

Thank you for your support over the past 71/2 years and Goodbye.



1993 OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS Darwin, NT

Most of the conditions for the 1993 Nationals will be as per previous O.D. Carnivals incorporating recent UIT rule changes. The purpose of this notice is to advise you of the aspects of attending a Nationals in Darwin that are different.

- Consider arriving a week earlier or departing a week after the carnival and make the 1993 O.D. Nationals a holiday destination there is plenty to see and do in Darwin for the family while the Nationals are on.
- These Nationals are to be run in conjunction with the 1993 Arafura Sports Festival – a similar format to the Oceania Games in S.A. in 1991. Arafura Sport Festival competitors will be squadded separately from Nationals competitors. Teams from the Southern areas of Australia may not compete for Arafura Sports Festival medals. Arafura Sports Festival competitors will also be shooting in our National and Commonwealth titles.
- Due to the running of the Arafura Sports Festival, both accommodation and airfares will be in short supply – Book Early. You may book accommodation through the Arafura Sports Festival booking office, complete packages through the N.T. Government Tourist Bureau in all capitals except Hobart, or fares through your travel agent.
- The Darwin Gun Club has ample facilities for those wishing to caravan or camp. Hot showers, toilets, washing and BBQ facilities. They can cater for up to 30 caravans, some powered sites available. Further caravan sites are available in commercial parks 2 minutes from Darwin Gun Club.

GEELONG ANNUAL TWO DAY CARNIVAL

The Geelong Clay Target Club held its annual two day DTL Carnival on November 28th & 29th. A total of nearly 140 shooters competed over the two days of competition for \$15,000 worth of trophies and another \$6,000 in cash added to the Calcutta, purses and sweeps.

Numbers were slightly down on what was expected, but the standard of shooting was certainly high. The weather was very scattered with some heavy downpours, brilliant sunshine, (at times making the targets impossible to see, because of the reflection off Corio Bay), and also we experienced some strong winds on Sunday which kept this years possibles in the Calcutta down to just one shoot-off squad, therefore providing some healthy purses to some fortunate buyers. The bidding for shooters at the Saturday night Calcutta Auction raised just over \$4,300, but with the Sunday forecast of strong winds prevailing, punters were not keen to outlay very much on individual shooters as the AA shooters were moved back to 19 metres for this years event to try and even out the competition. This proved to be a popular decision, but the highest price paid for any shooter this year was only \$200 instead of previous years, where in excess of \$400 has been paid.

At the dinner on Saturday night, Ron Green a former long serving Geelong Gun Club President and Life Member presented Graham Mahoney with an Honorary Life Membership to the club for the countless hours that he, his wife Maureen and family have put into the club over the past years.

As far as the competition was concerned the highlight of the weekend was Russell Mark winning every championship event on offer and along the way setting a new Geelong Gun Club long break record and a new Victorian State record with a total of 765 consecutive targets. This is the third time this year Russell has broken the old Australian long break record of 732 which stood for nearly 24 years previously. The Calcutta event was won by a 16 year old boy. Les Chant, who only three days previously started shooting with a new S05 Beretta Shotgun.

SKEET NEWS

Well 1993 is here. May I take this opportunity to wish all shooters and their families a healthy and happy New Year. This year should be good for Skeet, with a lot of good shots on the calendar. Now is a great time to get to the Gun Club and start some solid practice.

Quite often I am asked "How should I practice?," "How much practice should I have?," "What format should I take?," and so on. The amount of shooters I see with a problem, say on station 2 high, that go to practice and proceed to shoot round after round and still finish with the same problem, amazes me. What would be better is to work out how best you are going to shoot your problem target, then shoot that target until you are happy with the result. Shooting round after round is a waste of your precious practice time, so let's get down to 'tin tacks.'

First of all, set yourself a practice goal, e.g. on your competition day you may have had trouble with the high target on station 1 and the low incoming target on station 3, so, write down what you want to achieve or discuss the problem with your coach or training partner and work out a plan that is going to ensure a good hit on your problem target – do this before you actually go out to the shooting field.

