


EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS NOTES

Welcome to 1991 which shows all the promise of being an exciting year for shotgun shooters in Australia particularly for those who intend on being in Perth for both the National Trap Championships and the World Shotgun Championships.

UIT TECHNICAL INSPECTION

For some time now we have been talking about "next years" World Championships. That is all behind us now as "This is the year". As a sign of the increase in commitment for the UIT Championships we were visited in November by Mr Gary Anderson, a member of the UIT Executive Committee and the appointed Technical Delegate for the titles.

While we in Australia have always considered the WA Shooting Complex to be of world class standard it was very pleasing to have this confirmed by Gary Anderson who as well as expressing his delight with the complex found the grounds to be fully in keeping with the exacting requirements of the UIT.



During his stay in WA, Gary met with the Organising Committee for the World Championships and at the conclusion of his meeting congratulated the Committee on the preparations that had been undertaken to ensure the success of the UIT Championships.

SEMINARS

Shooters from three States attended seminars conducted by Gary Anderson. In Western Australia approximately 120 people attended the seminar at the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex. Gary, who has two Olympic Gold Medals to his name in Rifle Shooting as well as a string of world records, conducted what was described by those who attended as the most informative seminar that they had been involved with.

These comments were reinforced by those who attended the seminars conducted by SA and Victoria. In SA the seminar was arranged by the SA Shooting Association and was conducted at the SA Institute of Sport while in Victoria the arrangements for the seminar were made by the Victorian Smallbore and Air Rifle Association. Possibly the disappointment of the seminars in SA and Victoria were the noticeable lack of attendance from clay target shooters. Certainly clay target is a different discipline from rifle, however the training methods that relate to producing champions do not vary very much at all and in this regard an opportunity has been lost.

AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC COMMITTEE

As ASA delegates, Dick Willis ASA President and I met with the Australian Olympic Committee to seek funds for the Australian shooters from each of four disciplines to attend world cups during 1991. Our participation in world cup events is of extreme importance as it is at these events that countries compete for the elusive Quota places for Olympic Games competition.

Australia is able to compete for Quota places at the Oceania Championships however as the championships are restricted to the Oceania region the results are not taken into serious consideration by the AOC.

Funding has been obtained for eleven shooters to compete for Olympic Quota's in the 1991 year.

We wish them well in their efforts to obtain Quota's for Australia.

Funding from the AOC differs greatly now from what has been the case in recent years when funding was controlled by the Australian Sports Commission. The procedure that now applies is such that the ASC funds the AOC who in turn fund specific individuals and does not allow the funds to be shared for the benefit of an overall team. This situation is full of disadvantages so far as team composition is concerned. As an Olympic Sport we now must look seriously at revising our Team Selection Program from one that is governed by eliminations to one of straight out selection. A system along this line would no doubt have its opponents, however in the best interests of the sport it appears to be the only way to go.

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION

The Annual Meeting of the ASA took place in early December. Being an election meeting the following positions were confirmed.

President: Alistair MacPherson (NRA). Vice President: Alan Maher (ACTA). Management: David MacFarlane (ASARA), Don McCulloch (APSUA), Monty Fox (SSAA). AOC: Alan Maher (ACTA), David MacFarlane (ASARA). ACGA: Alistair MacPherson (NRA), Peter Anderson (APSUA). UIT: Alan Maher (ACTA), Tibor Gonczol (APSUA).

Matters arising from the AGM included arrangements for the Oceania Championships and the opportunity to obtain Olympic Quota's. In addition the role of the Australian Olympic Committee in relation to funding for international competition was discussed at length.

NATIONAL OFFICE

As you may recall the Association established a debenture program in late 1989 for the purpose of establishing a National Office following the sale of the property which had previously been occupied in Blackburn. A total of 29 debentures were issued, each for \$1000 which were to be held for a period of 10 years.

I am pleased to be able to advise that these debentures have been called in by the Association with all monies plus interest repaid as at 1-12-90.

On behalf of all members we thank those whose interest in the Association and its wellbeing enabled the National Office at Mt Waverley to be established.

Later this month ISU shooters will be travelling to Adelaide for the OD Nationals and for the members of the National Training Squad, the Oceanic Championships will also be contested. The OD Nationals are all important so far as the World Championships are con-



The Kromson equipment that has been supplied and installed by Olimpyc Targets will be tested prior to the Oceanic Championships at a competition scheduled for January 5 and 6.



