

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO MEMBERS



As National President I am concerned and disturbed at what is happening at the Executive level of the Association because of the fact that one State is not prepared to accept a democratic decision to a motion which they seconded and which received unanimous support from the Executive Committee.

Because of this I am taking the unprecedented step of going public in the Clay Target Shooting News on matters that are normally, and should be, dealt with within the structure of the Executive Committee.

My reasons for taking this action are clear and simple, and are based solely on my concern for the future well being of this Association.

Please read the letters published in this issue of the Shooting News so that you are aware of the problem with which your Association has been confronted — a problem that is very real and must not be allowed to continue, as to do so would destroy the democratic processes of the ACTA and undermine the structure under which it operates.

I am not going to open the pages of the CTSN on the correspondence which has been published in this month's Shooting News. All I want is for member clubs and you, the registered shooter, to have the facts of the matter clearly presented so that you are fully aware of the difficulties which have arisen since the Executive meeting in June.

At that meeting a unanimous decision was taken by the Executive Committee to appoint Executive members to Sub-Committee roles. This decision was fully compiled with by the three persons who had been given the responsibility, but is now not accepted by one State whose delegate to the National Executive Committee as well as seconding the motion cast a vote which produced a unanimous decision from members of the Executive — this is the reason for my concern.

The costs involved in holding a meeting of the Executive Committee, who are the only people who can address Queensland's demands, are in the vicinity of \$7,000, a cost which is completely unwarranted as the unanimous decision of the Executive has been complied with, which is sufficient reason as to why a meeting will not take place on something that has already been decided. As far as I am concerned the matter, having been dealt with correctly, is now closed.

Precedent for my decision is taken from the Minutes of the corresponding meeting in 1991 when the same delegate from Gueensland requested the then Chairman, Mr J. Scott, to re-open discussion on a matter which had previously been decided upon. The meeting resolved then that no action could be taken owing to the matter having been decided by a vote of the Executive Committee. It appears as though nothing has changed.

Are we working for the best interests of our shooters or are we, as appears strongly to be the case, seeking personal satisfaction, creating factions within the Executive and at the same time disrupting the sport. Who stands to benefit? In my concerned opinion it is certainly not the sport or its members, however — I leave it to you to be the judge.

EXECUTIVE MEMBERS AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION

Dear Sirs and Madam,

We request a Management Committee meeting be held as soon as possible to address all questions raised in this letter, and other matters.

Queensland wishes to express its' concern over the recent changes to sub-committee makeup and its' members portfolios. We feel that these changes have been very poorly considered and perhaps improperly influenced. A short history of our delegates follows.

Queenslands' two delegates joined the ACTA for their first meeting in 1990. At these meetings they were given no sub-committee portfolios, when other more experienced members were given up to three each.

The delegates acted in the best interests of the sport as ordinary executive members for a year, learning the trade as one well remembered Past President put it. At their second meeting in 1991 they were both elected to two committee positions, giving Queensland more input. This was reported to the general membership in our magazine. The Bulletin. The portfolios they were given suited their interests and abilities.

During 1991 they served on those committees diligently and without doubt showed as much interest and had as much input as any other member. Our two delegates were proud of their positions and always promoted the National view at State level.

They were instrumental in breathing some life back into the National Grounds debate, and put as much effort into the Promotions Committee as was allowable under the circumstances.

We do not know of any shortcomings or failings exhibited by our delegates in the performance of their duties at National Level and in the absence of any detrimental written report from their 1991 committee chairmen, as required by the old organisational structure, we can only give them our full support.

When Queensland proposed its delegates for the same committees they were already on we requested that the ACTA promote some stability and continuity in the sub-committee membership.

We expressed concern that the important larger issues, such as a National Grounds, would be severely disadvantaged if continuity and stability were not promoted.

As the number of vacancies on sub-committees is more than the number of new members to the executive we don't see why existing members should be reshuffled when they are performing satisfactorily.

A reshuffle to the extent proposed would destroy continuity on the Finance, Promotions and National Championships Committees. We believe the Finance and Promotions Committees are the two most important for the future of the sport, and are astounded that both have been dismembered. With twenty committee positions available surely their is no need to change 75% of a committee membership in one instance. The Promotions Committee has only one remaining member out of four elected last year. Finance retains two out of four members, a 50% change. We find it hard to understand the logic in this.