Now that the season is about to start, go through a basic check list, check to see if you are mounting your gun correctly, get your coach or training partner to see if your gunfit is still correct, (you may have put on or taken weight off), make sure your forend grip is allowing you freedom to swing the gun smoothly, if the swing is 'jerky' then your forend grip may be too far forward. If the barrels bob up and down through the swing, the forend grip is too low.

Check to ensure that your stance is efficient and comfortable for you, remembering to slightly bend both knees, with a little more emphasis on the front foot. Try it out, stand on the pad, place your front foot over the target hitting area with your back foot placed about the width of your shoulders and pointing at about 2 o'clock in relation to your front foot, slightly bend your knees, push a little forward on your front knee, now swivel your hips. If you have a smooth action, practice that stance all the time. If you feel that you are 'tied up' then adjust your body and feet until you can swivel left and right comfortably.

Now the big one, and you will have to get your coach or mate to assist you. Most of the targets I see missed are the result of the shooter anticipating the target flight and release, in other words the shooter moves the gun when he/she calls. This results in a jerky unco-ordinated movement, so what you have to practice here is calling for the target and not moving the gun until you can see the target clearly. Have your coach or partner stand behind you and have him/her watch your barrel tip for early movement. I say to the people I coach, "As long as you shoot Skeet you will ALWAYS have to force yourself ABSOLUTELY not to move that gun until you see the target clearly."

Next, practice your target sighting, what you want to achieve here is a very clear target and a hazy barrel end. Learn to focus in front of the target and maintain your gun speed, don't worry about leading, just focus clearly in front of your target no matter which station you are on. This technique will help your concentration and allow you to be in control of any target no matter what it's speed may be.

Once you are happy you have checked out okay and you have fixed your problem on Station 1 & 3 you may proceed to shoot a couple of rounds. Keeping a record of your practice round scores and percentages keeps the pressure up and drives you to shoot better than your last session, this achieves a higher degree of positive practice and strengthens your mental discipline. REMEMBER it's your session, so tailor make it to get the very best out of the practice for you.

If you have a big match coming up, say the January shoot at Wagga, then your game plan should start now – three weeks prior to the shoot.

Here is a simple training format sequence that you may like to try.

WEEK 1

Check Basics

- 1. Stance
- 2. Gun swing
- 3. Target sighting
- 4. Not anticipating target flight
- 5. Station work, Problem targets
- 6. Repetition station work (6 x Stat 2 high, 5 x Stat 3 low, 5 x Stat 5 high etc)

If you had the time in this first week (and the resources) 400 targets would be good. If this is unachievable, then as many as you can.

Fitness

This is totally dependent on your age and fitness level. If you are a runner, then run. Long distance jogging is excellent for shooting, it will obviously give you excellent fitnesss, strengthen your mental attitude and give you good strength. If you can't run then walk, you will find this pastime relaxing, and provided you keep a good pace up you will increase your strength and fitness. Whilst you are walking think about your shooting technique, visualise yourself going through the correct method of shooting your target.

Visualise the target turning into dust, this will strengthen your concentrative skills, so needed when you are competing.

In the first week if you are already training, lift the run rate a bit, work a bit harder if you have not been training, don't be like a bull in a china shop. Come in slowly, start walking at a pace that does not distress you, get a squash ball and squeeze it 10 times each in the right and left hands. Keep this up for two or three minutes, this is good for wrist and lower arm strength. Do some deep breathing and stretching exercises each day.

Nutrition

If you are not already doing it, start getting good tucka into you, good breakfast cereals and plenty of wholemeal bread. Stay away from fried foods and McDonalds, drink plenty of water, get plenty of fresh vegies and fruit and just cut back on the size of the meals. It does not hurt to come into a match a little lighter.

WEEK 2

Shooting

Shoot rounds, keeping record of the score. Emphasise target clarity, do not think of anything other than staying still until you see your target clearly. (See the target, shoot the target – nothing else.) All the basic work you have done in the first week should allow you to concentrate solely on shooting the highest score you can. Shoot about 200 if possible, if not, don't worry. Make whatever time and resource you have available very positive.

Fitness

Same as Week 1.

Nutrition

Same as Week 1.

Try and get as much sleep as you can leading up to a big shoot, lack of sleep causes anxiety.

