



#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS** NOTES



During the course of the Olympic Discipline Nationals a meeting took place between State nominated persons for the purpose of electing one from those nominated to a position on the National ISU Shooting Committee as the shooters representative.

Nominations were received from four states: NSW Brian Rosser; Old David Menck; WA Terry Morony and Tasmania Jim Briggs, all of whom are well known to shooters of the ISU disciplines throughout all states. The meeting which was chaired by National Shooting Committe Chairman, Mr Robert Smith, elected David Menck to the position.

With John Summers shortly to be competing in Los Angeles prior joining Russell Mark and Michael Diamond at a pre-Olympic competition in Barcelona. Following pre-Olympic competition all three will be joined by Robert Smith who has been appointed Team Manager for the European World Cup. Robert and the Olympic Trap Shooting Team will be strengthened by the inclusion of Greg Newey, a member of the 1991 World Championships team for the World Cup in Italy.

While the Olympic team are comppeting as part of their pre-Olympic preparation, Greg is participating on a self-funded basis as part of his overall goal to improve his shooting skills to their highest degree, we wish them all well.

#### **Olympic Games**

Another plus for clay target shooters was the recent appointment of Robert Smith to the position of Olympic Shooting Team Coach for Barcelona. Robert will be looking after a seven member team which will no doubt appreciate the efforts that he will be making on their behalf as they strive for personal and country honours. Robert is a well experienced person at world competition level and will be assisted by the experience which has brought for him recognition as a B grade UTT Judge at Level 3 Coach in Australia.

Competition for a position in the five member team to compete in Wales during July of this year will no doubt be keen during the Wagga Trap Nationals. The team is scheduled to depart from Australia in time to arrive in London on July 4, travelling to Wales to shoot their match during three days of competition commencing Friday July 10, before returning to Australia from London on July 14, after what should be a memorable experience.

#### **National Shooting Ground**

Investigations are taking place into the possibility of establishing a National Shooting Ground with the matter to be discussed in depth at a meeting of the National Executive Committee in June of this year. Opinions are many and varied on the subject of a National Shooting Ground, a subject which is certain to invoke comment amongst shooters from all states.

#### Membership

Despite the economic climate, membership has remained on par with 1991, which indicates that while things may be tough, the desire to remain a registered clay target shooter is still strong enough to find the way to do so. Hopefully for all concerned the difficult period which has affected so many will soon be a thing of the past and shooters will be able to get back to what they enjoy doing most, breaking targets.

#### Glenn Cup

With Australian shooters in New Zealand to shoot the NZ Nationals, the opportunity to win back the Glen Cup will feature strongly in the events leading up to team selection. Executive member John Murphy (Tas), will oversee the selection of the Australian team who will be giving their best in this traditional team match between Australia and New Zealand.

#### International High Gun — Australia/New Zealand

1992 sees the introduction of a High Gun Trophy over both countries National Championships with scores from New Zealand carried over to the Wagga Nationals. A Gold Southern Cross Badge and High Gun Sash will be awarded to the winner plus seven days accommodation and return air fare to the New Zealand or Australian Nationals in 1993, should provide for an interesting competition.

#### **Trap Nationals**

Please be aware of one of the conditions of entry for the Trap National Championships, namely condition (9) which has been introduced in an attempt to ensure that shooting on each day of the Nationals Championships is able to commence as close to the advertised starting time as possible. The introduction of this new system should eliminate the problem as well as ensure that shooters who nominate so they are placed in the last squad support their fellow shooters with refereeing and scoring.

Good luck to all who are shooting the Wagga Trap Nationals.

#### Double Trap

Those who shoot this Olympic discipline will no doubt be interested in the news that Double Trap for both men and women has been added to the shooting program of the XXVI Olympiad, Atlanta 1996.

With Double Trap now an Olympic event, every effort must be given to promoting this discipline in Australia as for some time many shooters have not taken this event seriously.

#### ANNUAL TWO DAY SKEET **CARNIVAL**

Tamworth Clay Target Club shooters took more than half of the trophies at the annual two day skeet carnival last weekend.

Of the 40 trophies being competed for, 21 were awarded to Tamworth shooters including five of the eight high gun trophies.

The most impressive win for the weekend was by President Col Burt who won the overall high gun with a fine score of 198/200 and was first and second in two events.

Fifty shooters from Queensland, all over New South Wales and the Victorian border competed in perfect weather conditions for the magnificent trophies generously sponsored by Hitachi Power Tools, Prouds the Jewellers, Humes, Gasweld, Ranger Tools and Equipment Lowestoft Herefords and Westherall Engineering.

Numbers were down slightly from last year which is attributed somewhat to the flooding throughout the state and to the clashing

with the ISU National Championships at Brisbane.

