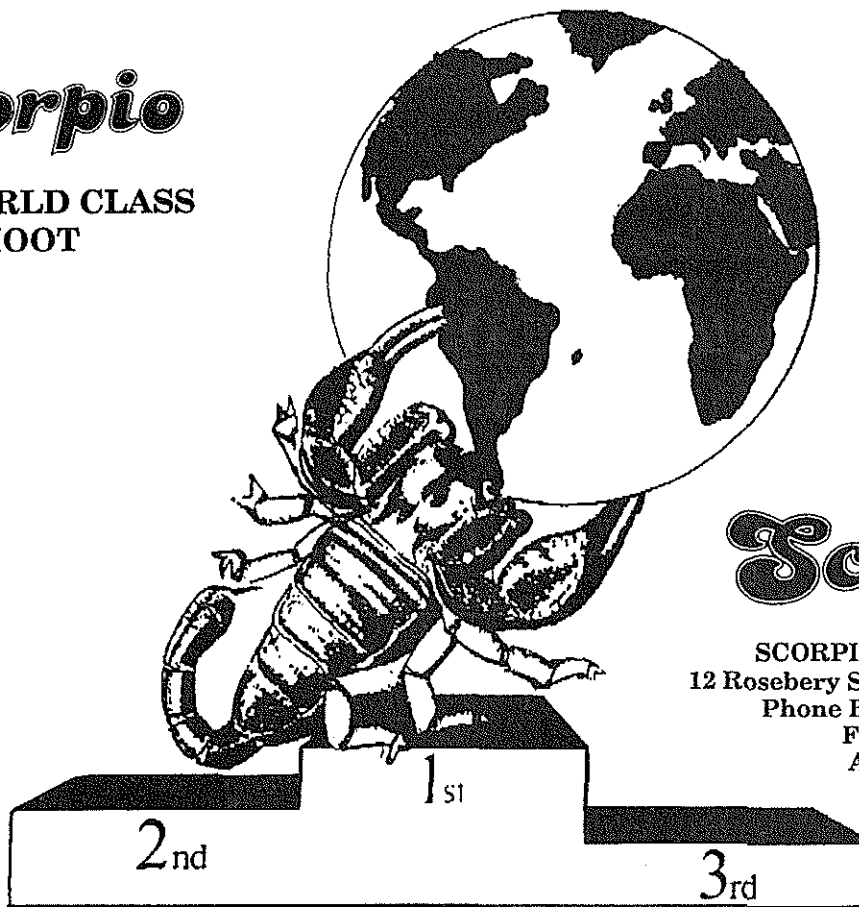

New South Wales are yet to advise of their replacement for recently resigned member Robert Smith.

Organisational Structure

A revised Organisational Structure was set in place, reflecting the responsibilities and authority of the various Sub-Committees, with the Organisational Structure becoming a By-Law of the Association to be read in conjunction with the Association's Constitution.

Introduction to Clay Target Shooting

The long awaited reprint of the publication 'Introduction to Clay Target Shooting' has finally been accomplished, with reasons for the delay in re-printing this booklet as many as they are varied.

Every club will shortly be receiving a small supply of books to be given away free of charge as a means of introducing prospective new members to the sport, with additional supplies available from the National Office upon request.

Shooting Activity

Reports from around the States indicate that there is an upsurge in the number of members actively participating from club level upwards. While this trend may not as yet be reflected at all clubs it is apparent that is occurring, which augurs well for the sport.

Oceania Shooting Championships

The Oceania Shooting Championships, which are the UIT Regional Championships, will be held in Auckland, New Zealand, commencing late January. Australia will be represented in the international disciplines of Olympic Trap, Skeet and Double Trap, with teams selected from members of the National Training Squad.

A competition will also take place for American Skeet and DTL, with selection procedures uncertain as at the time of writing. A notice in respect to a selection competition for DTL is contained in this issue of the CTSN. Skeet selection will most likely be determined from scores achieved over the 400T of the National Skeet Championships in Perth, however this is yet to be confirmed.

Rules Seminar

The review of the Association's shooting rules has been referred to each State Association for research and comment - State Associations have responded within the eight weeks given for proposed rule changes to be discussed within the State, with Queensland to provide their response by 26th October.

Once all State responses have been studied in detail by the Rules Committee, recommendations will be placed before the Executive to enable any rule changes that may be adopted to be introduced as from 1st January 1993.

National Skeet Championships

At the time of writing, the Perth Skeet Nationals are yet to be held. Hopefully the weather in WA will have been kind and the Nationals well attended.

OCEANIA SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Auckland, New Zealand
February 5th & 6th, 1993

An Elimination Shoot is to be held in December to select a three member DTL team to contest the Oceania Championships.

While the program has not as yet been confirmed, it is likely that the elimination will be over two days of competition over the weekend of December 12th and 13th with Sydney Gun Club the probable venue.

Being a self funded team, all proceeds of the elimination shoot will be used to offset the costs of the team members.

A self funded skeet team will also take part in the Oceania Championships with team selection determined during the course of the Perth Skeet Nationals.

Full details of the shooting program to select the DTL team will be included in the December CTSN.

EDITORS' MAILBOX

In Reply to Senator Tate

The claim in the ACTA magazine of September 1992 by Senator Tate that Tasmania is 'leading in gun training' is incorrect and cannot be allowed to pass unchallenged.

In 1991, the NSW Shooting Association through its subsidiary, the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, initiated the first safety awareness scheme in Australia that was run solely by shooters as a community service and for the benefit of the sport of shooting.

The council has a network of 500 shooting clubs throughout the state, and 1500 volunteer club members who have been accredited by the Commissioner of Police to be Firearms Safety Officers participate in the scheme.

As at 30 June 1992, the sum of \$270,000 has been injected directly into the shooting clubs of NSW from the conduct of firearms safety awareness tests on new applicants for a shooter's licences. What's more, this has been achieved in only four months of effective operation because gun licensing was suspended in NSW from September 1991 to May 1992.

Most importantly, and where the NSW scheme differs entirely from the Tasmanian scheme is the fact that the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council and the NSW Shooting Association are non profit sports bodies. As such, monies from the firearms safety awareness scheme in NSW are returned to the sport of shooting and are to be used for the development and promotion of all aspects of the sport up to and including Commonwealth Games, Olympic Games and international events. No money goes into the hands of a private company or individuals.

Proposed Rule Changes

For some time now I, like most others have sat back and taken in the actions and antics of various members of the National Executive, but feel the time has now come to put pen to paper.

Firstly, contrary to the belief of some, I do not have an axe to grind, nor do I have a grudge against previous Executive or paid employees - I just have a firm belief in standing up and being heard on matters that are not in the best interest to the sport.

Why don't you people all stand back and take a long hard look at yourselves? While you are all so wrapped up criticising each other, the sport of clay target shooting is falling down around you. When will you take notice of the shooters - the people who put you on the Executive - and stop treating all of us like idiots, and start telling us what is going on!

This brings me to the proposed rule changes - yes there are 46 and yes many of them are just word changes, but why in God's name is it such a problem to print them from start to finish, so everyone can have an opportunity to read them in the CTSN?

It is noted in the September CTSN that all State Associations would be making the documents available to all clubs for comment by 30-9-92. Upon enquiring if these changes were going to be printed in the CTSN, I was told that the National office would not handle the response!

From the minutes of the June meeting of the National Executive, it is noted that a poor response was received to requests via the CTSN earlier in the year, for suggestions and comments etc. to possible rules due to be changed on 1-1-93. Of course you will get a poor response when the average 'Aussie' will not rise up or take action until it has been placed in front of them.

Our last zone meeting held on the 15-8-92 attracted 15 of our 19 clubs, due directly to the rule changes that had been circularised by our zone secretary and overall the feeling of those present was one of total disbelief. The changes need far more discussion, more airing, and as for the comment that a change to what was tabled would not be considered unless an alternative was provided certainly didn't gain much in the popularity stakes.

