






EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES



This month brings about a meeting of the National Executive Committee which will be held in Melbourne. As reported in an earlier issue of the CTSN, the Association is embarking on a new organisation structure which will encourage and rely upon greater input from members of the Executive Committee than ever before.

Summarising what has been approved for implementation in May each member of the Executive Committee will have definite and distinct responsibility to a Sub-Committee chaired by a member of the Management Committee. In turn, each member of the Management Committee will have a greater responsibility to the Executive Committee for the Sub-Committee Portfolio's which they will be allocated.

The structure that has been approved is not a complicated system however it does rely heavily upon the work efforts of the Sub-Committees to ensure that progress is made in the sport.

NATIONAL OFFICE

A considerable amount of strain has been placed on the National Office owing to the departure of Tina Costello who having been with us for some 4 years has moved on in her working career. In addition, Antoinette Dal-Santo who has been with us for one and a half years is soon to leave us to become a mother. We wish them both well in whatever the future brings for them and thank them for their efforts on behalf of the Association.

Account inquiries to the office will now be the responsibility of Megan Smith who joined us in late April. Megan is a very capable employee and will prove to be a valuable asset in the office. We do ask however that every assistance is given to Megan as she settles into her role in the office.

COMPUTER

As is well known, the Association upgraded its computer operations this year and as foreshadowed difficulties did and are occurring. It appears as though the operations of the Association are a little more complex than first thought. Because of this our suppliers have had to revise their original recommendation which while at no cost to the ACTA has slowed down the full implementation of the system. This is being corrected however until such time as we are fully operative we may not always be able to provide all the services that are asked of us, every effort will be made to bring all services into full operation as quickly as possible.

NATIONALS

The venue for the 1992 Nationals have been determined. The ISU Olympic Discipline Nationals will be held at Brisbane Gun Club with firm dates yet to be set down. This will take place at the May meeting of the Executive and advised in the July CTSN. Trap Nationals will be held in NSW with Wagga Gun Club the proposed ground. Again actual dates will be decided upon at the May meeting of the Executive. The Skeet Nationals are scheduled to be held in WA at Whiteman Park.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

A meeting of the Organising Committee took place in Perth following the Trap Nationals. With six months to go, arrangements and planning are well in hand under the direction of the Organising Committee Chairman, Roy Holtfreter. The organisers in WA are and have been very active in their efforts to ensure that the Championships will be successful. As part of the activities the WA Clay Target Association are organising a down the line and skeet program to provide shooting for the many people who have indicated their intention to come to Perth for the World Ch'ships. In addition a 200T ISU Grand Prix will be held prior to the commencement of the World Championships which being an open shoot will allow those who wish to do so to compete against the internationals who will be in the field. This is an opportunity which it is anticipated will be accepted by many and also an occasion to remember as the years go by.

When planning for the World Championships we are continually faced with the need for more assistance at all levels. If you feel that you would like to assist please contact the ACTA Office or the WA Organising Committee through Terry Morony (09) 332 4891, where your services will be readily accepted.

The assistance received from the WA Government and the Australian Sports Commission has been invaluable for without support of this kind Australia could not consider hosting a World Championship. While the championships are in the Shotgun Disciplines the right to conduct the event has been vested in the Australian Shooting Association who in turn have allocated this responsibility to the ACTA through the World Championships Organising Committee.

Indications already are that a large Italian team will be competing as will a large team from the USSR. There is no doubt as to the wish of all countries to attend the event as expressions of interest in this regard have been received on all occasions that our shooters have met shooters from other countries in competition.

The visitors will be made most welcome in Perth where the people at Whiteman Park have become well known for their hospitality, we trust that you will be able to join with them and make the Championships one that will reflect well on Australia in the eyes of the shooting world for many years to come.

ASA/AOC – WORLD CUP POINTS

To be eligible for nomination to the Australian Olympic Committee for selection for Barcelona in 1992, athletes (shooting) must have recorded a placing at one or more of the UIT World Cups held in the two year period prior to the Olympic Games.

Points are awarded ranging from 16 for finishing in first place to 1 for finishing in 16th place.

