

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

In last month's CTSN you may have noticed an advertisement for entries for the 1990 Taipan Shield which is for a 5-Lady Club Team, shooting 20T, DB from 15m. Clubs not having five ladies are able to combine with neighboring clubs to form a team. Interest in ladies' shooting is ever increasing and here is a further opportunity to promote the women in our sport. The Shield has been won for the past four years by the ladies from the Kerang Club and while they are anxious to improve their record of wins they would welcome more entries in the competition. If you are interested in forming a Ladies' Team to challenge the Kerang Ladies then please see the Secretary from your Club and direct him/her to last month's CTSN which carried full details of the competition.

MACKINTOSH EVENT

Having recently held discussions with Mr Keith Murray, Director of the England Clay Pigeon Shooting Association, I am more than confident that we will shortly be able to announce an extension to the Mackintosh Team Event which will enable a 5-Member Team to compete internationally in a Shoulder to Shoulder Match against the other countries who participate in the Mackintosh Event. More about this hopefully at an early date. In addition it is also my belief that 1991 will see the introduction of a Skeet Competition along very similar lines to the existing Mackintosh Event again, more about this at hopefully an early date.

RELEASE TRIGGERS

Some concern has arisen that in some instances Release Trigger Shotguns are being used contrary to the requirements of the ACTA Shooting Rules. I draw your attention to the notice on Release Triggers published in this issue of the CTSN together with the Rule as it presently applies — If you are aware of any person not fulfilling the requirement of Rule 4.11 (B) (i)-(v) then please bring it to the attention of the person in control of the particular event.

OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS — WOMEN - JUNIOR

Selection procedures for the Oceanic Championships are printed elsewhere in this issue. As Women and Junior Teams are to be entered I would advise all who wish to compete for a position on the Australian Team to acquaint themselves with the conditions relating to selection. In addition the selection criteria for the 1991 World Championships is also published for early advice.

1991 WORLD SHOTGUN CHAMPIONSHIPS

During the period of the World Championships in Moscow discussions took place with Gary Anderson of the UIT who has been appointed Technical Advisor for Perth. Gary will be conducting his inspection during late November/early December and while he is anxious to ensure that the good name of the UIT is maintained has expressed his confidence in the ability of those involved to present for his inspection grounds and equipment that will be in exemplary condition for the all-important Championships in 1991.

If you are contemplating visiting Perth for the World Championships an early advice is to bring your gun, for the enterprising WACTA is contemplating a DTL competition over three or four days to show our international visitors how we shoot Down The Line

Organising Committee Chairman Roy Holtfreter and his wife Kath are currently in Europe on holidays and Roy will be visiting the Spieth factory as part of the preparations for 1991.

1998 COMMONWEALTH GAMES

As is probably well known by now South Australia has won the State bid for Australia's application to host the 1998 Commonwealth Games. If successful the shooting will be at the State Shooting Park at Virginia where a second Trench is being installed by the South Australian Government in support of their facility bid to the Australian Commonwealth Games Association — Shooting at this level in South Australia in 1998 will do wonders for the sport in the State providing of course that Australia wins the votes for 1998.

STATE COACHING DIRECTORS' SEMINAR

Director of Coaching Guy Boileau met with State Coaching Directors in Melbourne during early September to outline his and the Australian Coaching Council's approach to coaching. It is important for us all to realise that Guy in his capacity as Director of Coaching will be able to place a far greater emphasis on the implementation of Coaching Accreditation Programs than has previously been the case. To steal a well known phrase, "Why is this so?". Quite simply it is because most of his involvement and contact will be from the National Office where he is located. This will produce results in the Coaching Scheme, however it will take time. The early reaction to Guy's approach has been more than favorable and those with whom he has come into contact will attest to the change of direction that is taking place. Having said that we must not overlook the part that former National Coaching Directors have played in the development of the coaching scheme. We have as an Association been well served over many years in this area, we are now however at a time of change and slowly but surely we will see that change bring about variations in the coaching area that will reflect for years to come:

