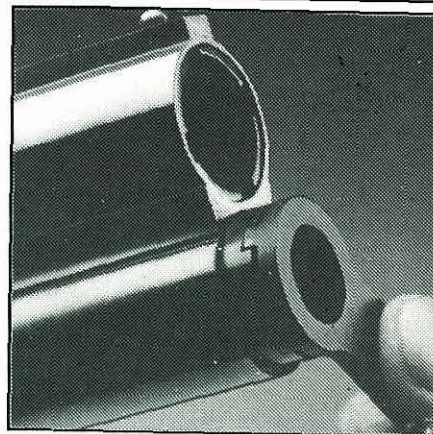
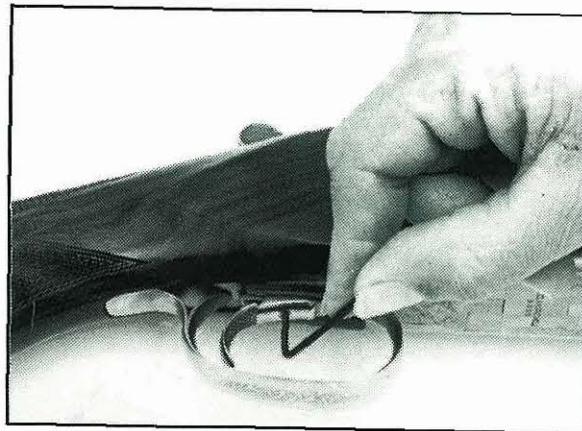

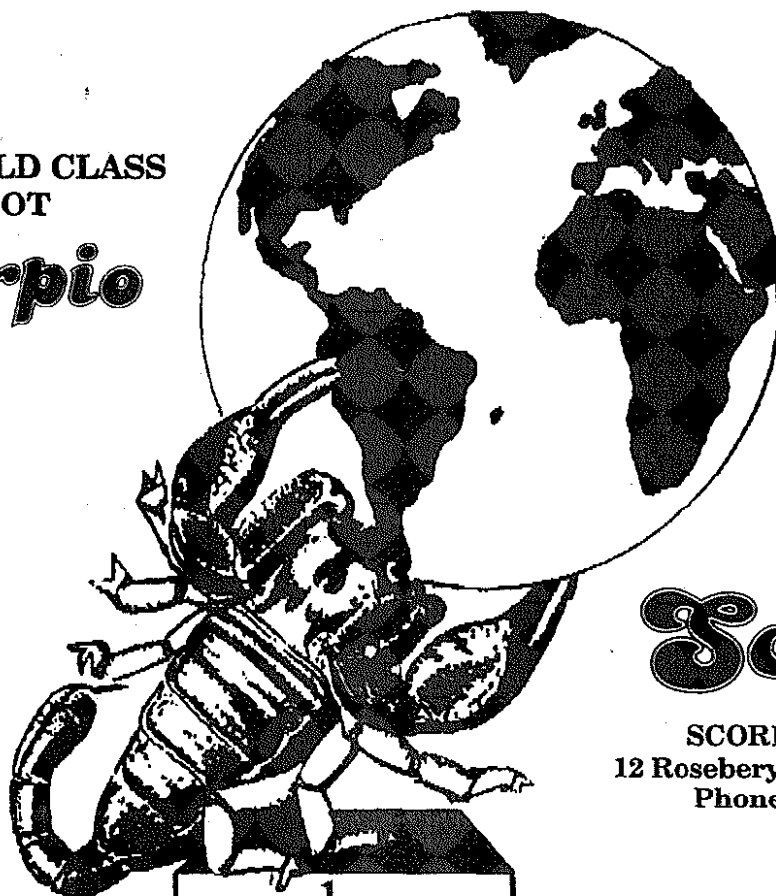

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS NOTES



At the time of writing arrangements are being made to conduct a full series of ACTA meetings in Melbourne. The meetings are scheduled to commence on Wednesday 10th June, finishing on Saturday 13th June, with a meeting between the ACTA Executive Committee and members of the New Zealand Clay Target Association, namely President George Ellis, Past President Graeme Webber and National Secretary Adrienne Sears.

The visit by our New Zealand friends is a follow up to the meeting held in New Zealand in 1991 at which time the bond that exists between both countries was greatly strengthened.

Many matters will be discussed during the meetings including 28gr loads and the National Ground subject, both of which will be reported on in next months CTSN.

ISU

The International Shooting Union have announced that as from the 1st January, 1993 the maximum shot load for both trap and skeet has been set at 24gr. The reason for the change was to reduce both the level of noise and the amount of lead shot, both of which are of increasing concern.

Additional changes were made which reduce 200t events over three days to 125 targets over two days with a final for the top six shooters. This change applies to both trap and skeet.

