

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Once again another twelve months has passed us by, much faster it seems than in previous years.

Successful National Championships have been held in Brisbane (Olympic Discipline), Wagga (DTL) and Perth (Skeet) with a total of 1,456 new shooters introduced to clay target shooting during the year. With an influx of new shooters of the magnitude that has occurred, one could easily believe that our registered shooter base has easily surpassed that of the previous year. This however is not so, as numbers are up only by the relatively small number of approximately 200, which means that 1,256 shooters did not re-register for 1992.

What do these figures tell us? To my mind it tells us that with clay target shooting we have a sport that is very attractive to new shooters - hence the number of new shooters registered in the past twelve months. They also tell us that despite the attractiveness of clay target shooting, we are losing in the one year almost as many shooters as that which registered for the first time in the same twelve month period.

This is not an experience that has occurred for the first time in 1992. The number of new shooters who have joined the Association over the last five years total in all some 8,042, which during the same period overall numbers declined by a staggering 2,336 which is a complete turn over so far as numbers is concerned over the last five years. It is obvious that while our sport is attracting new members, we are on the surface doing nothing to retain the interest of a considerable number of shooters, whose dissatisfaction with the sport is clearly demonstrated by their decision not to renew registration.

What can be done about the cause of this excessive loss of membership is not a question that can be answered in a few short words. What can be said, however, in a few short words is that the problem must be addressed if it is going to be overcome and overcome it must be. Perhaps the answer lies at club level where it appears that our C and B grade shooters are not catered for as well as they possibly could be. Perhaps it is the fierce competitiveness of clay target shooting, which does not prove to be attractive for those many shooters who joined the ACTA to get some enjoyment and fun out of breaking targets. Perhaps it is the politics of our sport, which appears to be rife at various levels. Whatever the reason, it must be overcome for the well being of clay target shooting.

How often have you heard people say that the fun has gone out of shooting. I certainly hear it often enough and maybe, just maybe, this is the area which is causing so many shooters to refrain from continuing with their membership. These are my views, which may or may not be agreed with, however the fact remains that we must retain the members we are losing and to do this we must first find the reason for their disenchantment. If you have any thoughts on the matter, which I sincerely hope to be the case, then please address them to the CTSN as the first step of many which will need to be taken if we are to solve the mystery of 'the disappearing shooter.'

Shooters Profile

You will have noticed in the November CTSN, a profile feature on four of our shooters. I am pleased to say that this feature attracted many favourable comments and will be repeated throughout the forthcoming year. Approaches have been made to a number of shooters who are well known in the sport, to contribute to this section of the CTSN and subject to their co-operation some interesting reading lies ahead.

The January CTSN will contain the first of two to three articles on Russell Mark which should be full of interest. Russell agreed to an interview which discussed many topics ranging from his introduction to the sport, shooters he has competed against, gun

selection, what is right or wrong with the sport in today's climate and where, in Russell's opinion, the sport should be heading. Having heard Russell's answers to the questions put to him, I am certain that like myself you will find his comments both interesting and informative.

Rule Review

The shooting rule review has been completed and is now before the Executive Committee for discussion. Once this has occurred, all changes will be published in the CTSN, hopefully the January issue, from where they will become effective immediately. No doubt the rule changes will both please and displease sections of our membership, however they are the result of an extensive review with input received from all states. If at first some of the rule changes are not to your personal liking, then please give them a chance to operate, after which you may well find that they are not as bad as first thought. Similarly, if you find the rule changes to your instant liking, then tell others so and explain to them why you like the changes that have been made.

Get Well

I am certain that our many members would like to join with me in wishing one of our members a speedy return to good health. The man in question is none other than Townsville's own Tom Comerford, who has recently had a stay in hospital. Those who may have journeyed to Townsville in 1990 for the Skeet Nationals will well remember the hospitality that was afforded all visitors to Townsville Gun Club where Tom occupies the role of President. Tom, from all your friends in shooting, a speedy return to good health and may you break many more targets.