Other points we wish to raise are listed below:

- Queenslands comments in relation to stability and continuity obviously were not passed on to other delegates or considered by those setting committee portfolios.
- 2. The decision to allow three people to set the sub-committee portfolios was made because the NSW position in relation to a management member was supposedly not known at the time and NT indicated they could not commit themselves as yet. This stopped those present of the new seven man management having input into the committee positions. The fact is that the NSW position had been quite clearly advised to the Executive Director well in advance of the meeting. The NT position at the time did not stop the committee notice showing Phil Grove TBC (to be confirmed).

- 3. As Deeley was removed from Promotions to stop two being on a committee from one state, what is the difference with two from WA on Finance and two from Qld on National Championships.
- 4. As Queensland is the only State to come out openly and support a National Ground in another state, surely the two Queensland delegates remain obvious choices for the Promotions Committee. Conflict of interest would be minimised if members of the Promotions Committee were from states not submitting proposals for a National Ground. Emphasis has been placed on the National Ground issue when the fact is that perhaps for the next two years it may be the smallest agenda item.

We can only assure you that this State will not be involved when open disclosure is not the order of the day. Having discussed this matter with the members responsible we question the reasoning and the wisdom behind these decisions.

We, the Management Committee of Queensland, await your early response with a date for this meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO STATE ASSOCIATIONS

It is regrettable that I find it necessary to make the comments contained in this letter direct to each State Association, however, in the best interests of the sport I have been left with no alternative.

As you are no doubt aware, the ACTA has recently conducted a series of Sub-Committee meetings plus a meeting of the National Executive Committee.

During the Executive Committee meeting a decision was taken to replace the existing four member Management Committee with a seven member (one per State) Management Committee.

This decision was democratically arrived at, and also the decision to have all Sub-Committee roles allocated by the President. Vice President and Executive Director - a decision which was unanimous, with all members agreeing to accept any allocated responsibility.

We now have a situation where one State is demanding that a special Executive meeting be called to over-rule the democratic and unanimous decision of the Executive, because they are unwilling to accept what they voted for in a unanimous decision.

As Chairman of the Management Committee, I have been pressured to call a meeting for the above purpose, however, my decision in consultation with my Vice President is that as the action of the National Executive Committee was democratic and in accordance with the rules of the Association, it would be irresponsible to bow to the pressure that has been in my opinion unfairly applied to change the direction given by the Executive Committee to suit the whim of the State concerned. For this reason a special meeting, which could cost some \$7,000 to \$8,000, will not be considered."

I believe that all State Associations should be aware of the attitude shown by the State in question to ensure that the facts of the matter are known, and the gravity of the situation is understood by all.

TO EXECUTIVE MEMBERS.

A decision was taken at the recent Executive Meeting for a three man sub-committee, viz; the President, Vice President & Executive Director, to place all Executive members into appropriate sub-committees.

The vote was a unanimous one.

The format of these sub-committees was selected with a great deal of thought and consideration by that elected Selection Committee, to give the best overall working team.

This Selection Committee knows only too well that the new Management structure was voted in with enthusiasm by a majority of our Executive members, and with this in mind we selected people with expertise, enthusiasm and commitment to our clay shooters, to best utilise this new Management Team.

However, as soon as the list was released containing the format of these sub-committees a fierce complaint was lodged by ONE State. with a threat to call a special Executive meeting to have this Selection Committee decision overturned, regarding the format of two sub-committees, in their favour.

At the closure of the Executive meeting there was a strong atmosphere of enthusiasm that our shooters would welcome the seven (7) person Management Committee. It was designed to bring us all closer together. State with State, to achieve more benefits for all concerned. This was praised as a strong democratic move, with more Executive members involved in the management of our sport on a National basis.

I felt proud to be your leader under these new circumstances, which showed a strong commitment for success.

Where is the democratic thinking now?

On the first decision made for our new image, we have two Executive members not even prepared to give the new selection a go - not even for a six month period. During this time the sub-committee chairpersons will make an appraisal of the value to that sub-committee of each member. If deemed necessary, from those appraisals, changes may be required to ensure the best performances from our Executive members.

The ACTA image, which some of our Executive members including the complainants, have stated to be poor and tarnished, in the view of our fellow shooters would surely be completely destroyed if we were to allow factional conflict within our Management Team.

Executive members must learn to realise that they are part of a team. specifically structured to organise and implement policies for the continuing growth, progress and benefits of our sport for our shooters.

You are not selected onto a Management team or a sub-committee for the sole satisfaction of your particular State. You are selected for your considered value and because of your expertise and team spirit.

There cannot be any changes to these sub-committees, except in special instances from a recommendation from the chairperson of a sub-committee, following a six month review of their progress.

Furthermore, all sub-committee members will direct all questions, queries etc. that are required from our Head Office, through their respective chairperson.

