The Special Meeting of the National Executive held in Melbourne brought about more unexpected changes to the administration of our Association.

I have now been elected to chair your Association, and Allan Kenny (Tas) is your new Vice President. We must now look to the future with the firm belief that the Executive will now be unified in their endeavour to achieve the goals and objectives set down and actively attend to the needs of all shooters of the Association.

I believe we must encourage every clay target shooter to become a member of our Association and look to expanding our disciplines to cater for all.

A decision was made at the meeting to send a 3 person Trap Team to take part in the Oceania Championships at the invitation of the New Zealand Shooting Association. These teams are to be self funding, but most certainly will be Australian Representative Teams. The Skeet team will be selected at the Perth Nationals and a special selection shoot will be held in Sydney for the Trap Team. Any funds raised at this shoot will go to the team.

In the next edition of the CTSN there will be a report on the final of the Victorian School Persons shoot held on the 16th September. It is a very positive aspect of our sport, in that some 600 secondary school students took part in the 4 Zone Eliminator.

It is events such as this that will ensure the future of Clay Target Shooting.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS NOTES

NO CONFIDENCE MOTION - NATIONAL PRESIDENT

At a special meeting of the Executive Committee on Saturday 12th September, National President Leighton Martin from South Australia was removed from office as a result of a no confidence motion put to the meeting by Queensland delegate Robert Nugent.

The no confidence motion was the result of an action by the President when he reported to members via the CTSN on the problems which he believed existed within the sport at Executive level.

South Australian delegate Graham Michell called upon the Executive to instruct the President to publish an apology to Queensland, this action did not occur with the President stating that he believed that he had acted in the best interest of the sport by advising members of the problems he believed existed, and that an apology, as well as not being necessary, would not be forthcoming.

Queensland delegate Robert Nugent then moved a motion of no confidence in the President, seconded by Noel Deeley (Qld), which was supported by G. Michell (SA), J. Murphy (Tas), A. Kenny (Tas), G. Mahoney (Vic), W. Jones (NSW). Delegates against the motion R. Silvester (WA), R. Smith (NSW), R. Fox (NT), E. Forward (WA), P. Grove (NT), with G. Woodhatch (Vic) abstaining and D. Lymn (SA) not in attendance.

NATIONAL PRESIDENT ELECTED

Following the no confidence vote in National President Leighton Martin (SA), a poll was conducted for the position of National President, which produced a tied vote between G. Woodhatch (Vic) and P. Grove (NT). Following a second vote being taken Glenn Woodhatch (Vic) was elected as National President with Allan Kenny (Tas) elected to the position of Vice President.

EXECUTIVE MEETING REPORT

EXECUTIVE MEMBER RESIGNS

Robert Smith a member of the National Executive Committee representing NSW has advised of his resignation as NSW State President as well as from all positions on the State Association.

Robert was first elected to the National Executive Committee in 1985, becoming a member of the Management Committee in 1991. His experience at all levels of the sport will be greatly missed and on behalf of all shooters we thank him for his contribution to the development of the sport of Clay Target Shooting and trust that he retains an active interest in Clay Target Shooting where his shooting skills have been well demonstrated on many occasions.

PIGEON FANCIERS ASSOCIATION

Many of our members will no doubt have read in the daily and country press of comments by a Director of the Pigeon Fanciers Association which attributed part of the blame for racing pigeons that had gone missing to thugs from gun clubs.

This matter has been taken up with the President of the Pigeon Fanciers Association who to date has not produced a response. A press release was issued from the National office which hopefully was published in all of the newspapers which carried the offensive article.

1996 OLYMPIC GAMES QUOTAS/MQS

Trap — Skeet — Double Trap

The International Olympic Committee has approved a total of 430 athletes to participate in shooting events at the 1996 Olympic Games. The following quotas have been established for Shotgun:

Men's Trap: (40) Minimum qualifying score 112/125
Men's Skeet: (40) Minimum qualifying score 114/125
Men's Double Trap: (20) Minimum qualifying score 120/150
Women's Double Trap: (20) Minimum qualifying score 96/120

NOTE:

- (i) Women's Olympic events in Trap and Skeet will not be held.
- (ii) Quota places are granted to the IUT Member Federations National Olympic Committee and not to the persons who obtain them.
- (iii) A shooter can only win one quota place for his/her country.
- (iv) Maximum country participation per event — men and women:
Trap and Skeet: 3 athletes — total 6, men only
Double Trap: 2 athletes — total 4, men/women

OLYMPIC GAMES BARCELONA 1992

July 1992 was the pinnacle of Russell, Michael and Johns shooting career as they prepared to leave Australia for Barcelona to compete in the Olympic Games. This was a first for Michael and John, Russell taking part in the 1986 Games in Seoul.