Seasons Greetings

On behalf of the ladies in the National office, Gloria, Gina, Danni and Leanne, and Director of Coaching Murray Alexander, I would like to take this opportunity to extend seasonal greetings to all shooters and their families, with the wish that 1993 brings with it health and happiness and a better year than the year just past. NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS


Returning to Western Australia for the first occasion since 1987, the 1992 Skeet Nationals hosted by the West Australian Clay Target Association were successfully conducted at the Whiteman Park Shooting Complex and a credit to the Organising Committee and host club WAGC.

While numbers were not as high as in previous years, this did not diminish the enthusiasm of the members of WACTA, whose efforts contributed to the success of the championships.

Weather conditions for the opening ceremony on Thursday morning were ideal and promised well for the days ahead. A contingent of 8 shooters had made the trip from New Zealand to Perth and in doing so, highlighted the lack of support from shooters from our own states, who on day one could only muster 82 from an overall total number of 90, with not all states represented.

The Honourable Graham Edwards, Minister for Police, Sport and Recreation officially opened the 1992 Nationals and publicly expressed his support of the West Australian Clay Target Association and WA Gun Club for their continued efforts on behalf of shooting in Western Australia and Clay Target Shooting in particular.

In the absence of National President, Glenn Woodhatch, ACTA was represented at the Opening Ceremony by WA Executive Members, Elaine Forward and Ross Silvester, who welcomed the Minister and called upon him to fire the opening shot, which duly broke the target to the delight of the Minister and those who attended the Opening Ceremony.

Shooters representing their respective states marched to positions under their state flags, accompanied by the music from two Scottish pipers whose presence certainly added to the flavour of the Opening Ceremony. Possibly the biggest disappointment at the Opening Ceremony was the absence of open teams from South Australia, Tasmania and the Northern Territory and the total absence of women and junior teams from all states other than the host state Western Australia, whose disappointment did not detract from their enthusiasm to represent their state in competition.

National Skeet Doubles Championship

A total of ninety shooters entered for the Doubles under conditions that were good for shooting, although a little windy. Doubles targets proved to be elusive for the majority of the field, however good performances were recorded by Brian Thomson (Vic) whose 96/100 took the honours overall. Laurie Chelepy (Qld) 93/100, Scott Wright (NSW) 93/100 all AA grade shooters, Merv Pratt (NZ) also shot 93/100 to lead the Internationals. A good A grade score was shot by Clem Bertini (WA) 93/100. Tournament Director Glen O'Brien combined his duties with a well shot 96/108 to take B grade. Linda Weston took out the womens section of the Doubles Championship with a score of 86/104. Best of the veterans was Northam's own Roy Holtfreter 86/100, with Wangaratta (Vic) junior Robert Holloway shooting 82/100 to win the junior section.

All States Skeet Championship

Numbers for the first of the standard skeet events had grown from 90 to 108 with the majority of new shooters coming from WA.

The wind had increased and a few drops of rain had fallen, however conditions were still on the right side of good as shown by the Victorian's Brian Thomson and David Cunningham, both of whom shot possibles. Pickings were slim for the New Zealand shooters with Waitemata's Gary Lisle the only New Zealander to figure in the final results finishing third in AA grade on 132/135, behind Queensland's Laurie Chelepy 133/135. Victorian junior, Robert Holloway 87/100 won his second junior medal to lead the juniors, with past ACTA President Roy Holtfreter taking the veterans section with a well shot 95/100 for his second win over the two days of competition.

A large crowd watched what many thought could be a long shoot off for overall between Frankston Australian club members Brian Thomson and David Cunningham, with David missing his thirteenth target presenting a winning opportunity to Brian Thomson, who recorded his second overall win over the first two days of competition.