Even if clubs did all receive a copy of this document - how many of their members would actually get to read it, make comment, etc. in the minimal time allowed?

I am of the understanding that some 12-15 years ago, a By-Law was passed at National level along the lines that rule changes etc. of this magnitude were to be printed in the CTSN 6 months before any changes.

Those charged with making the decisions on our behalf should start to listen and take in what they are being told - shooters are far from happy - they want to be kept informed, so stop playing politics and get on with the sport.

Rules Committee Responds

In response to your letter regarding rule changes I would like it to be known that the Rules Committee asked in the CTSN January 1992, pages 3 and 6 under 'Rule Review' for any recommendations and/or suggestions from individual shooters, clubs, zones and states to be forwarded to the Rules and Safety Committee for discussion at a 2 day Rule Seminar planned by the National Rules Committee. State Associations were then asked to send representatives from their Rules/Referee Committees to attend this meeting. We held this meeting in early July over the 2 days proposed with all states being represented, one from each state plus the 4 from the Rules Committee with the Executive Director taking the minutes.

The response to the initial request of suggestions/recommendations was poor and once having dealt with those we then went on to those brought up by the individual state representatives and any others that the group thought may have been beneficial to shooting in general.

We all believed this to be a highly productive and successful meeting and the Committee has since sent the 46 recommendations back to each state for their own state bodies to deal with and comment on. These comments will be scrutinized by the Rules and Safety Committee and the final recommendation will be put to the full Executive for a decision to be made.

The recommendations that have been put forward may not suit some individual shooters, but we believe they are the best for all the shooters as a whole. I believe it is up to the states and/or the state's representatives to explain why and how we came to these decisions and we as a Committee feel that any more discussions held would only bog down the whole system.

I know of no other sport where the rules are taken back to all the participants for their comments. You the shooters choose your representatives from club level, zone level and state level to make these decisions on your behalf so you should then abide by those made. The Rules Committee can only act in the portfolio that has been allocated to them - we believe we have fulfilled our role.

NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Conditions of Entry

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 25, two visits to the traps.
3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
16. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s), and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to

gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over 400 targets of the National Program.

17. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID-OPEN OR SECTION.
18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.
20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
22. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Handicap Cards

Nominations will not be accepted from any shooter who cannot produce a stamped handicap card or have the handicapper approve the reason for not being able to do so.

The issue of a duplicate card by the handicapper will incur a charge of \$20.

All shooters from AA to C grades must present their card to the handicapper for stamping prior to nominating.

'HA' Ultra Hard shot loads options are offered in each of the 3 new AA Target load families.

The 28 gram AA Family

The development of the new 28 gram loads was primarily in response to ACTA move towards 28 gram limit for mainstream DTL and Skeet. These new loads made their debut with distinction in April at Wagga ACTA Trap Nationals taking out the coveted overall National High Gun Award along with individual title success.

Whilst the new 28 gram loads were developed principally for DTL, Skeet (and initially UIT) they have also attracted a strong following for sporting applications among those shooters favouring lighter shot charges.

The new 28 gram AA Family consists of the following 4 loads — AA1200, AA1250, AA1250HA*, AA1300HA. Full specifications provided in an earlier issue of this magazine.

* P.S. AA1250HA (High Antimony) shotshells were used by Russell Mark to establish the new Australian Long Run Break record of 1177 straight.

The 32 gram AA Sporting Family

Winchester's recognition of the diversity of target requirements and favoured choke combinations in use has ensured this comprehensive range of loads is purpose designed to cover the broad spectrum of Sporting clay needs.

Pattern tuned by customised shot hardness type and velocity variations. AA Sporting loads are designed for optimum target smashing performance at close, medium and long ranges matched with Imp. Cyl. Mod. and Imp. Mod chokes.

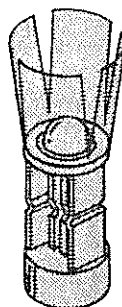
Launched in mid June, the new 32 gram AA Sporting family consists of the following 3 loads — Classic, Winner and Supreme. Full specifications provided in an earlier issue of this magazine. Now Winchester add their new 24 gram loads to the AA family line-up.

Three New 24 gram International Loads

Winchester's latest range was developed in response to announced UIT ruling effective 1-1-93, limiting shot charge to 24 gram for Olympic disciplines. The call for effective 24 gram ammunition represented a significant challenge for Winchester's Australian product design team. Different hull lengths and a number of powder types and blends were trialled along with standard and High Antimony shot. It also became evident in the early stages of prototype wad evaluations that conventional wads were inappropriate for the ultra light 24 gram shot charge. The quick 'n easy measure of modifying an existing wad die to simply reduce shot cup depth failed miserably, producing very poor patterns. Other measures taken to thicken and reinforce shot cup base also failed to produce patterns acceptable to Winchester quality performance criteria. Engineering and Ballistics personnel

continued to experiment with new cushion and shot cup design variations until the ultimate breakthrough was achieved with the new 'AA Convex' wad.

In a conventional wad, irrespective of cushion quality some lower level pellets are distorted under the compression of impact forces. Distorted pellets produce the 'flyers' that make up the ragged fringe of a pattern — too many 'flyers' and pattern quality and effectiveness diminishes. In general, superior cushioning and harder shot will minimise distortion and improve patterns. With the reduced pellet count of 24 gram loads, shot protection becomes a matter of critical importance if consistent effective patterns are to be achieved within the 30" circle at 40 yards.

The new 'AA Convex' wad features a substantial domed protrusion in the base of the shot cup. Unlike conventional wads, shot is not laying flat on the base cup. The bottom portion of shot is now inverted away from the base — away from the area of maximum impact forces. The domed protrusion also 'softens' and filters the transmitted impact forces even further by radiating them parabolically through the lower level of the shot charge. The unique 'Convex' wad thus affords maximum protection to the light 24 gram shot charge — ensuring quality patterns that deliver percentages comparable to Winchester's 28 and 32 gram loads.

The low recoil sensation must be experienced to be believed. Shooters will be truly amazed by the pattern quality and effectiveness of these new mini thunderbolts from Winchester. The new 24 gram AA International family will be available throughout Winchester's dealer network commencing early November.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

President

1. (a) Elected annually from members of the National Executive Committee in accordance with the Associations Statement of Purpose and Rules.
- (b) Once elected her/she is replaced as a member of the National Executive committee by the State/Territory from where the President is elected.

Executive Committee

2. Two representatives from each affiliated State Association/ Territory appointed in accordance with the Associations Statement of Purpose and Rules.

Management Committee

1. The National President, who shall act as Chairman.
2. (a) One member from each affiliated State Association/Territory, nominated by the respective State Association/Territory drawn from the Executive Committee, each of whom other than for the Vice President (if a member), shall act as Chairman of a Sub-Committee.
- (b) Positions on the Management Committee should be determined on the persons known or considered ability to assume the responsibility for specific portfolio's.
- (c) Management portfolios to be determined annually by vote of incoming Management Committee.
3. The Executive Member appointed by his/her State Association as a replacement member for the elected President is ineligible for appointment to the Management Committee.
4. (a) State Associations be requested annually as at 28th February to lodge written nominations for the fourteen Sub-Committee positions and advise the priority of each position for their State members, 1-14.
- (b) Outgoing Management Committee to consider the nominations received for Sub Committee positions and place a recommendation before the Executive at their next full meeting.
5. The Chairman of each Portfolio (Management Member) will submit ½ yearly reports (November & May) to the Management Committee on the performance of their respective Sub-Committees.
6. In the event of any Executive Member not accepting his/her Sub-Committee responsibility the respective State Association to be advised accordingly.