Based upon the best information to hand as at April 20, 1991 the following points have been recorded:

AUSTRALIAN SPORTS MEDICINE FEDERATION LTD. INFECTIOUS DISEASES POLICY

The following is provided by way of information to all sportspersons. While many of the areas may be considered to "not relate" to the sport of clay target shooting, the information provided by the Australian Sports Medicine Federation is designed to be educational for all.

The policy will be reviewed regularly and updated accordingly.

It is strongly recommended that all contact or collision sports team physicians, other sports medicine staff, coaches, referees, team managers, administrators, players and their parents be informed of this policy and adopt its commonsense recommendations forthwith.

For health care professionals, information on a suitable Hepatitis B vaccine may be obtained by contacting the ASMF National or State Offices.

• POLICY STATEMENT ON INFECTIOUS DISEASES

(With particular reference to HIV (AIDS) and HEPATITIS B)

A number of blood borne infectious diseases can be transmitted during body contact and collision sports. The more serious include **HEPATITIS and HIV (AIDS)** infections. These diseases may be spread by contact with infected:

- Blood
- · Saliva (not for HIV)
- · Perspiration (not for HIV) and
- Other bodly fluids

THE FOLLOWING RECOMMENDATIONS WILL REDUCE THE RISK OF DISEASE TRANSMISSION:

• All open cuts and abrasions must be reported and treated immediately.

PLAYERS

- It is the players' responsibility to maintain strict personal hygiene as this is the best method of controlling the spread of these diseases.
- 2. It is strongly recommended that all participants, involved in sport and playing under adult rules, be vaccinated for **HEPATITIS B.**
- 3. Players with prior evidence of these diseases must obtain clearance from a doctor prior to participation.

VALE DON (D.R.) TAYLOR

It is with deepest regret that the Tasmanian Clay Target Association would like to advise of the passing of Don (D.R.) Taylor on Monday the 11th of March, 1991.

Don served on the National Executive of the ACTA for many years until 1980 and was awarded Life Membership to the ACTA for his many years of dedication and hard work.

He was also a member of the Hobart Gun Club since he began Clay Target Shooting, and was also awarded Life Membership to his club.

He served many years on the TCTA as Club Delegate, State Rules Supervisor, National Executive Delegate and State President.

He always shared his vast knowledge of our sport without hesitation and encouraged many a new shooter to continue.

Don will be remembered by many, not for what he did, but for what he was — the loving companion of Gloria, a father and a friend, but most of all, one heck of a skeet shooter. He will be greatly missed by all.

Tasmanian Clay Target Association

TEAM AREAS

- It is the Club's responsibility to ensure that the dressing rooms be clean and tidy. Particular attention should be paid to handbasins, toilets and showers. Adequate soap, paper hand towels, brooms and disinfectants must be available at all times.
- 2. Cummunal bathing areas (e.g. spas) should be strongly discouraged.
- 3. The practices of **spitting and urinating in team areas** must not be permitted.
- All clothing, equipment and surfaces contaminated by blood must be treated as potentially infectious and treated accordingly.
- 5. Sharing of towels, face washers and drink containers must not occur.
- 6. All personnel working in team areas should be **vaccinated** for **HEPATITIS B**.
- In all training areas, open cuts and abrasions must be reported to the coach and treated immediately.

REFEREES AND GAME OFFICIALS

- 1. These officials must **report all open cuts and abrasions** at the first available opportunity.
- 2. Those who officiate in body contact and collision sports should be **vaccinated** for **HEPATITIS B**.
- 3. All contaminated clothing and equipment **must be replaced** prior to the player being allowed to resume play.
- 4. If bleeding should occur, the above procedures must be repeated.
- 5. If bleeding cannot be controlled and the wound securely covered, the player **must not continue in the game**.

EDUCATION

There is an obligation upon all relevant sporting organisations to **provide suitable information** on the associated **risk factors** and **prevention strategies** for these diseases.

The **safe handling** of contaminated clothing, equipment and surfaces must be brought to the **attention of all players** and **ancillary** staff.

