

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS-U.I.T. INSPECTION



Mr Gary Anderson, USA Executive Committee Member of the U.I.T. has been appointed as technical delegate for the World Shotgun Championships which are to be held at the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex, Perth, WA during November of 1991.

Mr Anderson who will be arriving in Australia in late November of this year to conduct his inspection of the grounds will during his visit be involved in coaching seminars that should be of undoubted interest to shooters as a whole.

As an indication of his proficiency in his chosen sport it is interesting to note that he has won twelve National Championships, seven World Championships, established six World Records, with gold medals at the 1964 and 1968 Olympic Games in 300-metre free rifle.

We are indeed fortunate to have the opportunity to learn from such a world class renowned shooter who is also widely recognised as an accomplished writer with his work accepted world-

As he is making his first visit to Australia it will be interesting to obtain his views on the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex of which we are in no doubt is in world class. We trust that his stay in Australia is enjoyable and that following his technical inspection of the shotgun ranges in Perth he also shares our view of it as a world class venue.

INTERNATIONAL RESULTS

Olympic Trap shooter Russell Mark has figured prominently in recent competitions shot in three different countries.

During August, Russell competed in the British Grand Prix which was shot in Wales attracting 192 competitors with 18 countries represented, finishing in second place with a score of 216/225, two targets behind the winner K. Gill (England) 218/225.

Again in August and following the World Championships in Moscow, Russell took part in the Grand Italia shot at Monte Catini. This event attracted 792 competitors from 28 countries and again Russell shot well to finish second with a score of 121/125 two targets behind the winner M. Tommassini (Italy) 123/125.

September produced the result that Russell was attempting to achieve as his score of 187/200, two targets ahead of Ireland's D. Evans, won for him the Cyprus Grand Prix in which there were 72 entries from 11 countries.

All in all Russell would be pleased with these excellent results which reinforce his position as one of the country's best competitors at Olympic Trap.

AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC COMMITTEE

The Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) is the body responsible for the participation of Australia's athletes at Olympic Games. The AOC is a member of the International Olympic Federation (IOC) as are approximately 160 countries or National Olympic Committees (NCO).

The AOC is comprised of members elected in accordance with the requirements of its Constitution with members elected for a 4-year term in keeping with the Olympic 4-year cycle.

Various Sub-Committees operate under the control of the AOC. These include:

- Planning & Review
 - Fund Raising
- Education
- Athletes
- Finance
- Apparel
- Medical

All of which are dedicated to the goals and ideals of the Olympic movement.

From an athlete's point of view probably the most important Committee within the AOC is Planning & Review. Under the chairmanship of AOC Vice-President John Coates this Committee determines the criteria for Olympic selection in the long term and in the short term is responsible for pre-Olympic funding for athletes who have met their strict criteria for the two years prior to the Games.

So far as the shooting sports are concerned, the Planning and Review Committee invite applications through the Australian Shooting Association (ASA) for funding for athletes who are capable of finishing in the first 16 places in the next Olympic Games.

With shooting considered by the AOC to be the one sport, the ASA through its Competitions Committee presents a combined submission to the AOC for the period of review. This submission is presented in person by the ASA Delegates to the AOC, President Dick Willis and Vice-President Alan Maher. Each shooting affiliate provides supporting documentation attesting to the performances of their respective athletes.

The procedure that has been adopted by the ASA for the two years prior to the Olympics ensures that those who had performed are recognised by the competition points that they have achieved in the two years prior to the Olympic Games in International Competition outside Australia. This procedure eliminates the possibility of persons being overlooked and again ensures that no one discipline or athlete is able to receive an advantage over the other.

While points are important they have no meaning whatsoever unless Olympic Quotas have been secured for the country and minimum qualifying scores have been achieved by the athlete.

Olympic Quotas are available at designated World Cups and World Championships and are won by the athlete for his/her country and not for his/her self.

Minimum qualifying scores (MQS) are also able to be achieved at designated competitions and as such are the first steps needed to be taken to obtain eligibility for nomination to the AOC for Olympic selection.

OLYMPIC GAMES SELECTION SYSTEM

The purpose of this system which is an agreed document between the Australian Shooting Association and the Australian Olympic Federation is designed to be both simple and fair, with the basic guidelines being Rule 29 of the Olympic Charter, which states:

"National Olympic Committees are reminded that, while the Olympic Games welcomes the youth of the world, it is physically impossible to accommodate all of the youth of the world and they are asked to use discretion and send to the Games only competitors adequately prepared for high level International Competitions."