Conditions had worsened some for the Commonwealth title with rain falling and a strong wind prevalent with a total of 121 shooters contesting the second of the standard events. Scores for the All States Championships and Commonwealth title decided the composition of the Australian Teams to shoot the Skeet Challenge Trophy Match.

Western Australian shooters dominated the Commonwealth title winning nine of the sixteen medals. Some good performances were recorded with none better than by Katanning's Laurie Hull, whose 104/108 proved to be a popular win in A grade. The well travelled Mick McGill (Qld) was a strong contestant for overall honours, however Brian Thomson (Vic) won the honours for the third successive day with a score of 136/139 to take the coveted Commonwealth title. Robert Holloway Victorian junior 85/100 and Northam's Roy Holtfreter 87/100 took out their respective sections for the third successive occasion, with Sue Thompson from Waitemata (NZ) winning ladies with a score of 89/100, much to the delight of her fellow New Zealanders.





Scores from New Zealand for the 1992 match which were opened at the conclusion of the Australian match showed that Australia had won the Open International Match with a score of 484/500, from New Zealand 482/500.

The Womens event also produced a win for Australia 219/250 over New Zealand 213/250, with the New Zealand Juniors 221/250, preventing Australia 205/250 from making a clean sweep of the competition. Despite assurances from England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Zimbabwe that they would be competing in 1992, scores were not received from any of those countries prior to the closing date of 31st October. Efforts are being made to ensure that all countries contest the International match for 1993.

The gun that has done and is doing more for shooters in 26 years, since I introduced them in commercial quantities into West Australia, than other guns that have been available over very long periods.




QUEENSLAND 1992 State Skeet Carnival

TOP GUN JUNIORS LEAD THE WAY

October proved to be a fruitful month for two of Winchester's 'Top Gun' juniors. Glen has shown enormous potential over the past twelve months shooting the International discipline and is a current member of the National Training Squad. As a Junior High Gun winner at a State Trap Carnival, Les receives 500 Winchester Target Loads of his choice.

On the back cover of this month's CTSN you will see the format for the 1993 'Top Gun' awards commencing on January 1st. Applications for registration will be received up until January 31st 1993, but the form must be received by Winchester before any award can be claimed. The 1993 awards offer a wider range of events, with major changes being a case of shotshells for any 300 break on any advertised Skeet or DTL program. Also 500 shotshells for the overall High Gun Winner on any major DTL carnival of at least two days duration which is advertised in the CTSN. Also, due to popular demand, we have included a Veterans High Gun award in State and National Carnivals.

The 1992 'Top Gun' of the year winner will be advertised in February's issue of the CTSN with the victor receiving 7500 AA Target Loads. Good luck for 1993 and remember entries must be in before January 31st, but ideally should be received by January 1st.

1993 Handicap Cards

Shooters who were registered in 1992 are able to compete in 1993 (January only) by producing their 1992 Handicap Card plus proof of payment of their 1993 registration.

This exemption will allow sufficient time for clubs to forward applications to the National Office from where the current 1993 Handicap Cards will be issued with minimum delay.

As from February 1st, 1993, no person shall be eligible to shoot without first presenting their 1993 Handicap Card or proof of current registration.




New Zealand has new Firearms Legislation which came into effect on November 1 1992, which affects the importation of pump action or semi automatic guns.

Anyone travelling to New Zealand with guns can apply at the Airport in NZ for a Tourist Firearms Licence. There is no charge for this life-time licence.

Semi automatic and pump action firearms require approval by the Assistant Commissioner. This approval will take approximately one week and customs will hold the firearm until approval is given.

Proof of identity and your local Firearms Licence is required for both licences.

SHOTGUNNERS' QUERIES

by Ron Forsyth

(Continued from previous issue).

Most Spanish shot I've seen is very hard, and so it throws the tightest of patterns. It's exactly the shot not to use in this particular gun, in either barrel.

So, he's evidently had some Tower fours on hand, and tried some of those to see what would happen. Good idea.