Shotgun changes, including the following, which are to be introduced as at January 1, 1993 are unofficial until such time as they are published in the UIT Journal:

- Time Limit: 10 seconds - Trap and Skeet
- Cartridges: (1) 24g shot load for all ISU events.
(2) Maximum pellet diameter Trap/Skeet - 2.5mm.
(3) Tolerance + .01 + .05mm.
- Trap Settings: Trap schemes 1-9, all distances reduced by 5 mtrs.
- Skeet: New procedure - station by station:
 - (1) 1 high single - 1 double = 3.
 - (2) 1 high single - 1 double = 3.
 - (3) 1 high, 1 low single - 1 double = 4.
 - (4) 1 high, 1 low single - 1 double high first = 4.
 - (5) 1 high, 1 low single - 1 double = 4.
 - (6) 1 low single - 1 double = 3.
 - (7) 1 double = 2.
 - (8) 1 high single, 1 low single = 2.

The target changes made by the UIT will reflect on our own National Championships which are currently 200t events. These changes are shortly to be addressed by the National ISU Shooting Committee and National Championships Committee.

Early indication is that three 125t events will replace the existing two 200t events with minimal loss of 25 targets over the six days of competition.

The venues for the 1993/95/97 World Championships in both trap and skeet have been announced as Barcelona 1993, Cyprus 1995 and Croatia 1997.

UIT Judges

Reference to this months CTSN will show that five of our members have been approved to hold B Grade Judges Licences with Peter Quire upgraded to A Grade. This entitles Peter to join David Menck and Jim Kelly both from Queensland as being eligible to officiate at World Championships and Olympic Games. Congratulations to all who have received their UIT Licences which result from their final involvement with last years World Trap & Skeet Championships in Perth. Full details are shown elsewhere in the CTSN.

UIT Recognition

As a result of the successful World Championships the UIT have awarded medals and diplomas to be presented to the individual recipients as a token of appreciation for their efforts on behalf of the UIT and shooting in general.

Details on those who have received UIT recognition will be published in the CTSN once the various recipients have received their awards.

Congratulations are in order to all concerned as well as the many others whose efforts contributed greatly to the success of the Championships.

World Championship Video

International Trap Team

This month we have our five member team off to Wales to contest the Van Diemen Trophy in Shoulder to Shoulder competition against England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and New Zealand. The team was selected over the three Mackintosh qualifying events and the Mackintosh Open Team Shoot at the Wagga Nationals. The team is sure to acquit themselves well and be good ambassadors for Australia and clay target shooting. We wish them well for their competition.

A meeting in Wales in early July will decide the future of Australia's proposal to have a five member team compete internationally on a two year rostered cycle. We as well as New Zealand are hopeful of obtaining the support of the home countries to bring the proposal to reality.

DTL Shooter Representative

During the course of the Wagga Trap Nationals, shooters nominated by their respective State Associations held a meeting to elect from their numbers a representative to the National DTL Shooting Committee.

NSW shooter Peter Hayman was the person elected to represent trap shooters for the two year period ending at the commencement of the 1994 trap national. Peter is one of three people elected as shooters representatives, each of whom are willing and ready to discuss problems that may exist, or to discuss suggestions that could better the sport. UIT World Cups

The Australian Shotgun Team have recently competed in Europe as part of their Pre Olympic program. Individual success was achieved by Russell Mark who won the Double Trap at Lonato with Michael Diamond coming in third. The Australian team of Russell Mark, Michael Diamond and Greg Newey outshot their opposition to win team gold for Australia in the Double Trap which has grown in stature since the announcement that Double Trap will become an Olympic event for both men and women as from 1996.

State Associations

Congratulations to Gemfield's Noel Deeley on his election as President of the QCTA replacing well known Tom Meadows who did not stand for re-election. Another change in Queensland is the appointment of Graham Brown as State Secretary replacing long serving Mrs Bev Grice who has elected to move on to other areas. We wish both Noel and Graham well in their new roles and on behalf of all shooters thank Bev for the dedication she gave to her valued role in clay target shooting.

Overall

The winter weather is now with us and things could appear to be a little bleaker than they actually are. While some are preaching doom and gloom, the fact is that our membership is up in numbers on last year, maybe not by a significant amount but nevertheless up.

Nationally the next major event to look forward to is the National Skeet Championships in Perth. November in the west can generally be relied upon to produce good weather to compliment the world standard facilities that exist at Whiteman Park. Nationals certainly do have that little more about them than other events and hopefully many of our skeet shooters will be journeying to Perth to contest the National titles. For quite a few it will be a return to Whiteman Park while others may possibly be enjoying the grounds for the first time. Whichever, the certainty is that they will enjoy their participation and the friendly atmosphere of Western Australia.