STATE COACHING DIRECTORS' ROLE

Those who are saying and there are some that the days of the State Coaching Directors being involved in actual coaching are well and truly numbered must look a little further than they are presently doing. The role of the State Coaching Director is one that initially is to ensure that his State's coaching commitments are being attended to. This involves a large degree of administration but it also ensures that zone and club coaches become active and remain active. Once this is being achieved then a large step has been taken. In addition the State Coaching Director will be called upon for coaching duties within their State where their very appointments is testimony to their ability to administer and coach in the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

CONSTITUTIONAL MEETING

State Presidents will be attending a working seminar in Melbourne on Monday October 27th to discuss and hopefully come to some agreement upon proposed changes to the ACTA Constitution. Prior to the workshop a draft of the proposed constitution is being made available for discussion at State level. It is advantageous for this procedure to apply for when the matter is placed before member clubs for a decision to be taken all known objections arising from State Associations will have been taken into account and problem areas hopefully solved.

WORLD SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS -- MOSCOW

A report from Team Manager, Robert Smith is contained elsewhere in the CTSN, while our particular discipline did not do as well as we would have wished for the dedication of each and every member of the team was a credit to them and Australia was well served by its sporting ambassadors. Congratulations to our pistol friends, Phil Adams and Lyn Marie Freh who each obtained one of the elusive but so important Olypmic Games Quotas. Our thanks to General Team Manager Peter Quire on behalf of all members of the Australian Shooting Team for a job well done.

Members of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club were shocked to learn of the sudden death on August 28th of Reg Bray.

Sixty-eight year old Reg had been a club member for many many years, although in recent years he only shot occasionally at club practices. During this time he formed some very special friendships and gained great respect from others because of his vast general knowledge especially in relation to trees, grass mowers, and also for the meticulous way in which he worked. Reg was not afraid to voice his opinions as he had some set ideas on how to handle machinery and look after other people's property.

He had a heart of gold and got tremendous pleasure from doing things for other people.

Reg, as so many of our visiting shooters would know had for the past five years been the person responsible for the magnificent appearance of our club grounds.

After Reg retired from the Rivers Trust about five years ago he volunteered to clean up the ground. What a marvellous job he did, turning it from a sadly neglected and overgrown area into what many believe would be the most tidy club grounds within Australia. The hundreds of laborious hours Reg spent at the club were all undertaken without ever being asked to do any of it. He loved the work and took great pride in how he had transformed the place. During the summer it was not unusual for Reg to be out mowing or watering the tracks at five in the morning and watering again until late at night just to keep the grass green and tidy for the shooters.

Reg's enthusiasm and dedication to the club was something which is seldom seen at clubs these days. He believed many shooters of today are not prepared to put back to the clubs in return for what they get out of it.

Reg will be enormously missed and long remembered at the Wangaratta Club.

Club members' deepest sympathy is extended to Mrs Bray and family.



PRELIMINARY ADVICE

OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS ADELAIDE 1991

(in conjunction with Oceania Championships)

The 1991 Oceania Championships will provide two Olympic Quota Positions for the region in both Trap and Skeet. In the Shotgun Section of the Championships Australia will be entering A and B Teams as well as Women and Junior Teams, all of whom will achieve a minimum qualifying score if scores are in excess of 182/200 trap and 184/200 skeet.

The methods of teams selection for A and B Teams as well as Women and Juniors will be:

A TEAM (Trap & Skeet) — First three from the 1990 Eliminations.
 B TEAM (Trap & Skeet) — Remaining three members of the National Training Squad.

WOMEN (Trap & Skeet) — Selected by the scores achieved over the first 200T of the 1991 Olympic Discipline National Championships plus 75T Oceania Badge Match.

JUNIOR (Trap & Skeet) — Selected by scores achieved over the first 200T of the Olympic Discipline National Championships plus 75T Oceania Badge Match.

NATIONAL & OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS PROGRAM

Sunday January 27: Oceania Badge Match 74T (Open)

Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday January 28, 29 & 30: Commonwealth Championships, Trap & Skeet, 200T plus Final.

Thursday January 31, Friday & Saturday February 1 & 2:
 National Championship/Oceania Trap & Skeet, 200T plus Final.
 Sunday February 3: Double Trap Championship, 150T plus Final.

NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD/1991 WORLD SHOTGUN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Australian open team representatives for the World Championships in November 1991 will be determined from members of the National Training Squad which will be decided upon from the results of the 400T of the National Olympic Discipline Championships in both Trap and Skeet.

Women and Junior Australian representatives will be the first three in order of scores recorded over the 400T of the National Olympic Discipline National Championships, providing that the minimum (ACTA) scores are achieved.

WOMEN: JUNIOR: TRAP 330/400 SKEET 330/400 TRAP 350/400 SKEET 350/400

In the event of minimum scores not being achieved, team selection will be by invitation.

BRUNEI GOLD

At the invitation of His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah of Brunei, an eight person Australian Clay Target Association Team left Melbourne on Saturday 21st July, bound for a two week trip to the South East Asian oil country and the 1990 MSB Shooting Championships.

The occasion was an International competition in Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet, being held in conjunction with His Royal Highness Prince Sufri's birthday celebration. Prince Sufri is the younger brother of His Excellency The Sultan of Brunei, and is a keen and competent clay target shooter, having represented Brunei in the recent Commonwealth Games in Auckland, New Zealand.

The invitation received was for a three person Olympic Trap team and a three person ISU Skeet team plus officials. The makeup of the team was — Olympic Trap: Bill Iles, John Maxwell, Filippo Petriella, ISU Skeet: David Cunningham, Michael Inguanti, John Summers.

Team officials were David Menck (Trap) and Ian Hale (Skeet), with David Menck assuming the role of overall team manager.

Before leaving Melbourne, the team was still very much in the dark as regards accommodation, details of the competition and travel arrangements, but as the day went on the trip certainly unfolded into the memorable and unique experience that it was to be

After eight hours in the air, the team arrived at Singapore's Changi Airport, where a short wait was scheduled before we could board a Royal Brunei Airlines flight for Brunei. It didn't take long to locate the New Zealand Team who were heading for Brunei on the same flight. The Kiwi team comprised three trap shooters Graham Ede, Graham Geater and Jamie Cane, and three skeeties Timmy Dodds, Robbie Tahau and Geoff Jukes. Team manager was Gavin Patton.

The two teams boarded the Royal Brunei flight which was running a little late, but were finally bound for Bandar Seri Begawan, capital of Negar Brunei Darussalam, arriving in Brunei a little after midnight local time.

After immigration and customs were cleared (the guns received plenty of attention before being taken by the army for safe keeping), the teams were loaded into a bus and taken to the Sheraton Utama Hotel, our home for the next ten days.

The first two days of our stay were set down for skeet practice and formalising of teams and individuals for the next week and a half of competition.

In all, over 50 competitors competed in the shooting championships, with eight countries (Australia, New Zealand, Brunei, Singapore, Sabah, Philippines, Malaysia and Thailand) represented. Many old friendships were renewed by those team members who had competed in the Asian countries before.

Tuesday morning, 24th July, saw the commencement of the ISU Skeet competition, but not before the official opening ceremony had taken place, and His Royal Highness had been presented to the team members and had fired the opening shot.

Conditions for the Championships were good, with reasonably hot humid weather continuing throughout. The Australian team members obviously enjoyed the conditions as they all started well and were in contention at the end of the first day.

David Cunningham and Michael Inguanti were sharing the lead after dropping only one target for the day. Local Samid and Vincent Teo were next on 73/75.

Day two of the skeet competition, and the final day of the team's match, saw the Australian trio of Cunningham, Inguanti and Summers well out in front in the team event on 216/225.

Cunningham and Inguanti again started well, both carding 25s, Cunningham however was again the better performer for the day, recording 73/75 to finish on 147/150, two targets ahead of Vincent Teo and Michael Inguanti on 145/150, with local Samid next on 144/150

The team match had become a battle for the minor placings. Australia's 430/450 was 20 targets ahead of New Zealand and Brunei who finished on 410/450. The silver in fact went to New

Zealand on a count back, with the Brunei A team, lead by His Royal Highness Prince Sufri, taking third.