The boys had decided to leave their arrival in Barcelona as late as possible, allowing them more time to train at home and not become bored with too much free time, and nothing to do in the village before the competition began.

John was the first to arrive and after a couple of days rest he started training. He trained very well under difficult circumstances, with only two or three shooters in his squad.

Russell and Michael arrived in time for the Opening Ceremony and to support John in his match. The Opening Ceremony was attended by our three shooters who looked the part. They got the buzz that sent the pulse beat racing and made them realise that the Games had begun.

Day one of the Games and John was in squad five. He did not get the start he would have liked shooting 23/25. He followed this with 24/25, then 25/25 for a total of 72/75. This left John well back in the field and he knew he had to shoot well on day two, which he did, shooting 24, 25, 25. This gave him a total of 146/150 and lifted him to be placed 20th and into the top 24.

John got to shoot on day three, with a slight chance of making the final six if he shot 50 straight, however this was not to be. John shot 49/50 with a 24 in his last round, that took him from top twelve position to finish 22nd on 195/200.

The event was won by Shan Zhang of China, a female shooter who lead all the way until the final. She had shot 200/200, then missed on four and five and looked out of it until the pressure told on the others also. But with 223/225 the gold medal was hers, while three shooters on 222/225 shot off for the silver and bronze medals. Juan Gihia of Peru was the only one to shoot station one for the silver medal, with Bruno Rossetti of Italy taking the bronze after shooting another six targets.

Johns performance was excellent. It was the highest score shot by an Australian at any Olympic Games, finishing in front of the World Record Holder and many World Championship and World Cup winners. This score in Australia would win on almost all occasions.

Russell and Michael had limited practice following the skeet on days of competition, but now with the skeet finished, the business end of the trip had arrived for Russell and Michael. Two days of official practice, with three rounds per day, both trained very well and shot confidently and were looking forward to the match.

Competition began with Russell first up in squad two and Michael in squad four. Russell did not get a good start shooting 23/25. He followed this with 24/25 and 25/25 to finish on 72/75 in 14th position. Michael got a fair start shooting 24/25, which he followed with two 25/25 finishing the day in equal first place on 74/75.

Day two of the match and Michael continued to shoot very well with another two 25/25, but then slipped a little with a 23/25. This put Michael on 147/150 in equal second place. Russell also began well with a 25/25. He then shot 23/25 and 24/25 to finish on 144/150 in 18th position. Both got into the semi final.

Michael and Russell knew they had to continue to shoot well if they were to make the final. Russell shot an excellent 49/50 to finish on 193/200 in 9th position, with Michael feeling the pressure a little, shooting a 22/25 in his first round then a 24/25. Michael also finished on 193/200, but in 11th position. As with John both these boys finished in front of a World Record holder and many of the more fancied shooters.

The event was won by Petr Hrolicka of Czechoslovakia, but as with the skeet, the lead changed from shooter to shooter during the final and at the end of the final, two were equal for the gold and two were equal for the bronze. The winning score being 195 + 24 + 1. Silver went to Kazumi Natanabe of Japan 195 + 24 + 0 with the bronze medal to Marco Venturini of Italy 195 + 23 + 9.

