



## EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS NOTES



At the time of writing it is still the festive season with an exciting New Year to look forward to. On behalf of the office I would like to thank all those people and the many clubs who sent us Christmas greetings and their best wishes for 1992, they are very much appreciated. We take this opportunity to extend our best wishes and hope that 1992 brings with it health and happiness for all.

#### **Executive Committee**

The old year brought about some late changes, firstly to the make up of the National Executive Committee where two members have unformately lost their positions owing to a clause in the constitution which disallows an Executive Member to have either a direct or indirect interest in any contract with the Association. This clause has affected Victorian, Graham Mahoney and South Australian, Graeme Michell whose positions have been declared vacant by the Executive Committee who were given no alternative according to the advice received. The ACTA is investigating the matter on behalf of both Grahams, however with little success to date owing to the very specific wording of the constitution. Unless an answer to the problem is found both the VCTA and SACTA will each be appointing a new member to the Executive Committee. It is very disappointing when situations such as this do occur, however the fact of the matter is that the Association is bound by its constitution whatever the end result may be, in this case a most unfortunate one.

The second change to occur is the appointment of Tasmanian President Alan Kenny to replace Stuart Browning on the National Executive Committee. Stuart after many years on the Executive has decided to give his best efforts to the area which he most enjoys, coaching. As State Coaching Director, Stuart will continue to play an important role. At the same time Alan Kenny who is well versed in administration through his employment and as Tasmanian State President will quickly make his mark at National level. On behalf of all we welcome him to his newly elected role, at the same time saying farewell to Stuart who we thank for his contribution to clay target shooting as a member of the National Executive Committee.

#### **National Office**

A third change is that we have unfortunately lost the valued services of Megan Smith who joined the Association in April 1991 to handle the accounting side of the office. Megan has had an opportunity to work towards obtaining her chartered accountants degree and while we were very disappointed at losing her services, understand that she has made the right career decision. With the bad comes the good which in this case is the appointment of Gina DiLullo to replace Megan. Gina joined the Association on January 3rd and we wish her well in what hopefully will be an enjoyable working experience.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY — NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISU Skeet.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 Targets.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. The persons designated as scorer/referee or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the services of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role SHALL INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTER-NATIONAL RULES.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 15. High gun awards are determined for each section irrespective of the nomination paid. To be eligible for high gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective high gun.
- 16. Shooters who are eligible for a reduced nomination and elect to pay the full open nomination shall be eligible for recognition in the open section only. One nomination only may be paid. Shooters who are eligible for and elect to pay a reduced nomination, (60% of the open nomination) for their respective division, ladies and juniors shall, having so declared their section of competition only be eligible for recognition in the section nominated (UIT Rules).
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.

- Competitors using automatic shotguns during the National Championships may recover their empty shells providing they have obtained an automatic ID card when nominating.
- Nominations will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director.
- 20. Practice of card playing at the Nationals Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas, or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- The Olympic finals system will be used to determined the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.
- 22. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors

   — Tournament Director to adjudicate.

#### QUEENSLAND LICENSING LAWS

With the introduction of firearms licensing in Queensland as from 1st January, all interstate and/or overseas visitors must by law obtain a visitors licence.

Visitors licences can be obtained by contacting: The Authorised Officer, Weapons Registry, Police HQ GPO Box 1440, Brisbane Qld 4000. Telephone (07) 364 4417, Fax (07) 236 1694.

No person shall be eligible to contest the Olympic Discipline National Championship being held at Brisbane Gun Club from February 10–16 unless a visitors licence can be produced.

Arrangements have been made for applicants for visitors licences to complete the necessary application at the Brisbane Gun Club on Monday February 10.

Please Note: A copy of your existing state licence is required together with the application fee of \$5.

## RULE CLARIFICATION — ISU SKEET

#### **GUN POSITION**

The current edition of the UIT's Special Technical Rules for Clay Target Shooting (dated 1st January, 1989) clearly outlines the requirements for gun position and jacket marking in ISU Skeet events.

These rules state . . .




Figure 1 Ready Position

S.6.23a "Until the target appears the competitor must stand in the ready position with both feet in the shooting station boundaries holding the gun with both hands (see Fig.1). The gunstock must be in contact with the body of the shooter with the toe of the stock on or below the marking tape (see Fig.1) and must remain in that position until the target appears.