WEEK 3

Shooting

Virtually nothing! At the most perhaps 50 to 75 on the day before the shoot.

Fitness

Taper right off heavy work, concentrate mainly on stretching exercises.

Nutrition

Pretty much the same as week 1 & 2, however 2 days before the match get into some foods like pasta, baked beans, bananas – these are easy to digest and give plenty of energy without filling you up too much.

So there you have it, a quick pre-match schedule, that of course you will want to tailor-make for yourself. A more detailed list would be prepared for the breakdown of training, shooting/fitness/nutrition. Make sure you do prepare a written schedule that you can keep as a record, plus when a schedule is written down you are more likely to stick to the format.

When you are shooting your match/tournament give yourself simple instructions, "SEE THE TARGET, SHOOT THE TARGET," and really that is all you have to do. Don't fill your head with all the mind destroying rubbish that shooters get themselves into. If you have prepared for the match and are confident of your ability don't stop the natural flow. Believe me, your brain is a wonderful computer and it will work out movement, leads, when to pull the trigger, when to shoot under a dropping target, when to swing fast or slow. So what triggers this wonderful instrument into action? Well, it's your eyes – so the bottom line is look hard at your target and let everything else take its natural course.

NATIONAL LEAGUE SHOOTING

I would like to make a suggestion to you all and to hear your views would be very pleasing. For some time I have seen team shooting declining for one reason or another. This exciting, social part of our sport is almost non existent. I find it is near on impossible to get shooters to travel outside their home club boundaries, so, if the dog won't go to the biscuit, bring the biscuit to the dog.

Therefore here is my suggestion -a National Team Challenge that you won't have to leave your club to compete in. Here's how it works.

- 1. Teams of five people
- 2. Start February, end 31st May
- 3. \$20 per member, \$100 per team
- 4. You can be a member of as many teams as you like provided you pay \$20 for each team you are a member in.
- 5. The team shoots twice a month at 100 targets each per member, so the team will aggregate 1,000 targets per month.
- 6. Scores to be varified and signed by the scorer and club captain or secretary and sent to the ACTA promptly at the end of the month or sooner.
- 7. You can shoot at any time throughout the month, but you must shoot together as a team at any convenient time sorted out by your team and your club.
- 8. You don't necessarily have to form a club team, but you can if you want. It could be named for example the Hawksbury Gun Club Team or Reggie's Old Boys or Perth Wildcats – anything you want.
- 9. At the end of the season the computer is hit and the team with the highest score is the winner. In the case of tied scores, the teams are notified and they shoot off, still at their own clubs. If the teams were close to each other they may arrange to travel so they can shoot off together, but only if they want to. Also on the shoot off day it's bad luck if it's sunny and calm in Perth, normal in Melbourne (hissing down and blowing like the devil) and windy in Brisbane.
- 10. Hopefully with enough teams entering, a very good award would be achieved by the winners. Perhaps a trip to the NSSA World Championships for each member, or cash – any number of things.


If you wanted to form a team and your club does not shoot Skeet, then you could arrange with a club near you to be used as a base.

Don't know who's in that one yet, except for Clem Bertini, and he is already packed ready to go.

On accepting the position of National Director of Coaching in January 1992, a review was undertaken of the material available to the ACTA coaches.

One of our front line manuals is the Basic Coaching Manual. This although twice reprinted and being changed from imperial to metric measurements, had not been reviewed since 1980.

A major investigation was therefore undertaken into the required data and knowledge that would form the basis of a revitalised edition. The proposed contents were discussed by the Coaching Council, compiled and forwarded to a selection of coaches.

Their task, as it was with the state coaches, to put on paper particular aspects and coaching methods used in the different disciplines, to be contained in the manual. The researched material that was then accumulated presented a mammoth task of collation.

An initial draft was produced and presented at the State Coaches conference and to several senior coaches, for comment and criticism. After further feed back a.second draft was produced using the knowledge gained and incorporating necessary changes to the English language content. This draft was then returned to the participating coaches.

From these coaches and the many hundreds of hours accumulated in it's production, has come an up to date and informative Basic Coaching Manual that will be of benefit to all coaches and especially new coaches undertaking accreditation.