The final 50 targets of the skeet and David Cunningham again performed well to record 48/50 and an overall total of 195/200, putting him into first spot in the final. Michael Inguanti also carded 48/50 to fill second spot in the final on 192/200, with Vincent Teo next on 191, Hj Mohd Samid on a personal best of 190, followed by Timmy Dodds on 186/200 and John Summers making up the six on 186/200.


Cunningham's consistency again showed through in the final, shooting 24/25 to take overall and the victor's spoils. The first place trophy incidentally had been made especially for His Royal Highness for the competition by Aspleys of London and was conservatively valued at Six Thousand Pounds Sterling, around \$13,500, not a bad trophy for a few days work.

Michael Inguanti also shot well in the final to score 24/25, but unfortunately local rules only allow one award per country, so second spot went to Vincent Teo on 214/225 with Timmy Dodds taking third with 212/225 after a countback from Samid.

In addition to the fine performances recorded by the individuals of the Australian team, Filippo Petriella and Ian Hale shot in the competition as "Mr X, fill in shooters". This is normal in international competitions where there are insufficient shooters to make up full squads of six. Ian shot extremely well to record 100 straight before withdrawing from the match, while Filip made up the numbers and got some experience.

Both shooters were presented with awards during the presentation ceremony in appreciation of their efforts.

With the Skeet Championship finalised, the next two days were set down for Olympic Trap practice, and the "trenchies" were all keyed up and ready to get stuck into the competition.

Again the early indication was that Bill, John and Filip were going to perform well and obviously liked the trap range, which had a beautiful background overlooking the South China Sea.

Again it appeared that the Aussies might be the ones to beat, certainly in the teams match.

The first day of the competition and the green and gold flag was looking good. Kiwi Jamie Cane shot consistently with 3 rounds of 24 for the day to finish on 72/75, only one target behind John Maxwell who finished with 25, 25 & 23 — 73/75, and Filipino Jamie Recio with 25, 23 & 25 — 73/75. Bill iles was also in there on 71/75, with New Zealander Graham Ede next on 68/75 and Filip Petriella also on 68/75. David Cunningham, fresh from a win in the Skeet Championship, was also shooting well as a "Mr X, fill up shooter", recording 67/75.

Day two of the trap and the Aussie team moved up a gear, recording 216/225 for the day to ensure first spot in the team event. Bill Iles shot a clean 25 and two 24s, Petriella recorded 25, 24 & 23, while Maxwell ended the day with 24, 23 & 24. John Maxwell still was in first spot, but after a good day had been joined in the lead by Bill also on 144/150. Jamie Recio and Filip Petriella were equal third on 139/150.

At the completion of the Olympic Trap teams match, Australia had in fact proved too strong, taking the gold by a margin of 23 targets.

New Zealand was again second and third spot was again filled by the Brunei A team.

With one day and 50 targets plus the final 25 to go, Maxwell and Iles appeared to have the gold between them. Again local rules dictated that only one medal would be awarded per country, so at the end of the day someone had to miss out.

John started well with a perfect 25/25, while Bill and Graham Ede of New Zealand both shot 24s. The second round saw Maxwell and Iles both falter a little to record 22s, while Leong Wei Heng of Malaysia carded 25, and Ede, Lai See Pan of Singapore and Petriella all scored 24s in their final round.

Going into the "final", John Maxwell was in top spot on 191/200, followed by Bill Iles on 190. Next was the Kiwi Ede on 186, Petriella on 185, and Jamie Recio of Philippines and Leon Wei Heng of Malaysia making up the six.

The "final 25" saw John Maxwell miss one early to record 24/25, while Bill shot a perfect 25/25 to tie the scores and take the overall trophy, again a \$13,500 gold trophy made especially for the occasion.

Presentations were made during the evening to the Olympic Trap team winners and the overall champions, while special presentations were made by the Team Managers to His Royal Highness Prince Sufri on the occasion of his birthday, and in appreciation of the hospitality and generosity shown to the visiting teams. David Menck presented His Royal Highness with a specially made map of Australia made from Australian cedar, and inlaid with a suitably engraved plaque and pewter ACTA National Championships medal.