S.6.23b No prolongation of the gun butt is permitted. To aid the referee in controlling the position of the gun, a mark approximately 25cm long and 2cm wide MUST be permanently affixed (see Fig.1) on the right side of the outergarment (left side for left hand shooters) according to the height of the crest (top) of the individual's hip bone. The outer garment is any shooting coat, vest, sweater, shirt etc which is worn by the shooter and visible to the referee and jury during shooting."

The points that need emphasising from the rules are as follows:


- The gun position may be anywhere on or below a line from the crest of the hip bone to the centre of the stomach (approx.)
- Shooters jackets MUST have a marking tape PERMANENTLY affixed to their jackets.

3. The gunstock must be touching the body.

The rules relating to these points are clear and the penalties applied to each breach of the rules are laid down (a warning for the first infringement, followed by the loss of one target for subsequent violation).

As incorrect gun position is a breach of the rules, so is the failure to have a permanently affixed mark on the shooting jacket. For many years, shooters have seen it as the responsibility of referees or jury members to 'tape' competitions prior to commencing a competition. This is not correct. As having a tape permanently fixed to the outer garment is a mandatory requirement of entry to the competition, it is the responsibility of the shooter and shooters who do not comply with the rules may be penalised accordingly.

With the introduction of 28g LOADS for all National Titles other than the Grand Australian Handicap random checks will take place during the course of the Nationals to ensure that the 28g load is not exceeded. A tolerance factor of +2% will be taken into consideration.

If in any doubt to the weight of your cartridges or only curious the opportunity will exist for all shooters to weight test their cartridges.

#### GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP 1992 DTL NATIONALS 36g - 11/40z

Acting upon a recommendation from the National Rules Committee the Executive Committee have deferred their decision to introduce 28g loads for the 1992 Grand Australian Handicap until the completion of the current rules review at which specific attention will be given to the effect of 28g loads on handicap shooting in its recent form.

All other events at the Wagga Nationals will be contested with 28g loads.

#### **VETERAN STATUS**

IT HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE ACTA THAT VETERAN STATUS ON AT LEAST ONE OCCASION HAS BEEN PUBLISHED AS BEING OVER 55 — THIS IS INCORRECT.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT THE RULES GOVERNING CLAY TARGET SHOOTING ARE COMPLIED WITH ON ALL OCCASIONS, FOR THE BETTERMENT OF SHOOTING AND EQUALITY OF COMPETITION.


The shoot off is conducted by shooting a sequence of double barrel, single barrel, pointscore, handicap, continental and double rise targets.

Of the nine shooters eligible to compete two were juniors. It may have been easy to assume that these two lads would buckle under the pressure and be a push over.





Goodbye 1991, hello 1992. But let's not wipe off 1991 so quickly, for what a year it was.



The excitement of watching our Michael Diamond shooting off the medal placement in the open trap event, and the sheepish look of pleasure on the faces of our Juniors on the dais to collect their bronze medal in the Junior Double Trap event, and Kathy and Deserie winning silver and bronze in the Womens Trap Section of the Australian Grand Prix. You should have all been there.

Julian Womble of Great Britain, winner of the Junior Double Trap event, who in fact, shot one target more than the winner of the Open Double Trap Event.

The team from China who left their men at home because they were not shooting well enough, but fielded a full team of women in both trap and skeet. But to be fair, the Italians, who only brought one woman with them, she did win the bronze medal in the Womens Trap Event, as their other women were not performing well enough.

The three Hungarian women skeet shooters, until Perth the reigning Women World Champions, who we found out over dinner one night, have been shooting the discipline for 20 years, and that home club for two of them is in Budapest on an island in the middle of the Danube River.

Pinky Le Grille, who has dual Belgium/British Citizenship, and until recently shot for Belgium, but due to a "difference of opinion" now shoots for Great Britain. Pinky won a Womens Quota for the Barcelona Olympics for Belgium and then a similar quota for Great Britain. Her mother was born in Tasmania so really she could be "OZ"!

The evergreen Susan Natrass from Canada, the silver medalist in the Womens Trap, also competed at the other World Championship in Australia, held in Melbourne in 1973, has won a Womens Quota for the Barcelona Olympics for Canada.

