If early signs are any indication the April National Trap Championships will be an enjoyable competition for those who decide to take the opportunity to go and see for themselves what a magnificent shooting ground exists at Whiteman Park. Trap Nationals Tournament Director Terry Moroney has together with the WACTA certainly led the way so far as the promotional pages in last month's CTSN are concerned. With the advantage of better priced airfares the skies to Perth will no doubt be full of shooters eager to shoot the Nationals on the grounds chosen by the UIT for the World Shooting Championships in November, an event not to be missed.

TRAP NATIONALS

Commence on Saturday 6th April with the traditional Grand Australian Handicap followed on Sunday by the National Double Championship which for 1991 is a 100T event over the 10 trap grounds at Whiteman Park. An interesting and welcome addition to the trap program is a Shoulder to Shoulder match for ladies and juniors which will be shot on the morning of April 7th, Single Barrel day. Good luck to those whose shooting skills have gained for their state selection for the Shoulder to Shoulder match.

SKEET NATIONALS

Unfortunately at the time of writing I am unable to confirm a date or venue for the National Skeet Championships, hopefully next month's CTSN will carry the news of when and where the 1991 National Skeet Championships will be conducted.

WORLD SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

The dates of the World Skeet Championships have been confirmed to us by the NSSA. The Championships will be held at San Antonio, Texas, USA from October 7-12.

It is proposed that a three-member skeet team will be sent by the Association to compete in America, this should certainly add a great deal of interest to the Skeet Nationals from where the skeet team will be determined by scores recorded over the four days of competition.

1991 REGISTRATIONS

You are reminded that 1991 registrations are now due. Without a current card shooters are ineligible to compete in accordance with the shooting rules of the Association.

In addition, registrations not renewed as at 1/3/91 will not receive any further issues of the CTSN until such time as membership may be renewed.

CONSTITUTIONAL REVIEW


A review of the proposed ACTA Articles of Association has been completed, however at the time of writing we are yet to receive a completed document from the Association's legal advisers. Once the document is received and has been approved by the Executive Committee a copy will be sent to all clubs to enable them to have sufficient time for the proposed document to meet existing constitutional requirements for the Annual General Meeting which is to be held in Perth on Friday, 5th April.

A considerable amount of work has gone into the preparation of the revised Articles of Association which by all accounts has been favourably received in all states so far as preliminary drafts are concerned. A new decade is with us and with it the need to update

the existing constitution in keeping with present day requirements. It is hoped that members will view the document favourably when it is presented to them for the benefit will be there for the sport as a whole. Those who oppose change in any shape of form are asked to study the document in its entirety once received, and not wait until the AGM to attempt to have passages amended or deleted. If there are areas that need addressing then let us address them prior to the AGM, if not a year will have gone by before the matter can be represented and in this day of change a year may be too long a wait. Any comments that may be received in relation to the proposed new set of articles will be considered in a correct and proper manner with written answers to those who raise the questions.

ACTA PATRON

As advised in a previous issue, Mr Malcolm Fraser, AC, CH, has accepted the honorary role of Patron of the Association. Over the past 45 years the ACTA has only had two Patrons, Sir William Bridgeford, KBE, CB, CBE, MC, 1946-1977 and Sir Henry Bolte, GCMG, 1973-1989. We look forward to a long relationship with Mr Fraser pictured in his Melbourne Office being presented with a plaque denoting his role as Honorary Patron of the Association.



ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The Executive have approved the establishment of a new Organisational Structure which should be of great assistance to the continued development of the Association.

In addition to the National Structure, a recommendation has been placed before all State Associations which hopefully will see the introduction of a similar structure at state level.

Next month's issue of the CTSN will, space permitting, carry full details of both the approved National Structure and a recommended structure for introduction at state level.

RULE AMENDMENT

Rule 4.15 — Management.

To be amended by the deletion of the words: "without giving any reason".

