




Presidents Resignation

In a shock announcement, National President, Mr Jim Scott of Dubbo, NSW has advised of his resignation from all positions at both State and National level.

Originally a member of the National Executive Committee representing NSW, Mr Scott was elected as a member of the Management Committee serving as Vice President to Past President Mr Roy Holtfreter.

Upon Mr Holtfreters retirement the Executive Committee elected Mr Scott as President of the Association, a position he occupied from 1988 until his recent decision to resign from office.

In May of this year, Mr Scott was awarded Life Membership of the Association for his service to the sport, over his ten years on the National Executive Committee. It is anticipated that presentation of his life members citation will take place during the trap nationals at Wagga in April of next year.



On behalf of all members we thank Jim Scott for his efforts on behalf of the sport over his many years of involvement, in particular the last ten years serving the Association at national level and wish him good shooting in the years ahead.

Advice has been received from Mr J. McVitty (Vic) that owing to the commitment to the position which he occupies on the National Executive Committee being greater than his position as a self employed person allows, he is no longer able to serve the ACTA at National level and has tendered his resignation effective as at 25th July.

John was elected to the National Executive Committee representing Victoria in 1988 and elected Vice President in 1991. During his time at National level he was very active in matters pertaining to the rules and will retain his interest in this area as a member of the VCTA Rules sub-committee.

On behalf of all members we thank John for his input to the Association while occupying a role at national level and wish him well in the role he is retaining in the sport as a member of the Victorian Clay Target Association.

With the two positions vacant at the time of writing, the affairs of the Association are being administered by the remaining members of the Management Committee — Ross Silvester and Bob Fox.

Skeet Nationals

During the recent meeting of the National Shooting Committee, Skeet Shooters Representative, Mr Bob Buchan, raised the matter of reducing nominations at the Skeet Nationals in favour of competitors shooting for medals only for first in each grade plus a trophy to be awarded to the overall winner only.

Discussion on the subject confirmed to the meeting that medals and an overall trophy presented in the manner suggested would have little to no effect on nomination fees as trophies in the greater part are fully sponsored thanks to the many supporters to the ACTA. Should sponsorship not be obtained for future National Skeet Championships with competitors wishing to retain the existing level of sponsorship then the reverse to the suggestion put forward would need to apply as nominations would certainly have to be increased to cover the cost of trophies and medals.

In 1991, we are fortunate indeed to have the support of Fuller Firearms, Winchester Australia, Olimpyc Targets, Scorpio Cartridges and B.R.A. Insurance as sponsors of the National Skeet Championships, their support is valued and certainly appreciated as is the support given by the host club, Wagga, who are sponsoring the 100T All States Skeet Championship and club stalwarts, Helen and Andy Sanders, sponsors of the Ladies High Gun Award, Ray Mack sponsor of the Junior High Gun and Country House Motor Lodge sponsors of the Veteran High Gun.

World Championships

The Organising Committee for the World Championships are well advanced with their preparations for the big event in November.

A number of countries have already advised of their intended participation including Italy, USSR and USA, other countries include Denmark, Germany, Poland, Norway, China, Ireland, Zimbabwe.

By all accounts many of our members intend visiting Perth for the World Championships which promise to be an exciting time for clay target shooting in Australia.

To counteract the many rumours that appear to be abundant (isn't that always), the situation in relation to the elimination at Downside on August 3/4 for World Championship Team selection was as follows:

The 200t elimination for the one position (trap) and two positions (skeet) was not on a first past the post basis with the final composition of the teams subject to justification — good luck to all. A special thank you must go to the Downside Club for their assistance with the conduct of the elimination matches.

UIT World Cup Final

Good news on the international scene is that the Australian Olympic Committee are funding Australia's two world cup winners, Russell Mark (trap) and John Summers (skeet) to contest the World Cup final in Munich in late August.

Both John and Russell contested the World Championship elimination at Downside on August 3/4 which provided a good opportunity for them both to obtain solid match practice. Russell is to contest the Austrian Shooting Federation Championships prior to the UIT World Cup final which will provide valuable practice under match conditions only days before the UIT match. Unfortunately John does not have the same opportunity as the Austrian Skeet Championships unfortunately conclude following the UIT World Cup match.

On behalf of all members and shooters in general, we wish both Russell and John the best of luck in this most prestigious event.

Proposed Statement of Purposes and Rules

The request for clubs to advise of their thoughts to the proposed document by August 1, unfortunately has received little response. Does this mean that other than for those clubs amongst the replies received, the proposed document is acceptable? We all know that this is not so, however, unless your thoughts are conveyed to the Executive Committee, how can they represent your wishes? Sub Committee Meetings

Under the new committee structure, meetings of the various sub committees will provide recommendations to the Management and Executive Committees in support of matters considered as beneficial to the sport. Management Committee members head the sub committees and all look forward to these sub committees producing thoughts, ideas and suggestions that will be of benefit to clay target shooters in both the short and long term.