The Korean Jury Man, demonstrating how the Japanese bow in greeting, and how the Australian wave their arms to brush off the flies.

The Russian team, who it was rumoured, were allocated \$5.00 per day for expenses, had brought with them items to sell, like caviar, beautiful colourful tea urns and hand carved wooden bears.



#### **EDITORS MAILBOX**

The Editor

After varying results with Mulwex AS-50 powder I looked forward to the introduction of Mulwex AS-30 which supposedly duplicates

Herchies Red Dot in volume, weight and performance.

The fast burning rate of AS-30 is certainly an asset as it appears that loz load pattern is better with faster burning powder. An article by Don Zutz who is at the forefront of Rifle and Shotgun reloading, in the USA. He found, as a result of this testing that powders similar to Red Dot produce better patterns than the more traditional, slower burning powders. The conclusion that he reached was that the faster burning powder had completed most of its burning by the time it reached the choke, therefore the wad did not suffer the stress of a slower burning powder that had not completed its burning (i.e. still producing pressure) at the choke. To prove this he used Bulls Eye (faster than Red Dot) powder with loz of shot to produce 92% patterns.

To start my testing using a CHRONY I loaded a 18.5gr AS-30 with loz of No. 7, along with a Winchester 209 primer and a Eley 1%oz wad.

There is two reasons why the Eley wad was used, firstly I have found that an 1½oz wad gives a better pattern with 1oz of shot and the diameter of the wad is less than the Winchester wad.

As my Beretta 682 has fairly tight bores I felt that the recoil and build of plastic could be reduced by the smaller diameter wad, my subsequent finding was that the Eley wad produces a slightly higher velocity (see table 1).

Loads of 19.5gr and 200gr were also loaded (see Table 1).

To say the least I was impressed with the results, the velocities advertised appear similar to those I recorded.

It was also pleasing to find that there was no noticeable muzzle flash, even though I was testing just on evening, believe it or not CHRONY's operate best with subdued even light, i.e. around evening time.

In summary, AS-30 appears to be an excellent powder for trap and skeeting shootings, with the bonus that it's Australian made.

Dear Sir.

It is not my habit to write letters to the editor regarding topics connected with clay target shooting, so for the first and I hope the last time, here goes.

Firstly I have been an ACTA member for the best part of forty years, a trap and skeet referee almost as long. The "refusal" rule — How many targets can a shooter refuse? If the referee cannot call the FIRST refusal lost, then the rule only satisfies the cheats among us, we all know one target wins or loses a shoot.

Mainly I want to answer all those negative thinking shooters who are on about the loz load, namely R. Burgess, B. Joy, M. Swale, S. Bates and D. Seawright. This sport is expensive as Mr Bates says, but a new bar for his press and a new bush surely is a minor part of his annual cost. As the rule does not come into force until 1993 we all have twelve months to use up the 32 gram wads.

I am under the impression that clubs were notified re this matter, certainly my own club, the Sunshine Coast Club were and voted on

it at a general meeting, in the affirmative.

Mr Chizzotti, I doubt very much the loz load will cause ACTA shooters to embrace Field and Game shooting. It is not a push over as you may think, 25 targets straight on any ground is unusual and not because they cannot shoot. Try it sometime, you could be surprised, and 1 oz loads are still adequate, I have personally used them exclusively for 5 years or more. I really think "trench" tells the whole story, their scores did not suffer from the use of this loz load.

Mr Swale you worry about handicap shooting! What handicap shooting? When I saw your complaint I checked the ACTA news and surprise, surprise! Forty-five clubs advertised seventy one-day programs for two hundred and eighty three separate up to 25 target and over events, just thirteen handicap events all on. We hardly ever shoot handicap and that is where the excessive turnover in new shooters is really caused. Shooting off 15 metres alongside all the hot shots does nothing to encourage them at all, and what help do they get from their fellow club members, all clubs please consider this very urgently, then and only then will the shooter turnover slow down a bit.

The doubting members have twelve months to get stuck into finding a good load. Put your minds to it instead of knocking it and I am sure you will be pleasantly surprised.

I am writing in reply to your letter dated the 26th December, 1991 in which you seek advice concerning the inheritance of firearms.

I wish to advise you that due to the provisions of Section 23 (2A) (a) of the Firearms Act 1958, should a person inherit or as executor etc, come into possession of firearms that were held by a deceased person then such beneficiary etc has a period of six (6) months in which to come within the law (obtain a licence and register the firearms) without fear of prosecution.