Sub Committees

1. The President and Vice President shall not assume any responsibility to act as Chairman of any Sub-Committee nor be eligible to vote on any Sub-Committee matters.
2. Each member of the Executive Committee other than the President and Vice President shall be elected/appointed to a minimum of one Sub Committee position.
3. Each Sub-Committee shall operate in keeping with any authority given them by the Executive Committee and be responsible for the placement of recommendations arising from their designated areas of responsibility to the Executive Committee and/or Management Committee.
4. Unless directed by either the Management or Executive Committee, no Sub-Committee shall act in its own right on any matters relating to the Association without the prior knowledge of the Chairman of the Management Committee.
5. Each Sub-Committee member to have a single vote with the exception of the Chairman who shall in the case of an equality of votes have a second or casting vote (Constitution 18(B)).
6. Matters brought before the ACTA by other than Executive Members and State Associations shall, in the first instance, be referred to the relevant State Association for attention.

7. The President, Vice President, or any three members of the Management Committee shall have authority to call a meeting of the Management Committee.
- * In addition to the Chairman, the National Coaching Council comprises of (7) State Coaching Directors appointed by their respective State Association plus the National Director of Coaching.
- ** Each National Shooting Committee comprises of (1) additional member appointed as the Shooters Representative for the respective discipline.

Executive Committee Authority

1. Constitutional matters
2. Expenditure items in excess of \$5,000
3. Legislation Reserve
4. Registration fees
5. National Championships
6. Budget approval
7. Contractual Sponsorship
8. Rules – Safety – Referees
9. Senior Staff Appointments
 - (a) Executive Director
 - (b) Director of Coaching
10. Committee of appeal from matters arising from decisions of the Justification Committee (Justification Committee ineligible).

Management Committee Authority

1. Recommendations from Sub-Committees in keeping with Executive given authority.
2. Expenditure for items less than \$5,000.
3. Justification Committee for teams to represent the ACTA from each discipline.
4. Professional advice.

Rules Committee Authority

1. Recommendation of rule changes and or new rules to the National Executive Committee.
2. Rule interpretations published in the CTSN.
3. Matters pertaining to the rules that may be received from members of the National Referees Association.
4. To refer matters pertaining to rule changes other than administrative changes to the National Referees Association for their consideration prior to formal recommendations being placed before the National Executive Committee.

Shooting Committee

NOMINATION

When and as requested by the National Office, State Associations to advise of their nominated person together with confirmation of their acceptance of the nomination.

ELECTION

1. Persons so nominated to meet at each relevant Bi-Annual National Championships for the purpose of electing from their numbers a representative to the National Shooting Committee for a two year term.
2. In the event of the State nominated person not attending the relevant National Championships he/she may appoint a representative to attend the election meeting on his/her behalf.
3. The National Office will liaise with those nominated in relation to
 - (a) Their attendance at the meeting of State nominated persons at the relevant National Championships.
 - (b) Advice on their nominated representative (if applicable) who will in turn be contacted by the National Office re their attendance at a meeting during the relevant National Championships.

SHOOTER REPRESENTATIVE(S) – APPOINTMENT PERIOD

Two years from the National Championships at which the respective representative was appointed until the commencement of the second National Championships held in the two year term of appointment, at which time the position becomes vacant.

Persons elected as Shooter Representatives to the National Shooting Committee are ineligible for International competition for the period of their two year appointment other than for traditional representative teams which may compete from time to time.

1. SKEET – 2 years from 1991 National Skeet Championships
2. OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE – 2 years from 1992 National Olympic Discipline Championships
3. TRAP – 2 years from 1992 National Trap Championships

Shooting Committee Authority

2. (a) National Shooting Committee (as in (2)) to be responsible for international competition and act as the selection committee for the relevant discipline, or alternatively determine the method of team selection.
 - (b) Final team(s) composition for all disciplines subject to justification
 - (c) All decisions to be by way of recommendation to the Executive Committee.
3. (a) National Shooting Committee (as in (2)) to determine the criteria applicable for the National Training Squad.
 - (b) All decisions to be by way of recommendation to the Executive Committee.

Finance Committee Authority

1. Preparation and presentation of annual budget to Executive Committee.
2. Recommendation on requested expenditure.
3. Investments.

4. Recommendations on ACTA registration fees.
5. Recommendations on fiscal policy.

Promotion & Development Committee Authority

1. Recommendations on Constitutional matters.
2. Development of the sport.
3. Promotion of clay target shooting.
4. Overseeing the production of the Annual Report.
5. Sponsorship recommendations.
6. Liaison with other bodies with similar aims and objectives.

Championships Committee Authority

Recommendations to Executive Committee on matters relating to the conduct of National Championships.

Coaching Council Authority

Responsible for the implementation of coaching standards for all disciplines through the workings of the National Coaching Council.

NATIONAL DIRECTOR OF COACHING

On August 14th and 15th, a State Coaches conference was held at the Tullamarine Motor Inn. This conference was attended by all states and the New Zealand National Director of Coaching.

With the large amount of tabled workload, a pre-conference was held Friday evening to go over past conference minutes and current state reports. By having this meeting we were able to eliminate a large portion of time which would have been consumed by the reading of the previous minutes and the seven state reports. A list of outstanding points from the minutes were listed as were relevant items from the state reports.

At 8.30 Saturday morning, all had assembled for what was to prove a long and indepth conference.

After welcoming all including Mr Alan Maher, ACTA Executive Director and Mr Paul Black, New Zealand National Director of Coaching, a short conference overview was given.

Mr Alan Maher then addressed the meeting adding his and ACTA's welcome to all those assembled and re-stated ACTA's Executives support of coaching and its' new direction.

The meeting then proceeded to the agenda items and following listed is those items and relevant comments:

1. State Reports

- All States had seen a downturn in coaching, however this should change with a defined direction being instigated.
- NSW had instigated a correspondence coaching system, using video and designated coaches to assist via telephone. This system eliminated a lot of travel and has the benefit of instant and continuing contact.
- NT's program of coaching continues with effort being placed on their teams. Following the DTL Nationals, their junior shooter - Brett Hale leads in the NT's Sports Star Award as does their winning Shoulder to Shoulder Team.
- WA has just changed to joint State Coaches, John Harris - Northern WA and ISU, and Tim Catling handling Southern WA. Mr Robert Mosel becomes the WA State Coaching Co-ordinator.
- Tas. Although having lost clubs, is continuing to conduct one day workshops aimed at team participation.
- Qld. With the resignation of state coach, Mr Arthur Kenna, a reorganisation plan is taking place.
- SA. Finances have slowed the coaching program, but renewed effort of personal contact has been instigated.
- Vic. An upsurge of interest in Level 2 and coaching in general, also the concern regarding legalities and insurance for coaches.

2. Introduction to Clay Target Shooting

The completely refurbished promotional booklet is now finalised and in the hands of ACTA and is all but printed. Copies will be distributed to each State at the earliest possible time.

3. Level 1 Accreditation (revised)

This revised Accreditation schedule is in the hands of the Australian Coaching Council and as of this date and a last minute alteration, will become effective immediately. To go with this revision, a new Level 1 kit is being assembled for the new candidates/coaches.

4. Accreditation Update Policy

The update policy required by the ACC is now approved and is to be instigated (as described in October 1992 CTSN).

5. Basic Coaching Manual

A first draft of the proposed new Basic Coaching Manual was tabled for comment. After this, the State Coaches took the draft document away for more indepth study and comment. After all the relevant data is returned to the National Director of Coaching, a more complete re-write will begin. It is planned

to attempt to have the manual completed and printed for all coaches by 1st January 1993.

6. Promotion of Coaches (Posters)

Several posters were displayed and were well received as a follow on from earlier efforts. After discussion, the coaches poster was recommended for printing.