While the value and importance of these sub committees is not to be underestimated the need for them to be given time to establish their role and progress accordingly is important.

Any person or club who believe that they have an idea or suggestion that would be of benefit to the Association are asked to have the matter discussed at club level, and once having gained support, have the club direct the matter to the respective zone association.

Should support be received at zone level then obviously the next move is to have the matter discussed at state level from where if support is received the matter will be discussed at national level.

I know, I know, what a waste of time and effort this all is, but again because having gained the support from the various areas that have discussed whatever the matter may be, surely the voice of the shooter has been heard and the wishes of the shooters from the respective state taken to national level where the matter is able to be addressed on behalf of all shooters and not just the one person or club who raised the subject. The system will work unless it is not allowed to.

In closing, good luck to all who are shooting skeet at Wagga in September, as well as Russell and John in Munich in late August.

COACHING CORNER: CONCENTRATION

When a shooter is having difficulties shooting possible scores, they usually start to blame bad targets, bad light, or other excuses.

Most times it is lack of concentration. The greatest champions in all sport are the people that have learned to control concentration. In shooting it would be impossible to hold your concentration completely for the whole event, so you must learn to hold your concentration for those few seconds it takes you to shoot one (1) target. Remember it is not a 25 target event, but one target at a time repeated 25 times.

Control of concentration will not come easy, so a lot of practise must be put into it to succeed. Practise concentration when ever you can, all you need is a few seconds that you are on your own, sit quietly and look at something, like trees, houses, people. Practise trying to get absorbed in them, then focus all your attention on one item, let all other vision blur into the background, let all external sounds become inaudible. Connect with that target, hold your concentration for a few seconds, then relax and let your thoughts wander, taking in all things you first looked at, then re-focus back on to that target, and you will find with practise, you will be able to hold your concentration for a longer period.

Worry is one of the greatest inhibitors of skilled performance, worry of fellow competitor, worry of not performing well. You must learn to view competition in a less worrying way, one strategy you could try when sooting is to learn to relax when it is not your turn to shoot, let your mind wander, but when it is your turn to shoot, use the closing of the gun as the signal to concentrate. Work out a few key words to say to yourself, such as, keep head on stock, swing through the target, keep the swing going, and last, but not least, LOOK for the target to leave the trap house and then call for your target. If you work on this, all distractions will soon disappear. After you have fired at your target and whether you hit or miss there is nothing you can do, so you must not worry about it but concentrate on your next target. Once you have learnt to control your concentration, you will be on your way to performing at your optimum level.

Regarding the change to 28gr/loz loads; I read in the magazine that after much detailed discussion by many groups, committees etc, it has been agreed to change to loz load in the method described in the magazine.



MENTAL VISION

Try to have an open, searching mind so you can understand the essence of this article which relates to one of my favourite wisdoms: "You only LOOK with your EYES, you really SEE with your MIND." This I believe is not fully understood by the multitude of sportsmen.

This I believe is not fully understood by the multitude of sportsmen. For the past 42 years, I have served the sporting world with our famous sport glasses and believe me, I have heard all the excuses for missing a target and then some!!

Here within is my personal observation and analysis of why you are not one of the champs breaking all the targets.

First let's take your eyes. They are a unique instrument which channels light rays through a hole (your pupil) and transmits light into brain waves. There is a lot more technical and medical terminology to explain this process, however, at this moment I am interested in conveying to you your reaction to this process.

Do you really see what you're looking at? Think about it! It's your turn to shoot...the target goes out and keeps flying...."Lost Bird". What do we hear some say?

"Oh that jet stream bothered me"..."Oh those damn kids yelling behind me made me lose my concentration"..."This squad I'm on has lousy timing" and so on and so on go the excuses. What does it all boil down to? Lack of mental discipline and mental

What does it all boil down to? Lack of mental discipline and mental vision. Most of you have the finest equipment money can buy and you have the knowledge and experience of the sport. Why are you always an "Also run posting bridesmaid scores"?

Let us analyse the mind. What is the mind? You have a brain but where is the mind? Your mind is your state of consciousness functioning through your brain. Then VISION IS A STATE OF CON-SCIOUSNESS interpreted by the mind via your brain capacity. Think about it! WHAT YOU ARE IS WHAT YOU THINK! SO, CONSCIOUS-NESS IS WHAT YOU REALLY ARE.

All the champions I have served these past 42 years have all shown me, in their own individual ways — confidence, discipline and one mindedness. In other words they have a strong conviction within themselves that they are a champion and they "go for it" every time they perform.

Without mental discipline, our minds wander and our thoughts become interruptions to our concentration. How do we overcome this lack of concentration and become "Captains of our own ship master of our own destiny?" It is not easy but it can be done. There are many ways to discipline the self into a higher and more successful life. First you must have the deep desire and apply the discipline to a search that will unfold with you. Read some biographies of famous people to see the hurdles and problems they overcame to become the champion of their profession. It takes a lot of YOU to get the little you out of the way so the champion can come through. THE ONLY COMPETITIOR YOU HAVE TO BEAT IS YOUR UNDISCIPLINE MIND. Your body and mind will serve your mental vision well . . . if your consciousness transmits concentrated discipline to the NOW of your reactions. Think about it! The last minute is gone forever... the future minute can't help you until it becomes NOW. NOW is the only moment you can live and react. Your concentrated now moment continually activated with the confidence and discipline will reward you as a champion.