Because of the size of the project I would like to thank some of the coaches involved. By their unselfish attitude and being willing to give of themselves in time and knowledge, the quality of the ACTA Basic Coaching Manual has been greatly enhanced. No insult is intended to any other person that became involved in some way.



AUSTRALIAN'S VISIT THE GRAND

The 93rd Grand American World Trapshooting Tournament, Vandalia, Ohio USA 1992

Eight of our trap shooters journeyed to America in August to shoot the 1992 World Trapshooting Championships. The tournament is referred to as the Grand American Handicap, and is in fact the worlds largest trapshooting tournament.

The Amateur Trapshooting Assoc has over 108,000 members and 1,250 gun clubs in USA and Canada. Over 5,500 registered shoots are held each year. Headquarters and tournament shooting located in Vandalia Ohio since 1923.

The economic impact of registered shooting exceeds 150 million a year.


For every registered competitor there are nine other clay target shooters involved in trap leagues, hunting practices, private clubs etc. An estimated 600 million targets are thrown annually.

There are 100 trapshooting fields (see photo) stretching over one and a half miles at the ATA home grounds in Vandalia Ohio.

Over 4.5 million targets will be thrown during the 1992 tournament. 30,000+ entries are expected. A total of nearly \$150,000 in trophies, added money and prizes will be awarded during the ten day program. 650 camping spaces are available on the grounds. Over 120 tons of lead (average per year) are reclaimed from the shooting grounds.

An additional \$6 million+ will be spent in the area for food, accommodation, entertainment, car rental etc. It is claimed that the sport has never had a fatal firearms accident.

successes at the 1992 Grand American tournament held at Vandalia Ohio (see group photo).

Our Australian group (because they had no previous shooting performance in America) were obliged to shoot from 25 yards in the handicap events, and in spite of this penalty, shot very well. Steve Atkins relates the story, and remember all trap events are single barrel only, score is dead or lost.

Brett Dunstan, from 25 yards shot a long run of 220 straight, he also shared in handicap purses and won his yardage handicap.

Wayne Headon, a long run of 115 straight shared in quite a few purses in singles and handicap. He shot 49/50 in doubles.

Ian Headon, long run of 90 straight in singles. He always seemed to be picking up purse money. Ian scored a personal best on doubles with 49/50.

Ray (Leroy) McKenzie saved his money by not going in the purses and although he never shot the singles as well as expected, he shot handicap and doubles quite well every now and then.

We entered an Australian team in their State Teams shoot in the doubles and although we were along way off winning the event, we did actually beat five of their states.

Steve Atkins had a long run of 346 in singles and another run shortly after of 240 straight. Steve won the first 'A' events with 150/150 in each. Didn't shoot handicap well at all, but managed a 94/100 in the Grand American which meant \$170 purse money.

The overall winner of the Grand American Handicap took home \$35,000 US - not bad for one days work with a shotgun, actually it was the only possible.

In the Doubles Championship Steve shot a 98/100, and guess what, yes, there were 10 possibles with 100/100.

Steve also won the award for the best foreign shooter with a 198/200.

All the guys in the Australian crew had a great time and hopefully learnt quite a lot about shooting clay targets, which was the main purpose of their trip.

SHOOTERS DICE WITH DEATH

Gippslander Norman Court admits that he is lucky to be alive. The 39 year old dairy farmer suffered a 120 stitch facial gash from the spinning steel blade of a brush cutter. An artery was severed.

So much blood was lost by the time Norman reached Dandenong hospital that he was given a transfusion.

He spent Christmas -six weeks after the mishap -worrying that the transfusion may have given him HIV. A cousin who is a doctor says the risk is very slight.

Norman's fiancee, Iona McJames of Mount Waverley, drove him to the 20k distant Leongatha hospital, which passed him on to Dandenong.

Norman was trimming a hedge from on top of the carport on his Pound Creek home. He pulled up on to the carport the ladder on which he had reached the roof. He slid the ladder out on to the hedge, as he had done many times previously. He walked out on the ladder, when he reached the hedge the ladder tipped and instead of stepping on to the solid hedge he fell into a gap. The cutting machine, revolving slowly, cut across his face from one eye-brow to his chin, through his lips. His dark glasses were cut in half.