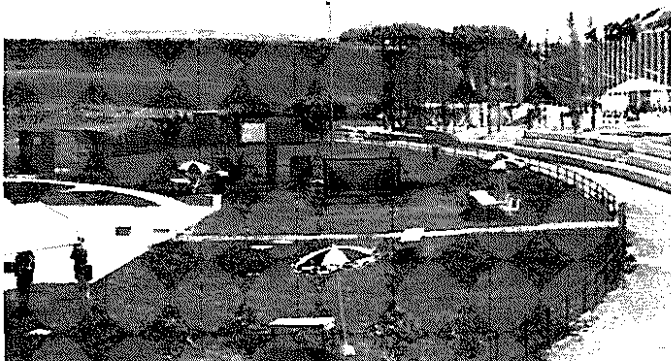
Russell and Michaels performances were also excellent, just two targets of a final spot away, and to finish in the top twelve in the world is something they and all shooters of this country should be proud of.

These three shooters are truly a credit to their Association, magnificent ambassadors for their country and a pleasure to be with and work with. They will, in my opinion, be around for a long time and will win medals in top competition throughout the world in the years to come.

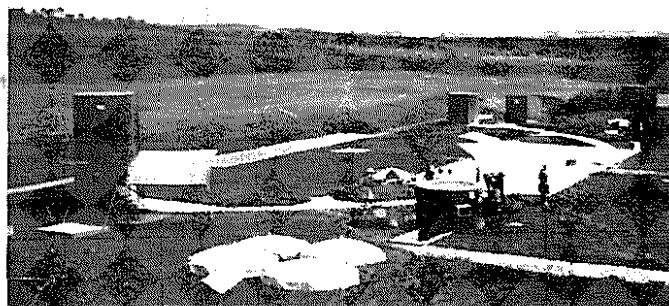

In my report to the ACTA Executive meeting 12th June and as printed in the August edition of the CTSN, I made mention of a Coaches Accreditation Update Policy.

This policy that has now been officially approved by the ACC, actually started for ACTA Coaches on the 1st January 1991. The date, although 18 months past, was designated from a previous attempt on our update.

However after long discussions at the State Coaches Conference, no coach, once an Update Log Book is received, will be penalised with the loss of time needed to gain points. Each State Coach will therefore be in contact with each and every coach within their State.

What does Accreditation Update mean to you and me? It means that over a four year period we exercise the skills we learnt in taking coaching courses and by doing so, learn more and advance our knowledge in Sports Specifics. For this effort the Australian Coaching Council ensures your credentials are renewed each four years and retained on an active list. Not much, maybe the words used to describe update, but as time goes by an insurance policy is to be introduced for coaches who have ACC Accreditation. We all know that 'litigation' is becoming a problem in all sports and walks of life so a Coaches Insurance Scheme will be important.

As well as this proposed scheme all active coaches will receive from the ACTA Coaching Council improved Coaching Manuals and Sports Specific data. These items as well as proposed Coaches Seminar are being designed to lift the profile of the Coach and in turn give Coaches pride in themselves, that an Australian Accredited Coach should have.

Please read the Update Policy that pertains to your Accreditation Level and give it a fair go. We need and wish to retain all Accredited Coaches.

1992 Crayfish Carnival July 25th & 26th

The 1992 Crayfish Carnival had the hallmarks of a good carnival – a mixture of novelty and competitiveness among shooters.

The first event on Saturday was the 25 DB Cash Divide where 6 shooters in A grade and 5 shooters in B grade all shot 25/25 to share the money in their respective grades and Amanda Shipp shot 24/25 in C grade to get the majority of the money for the grade.

The second event was the 25 DB Inshore Electronics District Championship with Terry Fraser and Harry Miller contesting for the Overall. Terry eventually winning with 107/107 and with this he also achieved his 100 break badge.

The third event was the 25 DB PS Zone Championship with Ted Dickinson winning outright with 74/75.

Before proceeding into the last event the club tried a concept which they called the Shooters Jackpot whereby a shooter must shoot 5 out of 5 from a set meterage – which may range from 17 to 22 metres. The shooter can buy up to a maximum of 3 tickets at \$1.00 each. These tickets then go into a barrel and five individual shooters are drawn, who then draw a meterage from which they must shot from. The sale of the tickets go to form the jackpot.

Two shooters namely Roy Holtfreter and Darren Lee were able to complete the task and pick up \$116.50 each. Darren completed his from the 21m mark and Roy from 18 metres.

The fourth and last event of the day was 25 DB Crayfish Carnival Graded where an epic struggle developed between Harry Miller and Lex Shipp to determine first in A grade, with Harry eventually winning with 106/106.