1991 REGISTRATION CARD

A quick glance at your 1991 registration card will show that some changes have been made to the written content. This has come about as a direct result of some amendments that have been made to the rules, in particular under Trap Common Mark Shooting:

- (3) Which advises that once attaining B grade a shooter can not be reclassified as C grade without receiving approval from the State Handicapper.
- (6) Any C grade shooter having recorded a 50t break from the common mark shall be regraded to B grade.

In addition Rule 2.7(a)&(b) is now included on the card, as is an area which must be completed by a Rule Supervisor in relation to the use of release triggers. With regard to Juniors please note the increase in the junior age from 17 to 18 years.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir.

Viewers of the ABC National TV programme, 7.30 Report, Friday 13th July were treated to a vile and biased attack upon clay target shooting and shooting sports in general. This was obviously orchestrated with the full support of the anti-shooting fraternity from within the ABC.

A distorted version of the Victorian High Schools Students firearms safety training programme was presented to viewers and no doubt went over well to some members of the public with no knowledge of shooting sports. This programme was presented with the apparent co-operation and support of a group which calls itself "Gun Control Australia". Publicity was given to this group's campaign of anti-shooting in schools and the awarding of prizes to kindergarten children for paintings depicting "the cruel shooter and poor animal trash". (Get them young enough and you can teach them anything - quotation by either Hitler or Stalin I believe.)

This programme was obviously concocted out of opposition to the Students firearms safety training programme which has been given publicity in the ACTA News. Reference was made to cooperation of "gun clubs" giving the free use of their facilities as being something evil and of the brainwashing of students into becoming future members. Compare this with their previously mentioned efforts with kindergarten children.

Film footage was shown of students handling firearms at a Victorian gun club, in particular of a young lad who also featured in "Countrywide" approx. one week later. The inference in this programme being that country children are much more likely to commit suicide because of their contact with guns. I wonder how the students who undertook the training programme feel?

As the term "gun club" and "guns" was mentioned on a number of occasions I feel that this matter concerns all members of the ACTA, yet I am amazed that no mention has been made in the "News" by Members, Management or Executive Committee. The matter has been reported in both the SSAA Journal and the Field And Game News. It appears that any shooter who values his sport must be a member of these two organisations.

The highlight of the 7.30 Report programme was a display by a bearded, old ham actor, who I believe to be an active supporter of "Gun Control Australia". This gentleman came forth with a display of crocodile tears that would put Johnny Ray to shame. He became so upset while telling the viewers of an incident in which a shooter, also a member of a gun club, shot and killed a young girl who was out boating on a lake. No further details supplied.

It is obvious that the enemy is well entrenched within the ABC and pushing their distorted views at public expense (ours). I feel that these incidents should be of great concern to all members of the ACTA and other shooting organisations.

ATTENTION ALL CLUBS

This letter is being written with the intention of alerting all gun clubs and others that may find themselves involved in a situation that the Echuca Gun Club experienced and which could become quite expensive.

In December 1989 a committee member of this club was approached by officials of a prominent VFL club (now AFL) based in Melbourne with a request to entertain officials and team members to breakfast and as well introduce them to clay target shooting.

This was organised for the 11th January 1990 when some eighty (80) members of this particular football club arrived for breakfast and afterwards clay target shooting.

The Echuca Gun Club supplied food, cartridges, clay targets and trappers, club members time (12) for cooking, coaching etc. was naturally given free, nett cost to our club was \$507.

Since then we have submitted 3 defailed invoices, written several letters, with copies to the President of the club as well as to the coach who did the organising.

We have also made two personal telephone calls to this person as well as two other calls to the accounts section but in spite of promises made we still have not been paid, neither have we had the courtesy of a reply to our letters.

So unless some good hearted solicitor within our ranks will take up our cause, it looks certain that we will never get our money as the cost of legal action would possibly outweight any return we may get, and without doubt the club involved would be aware of this situation.

We have had our fingers burnt so in future football clubs are out, so Presidents and Secretaries you have been warned and if this article prevents other clubs from falling for the same gimmick then at least some good would have come out of it.

SACTA has just completed the ISU Trench and Skeet Carnival held over the October long weekend at the State Shooting Park with host club, International Gun Club. With only 3 weeks to go before the carnival was due to commence and only one trench layout completed, much feverish activity took place and Graham would like to thank the State Government contractors, who, with the help of Metro Martini and members of the International Gun Club, completed the fitting of new traps to the second trench layout and completed of the skeet layouts.

Fifty-four shooters from as far afield as Darwin, Sydney and Melbourne joined us in the competition and it was a treat for the locals to see competitors such as the calibre of John Maxwell, Bill Iles, Russell Mark, Michael Diamond, Ian Hale and Brian Thomson shooting at their best.