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for consideration of recommendation by the ASA to the AOC an athlete must:

Shoot the appropriate Minimum Qualifying Score (MQS) at the appropriate International Competitions, and

- Score points under the ASA Ranking System as detailed in Appendix A (see below), and
- On the basis of performance in recent International Competition, be likely to finish highly placed in the next Olympic Games, and
- Demonstrate a satisfactory standard of physical fitness, which must be maintained,

ATHLETES

The basis of ASA recommendation to the AOC shall be that athletes will be recommended on the basis that:

- 1. They have met the athlete eligibility criteria, and
- 2. They are likely to finish in the top 18, and
- Australia has an Olympic Quota place or "Wild Card" in the event.

TEAM CHANGES

All athletes and officials should clearly understand that they are liable to have their membership of the Team terminated at any time by the AOC for breaches of the AOC's Doping Policy, the AOC's Competitor's and Official's Agreements, discipline or misbehaviour; illness, injury or other medical reasons; loss of form, team unsuitability or reassessment for any reason whatsoever.

Any such athlete or official may be replaced.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF TEAM

It is the sole perogative of the AOC to announce and make public the names of Athletes and Officials chosen under this system.

APPENDIX A — OLYMPIC SELECTION RANKING SYSTEM

(As mentioned above.)

- This system is based on points gained as a result of participation in Major World Championships, in the World Shotgun Championships, and in the World Cups of the UIT, with a competitor finishing in 1st to 16th place. First place 16 points, sixteenth place 1 point.
- 2. Major World Championships have a multiplying factor of 2.
- The qualification period covers the duration of the UIT competitions offering Quota places. However, it is expected that the period would be completed prior to the 31st December of the year preceding the Games.
- Points achieved as per 1 and 2 above will be aggregated across the three best results achieved in the period as defined in 3 above.
- A constantly upgraded Ranking List to be maintained and published by the ASA after each World Championship or World Cup in which ASA representatives participate.

The obtainment of a MQS and Australia having an Olympic Quota for any particular event does not in itself guarantee Olympic selection. This is determined by the AOC as a result of:

- 1. MQS being achieved.
- 2. Olympic Quota being available.
- 3. Points scored in World Cups/Championships by finishing from 1st to 16th place.
- 4. Athletes considered ability to finish in the first 16 at the Olympic Games

Providing that points 1, 2 and 3 can be demonstrated to the AOC, the ASA are able to nominate an athlete for consideration for Olympic selection. The final decision in this regard is taken by the AOC having considered point 4 and the finances available to the Australian Olympic Team as a whole.

This brief summary has been prepared by the ASA Delegates to the Australian Olympic Committee and is provided to enable members of ACTA and any other interested persons to understand and appreciate the difficulties that athletes from the shooting sports are faced with as they attempt to gain Olympic selection. We wish them well in this endeavour and assure them that as their sports representatives to the AOC we are at all times working on their behalf as individuals and for shooting on the whole.

U.I.T. WORLD CUPS 1991

Five World Cups have been set down for the 1991 year, all of which contain a Country Olympic Games Quota and the opportunity for competitors to achieve minimum qualifying scores (MSQ) in both Olympic Trap and Skéet.

l.	Egypt — Cairo	February 20-March 2
2.	Mexico - Mexico City	March 10-16
3.	USA - Los Angeles	March 17-24
	Italy — Lonato	
5.	Korea — Seoul	

A maximum of five competitors from any one country are allowed to be entered in each UIT World Cup. Three competitors competing in the World Cup for an Olympic Quota and minimum qualifying scores with an additional two competitors shooting to achieve their MSQ.

Australian participation in World Cup events is subject to the conditions set down by the ACTA so far as eligibility to compete is concerned.

If a person wishes to participate in any one or more of the designated UIT World Cups for 1991 they must first ensure their qualification to do so and having done that take the appropriate steps to obtain approval to compete at international level.

Once approval has been obtained the person(s) concerned is required within one (1) month from their return to Australia to submit to the National Office full details of scores and performances.

Please refer to the procedure for international competition which is published in this issue of the CTSN.

SOFT SHOT VERSUS HARD SHOT



Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of The Weekly Times, Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper, since 1977. The following article is reprinted by permission from that column.

Many factors affect the patterns thrown by shotguns, but one of the most important — and least considered — is the hardness of the

As we all know, a portion of each shot charge is deformed by the stresses of firing. The pellets at the rear end of the charge are crushed out of shape when the front ones press back on them during acceleration. At the same time, those around the outside of the charge are partly flattened against the bore, despite the intervening wad petals.

In the open air, the deformed pellets not only lose speed more rapidly than their rounder brethren but also fly wider, causing the charge to open up and spread. Therefore, because soft shot is more easily deformed than hard shot, it produces more scattering and longer shot strings - all else being equal.

This need not be a bad thing. Skeet shooters, for example, want a fast-spreading shot charge because their targets hurtle past at close range, either approaching, crossing or going away. But the same shot pattern would be useless to trap shooters, whose shots must be taken at longer ranges, always while the distance between muzzle and target is increasing.

