.

The notorious background at Katherine collected more than a few scalps as evidenced in the scores but that was more than compensated by the weather and the hospitality. I can honestly say that it was one of the happiest shoots I have attended with no dramas or major grizzles. Good stuff.

The skeet got off to an early start on Friday morning with John Doyle (nice to have you back J.D.) winning the overall and A Grade in the 50t Carnival Championship. Gove President Greg

Bateson took out the B Grade and Alice Springs shooter Chris Smythe won C Grade. The State Skeet Championship was won by Top End President Barry Munt in yet another shoot-off from Phil Crute. Jim Bitossi and Peter O'Grady won B and C Grades respectively.

A feature of the carnival was the keen competition between the junior shooters which is an encouraging sign for the sport. Chris Warren and Adam Brown cornered the market in pocket knives with one or the other winning junior titles throughout the weekend.

This was also the first year that we ran skeet doubles but the . event met with mixed reactions. Its inclusion was justified by the fact that it is shot in the national championships but a lot of shooters regarded it as more of a novelty event. Anyway, it was won overall by Mt Isa shooter and regular visitor to the NT, Mick McGill. B and C Grades were dominated by Alice Springs, being won by Peter O'Grady and Alice President, Mick Milera. Mick McGill won the Skeet High Gun with 143/150 and the Territory team selected for the Nationals is Barry Munt, John Doyle, Jim Bitossi, Chris Smythe and Peter O'Grady.

The skeet finished by about lunch-time Friday and after presentations the trap shooting commenced. The points score came as a sudden death event for many shooters, yours truly included, with the background taking a heavy toll. Ken Selwood, Victor Padovan and Graham (Stretch) Draper picked up money in the 10t eyeopener and NTCTA Secretary/Treasurer Phil Grove won the overall on the 50t championship: Victor Padovan, who had a very successful weekend, won B Grade and Peter Lawton, C Grade.

Sunday dawned (almost) with the single barrel eye-opener with Peter Hoare, Mick Harding and Ray Oakley picking up money. Darwin President Ken Selwood won the single barrel championship with Mick Harding and S. Savvas taking out B and C Grades. Savvas, a relatively new shooter, also had a good weekend and is surely destined for B Grade shortly.

Well known South Australian shooter Ron Smith won the 50t double barrel championship with the only possible shot in the event. Victor Padovan and S. Savvas winning Z and C Grades. There were some disappointing scores in the postal shoot, possibly a result of being shot at the end of a long day. The 5-man shoulder to shoulder team ended up being Phil Grove, Ken Selwood, Doug Chan, Victor Padovan and Jim Bitossi.

The handiap and double barrel was shot on the final day with rival juniors Adam Brown and Chris Warren both picking up money in the eye-opener and Greg Bateson right behind them. Victor Padovan won the State Handicap, Bronte Evans was second and Mick McGill third.

The double rise sorted many out with fairly low scores all around. Ron Smith won the sash and Tony Brown and Russell Mc-Kenzie winning B and C Grades respectively. Darwin junior shooter Brett Hall came second in C Grade, which is a promising start to his career.

KNOW YOUR EXECUTIVE



NOEL DEELEY, QUEENSLAND

Noel started his clay breaking at the Blackall Gun Club in the early 1960s, alas not long after his commencement the club went into recession.

Noel had a break from shooting at this time until the 1970s when the Gemfields Gun Club was formed. Since the time of the Gemfields club, Noel has held the position of Club President for six years, four of those being the last years straight.

With heavy involvement in the Central Zone of the Queensland Clay Target Association he is currently President after having been a councillor for such for the past six years. He is part of the QCTA Management Committee and the ACTA delegate to the National Executive on behalf of his state.

Noel's wife Joyce is very actively involved in the sport at club level. He has five children with three of them keen competitors in the sport he loves.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- Squads of 6 to shoot 50 Targets/100 Targets in brackets of 25, 50 Target events, one visit to the trap. 100 Target events, two visits to the trap.
- 3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 Targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded by any shooter then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination, shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 Targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be gradied with the heurit score recorded.
- will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

- 8. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter who interferes with or attempts to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweeppurse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events, excluding doubles events.
- 15. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s) and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
- 16. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID OPEN OR SECTION.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
- Nominations will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director.
- 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.