The day ended with 99 shooters taking part in proceedings and Sunday had 101.

Sunday started with 5Pr Double Rise Pages Special as a lead up to the State Double Rise Championship. This was eventually won by Jon Dyas with 18/18.

The major event was the State Double Rise Championship which was sponsored by the Geraldton Fishermen's Co-operative and was won by Gary Kelly, a member of Geraldton Club, with a fine 45/50. First in A grade was David Fox with 43/50, Dave Hilsz got first in B grade with 43/50 and John Coverley was first in C grade with 38/50. Helen Weise took out the Ladies with 32/50, Roy Holtfreter won the Veterans with 41/50 and Jason Bordley took the Juniors with 36/50.

The seventh event on the program was the 25 DB City of Geraldton, where 18 shooters got 25/25 to go into a shoot off for the Overall, which was eventually won by Scott Voak from the Northam club with a fine 115/115. David Fox took first in A grade with 114/115, Victoria Chuiko first in B grade with 58/59 and Amanda Shipp first in C grade with 24/25.

Before proceeding into the last event the club ran the Shooters Jackpot again with Neil Dowie going it along to win \$211.

The last event on the program was the 25 DB Crayfish Handicap with the Overall Winner being Scott Forsyth after a shoot off with John Coverley and Toni Watson. Scott shot 42/43 from 16m and as a result, John Coverley took first in the 11-15m group with 41/43, Victoria Chuiko took first in the 16m group with 34/35, Michael Boschetti took the 17-18m group with 32/33 and Terry Fraser took the 19-25m group with 24/25. Helen Wiese took the Ladies with 23/25, Kurt Schinzig took the Veterans with 23/25 and Wade Horo took the Juniors with 22/25.

The club tried another concept called Crayfish Poker which is based on the number of 25s a shooter can get in five allocated events (1, 2, 3, 4 & 7) and takes the form of a poker hand. The best hand a shooter got during the weekend was 2 pair (which did not include shoot offs), this was achieved by Harry Miller.

Harry shot 25s in events 1, 2, 4 & 7 he missed scoring a 25 DB possible in event 3, otherwise he would have achieved the highest category – the full house, but he still was able to win \$100 as a result of being the only shooter in the category.

The results of the poker were interesting – 37 individual shooters managed to get at least one or more 25s over the five events: Category – Number of Shooters – Final Dividend – Definition.

The final dividend was determined by dividing \$100 by the number of shooters in each category.

Both Phil Sandman and John Marshall both achieved their first 25 trap breaks and picked up an extra \$25.00.

Some shooters could have done a little better under this concept if they could turn 24s into 25s. But there is always next year.

The program was completed with the awarding of the Overall High Gun to David Fox with 245/260. The Ladies High Gun went to Victoria Chuiko with 227/260, the Veterans High Gun to Roy Holtfreter with 234/260 and Matthew Shipp took the Junior High Gun with 221/260.

Fresh from his 9th placing at the Barcelona Olympic Games Olympic Trap shooter Russell Mark smashed the Australian Double Barrel long break record over a marathon two days shooting at Tamworth NSW, using 28g load cartridges.

Shooting against all comers Russell's long break of 1177 smashed his previous record by a massive 318 targets.

The 1968 long break of 732 set by Victorian Jack Henwood was first broken by Russell in January 1992 when 859 targets were broken at the Geelong Gun Club.

Russell a property valuer from Hoppers Crossing in Victoria represented Australia at the 1988 and 1992 Olympics as well as the 1990 Commonwealth Games in Auckland.

With a World Cup win in the USA in 1991 and a World Cup ranking of 2, Russell has clearly established himself as one of Australia's all time great shotgun shooters.

MEDIA RELEASE

Budget Program for Sport

The Minister for the Arts, Sport, the Environment and Territories, the Hon Ros Kelly MP, announced today that \$82.9 million was to be provided for sport and recreation in 1992-93.

Of this, the Australian Sports Commission will receive \$59.6 million for 1992-93.

"It is my firm view that Australia's sporting success over the past few years, not just at Barcelona, owes much to the four year funding commitment which this Government previously gave to sport," Mrs Kelly said. "We are maintaining this commitment in this financial year."