In the event of a player, official or member of the ancillary staff being found to be suffering from such a blood borne disease (**HEPATITIS, HIV**), that person cannot resume training or play, nor be involved in any team or match, **until cleared by his local medical officer or the team doctor.**

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 55th Annual General Meeting was held on Friday 5th April with delegates in attendance to receive the annual report. National President Mr J. Scott chaired the meeting which was attended by delegates from 24 affiliated clubs, in addition a total of 99 clubs were represented by Proxy Delegates.

All reports presented to the meeting were confirmed. The agenda carried a Notice of Motion proposed by the Executive Committee which read:

"To replace the existing Statement of Rules and Statement of Purposes with a revised statement of Rules and Purpose".

Prior to the Notice of Motion being addressed at the meeting the chairman did advise that discussions between members of the Executive Committee had brought about a decision to withdraw the Notice of Motion.

This action generated a considerable amount of discussion from the floor following which Delegates were advised that comments and ideas relative to producing a new constitution would be received at the National Office up to and including the 1st August 1991 following which the matter of a new constitution would be reviewed by the Executive Committee prior to having a document made available to all states for their consideration.

Clubs are requested to have the matter discussed prior to 1st August and forward their thoughts to the National Office no later than 1st August.

Once club input has been obtained the matter will be addressed by the Executive Committee and returned to clubs via their respective State Association who will be encouraged to have the matter discussed at club level in an attempt to produce a constitution that will take the Association into the 21st century.

WARATAH STATE NOTES

I would like to make mention of a few items of interest from the Perth Nationals pertaining to N.S.W.

Our Open Shoulder to Shoulder Team (K. Perkins, V. Gatt, G. Kable, R. Taylor and T. Alvaro) was successful in winning the Teams Match with a very good score of 122-125. Congratulations to you all. Our Juniors and Ladies Teams both came third with scores of 69-75 and 67-75 respectively. Keep up the hard work – maybe next year.

Six N.S.W. shooters qualified for selection in the Australian Team. They were A.M. Burgess, K. Perkins, V. Gatt, W. Headon, I. Headon, and P. Farrugia. Greg Tiffen was selected in the Australian Junior Team. Any shooter who has competed at the Nationals knows how difficult it is to gain a position on the National Team. Congratulations shooters.

WHAT'S GOING ON!!! "WHAT IS GOING ON?"

Originally Victoria was allocated the 1990 Skeet Nationals, with the 1991 event being delegated to Queensland.

The ACTA and Queensland made a request that Victoria and Queensland swap years. Victoria readily agreed to this because of the reasons put forward, i.e. to hold the Townsville National in the same year as the World Shotgun Championships in Perth would place difficulty on some shooters.

Perhaps if Victoria had not changed, we would not be in the position we find ourselves in at the moment re the 1991 Event.

It seems that there are a number of persons outside the Victorian State Executive breaking their necks to become a member of that Executive with their criticism and "advice" on the running of Victorial! Sorry, until you become a resident of our State, we are not interested.

Victoria allocated the 1991 Nationals to the Melbourne Gun Club, the only club in Victoria to make application.

Melbourne Gun Club, supported by the VCTA Executive, then requested they be allowed to conduct the Championships in May for a number of reasons, not the least being that in some previous years, the only way into the Melbourne Gun Club in September was by power boat.

The ACTA did not accept the May proposal by the VCTA.

When Mr CONNORS speaks of the selfish few, I support him fully, but can attribute no blame to Victoria.

Many reasons were put forward NOT to conduct the event in May, none of which I believe were valid.

The Melbourne Gun Club and the VCTA Executive were capable and willing to host the Nationals with very little burden being placed on the ACTA. If Mr CONNORS is able to substantiate

the VALID reasons for holding the Championship in September, which would not also be valid for May, I most certainly would like to hear them.

Mildura Clay Target Club made a written submission via FAX in January direct to me, seeking to host the Championships. This application was discussed at the February meeting of the VCTA Executive.