Unfortunately, the move to such a large shot size from such a small one is too radical a jump. Big shot tightens patterns. He might have got far more useful patterns if he'd been able to find some softer shot of the same size, seven, as the hard stuff he'd had before. The comparison lost validity, though, because the sizes were so different.

So, if it's intended to try one load against another, then the shot brand and size have both to be taken into account.

At the time of writing, Tower and Winchester shot are of equivalent hardness in sizes 7, 8, and 9, so that the choice of this reader is limited.

However, the reason shot that is bigger, such as the size four he tried, patterns more tightly is that it deforms less in its path down the barrel. In this case, it could be an advantage to have more deformation and not less, so the thing could be to try substituting number eight for the seven.

This move alone can often make patterns more open by around five percent. The smaller shot size should certainly carry enough energy to the target for the first barrel, at least, from the fifteen metre line. At eighteen, it might be running out of puff, depending on how quick the shooter.

I come now to the actual distribution performance of the patterns, as this practical reader has described to me from his own experimentation.

I have to say first that I have never, not ever, seen patterns giving Oberfell & Thompson readings as low as 52. For interest, I would like to see such patterns. The shot must be so heavily concentrated in the centre that it would be difficult ever to hit anything.

The lesson here is that unless this reader had taken the trouble to pattern his trap gun, he'd have been trying to hit his birds at thirty five yards with the whole effective pattern concentrated in a space the size of a small dinner plate. Better him than me.

It seems to me that the ideal performance for trap at the stated ranges would be 55-60% in the first barrel, and 65-70% in the second. The figures would depend on the individual, and how far away the target was routinely to be broken.

As it stands, the gun is an enormous handicap. I rather doubt that a change of diet would fix both the overtight pattern and also improve the distribution by removing that ferocious centre density.

If anything would do it, the change to an ounce and a sixteenth of eights and 21 grains of Vectan AS, with AA case, wad and primer, might just fix it. (The use of AS is called for when patterns are too tight and the shot load to be shifted is a light one. It has a sharp pressure curve that gives the load a quick rap in the pants, thus providing a little of the distortion to the pellets that we're looking for).

With this strategy tried and out of the way, the reality may well be that the chokes are just too overpowering of the cartridge, and that boring the gun is the only answer.

The big danger here is going from frying pan to fire - after all, one go has already been had, and that didn't do much good. No doubt this thought is strong in the mind of the owner.

The great advantage of the trap gun is that its uses are so specific: it will always be used to shoot departing clays, and the yardages at which it is to operate are well known. There is not much risk, as long as a competent operator is engaged to do the job.

The reader asks how he should proceed. He suggests "nominal quarter and half or half and three quarter."

The dangers of this should be evident by this stage. These nominal borings are just that - they're names. One gunsmith's idea of what makes quarter and half might be another one's idea of half and three quarter.

If it comes to that, the condition the gun is now in was probably already some gunsmith's idea of some combination of the above, seeing the idea was to open it up from three quarter and full. And that didn't bring many good results.

The pattern I've recommended in the first barrel is 55-60%. The first of these figures is quarter, and the second is half.

The recommended second barrel is 65-70%. The first of these is three quarter, and the second is full.

I'm suggesting that whatever is done to it, the aim is to get the gun into the condition where it will produce the above.

If the shooter is casual, and reloads, then there will be a lot of room to move after the boring (as long as the choke has been properly reshaped). He can try several different combinations and one of them is pretty sure to be successful in giving the desired pattern with good efficiency.

There is slightly increased difficulty if the gun is to be used with factory ammunition - but no more than the average shooter faces, because when guns come with the chokes as put in place by the manufacturer, there is absolutely no guarantee that they're going to give patterns suitable for fifteen metre trap with certain factory ammunition - presumably, as the previous owner found out to his cost.