In other words, beyond skeet distances, a skeet-class pattern becomes so thin that many targets can slip right through. Conversely, the patterns suited to trap shooting are no good for skeet: because they need more time to spread, they increase the chances of missing at short range.

Obviously one way to cope with these varying requirements is to select a different choke constriction. But changing the cartridge "recipe" will affect the pattern too, even though the choke remains the same. This can be done by switching to another brand of factory ammunition or by altering one or more components of a reloaded

Since shot hardness is one of the possible variables, how much effect can it have?

Lead shot is made from an alloy of lead, tin and antimony, the lastnamed being the ingredient with the most influence on the shot's hardness. Cheap, soft shot has about 0.5% antimony, while good quality hard shot, usually called "chilled" shot, has 2 to 3%. This difference alone is enough to cause as much as 10 or even 15% variation in the average pattern density.

So the lesson is obvious: the effects of hardness changes should be considered.

Shot plated with copper and especially nickel is reputed to give denser patterns. But the pellets chosen for plating are usually superior chilled shot and they are bound to shoot tighter when compared with softer black shot.

High-speed movies have shown that, after leaving the muzzle, a charge of unplated pellets tends to cling together in a mass for a slightly longer time than a charge of plated shot.

It seems friction and deformation within the unplated charge help to lock the pellets together. But the plated product, being more resistant to deformation and behaving as though it were more slippery (even though graphited black shot probably has greater lubricity), is able to separate sooner.

So the spreading effect of a greater number of deformed pellets is matched by an earlier break-up, and the result, all else being equal, should be similar pattern densities.

However, because plated pellets are lighter, size for size, they are rather more easily deflected by turbulence and wind. So it's not unknown for them to yield slightly looser patterns than the best chilled shot.

Their toughness has one practical advantage, albeit slight: it improves their penetration in game.

An easy way to test shot from different sources is to squeeze individual pellets with a pair of pliers. The pellets must be the same size, and placed in exactly the same position between the jaws of the pliers. The harder shot will offer more resistance. However, this method lacks precision.

Some manufacturers use a drop test. A single No. 6 pellet is measured from several different directions by micrometer, to find its shortest axis, and placed in a dimple on a polished steel plate with the shortest axis vertical. Then a flat-bottomed steel cylinder weighing EXACTLY two pounds is dropped on to the pellet from a height of EXACTLY 0.75 inch.

The deformed pellet is again measured, so that the amount of flattening can be converted to a percentage of the original measurement, This percentage is called the "crush value". Altogether, ten pellets from the same lot are tested and the results conform to tolerances set by the manufacturer.

A simple alternative, using a more manageable 8-ounce weight and a less critical height of 76mm to obtain comparable crush values, was described in detail by Ron Forsyth in the January 1989 edition of the Australian Shooters' Journal.

CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT PAST & PRESENT

By George Biggs A.C.T.A. Historian

During my forty-odd years career at trap and skeet shooting I have had the good fortune and pleasure to compete with most of our outstanding champions at clay target shooting, both trap and skeet. Men like Donald Mackintosh, Horrie James, "Calrossie". Fred Burns, Newton Thomas — were an example to me in my beginner days. Each of these champions had their own particular style — but basically they were spot-on at gun handling and gun pointing. These shooters were truly champions of our sport in past years.

One of our champions in more recent years is an old friend of mine, Bill Delaney. Bill was shooting the pants off everyone at skeet when I came into the sport after World War Two. It was Bill and myself who pushed ahead with the introduction of American Skeet at our National Championships for the first time in 1970 at Perth Gun Club.

The following story is from Bill's own pen and relates briefly some of his experiences over the years at clay target shooting.

W. W. (Bill) Delaney

I was introduced to clay target trap shooting at 10½ years and coached by Horrie James (Duxbac). Donald Mackintosh recognised my early skill and requested I sign and autograph his "Future Champions Book" which he kept in his Bourke Street Gun Shop. I would dearly love to know what happened to that book.

I first shot at Benleigh Gun Club (Centre Road, President Lou Bertram), with such shots as Calrossie and Donald Mackintosh. I shot in open competition — no grades — and on occasions beat Calrossie, James and W.G. Downie; two of them being more famous as live bird shooters.


At 13½ I took home the largest bag of trophies, at that time, from Bentleigh Gun Club — three first, one second, from a five event program. The other club then operating was Nobel Gun Club behind Nobel's Ammunition factory at Tottenham. My firearm was an improved cylinder side-by-side exposed hammer 12-bore designated "Dreadnought" by Alcock and Pearce — second hand and well used.

At 14½ years I won the Donald Mackintosh centennial Cup in open competition with runner-up George Townsend, of the Bentleigh Gun Club. Horrie James tried to slow me down as he considered I powdered the clays too close to traps but remember I was using a very open bore.