Graham and Rae Richardson had the Loomberah complex looking magnificent for the carnival and Rae and her contingent of assistants did a fine job of catering for the shooters and visitors.

## - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

 In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate

Handicap Card.

- Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25 one visit only to the traps.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/ 75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once
  a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score.
  Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be
  credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penality of a loss of one target for their falling to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a Hearing with the appointed Jury.
- 13. Optional Sweep/Purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for Sweep/Purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 14. Optional Sweep/Purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 16. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun awards, Section(s) and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
- 17. The Overall winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they

- are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID OPEN OR SECTION.
- 18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.
- 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors
   — Tournament Director to adjudicate.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY — SQUADDING

Your attention is drawn to clause (9) of the Conditions of Entry for the National Trap Championship which reads: Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

Details relating to the conditions are contained on the back of the trap nationals nomination form.

#### HANDICAPPING — NATIONALS 1992

To make it easier for all concerned — office staff, handicapper and shooters — we would like all shooters to please note and adhere to the following points:

- Please present your current 1992 handicap card for stamping before nominating. Also your up to date 1991 card.
- Nominations will not be accepted unless cards are stamped by the handicapper.
- Any shooters unable to produce a 1992 handicap card, must produce a club receipt as proof of ACTA registration.
- Such shooter shall be allowed to compete on handicap and grade given. But any moneys or trophies won shall be held by the ACTA until proof of handicap and grade are verified.
- Rule 2.1(m). Should it be found that a shooter deliberately misled Management regarding his grade and/or handicap, the shooter will be suspended for a period of three months.
- If an error is made on your card, have your club secretary or handicapper neatly rule out the error, rewrite it correctly, stamp and sign it.
- Any obvious low scores entered on handicap cards just prior to the Nationals that enables a shooter to be downgraded, will not be taken into consideration. Rule 2.7(a).
- Please watch the handicap board, if your name appears on the board, please report to the handicapper's office.
- If you do not wish to be downgraded, please advise the handicapper's office.

#### CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION — ENTRY

Entry into the 1992 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1992 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1991 and 1992 registration cards, before nominating, to the 1992 Nationals Office Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1991 he/she must produce his 1992 registration card.

#### DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions except in the 40th Australian Double Barrel Championship, where there is a separate Australian Women's Double Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Double Barrel Championship, as well as the 38th National Single Barrel Championship where there is a separate Women's Single Barrel Championship and an Australian Junior Single Barrel Championship.

Shooters may nominate in any one section of an event — Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran. Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall only be eligible for the section entered, as well as all High Gun awards.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the open team irrespective of the section nominated for In addition to open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

#### AGE QUALIFICATIONS

Veterans — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 4, 1992. Juniors — are those competitors who, on April 4, 1992 will be under the age of 18 years.

#### STARTING TIME

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30 am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be resquadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

#### CARTRIDGES

For other than the Grand Australian Handicap (36g) load size for all National Title events is limited to 28g struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice including reloads may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships from Winchester and Scorpio both of whom are licensed to the ACTA for cartridge sales on the ground for the period embracing the Pre Nationals and National Championships.

#### TARGETS AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be magpie and will be supplied by Winchester Australia. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

#### CLASSIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the competitors to see that their entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to grades, open, ladies, juniors and veterans divisions. Contestants are reminded that regrading and rehandicaping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules Ladies, Juniors and Veterans who have elected to enter the open section will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as: OL, OJ, OV.

#### PRACTICE

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

#### CASH PRIZES

Cash prizes will be awarded in all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and the Deauville Doubles, to the Overall winner and the winner of each grade.

The cash prize for the overall winner shall be calculated on 50¢ per nomination, the grade winner shall also be calculated on 50¢ per nomination.

#### SHOOT-OFFS, CONTINUATION OF EVENTS

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time if considered necessary. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off, on the following day.

#### **NOMINATIONS ALL EVENTS**

The year of 1991 witnessed some very unexpected changes within our Association, with the planned restructuring of the sub-committees within our National Executive being implemented mid year.

Consequently, as a result of the formation of these sub-committees in which all National Executive members; Finance: Chairman R. Silvester, Coaching: Chairman R. Silvester, Development & Promotion: Chairman R. Fox, National Championships: Chairman R. Fox, Rules: Chairman R. Smith, National Shooting: R. Smith are actively involved with specific roles, there will now be a greater opportunity for the National Executive to be able to make better, wiser and more rapid decisions, on matters affecting all of our members within our sport.