An announcement will be made at a later date on future funding.

The Minister also announced continued funding of \$12.3 million in 1992-93 for the development of community-level leisure facilities.

The breakdown of the 1992-93 sport and recreation budget is as follows:

• Australian Sports Commission	\$59.6m
• Community Cultural, Recreation and Sporting Facilities Program	\$12.3m
• Australian Sports Drug Agency	\$3.2m
• Recreation and Water Safety Programs	\$2.0m
• Sydney Olympic Bid	\$5.0m

The Minister stated that while factors determining the level of funding to sport were much wider than Australia's success at the Barcelona Olympics, the achievements of our athletes are a clear indication that the Government's programs to develop sport in Australia are successful.

"The Government also places a high priority on the need to encourage and promote the benefits of participation in sport and recreational activities by all Australians. Funding priorities in the future will emphasise sports participation" Mrs Kelly said.

In making the announcement, Mrs Kelly said "I am particularly pleased that the Community Facilities Program is able to reach directly into communities across Australia to assist with the provision of much needed community facilities. This program will continue to make a tremendous contribution to encouraging people to participate in activities in their own community. As well, the injection of funds will have a positive impact on many local economies."

The Minister also mentioned that she was particularly impressed with what the Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) had been able to achieve in such a short time through its testing and educational programs. ASDA will receive an additional \$300,000 this year to enhance its education programs.

Mrs Kelly said "While the Sports Drug Agency's testing programs were essential, the long term solution to the drugs in sport problem lay in educational programs and an international network of commitment and co-operation."

Sport Welcomes Federal Budget

The Confederation of Australian Sport has acknowledged the Government's commitment to sports development by its decision to maintain existing funding levels in the Budget.

An amount of \$82.9m has been provided for sport and recreation in the budget. The Confederation has also been arguing that the Government should provide a longer-term commitment to sports funding and is looking forward to an early Government announcement of an on-going program of support. It believes this commitment is essential for sports to plan efficient and effective programs.

Executive Director of the Confederation, Mr Dene Moore, said the range of major initiatives being promoted by the Confederation in recent times had clearly assisted the Government reaching this decision. "We welcome Mrs Kelly's statement that funding priorities in the future will emphasise sports participation," Moore said. "Now that we are finally starting to look after our top athletes properly, we need to address the base of sport as well."

"This investment by taxpayers will pay dividends many times over, particularly through programs which will increase participation by Australians in healthy activity," he added.

The Confederation has also pointed out that sport is a significant employer. Current estimates indicate that there are some 80,000 full-time jobs in sport and many more part-time, with numbers growing rapidly in recent years.

BISMUTH NON-TOXIC SHOT

(Continued from September issue).

21 grains of D20 and 1 1/16oz, 30 grams, of bismuth shot, still with AA case, wad and primer, gave 54% through the quarter choke .014" barrel, and 64% through the three-quarter choke .025". Pattern distribution was well above normal and up into the good range, and I have to say that with regard to quality I would shoot this load rather than many lead ones I've made in the past.

All these experiments were done under time pressure to meet the need to get this information out to the readership. However, with even this relatively short exposure to the new shot material, it was obvious that it was performing in its patterning characteristics in a way that was comparable to lead shot in the two to three percent antimony range.

This is the most common span of shot hardness. The fact that patterns are a bit more open here or a bit tighter there is of no consequence at all, something easily dealt with in the usual reloading process, where a gun and load combination has to be settled on after a bit of experimentation.

And then came the field test. We had the patterns, but would it work against game?

Because of the limitation of the small shot size, I was reluctant to use the shot against ducks and rabbits, so I again took a variety of test loads, and had them shot at feral pigeons by not just myself, with all results recorded for later analysis.

I should say here that nothing annoys me more than seeing some so-called shotgun ammunition test braying about how a cartridge is a good one because somebody used it in the field and can boast proudly about producing half a dozen oneshot kills with it, and then concluding it must be a wonderful product.

This approach tells nobody anything about shotgun ammunition. As long as the loads used in it are of standard velocity or better, a shotgun will work against most small game with almost any choke in almost any shot size to pretty near thirty metres, and the fact that it kills a few head of game with a particular load is probably not significant.