7. Coaches Certificates

As with the Coaching posters, a draft ACTA Accreditation certificate was tabled. Again after discussion, the certificates were recommended.

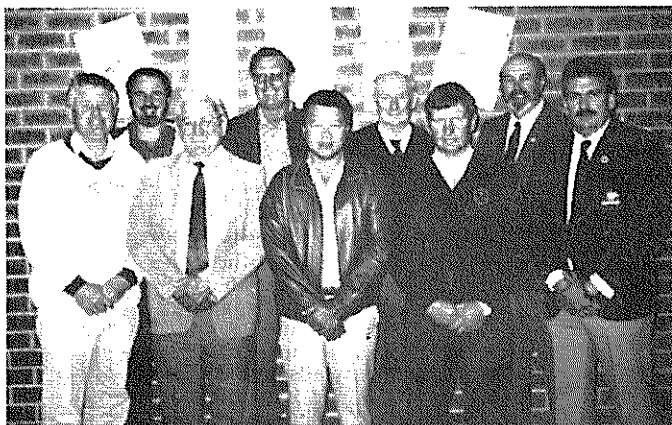
Considerably more topics were discussed by the state coaches with the above being a selection, other topics were:

- Specialised Coaches
- Coaching Manuals (Australian produced)
- Videos (Australian compatible)
- Firearm & Safety Courses
- ACTA 5 Year Coaching Plan
- Overseas Coaches
- CTSN Articles and Input
- General State Items

The meeting closed at 5.10pm with the consensus that the meeting had been the most productive yet held.

All were thanked for their input and that Mr Paul Black, New Zealand National Director of Coaching had enjoyed the conference.

In closing, it was restated, that what had been discussed and recommended during the conference, would not happen overnight but would be ongoing projects.

SHOOTING THE CLAY TARGET

by George Biggs ACTA Historian

Many of our new shooters to the sport of clay target shooting in recent years, would not know very much about the history and development of our game, that goes back to 1927 in Australia and further back towards the turn of the century in America, where clay target shooting was first developed.

Frequently I receive requests from College students as well as from other bodies for information about clay target shooting. One such request was from the ABC Television Station. They were putting out a sporting book on various sports and they wished to include clay target shooting. The book was to be the sportswatchers guide. Other inquiries come from libraries, historians etc. One other inquiry came from the English Clay Target Association wanting to know more about Donald Mackintosh.

The following story is taken from my new book 'History and Development' — Our First 56 Years in Words and Pictures, to be published before Christmas.

Introduction

Trap shooting is a sport where a shotgun is used to shoot inanimate targets. A clay target is made of limestone and pitch, it is shaped like an inverted saucer about 4" in diameter and one inch high. It is brittle enough to be easily broken by pellets from the cartridge.

The target is thrown by a machine known as a trap, hence the name 'Trap Shooting.' This trap causes the target to rotate as it skims through the air in a horizontal position. It travels to a distance of minimum 45 metres, maximum 55 metres. It leaves the trap, velocity wise, about 50 miles per hour. Your 12 gauge trap or skeet gun fires a shell containing 32 grams of shot which spreads out as it travels towards the target. At 40 yards the shot pattern of some 300 pellets no. 7 shot, will have spread out until it covers a circular area about 30 inches in diameter, some odd pellets will have a little wider. The target is usually hit when it has travelled around 30-35 metres from the gun depending on how quick the shooter is. Most targets are shot at from 15 metres behind the trap house. In handicap shooting the distances range back to 25 metres from the trap house. Only the very skilful shooters find themselves on the back mark of 25 metres. A target is scored as 'Dead' if a visible piece falls from it or if it is completely broken into pieces. It is scored 'Lost' if not hit at all or only 'dust' is seen to come off due to the glancing shot having grazed it. A competitor can also refuse a target after he has called for it if he thinks it is not a legal target, and providing he does not fire at the target, another target will be allowed. However, if it is fired at he must abide by the result of his shot.

For a number of years before clay targets were invented all kinds of targets were used. One of these was a glass ball filled with smoke or feathers and thrown also from a type of spring trap. (see sketch) Clay target shooting as we know it today started to become popular before the turn of the century. By the year 1900 the American trap shooter was getting himself geared up to shoot trap in a big way. The clay target (invented in America) was now a perfect inanimate target for the shooter. The amateur Trap Shooting Association of America has well over 100,000 members. There are in excess of 1,000 registered clubs throughout the country.

According to their records, clay target shooters fire at more than 700 million targets per year. This sure is big business, what ever way you look at it.

The Grand American Tournament, shot over in nine days commenced in 1900 and has been held continuously every year since that time. The 'Grand American Handicap' as it is known today, is claimed to be the largest clay target trap shooting tournament in the world.

Home ground and permanent headquarters of the ATA is Vandalla, Ohio. Over 5,000 shooters participate over nine days, shooting over 92 traps in over 1 1/2 miles long line. Approximately 4 million targets are thrown during the tournament held in August each year.

Trap shooting came to Australia after World War I around 1927. It was more or less introduced with the help of Eley Ammunition Co who in fact established the first clay target club adjacent to their factory at Tottenham, a western suburb of Melbourne. It was known as the Nobel Gun Club.

It was a very modest beginning to our sport. Eley Ammunition Co continued to sponsor the club for a number of years. During this time an Association was formed to control the sport, etc. It was known as the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association (ACPTSA).

Unfortunately World War II threw a dampener over most things and it was around 1946 before we were able to push ahead with the development of the sport due mainly to the shortages of equipment. However the sport was beginning to expand into other states.

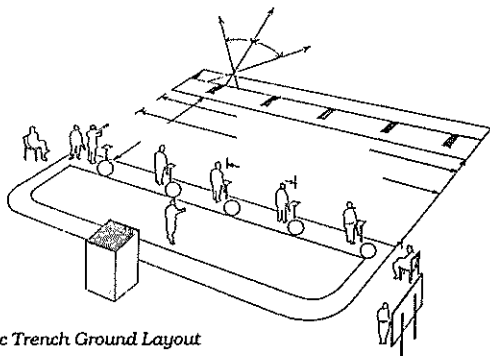

The Melbourne Olympic Games in 1956 (staged at Laverton Air Force Base) and the World Championships at Trap and Skeet in 1974 (held at the Melbourne Gun Club) gave Australia its introduction to International Competition.

Since 1974 Australia has sent both Olympic Trap and Olympic Skeet Teams to World Championships and Olympic Games with a fair degree of success.

Commencing with a team bronze in the 1974 World Championships, other fields of success were the 1982 Commonwealth Games in Brisbane. Numerous silver and bronze medals have been won by both trap and skeet shooters in the competition field of International shooting.

Standard American style trap and skeet shooting remains the most popular in Australia due to the fact that it is not as difficult to shoot for the average person who is not internationally ambitious and just wants to spend a pleasant Saturday afternoon's enjoyable shooting and a get together with friends.

Quite often husband and wife will compete with each other, likewise father and son or daughter.

There are several types of clay target shooting competitions.

Trap Shooting Events:

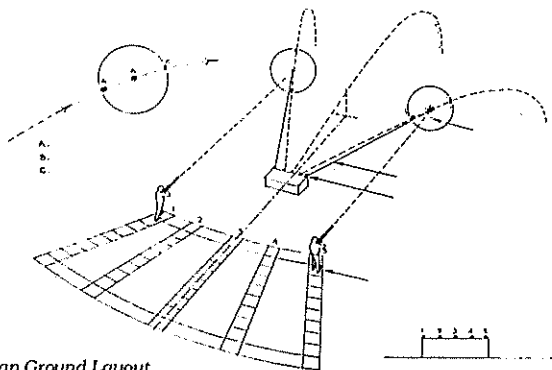
A. Championship Tournament Conditions

1. Single Barrel (one shot only is fired)
2. Double Barrel (two shots can be fired)
3. Point Score (two shots can be fired and depending on how the target is broken, the score is three points for the first shot, two points for the second)
4. Double Rise, two targets are thrown simultaneously from the trap at an angle of 35° right and left of centre. Each target is scored as one point or lost if missed.