BEAUFORT GUN CLUB

SCHOOL SHOOTERS LEARN SAFETY

Viewers of the ABC's '7.30 Report' on 11 July were given an inaccurate picture of the firearm safety programs in our secondary schools.

Presenter John Jost implied these programs are a recent phenomenon, and reporter Jill Singer did nothing to correct that impression.

In fact, target shooting has been available in our schools since the 1890s. About 30 years ago, however, the emphasis began to change. Safety training became the primary focus, with target shooting seen as a necessary adjunct.

Necessary? Yes, for the same reason that students in pre-driver education courses spend part of their time driving cars: safe habits cannot be developed without hands-on experience.

Jill Singer said students are "being coached to become crack shots". That's nonsense. The traps (clay target throwers) are adjusted to ensure easy shots and training an expert marksperson takes years.

Though there's nothing wrong in acquiring skills that can lead as far as Olympic competition, the in-school courses aren't designed for that purpose.

THE FIFTH AUSTRALIAN GUN EXPO

On the date November 1st 1986 at the Melbourne Royal Exhibition Building an historic event occurred with relation to the world of firearms being the staging of the "FIRST AUSTRALIAN GUN EXPO".

It was a national event with companies, organisations and individuals travelling from every part of Australia (as did purchasers) to participate in the Expo.

After three years the Expo's can now be termed "international" events with participants from the United States and New Zealand (possibly also Europe and Japan at the next one) attending.

Every conceivable area of the gun and allied fields are represented at each Expo such as: Custom made guns, military medals and badges, engravers, outdoor cooking equipment; bows, arrows and allied equipment; new and used books on hunting, collecting, target shooting etc; survival equipment; security equipment; safari outfitters (from as far away as New Zealand); cartridges; new and used target pistols; new and used target rifles; new and used shotguns; new and used sporting rifles; new and used handguns; scopes and binoculars; antique and collectable type guns related items such as swords, uniforms, obsolete cartridges etc; exmilitary rifles and handguns; taxidermists; custom knife makers; gunsmiths, clay bird, pistol, target, big game, deer etc; shooting and hunting clubs and associations; manufacturers; distributers; retailers; factory made knives; and a great deal more.

The organisers have been more than pleased with regards to the way the Expo has progressed but one aspect has been a disappointment to them which has to do with the dates the Expo's have been held on. In a sense the staging of the "Fifth Australian Gun Expo" on the dates October 27th and 28th at the Exhibition Building will be another momentous occasion for this will be the first Expo ever held on a non-Melbourne Cup weekend.

This of course means more participants and purchasers than ever before with the result of its being the biggest events of its kind ever held in Australia.



NATIONAL SECRETARY PULLS THE PLUG



After 16 years as National Secretary to the New Zealand Clay Target Association, Sid Hanson is calling it a day. Appointed to the position in June 1974 Sid has seen many changes in the national and local shooting scene.

Following his appointment, Sid went to Christchurch where the outgoing Secretary gave him a two-hour rundown on what the job entailed and then helped pack the office records into 17 tea chests which were shipped off to Napier.

Shifting the National Office from the South to the North Island did not sit well with many South Island shooters at the time as they had an inbuilt suspicion of anything that went on north of the Waimakariri River.

Over the next few years many changes were to take place. There was the introduction of the grades leading to a dramatic increase in record keeping at the National Office and the promotion of the ISU disciplines to the stage where nearly every DTL shooter thought the Council were spending the whole of the annual budget on these new disciplines.

The Council decided to have Sid attend all Federation meetings as one of the NZCTA delegates and this led to the Association gaining considerable support in coaching and finance for its ISU team nominees. Sid also rose to be President of the National Shooting Federation and was in that position during a most successful South Pacific Regional Championship in Christchurch in 1984.