Our National Executive at present is possibly one of the youngest experience wise we have had for many years, with only three of the fifteen members being in office for more than five years. This situation ultimately gives scope to many new ideas and a surplus of enthusiasm. These two attributes are particularly necessary to help guide the ACTA through these harrowingly economic times. Their enthusiastic input, through their respective sub-committees will bring new and improved promotional activity to our sport, in particular more harmony within our clubs, through to all of you, our members. We are endeavouring to streamline the decision making process of our National Executive.

On behalf of all our members and especially the National Executive, I take this opportunity to sincerely thank our immediate Past President Mr Jim Scott for his long and dedicated role as a member of the National Executive. His two years as Vice President and most importantly the three years as our National President, enabled Jim to carve a permanent and important niche in the ACTA. This achievement was recognised with an ACTA Life Membership being awarded to him. Congratulations Jim, and we hope to see both Jim and Joan Scott at many more National Championships to come.

During this year of changes within our National Executive again I would like to extend sincere gratitude on behalf of our members and the National Executive, to John McVitty (Vic), Mr Pud Burgess (NSW) and Stuart Browning (Tas) for their service to the ACTA. Similarly, I welcome their replacements to the Executive in Mr Graham Mahoney (Vic), Mr Bill Jones (NSW), Mr Alan Kenny (Tas) and my substitute delegate Dennis Lymn (SA).

Financially, the ACTA had a steady but pleasing year. The tough economic climate has shown the Management Committee in particular to be fully aware of the situation and make decisions appropriate to the cause. The Management Committee (Ross Silvester, Bob Fox and Robbie Smith) are to be commended for the responsible attitude and decisions which they either made or commended to the full Executive. It is the positive outlook and careful planning by these men in particular, that has guided the ACTA to a good solid financial result for this year.

Our Executive Director, Alan Maher, is to be recommended for his professional approach to his position, but more importantly, the dedicated manner in which he implements the decisions of our National Executive.

There is however a point which needs to be clarified regarding ACTA operations — whenever a decision is implemented through our head office, and it causes discontent with any of our members, those people immediately lay the blame on Alan Maher, and he is personally criticised for such a decision, whatever it may be. The position of Director of Coaching has changed. Following Mr Guy Boileau's departure during the year, Mr Murray Alexander (WA) has been appointed to this position. Murray, as those of you who know him, is very enthusiastic and has much to offer through his background as a previous WA State Coaching Director. This position is a part-time one and is based on the administration of new and revised coaching techniques and procedures to assist State Coaching Directors for their implementation within their respective states.

The shooting scene at National level again has travelled across our nation. The DTL Nats in Perth was successful and very well attended by most states. Congratulations to the new National Champions, it is interesting to see some new faces on the winners dais.

Across to Wagga for the Skeet Nats, which was also a very successful carnival, with good attendance of competitors in the events. Congratulations to the National Champion Scott Wright and also to the three man team to the USA — Scott Wright, Evan Stephenson and Paul Johnston, three young and very talented shooters, who also made their presence felt in the American Championships. That is a great promotion for skeet shooting.

Adelaide (SA) hosted the Oceania Championships in conjunction with the ISU Nationals which were very well attended, both in skeet and trap. Congratulations to Ian Hale (skeet) and Russell Mark (trench) in winning both the Commonwealth and National ISU Titles in their respective disciplines.

The highlight of this years calendar was the World Shotgun Championships which was held in Perth at Whiteman Park. The Organising Committee under the leadership of ACTA Past President Mr Roy Holtfreter must be congratulated on the presentation of a magnificent spectacle in every aspect of the competition, from the Opening Ceremony to the Closing Ceremony.

The UIT Vice President Mr Horst Schreiber was delighted with the large number of competitors, possibly equal to any other World Shotgun Championship, and also the ceremonies involved which were equal to or better than any others. Very strong words of encouragement indeed!

Very special congratulations for a magnificent achievement for Michael Diamond's silver medal at these World Shotgun Championships, a wonderful promotion for our sport.

Congratulations to our Olympic representatives: Trap - Michael Diamond, Russell Mark; Skeet — John Summers, and on behalf of all of you, we wish them every success, a strong and friendly competition, and above all pride in representing Australia at the Barcelona Olympics in 1992.

The National Shooting Ground proposal is currently in hand, with submissions in hand from NSW (Wagga area and Deniliquin area) and SA (Virginia area). The very important issues to be addressed in this instance are: Location — shooting area with no noise/pollution problems, central to the mainstream shooters, easy access by road and air, accommodation availability, interests for non shooting family members; Cost — overall costs from stage one onwards must be within the ACTA ability to be serviced, regarding long term loans. Our National Executive and the Promotions Sub Committee will be very cautious and resolute in making their recommendations on this matter. However, your comments and relevant criticism on these proposals at the ACTA AGM (Wagga) would be appreciated.