B. Handicap Tournaments

Handicap shooting ranges from 11 metres, back to 25 metres. The shooters handicap mark will be adjusted accordingly to his performance over a given number of targets from time to time. Every registered shooter is issued with a handicap card which he must present at his or her club, when nominating for competition.

An Australian Clay Target Association booklet covers all rules and regulations of the various types of shooting. It also sets out the handicapping system. Books are available from the ACTA Office.

Skeet Competition Events:

- A. National Skeet Championship 100 targets
- B. State and District Championships 50 targets
- C. Club Championships are usually 25 or 50 as the club sees fit.

In March of 1977 the ACTA decided to establish a National Coaching Council consisting of a National Coaching Director and State Directors in each of the states together with Club Coaches throughout the whole of Australia. The aims of this council were to develop a greater interest and promote our sport of trap shooting, whether it be for competition or just plain good fun.

Clay target shooting in Australia has come a long way since those early days in 1927, when a group of keen shooters got together to lay the foundations for a sport that has grown and spread to all states over the years.

Trap and Skeet shooting is now organised and controlled by the Australian Clay Target Association, with State Associations in all states. At present there are no less than 300 registered clubs and in excess of 10,000 registered shooters throughout Australia.

All Australian capital cities have at least one well appointed gun club equipped with every facility to conduct both International and standard trap and olympic trap and skeet tournaments. National Championships in the four disciplines are staged annually in various states in rotation. Standard trap and skeet events are graded AA, A, B, C also ladies, juniors and veterans divisions are conducted in conjunction. Interstate teams matches are also staged at various clubs throughout the year. Early in 1977, the Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Target Association established a National Coaching Council consisting of a National Coaching Director, with State Directors in each state zone and club coaches were later appointed, trained and accredited to complete a national plan. This enables the new shooter to receive instructions and be made to feel welcome at his local club. Clay target shooting is without doubt a life time leisure sport for all ages. Men, women, boys and girls in their pre teens and into their 80s and 90s can enjoy the fun and good fellowship that exists, the sport is in fact one of the greatest social levellers. People in all walks of life are involved.

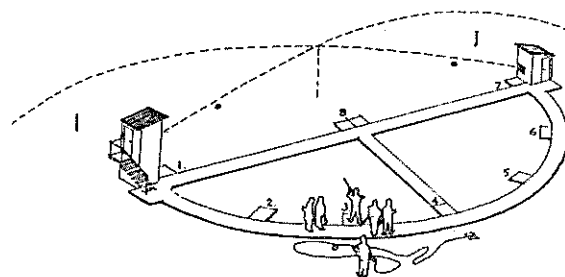
Guns & Ammunition

For the beginner trap or skeet shooter, the selection of his gun is not too difficult these days. There are quite a few types and models available to choose from.

The trap shooter will be interested mainly in the 12 gauge because this gun is the most efficient on clay targets. Selection of a gun is most important and should be given a good deal of thought firstly. Decide what you want the gun for trap or skeet etc, bearing in mind that a skeet or field type gun is not exactly suitable for trap shooting, and the trap gun is not suitable for skeet. The main difference is in the barrel. The average trap gun comes with 30 inch length barrel and is choked 1/2 choke in the lower barrel and 3/4 or full in the top barrel.

The skeet gun differs mostly in the barrel being choked skeet and skeet in both barrels, and 28 inch length barrels are recommended. Stock measurements are very much the same.

By far the most popular gun over the past 30 years has been the under and over for both trap and skeet shooting in Australia. Auto's have become much more trouble free in recent years, even with some of the not so well re sized reloads. Auto's are more

often seen on the skeet field than at trap. Actually the auto has a lot going for it as far as the lady shooter is concerned because of the softer recoil and it points nice and easy. However a word of advice all guns used for trap and skeet shooting should be checked for proper fit for the user. Names like Browning, Perazzi, Remington, Beretta, Miroku, Franchi and Winchester seem to dominate the trap and skeet grounds. They all do a first class job.

Skeet

Skeet shooting is the younger of the two disciplines it was some 20 years after the introduction of trap when skeet was introduced in America about 1920. It was developed to simulate and ASA substitute for various types of field shooting. Today it has become a very popular shooting sport in all countries throughout the world and has since 1968 together with olympic trap has become a part of the Olympic Games and world moving target championships.

Two forms of skeet shooting are practiced in Australia. They are known as American Skeet and International Skeet. Throughout European countries only International style is shot like wise at World ISU Championships and Olympic Games. World Championships are also shot at American style shooting events of 200 targets. International skeet does not vary all that much from American Skeet. Actually the field layout is identical and the shooting progresses in the same way from station to station using eight stations in all. However the targets are thrown further - 71 yards as against 55 for America, which of course means they are flying faster.

The gun hold position prior to calling for the target a rule stipulates that part of the stock must be touching one's hip below elbow in its normal hanging position. A three second delay or part of on the targets release after the shooters call is another hazard. Other variations of rules and target shooting procedure like shooting doubles from three and five stations make scoring at International skeet a little more difficult and certainly add an interesting challenge.

Skeet shooting made its debut in Australia towards late 1950. Its beginning at the Melbourne Gun Club was the efforts of a small band of club members. American rules of rules were accepted in 1961. The sport has become popular in all states. National Open Championships are staged annually in rotation in states that are equipped to handle the event.

Remember what I've said earlier, trap and skeet shooting is a whole family sport and a great social leveller where people from all walks of life gather to try their skill at shooting the clay target. You will be shown how to safely handle and use a firearm and enjoy the atmosphere of a good friendly afternoon.

In the 60 year history of our sport there has never been a serious accident. Its an incomparable safety record.

Preferred discipline and reasons why:

Australian skeet and Olympic skeet are my preferred disciplines. Skeet to me means relaxation, enjoyment, mateship and challenge. I also perceive skeet targets to be a good way to practice for bird hunting in the field.

I shoot all disciplines but I believe that skeet is my preferred discipline because of the consistency that I can maintain and the great enjoyment that I derive from it.

Gun details and reasons why:

1. Browning Under & Over 28" choked and adjustable stock
2. Franchi 500 Auto with trap stock

Both guns are reliable, well fitting and balanced and offer versatility for shooting other disciplines.

Ammunition used:

Mainly Winchester, 300 9s in 1oz & 1 1/8oz.

Influences on shooting career:

I was introduced to clay target shooting by Sid and Elva Churches of Taipan Projectiles in December 1977, and as a result joined the South Australian Gun Club. Ray Kimber influenced me to take up skeet more seriously, I then decided to concentrate on skeet while still enjoying the other disciplines.

I competed at many championships and took notice of the top shooters, such as A. Cousens, I. Hale, J. Summers and R. Kimber. Watching them made me eager to achieve greater consistency. All of the above shooters have helped me greatly at one time or another.

With plenty of hard work and thought, I gained a position in the Australian Skeet Team to the USA to compete in San Antonio in 1984, and in 1986 at the World Cup.

In 1986 I also gained a position in the Olympic Training Squad and spent some time in the Institute of Sport in Canberra with the then National Coach, Peter Quire.

The sense of achievement and excitement that making those teams gave me have kept my interest and enthusiasm for my chosen sport alive.

Coach and level of support:

In the early part of my shooting career Ray Kimber was by far the most helpful to me. This was followed by support from Peter Quire who was responsible for setting up various exercised, training weekends, videos etc.

It was relatively easy to bend Peter's ear as being in the same state as the National Coaching Director certainly made it easier to communicate with him when the need arose.