1990 has been one of the high points of Sid's clay target involvement with his serving on the shotgun jury at the Commonwealth Games in Auckland and being involved with the Oceania FITASC World Cup event more recently at Taupo. The jury involvement has led to him being the first holder of an A Grade UIT Shotgun Judge's Badge in New Zealand.

His own shooting career has shown a moderate success rate since he first shot at a clay as a schoolboy. Whilst secretary of the Hawkes Bay Central Gun Club he not only ran the office when the 1973 North Island Championships were held there but also won the Clay Sparrow and Single Barrel titles from a field of over 200 competitors. His best chance at National honours came at Hamilton in 1983, when from a field of just under 250 he was one of only four shooters to shoot a skeet possible. A lost station two high put paid to this but he had done enough to be a member of that year's team to compete against Australia in the Glenn Skeet Trophy. Two minor placings in South Island Championships and a silver in B Grade Single Barrel at the 1986 Nationals were achieved before he managed his only Provincial title at Nelson in Single Barrel. In both this event and the 1973 North Island Clay Sparrows Sid was first shooter in the shoot off and was to miss his fourth target, only to see his opponents, on both occasions do the same. Needless to say he didn't miss any more.

Sid is leaving the Association in a sound financial position and with systems in place that should make the transition to a new Secretary fairly straight forward.



COACHING CORNER



SO YOU WANT TO BECOME A COACH

INTRODUCTION

It has been suggested to me that there are some members of the clay target fraternity who are interested in becoming coaches but who have no clear idea of how to go about it. The following thoughts may be helpful to those who have the will but do not know the way.

WHAT IS A COACH?

A coach is a leader and activist in a competitive sport whose function is to bring about behaviour modification in participants or potential participants in the sport. Behaviour modification in our sport includes improved standard of shooting, ethical approach to the sport, teamwork, conformity with sport rules, personal discipline, capacity to enjoy the sport more, and so forth.

It would be fair to say that a sports coach today is generally an unsung, unrewarded handmaiden of his/her sport, but without whom the sport cannot grow. However, steps are underway, nationally, to improve the status and professionalism of coaches.

ARE THERE DIFFERENT SORTS OF COACHES?

Yes. Broadly, we have 'developmental coaches', who introduce people to the sport and who work with the more recreational shooters, and "high performance coaches" who work with "high performance" shooters. It is useful also to consider that there are administrators in the coaching fraternity who organise courses, who plan coaching development, who ensure that standards are maintained, or who manage teams competing interstate and internationally. Opportunities are available for some members to progress through most, or all, of these ranks.

WOULD I MAKE A GOOD COACH?

Established coaches tend to be outgoing, good communicators, decision-makers, leaders, and supportive of authority. If you match that profile and are prepared to work, to study and to re-qualify periodically, you are looking good.

IS THERE A JOB FOR ME?

It is pointless and costly to train coaches for whom there is no work. If there is no group or potential group for a coach to work with, there is no point in appointing a coach and the coach aspirant will not be able to requalify or to progress. Therefore, discuss with your existing Club/Zone/State Coaches a possible role for yourself. At the very least, one of them may need an apprentice/helper, which is an ideal way for you to start out in the trade.

DO I HAVE TO BE AN ELITE SHOOTER?

No. Obviously, however, a high performance shooter who becomes a coach has certain initial advantages.

IS THERE A COACHING STRUCTURE?

Yes. Standards are set by the Australian Coaching Council (ACC) which franchises the system through National Sporting Organisations (NSO) of which ACTA is one. The ACC is a division of the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) in Canberra, the body which coordinates, represents and funds Australian sportsmen and sportswomen. The training and re-training of coaches is delivered through "approved coordinators" who may be other coaches, TAFE colleges, State Sports Departments or the staff of ASC/ACC.

Coaches, once formally trained, are "accredited" by the Australian Coaching Council, which issues a badge and an ID card to each coach, for a small fee.