Special thanks to our head office staff, Leanne, Gloria and Megan who all work well together and certainly help Alan Maher to make the office operate as efficiently as it does.

Finally sincere thanks to Alan Maher for being so responsive and so helpful in our work together. #### **ANNUAL REPORT 1991**

It is my pleasure to be able to present to members the Balance Sheet and Annual Report of the Association for the year ending 31st December 1991. In presenting the report, the traditional format has been adhered to.

#### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

As required by the Association's Statement of Rules and Purposes, the National Executive Committee is comprised of two persons, appointed by their respective State Association for a period of two years, with the Executive Committee then electing from their number Mr Jim Scott from NSW to the position of National President, with Mr John McVitty from Victoria elected as National Vice President. During the year, Mr Scott tendered his resignation from all positions in the Association — an action which required an election to fill the important position of National President. Prior to the election taking place, advice was received of the resignation of Vice President, Mr McVitty, from the National Executive Committee.

Elections were held to fill the vacant positions, with Mr Leighton Martin from (SA) elected as National President and Mr Ross Silvester (WA) elected to the position of National Vice President, with advice subsequently received of the appointment of Mr Denis Lymn to the Executive as the replacement member for the National President representing South Australia, and Mr Graham Mahoney appointed by Victoria to replace Mr McVitty following his resignation. During the year a constitutional matter arose which prevented Mr Graeme Michell of SA and Mr Graham Mahoney of Victoria occupying positions on the National Executive Committee. With the matter unresolved, the Executive Committee were operating less two members, which did not allow the Committee to operate as efficiently as would be desired. In addition, Mr Stuart Browning, Tasmania, first appointed to the Executive in 1985, announced his intention not to seek a further term on the Executive Committee, and was replaced at National level by TCTA President, Mr Alan Kenny, with Mr Bill Jones appointed by NSW to the position vacated by Mr Scott.

While the unfortunate disruptions to the composition of the Executive Committee certainly had their affect on the progress of the Association during the year of review, members of the Executive are anxious to regain lost ground and during the coming year will continue to achieve this objective.

Appreciation is extended on behalf of all members and shooters to those members who have vacated their positions as members of the Executive Committee, having worked over the years in an endeavour to assist the Association and Clay Target Shooting in general.

#### MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Owing to the resignation of Mr Scott and Mr Mcvitty, Mr Leighton Martin (SA) and Mr Robert Smith (NSW) were elected to the Committee, Leighton in his capacity as National President and Robert elected by the Executive — both of whom joined Ross Silvester (WA) and Bob Fox (NT) on this important Committee.

Sub-Committees were elected under the Chairmanship of three members of Management: Ross Silvester — National Coaching Council/Finance; Bob Fox — National Championships/Promotion Development; Robert Smith — National Shooting/Rules. The difficulties experienced on the Executive Committee had their effect on Management, and indeed all Sub-Committees, with the result that activity at Sub-Committee level was greatly reduced and the organisational structure under which the Association operates unable to operate to its greatest capacity.

#### NATIONAL COACHING COUNCIL

The departure of the Director of Coaching in May had an effect on the production of coaching materials and publications which had been scheduled to be introduced in the second half of the year. It is regrettable to all that the National Coaching Council, which is made up of seven State appointed Coaching Directors under the guidance of a National Director of Coaching, is not enjoying the position in the sport that it justly deserves.

Steps have been taken to correct this situation with the appointment of Mr Murray Alexander to the position of National Director of Coaching, effected at the 1st January, 1992. Murray has outlined his priorities to the role he will occupy in a part time capacity and left no doubts as to his ability to have the National Coaching Council reinstated to its rightful position. As a former WA State Director of

Coaching, Murray is well credentialled in the coaching area, and an accredited Level 3 Coach. Difficulties will be experienced in the short and long term, however it is of the utmost importance to the future of the Coaching Council that Murray is given the opportunity to reinstate the Coaching Program to initially its former level from where growth can once again be obtained.

#### **AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION**

During the year the Australian Shooting Association conducted meetings on matters relating to the welfare of all Shooting Disciplines. Shotgun delegates, Robert Smith and Alan Maher, represented the ACTA on issues which mainly involved shooting on the international scene. The President, Mr Alastair MacPherson, and members of the ASA Management Committee attended the World Trap/Skeet Championships, which while ostensibly an ACTA competition, were the responsibility of the ASA. When addressing those present at the Championships, Mr MacPherson was warm in his praise of the Association and members of the World Championships Organising Committee, whose efforts on behalf of Australia were outstanding.

During the course of the Championships, UIT Secretary General — Mr Horst Schreiber, expressed the appreciation of the UIT for the manner in which Australia had conducted the World Championships — a fact which would not be overlooked if Australia should make application to the UIT on future occasions to host a major international competition.