RULE REMINDERS

1. Rule 1.2b TRAP

A sighter target must be thrown for No. 1 shooter on their call at the first and subsequent visit to each trap, or after a break in competition.

NOTE: It is not the No. 1 shooter's prerogative to accept or refuse to see this target but the referee's duty to release a target for the squad to see.

2. When a sighter target is to be shot in a 6-person squad, No. 6 shooter shoots first then No. 1, 2 and so on.

3. Rule 5.2f SKEET

When the first target missed is the 1st target of a singles bracket the gun must be immediately broken and re-loaded for the 25th target and subsequent single target.

LADIES TAIPAN SHIELD

Contested on an annual basis, teams comprise five ladies registered through the ACTA from the one club. Clubs not being able to form a five-lady team are able to form a team by combining with neighbouring clubs.

The Taipan Shield originated in 1974 at the instigation of Mrs Elva Churches who wished to promote ladies shooting.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

In November 1990 I attended a meeting in Alice Springs of Police Ministers from all Australian States, Territories and the Minister of Justice in the Hawke Labor Government, Senator Tate.

At this meeting Senator Tate presented to all ministers what was called a generic statement on gun laws in Australia.

There was a great deal of discussion on this statement by all Ministers present, but the outcome of the meeting was that at Senator Tate's initiative, and with the support of all States except New South Wales there will be a ban on the importation into Australia of a wide variety of self-loading rifles.

This was a stupid and hypocritical decision which, I believe, the Federal Government and the other governments which supported the motion, will regret.

It was a decision that demonstrated complete contempt for the legitimate needs of sporting shooters and farmers.

Many rifles which are at present used in legitimate sporting competitions are now to be outlawed. This is in spite of previous assurances by Senator Tate that rifles used for legitimate sporting competitions would not be affected. This amounts to the most blatant double-cross by the Federal Government.

Shooters who owned banned rifles and keep possession of them after the new laws come into force can, under Federal law, be liable to prosecution for having in their possession prohibited imports.

The New South Wales Government believes it is wrong for citizens of this State who may have a prohibited import in their possession to be put in the same position as common criminals. So, to clarify this situation I sought advice on the matter from the NSW Crown Solicitor.

The advice of the Crown Solicitor confirmed these fears that owners of banned rifles will be in possession of prohibited imports and thus liable to criminal prosecution.

One of the most depressing aspects of the Alice Springs meeting was the posturing of Senator Tate who went before the television cameras holding a self-loading rifle announcing that: "Here is a weapon that has been designed to kill people."

This is the ultimate act of hypocrisy by a representative of a Government that will ban some self-loading rifles. Many of the rifles banned are the less expensive makes and the selective bans have been made without any apparent rationale.

At least the misguided Barrie Unsworth was open and honest about his intentions: he wanted to ban and seize all self-loading rifles and made no secret of the fact.

He put the question to the electorate in a democratic way and the electorate gave a very clear, emphatic answer.

Senator Tate and his leader, Mr Hawke, are not even putting the question to the electorate. They are taking action without any democratic consultation with affected community groups.

Senator Tate has even gone to the ludicrous length of banning a type of air gun used in the game skirmish in which small paintballs are fired in a simulated warfare situation.

These small business ventures, which had begun to flourish in some States, now will be wiped out with one stroke of a dictatorial political pen.

Members also should be aware that some elements in the State Labor Parliamentary Party have been pushing for the tightening of gun laws in NSW.

In the NSW Legislative Council there have been many questions asked of me that make it quite clear that if returned to power there will be a very strong push from strong forces within the Labor Party to again introduce restrictive, ill-considered firearms laws in NSW.

Dear Sir,

Pertaining to the letter in January 1991 CTSN (Editor's Mailbox) by J. Fryer of Charlestown, NSW.

I sat and looked at the ABC TV program, The 7.30 Report, on July 11 and I agree with J. Fryer that it was a distorted program, but I do not agree that the only shooters that value their sports are members of the SSAA or the Field & Game, as he says that is the only place this program was reported.