I believe that shooting with and talking to top shooters has helped me immeasurably to learn which of the methods used suited me and helped me to improve my shooting.

I use the 'sustained lead' method of shooting standard skeet as I feel that for me this allows for greater consistency. Consistency is all important and is I believe the factor that helps to win matches.

Successes:

State Titles from 1983 to 1987 - Double Barrel, Continental, Skeet, Olympic Skeet.

Championships from 1980 to 1991 - Double Barrel, Points, Continental, Tower, Mixed Targets, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Trench.

Grade wins - 1984 Commonwealth Skeet Titles, 1985 National Skeet Titles, 1986 ISU Nationals, 1987 ISU Nationals, 1991 ISU Nationals.

Teams and Squads - Captain SA Skeet Team when we won the Shoulder to Shoulder Teams Match at the 1983 and 1987 Nationals.

Member Australian Skeet Team to USA - 1984 and 1986

Member Olympic Training Squad - 1986 and 1991

Member Australian Open Skeet Team - 1983, 84, 85, 86, 88, 89

Member SA Open State Team - 1983, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 90

Favourite shooting ground:

1. SA Gun Club at Bolivar, this is where I commenced shooting.
2. Melbourne Gun Club at Lilydale, I have shot most consistently there.
3. Wagga Gun Club, I have also shot consistently on this ground.

I believe all grounds have something to like and dislike about them, but most of all wherever a shooter does well, then that appears to be their favourite ground.

Home Club:

International Gun Club at the State Shooting Park, Virginia SA

Shooting Superstitions:

I try hard not to have any. They lead to negative attitudes.

Highest Breaks:

Standard Skeet 250.

Club Involvement:

I served on the SA Gun Club Committee for 5 years and on the International Gun Club Committee for 2 years. Shooters Skeet Representative to ACTA for 2 years.

Advice to new shooters:

1. Have gun fitted correctly.
2. Learn the rules of the game.
3. Listen to a recognised coach.
4. Learn the basic steps in your preferred discipline.
5. Set Goals.
6. Practice to those goals.
7. Remember that there are no easy targets.
8. Concentrate on the next target.
9. If you get into difficulty don't panic, start again with the basic steps.
10. Once you have developed a style that works for you, concentrate on that style.
11. At all times practice safety.

Shooting goals and the methods to achieve them:

Once you have reached a desired level of confidence and feel that you should have a go at a big tournament, set a plan of goals so that you can practice to a system that will encourage you to lift your performance level up to the time of the big match, at which time you should 'peak'. For a few days prior to this match have a rest and relax. Remember that in the match you are likely to shoot 100 targets a day plus shoot offs. It is important to keep fit and to watch your diet.

Above all develop your concentration level, look hard for the target and remember you only have to shoot the next target. Remember that concentration is only the 'power of positive thinking,' don't let yourself be overcome with negative thoughts. If realistic goals are set and worked up to your concentration, confidence and skill level will peak at the right moment.

Most outstanding performance:

Winning the 16th Australian Championship at Wagga Nationals in 1989 with a score of 191/191.

Date commenced shooting:

I started shooting in a fairly casual way on a Sunday afternoon in March 1979 when an Italian friend brought his hand slinger to my farm and we shot a few clays among the sandhills. Prior to this I had never seen this sport in action, but I knew without a doubt this was the sport for me. As there was no club in my area it was necessary to travel for over 2 hours or 150 miles to join the Ungarra club, later transferring to the Port Lincoln club.

Preferred discipline and reasons why:

Due to the distance that I have to travel to any club, down the line has become my favourite discipline and the one that I have had the most success in. The reason for this is that I was able to practice regularly at home with the help of my sons who were more than willing to 'pull' for me (my two girls have taken over pulling now that the boys are no longer living at home).

I also enjoy shooting trench, tower, ball trap and skeet and even though I have had some success in these areas I don't get many opportunities to practice at club layouts, therefore I sometimes lack consistency.

Gun details and reasons why:

I bought my first second hand Rottweil 72 in 1980 and although I have experimented with a few other makes of 12 gauge shotguns I have always returned to the Rottweil. All of my successes have been achieved using the Rottweil. The design aspect coupled with the drop out triggers suit me very well.

Ammunition:

I am a hard and fast Winchester competitor using 300 & 325s number 7 loads and for all major competitions factory loads are a must.

Influence on shooting career:

As a very raw newcomer I attended my very first Nationals in Perth 1980 and nominated for all the Pre-Nationals as well as the Nationals. I shall always be indebted to Newton Thomas for his advice and guidance during these Nationals and for heading me in the right direction (I went to the pre-nationals a 'C' grader and was re-graded to 'A' grade for the entire National Championships).

Another person who gave me sound advice was my friend and mentor the late Max Curtis of the Port Lincoln Club. Thirdly, but not least our former National Coaching Director Peter Quire who has been looking over my shoulder for many years now and who I can rely on to let me know if I slip into any bad habits.

Coach:

Except for the names above who come to mind I cannot think of anyone else who has consistently helped me along the road, but I must pay tribute to the many, many shooters who have encouraged me and supported my efforts. Jim Ellis in the past and Bill Iles to this time have inspired me. I like to observe the 'top shots' in action as I still look to improve and excel at all times.

Favourite shooting ground:

I really don't think I prefer one venue over another. I travel to many clubs each year and naturally some are more picturesque

than others. They can all be windy, wet or hot and friendly to visitors. I am more interested in the competition and trying to shoot possibles and for me a well run shoot with keen competition and meeting old friends as well as making new ones makes my day.

Home club:

I am currently a member of the Port Lincoln Gun Club on Lower Eyre Peninsula in South Australia and have been for 12 years.

International Teams:

After attending 7 National Championships I have been a member of Australia's Mackintosh Team 6 times.

Captain of the 1983 Glenn Cups Teams winning match and a member of the winning team for the 10th International Teams match.

Shooting superstitions:

I have no superstitions as such but prefer to referee prior to being squadded in major competitions as this helps me to get the feel of the conditions, watch the flight of the targets while at the same time helps to control any nervousness and also occupies my mind. I don't mind being number one shooter for some events at Nationals but prefer to circulate on other starting positions occasionally.

Highest break:

274 is my highest break achieved at the Adelaide Nationals in 1983.

Club involvement:

Unfortunately I find that living in the bush and having to travel excessive distances all of the time limits my participation to be an active club member. To atone for this I help out with trophies and donations and take a very active role in helping to ensure a successful shoot by shouldering the responsibilities of shoot marshal as well as refereeing and scoring. I am only too pleased to advise and encourage any shooter who seeks my assistance - not only in my own club but any other club member as well. I also make myself available at any state competition for any task requested of me.

Advice to new shooter:

1. When you attend a shoot for the first time, make yourself known at the office and they will introduce you to the president and/or club coach for guidance.
2. Take the time to learn and familiarise yourself with the rules.
3. Ask for clarification of rules and techniques if in doubt.
4. Watch other successful shooters - styles vary.
5. Don't get discouraged if you are not in the winners circle for a time instead persevere and seek out club coaches - they are there to aid and assist.
6. Set your goals a little out of your reach and continue to set new goals as you progress.
7. Above all enjoy your shooting.

Shooting goals and methods to achieve:

During the early 80s it was always my goal to improve every year and I feel that I have accomplished this task despite the lack of 'top class' competition in many instances and the remoteness of my home.

To try to combat these disadvantages I travelled extensively to many clubs in SA and over the border. I must add that all this travelling was made possible by the support and belief in my ability of my wife Yvonne who was often left at home to manage the farm and our family. My sons also played a very real part in helping me to practice as often as the farm work allowed, often giving up their own recreation time to pull for dad.