#### **AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC COMMITTEE**

With the acceptance by the AOC of the selection system for shooters from all Disciplines, activity at AOC level was in the main, confined to obtaining funds to further develop Australian shooters in their progress towards the Barcelona Olympic Games in 1992. With points able to be obtained as the result of performances achieved at designated World Cups/World Championships, a total of seven shooters were named in the Australian Shooting Team. Shotgun, while having two quotas for both Trap and Skeet, were not able to take up their second Skeet quota as the first level of qualifying conditions had not been met. Trap shooter, Russell Mark, and Skeet shooter, John Summers, although winning World Cups in Los Angeles and Egypt, were not able to accept the country quotas which went with their excellent wins as both had previously secured quotas for Australia during the course of the Oceania Shooting Championships. The seven person Olympic Team named in December were: Olympic Trap: Russel Mark (Vic), Michael Diamond (NSW); Olympic Skeet: John Summers (Vic); Rapid Pistol: Pat Murray (SA); Free Air Pistol: Bengt Sandstrom (WA); Ladies Sport/Air: Lynne-Marie Freh (Old); Air & Free Pistol: Phillip Adams (NSW). We wish them well in their endeavours to obtain country and personal achievements at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona.

#### **AUSTRALIAN SPORTS COMMISSION**

Shooting continues to receive excellent support from the Australian Sports Commission, whose contribution to the success of the Perth World Championships, while not measured in the financial sense alone, amounted to \$75,000. The opportunities afforded to athletes from all Disciplines must not be underestimated, for without this form of support, sport in Australia would not enjoy the level of success that currently exists.

It is now history that the Championships were an outstanding success, with glowing praise received from international visitors and UIT officials on the staging of the event and the magnificent grounds upon which the competition was held.

Many people were involved over a three year period to ensure the success of the Championships, and all are to be commended for their efforts. None more so than Mr Terry Mahoney, who worked tirelessly throughout all stages of planning and preparation. Terry's efforts went far beyond what could reasonably be expected, a fact which must be recognised.

Tremendous support was received from Mr Reg Wagland — Manager of the Whiteman Park Complex and Mrs Alison Harding — WACTA State Secretary, who along with Terry were the mainstays of planning and preparation, each of whom we thank for their efforts.

Roy Holtfreter in his capacity as Chairman of the Organising Committee was well served by all who gave their time and ability to the success of the competition, while many should be named the fact of the matter is that too many were involved — the sport however knows who these people are and appreciates their support.

UIT Officials, Mr Horst Schreiber — Secretary General, Gary Anderson — UIT Vice President and Technical Delegate, were in attendance as was the entire UIT Shotgun Committee — all of whom left Australia with fond memories of what they described as one of the better UIT Championships they had witnessed.

Responsibility for the conduct of the competition was given to Peter Quire, who along with Tim Catling ensured that shooting took place in a most efficient manner, with little to no intrusion on competitors, again two outstanding efforts on behalf of the sport.

The highlight of the entire competition was the performance of Michael Diamond (NSW), who in winning the Silver Medal in Olympic Trap stamped himself as an international competitor with the ability to become World Champion in future years.

Australia, being the host country, fielded teams in all events; Individual, Womens and Juniors — all of whom carried the responsibility of representing their country with dignity and pride.

#### WORLD CUP

In what was without doubt the best ever result for Australia in ISU Competition, Victorian's Russell Mark and John Summers both won World Cup competitions, defeating the best shooters in the world.

Russell with his win at the Los Angeles World Cup was the first to break ground, to be followed shortly afterwards by John Summers whose World Cup was won under trying conditions in Egypt. The exposure to the best competition available has produced results possibly greater than what was envisaged and augers well for Australia's future in ISU shooting.

Russell and John are to be congratulated for their efforts and also their participation in the World Cup Final in Munich, competing against other World Cup winners in 1991, with Russell achieving a 1991 World ranking of 2 in Olympic Trap, and John 7 in Skeet. As a result of their performances throughout the year and their selection as members of the 1992 Olympic Shooting Team, they will be competing in Barcelona along with Michael Diamond at a pre-Olympic competition funded by the Australian Olympic Committee.

#### WORLD SKEET USA

A Skeet Team was selected from the Wagga Skeet Nationals to participate in the World Skeet Championships at San Antonio, Texas, USA. It was the first occasion for each member to shoot as a representative of Australia and to their credit as ambassadors and their skill as competitors.