This must be adopted to allow the chairperson to be aware of all strategies within that sub-committee. If all members are given free access at all times to seek information from Head Office, our Executive Director will be unable to perform his required duties.

An Executive member can also add input to any other sub-committee through that sub-committee's chairperson.

You are not restricted to your particular sub-committee, because we must all remember that we are part of a team - we do not want solo performances.

Remember, we voted to be a team to serve our shooters on a National scale. We are no longer individuals representing separate States while we are involved in Management policies and sub-committee projects - we are a team working together for all of our nation's clay shooters. ана_н 1 анд 1

THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE QCTA

Dear Sirs,

Please accept this letter in reply to your letter of the 1/7/92. I am writing to you as an individual member of the ACTA Executive, not on behalf of my State or the other Executive member from my State.

Let me make it plain right from the start — You guys must be kidding.

I am writing to complain about the inaccuracies in your letter and the fact they your letter has been distributed as a factual account. I take no offence at the feeling behind the letter, but am offended that incorrect statements are sent to me and you credit myself and the other ACTA Executive members with having no memory of what transpired. 'Unbelievable' sums up my feelings.

I wish to address the inaccuracies in your letter, but first, let me ask you — What do you hope to achieve, that is in the interest of the sport and its members, by disputing the umpires decision?

As to your letter, I make the following points as my memory allows:

- You talk about two Queensland delegates not being elected to sub-committee portfolios in 1990. In 1990 the six sub-committee's did not exist, they were only introduced along with the formal Executive structure at the 1991 meeting. No other members attending their first meeting in 1990 were asked to sit on any committees either, not just the 'hard done by' guys from Queensland.
- 2. You have stated that your two delegates have been "proud of their positions and always promoted the National view at State level." That may well be the case, however the reverse is also true, that at a National level they have always promoted the State view.
- 3. You have stated that "Queensland proposed its delegates for the same committee's they were already on" can only refer to the Executive structure as it was prior to June 1992. As your delegates were the chief instigators of overthrowing the whole ACTA structure, then surely they didn't expect the same sub-committees.
- 4. You have stated that "A reshuffle to the extent proposed would destroy continuity" regarding three sub-committees. How the hell do you know that before any sub-committee has had a chance to operate. Do you really believe that a complete overthrow of the ACTA Executive promotes continuity.
- 5. You raise the point that "Queenslands comments in relation to stability and continuity obviously were not passed on to other delegates." Why the hell not? If your delegates were so concerned, after agreeing that the sub-committee be staffed via the method used, why didn't they pass on their 'comments' to the other delegates?
- "The decision to allow, etc. This stopped those present of the new seven man management having input etc." Rubbishi Everyone present voted unanimously that the 3 person selection committee was appropriate and acceptable.
- 7. "As Deeley was removed from Promotions to stop two being on a committee from one State, etc." That is your misguided opinion, not the written advice of the selection committee. You may remember their brief was 'proposed prior to the meeting re the old structure. Experience and Ability.'
- "Surely two Queensland delegates, etc. Conflict of interest, etc." Perhaps two from the one state, to be lobbicd by those states

wishing to host a National Ground would promote greater 'conflict of interest.'

As to answering your request, I see no necessity for a management committee meeting on the subject of sub-committee positions.

To my second and repeat question — What good is all this doing for the sport or its member shooters? If Queensland is so keen for harmony and action, why not get on with the jobs you have been give instead of all this 'bloody whingeing' about a result from a game you guys instigated and by a referee you guys appointed?

Let's get things moving to allow more people to break more targets, not test their patience and time with complaints of this nature.

Re: Request from QCTA regarding Sub-Committee membership

I refer to the letter dated 1 July 1992 which was copied to all Executive Members (but not the National office) regarding appointments to the various sub-committees.

Initially, I had no intention of responding to this letter and my first reaction was to consign it to the rubbish bin. My reaction, therefore is similar of my colleague Phil Grove. After consideration, I have decided to respond, not directly to QCTA but to the Executive Committee. In doing so, I will leave aside the issue of the propriety of the QCTA Management Committee making such a request of the ACTA and I will ignore the rudeness of QCTA not copying the letter to the Executive Director.