LOOKING BACK TO OUR BEGINNING 1927 and in between

1937 was a point in time when our sport became a national body to be known as the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association (embodying the Victorian Clay Target Association). The Victorian Association had been formed some several years earlier, actually in 1927. At this time clay target shooters decided to break from the live bird association and form their own state body. President and Secretary of the State Association were Mr H. G. James and Mr (Bill) McCullough. Bill McCullough served a period of 30 years as Secretary of our Association, until he retired in 1965.

Objects of the newly formed Association were to develop the sport of clay pigeon shooting, promote and encourage the formation of clubs, country and state associations.

Subscriptions for affiliation to the Association shall be as follows - for a club (not affiliated to a country or state association), two guineas per annum - for individual members, a registration fee of two shillings and six pence per annum. All subscriptions shall become payable as from January 1st in each year.

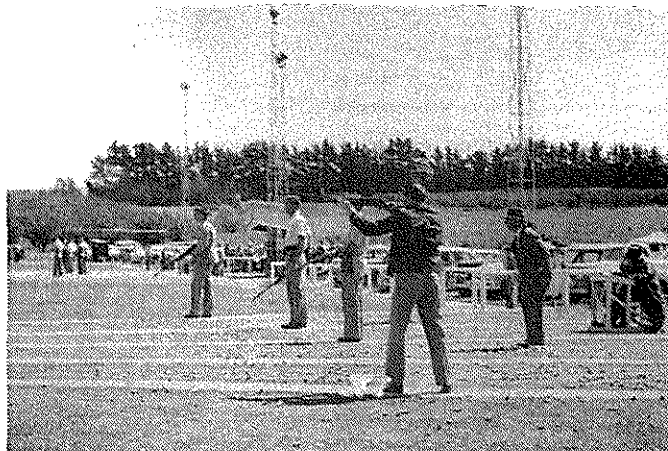
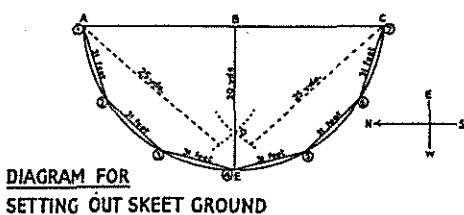
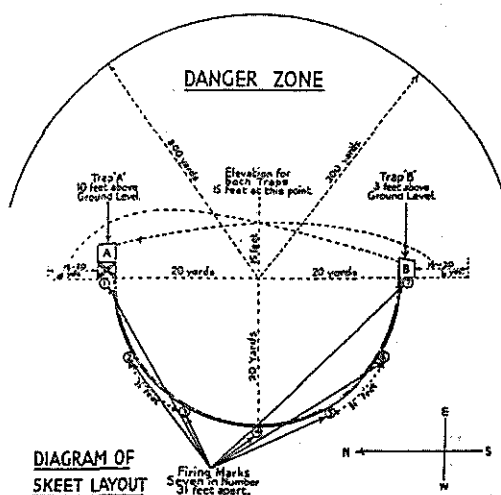
Book of Rules and Regulations

Shooting Skeet (English style). The rule book describes skeet as a form of clay target shooting which comes nearest to actual shooting conditions in the field, both in the variety of angles at which the birds are thrown and in the style of shooting. English style shooting remained very low key in Australia until the early 1950s when a small group of shooters, including myself, were responsible for American style skeet being accepted for competition. It was only then that skeet became a popular part of our sport.

Diagram shows the layout of the 1927 English system of skeet shooting. Today there is little difference between English and American skeet, one exception is English skeet has no number eight station. In place they take a double from station four.

The rule book goes on to advise on a suitable type of gun for 'skeet.' As skeet provides a series of shots similar to those actually met with in the field.

The book advises that the most suitable gun for this competition is actually a game gun - whether it be 12, 16 or 20 gauge (I wouldn't recommend this advice).

The Problem of 'Flinching'

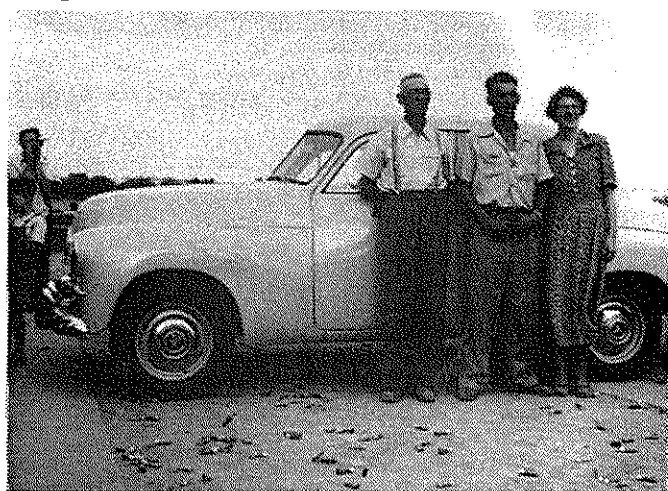
What is the cause and how do we get rid of it?