I assisted my father who was on the Committee of the A.C.P.S.A. (forerunner of the A.C.T.A.) to set up the Camberwell Gun Club (Bulleen) prior to World War II. I eased off shooting just prior to W.W.II as I had to concentrate on Architectural Course. The war years interrupted my shooting although I did gain respect for firearms and explosives and lectured after the war as a Reserve Engineer Officer (to C.M.F. lads).

I completed the architectural course, played golf and did not use a gun until July 1965 when an old shooting buddy, Des O'Callaghan, coaxed me out to Australia Gun Club.

I was introduced to skeet at that club and established the first 100 straight break (110 actually) in Australian Skeet history in 1967. I fought for and won permission to shoot as an Australian Olympic Standard Shooter in the 39th World Shooting Championships — Weisbaden 1966. After much opposition including the main body of the time I was granted permission from Dr E. Zimmerman, Secretary General Olympic Federation. I still have a movie of that event — taken by a German competitor where I appear in some frames.

I initiated and captained the first International Teams in Olympic Skeet and Trap to gain experience in international shooting by arrangement with the Singapore Govt. — Pesta Sukan Games. During the three attendances I captained, I scored gold, silver and bronze medals in Olympic Skeet. Others were won by Dr Carrol and one of my earlier pupils in Alex Crikis.

I am pleased to have been approached by shooters (in their early years) for coaching and count among my successes John Summers, Alex Crikis and latterly Lee Brownbill, who took out two Ladies' National Championships after only two years of coaching.

I was also instrumental in obtaining the financial grants from both the State and Federal Governments to stage the 1973 World Shooting Championships when W.A., who had applied for the event, were unable to finance the event and were about to hand the event back to the Federation. This would have made Australia the laughing stock of shooters world-wide. Melbourne Gun Club took up the challenge and I was responsible for ground layouts and club houses for both Melbourne Gun Club and the Sporting Shooters' Club.

The 1973 Championships were a complete success and I elected to be an Official Skeet Referee rather than be a competitor because of prior experience. Incidentally this was the first time in history that no complaints were forwarded by shooters.

My record for Annual Gold Badge-Aggregate for Skeet at Melbourne Gun Club still stands — three consecutive years with top score percentage for the year, around 96-97%.

I will be 70 this month and hope I am still able to contribute back to shooting for the joy and memories I have gained from the sport.

DONALD MACKINTOSH

Donald Mackintosh celebrates his 85th birthday with a straight 100 at Coburg Gun Club. The following story is from Jack McCraith who was Club President at the time. Jack also gives his personal opinion on a few of the past champions of our sport.

"Donald Mackintosh was invited to our Coburg Gun Club for his 85th birthday as our special guest, we contacted Victorrian Scottish Regiment and they agreed to send their full regiment out as Donald was a member. They arrived at the terminus in Sydney Road at where it is still today, you can imagine the interest it created. We had over 85 shooters and everyone formed two rows and they marched between us.

"Donald spoke over the address system and said he would shoot a score on the board of 100. In those days we had red washers for a hit, white ones for a lost bird. He shot the 100 straight.

"I was very young to see him shoot at Brighton Gun Club at live birds, I was taken there by my father. He was the best that I can remember, with the next best being Jack Sutherland (Calrossie), probably because there was shooting three days a week at live birds.

"At clay targets Fred Burns and Newton Thomas were the best Victorian shooters for quite some years in the major shoots.

"I was assistant to Stan Cole as a referee in the Olympic Games 1956 and without any question, to anyone who witnessed Bruino Rosini shooting would know his amazing ability which won him a medal. Before the Games started, some 12 years prior I shot live birds at Salamanka in the middle of Spain and Bruino Rosini won the main events, so for our boys from Australia to win they need to have full access to unlimited money to be full time at shooting, similar to full time golfers.'



OLYMPIC DISCIPLINES

1. NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD

A. Composition: OLYMPIC TRAP I.S.U. SKEET

- (i) A ten (10) member open squad shall be named for each discipline as a result of scores achieved at each years National Olympic Discipline Championships.
- (ii) Any member of the National Training Squad winning individual gold-silver-bronze at any full World Shooting Championships, Olympic or Commonwealth Games shall gain automatic entry into the following year's National Training Squad, being included in the order of qualification (if applicable) or as an additional member of the Squad providing that he/she has participated in the program that determines the composition of the National Training Squad.
- (iii) In addition to the open squads, two women and two juniors shall be added to each squad by
 - A. Scores achieved at each years National Olympic Discipline Championships. JUNIOR: MINIMUM STANDARD TO APPLY, TRAP 350/400, SKEET 350/400 WOMEN: MINIMUM STANDARD TO APPLY, TRAP 330/400, SKEET 330/400
 - B. When minimum standards are not achieved invitations to the NTS may be issued as a result of consultation betwen members of the National Shooting Committee on known abilities.