As an ex-member of Management, I can testify that the Qld proposals for the appointment of their delegates to the sub-committees did receive serious and fair consideration. Had the structure not been changed, the outgoing Management Committee would have made recommendations to the full Executive and the appointments would have been voted on in the usual manner. Those recommendations, incidentally, would have gone pretty close to satisfying the Qld requests. However, it seems to have escaped the notice of the QCTA Management Committee, that the structure was fundamentally changed at the 1992 Executive meeting - a process in which the two Old delegates were most instrumental. As soon as that happened, all bets were off as we had entered a totally new ball game. From memory, the motion for three people, the President, Vice President and Executive Director, to place all Executive members into appropriate sub-committees was not only passed unanimously but was seconded by Robert Nugent, the most vocal delegate from Qld. So, it would appear that the Qld delegates having invented a new game and appointed an umpire are only prepared to accept the umpire's decision if the ruling is in their favour.

The comments about the two Qld delegates not being appointed in 1990 are rubbish as the new structure was not implemented until 1991 — I should know as I proposed the re-organisation. That structure, in my opinion, was not given a fair go and arguments regarding the maintenance of continuity are meaningless.

Again in my opinion, the arguments supporting the seven person Management Committee were facile and the whole issue only arose because certain states could not get their members onto Management. (That usually happens when long serving Executive Members are unceremoniously dumped by their states and replaced with aggressive newcomers.) The decision effectively split the Executive and I do not see any short-cuts in the healing process.

After the last meeting I was profoundly depressed as I could not see what value the shooters had got for the \$12,000 (that is roughly what it costs for an Executive meeting). There was a lot of destructive comments and barely disguised personal attacks; a major organisational decision was taken without proper consultation of shooters; the Executive was split down the middle — but what had the shooter got in return? Where is our corporate plan? What are our corporate goals and objectives? What are our major strategies? Where do we see ourselves in 10 years, or 5, or even 1 year? Was there even any discussion on these issues at the last meeting?

Members of the Executive, I put it to you that we do not know where we are going to be in 6 months. As a body, we should stand condemned, and I would not blame the shooters for sacking the lot of us. We have taken a mighty step backward and it would appear that the intent of the Qld letter is to make sure we stay there.

No we do not need a Management Committee meeting - we need to get on with the job and try and repair the damage done to our organisation. For christ's sake, just for once, put your personal egos behind you and start thinking of our sport.

CONSTITUTIONAL AND ORGANISATIONAL MATTERS

Now that the dust has started to settle from the decision to enlarge the Management Committee to seven (National Executive Meeting 12 June 1992), it is timely to weigh up the implications.

The decision has fundamental implications for the organisation of the National Executive and thus for the sport as a whole. There is no point decrying the total lack of consultation with the shooters on a national basis or the indecent haste with which the decision was implemented. The voting is over and now we have to accept the consequences and try to move on in a progressive manner.

What was the decision?

"The Management Committee to be enlarged to a seven member committee, being a representative appointed by each State Association, with the elected President becoming the independent Chairman. The organisational structure be amended to reflect the enlargement of the Management Committee and become a By-Law replacing the rescinded By-Law (1).

Woodhatch/Kenny Carried"

What are the implications?

- The Management Committee is responsible for the day to day administration of the sport and needs to be efficient in operation and flexible. As it is well known that the most efficient committee is a committee of one, it is hard to accept that an increase from five to nine will increase efficiency (both figures include the Executive Director).
- 2. It is not generally understood that the Management Committee has no authority to enact major decisions. All significant deliberations by Management must be submitted as recommendations to the full Executive for final decision. That has not changed but we now have the somewhat farcical situation where seven Executive members now present recommendations to the other seven for endorsement.
- 3. It would be reasonable to expect that the most senior or experienced delegate from each State would become that State's representative on Management. Thus, it would be unlikely that the non-management member would oppose the decision made by the Management member. It would follow, then, it would be unlikely that the full Executive would ever reject a recommendation from Management as voting in the full Executive will merely follow the same pattern as in Management. The real decisions will now be made in Management with a rubber stamp from the Executive. This was never the case before and Management recommendations have frequently been rejected or amended by the Executive.
- 4. Someone, somewhere must, in the interests of the sport, take a consistently national view. Formerly that was a prime function of Management and I am proud to report that, in my experience of Management, a consistently national perspective was always maintained. According to its supporters the reasoning behind the

expanded Management is to ensure equitable State input into Management. Unfortunately, State input will almost certainly result in an emphasis on parochial inter and intra-state issues at the expense of a true national perspective. It is thus difficult to accept that the expanded management will facilitate the establishment of a national corporate direction which is so desperately needed.