Well I do value my shooting sports (clay target and field shooting) and the following is a letter I sent to that program:

"Dear John,

"I see your 7.30 Report as often as I can and I enjoy it very much, but the story on the 11th July about firearms and firearm safety in schools was the worst one-sided lot of rubbish I have seen.

"On the Report everybody seemed to be yelling about the kids handling firearms, and learning how to use a firearm safely.

"The whole world says to stop the kids getting into the drink, you must educate them about alcohol, to stop the kids getting into drugs, you must educate them about drugs, but when it comes to firearms Don't Educate Them.

"Educate the kids as to what a firearm is, what it is designed for, and how to handle it safely, education is the right and only way to do things, to let the kids natural curiosity take over his/her 'uneducated' head and then you really have trouble.

"Like the old saying, at little knowledge is hazardous, but anybody with a firearm with 'NO' education in firearms safety and handling is damn well dangerous."

So to J. Fryer, that program did not get past many concerned shooters, but as you know, if you yell and scream at these people all you do is add wood to their little fire (let this fire go out), and we the "concerned" shooters will do our fighting on the quiet, if we do things right, we will keep what we have and maybe, just maybe, gain a little along the way.



SHORT BARRELS SHOOT HIGHER — SOMETIMES



Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of *The Weekly Times*, Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper, since January 1977. The following article is reprinted by permission from that column.

Many of our newer shotgunners would be unaware that a short barrel tends to shoot higher than a long one.

The usual explanation is that the shorter barrel has less flip. To understand what this means, we must first accept the fact that a gun barrel is flexible. It bends and shimmies when a shot is fired, as high speed photography shows.

Now imagine a fishing rod held at arm's length. If we jerk the rod upwards, the tip lags for an instant. For practical purposes, therefore, the rod is bent downwards.

When this inertia-induced bend happens to a firearm barrel, it is called flip or, less commonly, muzzle lag. Obviously it is caused by the upward component of recoil, i.e. the kick-up. Since part of the flip occurs while the shot is still inside the barrel, the amount of flip controls the shot charge's line of departure.

A long barrel should exhibit more flip or muzzle lag than a shorter one, all else being equal, so it should yield a lower line of departure. Thus a long barrel may undershoot a short one, and a short barrel may overshoot a long one.

I say "may" because the connection between barrel length and the elevation of the shot is not as straightforward as it appears. Look at those words **all else being equal**: they mean there must be no change in the buttstock or rib dimensions, the barrel construction or the ammunition while we are making comparisons.

In reality, barrel length is just one of many variables.

If we have two guns — one with a trap stock, the other with a field stock — the difference in the line of sight will affect the elevation of the pattern centre: the trap gun will normally shoot higher.

The angle of the rib also has an effect. If one gun has a rib with a strong forward slope while the other's rib is closer to being parallel with the barrel, the former will tend to shoot higher.

And that's not all. Ribs have a stiffening effect — the more robust the design, the smaller the muzzle lag and the higher the shot. Similarly, under-and-over barrels are more rigid than single barrels, unless they are of floating or semi-independent construction. Thus the U/O layout has a high-shooting tendency too. Nor should we forget the thickness of the barrel walls; variations in this department must also influence rigidity.

All of these factors have a predictable effect on flip, and hence on the gun's tendency to overshoot or undershoot.

Ammunition? A change in the load will produce a change in the pressure curve. This in turn influences the barrel vibrations and hence the cyclic motions of the barrel at the muzzle. Such motions may reduce or accentuate the flip, and there is no way of telling which. That's why a mild cartridge, which theoretically ought to shoot a little higher than a harder-kicking round, especially from the top barrel, may throw the other way.

Now let's get rid of all the extra variables and assume we have a gun with interchangeable barrels. The butt, rib, barrel construc-

tion and ammunition are identical; only the length of the barrels is different.