B. Funding:

- Funding when applicable will be to the top six (6) members of each squad with
 - (a) The remaining four (4) members of the open squad
 - (b) Two Women
 - (c) Two Juniors
 - Included at their own expense.

C. Squad Requirements

Members of the National Training Squad must be prepared to

- (a) Comply with all reasonable requests made of them.
- (b) Maintain reasonable fitness levels that may be determined from time to time.
- (c) Maintain reasonable levels of competition performance that may be determined from time to time.
- (d) Participate in specified scheduled competitions that may be reasonably determined from time to time.

D. Team Selection:

Australian Team Selection shall be determined from all members of the National Training Squad. (See 11, 1991 only).

E. Elimination:

- (i) Australian Team Selection shall be determined through the conduct of an elimination program(s).
- (ii) Participation in any scheduled elimination shall be at the expense of the competitor unless otherwise determined.
- (iii) All persons to commence the elimination program on an equal score basis.
- (iv) Where more than one elimination is conducted scores will be carried forward.
- (v) In the event of any persons not being able to provide an acceptable reason for non-attendance at any scheduled elimination then his/her position on the National Training Squad shall be forfeited with the position being offered to the next qualified person according to the scores (and conditions, women/junior) recorded from the Olympic Discipline National Championships from which the National Training Squad was determined.

F. Training:

(i) The A.C.T.A. will endeavour to obtain training camp

- facilities at the Australian Institute of Sport on an ongoing basis.
- (ii) Wherever possible a minimum of three months notice of approved training camps will be given to all members of the National Training Squad.
- (iii) All members of the National Training Squad including women and juniors are to attend all training programs unless an acceptable reason (E.D./Nat. Shooting Committee Chairman) is given at the time of notice of their inability to attend.
- (iv) In the event of any persons not being able to provide an acceptable reason for non-attendance at any scheduled training program then his/her position on the National Training Squad shall be forfeited with the position being offered to the next qualified person according to the scores (and conditions, women/junior) recorded from the Olympic Discipline National Championships from which the National Training Squad was determined.

G. Doping - Drugs:

All members are bound by the conditions governing the illegal use of substances in accordance with the regulations of the Australian Olympic Federation, Australian Commonwealth Games Association and the Australian Shooting Association.

2. INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

- A. Guidelines for International Team Selection shall include:
 - (1) Current Australian ranking
 - Current International ranking
 - (3) Past competitive performances at International level
 - (4) Considered future potential at International level
 - (5) Team compatibility
 - (6) General standing as an Ambassador for the sport.
- B. No member of the Association shall be eligible to compete in any international event without having recorded a score in competition equal to or better than the minimum performance score as may be determined from time totime, in the four years preceding the event in which they wish to compete. As at 1.1.90 Olympic Trap 182/200, I.S.U. Skeet 184/200.
- C. No member of the Association shall be eligible to compete in any international event where his/her attendance would be recognised as being a representative of Australia without having received the prior consent of the Association through the National Office.
- D. Any person who fails to gain or omits to apply for approval to compete internationally and competes in any international event where he/she is recognised as being representative of Australia shall be deemed to be ineligible for selection in any team or gain approval to compete internationally for a period of twelve months from the date of the event contested.
- E. Any person who having gained the approval of the Association competes in international competition shall within one month from their return to Australia submit to the National Office full details of his/her scores and performances.
- F. Persons qualifying for a position on any International Team must advise of their availability to take their place on the team within the prescribed period of time.
 - Once a date that allows reasonable time for acceptance to be given has expired, the position on the team will be offered to the next available qualified person.

3. INVITATIONS

Any person who may receive a personal invitation to train or compete outside of Australia may only do so with the consent of the Association if his/her training and or competition is recognised as being representative of Australia as against involvement on a personal basis.

4. COMPETITORS ACCEPTANCE

- A. Any person who as a result of the scores recorded by them are named as being a member of the National Training Squad, are to advise the National Office of their non acceptance of a position on the National Training Squad if they are not prepared to accept the conditions of the Association which have previously been advised to them either by mail or via the C.T.S.N.
- B. In the absence of any advice as in 4A all members of the National Training Squad have indicated their acceptance of the terms and conditions relating to the National Training Squad and International involvement under the auspices of the Australian Clay Target Association and the Australian Shooting Association.
- C. All team members must be prepared to sign a team members agreement and abide by the conditions therein.

5. JUSTIFICATION COMMITTEE

- A. Shooters selected to represent the Association by any method that may be determined by the National Executive Committee shall be subject to gaining approval from the Justification Committee.
- B. The National Shooting Committee shall act in an advisory capacity to the Justification Committee so far as selection for any international team is concerned.
- C. The National Management Committee of the day shall assume the role of a Justification Committee
- D. In the event of any person being declared ineligible by the Justification Committee for International Team selection the National Executive Committee of the day shall act as a Committee of appeal whose decision shall be final.