Following the presentations came the moment all had been waiting for, the time for each visting team to get up on stage and present a "royal command performance." Bill Iles immediately took the microphone and apologised that he would not be able to sing as he was suffering from laryngitis. Bill also apologised for John Maxwell, saying that John couldn't sing anyway, but Bill added that our two stars — the guy in the skull cap (Ian Hale) and the Danny Devito look-alike (Michael Inguanti), would perform for the crowd. David Cunningham then took the initiative and led the boys in a special and unique performance of Waltzing Matilda. Definitely different!

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Alan,

Re: National Shooting Ground

The subject of a National Shooting Ground arises from time to time and I believe it is once again under consideration by the National Executive Members.

Whilst I agree in principle to having a National Ground I don't believe that it can ever be a viable proposition. Before any decision is made the following points must be addressed.

(a) Location

It is logical to site a National Ground in an area where there is ready access to the majority of shooters, i.e. Central-South New South Wales. The area required would be substantial if it is to accommodate twenty-five layouts; this being the number mooted.

Because of the nature of the venture it would need to be sited some distance from any town or city, but why twenty-five layouts is a mystery to me when currently with numbers of competitors falling it is possible to run a successful Nationals with less than half that number.

Does the Executive believe that numbers will double in the near future? I doubt if this will be the case.

(b) Viability

With a complex of such size and value it would be necessary to have not only the National Office on site — which in itself would create a logistical problem as I see it — but also to have a full time caretaker who would need to be housed on site.

The burning question is where does the money come from to not only establish and equip such a complex but to maintain it. How many shooters would use the facilities on weekdays? Very few if any as there is not the number of shooters in Central-South New South Wales to take advantage of facilities such as would be available.

The suggestion has been put that the complex obtain a licence and that the revenue from poker machines would meet the maintenance and running costs. Once again in these days of random breath testing etc. how many people are going to travel to a complex out of town to play the pokies when the same service is available within the town.

The success of the American situation is invariable quoted but we must remember that shooter numbers are much greater and that in America there is a significant number of professional shooters. There is no comparison at all to the local scene and those students who are adamant that we can utilise a National Ground on the same basis must be deluding themselves as they have not considered all aspects of the establishment and viability of such a complex.

The members of the Executive if giving serious thought to the proposal for a National Ground must do so with the cost to shooters in mind. Someone has to pay, in the long run it could well be the sport itself that pays as the development of clay target shooting in States other than where a National Ground is situated will be seriously affected.

Advice from the Australian Sports Commission contained the very welcome news that the Australian Clay Target Association has had grants totalling \$136,000 approved under the 1990/91 Sports Development Plan.

Included in the grant is an amount of \$50,000 being part of the \$75,000 grant approved for the conduct of the 1991 World Shotgun Championships in Perth during November of that year.

Additional grants have been approved in the areas of administration/coaching which included provision for the continuance of the annual seminars conducted by the National Coaching Council involving State Coaching Directors.

Attendances at the Institute of Sport has also been approved with assistance grants allocated for this purpose. This will enable the members of our National Training Squad to prepare for the all important forthcoming World Shotgun Championships.

The recognition given to the sport of clay target shooting by the Australian Sports Commission is very much appreciated and will assist the sports development in the years ahead.

COMPETITION AGES

From time to time we do receive enquiries as to what constitutes a veteran shooter as well as a junior shooter at ACTA level.

To shoot as a veteran, a shooter must have passed the age of 65 on the day of competition. Similarly a junior shooter must be under the age of 17 on the day of competition. It is worth remembering however that the junior age level is to be increased to 18 years as at January 1, 1991.

Shooters who have had 30 years of continuous registration with the ACTA and have passed the age of 60 years are entitled to a concession in the cost of their membership. THIS CONCESSION DOES NOT ENTITLE THE SHOOTER TO LAY CLAIM TO VETERAN STATUS.

Shooters who claim veteran status under the age of 65 or because of their long service concession are in conflict with the rules of the Association and competing for recognition in areas for which they are not entitled:

- Veterans over the age of 65 on the day of competition;
- Juniors under the age of 17 years on the day of competition.

Please make certain that when entering events at any level from Club to National Championships that your correct status as a member is recorded.