In all probability we won't detect a change in the pattern elevation if the difference is 2" or 50mm. But if we are talking about 4" or 100mm (28" as against 32" barrels, for example), the high-shooting behavior of the shorter snout is more likely to be significant.

Flip may not be the only factor involved, of course. With less weight up front, the gun is liable to kick upwards a fraction more than before. Result: a further raising of the line of departure. Here, much depends on the relationship between the recoil line and the point of contact on the shoulder. Where the recoil line is low, as it is with the bottom barrel of a U/O, the kick-up component is minimal.

The high-shooting phenomenon is most noticeable with barrels in the 18-20" or 46-51cm class — the sort found on brush guns and police models.

When they are ribless and single, such barrels are quite flexible. Even so, they need to be held low to compensate for the smaller degree of muzzle lag, plus any kick-up that takes place before the shot charge leaves the muzzle. When they are stiffened by a tubular magazine, as is often the case, their tendency to shoot high is further increased.

Without a rib to raise the line of sight above the muzzle, the barrel tends to adopt a steeper upward angle in relation to the line of sight. That adds a bit more elevation to the shot.

Consequently shooters who try these short-barrelled outfits on clays for fun or practice (such guns are not suited to target work) are apt to get a shock. In most cases they find that they have to point well under the target.

BOOK REVIEW

There do not appear to be many publications in Australia on the sport of clay target shooting. A recent visit to the National Sport Information Centre at the Australian Institute of Sport gained us a list of six clay target titles of which three were ACTA publications and one was the US Army's Marksmanship Unit Guide for skeet and trap. A fifth was the UIT Special Technical Rules for trap and skeet. The catalogue of a sporting book shop in Victoria yielded five additional titles.

Thus, when the opportunity arose recently to review a British book on shooting clays we seized the chance eagerly. The book is "Move Mount Shoot" by John Bidwell and Robin Scott. To our surprise when the book arrived, we read the sub-title "A Champion's Guide to Sporting Clays". Now, don't switch off because this sub-title indicates the book is directed at our Field and Games fraternity — this is a truly excellent book on shotgun handling.

Our ACTA training publications, and the US Army Marksmanship Unit (USAMU) manual we have seen, are very strong, even rigid, on how to do certain things. They are profoundly deficient on why we should do them thus. In our opinion, such publications are flawed as training media for young and adult shooters, and for coaches. If people are to be fully engaged in the learning process they must understand why they are told to perform in certain ways. The absence of "why" material in ACTA training lore also tends to produce a rigidly prescribed ACTA shooting style which may not match the requirements of all Australian shooters, who come in different shapes and sizes, with different strengths and weaknesses.

The Bidwell/Scott book contains a great deal of reasoned material on why certain aspects of shotgunning technique are to be preferred. Where there are options, these are discussed and the reader is left to experiment and to make up his/her own mind. On a number of topics, there is a direct cutover to trap and skeet practice. The text is refreshing to read and the reasoning is very clearly described. This is to be expected as Robin Scott is an experienced journalist and writer, and a good one at that.

John Bidwell is the 1988 FITASC Sporting World Champion, the proprietor of a shooting ground and a prominent UK shooting instructor. His excellent technical qualifications are reflected not only in the text of "Move Mount Shoot" but also in the illustrations, a mixture of high grade photographs and line drawings. With a couple of minor exceptions the illustrations are brilliant, as in, for example, clearly distinguishable shot strings (or shot clouds) en route to clearly distinguishable targets.

One of the many interesting aspects of the book relates to the minor coaching controversy in this country over stock length, or length of pull. Our current Basic Coaching Manual states as

follows: "... the distance between line of finger tips (on the rear hand) and line through nose and chin is between 20 mm and 50 mm." Bidwell's illustrations tend to show that British shotgunners, whatever their discipline, prefer their rear hands much further from their faces.