6. REVIEW

- A. The terms and conditions of membership of the National Training Squad together with accompanying conditions relating to the Olympic Disciplines shall be reviewed on an annual basis by the National Shooting Committee. Any variance to the existing conditions shall be determined by the National Executive Committee in accordance with 6B.
- B. The terms and conditions of membership of the National Training Squad together with accompanying conditions relating to the Olympic Disciplines shall be as agreed to by the National Executive Committee of the day.
- C. The terms and conditions of the National Training Squad together with accompanying conditions relating to Olympic Disciplines shall be published in the November issue of the C.T.S.N. for the ensuing year.
- D. The Executive Committee of the day shall be the sole arbitrator in any area of dispute.

7. TEAM FUNDING

- A. In keeping with the distribution of funds by the Australian Olympic Federation, Australian Sports Commission and Commonwealth Games Association participation in International competition shall at all times be subject to the availability of funds. In the event of funds not being made available for any or all members of a team, participation will be on the basis of self funding.
- B. Should any team member decline their position then a position will be made available to the next qualified person from the National Training Squad.

8. TEAM UNIFORMS

- A. Each person competing for the first time as a member of an official Australian Team shall receive the following items of team uniform.
 - (i) Australian Blazer Trousers/Skirt, Shirt, Tie.
 - (ii) Australian Shooting jacket and patch
- B. The replacement of items of team uniform for future occasions will be considered on merit.

9. ELIGIBLITY RULE

To be eligible for international competition under the jurisdiction of the Australian Shooting Association competitors

must be able to comply with the Eligibility Rules of the UIT and IOC as described in the UIT Eligibility Rules 1-10, effective as at July 19th 1988.

10. EXECUTIVE AUTHORITY

NOTE: In certain years it may be necessary to name teams without adopting the preferred elimination program which enables teams to be named as close as possible to the competition dates.

11. WOMEN AND JUNIORS 1991 ONLY

(i) Oceania Championships
 Teams selected over 275T (badge match & 200T championship)

(ii) World Shotgun Championships Teams selected over 400T of National Olympic Discipline Championships. (Subject to Minimum Scores; see 1 [iii]).

COACHING CORNER

Recently, a club coach from a country area expressed his concern to me that he had virtually no work to do. He asked what I could do to help, but there was little I could think of at the time. The problem has been nagging at me ever since.

More recently, a parent of a young shooter with potential in an Olympic discipline asked me for advice on bringing the young person up to international standard. The appropriate State Coaching Director and I have discussed the matter and the short answer is "coaching". Why was this not obvious to the parent?

Members of the public frequently phone National Office expressing an interest in taking up the sport and asking for the address of a nearby club where they can receive instruction or coaching. Often we are hard put to do other than to refer potential new members to the strongest (coach-equipped) clubs — which presumably have a lesser need for new members — when the rule of equity really requires us to provide a list of suitable clubs for the customer to investigate.

These episodes indicate that we possibly have supply and demand problems with coaches.

In May, the Australian Coaching Council informed us that we had 356 coaches — 292 at Level 1, 57 at Level 2 and 7 at Level 3. That is, one and a bit coaches per club and better than one coach per 30 shooters.

It is interesting to compare this with netball, a very well-developed Australian sport. This has 360,000 registered players and 2649 accredited coaches — 2577 at Level 1, 72 at Level 2 and NIL at Level 3. This works out at one accredited coach per 136 participants. A number of these Netball coaches are at the Australian Institute of Sport and at state-based sports institutes. By comparison with netball, we in Clay Target Shooting seem to have an extremely strong coaching base. If there are supply and demand problems, what are the reasons?

With the underemployed coach(es), knowledge and understanding are part of the problem. If shooters do not know that their club has a coach, they are unlikely to use him or her. If they think, or if any club coach thinks, that coaching begins and ends with initial firearms handling (after which the shooter is on his own), then they are wrong. Coaching is a continuing process, the objectives of which are improved performance and greater enjoyment of the sport. Len Cook, State Coaching Director of Victoria, makes this point in an upcoming article.

If shooters think the club or zone coach is a quiet old coot and a modest shooter who could not possibly help them, they should think again.

Any accredited coach has been formally instructed and tested in technical aspects of shooting, rules and etiquette, safety measures, basic psychology and methods of instruction. Above all, accredited coaches are volunteers who in many cases believe they can contribute more to the sport as coaches than as shooters. And they can.

If no one knows who or where the coaches are, then all of us in officialdom have a role to play in getting the information out. A lot of time and money has been invested in our coaching resource. The product is too valuable to leave on the shelf.