The decision to contest the World Skeet Championships was vindicated. The three man team of Paul Johnston (Vic), Evan Stephenson (SA) and Scott Wright (NSW) were assisted in the US by the President of the NZCTA, Mr Graeme Webber, whose knowledge of the American scene and overall assistance enabled the team to quickly settle into the competition. The team was financially assisted by the Australian Sports Commission, who hopefully will be able to provide assistance for future teams to shoot against the best the world can offer.

#### **OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The Oceania Shooting Federation conducted the Oceania Championships in Adelaide during the early part of 1991. The Australian Clay Target Association were able to successfully merge the Oceania Competition with the Olympic Discipline National Championships, which added to the overall success of the Oceania Championships.

Australia was successful in winning the four available quota places for the 1992 Olympic Games, with Russell Mark and Michael Diamond successful in the Olympic Trap event and John Summers and David Cunningham successful in the Skeet Competition.

#### INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

The 1991 year of competition for the Mackintosh Trophy saw Australia finish in third place in all three divisions of competition.

Congratulations must go to the Canadians who won the Open and Junior sections, and finished runner up in the Ladies section.

#### CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

Difficulties experienced with the computerised Desk Top Publishing system delayed the introduction of DTP during the year. The decision to introduce DTP did not fully take into account the intricacies of what is now known to be a specialist operation, requiring a specialist operator. A problem did occur late in the year when the posting procedure was changed to allow for the CTSN to be plastic wrapped and not as previously wrapped and wrolled. This alteration, while recognised as being an improvement, caused delays in the receipt of the CTSN despite the office never failing to meet its printing deadlines. Moves have been made to overcome the problem that arose, however, it should be understood that once the CTSN reaches the postal service by the due date all control in relation to delivery has been lost.

Posted monthly to full members at a nett cost of \$0.17¢ per issue, which includes postal charges, the CTSN represents excellent value as a means of communication to members and promotion of club shooting programs. The section containing Shoot Reports, while a costly experience, continues to provide scores which are read with interest by dedicated shooters.

We are fortunate to be able to receive continued good and valued support from our commercial advertisers, as well as many clubs who use the CTSN to promote their activities.

#### **NATIONAL OFFICE**

Changes to the office personnel early in the year produced minor difficulties which were soon overcome thanks to the support and efficiency of Gloria Kirkpatrick and Megan Smith who replaced Antoinette and Tina.

While the National Office does not receive a stream of visitors, those who do call in from time to time will support the efficiency of the office, whose inhabitants are far too often taken for granted. The fact that this occurs is in itself not out of the ordinary, however the fact remains that the office staff of the Association, are willing and often overworked persons who do not, as some may believe, Live the life of Riley.

Learne Day continues to serve the Association well in her duties which are most months hampered by the lateness of material for the Clay Target Shooting News. Those that are continually late, do in many instances expect miracles to be performed, and to Lea's credit this sometimes appears to occur.

Gloria Kirkpatrick who replaced Antoinette, now the mother of Anthony, quickly adapted to her role with the office and is a very willing and efficient person to work with. Megan Smith, unfortunately for us, left the Association in December to further her accounting studies. Megan had stamped her efficiency onto her particular area of expertise and will be missed.

#### SUMMARY

The year in review has been a year of promise and a year of difficulty. The promise was clearly rewarded with the success of the international ISU shooters on the World scene and the selection of three to the 1992 Australian Olympic Shooting team, as well as the outstanding success of the World Trap and Skeet Championships. In addition, to have a Skeet team contest the World Skeet Championships for the first occasion in many years can only add to the future of this Discipline in Australia.

The difficulties unfortunately are many and varied, ranging from the personal difficulties that many members must have suffered under the trying economic climate that did and still prevails. This of course finds its way to all levels of the sport. Clubs in the first instance are generally the earliest to experience problems that are in the main financial so far as attendances are concerned. Many clubs have advised of a downturn in numbers, which hopefully will be reversed in the coming year.

Administration wise, the ACTA year of 1991 was a difficult one with the resignation of the National President and Vice President, plus the Constitutional problem which arose and is as yet unsolved. The election of firstly a new National President and then Vice President took time, followed by the time to elect a new member to the Management Committee. While all difficulties have not been resolved, the coming year should allow for the Sub-Committees to attend to their designated responsibilities which in turn will assist with ongoing development.

## FITTING THE GUN STOCK OPTICALLY

The following article is printed in the interest of the ongoing search for knowledge into all aspects of Clay Target Shooting.

The Coaching Council recognises there are many and varied factors, involved in "Gun Fit", and the art of breaking Clay Targets.

This article therefore falls within the parameters of our coaching

This article therefore falls within the parameters of our coaching system, as an expression of the writers personal opinion, based on his experiences and search for knowledge.

Mr Ray Mack of South Australia and Mr Bud Decot of the USA have put pen to paper with this, their opinion on one aspect of Gun Fit.