Mr CONNORS, who I believe knows the working of Clay Target shooting bodies better than the vast majority of shooters in Australia, whether it be Club, Zone, State or National, did not at any time approach his Zone or delegates and brief them on behalf of the Mildura Clay Target Club to support his application. His Zone delegates were not in a position to answer a number of relevant questions posed by the VCTA Executive, therefore the VCTA was unable to support his application on such short notice.


National Championship rules of the ACTA require that a club hosting the Nationals have their ground ready 12 months prior to the date of the event. It also requires that a Club hosting a National Skeet Title have a minimum of six skeet layouts. The above are only two of the requirements Mildura did not have at the time of the application.

Since I have been the President of the VCTA, I have asked all my Executive to discuss freely with all shooters any matter raised at State level and whilst I remain as State President, this will be the case.

When Victoria is again allocated the Skeet Nationals, I hope that Mildura will be the first to make application to host the event.

Finally, I find it comical that Mr CONNORS has suggested the current Victorian Government would be aghast to see the Championship go outside this State, when he is fully aware of the amount of money it has cost shooters (and the ACTA) to hold onto their "shooting rights".

1991 TRAP NATIONALS

With the Trap Nationals being held at Whiteman Park on the first occasion since its completion in 1985 a great amount of interest was shown in the facilities available for shooters in Western Australia. With the Nationals commencing on Saturday with the traditional Handicap event the visitors from the east took the opportunity to shoot the Pre-Nationals and enjoy the warm 35°C temperatures. The grounds as always were in immaculate condition and for this we express our thanks and appreciation to complex manager Reg Wagland, Ted Dickinson, President of WA Gun Club and the members of the club for their efforts in preparing the grounds for 1991.



The opening ceremony conducted prior to the handicap event was very colorful and a credit to the WA Organising Committee. State Teams, Open Ladies and Juniors were piped to their positions for the Opening Ceremony which was well attended by shooters. Mr Jack Busch, Executive Director of WA Ministry of Sport opened the Championships in the absence of WA Sports Minister Mr Graeme Edwards who while unable to attend owing to other commitments, attended the club during the Pre-Nationals and also during the remaining days of competition. When requested to do so, Mr Busch with the assistance of Assistant State Coaching Director, Murray Alexander fired the opening shot and delighted himself and the large crowd in attendance when he broke the target declaring the 1991 National Trap Championships officially open. 


GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP



NATIONAL SINGLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIPS







LADIES HIGH GUN - Zelda McClure, Waitemata, NZ 470/525.



THE BEGINNING OF SKEET SHOOTING By GEORGE BIGGS A.C.T.A. Historian

During the early days of skeet in Australia skeet shooters were somewhat handicapped due to the lack of suitable type of gun. Most of us had to take dads old field gun bored half and full or we used an auto also bored full choke to say nothing of the unsuitable style of stock design ... results being scores were kind of disappointing.

The American National Skeet Shooters Association are a separate body from the American Trapshooters Association, which was formed many years before skeet was invented. Skeet was developed in the beginning from field and hunting sports. These shooters were in fact the inventors of skeet shooting.

Australia's first nibble at skeet began in late 1950 at the Australian Gun Club. A small group of enthusiasts would wait until after the main club program was over and they would play around and practise what was called English style skeet, which consisted of a round of 20 targets only and no number 8 station. Doubles were shot from stations 1 2 6 & 7, the second target of each double was



only released upon the report of the first shot. Doubles were only shot after the shooter had finished his first round of singles. As interest grew in the game it was decided to form a panel to look into the American rules of skeet. This panel consisted of Roy Fallshaw, Bill Delaney, Frank Johnson & George Biggs. The panel quickly found that American rules would be much more interesting, the club agreed and the suggestion was presented to the A.C.T.A. who finally agreed to adopt American rules of skeet as of 1961.

Skeet was then firmly established and became a part of the club's weekly program. Roy Fallshaw was the winner of the first club skeet championship. The game quickly spread to other states resulting in a postal interstate match which was keenly contested and still is today by both men and women as well as juniors. 1970 saw the first National Skeet Championship shot on the grounds of the Perth Gun Club. Since 1983 when the Skeet Nationals were first staged, membership has increased and scores have also shot up, we have in fact followed a similar pattern to the early times of the development of skeet shooting in America. Unfortunately our population being much smaller tends to hold us back somewhat, we also need to have better promotion.