KNOW YOUR STATE COACHING DIRECTOR



Arthur Kenna

Arthur commenced clay target shooting in Winton in the early 1960s. He then moved to Townsville where he is a member to this day. Upon the coaching scheme being introduced in Queensland, he not long after commenced coaching himself. Arthur assisted Tom Comerford for a time and then was appointed Assistant State Coach in 1987-88, he was appointed State Coaching Director in 1988.

Arthur is still involved in the sport in a number of ways but states he finds the coaching position the most exciting.

The following piece of editorial Arthur supplied as an insight into his coaching role.

SHOOTING WITH GLASSES

Because of the importance glasses appear to play in the sport today I decided to raise the topic while conducting a zone coaching seminar at Dalby recently. This group consisted of shooters with a broad range of age and experience and they came up with some interesting ideas.

The first question I posed was why do shooters wear glasses?

Answers covered:

- 1) Necessity
- 2) Protection of eyes
- 3) Reduce glare
- 4) Enhance performance

Necessity-

A great number of sports competitors find that wearing glasses becomes a necessity.

Protection:-

This is an area where little importance is placed. It has become necessary to protect your eyes especially when shooting skeet, and the people who wear normal sun glasses for protection are just kidding themselves.

Reduce Glare:-

Some people find it necessary to wear glasses to reduce glare. By reducing glare you are also reducing tension on eye muscles, and others and avoiding the chance of headaches. I have found this necessary when competing at clubs like Mt Isa.

Enhancing Performance:-

A greater number of shooters are experimenting with coloured lenses to improve performance.

I found the article "Shooting and Lenses" in the February edition to be an excellent article particularly the following statements.

- a) "Use the lens to isolate the target from the background"
- b) "Unfortunately, everyone sees colours differently and their perception of any colour is different. Some trial and error is probably necessary to discover what lens colour is best for any individual shooter".
- "The most important thing is to use the lightest tint that you can possibly stand on the brightest day. There is a very logical reason for this. The more light to which your eye is exposed, the more your pupil will constrict. If your pupil is constricted, you will experience better focusing ability and superior depth perception. Therefore, you will be able to pick up the target more rapidly, focus on it more clearly, and shoot better as a result".

A publication that may assist you in choosing the correct lens colour is a book by Kodak called "Filters and Lens Attachments" — particularly the section on light and colour.

The group then raised a point that you never think of until it happens to you and that is the need to wear prescription glasses. This is a problem that a lot of coaches never encounter; therefore they do not understand the anguish that this person may go through. It is surprising the number of people who say to you "I didn't realise I needed glasses, I can now actually see the target and not a blur".

The first question this raises is: Who should test your eyes and prescribe your glasses? This is your choice and is usually one of the following.

- 1) Eye specialist
- 2) Optometrist specialising in sports glasses
- 3) Optometrist

Having your eyes tested is the easy part — now you have to select the type of lens and frames to suit your sport. The most important aspect of selecting your frames etc. is finding an optometrist who will listen to the requirements of your sport.

Some of these requirements are:

- 1) The actual positioning of the prescription within the lens.
- Comfortable bridge; so that they do not cause discomfort on your nose.
- 3) Thin frames, to give greater field of vision.
- Wings that will hold your glasses in place and not shift due to the effects of recoil.

There are a tremendous number of frame shapes, different bridge shapes and types of wings. If you have never had to select a pair of glasses for yourself my advice to you is consult with people who have encountered this problem for advice.

With the high cost of glasses remember: investigate the type of glasses you require and find an accommodating optometrist who will assist you. If you require a coloured tint remember to keep it light. My personal feeling is that because the selection on colour depends on the individual person's eyesight, different backgrounds, colour of targets, this could require a shooter to carry a great number of coloured lenses. Clear lenses would be my own preference.

The Gold Coast Clay Target Club is on the move again, after several years of marking time. The layout at Rifle Range Road, Pimpama was set up in 1976 but alas, progress has caught up with our venue. The move to Gross Road, WOONGOOLBA, our second since the early seventies, is set down for November 1990. Watch the Queensland Program section of future CTSNs for programs and our "Giant Opening Shoot" in January 1991. Set some holidays aside for two and a half days' shooting on Friday, Saturday and Sunday 18-20 January 1991.

At the time of reading this article the grass will be sprouting up everywhere on the new grounds and the committee will be doing everything in its power to assist.

The new club boasts a four-trap layout for DTL shooting superimposed with two skeet layouts (one capable of ISU) and provision for a future ball trap. The shooting will be **great** as this is a return to **flat grounds** not experienced since the original club was located at the old Igloo on the Southport Racecourse.

The background is superb however the selection of target colours will depend on testing of various targets under differing light conditions.