Norman, an AA grade trap shooter, picked up a gun for the first time a month after the mishap. When the stock touched his cheek, soreness suggested that shooting was several weeks away.

Seven days before the accident he shot 132/132 to win A grade in a double barrel event at the Melbourne Gun Club.

1993 OD NATIONALS UPDATE

As you will be aware, the 1993 OD Nationals in Darwin are being conducted in conjunction with the Arafura Sports Festival. This will be run along a similar format to the Oceania Games, in conjunction with our OD Nationals in Adelaide a couple of years ago.

Most Australian competitors attending the carnival will not be able to compete for Arafura trophies, a medals only competition. Entry will be restricted to teams and individuals from the north of Qld, NT, WA and Asian countries. At the time of writing, I expect overseas teams to attend from 6 to 8 countries.

However, the Arafura Sports Festival Organising Committee will allow, indeed encourage, Australian competitors in the OD Nationals to register as Arafura participants. The benefits of registering are: —

SHOOTING SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR

The NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, a subsidiary body of the NSW Shooting Association, sponsored the inaugural 1992 Shooting Sportsman of the Year awards with a presentation dinner held on Friday 27 November, at the home of Sports House, the Wentworth Park Greyhound Racing Complex in Glebe, Sydney.

The evening was hosted by television personality. Ron Wilson, from Channel 10's Good Morning Australia program. This occasion was the first at which the best shooters from all disciplines in NSW were honoured together in a public forum. Over 300 shooters and their partners attended a very successful and popular awards presentation night. The awards were sponsored by the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council from proceeds received through the safety testing of new shooter licence applicants. The success of the scheme to date has seen around \$400,000 put directly into NSW shooting clubs.

Each discipline of the NSW Shooting Association nominated a finalist from their clubs throughout NSW. Three of the finalists nominated were under 21. They were NSW Field & Game shooter, 16 year old Barty Brighenti from Griffith, NSW Rifle Association finalist, 17 year old David Coleman from Orange and Michael Diamond from NSW Clay Target Association.

In all, nine finalists received a sterling silver medal and cash grant of \$200. They also included 1992 Olympian and Commonwealth Games Champion, Phillip Adams, from the NSW Amateur Pistol Association. Other finalists were Graeme Whatman from Adelong, a member of the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia (NSW), the 1992 Australian Champion in metallic silhouette rifle shooting, David Clifton, NSW Smallbore and Air Rifle Association and current NSW State 50 metre champion, Paul Duffy, from the Antique Arms Collectors Society of Australia. Tom Potter from the NSW Muzzle Loaders Association and Ron Thomas from the Joint Committee of Recreation Hunting Associations in NSW.

In what was obviously a close contest, Michael Diamond was also awarded the 'Sportsman of the Year' Gold Medal and Cash Grant of \$1,000. The award was presented to Michael by the Deputy Premier of NSW, Mr Wal Murray, who congratulated the Council and its supporters for helping to change the image of shooting in NSW and bring it to where its future lies, in a sporting environment.

The Chairman of the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, Mr Charles Copeman, said that although he was not a shooter, he was very pleased to be a part of the development and promotion of all aspects of the sport of shooting. Mr Copeman also stated that he looked forward to the continuation of this prestigious award to encourage new and experienced shooters to develop their skills and the opportunity for their Associations to reward them for their performances.


1993 Handicap Cards

Shooters who were registered in 1992 are able to compete in 1993 (January only) by producing their 1992 Handicap Card plus proof of payment of their 1993 registration.

This exemption will allow sufficient time for clubs to forward applications to the National Office from where the current 1993 Handicap Cards will be issued with minimum delay.

As from February 1st, 1993, no person shall be eligible to shoot without first presenting their 1993 Handicap Card or proof of current registration.

PROFILE ON RUSSELL MARK

Interviewed by Alan Maher



Name: Russell Mark Age: 28 Years Profession: Land Valuer – self employed Other Interests: Golfing ~ handicap 18 Music Astronomy

Alan: Where and when did you start shooting clay targets?