So, if the gun is to be used with factory ammunition, I'd be inclined to go for a little more constriction rather than a little less. If not, then as long as the chokes are done properly, there shouldn't be too much trouble getting the right patterns. I say this because many factory loads are higher in pressure than those of the reloader, because of the faster burning propellant used and also the tightness of the factory crimp, and thus they tend to give more open patterns when compared to reloads with all else equal.

In my efforts to get the barrels rebored, I'd perhaps ask for .013-.014" in the first, and .020-.022" in the second.

Most important of all, I'd be specifying that I wanted half to five eighths of an inch parallel in the first barrel, in front of that choke; I'd want three quarters of an inch in the second.

The parallel after the choke has a significant effect on it, and it is all too often overlooked by the folk who call themselves gunsmiths and just bore out diameter when they're asked to open a choke.

It isn't vital to the quality of the pattern that a parallel be this long or that, but the more unusual that parallel, the more fully will be the barrel. The more conventional the shape, then the more easily a suitable load may be found for it.

So, I'd be talking constriction and shape to the gunsmith, rather than using terms like half or three quarter. They're too vague.

The last question is a very hard one indeed.

The reader wants to know whether there's any intrinsic value in having more open constrictions throwing his three quarter choke patterns than there is in having tighter constrictions doing it.

I guess even the idea of this is hard for some to swallow. The myth persists that a barrel choked three quarter throws patterns of three quarter, and that's that. But it is a myth.

Picture one gun that has tighter borings, and a sharper pressure and higher velocity load is put through it, with shot of the same hardness (as it near enough to all is, now, in the trap sizes).

It may very well shoot patterns identical in percentage to those shot by a second gun with more open borings, but shooting a lower pressure and lower velocity cartridge.

There is a theoretical advantage in favour of the second gun. This is because in order to produce its, say, half choke pattern, the more open barrel can use harder shot with a slower burning propellant that deforms the shot pellets less, and allows those which are gravitating to the outside edge of the pattern (and hence providing the spread) to be getting there with the help of less deformation. These pellets, being more round, will consequently carry more energy.

The other gun will be shooting its half choke by squeezing softer pellets through a smaller hole, and deforming them more. This way, those pellets that are at the outside edge of the patterning, hence providing the spread, will be more deformed and be carrying less energy.

This gives the edge to the open barrel and less deformed shot combination.

However, I must add that I have numerous combinations of barrels that for one reason or another I choose to use with a bit more choke instead of a bit less. This means it's often necessary to step up the velocity or the pressure or both to get the right pattern for the job. I accept that the pattern fringe is not as good as it could be under ideal conditions, but I keep doing it because it adds to the flexibility of the barrel in question.

It's generally easier to open a barrel up a smidgin than it is to tighten it with the change of a cartridge.

There's another consideration here, as well. Many guns are overchoked, and when an owner gets in touch with a gunsmith and discusses requirements, he's taking a big step. It costs time, effort and money.

When the gun comes back, it may be that two or three thou. more should have been taken from the chokes; but having just gone through the exercise, few of us are going to shoot a few patterns, decide on a little more metal having to go, and then turn the gun round for another try. What we get the first time is going to be what we stay with.

It's always necessary to offer a gunsmith a little room to move in choke work, and it seems to me that if you're going to err, then it's better to do it with a little more metal still in place than with a little less. After all, if you're shooting trap, the possibility is always there that having paid all this attention to his gear, a shooter could end up having his handicap increased, and as his yardage goes up, the little extra choke could come in handy.

I hope that this fairly general discussion of possibilities helps the reader; he's gone to the trouble of trying to help himself with some pattern assessment, and he deserves success.

His difficulties underline many of those that beset trapshooters everywhere. If he can improve those awful patterns, then I think he's in for a pleasant surprise with his scores - up to ten percent improvement, if I'm any judge. Black aspros, take cover.

The 1992 WA State Carnival was conducted over the long weekend of 26th-28th September at the Whiteman Park International Shooting Complex, Perth.