#### Murray Alexander, National Director of Coaching

After a long discussion with Bud Decot, a legend in his own country the United States of America, in the field of taking care of the eye needs of sportsmen and women, particularly trap and skeet shooters. I locked into a statement that Bud made in that "had a good stock maker set up alongside of me when I started serving the needs of trap shooters some forty years ago, he would have built up a million dollar business right along with me".

Bud has long contended that a shooter's gun stock needs to suit him optically and, whilst most gun stocks come close to fitting the physique of the average shooter most fall short of properly fitting the eye measurements needed for a properly fitted stock.

All the good shots put the gun to their face and it is perfectly aligned and not their face to the gun.

In Bud's opinion, it is not poor eyesight or inferior eyesight that keeps most shooters out of the winning circle. It's true that good eyesight is one of the most important assets in sports, however with corrected vision most shooters have an equal chance to be on target. Any shooter who has to turn their head "into" the gun stock is going to be seeing out of their eyes on an angle.

The eyes must work together for perfect results. If the head is turned into the gun stock to force the eyes over the barrel and sight we create an imperfect perception. We may think we see perfectly but the objects are displaced and judgement of depth perception is off. When we turn our heads and look out of our eyes on an angle we can split our vision and see double which means both eyes are functioning individually.

You can test this by looking at a small object in the distance then slowly turn your head at the same time keeping your focus on the object. As soon as you turn your head too much you will see the object double which means that both eyes are seeing the object individually not as a team. If you turn your head even more you will find that the object gets even dimmer and may even disappear entirely. So what this means is obvious, to see the best we possibly can, we should be looking straight ahead and our heads should not be tilted.

In the back of the eye we have the retina, the screen of the eye. As most shooters will know, light comes into the eye, strikes the retina and is transmitted into brain waves. There is only one small spot on the retina where we focus properly. This is why it is so important to be facing straight ahead for most of life's activities, not only shooting.

Every shooter should be more aware of his personal eye measurements before he buys a gun. For instance you should know your pupillary distance (PD) this is the distance centre to centre between the pupils. Also check your cheekbone measurement — the outside measurements of the skull from jawbone hinge to jawbone hinge — right where you put the stock on your cheek. The difference between these two measurements could tell you how much "offset" you need on your stock or if a thin stock would suit you better. By and large most average gun stocks on the market today are too thick for the average shooter.

If you want to check to see if your gun suits you optically, here is a simple test. Ideally have someone to help you or perform this in front of a mirror. Naturally check and double check to make certain the gun is unloaded. Close your eyes and then mount the gun firmly in your normal shooting stance. Now open your eyes to see if they are straight over the gun sights, your observer can help and perhaps offer a non biased opinion, have your helper also check to see that you are not canting, (mounting the gun on an angle) remember you want to be looking straight ahead with the gun in an upright position.

With regard to the comb height there are many aspects to consider, however, Bud's thoughts were that it was better for the sighting eye to be "over the sight" rather than behind the sight. So at least a figure eight with the beads on top of one another or even a little more gives the shooting eye more vision.

Now consider these points — Are you one, or do you know any shooter who runs hot and cold? Shoot 100+ one day and miss 4 targets the next day or worse in the very next event?

A lot of shooters with an imperfectly fitted gun can shoot some good scores but cannot always stay in the winners circle. They have made adjustments to the stock's error and shoot pretty good scores but cannot do it consistently. For example in shooting the 100 straight they may have tucked the gun in closer to the cheek putting their eyes properly over the gun, without turning it. In the afternoon may be they did not cheek the gun quite as close due to recoil or whatever other reason so their scores fell away. The weather did not change, the targets did not change, they simply were not holding the gun to adjust for the stock's error as they were in the morning.

So have a think about your gun mount and your eyes alignment down the rib and be prepared to seek some help from a competent stockmaker.

I invite any shooter with an optical or stock problem to write or contact me and particularly recommend the book "Insight to Sports", it just may give you the edge you have been looking for.

## SCORPIO TRAP LOADS THE WORLD'S NUMBER 1 CARTRIDGE?

After the success of the World Trap and Skeet Championships it came as no surprise to find many overseas cartridge manufacturers inquiring of Sergio Zuffo as to what he is doing right. Zufio has sourced product from world-wide manufacturers and completed extensive testing of these through the "state of the art" BSN Pressure and Velocity testing equipment he has installed, to ensure the consistency of his loads and maintain the quality control demanded of commercial manufacture. In fact the equipment he has installed is, without question, the "best" in Australia, and possibly the world! This is quite a "tall" statement to make, but after spending two days at Zuffo's testing range in NSW and later speaking to the aerospace technicians from BSN, Italy, (whilst attending the 1992 SHOT Show in America), I feel quite comfortable in making such a statement. As I have also seen the testing equipment utilised by other larger manufacturers in Australia I certainly know what I am comparing Zuffo's equipment to.