The way to make an accurate assessment must begin with patterning, and comparison of the results with other known data. And this we have done.

In the case of bismuth, however, as with steel shot, there was a real question mark against the suitability of the very material that had been employed for the shot charge. If there were real inadequacies, then these might be shown up by full ballistic tests, such as shooting into ballistic grade gelatine and being compared with numerous other loads at the same time.

However, there being no time for this, and being very familiar with the performance of all sorts of loads under all sorts of conditions against feral pigeons, and the shot size on test also being more suitable for the task, it was plain that some more pigeon shooting was what the doctor ordered.

As a result of that testing, I am going to stress one very important point: the bismuth did not perform differently to lead in any significant way. It was with great delight I discovered that when shooting the new material, no change in forward allowance was required.

This point cannot be overemphasised. If shooters of steel are going to get into difficulty with it when they begin using it, it's because it is so much less dense than what we are used to in the form of lead. Because it's lighter, I suspect steel keeps its speed up over the first twenty-five meters or so, meaning that less forward allowance has to be given at such ranges - but then it slows down dramatically, and more has to be given at medium ranges. At longer ranges it can't be used at all. This confuses the eye and baffles the muscle memory. It makes the shooter balk at opportunities that are reachable and then get disappointed and frustrated at all the unsuccessful shots that follow that experience says should have paid off.

With the bismuth, it was just as though lead shot was in the gun.

Yes, there was one result which typed it as a new material. Although it measured as number 7 it weighed in as 7½, so its killing power was as the latter. In the field this brought it back about four yards in its ranging power from what one would expect from number 7 - but the good news is that it did genuinely only bring it back to the same distance as one would expect for 7½.

In other words, in selecting this shot for game shooting, my conclusion is that shooters are going to have to select it in terms of its weight and not its size; however, this is no problem at all, if there's only a half size of difference in it, between bismuth and lead.

Lead shot of size five or larger can be used on the low velocity principle; this means that it does not matter much how fast it is driven, because it will still reach the target at pretty much the same speed once about forty yards is passed.

In the case of bismuth, it will probably mean in practice that the shooter who wants to use it against ducks may have to go to size four to capitalise on this fact of physics. However, once the slightly heavier shot is chosen, there should be no appreciable difference between bismuth and lead, presuming that future bismuth shot is the same as or better than the current prototype.

Now, if you can come up with better news than that, I'd like to know what it is. There's no danger of being able to say such good things about steel shot.

In the field testing, great care was taken with examination of wounds on the live game that was shot. Initially afraid of the possibility that the pellets may fragment, I was pleased to find that they seemed to perform exactly as lead does, with the under forty yard birds having the same number of exit wounds as would be the case with lead loads. There was no undue wounding or feathering of birds, unlike what I found with steel.

The only oddity to report was a couple of large exit holes, which I am unable to explain. It could have been 'balling' where the shot is fused by gases and clumps together to make an oversize projectile of a number of welded pellets; however, in all the patterns I shot I did not find the slightest sign of this, and so no explanation offers itself. More work will have to be done as the story develops.

Yet another great advantage of bismuth shot as a concept is that in the reloading of it there are no special considerations.

Unlike in loading for steel, the same components can be employed that we all use in reloading our lead shot cartridges.

In reloading bismuth, there would be no wild pressure hikes, no barrel damage, no choking problems, no need for strict separation of guns and powder and wads and cases for steel and lead. The only difference on the reloader's bench at home is that there would be an additional bottle of shot which would be reserved for making waterfowl loads for shooting over any wetlands which it is acknowledged are not suitable for lead shot.

In the event that proper scientific study finds the need for this, then I could go so far as to say that bismuth shot could work out as an option against lead; there's no way that I could ever see myself saying that about steel.

As supplied, bismuth patterned like lead, performed like lead against game, and offered no ballistic disadvantages of any kind.

The clubs in this section will include: C.M.T., Derby, Eastern Goldfields, Exmouth, Geraldton, Koolan Island, Kambalda, Lancelin, Laverton, Meekatharra, Newman, Northam, Southern Cross and the West Australian Gun Club - only ISU Skeet and Trap.