Although traditionally WACTA has held trap and skeet state team elimination shoots on the same weekend, due to the vagaries of programming for the past two years, these shoots have been held separately. Also, in the past, the major state titles have been allocated on a rotating basis to clubs around the state and it was felt that attendances were being restricted to those who were either very committed, or affluent enough to attend all events.





The 20t International Handicap resulted in two shooters losing a metre. Back marker was Dino Oliviero from 25 metres.



The President and Committee thank all who helped prior to and during the two days. Many thanks again and we hope to see you all again next year.






Barb Wallace, Overall Ladies High Gun winner.

SKEET NEWS



Now that all the State Skeet titles are finished, skeeties from around Australia and New Zealand are enjoying the National titles.

This year, the gem of the west, Perth played host to the titles. The attendances were good with 133 competing, the weather was unkind with very heavy winds, obviously effecting scores, with only three 100/100s shot throughout the tournament, however, by all reports, while the weather may have been unkind, the hospitality extended to competitors by the folks from WA was great, the trap mechanics made every possible attempt to make sure that targets were equable and the organising committee had a well run tournament. Comments were that this was a very happy Nationals. Congratulations Perth.

The results are now in and Frankston Australian shooter Brian Thomson had a 'ripper' Nationals. Brian won the All States 113/113, the National Doubles 96/100, the Commonwealth 136/139 and the Overall High Gun 391/400, what a top effort (bet he wishes he was in the Winchester Top Gun Awards). This I am sure was a popular result as Brian really is one of our shooters who puts in, on and off the skeet field, congratulations Brian.

We also have a new National Champion, hailing from the Brisbane Gun Club, Dave Dundon. Dave shot the only 100/100 in the National title, this bloke keeps popping his head up in big shoots, he is competitive in both disciplines of skeet (ISU and standard) a good shot and a tough competitor, the only thing is this, I pity the folks at Brisbane Gun Club, there will be some ears up there for a while!

The Ladies High Gun was won by a regular, popular visitor to our country Zelda McClure from the Waitamata Gun Club in New Zealand, Zelda shot 351/400.

Ex President Roy Holtfreter from the Northam Gun Club won the Veterans High Gun with a commendable score of 361/400. The Junior High Gun award went to Robbie Holloway from the Wangaratta Gun Club. Gee, this young fella is a good shot, winning at these tournaments is making him stronger all the time, we can expect to see more of this bloke on the dais. In the teams matches the Kiwi's rolled us in the Glenn Cup (won't they be crowing over that one), the Shoulder to Shoulder was won by Western Australia, this match could have been better attended, State Association may have to get behind their teams a bit more, this by no means detracts from WA's win, congratulations to all team members. The National 5 Person Club Teams Match went to the Frankston Australian team. Obviously this is a broad result report, a full report may be found in other pages of this issue.

On the overseas scene, Adrian Cousens has continued his success in the USA. This year at the NSSA World Skeet Shoot, Adrian won the High Overall with a perfect 550/550, a great effort? Well, now consider that to win the HOA he had to shoot 100/100 in 410g, 28g, 20g an 250/250 in the 12g, that is obviously World Class. This skeet season Adrian registered 14,000 competition targets with a percentage of 99.4% over all 4 gauges, truly remarkable. There is also a solid rumour that Adrian may take the position of National Coaching Director of the National Skeet Shooting Association of America. If this is so, this position would certainly be a caper for his career.

Now, there was someone else at the World shoot. Frankston Australian lady shooter Lee Brownbill was also competing well, for those who know Lee, her pre trip preparation was intense, and this hard work paid off when she won the Ladies gold medal in the Mini World (the shoot is divided into two, the mini world and the world), Lee won her class (C1) in open competition. Lee finished with an average of 97.6% over both 12g and 20g, along the way Lee shot a couple of 100/100s, a couple of 99s and in her series shot a 154/154, these are great scores in any persons book, and a by product of hard, positive practice. Well done Lee.