I was absolutely elated in 1983 at the Adelaide Nationals to be able to repay them a little for their dedication to myself and my sport by becoming the Double Barrel Champion as my family are my most ardent fans.

Like many others on the land, drought years and the rural downturns have curbed my participation during the late 80s and to this time.

I regret very much not being able to consistently shoot the shoulder to shoulder with many of the top shots in the eastern states. Every sportsman needs to be challenged by repetitive competition by others who are more skilled than he or she is.

I pride myself on my consistency and over the years have been very pleased to perform exceptionally well during team competitions, for club, zone, state and national teams.

Most outstanding performance:

It probably goes without saying that bringing home to my small hometown in rural SA the Double Barrel Championship Cup from the Adelaide Nationals in 1983 was a very proud moment.

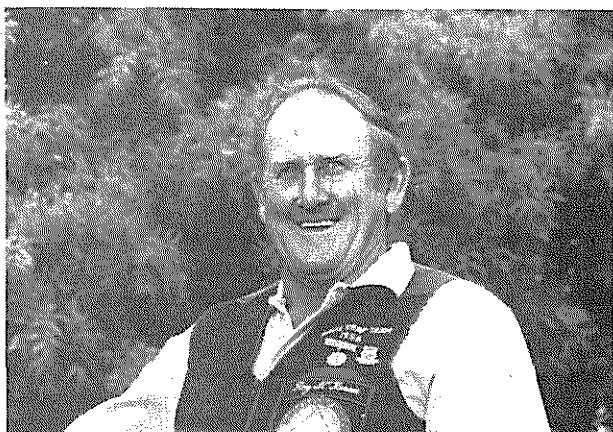
Successes:

I gauge my success in clay target shooting not on the number of trophies, or televisions, or microwaves or guns that I have won but rather on my ability to consistently represent my club, zone, state and country and to perform well at these times. I have also been fortunate to have experienced great personal success, as well as have a vast number of overall championship and high gun sashes to display on my walls. These have been accumulated from all levels and all disciplines. They also include my successes at the more recent Masters Games together with my two gold medals and bronze medal awarded at that time.

To add to these awards I was very humbled to have received in 1984 His Excellency, the Governor General's Patrons Award. I was honoured to have also been named The Sportsman of the Year in my own district in 1980 and 1981. To be recognised by your fellow shooters is a feat in itself but to be acknowledged publicly by your own district and surrounding areas is a very proud moment I will always remember.

Successes:

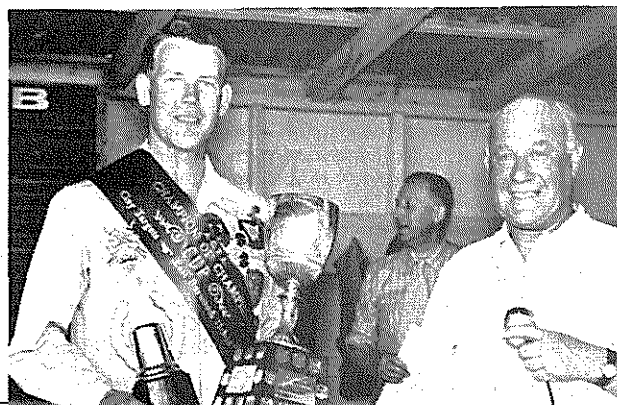
His greatest successes have been in winning the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship at the Nationals twice, first in Queensland in 1987 and in Perth in 1991.

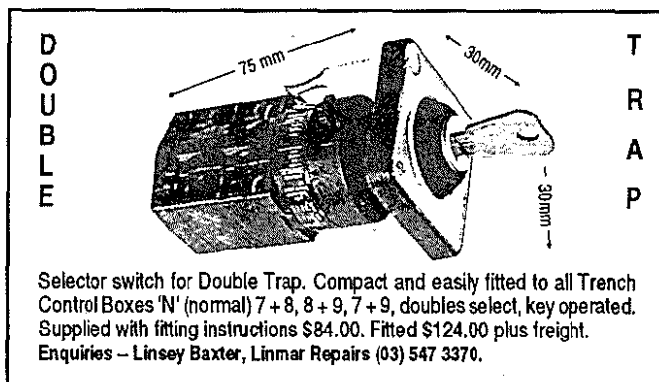
The Warren Charlton Bar Pin High Gun was won by Grant Thatcher of Tumut with 198/205 after shooting a perfect 55/55 for the night competition.

The zone would also like to thank the zone delegates and other zone members who assisted to run the shoot.

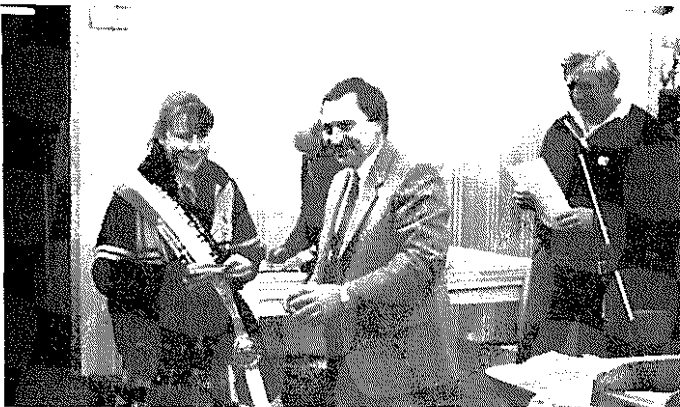

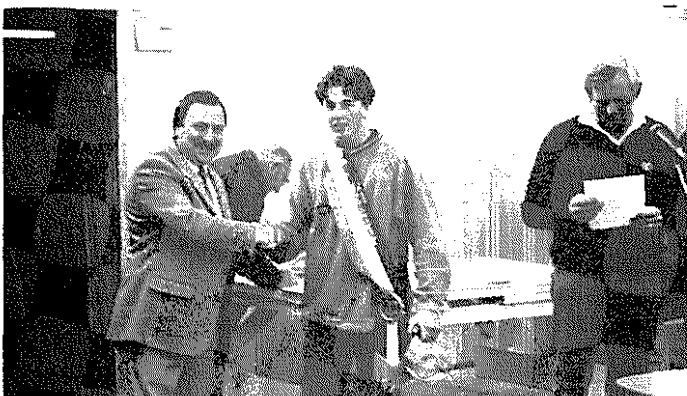

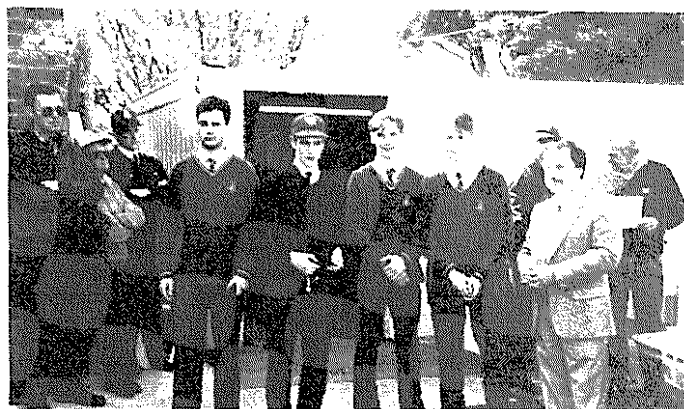

SHOTGUNNERS' QUERIES

by Ron Forsyth

A reader writes with Trap Troubles

Dear Ron,

I have been shooting down the line for five years.

I have an early model Miroku trap gun, which I bought fourth hand. The bottom barrel is marked + and measures .707" with vernier callipers and the top barrel is marked + and measures .703".

A competent gunsmith informed me that the bottom barrel measured open half choke and the top barrel open three quarter choke. One of the gun's previous owners was supposed to have had the chokes opened up by a gunsmith in Sydney, which these measurements seem to confirm.