International skeet came to Australia during 1973 when the World Moving Target Championships were staged at the Melbourne Gun Club. Twenty eight countries competed in both the Olympic trap and Olympic skeet events of 200 targets per shooter each event.

WINCHESTER'S IMPROVED BALL POWDER – Super Target

Several years ago Winchester (USA), began loading their new Improved Ball Powder, "SUPER TARGET", in their factory loads for competition clay target shooters. Having achieved success in the "States", Olin Division, Winchester (Australia) is now releasing this new target powder in Australia. The virtues of the SUPER TARGET powder are many over the former 452AA. SUPER TARGET powder is formulated to produce very uniform velocity and pressure, for very consistent pattern placement. Other virtues include: it meters very uniformly (a big edge for consistent) performance), it is cleaner burning than its predecessors (which will reduce the number of malfunctions attributable to residue accumulation), and it is marginally more efficient permitting more loads for your dollar.

Fortunately, as the new improved ball powder works at lower operating pressures than other powders, it is very soft on recoil one of the most evident characteristics found during its field testing — and without affecting velocities. SUPER TARGET certainly gets out to the clay target quickly. There is also the inherent feature of a double based powder. These type of powders have greater stability over a wide range of temperatures which provides the consistent winning patterns shot after shot — whether you shoot in Tasmania during winter or in Darwin in summer. Consistency which instills confidence with shooting wherever you might choose to shoot.

The accompanying reloading data detailed with this review and provided by Winchester conveniently contains equivalents to their factory loads along with the respective MEC powder bush required for SUPER TARGET powder. During reloading for this evaluation the SUPER TARGET powder metered very evenly as suggested. The 2¼ dram load in the I ounce section proved devastating on skeet and very enjoyable to shoot — even for the slightest built person. A lady shooter to whom I provided several different loads commented on how comfortable the lighter 2¼ dram I ounce load recoiled. She was impressed with its even patterns and effortless manner in which it demolished skeet targets.

Whilst shooting DTL targets at a hearby ground I too was amazed at the speed in which the lead shot reached the clays. As an oversight I had installed a 3/8 Briley tube in my first barrel and a 4/8 tube in my second. The first barrel loads with 22 grain of SUPER TARGET in the 1 oz. load shattered clays without the need for a second barrel, which was very reassuring as the chokes were quite open for shooting off 15 metres. Back at 20 metres the clays did the same thing, and this was verified by another shooter in my squad who tested the loads through a Winchester "Pigeon Grade" trap gun.

During further evaluation during a practice shoot conducted at Inverloch the SUPER TARGET loads proved devastating on "flushed" targets with the absolute minimum of recoil. The skeet targets shot as part of a mixed round using the 1 oz. load in 9 shot were simply smoked. At the DTL tracks, for 10 targets, the 1½ oz. 3 dram loads performed well.

Overall, the new Improved Ball Powder, "SUPER TARGET" performed magnificently. Every load assembled crimped well with only 30 pound of wad pressure required. I predict SUPER TARGET will be greatly accepted by shooters who enjoy fast loads with the minimum of recoil, especially skeet and UIT shooters for the 1 oz. loads are a sheer pleasure to shoot — with devastating results. DTL shooters currently using Winchester's 452AA will certainly notice the difference in residue found in their barrels for the SUPER TARGET is a much cleaner burning powder. Good luck with SUPER TARGET, I am certainly impressed with it and I think readers will be too! Safe reloading from the data provided and remember to ALWAYS wear safety glasses when reloading cartridges.

REFEREES & ASSISTANTS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS, PERTH

As expressions of interest are currently being sought from people interested in acting as Referees or Assistants for the World Shotgun Championships to be held in Perth during November, many may be interested in the format proposed for these officials.