VALE GEORGE G. KIRKPATRICK

It is with deep regret that I have to advise the death of George G. Kirkpatrick of the Beaufort Gun Club. George had not been in good health for some time and passed away peacefully at home on 25th August.

George was a life member of the Beaufort Gun Club and his family kindly donated a perpetual shield (see September CTSN) to be competed for annually at the Beaufort Gun Club. George held most positions at the club during his long association with the sport. A farmer by occupation, George had a philosophical approach to life, he frequently entertained us with his stories and entered in competition to within a month of his passing. 

WORLD SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS MOSCOW 1990

Wednesday the 1st August had arrived. The Australian Shooting Team members, under the leadership of Peter Quire, met at both Melbourne and Sydney airports for the flight to Moscow to compete in the 45th World Shooting Championships.

The team consisted of 25 competitors which included our trap and skeet shooters of Brian Thomson and Alex Crikis (skeet), Michael Diamond and Craig Tilley (trap). Russel Mark (trap) had departed earlier to compete in England where he finished second in the Rolex British Grand Prix with a very good score of 191/200+25. Accompanying the team were officials and a support group which included Mal and Carol Tilley.

Our flight took us via Los Angeles where we missed our connecting flight to New York. On our arrival in New York some 23½ hours after leaving Sydney, and after a brief overnight stay we had three hours to see the sights of New York which the shotgun team members did by taxi, then onto Moscow.

On our arrival in Moscow and after clearing Customs we were met by our interpreter who then took us to accreditation then onto our hotel, which was one block away from Red Square, for our first Russian meal and a much appreciated rest as it was now Friday the 3rd August and late afternoon in Moscow some 52 hours since departing Sydney.

Saturday morning was taken up at the range, checking our guns and unpacking the ammunition which had been kindly donated by both Winchester and Scorpio, our thanks must go to both Bruce Burns and Sergio Zuffo for their generosity. The boys then had time to look over the layouts before we rturned to the hotel for lunch. The rest of the day was taken up resting or looking around Red Square etc.

Sunday and Monday saw our Trap and Skeet shooters participate in unofficial practice. All trained well considering they had only one day's rest after such a long flight.

By now all countries had arrived and official Skeet practice began on all four layours. Day one of training saw Alex shooting very well while Brian was still experimenting and adjusting to the range. On day two of practice Alex shot 49/50 with Brian shooting 69/75.

Friday 10th was the first day of competition. In very still and hot conditions shooting got underway at 10am, Brian got off to a disappointing start with a 21/25, he then followed it with an excellent 25/25 and finished the day with a 22/25 for a 68/75. Alex got off to a perfect start with 25/25 then followed it with a 23/25 and a 22/26 for a 70/75. Only five of the 97 Skeet shooters had shot 74/75.

On Saturday conditions were a little cooler. Alex was first up and shot 23/25, he followed this with a 21/25 while not feeling well then finished the day with 23/25 for a 67/75 (137/150). Brian also began

with a 23/25 and followed it with 22/25 then 23/25 for a 68/75 (136/150). At this stage the field was led with three shooters on 148/150 and three others on 147/150.


After the semi-finals and finals both Brian and Alex were able to shoot on to achieve their MQS for Barcelona 1992. Neither were successful — Alex finished on 182/200 and Brian 180/200.

The event was won by Anorea Benelli of Italy with 198/200+ followed by S. Puldon of Cuba 196+25 then T. Imnaishvili of the USSR 196+24+13. The ladies section was won by Svetlana Demina of the USSR with 195/200, a new world record.

Monday 13th saw the first Skeet Doubles event (for those interested see diagram and rules elsewhere). It was an event new to everybody but it was not long before some shooters were shooting 20/20. The event was won by Frank Nielsen of Denmark with 70/80+20 followed by V. Timokhin, USSR, 72/80+18 then B. Hochwald, GDR, 68/80+20. Ladies winner was Terry Bankey, USA, 67/80+16. Brian shot very well to finish in ninth place with 68/80. Alex enjoyed it immensely but just did not get into the swing of things for a 57/80.