- 5. In effect, what has happened is that an Executive has been formed within the Executive. Management has been abolished. I will make a prediction that, in the cause of administrative expediency, the President and perhaps the Vice President will gradually assume responsibility for the small day to day decisions. At a further stage in the process, this surrogate management committee will seek endorsement from the inner Executive who, in turn, will seek endorsement from the outer Executive, Laughable? I wish it was.
- 6. The likelihood of the President utilising a second or casting vote. as defined in Rule 39 (a), is now almost non existent. In the inner Executive an equality of votes is impossible, except in the unlikely event of a member being absent. As the voting pattern of the full Executive will be similar to that of the inner Executive the closest to a tied vote would be 8:6. The President has effectively been disenfranchised.
- 7. The final implication is the all important financial one. In order to complete the required business the previous Management Committee met five times in the last six months of its appointment. (The previous six months dominated by events associated with the previous President's resignation and thus do not constitute a fair assessment.) Four of these meetings were conducted by telephone conference, an efficient and cost effective method. As a telephone conference involving nine people is likely to be remarkably unwieldy, there will be a greater necessity for fact to face meetings of Management. I would suggest that at least three, perhaps four meetings will be necessary, particularly in the first year of operation. That will cost either about \$21,000 (3 meetings) or \$28,000 (4 meetings) which will be over and above the current \$12,000 cost of one full Executive meeting per year. Previously, total travel costs of the Executive and Management were in the order of \$15,000. This year, it is possible that they may go as high as \$39,000. The costs of the telephone conferences will also increase in a similar proportion. Is this news that the average shooter is likely to welcome? It is, after all, shooters money that is being spent.

Conclusions

The implications above should be considered against a backdrop of a steadily decreasing membership, a national economic recession and an increasingly sophisticated attack on firearm ownership throughout Australia. It would seem more reasonable to trim our management structure to make it leaner and more efficient. Instead, we have expanded our structure and almost certainly will become less efficient. In addition, we have become more inward looking, a dangerous trend in these times.

Given the existence of an inner Executive and the effective abolishment of Management as it formally existed, the necessity for the full Executive Committee needs to be questioned. If it merely acts as a rubber stamp for the so-called Management, then it is serving no useful purpose and should be abolished. The constitution would need to be amended to reduce State and Territory representation from two delegates to one.

Alternatively, perhaps we should consider abolishing State representation altogether in favour of a system which selects a minimum number of delegates (4 or 5) from all Australia with emphasis entirely on merit and with no connotation of State or area representation. The Australian Constitution has created a ridiculous state of over-government, administrative duplication and a tremendous waste of energy in internecine state/federal politics. Is there any real need 'to perpetuate this nonsense in a small organisation of just 8.000 shooter? It bears thinking about.

STEEL SHOT Some Facts

As shotgunners should have heard, there is a governmental move now taking place to ban lead shot in favour of steel in some areas of Australia. There are shooters who simply believe this will have no great effect on their shooting. Nothing could be further from the truth. All shotgunners need to be aware of how this change could drastically alter their hunting and shooting activities.

Shooters in various parts of the country are becoming aware that before long the official push to introduce non-toxic steel shot is going to take effect.

Steel shot really began as a concept after his first study into lead poisoning in waterfowl was published in the US by Frank C Bellrose in 1959. A sufficiently good case was made that lead peliets could be toxic when ingested by waterfowl.

After that time, many substances were tested to provide an alternative to traditional lead. Copper, zine and soft iron were among the materials tried. Soft iron, which has now become known as steel, achieved the most favourable results, and it has been under development ever since.

Its first use here was at Bool Lagoon in South Australia, where it has been mandatory for several years. Initially this was the only place it was required, but as of 1992 it is illegal to take lead shot into a game reserve anywhere in South Australia, and as of 1993 it is to be illegal to use lead shot over any recognised South Australian wetland, regardless of whether it is publicly or privately owned.

The Northern Territory has followed suite with several popular waterfowl hunting sites being permanently closed to lead shot from this year. Clearly, the movement is spreading.

While many shooters will be aware that steel shot was mandatory for waterfowling throughout the United States in 1991, few are aware of just how long it has been around. It was widely developed from the late 1960s, and ammunition companies were field testing it extensively that long ago. For instance, in 1971 Remington conducted shooting trials against ducks in Maryland, USA, with 1_{602} loads of US#4 steel compared with 1_{602} loads of US#6 lead.

Over that time, there is no doubt that this shot has improved to some extent. Quite possibly it is now as advanced as it is going to get.

All sorts of processes have been tried, but the product that we are now seeing loaded into American shotgun cartridges is produced by one of the two big companies Hoover, and Daisy, (the latter makes air rifle pellets). Manufacture is relatively expensive, involving muchmore than the traditional long or short drop process of making lead shot.