The Organising Committee is seeking the assistance of approximately 30 people to act in the capacity of referees and assistants. Referees will be selected from suitably qualified applicants and will be required to undertake a course of instruction, by correspondence, to enable them to be appointed to the position of ACTA ISU referees.

Assistants will also be given suitable training to make them aware of the rules relating to the Olympic Disciplines, and will be able to take advantage of some on-the-spot instruction at Perth on the day leading up to the World Championships.

The current proposal is that nine teams each of three people will be formed. One (or more) member(s) of each team will be appointed as the official referee, the remaining two people will act as assistants, and will be the button pusher and scorer.

Three teams, each of three people, will be assigned to each of the three shooting grounds to be used to conduct the Championships. These teams will be identified as Team 1A, 1B and 1C, 2A, 2B and 2C and so on.

Each of the three teams assigned to each ground will then officiate as follows:

- Team A working as referee, scorer and button pusher.
- Team B working as check scorers and flip board operator.
- Team C not working.

At the completion of the round, the teams rotate, Team C becomes referee, scorer and button pusher, Team A becomes check scorers and Team B is off. The same procedure would be applied to each of the other two shooting grounds, with Teams 2A, 2B & 2C and 3A, 3B & 3C, working in rotation.

Working in this manner, two of the three teams assigned to each ground will be working while one team has a break.

As the Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet events will be conducted at different times, the teams of referees and assistants will be required to officiate in both championships, and also the Double Trap event.

The positions of referees and scorers at the World Championships are very important to the success of the championships, and the ACTA and the Organising Committee will certainly be acknowledging the importance and value these volunteer workers are playing. All referees and assistants will be suitably attired and identified as officials. Members of the official UIT jury will also be assigned to each shooting ground during the competitions to assist with the overall running of the competition.

Rarely does an opportunity arise for enthusiasts of clay target shooting in Australia to become actively involved in a shooting event of the importance of the World Championships, and whether a person is familiar with ISU shooting or not is not of any great importance in this case. Full instructions will be given to all officials, even down to the manner of scoring, which anyone can do. The organisers are still looking for assistance, and Perth is a lovely place for a holiday during November, especially when a shooting event as important as the 1991 World Shotgun Shooting Championships is being conducted there at the time.

Please give these championships your support and let us know if you are available to act in an official capacity at what will be an exciting time for shooting when the World Championships are held in November. If you can assist please complete and return the coupon in this month's CTSN which is calling for volunteers.

CLAY TARGET SHOOTERS AT INSTITUTE OF SPORT

÷

As indicated in last month's edition, the Women's and Junior Olympic Skeet and Trench teams, for the November World Shotgun Championships, went into camp at the Australian Institute of Sport from 15 to 20 April.

Team members were subjected to an intensive program of exposure to the sports science facilities at the Institute. The largest component of sports science exposure was sport psychology, to which four hours were devoted. Members were given instruction on goal setting, concentration and arousal; arousal relates to placing an athlete in an ideal psychological state for the achievement of best competitive performance. In addition, each athlete, and the team, was psychologically assessed and comprehensive reports were prepared. The reports will assist self-management by the shooters, and each report has a separate annex to guide coaches in the best means of relating to each athlete.

Team members were given comprehensive instruction on appropriate nutrition, including fluid intake, were shown how to use gymnasium equipment properly, and how to exercise without gymnasium equipment. They were taught the use of massage as an aid to relaxation, and as an aid to bringing athletes up to peak performance. They were shown how biomechical analysis has helped other athletes at the Institute, and conclusions were reached as to how this arm of science may help us in the future.

Most of the shooters in camp were able to recount episodes of tiredness, muscular soreness, headache and other symptoms during periods of long competition. The unanimous response of the AIS scientists to these episodes was that they could be alleviated by proper exercise programmes, by better nutrition and fluid intake, and by other aids to self-management. Each team member now has access to most of the necessary techniques. Members have made informal contracts to put themselves on training regimes from now to November and assistance will be provided to them to ensure goals are met.

Through the kindness of Canberra International Gun Club, the shooters spent four afternoons on the Club's new shooting ground. Diagnostic and minor remedial coaching was provided by Brian