No greater misfortune can befall a trap shooter than to be attacked with a case of what is known as 'flinching.' The term refers to what seems to be a temporary paralysis of certain nerves, producing an inability to pull the trigger at the psychological moment. While it is not painful except to one's self-esteem, it is most annoying and is fatal to good scores. Anybody who can offer a sure cure for it would earn the hearty thanks of regiments of trap shooters throughout the country.

It does not specially attack novice, in fact, it seems to take hold rather of more mature shooters. Even experts are liable to be seized with it, but why it comes and how it goes appears never to have been satisfactorily settled.

The main trouble, however, seems to be located in the trigger finger, which cannot be persuaded to pull the trigger at the right moment. This applies to 'flinching' proper, not to the flinching, or rather the jerking away of the butt of the gun from the shoulder, due to the fear of pain caused by the recoil of the gun on a sore shoulder.

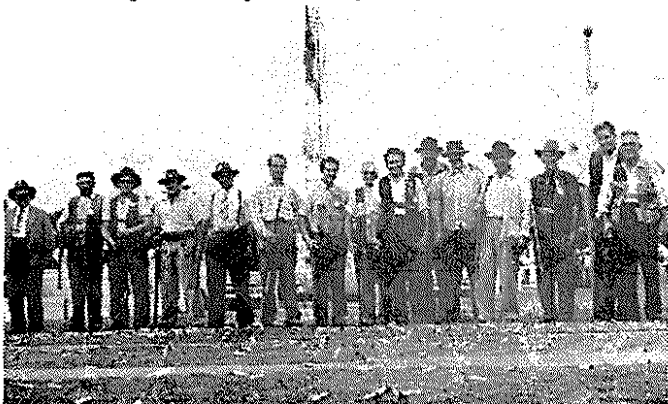
The curious thing about the real flinching is that it comes upon you suddenly and without any warning. The first you know is that you have got it.

The next thing is how to get rid of it. Columns have been written on the subject, and any number of cures suggested, but we do not seem to be any nearer a solution of the problem than we were ten or fifteen years ago. The following, however, seem to be the best suggestions to make to persons afflicted with this misfortune, with a view to having them given a trial as a possible means of cure:-

- (1) Stop shooting for a while, so that if it is the nervous system that is out of joint it may be given a chance to become normal.
- (2) Examine the grip of your gun and take hold of it firmly. In fact, grip it as you would when shooting. Note whether the grip is large enough to comfortably fill the hand. If it is not, try wrapping it with whipcord, or get some expert with the needle and thread to sew a piece of chamois leather around it. If it is too large for you to grasp easily, sandpaper it down until it just fills the hand.
- (3) The trouble may be in the length of the stock, or the way you are holding the gun. Ask expert advice on this point, and if it is thought that the stock is a little too short, add a rubber butt-plate to lengthen it a bit; or if it seems too long, have a gunsmith remove the heel-plate and try it that way.

1993 OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS Darwin, NT

Most of the conditions for the 1993 Nationals will be as per previous O.D. Carnivals incorporating recent UIT rule changes.

The purpose of this notice is to advise you of the aspects of attending a Nationals in Darwin that are different.

- Consider arriving a week earlier or departing a week after the carnival and make the 1993 O.D. Nationals a holiday destination - there is plenty to see and do in Darwin for the family while the Nationals are on.
- These Nationals are to be run in conjunction with the 1993 Arafura Sports Festival - a similar format to the Oceania Games in S.A. in 1991. Arafura Sports Festival competitors will be squadded separately from Nationals competitors. Teams from the Southern areas of Australia may not compete for Arafura Sports Festival medals. Arafura Sports Festival competitors will also be shooting in our National and Commonwealth titles.
- Due to the running of the Arafura Sports Festival, both accommodation and airfares will be in short supply - Book Early. You may book accommodation through the Arafura Sports Festival booking office, complete packages through the N.T. Government Tourist Bureau in all capitals except Hobart, or fares through your travel agent.
- The Darwin Gun Club has ample facilities for those wishing to caravan or camp. Hot showers, toilets, washing and BBQ facilities. They can cater for up to 30 caravans, some powered sites available. Further caravan sites are available in commercial parks - 2 minutes from Darwin Gun Club.

OLYMPIANS ON THE WAY TO BARCELONA

Australia's Shotgun Olympians Russell Mark, Michael Diamond (trap) and John Summers (skeet) are now in the last stages of their preparation for Barcelona, after what has probably been the best ever competitive lead up to the Olympics that Australia has ever had.

World Cups contested during 1991 brought outstanding success particularly for Russell and John who both won UIT World Cups and went on to compete in the World Cup Finals at Munich prior to the Perth World Championships which produced a silver medal for Michael Diamond after an exciting final round.