Steel shot has to be made by first turning the iron into wire or rod shapes, from which it is cut, then turned into balls by a rolling process. Afterwards it is further softened by annealing. It also has to be treated to prevent rusting, which is a big problem in that it is used in the wet conditions that go with waterfowl shooting.

I think it is telling that not even the American big three. Federal, Remington and Winchester, can make their own steel shot. They buy it in. If it were straightforward to make, I don't think there would be any doubt that it would be produced by not one but all of these major manufacturers.

When steel is considered as a substance to be turned into a projectile, it brings with it one disadvantage of the severest kind. It is not heavy enough.

The specific gravity of lead is about 11.4, while from is about 7.8. This $\frac{1}{2}$ means that steel shot is only about two thirds the weight of lead, and regardless of what ballistic tricks are played, this factor is inescapable.

The sphere makes a very poor ballistic missile at best. The thing that makes it useable in a shotgun is principally its weight. In the range of velocities employed in shotgun shooting, the round lead missile can be launched relatively quickly – say, 1400 fps – or relatively slowly – about 1150 fps – and once the hunting shot sizes are reached, it doesn't matter much at the ranges where game is usually shot. Air resistance at forty to fifty yards slows down all the pellets to pretty much the same pace, whether they were launched quickly or slowly.

In the case of steel, this does not apply. Because it is so much lighter, it is not equipped to be an effective missile in the first place. It slows

Consequently, in an effort to combat this shortcoming, it is driven relatively quickly at all times.

The next thing about it is that because of its lightness, the shot sizes that we are used to have to be rethought. A pellet of Australian number three lead shot weighs 3.1 grains, but the same size pellet of steel weighs only 2.4 grains. The traditional size of pellets no longer apply, because the size is only another way of classifying the weight of the pellet.

This difference of material constitutes a very considerable difference in the killing power of the pellets, and that is the major theme of this article.

If we are to look inside a cartridge of steel shot, we find the differences of the projectile material necessitate many changes from what we are used to seeing.

Firstly, because steel is so much lighter than lead, to put the usual hunting weights into the standard 70mm case, that is, 32 or 36 grams, that much more space will be occupied.

As a result, the wads that have to be used are unlike any lead shot wad. They are buckets, without collapsing legs. They are very much longer, because they have to handle the extra length of the shot column.

They are also very much tougher. The plastic used in them has been some time in development, because it has been necessary to offer complete projection to the bore of the barrel, in order to avoid causing severe damage to it. They are much thicker, and that also takes up space. The wads as well have to be split very carefully, or else there is a danger of turning a shot mass into a solid projectile.

The powders used are also different from what we are accustomed to, being so much slower burning than ordinary shotgun ammunition.

Because there are no legs on the wad, and also because the steel is so incompressible, pressures in steel shotted ammunition rise very quickly to heights which we are not used to.

This is exacerbated by the need to keep velocities high and to keep shotloads large, and then exacerbated some more by having these two requirements bound up in such long shot columns.

The cases also are never the well-known AA; they are Reiffenhauser style, with the straight wall of the European design. This has a separate basewad, and the use of it suggests to me that every possible means has to be employed in an effort to keep pressures down. By using a parallel-tubed case, a pressure saving of perhaps a thousand psi can be made, and so this is what manufacturers have to choose.

So, all these things suggest that steel is a far cry from lead, producing ammunition quite unlike anything we have ever been used to.

With regard to the actual loads sold here in Australia, there are only two kinds that I know of. By far the most widespread has been imported fully loaded by Winchester. There is also some that has been brought in by Rottwell, but it is much less common.

In the course of preparing this report, steel shot was used extensively against game in all of the configurations available. Many interviews were also conducted with people who have used it, chiefly at Bool Lagoon.

The test loads were all 12 gauge, and consisted of $1\frac{1}{402}$ of US#4 (Australian #3), which produced 1365fps, and $1\frac{1}{402}$ of US#4 and US#2, both at 1275fps.

If I had a single good thing to say about this stuff, I'd say it now. Unfortunately, I can't think of one.

To continue to put in perspective the problems I have found, it should be said that in America when steel ammunition first hit the market, authorities told shooters that they had to step up two shot sizes when they tried to compare steel with lead. If they wanted the results of American lead sizes, then they had to but American fours when they went over to steel.

This was called 'the rule of two,' and gradually it came to be accepted. American gun writers referred to it often.

However, as time has gone on, it has proved to be more and more controversial, and just changing to a steel shot two sizes larger than its lead counterpart has come to be seen as not all there is to it.