Bidwell is an unashamed advocate of instinctive or "instinctual" shooting and of "Maintained Lead", which we call sustained lead. For what it is worth, his approach to shooting bears resemblance to aspects of commando and tropical warfare shooting techniques employed in certain Australian Army shooting environments since World War II.

"Move Mount Shoot — A Champion's Guide to Sporting Clays" by John Bidwell and Robin Scott is available from the Australian distributors Peribo Pty Ltd, 26 Tepko Road, Terry Hills, NSW 2084 (telephone 02-486 3188 and fax 02-486 3036). At a recommended retail price of \$49.95, while not cheap, it is excellent value for money.

- Permanent total loss of sight in both eyes — \$40,000
- Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of both hands — \$40,000
- Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of both feet — \$40,000
- Loss of or the permanent total loss of the use of one hand or one foot — \$40,000
- Other benefits of a similar nature attract benefits on a reducing scale.

SCOPE OF COVER: (within the policy conditions)

Weekly Accident Benefit — \$400 p/wk for temporary total disablement payable from the eighth day of medical attention for an aggregate of 104 weeks — limited to income earners only.

Temporary partial disablement — \$100 p/wk payable from the eighth day of medical attention for an aggregate of 104 weeks — limited to income earners only.

NON-INCOME EARNERS: (within the policy conditions)

It is not possible to provide other than a brief summary of the policy owing to the many circumstances that could arise from time to time. Any queries, however, that may arise are to be addressed to the A.C.T.A. who will endeavour to obtain confirmation clarification to the written request.

BENEFITS:

Benefits are additional to any existing policy that may be in force other than for workers compensation entitlement.

THE BEGINNING OF TRAP SHOOTING

In England and Europe

Recently I was asked about when, where and how did trap shooting get started. At that point I did not have the exact answer and so decided to do some research into the subject. Here is the story:

The origin of trap shooting can be traced back to the ancient pastime of popinjay shooting, a game practised by the ancient Greeks and the expert bowmen of medieval times. This popinjay thing was a stuffed parrot placed upon the top of a pole, and used as a target, in some instances a live bird was used; a certain amount of liberty being given to it by the length of cord used to secure it to a pole.

The toxophilite society during the 18th century held frequent meetings for popinjay shooting; the last recorded took place in September 1792 at Highgate, England.

About the year 1856 live pigeon shooting was patronised by a Lord Huntingfield, The Earl of Stamford and other noblemen and suddenly became fashionable. Since that time clubs were formed and grounds were reserved for this sport wherever the Anglo-Saxons are found. The first fashionable resort for pigeon shooting near London was the "Old Hats", a public house on the Uxbridge Rd; it obtained its name from the pigeons used for shooting being placed in holes, covered with old hats which were the primitive pigeon traps used.

In France, Germany and Italy pigeon shooting had been well received, and the international concours arranged at several of the leading watering places were carried well, and attendance was good. The year 1878 saw many English and American professional shooters attending year after year, competing for big money prizes. It is reported that a prize of £1400 was one of the most valuable prizes shot for at Monte Carlo. The pavilion at Monte Carlo is artistically designed and well furnished, it faces and looks out over the sea, with Monte Carlo rising up immediately behind it.

It would seem that in the earlier days of wing shooting, the best professional shooters were to be found among the English and American shooters. One outstanding score on record is that of an American Captain A.H. Bogardus who shot a score of 99/100 — the 44th bird was actually shot but unfortunately it fell out of bounds. This extraordinary score was shot in a match with Mr Rimmell, an Englishman, for \$250 a side. The date, July 2, 1880. The Captain used an English hammerless gun.

On February 7, 1881 a match was shot at Welsh Harp, Hendon between Dr Carver, a champion American shot and Mr W. Scott, a celebrated English wing shot. Both shooters used Greener choke bore guns. Dr Carver scored 66 birds, Mr Scott scored 62, the

stakes were \$800. Birds were wild and fast with the weather vile, the greater part of the match being shot in a blinding snow storm and driving squall from the south-west.