During 1992 John has shot in the USA at the Los Angeles World Cup finishing a very creditable seventh, Russell, Michael and John then went on to shoot in a Pre-Olympic competition in Barcelona which was organised by the UIT to enable Olympic shooters to get the feel of the Olympic Shooting Range, under the leadership of Olympic Shooting Team Manager David MacFarlane.

Following Barcelona, the Olympic Shooting Team Coach, Robert Smith took the team to Italy and Germany to contest the last of the World Cups before the all important Olympic Games in Barcelona.

While not yet at their competitive peak for Barcelona, the experience gained during their lead up coupled with the intensive training that they are currently undergoing will hold them in good stead for the most important competition they have ever taken part in.

Barcelona will be the second Olympics for Russell, while both Michael and John will be Olympians for the first occasion.

As a shooting team, all three are very experienced, as is Olympic Coach Robert Smith who has had the responsibility of the shotgun team for a number of years — we wish them well for both individual and country success.

Congratulations to our shotgunners on their selection and also to members of the Australian Olympic Team who will be contesting the pistol events.

BROKEN HILL GUN CLUB INC.

The weekend of May 9th and 10th saw the completion of the Broken Hill Gun Club Inc's West Darling Championship shoot. One hundred individual shooters took part with competitors travelling from all over Australia.

The chilly and sometimes windy conditions of Saturday, plus chilly but reasonable weather on Sunday, helped along by the attendance of champion shooters saw the opening of some big breaks.

Two notable breaks were achieved, one by lady shooter Faye Burton from Kerang, who shot a personal best of 235 which is also thought to be an Australian record for a lady shooter. The other came from local shooter Darryn Nicholls who shot a personal best of 437, with Lynne Curtis again managing to take part but finishing second. Congratulations to all of you.

The results are as follows:

- 1) **Silver City Guns & Ammo Handicap 20t.**
This was conducted over three meterage groups in windy conditions which helped handicap the shooters with only seven possibles being shot — 21-25m — N. Court 30/32, 16-20m — E. Coop 24/24 and 11-15m — R. Dowling 27/27.
- 2) **Sandvik Gift 25t DB.**
With Samsung video recorders being first in each grade, local shooters figured well with J. Spain, D. Lemmich, R. Dowling and R. Hastwell taking out placings in relevant grades. R. Dowling took out his second event for the day. AA grade went to Frank Argro 120/120 pushed along by Steve Haberman 119/120, A grade L. Chant 44/44, B grade J. Spain 34/34 and R. Dowling taking C grade with 26/26.
- 3) **Broken Hill Community Credit Union DB C'ship 25t.**
Brett Dunstan took the Overall in this event after a lengthy shoot off which had to be carried over to Sunday morning, when fading light and Brett experiencing gun trouble, called a halt on Saturday afternoon. Overall and AA went to Brett with 210/210, second in AA grade was B. Webb 209/210. R. Mack took A grade 60/62, G. McMillan took B grade 69/70 and M. Davis took C grade 34/36.
- 4) **Buttercup Bakeries Night SB C'ship 25t.**
A possible eluded all shooters with only three 24s being shot. F. Dimasi a 'B' grader managed to take the Overall, shooting 28/29.
- 5) **George & Neil Hoskins Memorial Points C'ship 25t.**
An event that has been conducted for many years and has proven to be a popular event to be won. After a lengthy shoot off, L. Knight was the eventual Overall winner with 213/213, pushed by D. Nicholls who ended on 210/213 and second in AA grade.
- 6) **Broken Hill Gift 25t DB.**
With a Samsung TV up for grabs in each grade, where again the competition was hard. After losing the shoot off in the previous event, Darryn Nicholls decided to dig in this time and was eventually rewarded with a win and a top break of 437. Faye Burton also succeeded in taking out a lengthy shoot off to take the A grade with 191/191.
- 7) **Rick Jones Shearing SB C'ship.**
This was the last event of the day and went to Glen Hayden (60/60) after a shoot off for Overall. Local junior shooter J. Spain collected his second sash for the weekend, as did Merv Peetz.

There were two teams events conducted over the weekend with the McKean Shield on the handicap and the Wilyama Shield on the gift on Sunday. Melbourne won the McKean Shield from a double countback with Horwell 92/100, B. Perks, J. Mollica, N. Court, I. McJames and C. Zagor shared the spoils. Geelong team members S. Haberman, L. Curtis, G. McHenry, B. Dunstan and Glen Hayden took out the other shield with 5 possibles — 125/125.

Open State Postal Team High Gun was Wayne McCarthy on 58/58 whilst Katie Lights 25/25 gave her the Junior Team High Gun.

