


## **1992 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Saturday April 4, produced warm conditions for the first day of the 1992 Nationals. By the numbers that had shot the pre-Nationals it was apparent that the entries for the Grand Australian Handicap would most likely exceed the number achieved in 1988 when the Trap Nationals were last held at Wagga.

Weather conditions in the weeks leading up to the Nationals had been dry, however the grounds were ready for the large numbers that were expected to attend.

An impressive Opening Ceremony took place with State Teams marching to take up a position under their State flag to the accompaniment of a Scottish piper. A larger than usual early morning gathering of spectators was very pleasing to see and certainly added to the overall spectacle.

National President, Leighton Martin, welcomed to the Championships Mr Wal Fyfe, the Federal Member for Hume, who declared the Championships open by firing the first shot of the day, with the assistance of National Director of Coaching, Murray Alexander.

All was in readiness, State Teams were anxious to commence their events and the first day of the 1992 National Trap Championships was under way.

#### STATE TEAMS MATCH - 25T

All seven States/Territories were represented in the Shoulder to Shoulder match — the first to be shot under the 28g rule. Competition was always going to be keen, as seen by the dedicated approach given to this opening event.

Resplendent in their Northern Territory uniforms the "Territory boys" surprised possibly most people other than themselves when they shot the Team Match clean to finish clear winners on 125/125. Phil Grove, spokesman for the team and also one of the Territory representatives to the National Executive Committee, clearly expressed the feelings of the team when accepting the ACTA Cup from President, Leighton Martin. Shooting in the Territory, while not overly strong in numbers, certainly has strength and depth in ability. having produced National Title winners in recent years.

The win was a popular one with a clear victory by two targets from the host State NSW, 123/125 (362 points), with Tasmania also showing their strength finishing third on points, 123/125 (357 points). State Team Champion - Northern Territory 125/125.

#### **GRAND AUSTRALIAN MANDICAP** - 501

The early expectations on the numbers likely to participate were correct, with a total of 471 entries in the first National Title Event, which was an increase of 24 over the 1988 number. With the difficulties that many people are and have been experiencing over the past year or so it could have been easier for many to have stayed home, however as the numbers indicate, the love of their chosen sport obviously swayed the day.

With the Opening Ceremony and State Teams Match taking up the early part of the morning, the usual late start could have been a problem, however Shoot Marshall Bill Jones, and Tournament Director Robert Smith, kept the squads moving freely and were well supported by the behind the scenes office personnel who were capably lead by NSW State Secretary, Mrs Libby Bunting.

Probably one of the most pleasing features of the event was the large number of women and juniors who took part. With a field of 27 women and 35 juniors, both sections of the Handicap were going to be well fought out.


Conditions were unchanged, with clear skies and a warm day to look forward to. As was expected, numbers had increased for the PAGE 4 Double Barrel, being the first event for Mackintosh Team Qualification. A total of 80 shooters shot the 50T, producing 13 squads to contest the shoot-off which commenced at 2.45 pm.

Conditions were excellent and many were wondering whether or not the shoot off would be finalised before dark, owing to the quality of the field.

Shooting continued throughout the afternoon until only four of the eighty shooters remained. The final four were a mixture of three experienced shooters and a C Grade shooter whose best ever break prior to the event was a 37 shot at Bega.

Three shooters, John Maxwell, Michael Diamond and Brett Dunstan, were all well experienced on the international scene and were expected to fight out the battle for Championship honours.

John Maxwell was first to drop out, missing target 203, leaving Michael Diamond the hot favourite. Michael dropped out at 219 leaving Brett the hot favourite. Brett dropped out when he missed target 259, which left Craig Bishop from Bega Gun Chub in NSW to create history by winning the Double Barrel Championship from C Grade, going from C Grade to AA Grade. In the course of the event, establishing on the way the Double Barrel break record using 28g loads.


#### SINGLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIP --- 50T

Team photographs were taken and all interest was on the Mackintosh Open Teams Match, which would produce a five member team for England in July of this year.

The scores for the three Mackintosh qualifying events plus the 100T Mackintosh Competition produced a fine team to represent Australia in Shoulder to Shoulder competition for the Van Diemen Trophy in Wales in July, at which time we hope they are rewarded with a competition victory, and being the first to hear the result of this year's Mackintosh Competition, bring back to Australia the results they have been competing for in Wagga.


#### CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS - 75T





Another outstanding achievement amongst our Top Gun participants was that of Dino Olivero from the International Club in Adelaide who shot an amazing break of 512 which made him eligible for 1500 target loads complimentary from Winchester. Dino is the first shooter under the Top Gun award scheme to claim an award for a long run break. His break on the 1st of March is also the all time South Australian record.



The games are run along similar lines as the Olympic and Commonwealth Games with the Shires in effect representing the various countries. Competitors then compete for gold, silver or bronze medals in individual or team events depending on the type of sport.