On the international scene, Aussie team shooter Craig Meuleman just ripped into 'em in New Zealand, winning the North Island ISU Championship, the National title and the High Gun. Craig shot a 95.2% average, shooting the new rules and Winchesters 24g load, this is a good effort and will give Craig a lot of confidence. World Cup winner John Summers was not far away, but the strong performance by Craig was too good.

This year in Skeet has been good for shooting, I think the move of closer relationships between the ACTA and ASSA was a step in the right direction. Any move to make the system better so as to enable skeet shooters to enjoy their sport with more matches, more venues, more coaching can only make our sport stronger. Numbers have been down in some shoots this year, hopefully with the shoots planned for next year, the sport we love so much will get even better.

New Zealand have some really good skeet shoots planned for the early part of next year. The air fares are reasonable and you can combine some terrific shooting with a holiday in this lovely country. There should be a contingent of Kiwi's at both the Nationals and the ASSA shoot at Wagga, so make yourself known and catch up on their shoots. If you want more info the National office will give you the dates.

Rule changes have seen the need for a whole new range of shotshells with the most recent being the 24g load. This load is to be used for international skeet from the 1st January 1993. What this means to skeeties is now we have the finest range of shotshells ever. The 24g load is a joy to shoot, with the most noticeable difference being the lack of muzzle jump. Of course recoil is down too. These cartridges are quite fast and target striking is excellent, so skeet shooters now have a range of 32g loads with varying velocities, 28g with varying velocities and now 24g with options. The interesting fact is that these skeet cartridges are specialised with wads designed to enhance skeet patterns plus new powder blends especially manufactured to drive these loads efficiently and consistently. I think it is great that technology allows for a specialised skeet cartridge and not a trap cartridge (which is loaded to perform differently) with number 9s stuffed in to make a skeet shooting cartridge. Our locally manufactured products are leaders in their fields, with prices being realistic everybody can enjoy these cartridges.

This year it is quite noticeable the amount of skeet shooters having their guns set up properly. By this I mean removing excess angles on the forcing cones, barrel porting on one or two barrels, back boring, fitting adjustable stocks. It won't be long before the advantages that these innovative techniques bring will come to the fore. Still we get the old 'die hards' who knock advancement, but the bottom line is these modifications do work and will enhance your scores. How, you may ask, well, forcing cone modification reduces recoil, eliminates a percentage of shot distortion (which causes 'fliers'), eliminates a percentage of wad drag and decreases muzzle flip. Backboring improves the quality of the pattern, reduces recoil and gives a denser larger pattern by shortening shot string. Porting reduces muzzle flip and reduces markedly recoil. The adjustable stock is an excellent way of getting a stock to fit you without the expense of having to have a new stock fitted and made. The adjustable comb allows sideways movement as well as up and down (at front and rear). This adjustment allows the shooter to adjust the stock so as the shooting eye pupil at the bottom of the pupil is resting slap bang in the middle of the front sight. The old saying 'You shoot where you look' is certainly enhanced by the adjustable stock. If you are shooting gun down it may be worthwhile to make sure your gun is balanced, sometimes the adjustable stock adds too much weight to the rear of the gun. Lead strip is available and will stick to the underneath of the bottom barrel and is not unsightly. Adjustable combs come in natural wood and soft top, if you press your head down really hard on the comb then the advantages of

the soft top are obvious. Adjustable combs are excellent for juniors as their bodies are changing continuously, so does their sighting plane, their scores can be effected if these changes are not kept in check, so the adjustable stock is a great asset in this area. It is interesting to note that since technology has helped keep recoil in check, shooters in other countries, who have the advantage to implement these changes, are scoring better than ever before in all categories. So the advantages are obvious and we have the people in Australia to carry out this work and do a great job, so if you haven't had your gun 'worked' talk to people who have, have a shot of their gun and weigh up your options.


The highlight of the weekend was the Gus Buerchler Remembrance Trophy, and the winner with a score of 97/100 was Mick McGill.