If you look at American advertising, you will see that numerous shifts are taking place in the firearms that are being sold to shotgunners.

We in Australia think of the three inch magnum as being a bit of a rarity; how many people do you know who regularly use one? When I think about it among my own circle of acquaintances I can't name one offhand.

ISU SKEET SEMINAR WA 1992

SATURDAY JUNE 6

The first ISU Skeet Coaching Seminar for WA was held at the West Australian Gun Club on the 6th and 7th June 1992 and acknowledged by all in attendance as a resounding success. The course convener and National Director of Coaching Mr Murray Alexander did a first class job in organising and oversecing this successful venue and can add another notch to his belt in his quest to revamp and give new direction to our National Coaching system.

The principal lecturer/coach was Mr Ian Hale and was supported by Vince Marney and Max Weston. After the introductions were over and the seminar format explained, it was time to get to work.

The first topic covered was 'Interaction,' the need for two way communication and information sharing between coach and shooter.

The next subject was 'Setting Goals,' how important it was to set achievable goals and the steps required to achieve your ultimate goal.

Then came the 'Attention Grabba.' 24 gram loads and a change in the shooting format by eliminating the low single on station 2 and the high single on station 6, and adding a double on station 4. A lengthy discussion followed on how existing equipment would be affected by the reduction in shot weight, especially in the 'forcing cone' and 'choke' areas. It would appear as though a lot of work will be need to be done by the cartridge and equipment manufacturers in this area, to get the best performance possible out of this new mini load.'

The all important subject of 'Gun Fit' was the next cab off the rank and created a lot of discussion, as was expected, by the time this topic was covered completely, many misconceptions were eliminated and the group as a whole benefited enormously.

'Focusing' This was the heart of the seminar. The kill of soft focusing, seeing the target clearly as it leaves the trap then narrowing the focus to the point where you can almost read the name on it, hard focus. The area where the target is broken, grey area, seeing the target break and following through.

Next it was off to the layout to test the theory and for the majority, it was a situation of pleasant surprise, especially shooting doubles on station 4. The success of the group in trying the new format was exceptional and the confidence gained guaranteed ian everybody's attention for the balance of the seminar. All the shooters were using the self assessment process and analysing each others performance signalling the beginning and development of their awareness skills.

Lunch

Gun Handling skills got things on the move after a lunch break, this subject re-emphasised the importance of gun fit. The need to practice gun mounting and swing at home on a daily basis was the important message here, and I think at this point the group started to realise that if high expectations were to materialise then they were all in for a lot of hard work, from this point on.

Smile folks you're on Gun Cam!

It was time to do some shooting on video, and check individual gun mounting problems, as well as showing the shooters how the coach sees them. This session had a lot of impact because the camera tells no lies, and the shooter can immediately see what the coach has been saying and if the camera is used constructively, the benefits are numerous.

Arousal and the methods used to control if was another module that proved to be a real hot topic, because everyone without exception, could relate to its effect on positive and negative results experienced in the past. Many examples were sighted for over or under arousal, and what needs to be done to control this human phenomenon, and thereby produce a desired result.

Fitness and Diet were discussed at length covering methods of exercising and the benefits to the competitor for developing a healthy mind and body, through proper diet and physical fitness.

Centring, a skill developed to block out external influences. from background noise to thinking of how the scoreboard looks. How to use this skill in conjunction with visualisation (mental rehearsal) to rub out negative and promote positive thought prior to calling 'pull.' The use of breathing control and how it is used to stimulate the centring process.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF COACHING

On Friday 12th June I delivered my first report to the ACTA Executive Committee Meeting. Following are relevant excerpts from that report.

Since accepting the position as Director of Coaching I have attempted to identify the areas within the coaching field that required attention. After discussing with State Coaches these directions and listening to many suggestions and criticisms, a positive start was made.

Collation of Coaches State by State

A request was forwarded to the Australian Coaching Council for a complete read-out of the current status of all Accredited Coaches as of January 1, 1992. There is now a current list including newly Accredited Coaches available through the National office. They are made up of 267 Level 1, 55 Level 3 and 7 Level 3 with 21 Level 1 becoming unregistered and 3 deceased.

An Introduction to Clay Target Shooting

This booklet which is the front line of the ACTA promotion of our sport as well as a basic instruction manual, was the first major revision to be undertaken. Again after consulting the State Coaches, a revision plan of ideas and content was formulated. After many hours of writing and lengthy revisions, a final draft was accepted for publication. This is now with the National office where it has been installed on the computer for in-house printing.

Level 1 Accreditation Revision

In 1990, the Australian Coaching Council requested a revision of all sports Accreditation Schemes.