## DIAMOND ON TARGET FOR MLC AWARD

After his second placing in the World Championships in November, Goulburn clay target shooter, Michael Diamond has now set his sights on a gold medal at the Barcelona Olympic Games. He has also become an early favourite to take out this year's New South Wales MLC Junior Sports Achiever Award.

Following the championships, he was officially selected in the Australian team to contest the Olympic trench discipline in Barcelona. Diamond is one of 500 scholarship holders who are supported

through MLC's \$650,000 national junior sports sponsorship program.

Monthly nominees for Achiever of the Year awards in each state are selected from outstanding performances across the 41 individual sports covered by the scholarship scheme. Last year's New South Wales title went to champion Australian gynmast, Monique Allen.

At only 14 years of age, Diamond was the youngest ever to win the world junior championships, in Venezuela in 1987. He retained the junior crown two years later in Italy, becoming the only person to ever win back to back titles.

"Michael was still eligible for the junior championship this year," said his father Con, "but he wanted to try out in open competition against the best in the world."

"After doing so well, he believes he has the ability to win the gold medal in Barcelona."

Prior to the World Championships, Diamond won the Grand Prix of Nations event, defeating Venturini and all the other competitors who went on to contest the world championships.

Con Diamond, a club shooter with the Dapto and Canberra International Gun Club, has coached his son since he first took up the sport at the age of nine.

"It was obvious very early that he had a lot of potential," said Con, "but he has also worked very hard. He is very fit, and dedicated to being the best."

"He's also had a lot of assistance. We're very thankful to companies like MLC for providing the financial support Michael has needed."

"The family has been supporting him, but it's a very expensive sport, especially with all the travel that is involved."

Another one hundred and eighteen elite New South Wales juniors from 31 sports are also supported by the MLC scholarship program this year, worth \$156,000.

The junior Sports Federation has contributed more than \$1.1 million to the development of junior sport in the state since the program's inception in 1981.

In addition to a cash grant of \$1000 each, scholarship holders receive sports clothing and attend an intensive MLC sportscamp program.

If Diamonds does win the MLC Achiever of the Year award, he will recieve a further cash grant of \$1000 and a trophy.

How lovely it was to see two of the district's senior shooters at the Chris Walker Memorial Handicap held in Wangaratta in October Both gentlemen, Alex Jamieson (left) and George Walker (right) are eight-three years of age and had plenty to talk about the "good old days" of shooting.

Alex from Corowa NSW commenced shooting competitively at the age of twelve years at a Hopefield sport meeting. During his shooting career he won many district championships (both live bird and clay targets), the first in 1929 at Rutherglen and the last in 1989 at Corowa. At one stage during the fifties he was one of only ten shooters in the Commonwealth to shoot off the 26 yard mark.


Alex keeps in very good health but sadiy, because of failing eye sight no longer competes although he regularly attends the Corowa shoots to have a chat with the boys.

George Walker of Wangaratta commenced shooting in Euroa in 1927, when live bird shooting was readily accepted, clays were occasionally used as targets at that time. In 1928 George drove his first car to shoots at Shepparton and Benalla. At Benalla he won the big event of the district by taking out the Good Friday Handicap which had first prize money of fifty pounds.

George's shooting career had many successes too numerous to mention, but three of the most memorable were in 1949 when he won the Commonwealth mixed bird Championship and in 1950 when he took out the Victorian Galah Championship followed by the Loddon Valley mixed big bird championship, the latter being when it was reputed he broke the bookies.

George adapted equally as well to clay target shooting after live birds were no longer used by winning many club and district championships, until he last shot in 1990.

Unfortunately due to poor health George is no longer able to shoot, but attends the Club in October to be present together with his family for the presentations of trophies for the event held in honour of the memory of his grandson, Chris Walker.



Both Alex and George held the position of President for their respective clubs for many years, and are held in very high esteem by the local shooting fraternity.

Their years of dedication, together with the enormous amount of time and effort they have freely given, has greatly contributed towards the establishment of their respective clubs. They have been awarded Life Memberships in recognition of this, which is something both gentlemen can be justifiably proud of.

So we pack up the targets, the guns and the kids,


And go back to where we came from.