It is now Tuesday and time for official practice for Trap. In overcast and wet conditions our shooters trained hard over the two days and after sorting out a few minor problems Michael and Craig, who had not been able to shoot for the last week along with Russell who had been training in England up to official practice, were looking forward to the match.

Competition began at 10am in very overcast conditions with occasional periods of rain. Michael was first up and began with a 24/25 followed by a 23/25 then 25/25 for a 72/75 to be in 24th position. Russell shot 23, 24, 23 for a 70/75. Craig was feeling the pressure of his first international match and finished the day on 67/75 after rounds of 23, 21, 23. At this stage six shooters had shot 75/76 with a further six on 74/75 and 73/75 out of a field of 102 shooters.

Day two began with a slight breeze and clear skies. Craig was first away and shot a 24/25, followed by a pair of 21/25s for 66/75 (133/150). Michael and Russell were both looking for good scores hoping to make the cut off. Russell began with a pair of 23/25s then 24/25 for 70/75 (140/150). Michael shot three lots of 23/25 for the day leaving him on 69/75 (141/150). The cut off point was 143/150. The field was led by Jorg Damme (GDR) and Manuel Silva (Portugal), the junior who Michael defeated to win last year's Junior World Championship, on 150/150 with Daniele Cioni of Italy on 149/150.

By now the Teams competition had been finalised with Italy the champions on 441/450, then Portugal 440/450 and the GDR 432/450. We finished in 16th place with 414/450 and all eyes were

on the leaders to see if they could shoot 200/200. We were fortunate enough to be able to witness a faultless performance by Jorg Damme (GDR) for a 200/200 just one target clear of Daniele Cioni, Italy 199/200.

It was now finals time and with Damme missing his 212th target and Cioni his 213th Jorg Damme became the new World Champion and record holder on 224/225, Daniele Cioni 223/225 second, with Marco Venturini (Italy) 221/225 third. Our three shooters were able to shoot on for their MQS for Barcelona. Russell and Michael both have a MQS but Craig was not able to achieve his and finished on 172/200. The ladies winner was Pia Baldisserri (Italy) 189/200.

It was time for the Double Trap event which was shot under the new rules, these are much fairer to all. As usual our shooters performed very well in this event finishing second for the third year in succession with a score of 358/450. France won with 364/450, Italy third 354/450:

Russell 126/150 and Michael 122/150 both made the cut, they both shot well in the semi-final — Russell 40/50, Michael 43/50 — this put them both into the final. Russell finished in fourth position 211/250, Michael 207/250. The event was won by Bret Erickson (USA) 221/250 with Kevin Gill (England) second 215/250, then Jean-Paul Gros (France) 214/250. Craig shot 110/150. The ladies winner was Satu Pusila (Finland) 162/200.

To Michael, Craig, Russell, Brian and Alex may I congratulate you on your performances. You all competed to the best of your ability and like you believe that if you were able to compete more often in harder matches your scores would increase and lift your scores those couple of targets required. You were all a credit to your country and Association, also Peter Quire thank you for your assistance and company — you were a pleasure to travel with.

I would also like to thank Barry and Trevor Cassey who packed some of our ammo in wooden boxes.

Thank you all for a very memorable World Championships.

COACHING CORNER

I was going to publish something about observation and problem-solving for coaches in this edition, but the opportunity has just come up to brief you on sports science, which you would probably find more interesting.

Two scientists in Queensland, with funds from the Australian Sports Commission, are conducting research on "The Perceptual-Motor Characteristics of Elite Performers in Aiming Sports". The "aiming sports" include billiards, snooker and clay target shooting. (I bet they meet some interesting subjects.)

The "perceptual-motor characteristics" relate to the body's response to the needs of seeing a target and engaging it. This involves not only the hand and eye, and the cunning bits in between, but also the movement of the torso. The scientific observations will, in addition, have the capacity to record the body's absorption of recoil.

The electronics being developed are a sensor for the trap arm, a microphone for the sound of the shot, and a sensor for a small muscle pad between the thumb and trigger finger of the rear hand. Early documents from Peter Quire indicated the scientists would also be using a "force platform" which would electronically measure the varying loads on the feet at different points in the technique. Data from these various sensors will need to be stored and integrated — probably to make corrections for sound travel in the air.