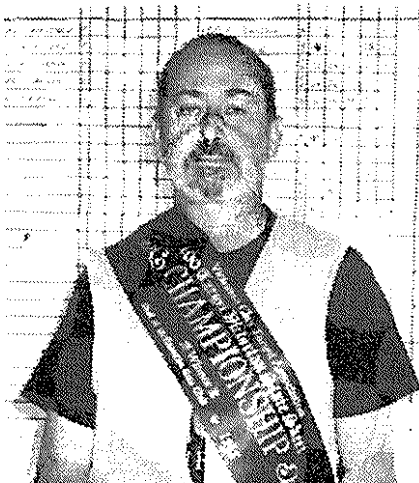

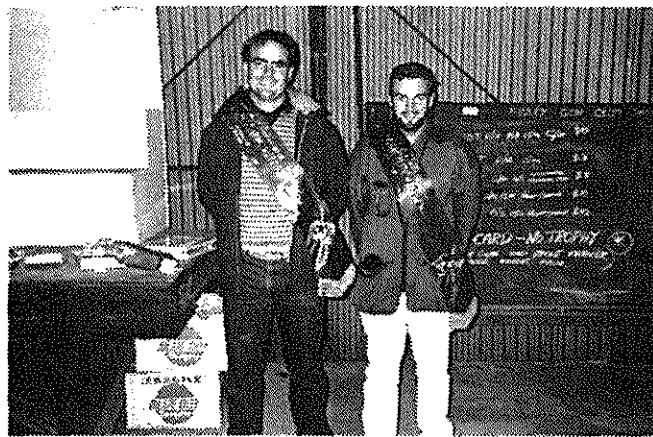

MEXICANS IN FNWQ

FNWQ as I discovered stands for Far North West Queensland, specifically Karumba, when friends Pauline and Richard called with an invitation.

They are working their way around Australia and happened to seek employment with Lou Solari (G & J Welding). Lou is the Secretary of the Karumba Gun Club and he invited them, and through my wife Jane and I, to attend the Easter shoot. As we were planning to visit our friends for some fishing it seemed appropriate to enter the shoot as well. As I was not an ACTA member at the time I had some homework to do, but first things first.

Karumba is a small town in the south east corner of the Gulf of Carpentaria. It is about 4,000kms from Melbourne by road and three plane flights away by air.

The climate and geography are harsh, with temperatures regularly in the 40s during summer and humidity in the high 90s. Even in mid April the temperature and humidity seemed to suck the energy out of the Mexicans. This environment breeds a rugged and independent type of person and it is debatable whether the sharks, crocs or the locals are tougher.

The Karumba Lodge Hotel, the main wateringhole, has two bars; the animal bar with cement floors and furniture bolted to the floor (come as you are), and the 'suave' bar where shoes and a shirt are required.

The place is a haven for fishermen who pack the place at Easter seeking grunter, queenfish, jewfish and barra. The travel literature neglects to mention that for each of these delectable species you must catch 15-20 slimy and venomous catfish. I caught about 100 of these and in the end became so expert at removing them I devised a new method of releasing them with garden shears!

I was informed that the shoot was an ACTA event and I had to join to compete. As a newcomer to this type of shooting I felt I needed some expert advice on the topic from someone with experience as well as a dose of 'animal cunning'. After some research I found a gentleman called Jack Glanville at Frankston Australia to provide advice.

Jack is an old poacher from way back with many trophies to his credit, who has recently resumed shooting trap after a break of many years. He was able to explain trap shooting techniques and give me some tips on competition. He also suggested that my Beretta S682 Sporting needed a trap stock as he observed considerable muzzle flip. (At \$700 for a new stock this was one piece of advice I conveniently ignored).

Geoff Wallis of Frankston Australia was happy to take my money and he and Jack looked on with some glee as I approached my first competition. I have to admit after shooting 30 straight in practice I thought the game was easy, however 37/50 in a DB event soon brought me to my senses.

After this brief introduction it was off to Karumba.

The Karumba Gun Club consists of very few members as we discovered when we arrived for practice before the shoot. Snowy List the President, Lou Solari, Charlie Buhagiar and Gary Wessel were at the ground painting and repairing traps etc. We assisted by supervising their progress with a beer in hand. (It was quite warm for Mexicans and we felt we needed time to acclimatise).

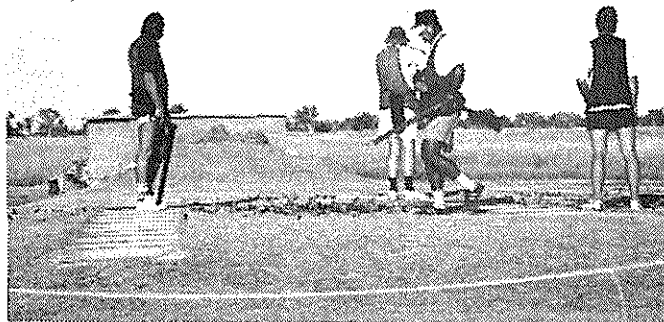

Richard and I were not impressed when our partners wanted to 'buy' Gary Wessel. We did not think their decision was based on his ability to shoot clays especially as they reneged when they found out they could not have him for the year.