After designing a basic outline it was felt that more detail of requirement from ACC was required. With the assistance of Mr Alan Maher. I obtained enrolment at the Institute of Sport for a workshop on Accreditation and Revisions. From this workshop a completed revision of our Level 1 has been documented, containing ACC requirements as well as improved sports specific.

This document is now in the hands of the Australian Coaching Council's Technical Committee for its August meeting.

ACC Coaches Accreditation Update

Along with the request for a revision of our accreditation levels came a request for the ACTA's Coaches Update policy. The principle behind this policy is to ensure a coaches continuing commitment to coaching over a four year span. The suggested requirements ACC put forward were Level 1 – 24 hours or points, Level 2 – 48 hours or points and Level 3 – 100 hours or points. With guidance obtained during the workshop, a policy was constructed that suited the ACC requirements yet fitted in with our sport's unique characteristics. This policy, also with the ACC Technical Committee, is one, that once read and understood by our coaches should be adopted easily.

Basic Coaching Manual

With the completion of the Level 1 revision came the need for an improved and updated revision of this coaching manual. Using the

Many hours of research have so far gone into the different segments to be contained in the revised coaching manual. Input has been sought and obtained from various sources and individuals and at this point is being carefully evaluated and compiled. It is hoped that by the State Coaches Conference in August a mock up will be available for a first review.

Certificates

One of the requirements the ACC asks of each sport when accrediting their coaches is for that sport to supply a certificate to compliment the ACC's badge and ID card. This has been completed for acceptance by the State Coaching Directors before its design is recommended to the ACTA Executive.

Library of Coaching Data

Comprehensive coaching material has always been a commodity short in availability when we talk about the disciplines shot within Australia. To attempt to create a library of in-depth data for our coaches I have instigated a search for this material among a group of knowledgeable shooters. Initially only a small group have been asked to put pen to paper on their disciplines and to provide coaching manuals that may then become the foundation of ACTA Coaches data bank.

State Coaches Conference 15 & 16 August 1992

This conference, the first since 1990 and the first for several State Coaches should prove to be the most in-depth yet held. It will see the finalisation of old and outstanding issues as well as mapping out recommendations of the future of coaching. It is planned to use as much available time from Friday evening to Sunday mid morning to cover all items correctly.

From this conference will come recommendations of coaching needs and the direction perceived to be needed.

WORLD CUPS PRE OLYMPICS 1992

Barcelona/Lonato/Suhl

On Saturday April 23, Russell, Michael and John left Australia for their Pre Olympic Games training. First up was Barcelona. This event was a closed shoot in all shooting disciplines, limited in most cases to one shooter per country for each discipline. Australia was granted an extra shooter in trap in recognition of Michael and Russells efforts in 1991–1992.

Barcelona was under the control of Mr David MacFarlane, Shooting Team Manager for the Olympic Games. On all reports from our shooters, the Speith equipment installed in Barcelona was throwing the targets exceptionally fast in their initial stages. This did not allow most of the shooters time to come to terms with the range, but after the 200 targets, Russell finished in the top 24, making the cut, with both John and Michael just missing the cut.

On Saturday April 30, I met Michael, John and Russell at Frankfurt airport, where we left by car for a rather long drive to Lonato in Italy, so the boys could compete in local competition on Sunday.

On arrival at the club we were to find out that they could only shoot for targets, so after two rounds each we left for our motel for a much carned rest. Monday was spent finding ammunition and visiting the Beretta factory and meeting with Greg Newey, who had arrived at his own expense, then to the club for a couple of practice rounds each. after which we called it a day.

Tuesday and Wednesday were taken up with official practice. John was shooting very well and was looking forward to his match. Russell. Michael and Greg were meeting with mixed success, but with so much practice they were also looking for the competition to start.

Thursday and Friday saw the first 150 targets shot, the semi final (cut) determined, and the teams match resolved.

JOHN - 25 + 25 + 23 + 24 + 25 + 22 = 144/150

This put John into the semi in 23rd position, his last round being very costly.

RUSSELL - 23 + 25 + 24 + 23 + 24 + 24 = 143/150

This also put Russell into the semi in 8th position, very consistent shooting.

Michael and Greg both missed the cut, Michael started both days disastrously and finished in 25th position.

MICHAEL - 20 + 25 + 23 + 20 + 25 + 25 = 138/150

GREG - 24 + 23 + 22 + 22 + 23 + 19 = 133/150

On Saturday we left for Suhl (Germany). Sunday was official practice day where both Michael and Russell trained very well.