About the year 1879 a new type of trap shooting came into being — it was to be known as Glass Ball Shooting. This type of shooting was made fashionable in America by Ira Payne and Captain Bogardus. In England catapults were used to spring the balls, but in America spring traps were invented, these traps could be set to throw balls in any direction and at any height. When first the balls were of coloured glass, and filled with feathers so that there could be no dispute when they were broken. A special set of rules were drawn up covering the competition of glass ball shooting.

History records that Captain Bogardus, the great American wing shot, made a match against time in December 1879 and succeeded in breaking 5500 glass balls in a few seconds less than 7 hours and 20 minutes. His misses numbered 356.

Dr W. Carver, an American who spent 16 years of his life among the Indian tribes attained great skill with rifle and made his debut in San Francisco as a professional marksman. He later visited Europe and astonished all with his remarkable skills with a rifle and gun. His greatest feat was before the Prince of Wales when he broke 100 glass balls consecutively with his rifle. His quickest time for smashing 32 balls was 32 seconds. He broke with a rifle 5500 glass balls in 8 hours and 7 minutes missing 712.

Towards the end of the century live bird shooting was giving way to targets as a trap shooting sport and glass balls were giving way to the development of the clay target. It was just before the turn of the century that clay target trap shooting was developed in America. In the early days of pigeon shooting the sport was referred to as wing shooting, at a later date a special type of trap was invented using a strong spring loaded platform to launch the bird — hence the name trap shooting was born. Prior to the introduction of spring loaded traps, a type of catapult was used to throw glass balls.

Around the turn of the century clay target shooting had become the in thing. In America both the target and the traps were developed to perfection. Gun clubs were springing up all over the country. America had become the clay target trap shooting capital of the world. In a much smaller way England and Europe followed.

Eventually trap shooting became a part of the Olympic Games Shooting Discipline. The Melbourne Olympic Games of 1956 was Australia's first opportunity to field a two-man team in international Olympic clay target competition.

Clay target shooting became established in Australia in 1926/27. Australia's first registered club was named the Nobel Clay Target Gun Club with a shooting ground at Tottenham, a western suburb of Melbourne.

Up to this time and before clay target shooting, equipment became readily available after World War One. Many live bird clubs established in Australia in the early days were a carry over of live bird shooting in England and were now converting to inanimate targets.

One of the pioneers in this development was Australia's Donald Mackintosh. Donald was actually the pioneer and founder of our sport of clay target shooting in Australia. Donald Mackintosh had established himself overseas as a World Champion long before those of us shooting today were born. Foreign press have described Donald as a man whom we have no hesitation in proclaiming the best shot in the world at the present time, September 23, 1908.

It would seem that a number of Australian shooters were very successful overseas during the latter part of the 1800s and early in the 1900s. As Donald used to put it "these were exciting times".

During the 1890s Buffalo Bill brought his Wild West Show to Australia. The show came complete with Indian Chief and Tribe. The famous American trick shooter Dr Carver also performed trick shooting exhibitions with rifle and revolver while mounted on

horseback. Doc Carver spent some six months in Australia and renewed his friendship with his old friend Donald Mackintosh.

This was a time in Australia when live pigeon shooting was possibly at the crest of its time, big money and betting made the sport very popular, especially in country areas — it remained to a lesser degree until 1957 when it became illegal in most states. Clay target shooting has now taken over as a trap shooting sport.

DR CARVER VISITS AUSTRALIA

Dear George,

This yarn came to me from C.B. (Barney) Meadway — now departed.

Barney came from the Benalla district. He was a smallish fellow with a handy way with words.

His shooting days were tapering off when I knew him, but he was always on for a yarn.

Anyhow, as Barney told it, the great Dr Carver from the U.S. of A., with his reputation as the greatest wing shot in history, arrived at the New South Wales Gun Club (I think it would have been at Sans Souci, which is now part of the Mascot Airport. The clubhouse, the dog kennels and bird cages were still there a few years ago) and he challenged any person in the world to shoot him a match from 30 yards, 100 birds up, and £100 a side.