Coaches within States/Territories are coordinated by State and, in some areas, Zone Coaches who also provide communications links. State Coaching Directors coordinate with the National Director of Coaching at ACTA National Office, who is responsible to the Australian Coaching Council for overall quality control.

WHAT DO I DO NEXT?

Ask your Zone or State Coach if you can be offered a place on the next course in your State or region. State and National Coaching Directors have the resource material to provide answers to any further questions you may have.

Gary Redmond, a real champ when it comes to Junior shooters, donated a reloading press to the Club for juniors to learn to do their own thing, under supervision of course.


Many thanks Gary - that press is already doing a mighty job.


CHARITY SHOOT

THE SPORT OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

Australia's first registered clay target club was The Nobel Clay Bird Club. The club first came into being through the efforts of a small band of enthusiastic clay target shooters who in 1926 decided that they would prefer to shoot clay birds rather than live birds. So after several months of fun shooting in a quarry at the back of I.C.I., a factory in West Footscray, a Melbourne suburb, it was decided that a club should be formed. History was made on Friday September 9, 1927 when at a meeting held at 380 Collins Street, Melbourne, it was decided to form Australia's first clay pigeon shooting club. It was to be known as the Nobel Clay Bird Club.

Prior to the Nobel Club being formed, small groups of shooters in various places would run what could be called fun shoots, using more or less their own rules of competition. One of the more prominent of these clubs was the Victoria Clay Bird Club. This club used a piece of land adjacent to a market garden in Bentleigh, a south eastern suburb of Melbourne. Nobel and Victoria clubs were actually two pioneer clubs, they merged in October 1939 and used the Nobel grounds. Shooting continued until several months after War was declared.

In the years between 1927 and 1936 numerous clay bird clubs were formed. They were affiliated with what was known as the Gun Clubs Association of Victoria. This was a live bird shooting body with headquarters at the original Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham.

1936 was the year when Australia really began to shoot clay targets in an organised manner. Up to this time clay target shooting was controlled by the Live Bird Association and for obvious reasons it was apparent that we had to control our own type of trap shooting.

At a meeting called to discuss the matter, it was decided to proceed in this direction. It was agreed that the name of the Association would be "Clay Target Shooter's Association of Victoria". Officials were elected as follows — President: Mr H.G. James; Vice Presidents: Colonel C.W. Thompson and Messrs J.M. Wilson and L. Bertram; Secretary: Colonel Thompson; Treasurer: Mr H. Benison; Handicappers: Messrs E.J. Parow, H.G. James, G. Townsend; Committee: R.W. Delaney, A.P. Cook, J. Benison with power to co-opt two others. This was now the beginning of clay target shooting nationally.


HOW IT BEGAN

We can go back well over 100 years to the beginning of trap shooting, somewhere around the year 1840. At this time trap shooting consisted of live pigeon shooting only. It was during the years 1860 through to 1886 that live pigeon shooting became popular throughout England and the Continent. Special pigeons were bred for this type of trapshooting, they were known as the Blue Rock small in size and very fast flying.

Prize moneys of thirteen hundred and fourteen hundred pounds were not uncommon in the years around 1878. Excellent scores were also put up by several famous English, American and Continental shooters.

Some very interesting information on live pigeon shooting is described by W.W. Greener in his book "The Gun and Its Development", published in England in 1900. He goes on to describe how live pigeon shooting was conducted in the mid-1860s and at a later date, trap shooting at glass balls filled with feathers, were thrown from a rotating trap. The glass balls filled with smoke were later invented in America and proved popular when live pigeons were not available, or as in some states, live pigeon shoots were illegal.

Mr Greener describes how a Captain H. Bogardus, the great American wing shot, made a match against time in December 1879




1. Before the introduction of clay targets around the turn of the century glass balls were developed and made fashionable in America by a Captain Bogardus. In England catapults were used to spring the balls, but in America spring traps were invented. Cards standard trap shown in the centre of the drawing is described as the latest American trap, it will project one or two balls in any direction or it will rotate, throwing balls in a direction impossible to foresee. The balls were often filled with coloured smoke or feathers so as to be seen when broken. The balls were also chequered to prevent the shot glancing off.

and succeeded in breaking 5500 glass balls in seven hours and twenty minutes. The misses numbered 356. The Captain used an English gun with two pairs of barrels. During the match the Captain changed the barrels no less than 55 times.