The studies will be conducted in three-dimensional video, using highly reflective marker tags on gun, shoulder, wrist, and possibly other parts of the body.

This research has the capacity to provide information on the human mechanics of shotgun shooting, with possible spin-offs for our development of skills. We will keep you briefed on this project.

On the subject of sports science, we are asking the Sports Commission to look further into the human mechanics of shooting and to keep an eye out for material on noise reduction. On the latter, we have found a couple of short articles on land use and the use of straw bales for noise reduction. We would be happy to send copies of this material to clubs in trouble with their neighbours, on request.

The Australian Sports Commission farms out a lot of research to tertiary students. If any reader has an idea for a sports science project, please drop a line to National Office.

RELEASE TRIGGERS

It has been brought to the attention of the Association that some shooters have been competing against the rules in relation to the use of release triggers. To make certain that no doubt exists as to the release trigger rule it is reproduced in its entirety with the added comment that a recommendation is before the National Executive Committee to vary the authority for the approval of release triggers from Referee Examiners to State Rules Supervisors.

Rule 4.11 (b)(i) ACTA shooters suffering from some condition which would make the use of a release trigger gun desirable shall obtain a statement signed by the President and Secretary of the shooter's home club, that the shooter suffers from such condition and shall present the statement to a Referee Examiner who shall satisfy himself that the shooter understands the use of a release trigger device.

Having been so satisfied the Referee Examiner shall forward the club statement to the ACTA Executive Director who shall keep the register of shooters authorised to use release trigger cuns.

(ii) No ACTA shooter other than those authorised in Trap Rules 4.11(b)(i) shall use a release trigger gun.

(iii) All release trigger guns used by ACTA shooters and overseas visitors shall be clearly labelled "CAUTION RELEASE TRIGGER" — in a conspicuous place near the breech. Such labelling to be consistent with 12mm width marking tape.

(iv) Release trigger guns shall not be left in gun racks or in positions where they can be mistakenly handled but shall be constantly under the control and supervision of the user.

(v) The user of a release trigger gun shall notify the Referee at each visit to the trap and skeet layout.



NEW DOUBLE TRAP RULES

Through their official publication, The U.I.T. Journal, the world body have advised that effective immediately new rules will apply to the third shotgun discipline, Double Trap.

Briefly, the format has been completely changed to make the discipline more equitable. Whereas before two traps (one fixed and one oscillating) were used, the format will now be that three

traps (all fixed) will be used. The traps will still be located in front of the number three shooting station.

Like Olympic Trap (Trench), a series of programs have been set so the targets thrown can be varied round to round or day to day. This will also ensure that the competition is equitable, and that all shooters receive the same targets throughout a round of 25 pairs, or the competition.

The tables shown below explain the new format.

SHOOTER'S CORNER ...

Q. In my recent travels I have noticed a large variation in the distance "Balltrap" targets are thrown. Club managements are quoting various sources of information for their actions, which have resulted in targets thrown from 60m to 75m and sometimes further.

Please provide resolution of the problem stating distance to be thrown and tolerance allowable.

There appears no confusion with respect to angles or height that targets are allowed to be thrown, nor with the grading procedure.

Mount Gambier Gun Club Inc.

A. Ball Trap

Rule 6.5 Target Distances, Angles and Elevations

The trap shall be adjusted so that in calm weather:

- (a) With a throwing elevation of 2 Metres at 10 Metres forward of the pit, a properly released target will cary 75 Metres (+ or - 5 metres) if measured over level ground.
- (b) The height of the targets' path above the level of the traphouse roof and 10 metres forward of the trap shall be at least 1 metre and not exceed 4 metres.
- (c) The targets shall be thrown within an area bounded by angles of not less than 30° nor more than 45° right and left of the imaginary centreline drawn through the centre of the traphouse and station 3. The horizontal angles will be measured from the front edge of the traphouse.

Important to note:

Shooting stations will be arranged on an arc measured and drawn 15 metres to the rear of the traphouse.

Only 28g cartridges may be used for ball trap, with No. 7 shot being the largest allowable.