Festivities began on the Friday night before the shoot with 22 shooters and their families dining out at the local motel.



THE MASTER EYE

Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of *The Weekly Times*, Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper, since 1977. The following amalgamation of two articles is reprinted by permission from that column.

Reduced to the simplest possible terms, shotgunning consists of tracking a moving object with the eyes while pointing with the leading hand and the barrel.

Our focus must always be on the target: we have to keep both eyes open and concentrate on seeing it as soon as possible. (In trap shooting, this may mean a short distance beyond the trap house, rather than the instant it appears above the trap house edge, but the underlying principle still holds true.) Above all, we mustn't allow our attention to wander from the target to the gun.

An experienced shotgunner can get to the stage of being unaware of the barrel, especially when a quick, instinctive reaction is called for. As a general rule, however, the barrel will be included in the sight picture in a fuzzy sort of way.

The key to success is to ensure that the gun always points where we want it to. For this to be possible, we must know how to mount and hold the gun correctly, with our master eye directly in line with the barrel (or, in the case of side-by-sides, the rib between the barrels).

The master eye dominates what we see and influences what we do. If it is off to one side, the shot will also go to that side. Consequently, we can't shoot well with a conventional stock unless the master eye is on the same side as the gun — right master eye, gun at right shoulder; left master eye, gun at left shoulder.

There are at least half a dozen ways to determine which eye is dominant, but they are nothing more than variations on the same couple of themes. The following method is as good as any:

Tear a hole, about the size of a 5-cent coin, in a smallish piece of paper. Holding the paper at arm's length, look through the hole at a small object a couple of metres away. Both eyes shold be open.

Then, still with both eyes open, bring the paper right back to your face while keeping the object centred in the hole. The hole will automatically come up to your master eye.

In most right-handed people, the right eye is the master eye. Similarly, the left eye is dominant in most left-handed people. However, a small percentage of the population combines right-handedness with a left master eye, or vice versa. We also have a few who have no rigid pattern of eye dominance, rather like people who are ambidextrous; we will return to their particular problem later.

Some of these variations stem from a deterioration of the sight in one eye, brought about by accident, disease, congenital defects or age. The rest have no detectable physical cause, and are thought to be the result of childhood learning.

Interestingly, and significantly, a person can go for years with a definite master eye, then find that the other one has either taken over or is in the process of doing so. The possibility of such a reversal should always be considered if an inexplicable loss of form occurs.

If poor shooting can be traced to a master eye problem — which means, in effect, that the gun is on the wrong shoulder — What can be done about it? There are a number of solutions.

One is to shoot from the other shoulder. Making the switch can be very difficult, especially when the shooter has years of shotgunning experience. Initially the stance and hold feel completely wrong, and timing goes out the window.

Gun fit plays a part, of course. Some stocks have no cast, twist (toe out) or cheekpiece, so they can be fired equally well from either side. Others are made for one side only, and must be altered or replaced before the change to the other shoulder can be accomplished.

Once the fit has been adjusted, the difficulty becomes more psychological than physical; if a shooter really wants to make the switch, he or she usually succeeds in time. I know several who have done it.

The second solution is a cross-eyed stock, a strange-looking affair which comes off the customary shoulder, bends sideways in the vicinity of the grip and puts the rib in front of the opposite eye. It removes the need to change shoulders but is hard on the wallet.

Lastly, we can force the weaker eye to take over. This will allow us to use the same shoulder AND the same gun.

Keeping the master eye closed will do it. So will a blocking device such as cardboard taped over one side of our shooting glasses. But the consequent loss of depth perception is a definite disadvantage.

English coaches talk about "dimming" the master eye — in other words, leaving it open until the last moment, then closing it enough to transfer control to the weaker eye. The timing and the extent of the closure depend on the individual. Having tried this technique, I must concede that it's easier said than done — though I did complicate the experiment by shooting from the opposite shoulder in order to put my weak eye behind the rib, and thus failed to do anything well.

Be that as it may, dimming is both the cheapest and potentially the simplest remedy for a master eye problem. Therefore many believe it should be given a decent trial before other solutions are sought.

There is a fourth approach. On its own, it won't provide a cure for people whose master eye is definitely on the wrong side. However, it may help those who are "dual eyed" (i.e. the ones with no rigid pattern of eye dominance) and probably could serve as an adjunct to the dimming technique.

The idea is to increase the subconscious impact of the outline of the top of the gun, so that the eye behind the barrel is forced to play the dominant role.

With under-overs, pumps and autos, the side of the gun bulks larger in the field of view than the top, because the top is narrower. A person with normal eye dominance shooting from the correct shoulder is not aware of this, but the effect on a dual-eyed person is to "attract" the wrong eye and make it dominant — or so the theory goes.