Forty two competitors attended the shoot which was held in an atmosphere of friendly rivalry. In C grade I was informed that there

was a bandit Kevin 'Bushy' Eames who was teetering promotion to B grade but who had somehow managed to stay in C grade.

Bushy had been a supervisor when Pauline was working in the animal bar and she was keen for me to set him straight. When he found he had a keen rival he met the threat with a laconic grin which did nothing to settle my nerves.

As luck would have it Bushy and I were in lane one and lane two of our squad and I approached the first event, a 10t Eye Opener, with considerable trepidation. The event started with a free target which I was pleased to hit however I was very nervous and shot 8/10 to Bushy's 9/10.

The 25t DB which followed was worse - 18/25 - while Bushy the Bandit shot 22/25 to win the event. With my confidence at low ebb I approached the 30t pointscore. Perhaps supporting Jack Glanville's view about my gun I managed 23 1st barrels and two lost for 69 to beat Bushy by a couple of points and win the event. My support crew were delighted with a victory and celebrated by downing some icy cold ales in front of my very thirsty eyes. Not fair.

The 50t Continental was an event I had never seen before and it certainly tested the shooters. Bushy and I were in the last squad of the day and with light fading fast I managed to do one better than his 46/50. After some trouble with the low swingers early on I managed to shoot the last thirty straight causing the referee to dub me the 'owl' because I could see well in the dark. The event was won by Clayton Cusack, a young shooter from a well known shooting family who has great potential, with 48/50.

Sunday began with a 50t DB which culminated in C grade with a shootout between Bushy and myself. After Bushy nervously poked at his second and missed, I shot the easy straightaway to win. Bushy lost twice in this event because he was also regraded to B grade.

The next event a 30t Medley (10DB, 10SB, 10PS) was the Calcutta event and great interest was shown by all particularly as the event progressed and 48/50 was the best score. The last squad included Robby Cusack (eventual Overall High Gun) who completed a great weekends shooting with 49/50. I lost concentration after a good start and shot 37/50. Bushy came in with 47/50 to beat me and with the B grade section.

In the final Handicap event an 11-14 Marker, P. Wilcox shot the possible to win the overall. He was thrilled as he had never shot the possible before, and I was tickled as my 24/25 won the event for the front markers. This event was also the decider between Bushy and I and his 23/25 from 16m was not good enough.

The presentations, after another great BBQ meal, featured shooters from Mt. Isa, Ingham, Normanton, Townsville and of course Melbourne, who all praised the organisation of the event, a credit to Snowy and Lou and to the sponsors M & S List and Ruby Marine, Wilson's Engineering and Ilwong Freezers, Karumba Lodge Hotel, G J Welding P/L, B & B Supermarket and Vic Bargery, D & K Adams, J & R McCracken and D & J Cotter who put on a great couple of days.

Finally after being hit with a bill for \$148 excess baggage from Flight West Airlines in Cairns, I decided to either shoot all my cartridges at the club or give the remaining few to the club. Wouldn't you know it, one of the prizes was half a case!

10th Anniversary Shoot — April 25th & 26th, 1992

With hard times facing us all at the present time I was not expecting an 'over abundance' of shooters at our Anniversary shoot, with the State Carnival not that long gone, then the National titles in Wagga only having just been completed (at which I believe a near record number of South Aussies attended). Imagine my surprise at finding the grounds literally swarming with shooters on the first day of competition. Grade High Guns went to Peter Hall (International) for A grade with 259/275, John Bretag (Monarto) for B grade after shooting 255/275

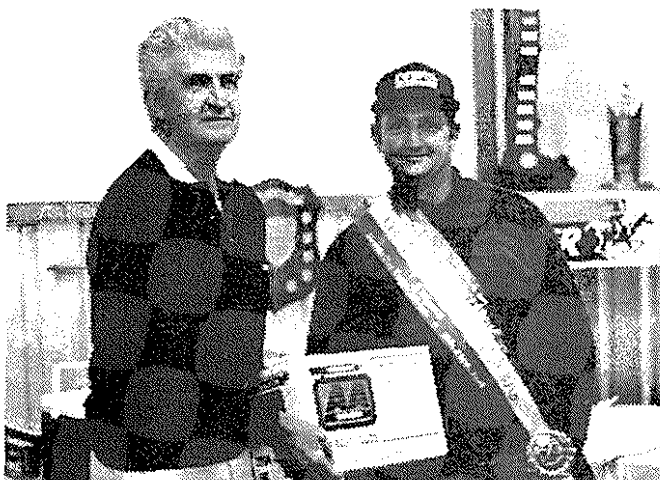

Farewell old mate.