Russell: Started in 1977 at Easter Carnival in Mildura. I was a footballer, playing for East Ballarat, but hurt my ankle at the start of the season – took up shooting and never went back to football.

Alan: When did you start shooting ISU - your greatest claim to fame at the moment.

Russell: In 1984 when the Olympics were on it aroused my interest and I bought a new Beretta 680 shotgun for \$800 and decided this was where my future in shooting lay. I have enjoyed it ever since. It's a form of shooting I have never mastered and think I never will, therefore it has held my interest for that reason.

Alan: Where did you start shooting ISU?

Russell: Melbourne Gun Club in particular. My father used to work for Winchester and I would come down to Melbourne from Ballarat with him.

Alan: Do you like Melbourne as a ground?

Russell: Melbourne Gun Club is a hard ground but certainly a very good ground to shoot on.

Alan: When did you last shoot there?

Russell: Unfortunately Melbourne don't shoot a lot of ISU any more so I have been shooting at Frankston and Werribee for the last 12 months. Werribee has a fully automatic trap range which is very handy for me.

Alan: Yes, being close to home, and is Werribee being well patronised at the moment?

Russell: Yes they are actually making quite a go of their Olympic Trap range. I wish there was more money to put in another layout.

Alan: What would you consider to be some of your biggest achievements in the sport? We all know that you have had two Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games and a few World Championships, but out of all of those which is the biggest individual achievement in the sport that you are particularly proud of?

Russell: Winning the World Cup in 1991 in Los Angeles was an individual highlight.

A memory that sticks in my mind more than anything was when John Maxwell, Michael Diamond and myself won the Grand Prix of Nations Teams Event in 1991 also, that's the thing with shooting, it's a very individual sport but when you win a team shoot, especially in a country like Italy it really makes you proud.

Alan: Yes I'm sure that would be an everlasting memory Russell. We have a large cup in the office here that the Australian Team, courtesy of John Maxwell, brought back to Australia. How many shooters would have been participating in that competition? **Russell:** Well in excess of 120, the thing is that 120 over there means that they are 120 very good shooters. There might have been 20 teams in the competition.

Alan: What about disappointments. You must have some of those because with success comes disappointments and unfortunately there are usually more disappointments than there are successes.

Russell: You can't be successful 100% of the time, in fact if you are successful 30% of the time you are a fairly good shot in my opinion. I guess the biggest disappointment I have had was missing out on the Australian Team in 1985 when I was shooting very well. I thought that year I would make the team, but I learnt a lot from missing out.

Alan: What caused you to miss out?

Russell: I think I was a bit big headed to be honest, I really just thought I would walk into the team that year. I don't know why I thought that looking back now, but at that time I was probably shooting Olympic Trap as good as anybody coming up to the Nationals and when the Nationals started I think the pressure got to me.

Alan: Who made the team that year?

Russell: It was John Harris, Bill Iles and Terry Rumble. They all shot very well during those Nationals but they probably didn't shoot the scores I had been shooting the weeks prior to it – that's the disappointment I remember, and shooting poorly in the 1990 Commonwealth Games. I think that I have learnt lessons from these competitions.

Alan: You obviously have learnt lessons from those, as you have gone on to bigger and better things, finishing 9th in the Olympic Games in 1992 – a tremendous achievement.

Is having a big head a problem that a lot of shooters or sports people generally face?

Russell: It effects the young and inexperienced sportsperson generally. The top shooters you meet overseas are very aware of the realities in Trap shooting, very similar to those faced in a golf tournament. They are aware that there are 20 or more guys who could win and they accept that they are not going to win all the time.

Alan: In 1985 you would have been 21, we have a good shooter around that age at the moment in Michael Diamond. Do you have any advice for young shooters such as Michael in this regard?

Russell: Michael Diamond has a very good head on his shoulders. He is lucky enough to have parents who have closely watched him and never let him get a big head. This, in my opinion, is Michael's greatest attribute, not so much the fact that he is one of the best shooters I have ever seen, but also one of the best sportsman.