My trip to Sydney to view the SCORPIO testing equipment was indeed an "eye opener". I must admit that, so far as SCORPIO cartridges were concerned I was a "fringe dweller", not really knowing what was going on, what was loaded or what Zuffo would come up with next! The events of the 1991 World Championships won me outright, especially the trap final. The 28 gram loads shot by the Australian finalist and silver medalist, Michael Diamond performed extraordinarly during the shoot-off and whilst Marco Venturini shot much faster than Diamond (at least three to four metres quicker), the manner in which Diamond turned every target inside out was not only a credit to his skill and the custom-made Beretta SO4 he used, but also a tribute to the cartridges which he chose SCORPIO OLYMPIA SPECIAL. These were developed especially by SCORPIO cartridges for Diamond, and whilst Sergio Zuffo can take credit as the manufacturer there is also a "man behind the man" which many would not be aware of. This man, Eric, has spent thousands of hours testing and developing cartridges and although he has no formal training, such as a university degree or similar, he has an obsession with shotgun ballistics - an interest which has mused him for nearly 20 years. Fortunately for Eric he has also shared the confidence of an East German Ballistician who discussed his intimate knowledge and imparted 30 years experience as a ballistician in an East German ammunition plant. What Eric lacked in formal qualifications he more than made up with practical experience, experience of the kind which cannot be read from books or learnt from papers. Coupled with the \$67,000 computerised testing equipment installed by Zuffo at Eric's own registered testing range, he continues to build on his knowledge through experience and further testing. Zuffo's present trap loads are testament to Eric's ability.

For those with a desire for knowledge in the area of shotgun ballistics Eric's testing range is a statement of his commitment to developing product of excellent quality. The software used to run the ballistic's program itself is \$4,500 and there are 4 programs. The BSN test gun is the very latest fitted with a Univeral receiver and capable of accepting either a rifle, pistol or shotgun barrel. The transducers can be attached in several configurations, depending on what information you desire. The configuration which Eric adopts includes barrel time, peak pressure, muzzle velocity and the velocity at 20 yards, (observed velocity). The computer used to calculate and compile the various data also prints out a pressure curve showing; primer burning time, wad collapse time, the progressive development of pressure throughout the projectile's time in the barrel and barrel time. Horizontal and vertical axis are scaled and correspond with the pressure and time data provided by the printout. Barometric pressure, temperature and humidity are also entered into the template for each individual firing, or groups of firing. The whole set-up is

Being in possession of "state-of-the-art" testing equipment is only a part of the success SCORPIO cartridges are now enjoying. Without Eric's depth of knowledge and Zuffo's preparedness to source the

world for quality components the success of SCORPIO cartridges might only be mediocre, or at the very most slowly progressing. Their determination and application has paid off. The time which I spent with Eric was invaluable - he is, in my opinion, brilliant! His understanding of the internal ballistics of shotshells and his practical experience are well beyond most and may never really be appreciated by others. The fact that he is now putting together SCORPIO shotshells and maintaining stringent quality control tests is as much as ANY manufacturer could ever expect. Eric's interest in ballistics and willingness to offer his knowledge along with a "free-hand" from Zuffo to test others' products and develop new loads can only contribute to the further establishment of SCORPIO product. The trap loads which are currently available, speak for themselves, as do the successes those loads have achieved over the past 18 months. SCORPIO cartridges can also be credited with keeping the prices of cartridges down, for present day case lots have NEVER been more affordable.

Although Zuffo has been busily searching for his ultimate loads over the years I feel his search is over. The Italian BPD propellant, although comparatively expensive with English, French, Spanish and Australian propellants, seems to be serving the purpose and achieving the desired results. Continued research and development of loads will ensure that SCORPIO product is improved upon, and for those who enjoy a round at simulated field shooting or field shooting, don't be surprised to see a consequent improvement in field ammunition as well, and for a very affordable price. Zuffo is certainly being extended with his present shotshell production as referral and the success of his product spreads. As an Australian ammunition manufacturer I can only wish him well for he certainly seems to be doing everything right, especially if he continues his association with Eric. So long as SCORPIO prices remain stable and their successes continue, I predict many more shooters will be opting for SCORPIO product. Whether Zuffo can keep up to the demand though, will remain to be seen. Good hick and safe shooting - John McDougall.



Alan Vilcins and J. Lavier.




Richard Dean was South Australia's Champion Shooter.

#### ATTWOOD-LAW CUP