WOMENS' TALK





OUT OF THE PAST

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The 1970 National Championships conducted at the Perth Gun Club, WA over six successive days of Saturday February 28 through to March 5.

The Champion of Champions Cup shot 50 targets from 20 yards saw Doug Smith of Brisbane victorious with 115/115. The Double Barrel Championship went to Jim Ellis of NSW with 370/370, John Harris of Cunderdin, WA pushed him all the way and managed second place with 369/370. Jim Ellis also took the Single Barrel honours with the only possible of 50/50 off 16 yards. The Double Rise Championship was won by Ipswich (Qld) shooter N. Johnston with 48/50. The Australia-New Zealand Trap Championship with a score of 180/180 was taken out by Newtom Thomas (Vic.). Newton also won the National Skeet Championship, the first to be shot for, with 60/61.

It was this year that the 24th International Teams Match for the Mackintosh Trophy was conducted, the final section of this prized event was conducted at Warwick, England on July 18, after all contesting countries had lodged their sealed scores by mail. In attendance representing Australia was Perth Gun Club Immediate Past President Jules Steiner, who for 1970, was an Honorary Vice President of the Australian Clay Target Association. The results showed the New Zealand team win with a score of 7304/7500, Australia could only manage third place on this occasion with a score of 7213/7500. Australia had won this prestige event nine times in the 12 years to 1969 and although varying methods of scoring have been used, the 1969 Australian figure of 7414/7500 points for this 30-member team event was a huge 201 points up on this year's score.

TEN YEARS AGO

For many years, the "unsung heroes" of the ACTA have continued to work at developing the sport, without receiving very much more than criticism. The National Executive is concerned at the lack of awareness on the part of the general membership, as to the vital nature of the role played by the special people. Consequently, at its last meeting, the Committee authorised the core group to prepare a format for the introduction of an award to be known as the Presidential Medal. In an effort to guarantee the integrity of the award, as the highest possible commendation in clay target shooting, the assessment of applications will be extremely thorough and detailed. The Association's intention is to announce the first winner/s at their meeting in September.

One of the proudest moments in the life of clay target shooting's Director of Coaching, Newton Thomas, occurred on Australia Day, January 26, 1980, when he was awarded the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) in the Australia Day Honours List. The citation read "Jenkin Newton Thomas has been awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia for his services to clay target shooting".

To say that clay target shooting is a way of life to the Mules family would be an understatement. At the 1980 South Australian State Carnival Bob Mules captured the State Double Barrel Championship some 40 years after he won his first State title. He then had the pleasure of watching his son Phil Mules win the State Single Barrel Championship and his grandson Andrew Mules win the Junior title in both the Double and Single Barrel Championships.

The 1980 National Championships saw Russell Mark at the age of 16 win the blue ribbon event—the Australian Double Barrel Championship with a score of 349/349. Russell was pushed by Doug Smith who went on to win the National Champion of Champions Cup with 205/205. Lyn Curtis (Bairnsdale) made his first appearance at a Nationals Series and finished victorius in the Grand Australian Handicap with 74/74. George Biggs, celebrating his birthday, gave himself a present as the Overall winner in the 11th Australian Skeet Title shooting 62/62. All the way from the US of A came Leo Harrison who showed his fine shooting style by capturing both the Overall High Gun (480/500) and the Trap High Gun (432/450).

BUNDABERG GUN CLUB INC.

Bundaberg Gun Club held its Annual Two Day shooting carnival on Saturday and Sunday last with a good roll-up of shooters from as far away as Mt. Isa in the north and from Tyrendarra in Victoria in the south.

Shooting commenced at 1.00pm with five possibles shot in the first event. In the second another five possibles were shot in the **ALAN POWELL FORD** double barrel event, J. 




Shooters travelled long distances to compete, from all over NSW, Victoria and Queensland, and regular New Zealand visitors to Australia, Ted and Van McRae.

Next year Skeet shooters will travel to Tamworth for the Carnival, Trap shooters will journey to Wagga for the State Carnival.







VALE ERIC TROY

His many shooting friends and acquaintances will be saddened to know that Bathurst Gun Club member Eric Troy, died at his home in Bathurst, NSW on April 7, 1990, five days after his 84th birthday. A keen skeet shooter he shot his last round a month before his death.

In his younger days Eric was a competition athlete, footballer, swimmer and tennis player and he always enjoyed bush shooting and hunting having been taught as a child by his grandfather Troy on the family property at Mittagong, NSW.

Eric Troy was a skilled and willing teacher in the use of firearms and has left a great legacy in the many shooters he introduced to the sport and instructed and coached. He is survived by his wife, Shirley (secretary of Bathurst Gun Club), sons Warwick and Graham, daughters Jakelin and Martine and their families.

The Bathurst Gun Club will be holding a memorial shoot for Eric in 1991 on a date to be announced.