John will be responsible for the ISU coaching in the State.

Tim will be responsible for the southern half of the state, the clubs in this section include: Albany, Augusta, Boyup Brook, Bunbury, Busselton, Collie, Denmark, Edgehill, Esperance, Katanning, Kojonup, Narrogin, Peel & Districts, Salmon Gums, Wagin and the standard trap and skeet at the West Australian Gun Club.

The Association has also appointed Mr Robert Mosel to act as the State Coaching Co-ordinator, which involves the role of liaising between clubs, zone coaches and the joint State Coaching Directors and reporting to the WACTA Committee on coaching activity within the state and its funding.

It is hoped that clubs would plan to hold regular coaching sessions and clinics for their members (and respective new members), in order to increase a shooter's confidence and competitiveness.

It is important that shooters utilise their own club coaches and the coaching network in order to become better shooters.

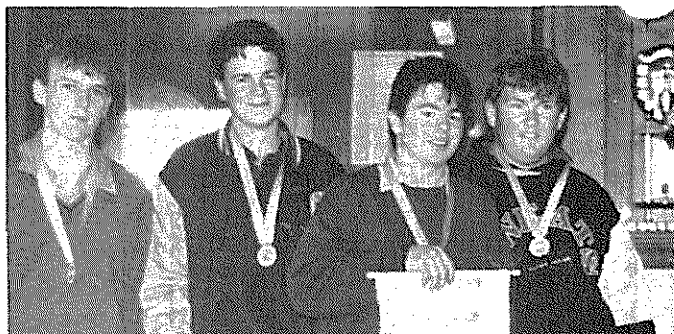

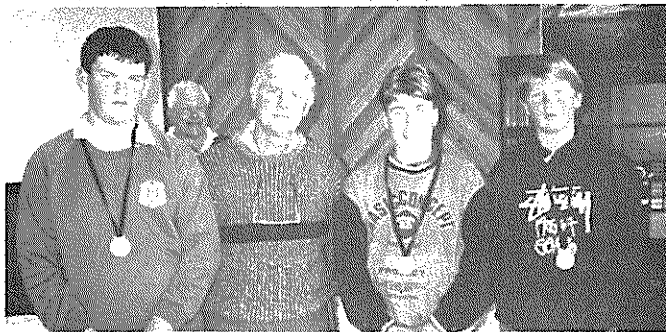

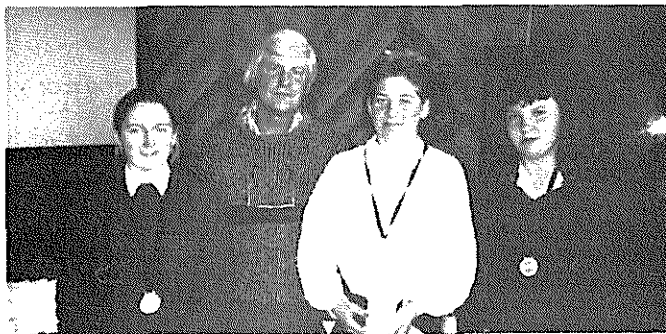

SKEET SEMINAR WAGC 1992

The first skeet seminar in WA since 1983 was held at the West Australian Gun Club on Sunday 9th August 1992. In spite of predictions of cold, wet and windy weather, attendance was better than planned, with 34 members reflecting a broad range of novice and experienced shooters, thus confirming a strong interest in the discipline and demand for adequate coaching.

Murray Alexander, our National Director of Coaching, officially opened the seminar, acknowledging the conscientious efforts and hard work by WAGC Skeet Coach, Max Weston, in preparing, arranging and presenting the seminar. Mr John Harris, State ISU Coach and Zone 1 Coach, Mr Peter Strike, attended the opening session and were pleased by the response from WA shooters. Lets hope that this positive start made by Max can be further developed into a full program to benefit the shooters of this state.

Introduction:

Max outlined the objectives and format of the seminar, linking it closely with a reference training manual provided to each of the attending shooters. The purpose of the seminar was to introduce the novice to the basic fundamentals and techniques of skeet, while reinforcing the same to experienced shooters who have never fully understood the idiosyncrasies of the discipline.