He was challenged five times and he won each time. Although Jack Neeld ran him close when he shot 93 to the doctor's 94.

I knew Jack Neeld's son: another Jack, and I had discussions with him about it, but he lacked a sense of history and was only mildly interested, although Errol Bullen, another member of NSW Gun Club of my days there, confirmed Barney's story.

Carver then came to the Melbourne Gun Club (at Brighton, I think) and challenged anybody in the land to shoot against him on the same conditions as in Sydney.

There were several takers and once again Carver won each match. In one of these matches, after he had shot about 20 birds straight, the doctor walked off the mark and called for a strip of lead; he said he felt he was over swinging and wanted to wrap the lead around his barrels to slow himself down a little.

After pocketing the loot and running out of challengers, Carver issued an open challenge for £500 a side, 100 birds up.

This offer went untaken for a few weeks while Carver won about every event he wanted to win in the daily competitions of those days.

Then one Friday, the Grant brothers from Skipton walked into the Club on one of their occasional visits. They worked as rabbiters on very ordinary wages and their ability to shoot at the Club was limited.

According to Barney, they were "pretty fair shots".

They had never heard of Carver, but when told of the challenge they had a little discussion, pooled their money and drew straws to see who would do the shooting.

Bobby drew the long straw, and after checking that the Carver money was up, they paid their £500 and the match was set for the Saturday a week away.

A great crowd came along for the event and over 50 book-makers stood up to do battle with the punters (these were the days before sprung traps, and the odds would have been five to two on, or worse).

Anyhow, with much excitement, huge betting, and a break for lunch, the big day saw the great Carver shoot 99 out of 100, and in Barney's words, "It wasn't bloody well good enough, Bobby shot the 100."

CHAMPIONS COMPETE AT TOTTENHAM

**"BARNEY" MEADWAY WINS COMMONWEALTH
PIGEON TITLE**

In a tie shoot with four other competitors, C.B. ("Barney") Meadway gained an easy victory for the Commonwealth Pigeon Championship title at the Melbourne Gun Club's grounds at Tottenham last month, when he shot 23 out of 26 birds. C.C. Jones (Bacchus Marsh) was second with 22/26, and A. ("Fred") O'Donnell (Charlton) and J. Long (Bendigo) were equal for third place with 21/26.

Sixty-one competitors, representing numerous Victorian and interstate clubs, competed. Weather conditions gave birds a big advantage, and this resulted in a rapid reduction of the field. C.J. Dolan (Qld) shot in fine form up to the twelfth round, and at its end he was the only competitor with a clean score. In his next three shots he seemed to be "all at sea", and missed badly on each occasion.

By the end of the eighteenth round the whole field, with the exception of "Fred", had all exhausted their three chances and retired. The latter was left with three birds to kill to win, but he failed in the nineteenth round against an "incomer". This allowed all the competitors in again, and after one further round had been fired shooting was suspended for the day.

Continuing the next morning against very fast birds, Meadway, O'Donnell, "Fred", C.C. Jones and J. Long were the only competitors to reach the twenty-first round without a further miss. They divided £270 from the attached sweepstakes and shot on at an additional five birds for the title. Meadway obtained his full quota, and C.C. Jones missed one, while the other three each recorded two misses.

Meadway's victory was well deserved, as he had been shooting out of form for several weeks, and his victory in the Melbourne Club's championship a week prior to the big event marked his return to something like his old form. Meadway won the Commonwealth Pigeon title in 1922. He has held most of the important Australian and Victorian titles and earned a good reputation at Monte Carlo, where he has been a visitor at the last two shooting carnivals.