Clay target trap shooting as we know it today started to become popular before the turn of the century. By the year 1900 the American trap shooter was getting himself geared up to shoot in a big way.



2. Artificial Flying Pigeon — This machine was introduced as a machine which the patentees thought would supersede the glass ball traps. A skilful driver is however, necessary to get good sport from the birds, for if the driving-handle is turned slowly and regularly, a slow gentle sweep is given to the pigeon that no tyro could miss. The pigeon is either iron, whitewashed, or of a wire cage, having inside a balloon, which keeps the two wings spread until caused to collapse by the penetration of shot.

Today the Amateur Trapshooting Association of America has over 100,000 members. There are over 5000 ATA shoots per year shooting at something like 1000 registered clubs throughout the country.

According to their records, clay target shooters fire at more than 600 million targets per year. It is estimated that \$150 million yearly goes into the economy of the country. That is big business whatever way we look at it.

The Grand American Tournament, shot over nine days was commenced in 1900 and has been held continuously every year since that time. The Grand American Handicap as it is known today, is claimed to be the largest clay target trap shooting tournament in the world. Home ground and permanent headquarters of the ATA is at Vandalia, Ohio. Over 5000 shooters participate over nine days, shooting over 72 traps in a mile long line. Approximately 3¼ million targets are thrown during the tournament in August each year.

It was not until the mid-1920s, after World War 1, that clay target shooting was introduced into Australia — more or less from the English Association and with the help of Eley Ammunition Co., who in fact established the first clay target club adjacent to their factory at Tottenham, a western suburb of Melbourne, this club was known as the Nobel Gun Club.

It was a very modest beginning to our sport. Eley Ammunition Company continued to sponsor the club for several years. During this time an association was formed to control the sport, it was known as the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association (ACPTSA), formed in 1936.

The outbreak of World War 2 in September 1939 brought to a halt the growth of clay target shooting in Australia. However, four or five clubs did hang on and managed to shoot at intervals throughout most parts of the war whenever it became possible to obtain targets or shells, which was not often. The Blackburn Gun Club, formed in 1936, was based on the private property of Jack Bryant, in Holland Road, Blackburn. This was one of the clubs able to operate during the War.

During the early months of the War, units of the United States Air Force were often entertained for shooting practice (clay target practice was a part of Air Gunner training in those days). The theory was that shooting at targets familiarised the gunner with the technique of shooting moving targets. Can you imagine it, in today's age of computers?

The greatest problem facing the few clubs trying to keep going during the War was the non-availability of targets and ammunition. However, two old-timers in Jack Bryant and. Horrie Donnelly, became clay target manufacturers, operating out of a garage in Blackburn. Unfortunately quality control was not always up to scratch, but no one complained about such a minor detail as some targets that only dusted when shot at.

Blackburn club continued to shoot until the property was sold in 1947. It was then necessary to look for a new site. Vic Fankhauser, a very keen member of the Blackburn Club, who owned an orchard property in Burwood Road, offered a part of his land to the club. Nobel and Blackburn Clubs then merged to form the Australian Clay Target Club. The first shoot was held in September 1948. Dave Watson was President and Aub Johnston, Secretary. At a later date the name of the club was changed to Australian Gun Club and was for a number of years the venue of Australian National Championships, until they were rotated around other States as the sport developed on a wider National scale.

Two other clubs to survive the War years to become forerunners to clubs operating today were Camberwell and Coburg clubs, eventually suburban expansion caused both clubs to seek other sites. Coburg went out to Epping and became Metropolitan Clay Target Club, while Camberwell joined with Croydon at Lilydale to become Lilydale Clay Target Club and finally at a later date the name was changed to Melbourne Gun Club.