Origins of Skeet was the opening subject with explanations as to how it started and subsequent changes introduced to bring it to its current format. **The shooting foundation** highlighted the importance of the basic fundamentals, and how they can affect growth development and shooting skills.

Gun Fit was discussed in depth, catering primarily for the experienced shooters, but with sufficient interaction from novices to satisfy their curiosity. **Reference point, feet position and hold position** were covered in detail, as they form the basis of fundamental shooting technique. It was surprising to witness so many 'experienced' shooters solving their age-old problems by discovering that they had drifted away from the 'basic fundamentals,' or had not learned them from the start.

Mental Rehearsal was discussed briefly as a potential benefit to competitive development. While an important subject, detailed reference to it would have changed the direction of the seminar, resulting in the loss of interest by most of the audience. A video, 'What you see is what you get,' referring to metal rehearsal, or 'visualisation' was enjoyed prior to the morning tea break.

Due to 'time overrun,' the next scheduled film, 'Showman Shooter' was shown during the morning tea break, and enjoyed by all.

Lead and forward allowance: was the first subject after morning refreshments and occupied most of the second session, as a number of pertinent questions were raised relevant to various stations. Max explained the benefit of 'lead markers' and how they simplify the changing perception of lead from station to station. This was particularly appreciated by the novice group, as it gave them a distinct pictorial view of what was required.

Types of Guns: was a subject of special interest to the novice shooter, and answered all their questions as to the reasons for choosing a particular type of gun.

Gun up or down: generated much interest, with answers from Max solving problems for novice and experienced shooters alike.

One eye or two: was discussed in depth, highlighting previously unconsidered matters, such as peripheral vision and eye dominance, imparting valuable information to both novice and experienced shooters.

Bad habits and misconceptions: gave us reason to laugh at ourselves and realise how fragile and superstitious we all are.

Interesting facts: finalised the subject presentation and was informative and entertaining, covering statistics on ballistics as well as target trajectory, shooting stats from the USA, and possible future changes to the skeet format.

Lunch was held from 12.45pm to 1.30pm, during which a second film, 'Skeet Well' by Fred Missildine, was thoroughly enjoyed by all attending.

Coaching after lunch was severely affected by the weather, which grew worse by the minute, however a surprising number of die-hards and new shooters ignored the elements and sailed forth to put principle into practice. Clem Bertini, Joe Coci and Peter Vosper assisted Max Weston in directing the squads.

Conclusion:

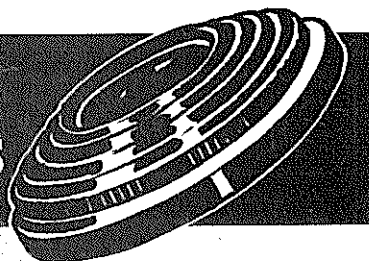
It is the writers opinion that this was an extremely well presented clinic, with valuable information efficiently imparted to both experienced and novice shooters. While it was principally aimed at the novice, many other shooters gained further insight into new concepts and techniques. Everyone spoken to afterwards confirmed this and expressed a strong desire to support further clinics.

Thanks need to go to WAGC for providing the venue and assisting in the promotion of the clinic. Thank you to Barbara for the magnificent spread she single handedly provided for the hungry hoards at lunch. No one can say they did not get their monies worth in food alone.

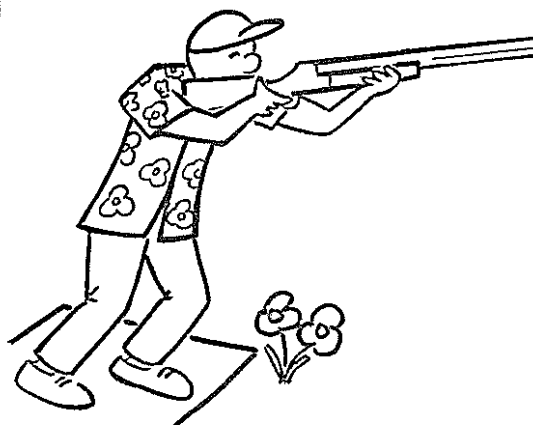