Recently I was trying to work up a more efficient trap load. All the patterns seemed to suffer from uneven pellet distribution and central thickening to varying degrees. After reading the patterning articles in the ASJ I decided to try and test some loads using the Oberfell and Thompson method.

The first load I tried was the one I use in DTL, 1 1/16oz of No.7 shot (Spanish - supposedly hard), Winchester case and 1 1/8oz wad, CCI 209 primer and 19 grains of Nobel 78.

In the bottom barrel it delivered 83% of the shot in the 30" circle at forty yards (the O & T rating was 64).

In the top barrel, it gave 86%, (with an O & T rating of 52).

Next I substituted 1 1/16oz of Tower No. 4 shot. The bottom barrel then gave 91% (with an O & T rating of 52), and the top barrel gave 90% (with an O & T rating of 67).

If I was to have the chokes in my gun altered, what would you suggest I aim for and how do I specify what I want? The gun is used at 15-18 metre DTL.

After re-reading the articles I guess what I have in mind is get either nominal quarter and half, or half and three quarter, then adjust the patterns up and down by altering powder and shot combinations to suit what I am doing.

In your articles you state it is easier to get better quality patterns from more open choked barrels. Also that from lightly choked barrels it is possible to get patterns varying from cylinder to full choke just by changing the hardness of the shot, and sometimes the powder.

In your experience, would these tighter patterns (say, three-quarter to full) from a more open barrel have better pellet distribution than patterns from a barrel, with, say, nominal full choke constrictions:

This letter from a reader seems to me to bring up so many of the difficulties that go with trap shooting that I have printed a fair chunk of it.

A lot of discussion of problems like these goes on at every trap ground.

Let's try to clarify the issues. First, there's really only one point of the letter: the writer wants to be able to shoot clay targets reliably at DTL from fifteen to eighteen metres. The details of the letter can be dealt with specifically, but the aim is just to get the necessary number of pellets onto targets in this specific discipline.

Now to the gun. The Miroku give good service, and in many ways should serve as a common example of the trap gun. Not bought new, it has borings that probably weren't suitable for the job. The reader has made the effort to get an idea of the actual choke remaining in the tubes, but has come up against a difficulty. The fact is, if you just take the overall diameter of the bores at the muzzle, then you haven't learnt very much, because the diameter of the barrel behind the choke can vary significantly. A tube such as this with final measurement of .703" might have no choke at

all, or it could be quite tight, depending on the diameter of the actual bore before the choke.

This is why choke gauges don't help much. A lot of people apologise for them - "Yes, I know they give a general indication, but . . ." - and then they go ahead and use them anyway.

In this case, the past owner has evidently found the gun to have been too tightly choked for his purposes, and then made an attempt to get it opened, but obviously wasn't very successful, because patterns of over 80% are ferociously tight, and not of much use for almost all shooters.

It is interesting that a gunsmith called the chokes an 'open half' and an 'open three-quarter.'

This is a sad fact of life, which all shotgunners should be aware of.

Years ago, when many gunsmiths were doing their training, chokes were set up on the old English standards of constriction; quarter was .010", half was .020", three quarter was .030", and full was .040".

If the gunsmith in question was trained in those days, then he may still regard these as being the necessary constrictions for those chokes. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Among other comments in passing, I would like to say that in my experience, most gunsmiths have done no patterning at all. With regard to choke, they've mostly been taught that these are the constrictions that are called by those names, and that's all there is to it.

In a way, they're quite likely to say this, because in the days before plastic, these are the constrictions that were necessary to make patterns of these nominal percentages. And, because gunsmiths are busy repairing guns, I guess a lot of them haven't put time in patterning them, it not being a skill the average Australian calls on a gunsmith for, to find out just how much things have changed.

This doesn't do our reader a lot of good, though. He's been told that he has a bottom barrel with a choke of 'open half' - yet he's getting tight full from it.

The answer is almost certainly that the previous work done on these chokes just involved removing diameter, instead of setting up the taper again to build a new choke.

If you take out diameter only, just to make the hole bigger, then nothing is liable to happen for quite a while, as the hole gets larger. Then, it all happens at once, and in a very few thou. the whole choking effect gets lost, and you end up with a barrel that's too open.

At this stage, our reader has had some diameter removed, but not enough to reach this breakaway point, and so the patterns remain tight - at least, with the particular load.

It seems to me to indicate just perfectly the standard problem that we all face: we all have to test our guns if we want to know what they're doing.

If he decides to get some more metal removed, then when he gets the gun back, he has no alternative but to pattern it and see if this did the trick.

If, on the other hand, he can't find a gunsmith who grabs his confidence, or he just plain doesn't want to have the tubes messed with again, then he needs to find a cartridge that suits the gun better - in which case, he has no alternative but to pattern some more and find a suitable one.

In other words, no matter what the circumstances, no barrel of any gun can be relied on to produce patterns that are anywhere near what you for one reason or another expect. This particular gun is stamped full of three-quarter (whatever that means) but just imagine what kind of patterns it must have been throwing before the chokes were eased. Now, somebody's spent money getting the chokes taken out, and it shoots full and full! There's a lesson in that, no matter what your discipline.

So, what does he do?

My immediate response is to say that it will cost less in time and money if he sets out to find how much leeway he's got with the gun as it is. He evidently felt this himself, because he set out to experiment by changing his brand of shot.

HOW DO PIGEONS GET HOME?

The age old mystery of how pigeons find their way home is still unsolved, but most racing men are more concerned with improving the speed with which a bird homes rather than how it does it.

The late Mr. Jack Kilpatrick, of Ireland, wrote of the homing faculty: "It may seem absurd to suggest that pigeons find their way home by navigating by the sun, when we know that the sun is never over the same spot on the earth more than a few minutes each day."

"Yet we must admit," he said, "that the sun and its position in relation to the earth have an influence on pigeons' lives."

Mr. Kilpatrick supported his theory by saying that on a bright day birds cleared the race point in a few minutes on the correct line for home, but on a dull day, with a heavy, overcast sky, they hesitated, flew about for some time, and then made off, probably in the wrong direction, and went back to the liberation point.

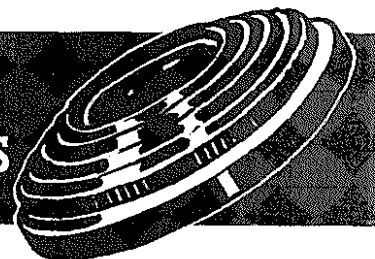
Colin Osman, in his new book, correctly states that a pigeon homes to its loft, and not to a geographical position.

This was proved during the war in the training of pigeons to fly to mobile lofts. If the lofts were moved, the birds would search for them until they found them.

Other theories about homing are that pigeons have extra-sensory perception, or that a pigeon loft transmits a beam, like radar, on which the birds fly home. (Some pigeons must have very poor radar sets!)

Rotation of the earth and the earth's magnetism are other theories. Very little scientific work has been done on any theory, and what has been undertaken has been just as quickly upset by other scientific experiments.

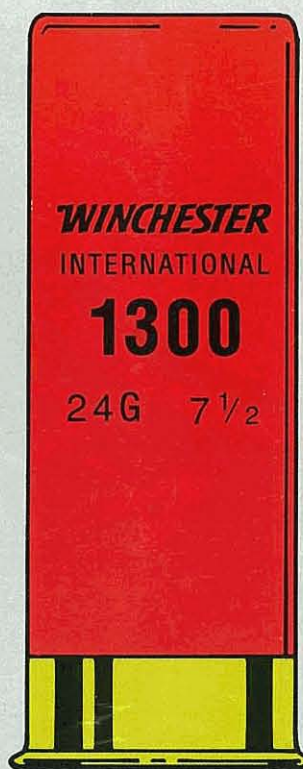