Bill Delaney Senior, established the Camberwell Gun Club during the latter War years on land adjoining a creek on Bulleen Road, North Balwyn. It was a one trap ground as was Coburg, simply because there was no room for more. The shot fall-out was over a creek in both cases.

The original Melbourne Gun Club was based at Tottenham, a western suburb of Melbourne — it was the headquarters of live bird shooting in Victoria. In 1957 live bird shooting was banned in Victoria.

Although our early days of clay target shooting were centred in Melbourne in the early 1920s, it was not long after that other parts of Australia followed on. Queensland was quick to join in with Townsville Gun Club in 1920, St. George in 1937, and Cunnamulla in 1938. Townsville was, in fact, the first club to send a delegate to the newly formed National Association. Today Queensland has some fifty-odd active registered clubs.

Clay target and cartridges continued to be a big problem for several years after the War. It was getting on to 1950 before I.C.I. were able to produce the Australian made target and ammo. Prior to this clays came from England, and our shells, mostly Winchester and Remington, came from USA. Quite a few clubs of that time attempted to make their own clays in different ways. I know of two that gathered up the broken targets from in front of the trap and melted them down to form up again in their own version of a mould. Of course, when the broken targets were gathered, pieces of other things like leaves and twigs etc. were also included result was a very well reinforced clay target — not too easily broken.

It was after World War 2 — around 1946 — that clay target shooting began to expand to other States. The Townsville Gun Club in Queensland is possibly one of Australia's oldest and very progressive clubs. During the immediate post-war years, clay target shooting suffered the effects of both gun and ammunition shortages that lasted well in to the late 1940s resulting in slow expansion of all shooting activities. All types of ammunition were in very short supply and drastically rationed. 1950 saw the beginning of a great deal more expansion of our sport.

The Melbourne Olympic Games in 1956 was an excellent boost to Australian clay target shooting. We fielded a two-man team in International trench shooting for the first time in our history. The event was staged at a specially prepared ground at Laverton Air Force Station. Not long after the games were over the ground was dismantled and the equipment just disappeared. It was really a tragedy for Australian clay target shooting generally because the chance to carry on with ISU shooting was lost, it was only when the Melbourne Gun Club staged the World Moving Target Championships in 1973 did the Australian shooter gain the opportunity to become international. It was at these championships that our Australian trench team came out winners of bronze medals for third place after a shoot off with Italy for 2nd and 3rd placings. 27 countries took part to make the events a huge success.

After the smoke had cleared away from the 1973 Melbourne World Championships it became apparent that International Trap and Skeet shooting was in Australia to stay.

Since 1974 Australia has sent both Trench and Skeet teams to World Championships in several overseas countries with a fair degree of success. Unfortunately because Australia is so far removed from Europe, where most Olympic type shooting is done,

the cost of sending teams away each year becomes quite a financial burden. However, Olympic style shooting is making big progress in countries closer to Australia, like Singapore, Thailand, Korea, Japan, China, New Zealand and Noumea. Because of this, it is now envisaged that more frequent exchange of shooters will occur leading to greater competition experience and less travelling expense.

Standard American style trap and skeet shooting remains the most popular in this country due to the fact that it is not as difficult to shoot for the average person who is not internationally ambitious and just wants a pleasant Saturday afternoon's enjoyable shooting and get together with friends.

Clay target shooting in Australia has come quite a long way since those early days in 1927, when a group of keen shotgunners got together to lay the foundations for a sport that has grown and spread to all States over the years.

Our sport is now organised and controlled by the Australian Clay Target Association, with State Associations in all States. At present there are no less than 295 registered clubs and in excess of 8000 registered shooters throughout Australia.

All Australian capital cities have at least one well appointed gun club equipped with every facility to shoot both international and standard trap and skeet competition.

A national championships tournament in each of these disciplines is staged each year in various State capitals.

OUT OF THE PAST

FIFTY YEARS AGO

The Commonwealth Mixed Birds Championship of 1940 was originally listed for decision on the Camberwell Club's grounds at North Balwyn on the date March 2. However, it was found that the date practically coincided with the Victorian Duck Opening, so the club sought Association permission to defer the event. The association agreed and a new date, June 22, was arranged.