**"BACK TO INGLEWOOD" WEEK — £100 FOR
TRAP SHOOTERS**

In connection with the "Back to Inglewood" movement the local Gun Club proposes to hold a £100 Pigeon Handicap on October 5. Secretary J. Turpie informs us that improvements to the grounds include the installation of a good trap-puller and a fenced enclosure. Luncheon will be served on the grounds and cartridges will be on sale. The Club's application to the G.C.A. of Victoria to hold the shoot has been granted.

BENDIGO PICNIC SHOOT

The Gun Clubs' Association of Victoria has received an application from the Bendigo Club asking that Railway Picnic Day (which has yet to be fixed) be set aside for the Club to conduct a £100 handicap. It is almost certain that the Association will accede to the request.

At the annual meeting of the Bendigo Club, which was held recently, the following were elected office-bearers for the ensuing twelve months: President, Mr J.R. Trengrove; Vice-Presidents, Messrs J.H. Tubb and T.E. Wilson; Handicapper, Mr J. Boehm; Treasurer, Mr H.A. Ross; Joint Secretaries, Messrs G. Meakin and T.J.R. Brown; Committee, Messrs J. Boehm, A.H. Campbell, B. Ashford, J. Long.

The club has constructed its own aviaries for birds, and other improvements should go a long way to making the club one of the best in the State.

COROWA CLUB'S IMPROVEMENTS

A letter from Mr F. Galbraith (Secretary of the Corowa Club) states that extensive improvements to the club's grounds have added considerably to the comfort of shooters. At the annual

meeting recently it was reported that the club was in a sound position, its credit balance for the past year being £70.

THE GUN

The trap shooters of earlier days before the turn of the century were not given a very wide choice of gun. Except for live pigeons the only other use was game shooting, and for this a standard type of gun was made. For all purposes it was known as a sporting shotgun. Space here would not permit me to go into the development of the shotgun from the beginning. Suffice to say that the English guns were an example of what was required. The breech loading sporting shotgun was first established in the early part of the 18th century. However it was many years later before the system of locking was perfected.



The Purdey hammerless gun, with its self- and wide-opening action and Purdey third bolt, has gained reputation that is world-wide for great strength, ease in loading, and durability.

THE CARTRIDGE

The loading of 12 gauge cartridges in earlier times was to say the least rather slow. Unlike today where we have machines to load one-piece plastic cases and plastic wads that do the job turning out thousands of precision loaded shells per hour.

MAKING OF GUNPOWDER

It is reported that gunpowder was developed in China back in the Dark Ages but no one had a use for it and no interest was shown. However around 1650 production of gunpowder was commenced in England and Scotland. Spain and Germany were also into the manufacture of gunpowder at that time. Today, gunpowder is made in many countries throughout the world, including Australia.

Conditions of Entry

NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap — squads of 6 ISU Skeet.

TRADE PRACTICES ACT

The attention of advertisers is drawn to the Trade Practices Act 1974 and the provisions in the Act which apply to advertising. It is not possible for the A.C.T.A. to ensure that advertisements which are published in this magazine comply in all respects with the Act and the responsibility must therefore be on the person, company or advertising agency submitting the advertisement for publication. The A.C.T.A. reserves the right to refuse any advertisement without stating the reason.

3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot a full round of 25 targets.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. The person designated as scorer/referee or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the services of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role SHALL INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.
9. Any unauthorised shooter who interferes with or attempts to interfere with a trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
15. High gun awards are determined for each section irrespective of the nomination paid. To be eligible for high gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective high gun.
16. Shooters who are eligible for a reduced nomination and elect to pay the full nomination shall be eligible for recognition in the open section only. One nomination only may be paid. Shooters who are eligible for and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of the open nomination), for their respective divisions, Ladies and Juniors shall, having so declared their section of competition only be eligible for recognition in the section nominated (UIT Rules).
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic I.D. card when nominating.
19. Nominations will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director.
20. Practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
21. The Olympic finals system will be used to determine the O/A placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.
22. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
23. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.