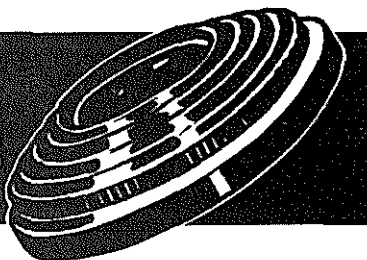
EVERY PICTURE TELLS A STORY

1992 CRAYFISH POKER

Not everything is possible but a 25/25 is . . .

Introduction

In keeping with the Crayfish concept, the Geraldton Gun Club will introduce a new concept to its annual Crayfish Carnival and it will be known as Crayfish Poker.

It is based on the number of 25s a shooter can get in five allocated events and takes the form of a poker hand, but these hands do not necessarily conform to normal card conventions as the 'Crayfish' have made up their own rules!

How to Play

To be eligible a shooter must shoot at least one 25/25, commonly referred to as a 'Possible' in any one of the five allocated events which are listed as follows:

- Event 1 — 25 D/B Trap Cash Divide
- Event 2 — 25 D/B Inshore Electronics District Championship
- Event 3 — 25 D/B P/S Zone Championship
- Event 4 — 25 D/B Crayfish Carnival Graded
- Event 7 — 25 D/B City of Geraldton Championship

The winning hands are split into 8 categories, ranging from shooting only one 25 or 'possible' out of the five allocated events to shooting all five possibles known as a 'full house' as shown below.

Each category has combinations attached to it, i.e. if a shooter wanted to achieve Category 4 they could do so in a number of ways by shooting 25s in Events 1-2-4 or 1-2-7 or 1-3-4 or 1-3-7 or 1-4-7 or 2-3-7 or 2-4-7.

Each category has cash prizes and these will be divided amongst shooters in each category.

We believe that as shooters move into higher categories more cash will be won by them as there would be less shooters in these categories, but the club cannot guarantee this will be the case.

Rules

- (1) A shoot off will not count in this concept.
- (2) A shooter cannot claim more than one category i.e. if a shooter scores all five possibles they could not then claim to be part of the lower categories as well.

- (3) A shooter cannot elect a lower category having achieved a higher one.
- (4) The point score will be converted back into a double barrel score, so that 75/75 does not necessarily have to be attained to qualify as a possible, in effect it will be the number of targets hit.
- (5) If a category is not attained then the money allocated will jackpot to the following year.
- (6) The Committee reserves the right to change the rules and definitions and in the case of a dispute the Committee's decision is final.

The club will also pay a bonus of \$50 to be divided amongst shooters achieving their first 25 trap break badge in addition to what final categories they may finish with.

Shooters are encouraged to nominate for all 8 events on the program. Shooters who wish not to nominate for some of the five allocated events simply reduce the highest category they could have achieved if they nominated for all five plus they reduce their chance of winning the Carnival High Gun.

Benefits to Shooters Psychologically — every shooter would believe they are capable of achieving at least one 25 or more in the 5 events and some would go further believing they could achieve the ultimate 'full house' and most probably will.

This type of thinking reverses that of graded optional sweeps — normally shooters pay their sweep money and would think of the money to be won and then try to achieve a 25 or 24 or 23/25 regardless of grading.

Whereas now shooters would focus primarily on achieving a 25 first and then think of the money to be won. This also opens the shooter to the likelihood of place in their grade, if not an overall in the event(s) and at worst a dividend at the end of the carnival depending upon what final category is achieved at no additional cost other than normal nominations.

It is important to note that even if a shooter does not get a 25/25 in an event they could still be eligible for places and prizes in their respective grades.

The club also has the Double Rise Pages Special as a lead up to the 25 pair State Double Rise Championship and Crayfish to be won in events 4 and 7.

So if you play all 8 events right you could win an Overall High Gun, Crayfish and other great prizes along the way.

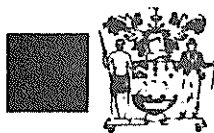

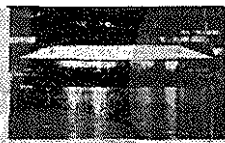

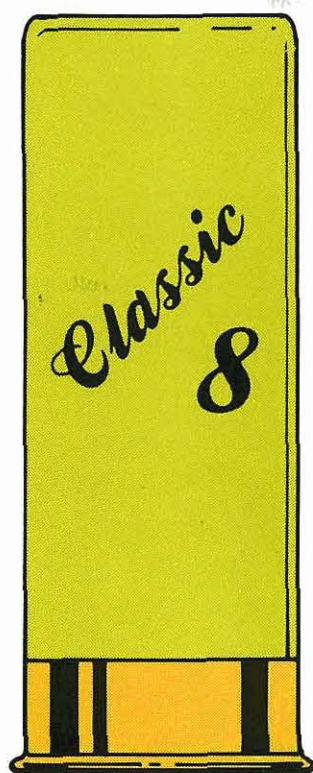