It was also mentioned that "Due to the War" there would be no International Match in 1940.

Jack Bryant Snr of Blackburn, whose name appears regularly about this period, was apparently at the zenith of his form. It is noted that he successfully defended his Commonwealth Double Barrel Title. Lancaster were next out, each with scores of 33/35. Bryant ultimately won 39/40 from Reg Ilett (Harrison) 38/40. Bryant used only three seconds in the contest at 25 targets from 20 yards.

At the first open shoot conducted by the old Werribee Club on the Werribee Racecourse, Bryant again won the main event, at double rise on this occasion, scoring the moderate total of 8/15 pairs to win from Texas (C. Lancaster).

FORTY YEARS AGO

At a Griffith (NSW) fixture 106 shooters attended. The club introduced an unusual scheme for arranging team competition. Each competitor paid in 2/6 and names where then drawn in teams of four. The winning combination comprised Ted Matthews (Bowna), E. Albert (Barellan), E. Fromholtz (Griffith Secretary) and Owen Mc-Loughlan of Cohuna (Vic.). This type of event proved very popular and it could well be tried out again. Dinky (Bill Catlin) and W. Wager (Melbourne) cut the first two places in a 50-pound Handicap at a Holbrook meeting in NSW.

In a Hobart shoot no fewer than 23 of the 40 entrants in a double barrel event carded possibles. The miss out rule applied in the shoot-off which went to J.M. Tyquin, now of Brisbane, on the 29th round.

The Commonwealth Skeet Championship of 1950 was shot at Leeton by the then local club. Nearly 60 entries were received. The title went to Narrandera sportsman Tom Whillans. Newton Thomas was runner-up.

THIRTY YEARS AGO

Geraldton (WA) — The Past President complimented the members on the installation of the new night shooting additions. Through scrounging of an old motor car, a rejected generator, a very fine and efficient plant has been put together, and the club now has a good as any night shooting ground in the State.

Alexandra (Vic.) - Three traps were used for the first time and everything went without a hitch or hold-up thanks to Ron Hedger, his father Manse and son Arthur. Night conditions were perfect with C. Dean in top single barrel form and Tup Pedersen providing the thrills for the crowd with some excellent second barrel saves. Over the night events Claude Dean shot 100 straight without use of one second barrel. Newton Thomas was in his usual form and gave advice to young shooters. Visitors from all States except WA contested including Frank Morton from Alice Springs who was a long way from home. The Victorian Double Barrel Championship produced a splendid exhibition of skill in the tie shoot which brought success to Ray Parker of Colac 100/100. Both Ray Parker and Fred Shearer recorded 100 to 150 breaks. Ray is a 24-yarder and deserved great credit for 153 straight. The big event for the station wagon produced records. At the halfway mark, 61 possibles were on the board to share the sweep. Sixty-four shot the possible in the second 15 and a record 25 possibles lined up for the tie shoot. This continued for three and a half hours and a gallery of at last 1000 watched with keen interest and much appreciated silence throughout. Six shooters eventually decided to divide. Final presentation was made to High Gun winner Athol Miller of Apsley who was decorated with the club sash for the fine score of 103/105.



I. Let me congratulate the executive committee on not approving this recommendation, and it gives me confidence that the executive does not have ALL shooters at "Heart", not just I.S.U. disciplines, contrary to what one hears around the "traps".

2. It would appear to me that the people who do not know what shooters want are the National Shooting Committee.

Perhaps this committee is too "weighted" towards I.S.U. disciplines and they should come in more contact with the "bread and butter" of our sport, the D.T.L. shooter. By listening to a few it does not give the views of the many and I.S.U. shooters should take notice of that.

I am not against I.S.U. — quite the contrary — but if D.T.L. rules are to be changed then let ALL shooters make the decision.

In concluding I would like to think that D.T.L. shooters are just as important to this sport as the "Prima-donnas" and I am sure that the many small clubs located around this country would agree with me.