Alan: Getting off the ISU side for the moment, you are very well known in DTL shooting for that shool-off that occurred over in Perth in 1980, the Double Barrel Championship, when you would have been 16 years of age. What can you tell us about that shoot off, which must have been quite dramatic. The one that Doug Smith was involved in with you.

Russell: A lot of people still ask about that to this day. I guess that was back in the days of tremendous rivalry between Eley and Winchester. There was Doug, who was a very heavily sponsored Eley shooter and myself, who Winchester were giving a few shells because my father worked for them. It got to the stage where the shoot off was approaching the Australian record, when unfortunately Doug had a third misfunction. The target was called lost, therefore the event was never receive decided in my opinion. Doug took it like the sportsman that he is, but I have heard a lot of debate over the years as to who would have won it if it had of gone on further. He was certainly the favourite. I have never had a chance to shoot off with Doug since.

Alan: What advice Russell would you give anyone aspiring to make an Australian team, whether it be a standard discipline or an international discipline?

Russell: I think you have to set yourself realistic goals and that is the problem I faced back in 1985. I didn't really give myself a realistic goal then, I decided that I would take up ISU shooting one year and the next year I would make the Australian Team. Well, that's unrealistic – you have got to give yourself probably four years to make an Australian ISU team, and maybe about the same to make a DTL team. At the end of every year you should

sit down and have a look at how you have performed for that year and then maybe write down three or four major events you want to perform well in for the following year. Then closely monitor how you go and if you achieve your goals aim a little higher – don't go too high all at once.

Alan: You say that is what you should do, but do you do it yourself?

Russell: I haven't always but now I do, there is no doubt there will be three or four events I would really like to do well in each year, and I certainly mark them on my calendar as the events that I will go flat out to train properly and do my best in. I certainly compete in more than three or four events per year, but you just can't compete at your best in all of those events.

Alan: Apart from the obvious ones, like the Olympics which goes without saying, what event did you set yourself to win this year and how did you go?

Russell: Well of course the Olympics was my major event this year, other than that I'd have to say the World Cup events overseas. In an Olympic year you have to make your goals the overseas competitions. Next year all my events will be in Australia and I don't know if I will be going overseas at all. Unfortunately for me at the World Cup this year. I missed my last target and lost a spot in the final. At the Olympics I finished 9th, but only two targets off the winner. Realistically, I don't think I have done too badly this year. I didn't win a medal as I would like to have done, but you can't win all the time.

Alan: Out of the shooters who took part in both of these events, bearing in mind the standard they might have, what would you be able to tell us about the oldest shooter you have shot against at Olympic level who is competing at the very top of the sport:

Russell: The oldest guy I have shot against is named Luciano Giovanetti from Italy. He has won two Olympic gold medals, the second one when he was 46. It's not a bad effort. I don't think age is a barrier, if you have got age with a lot of experience, you are often a lot better off than a very young person who is full of energy and reflexes with no experience at all.

Alan: At 28 years of age and having shot in two Olympic games, it is conceivable that if you hold form and things go the way you'd like them to within the next 16 years you could compete at another four Olympics and still be at the level which you believe you could win, age not being the barrier.

Russell: Desire becomes the big problem here, its how much you really want to keep going to the Olympic Games or how much time you want to keep spending overseas or training. The older I get I tend to have a little bit more money but a little less time each year. Time is really my biggest problem now. It's not so much the ability or the money, it's the problem of finding time to do all these things. Certainly with double trap coming into the next Olympic Games things might change. Both Michael and I have always shot double trap well and I think Australia will do very well in the next couple of years in all the major double trap events around the world.

Alan: We'll get into the double trap a little later on, but just continuing on this same vein, what support have you received over your years in shooting, who or what companies have assisted you, whether it be with kind or whatever, to help you get where you are:

Russell: I've been lucky as far as ammunition is concerned, and I guess ammunition is one of the biggest expenses. Originally, I was very well supported by Winchester when a guy called Ross Baillie was the managing director. I was very good friends with Ross's son, Keith. We did a lot of shooting around the place, and Ross used to look after us pretty well, but I guess that the budgets were drawn and I was made a pretty good offer from Maionchi Ammunition when their shells were being imported into Australia by Steve Balough from Canberra, so I took a deal with Steve for a couple of years and shot a fair amount of his cartridges which was very good ammunition, but the way the Australian dollar went, they just couldn't afford to keep importing them to Australia. Then, I had an offer from Sergio Zuffo, so I shot his ammunition for quite some time and did very well with it, winning many titles and made a lot of Australian Teams. Just recently I've been offered a position with Winchester as a Shooting Consultant there, and of course I'll get some ammunition as part of that, so I'm back shooting with their new range of ammunition. I've had a lot to do with the promoting and the marketing of their new shells and the designing aspect of it which has been interesting. That's where my future lies in the short term anyway.

Alan: Obviously then when Steve Balough, Winchester and Sergio Zuffo in days gone by assisted you with cartridges, it really was a promotional exercise on their part, but with what you're currently doing now you are much more involved because you are contributing to the development of the new shells and that type of thing, so are you enjoying that side at Winchester:

Russell: Yes, that's the side of it that I had a little bit to do with Sergio but not as upfront as what I have been with Winchester, and it certainly keeps your mind very active when you see the other side of an industry which is interesting from my point of view.

Alan: Both Sergio and Winchester have been and still are both very good to the A.C.T.A. They have been very good supporters of us and I know what your relationship is with Winchester now, that's well documented, but how's your relationship with Sergio Zuffo these days, now that you've gone from being a Scorpio cartridges user to shooting Winchester shells. How did Sergio take it, and how do you get on with him now?

Russell: I guess probably the hardest decision I ever had to make, was to telephone Sergio and tell him that I had been made a fairly good offer from Winchester.

We had a long talk about it, Sergio could see that for my future that was the decision that I really had to take. I always have a drink and a meal with Sergio at every competition we end up at together, and I'd have to say I've still got a good relationship with him. From my point of view he's done me a lot of good favours over the years, as he has done the Sport. I can't knock his ammunition that's for sure, that's something I'll never do. It was purely a business decision, and as far as the personalities are concerned, Sergio and I still get on very well.

Alan: That's an example of what you said early on about sportsmanship. You can have sportsmanship on the grounds, but you've also got to have a similar situation off the ground, and if you've got a good relationship with Sergio Zuffo now, bearing in mind that you are probably his greatest competitor with Winchester, well that's tremendous.

Just getting on to Clubs Russell, you've shot at a lot of Clubs, you probably haven't shot at every one of the Clubs that we have, but you've probably shot at more than half I suppose. Where is your favourite, or which is your favourite Club in Australia for shooting, let's say DTL first.

Russell: I guess probably the easiest Club I have ever shot at, and the most picturesque Club would probably be Geelong which is the Club I'm registered with at the moment. It's got a tremendous background and the scores are always very high there. I've shot at a lot of Clubs around the place that I have enjoyed very much, particularly some of the Clubs that are in Northern Queensland such as in Townsville and Cairns.

Alan: Conditions up there would be a little more difficult . . .

Russell: Yes, it's a little bit hotter that's for sure, but I spent a lot of time there training before the Olympics at both of those Clubs and I found them also very picturesque and very well run. Townsville in particular.

Alan: Yes, I think everybody has very good memories of Townsville. There's been some good shooting up there. What about ISU, Russell, where do you prefer to shoot the Olimpyc Trap?

Russell: If I had my choice of where I would train before I go overseas, it would probably still be Melbourne Gun Club, but unfortunately I think the equipment at Melbourne Gun Club is now beyond being really competitive any more. It just doesn't seem to be the same as what it used to be. I guess my own Club in Werribee now has got the more sophisticated equipment, that's probably where I do the majority of my training now and we are trying to set that up as much as possible like a European Club.

Alan: When you say your own club Russell, not so long ago you said that Geelong was your Club, does that mean your planning on transferring your registration to Werribee, or are you going to remain at Geelong?

Russell: I'm an honorary life member at Geelong, that's something I'll always appreciate, they made me an honorary life member when I made the Olympic Team in 1988. I guess the reality is for my future I'll be doing a lot more of my shooting at Werribee . . .

To Athol and Keith, you were both unique in your individual styles and both gentlemen by pure definition.