To counteract this, a highly visible, non-glaring rib is required. There is much disagreement on what sort of rib serves best, but the so-called "channel top" type is worth considering. This has a depressed centre section flanked by slightly raised edges, often with different surface treatments. Switching to a wider rib may also help

He advises:

TRAP SHOOTING — STANCE AND AIMING

One of the most important aspects in shotgun shooting is to have a simple basic stance which has the shooter balanced both before and after firing one or more shots.

A shooter's stance should be comfortable and natural to him/her so that it can be consistently adapted.

Exaggerated or varying stances put stress on the shooter which leads to fatigue and imbalance resulting in inconsistency, particularly in trap shooting where target angles are varied and acute both to the left and right.

A shooter can easily adapt a correct stance which will be consistent if he practises the following points:

Facing your target area stand with your feet apart far enough to give your body a natural balanced feeling (persons of average height 8" to 10"). If right-handed have your left foot slightly forward of the right. Right foot slightly forward if left-handed.

Feet too close together will make the shooter top heavy and feet too far apart will restrict the body swing to either side.

Bend the forward knee fractionally and bring approximately two-thirds of your weight onto the front foot. This keeps your weight forward and allows a much more freer swing to right or left than would be attained with a locked front knee.

Lean slightly forward from the hips. This assists the body to absorb the gun recoil and allows for a better pivot. Hips should never be forward of the shoulders, which is a common fault with new shooters.

To provide a stable base from which the shooter can swing, footwear should be comfortable and have a wide sole area.

In trap shooting because targets are shot from five different tracks varying in angle from the centre of the trap house and also because targets are thrown at different angles from the oscillating trap, correct foot positioning is essential to make the shooting of extreme angle targets easier.

Correct foot positioning on each track can be adapted if the shooter places his/her feet, using the correct stance, as if he/she were to fire a shot at the fixed 50-metre peg behind the trap house, in line with track number 3. A check on foot-position is when the shooter raises the gun to his/her shoulder in a natural position, it should be pointing approximately at the 50-metre peg.

In addition to the shooter adapting the correct stance and feet

position, to further assist him/her with the angling targets, on the call of pull, points of aim relative to the particular track and the trap house should be used.

Points of aim should be slightly below the leading edge of the trap house so that the instant the target appears the shooter can immediately identify the target's line of flight.

Point of aim over the trap house will cause the shooter to jump into the target more than follow its line of flight.

- From Track One Point of aim should be the top left hand corner to cater for left swinging targets.
- From Track Two Between the left hand corner and the centre of the leading edge.
- From Track Three Centre of the leading edge.
- From Track Four Between centre and top right hand corner of leading edge.
- From Track Five Top right hand corner to cater for right swinging targets.

These points of aim, together with the correct foot positioning, give the shooter a distinct advantage when faced with acute angled targets.

All the above points should be adopted and practised not only by novice shooters, but also experienced shooters who may find that attention to certain detail will improve shooting performance at a particular target.

WARATAH STATE NOTES PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1990

I realised that I would have a very hard act to follow when I was elected as successor to Robbie Smith, at the end of his three-year term.

The support from the members of the state executive, particularly the Vice-Presidents Robbie Smith and Pud Burgess, has been invaluable to me.

SKEET NATIONALS

The first major competition to be held under my presidency was the Skeet Nationals at Wagga in November 1989.

These nationals ran very smoothly, a tribute to the organisation of Robbie Smith and his team working in conjunction with the Wagga Gun Club.

During the championships a serious accident occurred when Adrian Cousens, a well-known skeet shooter, was hit by a trap arm while adjusting a skeet trap. Thankfully Adrian has now fully recovered.

The ACTA acted quickly after this accident and introduced compulsory installation of trap arm guards to avoid any reoccurence of this type of incident.

The NSWCTA has been advocating the use of arm guards for quite a while.

STATE CARNIVALS

1990 was the first year of a four-year period during which the state and skeet carnivals will alternate between Tamworth and Wagga Gun Clubs.

The Skeet Championships were held at Wagga. Members were down slightly on 1989 possibly due to the economic situation and the difficulty of getting to Wagga due to the flooding throughout NSW.

The carnival was a success for the competitors who enjoyed keen competition. The NSW shoulder to shoulder team selected here won this event at the Townsville Nationals in September.

The State Trap Carnival was held at Tamworth on the October long weekend. The carnival was one of the most successful of recent years. Congratulations to Tamworth Gun Club on its preparation of the grounds — they gave us a lesson in how to do it properly.