The computer industry has a favourite clicke which can be applied to your mental vision process. "Garbage in . . . garbage out". In other words, what we let enter our minds becomes a law unto cur life. We either entertain positive thoughts or negative thoughts and those we accept in our minds will make or break us as champions. Now you know why I have always called you "champ". NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS HANDICAP CARDS

Conditions of Entry

Nominations will not be accepted from any shooter who cannot produce a stamped handicap card or have the handicapper approve the reason for not being able to do so. The issue of a duplicate card by the handicapper will incur a charge of \$20.

All shooters from AA to C grades must present their card to the handicopper for stamping prior to nominating.

SKEET CHALLENGE TROPHY

With the introduction of the International Skeet Competition, persons qualifying for all competitive teams are advised of their entitlement to obtain at their own cost, an Australian blazer to denote their achievement in becoming a member of an Australian Team competing for the "Skeet Challenge Trophy".

Details of the availability of Australian blazers are available from the National Office.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY — NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 25, two visits to the traps.
- 3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interferring with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 15. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s), and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over **400** targets of the National Program.
- 16. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID OPEN OR SECTION.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.
- 19. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors --- Tournament Director to adjudicate.





FACTS ABOUT CHOKE PERFORMANCE

Ross Williams has been writing a weekly shooting column for the sports section of *The Weekly Times*, Australia's biggest-selling rural newspaper, since 1977. The following article is reprinted by permission from that column.

In shotguns, the choke is a narrowing of the bore at the muzzle end, its purpose being to modify the spread of the shot. It is also one of the least understood aspects of shotgun design.

Because we use labels like quarter and half or modified and full to describe a gun's choking, many a beginner assumes that all chokes with the same label will produce the same result. A half choke is a half choke, and that's that.

Actually the choke is one part of a system with many variables.

Some of those variables concern the internal dimensions of the barrel from the chamber onwards. Others have to do with the choke itself; each choke is a combination of angles and dimensions which vary from maker to maker and even from gun to gun. Consequently each gun behaves like an individual.

The ammuniation, too, is part of the system, so a change in the cartridge recipe will affect the shot pattern thrown by a given barrel and choke.

To open up the pattern, for instance, we can switch to softer pellets or, at the expense of extra recoil, increase the muzzle velocity. Conversely, harder shot and lower velocities will cause the pattern to tighten. It's easy to see why. Both the hardness of the shot and the velocity affect the number of pellets deformed by the stresses of fining, and how badly they are deformed. More misshapen pellets equals lower pattern percentages.

Modifying these broad variations we have factors like the rate of acceleration within the barrel and the wad design.

Let's imagine two loads with the same muzzle velocity. If one gives the shot charge a sharp initial push while the other accelerates the pellets more smoothly, we can expect a slightly looser pattern from the former. The reason is that pellet deformation will be greater if the shot charge suffers a swifter kick in the backside.

This swifter kick is mainly provided by faster powders and hotter primers. Thus a change of propellant or primer can alter the pattern even when there is no difference in the speed of the pellets when they leave the barrel.

Other factors are the size of the shot (smaller pellets tend to give looser patterns, all else being equal) and the number of pellets in the charge. If we increase the shot charge by 6% (a standard increment) without altering the pellet size, we will often find more than a 6% increase in the number of strikes in the standard 30-inch circle at 40 yards.

In other words, adding pellets to the charge normally tightens the pattern. The reason is probably that, in the larger charge, a higher percentage of the pellets at the centre and front of the charge are protected from deformation.

Wads also influence results. Firstly, differences in their design lead to differences in the actual burning rate of the propellant. These in turn alter the muzzle velocity and the rate of acceleration — and we already know what that means.

Secondly, wads vary in the cushioning they offer to the shot charge. Some plastic wads are slightly better than others at protecting the pellets at the bottom or rear end. All reduce the deformation of pellets around the outer edges of the charge where the wad's petals prevent abrasion by the barrel walls. Sidewall protection is believed to be the main reason why plastic wads throw tighter patterns than the old style wadding. Certainly, short-petalled plastic wads will open up patterns to be a measurable extent.

So everything depends on the mixture of variables built into the gun and its ammunition. A gun may have a nominal ¼ choke up front, for example, yet the actual pattern percentages can easily run anywhere from quarter to full.





Peter Quire has been appointed Competition Manager/Shoot Marshall, with Tim Catling (WA) appointed to assist.



The program of matches for the Australian Grand Prix will be announced dependent on the response. Be assured the quality of trophies and presentations will be of the highest standard.




